TDC considers flexibility in grants

Sweeney resigns from council

CHIPLEY — A Wausau-based Pit Bull Terrier dog show brings hundreds of visitors from out of state, and the Washington County Tourist Development Council wants to help keep that tradition going strong. Sheree Folmar had withdrawn

her application for a grant from the TDC after attending the council's recent Event Planner Workshop due to the council's new policy of providing local radio advertising instead of advertising funding.

"She brings in people from all over the country, and her best advertising is the national trade magazine," said Heather Lopez, executive director of the TDC, during Monday's meeting at the Washington County Chamber of Commerce building in Chipley. "If she advertises locally, there may be some local people who come by to see the dogs,

but her main audience comes from out of state."

Folmar said the local radio would not be very useful for her event so she withdrew her application.

Lopez said last year the American Dog Breeders Association dog show Folmar hosts is called the Sunshine State American Pit Bull Terrier Club (APBTC) and the event drew enough people to fill up motels in Chipley. "The only reason all the motels were not full was that some of them have a 'no pets' policy, so people were sent to Bonifay," Lopez said.

"Now wait a minute," said TDC board member Ted Everett. "This is a multi-day event that is bringing heads in beds, which is exactly the kind of thing the TDC is here to support." Everett suggested the TDC help Folmar with advertising in the national magazine as well as offer some local radio advertising.

"We have to be flexible with our thinking, we don't want to have our policies written in stone," Everett said.

The board approved the motion

Business, civic leaders discuss economic growth

CHIPLEY — The third Symposium for Economic Development in Washington County looked at the effect a new industry could have on the local economy.

Sponsored by the Washington County Chamber of Commerce, the symposium was held Tuesday at the Panhandle Area Educational Consortium. The meetings bring civic and business leaders together to discuss how to create economic growth in the county.

Larry Sassano, president of Florida's Great Northwest, explained the community role in economic development preparation.

Getting an industrial site in front of potential industries means developing the communities' sites, buildings and infrastructure before hand. "Your county is your product, and you have to get it out there and sell it," Sassano said.

As a representative of Florida's Great Northwest, Sassano travels to trade shows and site consultants to market the Panhandle to

to grant \$400 to the ADBA dog show to go toward national advertising.

The board also tabled accepting the resignation of Scott Sweeney from the TDC. Sweeney submitted a letter informing the board of his intention to move to Holmes County to reside, although he will continue to work at Falling Waters State Park in Chipley.

Lopez said she would research whether or not members of the TDC were required to live in the county that the council serves.

Another member, Mark Hess, now also resides out-

side the county, so Lopez will find out if they can continue to serve on the TDC.

The board also put off advertising the open seat on the TDC until the matter can be researched.

Linda Cain, mayor of Chipley, is being replaced on the TDC board by Lee Dell Kennedy, a city councilman who serves as Chipley's mayor pro tem. The board voted to renew Cain, Hess and Dana Phillips' terms during the meeting.

The board members also voted to cancel their December meeting due to the holidays.

Board member Amy Wiwi announced the Chamber's plans to hold its first annual Chili Cook-Off on Dec. 7 as part of the city's Christmas Fest.

"We're limiting entry to 10 entries, and we already have six," Wiwi said. "If you have one of the best chili recipes in Washington County, then be sure to sign up."

The cook-off will be held from 3 to 6 p.m. at the Farmers Market Complex in downtown Chipley with chili judging beginning at 5:30 p.m.

During the November Chipley City Council meeting, Everett invited Mayor Linda Cain and the city council members to come serve as judges for the cook-off. The public is invited to attend all of the Christmas Fest events.

The annual Christmas Parade will begin at 3:30 p.m. with line-up beginning at 2:30 p.m. at the old Chipley High School track. Photos with Santa will be available from 2 to 3 p.m. and from 4:30 to 6 p.m. at the gazebo downtown.

At 5:30 p.m. there will be a reading of the Cajun "The Night Before Christmas" by Kermit Soileau.

The Spanish Trail Playhouse will also stage their program, "A Classic Chipley Christmas," at 7 p.m. at the historic Chipley High School auditorium, on Dec. 7.

There will also be carriage and pony rides, food and drinks and the Wash-

ington County Historical Museum will be holding an Open House as part of the Christmas festivities.

The program's topic was Affordable Care Act: Key Small Business Provisions, and it was presented by Donna Padgug, a business development specialist with the U.S. Small Business Administration North Florida District Office.

