# County 65th in state's healthy residents

**PANAMA CITY**— Only two counties in the state are less healthy than Washington County, according to rankings released by a nonprofit organization Wednesday. Bay and other Panhandle counties finished closer to the middle of the pack.

The "2013 County Health Rankings" outlined several factors, which, directly or indirectly, impact residents' overall well-being.

These included smoking, drinking, obesity, teen pregnancy and even high school graduation. The study was conducted as a partnership between the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute. It included nearly every county in the U.S.

"It's not a huge surprise," Rick Davis said of Washington County's near-bottom ranking, 65th out of 67 counties.

As the county's health department administrator,

Davis is aware Washington County has been ranked poorly for the last three or four years, remaining in the bottom 10. Last year it was 64th.

"I don't think it's any secret that the population's health in Washington County and most small, rural counties is below average for the state," he said.

Washington County performed worse than the state average in nearly every category. For example, 25 percent of its residents are in "poor or fair health," compared to 16 percent

statewide and 17 percent in Bay County. About 9 percent of the county's babies are born with a low birth weight, compared to 8.7 percent statewide and 8.4 percent in Bay County.

Twenty-seven percent of the county's adults smoke; 19 percent smoke statewide and 22 percent do in Bay County. Thirty-six percent of the county's adults are obese, compared with 26 percent statewide and 27 percent in Bay County.

# Consultant: County was affected by 2010 spill

**CHIPLEY** — Washington County businesses may be eligible to file claims for losses due to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill of 2010, even if they were initially denied by the BP claims offices, said Ron Bell, director of sales for NFW Consulting.

Bell spoke to the Washington County Chamber of Commerce on Thursday, at Northwest Florida Community Hospital, during the chamber's monthly "Third Thursday" breakfast meeting.

Deepwater Horizon was the largest offshore oil spill in U.S. history.

While drilling at the Macondo Prospect on April 20, 2010, an explosion on the Deepwater Horizon oil rig caused by a blowout and killed 11 crewmen. The explosion also ignited a fireball visible from 35 miles away.

The resulting fire could not be extinguished and, on April 22, Deepwater Horizon sank, leaving the well gushing at the seabed.

"The oil spill decimated the economy in this area," Bell said. "When it first occurred to BP that they had a bad PR problem, they hired an independent insurance adjustment firm to handle the claims."

Bell explained that when catastrophes such as hurricanes or tornadoes occur, insurance companies often hire independent adjustment firms to help with the numerous claims filed. BP hired one of those firms to handle the initial claims from businesses seeking reparations following the oil spill.

On those initial claims, in some cases BP was paying more than 10 times what the loss was worth, Bell said. Then BP realized it was putting too much money in the wrong hands.

It takes all areas in the correctional environment working together for inmates to achieve this accomplishment.

"When it comes to helping inmates who want to help themselves, everyone working together in the corrections environment are dedicated to improving lives not just incarceration," said Moat. "The leadership of the institution encourages each and every staff member to put forth effort in encouraging the inmates under their care to earn a GED if they have been unsuccessful in the past."

With the Warden and Assistant Wardens' support, the staff at the institution can look ahead knowing that they are doing their part for the betterment of inmates who will be going out into communities one day with more than they had when they entered.

Thirty percent of the county's adults report not exercising in their leisure time, compared with 24 percent statewide and in Bay County.

### Teen pregnancy

Another striking figure is the teen birth rate, which was very high in rural counties. For every 1,000 female teenagers 15 to 19 years old, Washington County had 57 births compared 40 statewide.

Bay County had 56 births per 1,000 teens; Calhoun County had 57; Franklin County had 82; Gulf County had 44; Holmes County had 68 births; Jackson County had 55; and Walton County had 53.

Davis said the county's health department offers minors free, confidential birth control and no parents will ever be notified of their visit. Increased use of the free service could reduce teen pregnancy numbers in the future.

