# Early voter turnout up for area

## Presidential candidates spend last days of campaign courting Florida voters

**CHIPLEY** — Early voting in Washington County was happening at record levels Thursday, according to the county Supervisor of Elections office.

As of Thursday, 4,205 early and absentee votes had been received at the Supervisor of

Elections office, said Supervisor Carol Finch Griffin and Deputy Supervisor Denise Stephens.

"This is better than we have had in the past," Stephens said of the voter turnout. In fact, nearly 28 percent of the voters in the county had voted by Thursday afternoon.

According to Griffin, 2,067 Democrats, 1,905 Republicans and 233 other party candidates

had already voted.

"We're having a lot of voters come in," Stephens said. "A lot of people are getting involved this year."

As of Wednesday morning, Democrats held an advantage over Republicans statewide in total pre-Election Day ballots cast: 49,000. But Republicans

# Deputy: Ebro Greyhound Park robbed

**EBRO** — An early morning armed robbery at Ebro Greyhound Park resulted in one security guard being injured and an undetermined amount of cash stolen shortly after the park had closed at 3 a.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 30, according to a Washington County Sheriff's Office news release.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office received the call at approximately 3:30 a.m. Tuesday morning and dispatched deputies immediately to the scene.

Initial investigations revealed that the suspect had entered the facility, overpowering the security guard before entering a room in which cash was housed.

The suspect fled, on foot, with the cash in an unknown direction of travel. EMS was dispatched to the scene to evaluate the security guard's injuries. The victim refused to be transported by EMS, according to the sheriff's office release.

Investigators are intensely working all leads and have identified a number of possible suspects.

More details will be released as they become available.

# District 5 candidates eye FCAT, education

**MARIANNA** — Education is listed as the number one priority for Florida State House District 5 candidates Travis Pitts (I-Chipley), Eddy Holman (I-Chipley) and Marti Coley (R-Marianna).

All of the candidates listed the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FACT) as an important issue for voters; it might be a familiar item that will help voters make their choice Nov. 6.

“F” stands for failure and ‘CAT’ stands for catastrophe,” Pitts said.

Pitts, opponent of FCAT’s way

of doing education, said he would work hard at being an advocate in the House to stand up for state employees and education. “We need to prepare our children for the future not just prepare them to take a test,” Pitts said. Pitts said local schools have the capacity to develop a curriculum inside state guidelines.

“We need to return our local schools to local control,” he added. The testy subject does not end with Pitts.

Holman, a write-in candidate, described his daughter as once being a high school student who had the grades to pass the 12th grade, but not the FCAT scores, which he

said was unfair.

“If a student goes to school 12 years and they worked and they earned the credits they needed to graduate, I do not believe that one test should dictate to that student whether they get a diploma or not,” Holman said.

“There’s got to be a way to come up with a solution or a plan that will keep the education at a high level, but not put a big burden on the student,” he added.

Holman said if elected he would work with his fellow representatives to examine a solutions with a “help or harm” approach.

The FCAT is transitioning to the FCAT 2.0, which sets new student

academic content standards, according to the Florida Department of Education website. The transition will be completed this spring.

Contrary to Pitts and Holman, Coley thinks the test must remain.

“The state has always had some type of test to measure a student’s level of achievement,” she said. “Without measurement, how would we tell if our students were receiving training that they have to have to compete in the tough economy and job market that we have today?”

The former educator said she believed that FCAT never will be completely taken out of the state educational system. However, as the Florida State House represen-

tative of District 7, Coley has supported the test to be replaced with End-of-Course Assessments.

The Florida Department of Education is transitioning the FCAT to EOC Assessments for some high school courses. The assessment is computer-based and student’s scores will comprise 30 percent of the student’s final grade, FDE reported.

The transition began in the spring this year.

“If we don’t offer a strong education,” Coley added, “why would new businesses and new industry want to come to our state; they have to know that we will provide a well-trained workforce.”

pointed out that, compared to 2008, Democrats aren’t in the position to rack-up a major early-vote lead.

Part of the reason for that: the GOP-led Legislature last year cut early voting days to eight in Florida, down from 14 in 2008.

In all, Democrats edged Republicans by 118,000 early-vote ballots early in the week, but Republicans extended their absentee-vote lead to more than 69,000.

Almost 2.7 million ballots have been cast out of a total of 12 million registered voters, 75 percent of whom are expected to vote. That means about 30 percent of the ballots could already be in.

Officials said this week that 2 million Floridians have already voted early.

In the final week before the election, both the Mitt Romney and the Barack Obama camps were present in Florida, if not in the Panhandle. The sometimes acrimonious presidential campaign is likely driving some of the early voting, with the president’s vote early ads seemingly om-

nipresent on the internet. Florida is considered a key swing state in Tuesday’s election, and both candidates are polling practically neck-in-neck.

Mitt Romney campaigned Wednesday in Miami and Tampa where he delivered his standard campaign speech, with two notable exceptions.

Romney called on people to aid the survivors of Hurricane Sandy in the Northeast. And he never mentioned President Barack Obama by name, shying away from ostensibly attacking the Democrat.

“This is quite a time for the country, as you know,” Romney said in both Tampa and Miami. “We’re going through trauma in a major part of the country. ... It’s interesting to see how people come together in circumstances like this.”

Romney’s toned-down approach underscores the difficulties of criticizing the nation’s commander in chief after a disaster.

But, with Vice President Joe Biden sharply criticizing Romney and running

mate Paul Ryan on a campaign stop in Sarasota, the chances are that the Republican campaign won’t stay too positive for too long.

Romney’s positive tone also indicates his status in Florida — he’s ahead, albeit narrowly, according to numerous polls. Add in absentee ballot and early-vote numbers, and the race is as close as ever.