"Businesses that have fewer than 25 full-time employees and that pay average annual wages below \$50,000 and contribute 50 percent or more toward employees' self-only health insurance premiums may qualify for a small business tax credit of up to 35 percent," Padgug said. "In 2014 this credit goes up to 50 percent."

Another change will be

the requirement that aggregate annual health care costs be reported on the W-2. However, the W-2 reporting requirement does not apply to employers required to file fewer than 250 Form W-2s in the previous calendar year.

"The employee does not have to pay tax on this amount, it is just for informational purposes."

Padgug said employees of small businesses will have insurance options in January 2014, with open enrollment now ongoing, through the Small Business Health Options Program (SHOP), which will provide a broader-based insurance pool for small businesses to participate in.

The SHOP program will offer small businesses increased purchasing power

to obtain a better choice of high-quality coverage at a lower cost.

The SHOP program will also help reduce administrative complexity, reducing costs. In 2016, employees with up to 100 employees will be able to participate.

"The more people you have in your pool, the better it is for everyone and it lowers the risk and ultimately it lowers premium costs," she said.

potential developers. "This year I am working on 52 projects, and so far two of those have actually made announcements," Sassano said. He often travels to New Jersey, Dallas and Atlanta to meet with site consultants and to prospect for industries that could relocate to Florida.

The final step is closing the deal, Sassano said, which includes identifying state and local incentives and coordinating with the client to complete the agreement.

"When companies look at sites as possible locations, it is more of a process of elimination," Sassano said. "Companies look to eliminate as many locations as possible before they actually start looking at sites."

The first phase of site searching begins with a ranking of the site criteria, mapping the coverage area, issuing a Request for Proposals, and then selecting communities where the business may succeed.

Once the sites are visited and ranked, negotiations begin and after due diligence a final site is selected. At that point, there is an announcement made and incentive assistance is offered, Sassano said.

Andrew Rhodes of Gulf Power explained the economic potential of a 100-job industry locating in Washington County by using a real example of an industry that was looking to locate in the Panhandle.

A food processing facility seeking a 160,000 square-foot building with 22-foot ceilings and 10-15 acres was looking to locate in the region. The facility needed 660,430 gallons of water per day, which is a requirement beyond the capacity of any water utility in Washington County.

"When I saw that, I had to say, 'we'd love to help you, but we just can't do it,'" said Ted Everett, executive director of the Chamber of Commerce.

"That is a tremendous

amount of water," Sassano said. "There are not very many municipalities in our area that could handle that type of a request."

However, if the county had been capable of hosting such a facility, those 100 jobs would have generated over \$5 million in labor income and another \$3.8 million in indirect and induced effect on the local economy, Rhodes said.

"The impact is truly regional," Rhodes said. "Only 36.8 percent of the workforce in Washington County comes from Washington County." Workers for jobs in Washington County also come from Jackson, Holmes, Bay Walton, Calhoun, Escambia, Okaloosa, Leon and Gulf Counties as well, with Jackson County leading the pack with 13.5 percent.

"The high tide floats all boats," Everett said. "Job creation is not just something that helps those 100 people, it's good for the whole county."

Abuse leaves mental scars that last

Several news stories have surfaced recently about abusive school teachers, babysitters and more. In some cases, the abuse was documented by audio recording devices or hidden cameras.

When I lived in another state, one youngster recorded ongoing violence in a foster home and sent it to a local TV news station, revealing that people who'd won accolades for taking in children were actually abusive thugs.

After reading one such story online last week, I was intrigued by the public commentary, much of which involved people's own stories of abuse. These harrowing tales recalled memories of beatings and psychological abuse, often in school settings.

If you think it doesn't matter who handles our society's children, think again.

I had a dreadful first grade teacher. In her "care," children were whipped, ridiculed, harassed and constantly berated. Her actions deeply affected me. It wasn't physical violence in my case, but an onslaught of intensely hostile remarks coupled with a publicly humiliating experience. By contrast, my preschool experiences involved gentle, patient people. I remember kindergarten fondly. First grade, not so much.

So why would I even remember first grade today? Because my teacher, a sadistic old bag, made quite an impression on me. She was a teacher, all right. I learned classroom basics better from every other teacher before and since, but she did teach me one thing: how not

to treat others.

Fortunately, it's not as easy to get away with mistreating children, the elderly and the disabled as it was in previous generations. I've seen videos of nursing home employees striking elderly patients. Maybe if more nursing homes used cameras, employees would reconsider harming people in their care. Some chronic abusers gravitate toward careers leaving them in charge of people weaker than themselves. They may shift from one school, hospital or institution to the next, and by the time their offenses are discovered, there's an extensive trail of damage.

