Growth strategies taking shape

The Washington County Chamber of Commerce hosted the fourth in a series of Economic Development Symposia on Thursday at the Panhandle Area Education Consortium in Chipley.

The previous three symposia helped provide insight into how

economic development works and identified Washington County's needs, strengths and weakness. Collaborative member Terry Ellis opened the meeting, explaining this meeting was simply the next step on the path to a stronger local economy.

"We're just putting the details together," said Ellis, who serves as manager of West Point Home Inc. in Chipley. "Jobs represent op-

portunity, and the challenge is to forget about district lines and city limits and do this for our families."

The collaborative posed three questions that were discussed and answered by four groups in "break-away" sessions: What existing assets do we have that can be used to stimulate economic development? How can we enhance those assets to improve their marketability? How do we fund those

enhancements?

There was no shortage of answers from the participants. Assets identified included the county's proximity to transportation corridors such as I-10 and highways 77 and 90, availability of large tracts of quality land, quality hospital and education systems, low crime and existing infrastructure.



Gaming measure might cover slots

TALLAHASSEE — Washington County might get its one-armed bandits after all.

A state Senate gaming panel revived the idea Monday as some lawmakers pushed to give counties that approved slots by local voter referendum the right to operate them.

Washington, Gadsden and Hamilton counties have approved slot machines, but state Attorney General Pam Bondi has blocked them. Ebro

Keen remembered for 'giving back'

A Washington County man is being remembered as a loving family man and friend this week after succumbing to injuries he received in a car accident last Monday, February 10.

The Florida Highway Patrol reports Samuel Aldon Keen, 40, was traveling westbound on County Road 276 around 4 p.m. and entered the northbound lands of State Road 75 (Highway 231) and crossed the path of a semi truck, driven by Jonnie W. McClendon, 68, of Georgia.

The front of the semi collided with the left side of Keen's 2000 Dodge van, sending the van to rest facing west in the southbound lanes. The semi came to rest facing north across the northbound lanes and left turn lane.

Keen was airlifted to Bay Medical Center, where he was pronounced dead Tuesday, February 11. Keen's fiancée, Heather Lynn Carter, who is expecting the couple's first child, was a passenger in the van. Carter was transported to Jackson Hospital, where she was treated and released later that same day.

Keen's sister, Charlotte Miller, says while her family is grieving their loss, she hopes Keen will be remembered for his contributions to his community.

"Sammy loved to give back," says Miller. "He enjoyed working as a music DJ and would often donate his services to non profit events, such as Chipley's ROTC program. He was a great friend, father, brother and son and never met a stranger." Keen had four children, with a daughter expected this summer.

Arrests made by JCSO in separate domestic complaints

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office made two arrests last week after re-

sponding to two separate domestic disturbances.

Deputies were dispatched to Holly Timber Road around 8:16

p.m. Saturday, Feb. 8 in response to a domestic altercation

Deputies report the investigation found 52-

year-old Rebecca Barnes of Cottondale "slapped her husband" and "struck him with a piece of heavy-duty cookware", causing visible injuries.

Mrs. Barnes was lodged in the Jackson County Correctional Facility to await first appearance on charges of aggravated battery domestic.

Deputies also responded to 4th Avenue in Alford around 6:20 p.m. Sunday, February 9 regarding a report of armed domestic violence. According to reports, 50-year-old Charles Wamer, Jr. of Alford "became angry over his niece and her boyfriend smoking in the house".

As the argument escalated, Wamer reportedly pulled a pocket knife and threatened both subjects, stating that he would "kill them."

When the female victim advised she was calling the law enforcement, Wamer fled the scene.

He was located a short time later and arrested on charges of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon domestic.

No one was injured in the incident.

Ideas to enhance those existing assets included creating and keeping a current inventory of available land tracts and their available resources, such as water and sewer access. Also discussed was the importance of pre-developing the areas most desirable to develop by initiating new infrastructure. Promoting the community and developing continuity between local government entities, merchants and the private sector were also listed as a priority.

Funding ideas ranged from partnering with the Tourist Development Commission for capital improvements to earmarking a percentage of county land sales to contribute to the economic development fund. Vernon's strong recreation base also was discussed, along with the potential to enhance it through state grants. More state and federal grants also could be identified through establishing a lobby relation in Tallahassee to listen out for funding opportunities.

"It's time for us to stop talking about it and do something about it," said John Robbins of Bay Solutions. "You have a lot more power than you realize. Together, we can do it. Together, we can move mountains."

Greyhound Park has shown off plans to add slot machines to its existing facilities, which include a dog track and card room.

State Sen. Jack Latvala, R-St. Petersburg, pushed the hardest on the panel to open up slots in these counties. He said six counties across the state consented to slots already but can't use them.

Latvala said the voters' will should be recognized and took his argument a step further. He said all other counties should have an equal opportunity for a referendum to get their own slots.