Front-runners usually stay as positive as long as possible.

To juice up Election Day turnout in Florida’s most Democratic county, Obama plans to visit Broward on Sunday. With her husband busy surveying damage left by Superstorm Sandy, first lady Michelle Obama was heading to Florida on Thursday to speak to his supporters in Jacksonville, Daytona Beach and Miami.

She was trying to firm up the President Obama’s message about what he believes is at stake for Florida voters going into next week’s election.

The first graduates were selected from a pool of interested volunteers and determined to be qualified candidates. Volunteers were screened, completed a background check and successfully completed the required training curriculum.

Some of the initial duties they will perform will be visibility patrol, assisting with traffic and crowd control, welfare checks and special events. All necessary equipment will be provided to the volunteers who will be expected to perform a required number of hours each month.

PSO’s will not be sworn law enforcement personnel and therefore will not be responding to or handling any potentially dangerous calls for service. Primarily,

they will provide those services which are essential to public safety that deputies are already doing, freeing up our personnel for more serious law enforcement duties.

This has been a successful program in many other counties in the state of Florida. “Volunteers have always been a vital part of our community in many ways,” Haddock said. “We couldn’t be more proud to welcome this group into participating in something that is vital to the safety of our citizens.”

## Commission candidates visit Kiwanis Club

**CHIPLEY** — The Chipley Kiwanis Club met for its weekly luncheon Oct. 30.

The program was a question and answer session with the two candidates for County Commissioner for District 3: Charles Brock and Tray Hawkins. Both candidates live and work in the Vernon area.

In their opening remarks, both candidates pointed to their experience as pluses for their candidacies. Brock told the club he had been a county commissioner for 16 years. He also said if elected, this would be his last term as a commissioner. Hawkins pointed to his experience on the Vernon City Council and experience running his own business in Vernon.

In answer to a question concerning their top two priorities if elected, Hawkins said creating jobs in the county and getting the county budget under control would be his top priorities. Brock said his top priorities would be water and roads. Hawkins said Washington County had the highest unemployment rate and highest millage rate in a 15-county region. He discussed how he had saved the city of Vernon money on a waste pickup contract and his ideas for producing more revenue for the county. Brock re-

counted his work with the Northwest Florida Water District to prevent Bay County from drilling wells for municipal water supply in northern Bay County and his work with legislators to bring funding to the county to pave secondary roads.

Both candidates said they would support a 1 cent sales tax. Hawkins qualified his endorsement with the caveat that the sales tax would be for a limited time frame and only be used to pay down county debt.

In their closing remarks, Hawkins emphasized that the county would need to invest in infrastructure in order to attract firms to the county and create jobs. He said firms looking to expand need to see the infrastructure in place. Brock said he would work with legislators to bring business and jobs to Washington County. Both candidates requested support in the election bids.

This meeting was the last local political forum for the Kiwanis Club before the elections next week.

## Halifax to sell California papers

**DAYTONA BEACH** — Halifax Media has reached an agreement to sell the Santa Rosa (California) Press Democrat and its affiliated publications to a recently formed local company. Halifax Media purchased the Press Democrat, The Petaluma Argus-Courier and North Bay Business Journal in January 2012 from the New York Times Company as part of an acquisition that included 16 publications, mostly in the Southeast. The announced transaction is expected to close early November.

"Sonoma Media is funded by investors who live in the community and care about their local newspaper," said Michael Redding, CEO of Halifax Media Group. "We purchased the businesses earlier this year and have been impressed with the outstanding staff and excellent publications. Considering 90 percent of our company is based in the Southeast, it makes geographic sense for Sonoma Media to own the business."

Founded in 2010, Halifax Media is headquartered in Daytona Beach. The company's investment group includes Stephens Capital Partners, JAARSSS Media and Redding Investments. The group consists of 36 newspapers and affiliated websites. Halifax Media's strategy is to invest long-term capital in quality companies positioned in strong markets that are closely connected to the community.

# What do you reflect to others?

When you look into a mirror, what do you expect to see?

Naturally, you expect to see a reflection of yourself. You're not going to see a reflection of someone else in another city. And, unless you're Dracula, you also won't see an empty space where your reflection ought to be. You might or might not like what you see in the mirror, but with the exception of a funhouse mirror at the fair, you should get an accurate reflection of your physical appearance. If you have a few extra pounds, wrinkles or a bad haircut, it's not the mirror's fault. The mirror's function is simply to send back a reflection.

Many religions teach that human beings are made in God's image. If that's true, it could be said that we all possess a portion of that divine image. If we could learn to reflect God's image, perhaps we could function as mirrors in our own right. Each one of us, by virtue of being living human beings, carries a bit of the divine spark, the image of God. We possess a life force, that precious substance separating the living from the dead. If you're alive and reading this, then you've got that life force. And you can also reflect it.

Unlike a household mirror, people are selective and can make conscious choices about what they reflect. Some people reflect peace and joy, while others reflect constant misery. The human mind can also

be deceptive and reflect things that aren't actually there. In the case of someone who continually expects to be mistreated, she might reflect a false image of paranoia and hostility. On the other hand, a person who believes that people are valuable and worthwhile can reflect that image, helping others to see themselves in a positive light.

We're also backward mirrors, reflecting not what's in front of us, but rather, what's deep inside. If you were to stand in front of me, I couldn't reflect your image. I can only reflect what is within myself. Will I reflect a clear condition or a clouded one?

Like any mirror, our internal mirrors can get dirty or obscured. When a mirror is covered with grime, it doesn't present an accurate reflection. Likewise, it's hard to reflect a divine image when our spiritual mirrors are smeared with dirt. That dirt can include