Memories of abuse can last a lifetime. Mistreat a child, and there's an excellent chance he'll remember it in old age. On the other hand, most abusers go comfortably to their graves without

a moment's thought for those whose lives they've wrecked. Victims of abuse can suffer for years, even after their abuser has died or moved away. Bad memories cause bitterness that can haunt people for life. The bullies win twice, once when perpetrating the harm, and again whenever the victim remembers it.

Almost every religion teaches some variation of the Golden Rule. Some act as if it doesn't apply when dealing with children. But notice that the rule isn't followed by the words, "unless they're younger than you." It also doesn't say, "unless they're elderly" or even "unless they're animals." The Golden Rule doesn't have an escape clause. So if you're dealing with living beings of any age, be careful. The things you say and do can have lifelong effects, both on yourself and others.

Ebro man one of 10 arrested in police sting

Suspects charged with intent to have sex with a minor

DEFUNIAK SPRINGS — Police arrested 10 area men, including an Ebro resident, on charges of intent to have sexual relations with a minor, according to a news release from the Walton County Sheriff's Office.

The WCSO, along with other members of the North Florida Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, conducted an operation called "Operation Turkey Hunt" to take all violators into custody who traveled from multiple locations to Walton County with the intent to have sexual relations with a minor.

Arrested in the sting operation were:

John Reyes, 42, of Mobile, Ala., charged with one count obscene communication use computer to seduce solicit lure child and one charge obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian;

Ren Greco, 25, of Lynn Haven; charged with one count obscene communication use computer to seduce solicit lure child and one count obscene communication travel to meet after use computer to lure child;

Mohammed Alhamdy, 30, of Fort Walton Beach, charged with one count obscene communication use computer to solicit parent guardian consent and one count obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian;

Charles Maines, 21, of Ebro, charged with one count obscene communication use computer to solicit parent guardian consent and one count obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian;

Jerry Hartman, 40, of Fort Rucker, Ala., charged with one count obscene communication use computer to solicit parent guardian consent and one count obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian;

William Moodie, 24, of Sandestin, charged with one count obscene communication use computer to seduce solicit lure child and one charge misdemeanor obscene communication;

Timothy Coffey, 39, of Fort Walton Beach, charged with one count obscene communication use computer to solicit parent guardian consent and one count obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian;

Melvin Andrews, 24, of Fort Walton Beach, charged with one count obscene communication use computer to seduce solicit lure child and one count obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian;

use computer to seduce solicit lure child and one count obscene communication travel to meet after use computer to lure child;

Nick Walker, 22, of Freeport, charged with one count obscene communication use computer to solicit parent guardian consent and one count obscene communication travel to meet use computer to solicit guardian.

"We want those individuals who would prey on our children to be afraid of what is waiting behind the door for them," Walton County Sheriff Mike Adkinson said. "I want them to understand that when it comes to protecting our children, we are the boogeyman waiting to get them."

The operation ran from Nov. 13-18. During the course of the operation, numerous posts were placed on several social networking sites. The undercover profiles that were used online were mostly of juvenile females and males with the approximate age of 12 to 13 years old.

The online advertisements had been posted to target suspects who engage in sexual activities with underage minors within the state of Florida.

Ten individuals responded to online advertisements through the use of email and electronic communications.

According to police, during conversations between some of the suspects and the undercover officer, who was posing as a 12-year-old female's mother, the suspects solicited the "mother" to engage in sexual activity with the 12-year-old female.

Other conversations con-

sisted of the suspect engaging in conversations with the undercover officer, posing as a 13-year-old male, and the suspect soliciting the 13-year-old male to engage in sexual activity, according to police.

During the course of the conversations, the suspects obtained an address, and upon arrival at the location the suspects were all taken into custody. The suspects' ages ranged from early 20s to early 50s, and occupations run the gamut from active-duty military to steel worker, retail sales, unemployed and a preacher.

All suspects were booked at the Walton County Department of Corrections. Each suspect was issued a \$1 million bond with the release conditions of no contact with minors and that they be required to wear an electronic tracking device, according to police.

To combat the online sexual exploitation of children, many hours were devoted to the planning and execution of this operation, Adkinson said. In the coming weeks, additional arrests could be made in connection with Operation Turkey Hunt.

In addition to the Walton County Sheriff's Office, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, St Johns County Sheriff's Office, Gainesville Police Department, Escambia County Sheriff's Office, Pensacola Police Department, Bay County Sheriff's Office, Tallahassee Police Department and Crestview Police Department all participated in the task force investigation.
