Commissioners reconsidering MSBU

Ordinance might be updated to specify spending

CHIPLEY — Changes to the ordinance that established the Sunny Hills MSBU might be coming in the near future — changes meant to speed up the pay off of the \$1.66 million loan the county owes for

road work in the subdivision. The Municipal Service Benefit Unit, or MSBU, is an ordinance-created tax district, or as County Attorney Jeff Goodman said, “an area on the map.” Within that area, funds are raised to provide services to the residents in that designated region. However, the MSBU is not an entity unto itself.

The MSBU is a mechanism by which a county can fund a particular service or facility that provides a special benefit to property from a levy of special assessments, said Attorney Crystie Voehl of Tallahassee, from Goodman’s office.

“The MSBU is not a legal entity;

it cannot own property,” Goodman told Washington County commissioners on Thursday in a BOCC workshop. “That is something we’ve heard in the past, and I want to set that straight — an MSBU can’t own property or equipment. It is just an area on a map.”

Ultimately, all responsibility for the MSBU area falls back on the county commissioners, Goodman said, and Voehl gave a presentation to the commissioners explaining what MSBUs are and how they work, as well as what alternatives exist.

Currently, the county collects \$31.25 a year from residents and

property owners within the MSBU, and that money is used to provide services to those living in Sunny Hills, as well as to pay down the \$1.66 million in debt — a loan that is not scheduled to be paid off until 2028, Goodman said.

Voehl said an MSBU can provide services including fire protection, law enforcement, recreation services and facilities, streets and other essential facilities, but only within the MSBU.

In the past, the county has purchased maintenance equipment for use in Sunny Hills with MSBU

Relay for Life kicks off the new year

WASHINGTON COUNTY — The Washington County 2013 Relay For Life had its first team meeting of the New Year on Monday at Pattillo’s on the Washington-Holmes Technical Center Campus.

Steven Carter welcomed two new teams to the relay, from Wal-Mart 2114 and First Freewill Baptist Church.

This year’s goal is to raise \$60K. Teams had raised \$13,245.02 before the meeting on Monday night, at which several more people turned in money. Seven more teams are needed to meet the goal of 30 teams. The goal for sponsorships started out as \$6,500, but it has been surpassed and the goal raised to \$10,000.

This year, luminaries are available for a donation of any amount, and all money raised on the luminaria bags will go to the team who sells them. The form still needs to be turned in

BOCC changes county organizational chart

CHIPLEY — The county organizational chart was changed Thursday when the Washington County Board of County Commissioners decided to move the Emergency Medical Services department back under the purview of the county’s public safety director.

Commissioner Lynn Gothard made the motion to move the EMS back under the public safety director’s control per the county’s Proposed Progressive Governmental Structure chart, approved in 2008. After discussion, the commissioners voted to make the move, with Commissioner Joel Pate voting against the change.

On the chart, in 2008 the EMS is listed under the public safety director, but in 2009, the chart was revised and EMS was moved out to be a department on its own.

The county has not had a public safety director since the retirement of Roger Hagan in December.

“Roger Dale was a coordinator

with all the departments,” Pate said. “They (EMS) pay more than half its own expenses because they can bill for their services,” Pate said. “And we’re not talking about putting someone there to tell them how to run their department.”

Pate said he was chairman of the commission when the EMS moved from the hospital to county control. “It’s been there for seven years, and our system works pretty good. If it ain’t broke, don’t fix it,” he said.

Creating the progressive structure for the county was contentious. “I came onboard to a stack of grievances,” said Human Resources Director Heather Finch, who provided commissioners with a copy of the county’s organizational chart. “It was very difficult, and we had people very upset.”

Finch said the county also reworked the salary structures at the same time. “It was a huge, huge process.”

“I feel the whole thing needs to be looked at,” County Manager Steve Joyner said of the county’s

organizational chart. “There are a few things here we don’t have anymore. It just needs cleaning up a bit.”

Board Chairman Alan Bush noted that the county’s E-911/GIS was not answering emergency phone calls, but rather deals with providing addresses for county properties. “I don’t know why that isn’t under building or code enforcement,” he said.

Earlier in the meeting, county resident Danny Hayes asked the commissioners if there were plans to hire a public safety director. “My question is this: Why do we need to fill this position so quick?”

Commissioner Todd Abbott said the county has been looking for a public safety director for some time, even before Hagan announced his retirement.

Hayes said the commissioners should be diligent in searching for a public safety director and make sure any candidate hired has sufficient experience and qualifications for the job.

money, and currently the primary expenses involve streetlights, mowing and paying on the loan. The equipment bought with MSBU funds should be used within Sunny Hills, Goodman said.

Other alternative ways of funding the Sunny Hills expenses could be establishing a special district, or establishing a Municipal Service Taxing Unit, which establishes a millage tax rather than an annual amount.

Voehl noted that both of these options involve a tax millage that would count toward the county's overall millage, even though it is only paid within the designated area. "The MSBU allows for more flexibility and doesn't lock into the county's millage," she said.

The county is limited by statute to 10 mills, Goodman said.

"It'd be next to impossible to implement a special district out there," Goodman said.

Another option, incorporating Sunny Hills as a city or town, is also difficult, Voehl said.

The county has to have some mechanism in place to raise funds to pay off the loan, however. "The debt service creates a lack of flexibility," Goodman said. The debt ties the county to the MSBU, and the best way to sever that tie would be to pay off the debt.

"I think the county should focus on paying off the loan," Goodman said.

Commissioner Lynn Gothard asked if the MSBU could be dissolved and the county continue to collect the assessment to pay toward the debt.

"The assessment can be put toward the debt," Voehl said. "The commissioners can designate where the funds go." She said typically, ordinances establishing MSBUs designate line items showing where the funds will go and which services will be provided.

The county's MSBU ordinance could be updated with set amounts designated for maintenance and lighting, putting the rest of the tax funds raised toward retiring the debt.

"I think this is a good idea," Commissioner Charles Brock said. Commissioner Todd Abbott asked if County Manager Steve Joyner could bring to the next workshop information on how much maintenance and lighting in Sunny Hills costs. "The rest of the money could go to paying off the debt," Abbott said. "I would like to see us make some decisions and get this rolling immediately."

"We want to pay this debt off," Brock said. "I think we need to take the bull by the horns. In theory, we could pay this loan off in four years."