In Bay County, minors also can get free, confidential birth control from the Health Department, but they must fill it at a pharmacy. Adults also can receive free birth control, provided they meet certain income criteria, said Julia Ruschmann, county health department spokeswoman. Free condoms always are available.

Ruschmann said the Health Department does not assist teens looking to get an abortion.

### Other counties

Overall, Bay County ranked 35th of the state's 67 counties; last year it was 34th. Calhoun County was 46th; Franklin County was 33rd; Gulf County was 34th; Holmes County was 52nd; Jackson County was 49th; and Walton County was 41st.

Of the eight counties, Franklin County had the worst high school graduation rate at 59 percent, and Gulf had the highest smoking rate at 29 percent.

Of the eight counties, Calhoun County followed Washington County with an obesity rate of 34 percent, followed by Jackson at 33 percent.

Income and availability of healthy food can be a factor. Thirty-four percent of the children in Washington County live in poverty, compared to 25 percent statewide and 23 percent in Bay County. Meanwhile, 52 percent of Washington County's restaurants are fast-food joints, compared with 44 percent statewide and 42 percent in Bay County.

### Socioeconomic factors

For the state, 71 percent of high schoolers graduated in four years, while 59 percent of adults had "some college." But, that was better than Washington County, with its 69 percent high school graduation rate and 42 percent "some college" rate. Bay County had a graduation rate of 68 percent and "some college" rate of 59 percent.

Davis also said Washington County needs to improve its "personal health education and responsibility." He feels the problem is institutionalized in rural counties and there is little health departments can do. He said they can't force people to live healthier, more responsible lives.

"We try to educate, but this is a democracy. I cannot force you to not eat a piece of fried chicken. If you want to go out back and smoke, that's between you and your employer," he said. "I can't force you to not smoke, and I can't force you to exercise."

Then the process went to the Gulf Coast Claims Facility, under Kenneth Feinberg, and the GCCF turned down many claims and lost a lot of the paperwork that residents filed with the organization, Bell said. Soon, a federal lawsuit filed in Louisiana led to a settlement from BP in which \$7 billion was made accessible to pay claims through the Deepwater Horizon Claims Center.

Likewise, the nation's best economists were called upon to come up with a formula for calculating loss due to the oil spill and the resultant economic downturn — a formula that came out in a 1,000 page document, Bell said.

NWF Consulting came about as a company when a Santa Rosa County entrepreneur, Harrell Downey, and Officer James Price standing in front of the Protective Management holding the GED of an inmate who worked on his diploma while in PM status.

Downey learned how to file a claim with the Deepwater Horizon Claims Center, using the complex formula, then began teaching others how to file a claim by holding seminars along the coast, Bell said. The resulting firm, NWA Consulting, became the top Deepwater claims experts in the country, he added.

"In the case of the first two programs, it was the case of the proverbial fox guarding the henhouse," Bell said. With the settlement claims center, BP is no longer in charge of who can file.

Some businesses are, however, not allowed to file claims, including banks, financial advisors and BP gas stations. Most other businesses, however, can file a Deepwater Horizon claim if they can show that there was a downturn in profits in 2010.

"The way they determine if you have a claim is to look at your profits from 2007 to 2011," Bell said. "If they can show that you had a downturn in profit, then they do this calculation and it tells you how much you will get paid."

NWF Consulting will file claims for local businesses, and the consultants receive a 15 percent fee on whatever amount is collected. Bell said that on average it costs NWF Consulting \$7,500 to file a claim, but that cost is covered by the consulting firm and they only get paid if they collect a claim payment.

Washington County falls into zones C and D as far as claims go, with the A zone being directly on the coast. However, in the case of Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana, the entire states are considered affected areas so towns such as McComb, Miss., which are not coastal at all, have received claims.

"People are filing claims, and getting paid," Bell said. "What we've seen, is if we look at four claims, one will get paid. This is pulling a lot of money back into our economy, and that is having a positive impact."