The committee plans to propose comprehensive legislation this year that will include a requirement that any gambling expansion be approved as a state constitutional amendment, requiring 60 percent of the vote. Latvala wants all counties to have a chance at slots without that requirement.

Palm Beach County senators, where slots are stalled by the Bondi decision, also pushed to allow the casino-style gambling machines.

Other lawmakers avoided the contentious issue, including the panel's only Panhandle representative, Sen. Bill Montford, D-Tallahassee, whose district includes Calhoun and Gulf counties.

Comprehensive legislation

The committee and the public still haven't seen the first draft of

the comprehensive gaming legislation and what it will say about slots. Chairman Garrett Richter, R-Naples, ultimately will decide what goes into it and was non-committal on the issue Monday.

"We just have to continue to weigh all the impact ... that there is as we proceed in this," he said.

His hesitation comes even though Lee County, which he represents, also has its slots stalled because of Bondi's decision. Richter, however, agreed other counties should have a shot at their own referendum before the constitutional amendment requirement would take effect.

The constitutional amendment requirement is one of many provisions in the three-bill package that will come in proposed committee bills and be revealed Feb. 24.

Richter chose to delay making the bills' text public Monday; instead, he opted to open up the panel for more discussion on the legislation, offering only details of the legislation's current content.

Richter also reasserted his support for decoupling — ending a requirement that tracks run a minimum number of races to operate card rooms. Last week he got pushback from Latvala over fears about breeders' and trainers' jobs after decoupling, but he suggested a phase-in approach Monday, and although he gave no details that appeared to mollify Latvala.

The committee also reaffirmed its commitment to require tracks to report animal injuries.

Seminole Compact

The committee also voiced concerns over how the legislation would affect the Seminole Compact. The state government must renegotiate the banked card games portion of the compact by 2015; these games include blackjack and baccarat.

The concern is how much revenue the state would lose on the compact if it allowed a destination casino in Miami-Dade County and in Broward County. Both are included in the current legislation.

Palm Beach County senators still are pushing to get a destination casino in their county, but Richter wasn't interested. He said the state can't have "carte

blanche expansion of casinos."

The proposed legislation also would create a five-member "Gaming Control Board." The panel would oversee all gaming throughout the state, except for the Florida Lottery. The members would be appointed by the governor for staggered four-year terms and former lawmakers could not be picked for three years.

Some lawmakers opposed the Lottery's exclusion from the gaming commission. Latvala said the state constitution limits the number of state departments the Legislature can create and it's getting pretty close to that ceiling already. He suggested putting the Lottery under the gaming commission to free up a department.

Meanwhile, Sen. Oscar Braynon, D-Miami Gardens, took a jab at the Republican-led Legislature proposing multiple layers of government expansion. He said he wasn't sure about a provision allowing the state agriculture department to oversee bingo and other games when a gaming commission would exist. He also noted the state already has the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering.

"I would hope that if we are creating a new joint-oversight gaming department that we would try to condense things ... but again that's just me as the small-government Democrat that I am," he said.

"The cost is \$350 for the gig with Paron's Produce and Black Hat-Camo Productions as the event promoters."

Hot dog lunches will be sold at the Caryville Flea Market today, Feb. 22, March 7, March 15, March 29, April 5 and April 11 at \$4 a plate to raise funds for the entertainment.

In other business, the council approved resident Ashley Pate's request to in-

stall a gate limiting access to private property off of Strickland Road.

"People are going down that portion of road and dumping garbage and needles," Pate said. "I've spoke with the surrounding landowners, and they are more than happy with the idea. There will be a combination lock, and both the owners and the city will have access to the combination."

Council approved with a vote of 2-1, with council member Ransom Works voting "no."

"It's not right to block people off from accessing areas of the city," Works said.

The Council also approved a proclamation recognizing Feb. 11 as Dixie Phonics Day. "Dixie Phonics" is a style of music as presented by Herbert J. "Kuntry" Carter, a 72-year-

old country singer from Leon County.

Carter said he created Dixie Phonics so North Florida and South Georgia would have a classification for the area's own unique sound, which he said is a combination of Cajun, Texas swing and bluegrass.

"This will allow local artists to have a platform to work from, especially if they're planning on going to Nashville," Carter said.

"This helps musicians connect. I'm creating a cultural exchange."

Millard French told the Council visitors representing the local Tourist Development Council will be at the next council meeting to discuss Caryville's old RV Park, the Farmer's Market and the old prison.

French also said the materials cost quote to fix the roof of the Caryville Recreational Center is

\$4,600, with local inmates providing the labor.

Council member Jim Taylor said they were "really close" to fixing the roof, with \$3,500 left in the Worm Fiddling account.

The Council also approved of Fire Chief Gene Forehand purchasing a new phone with a prepaid plan from Wal-Mart.

The Council will meet again in regular session at 6 p.m. March 11.