# County 4-H competes at state shooting competition

Every other Sunday afternoon, you'll find about 30 Washington County 4-H'ers and their parents at the archery range or skeet/trap range for shooting sports practice. They're laughing, talking and having a good time, but as soon as they step up to shooting line, the expressions on their faces let you know this is serious business to them. Across the nation, the 4-H Shooting Sports program has become one of the most popular programs, and Florida 4-H is no exception. Washington County 4-H hosts two of the shooting sports disciplines in shotgun and archery. Taking a deeper look into the program, you'll learn that youth aren't just being taught to shoot targets with accuracy; they are learning positive skills that will go with them throughout their lives.

The mission of Extension 4-H programs is positive youth development. The different programs, including shooting sports, are vehicles to achieve this. Not only are youth learning safe and responsible use of firearms and principles of archery, they are developing life skills in self-confidence, personal discipline, responsibility and sportsmanship.

Shotgun coach, Gary Clark, stated that safety is the top priority in everything he teaches his members. At a recent shotgun coach recertification session, the trainer commented that Sure Shots 4-H

Club members were some of the most conscientious youth she had worked with and that Clark's dedication to teaching safety and respect for firearms was evident in everything the 4-H'ers did.

Samantha Raney knows firsthand the value of the 4-H Youth Development program; once a Washington County 4-H'er, Raney is now a 4-H volunteer and coach of Top Nocks 4-H Club. While she's participated in everything from science projects to public speaking to consumer judging, she says that the shooting sports program was one of the most beneficial experiences that she had as a 4-H'er, and she wants to pass that on to other kids.

At the recent Florida 4-H state archery match, 4-H Juniors Gavin Kindig, Cole Dillard and Avery Sapp competed along with Senior 4-H members Levi McDaniel, Joel Owen, Aaron Doss and Nathan Nichols.

Held at the Easton Newberry Sports Complex, 4-H'ers competed in FITA (Federation of International Target Archery) which are the traditional ringed archery targets, field which involves shooting in wooded, rough and rugged terrain at different distances and angles as well as 3-D which involves shooting at wildlife targets where hits are scored according to where it lands on the target.

After a full day of competition with over 230 4-H'ers from all over the state, Cole Dillard placed 10th in Junior Compound and Avery Sapp placed ninth in Junior Compound. Senior 4-H member Aaron Doss placed eighth in Compound. Levi McDaniel, who competed as a Florida National Archery Team Member last year, placed third in Recurve.

The Florida 4-H state shotgun match was hugely successful for the Sure Shots 4-H Club who took away the majority of top placing

## Easter a time of celebration, happiness

It's a very busy time, in terms of religious activity. We're coming into Easter, Passover, Ostara and other holidays. Due to the difference in the Western and Eastern liturgical calendars, the Eastern Orthodox churches began observing Lent on March 18, while Lent started on February 13 in most of the Western churches. As it turns out, the spring equinox is an extremely popular time for religious festivals. The same is true of the winter solstice, which falls near Christmas, Hanukkah and many other holidays. A solstice or equinox can frequently be connected with intense religious activity worldwide.

Of the various spring holidays, Easter is one of the most widely observed. The Easter season is a time of mixed solemnity and joy, ranging from the penitential observances of Good Friday to the festive celebration of Easter Sunday. There are also, in some churches, additional services during Holy Week (the time between Palm Sunday

and Easter). This includes Maundy Thursday and Easter Vigil (the Saturday before Easter Sunday). Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, as well as the institution of Holy Communion. It is marked in some churches by ritual foot washing. On Good Friday, Christians reflect upon the crucifixion. In some denominations, Easter Vigil is a time

for bringing new converts into the congregation, and may also be observed by the lighting of a special fire and/or a Paschal (Easter) candle. Not all Christian denominations observe Holy Week services, but for those that do, this is a very busy time indeed.

I grew up in an area where certain churches refused to celebrate Easter and Christmas. They argued that these aren't proper Christian holidays because of having been adapted from earlier non-Christian practices. So I became accustomed to different approaches to Easter, including

the option of not celebrating it at all. At school, children from families that objected to Easter were often forbidden to have Easter candy.
