

## Ag commissioner touts biofuels

**CHIPLEY** — The country needs a sensible energy policy, and Florida could play a vital role in showing the nation how to become less dependent on foreign oil, Florida's Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services Adam Putnam said

Wednesday.

Putnam was in Washington County this week, visiting local farmers and speaking to an early morning crowd at the Washington County Ag Center.

"Florida can play a role with renewable energy, such as the biomass facility using pine trees for fuel," Putnam said, referring to the Green Circle Bio Energy in

Graceville.

Green Circle Bio Energy has built the world's largest wood pellet plant in North Florida. The plant started production in May 2008 with an annual capacity of 560,000 tons, according to the company website.

The pellets are supplied to the power-generating industry for co-firing in coal-based power plants. Central heating companies are an-

other sector to be supplied.

Green Circle Bio Energy is projecting more pellet plants to be built in wood fiber-rich areas over the next few years.

Solar energy is another area in which Florida could lead the way.

"The technology is expensive now, but prices on things do come

**CHIPLEY** — Northwest Florida Community Hospital held a groundbreaking ceremony on Tuesday to celebrate an event that had been several years in the planning.

Hospital officials took shovels in hand to celebrate the construction of a \$1.7 million physicians of-

fice building — an idea that originated in 2002, said NFCH's President and CEO Patrick Schlenker.

"In 2007, the economy took a downturn and we had to put those plans on the shelf," Schlenker told the crowd of about 50 city and county officials and hospital employees gathered for the groundbreaking. "Then last year, things happened that let us take those

## Area churches prepare for Holy Week services

Several area churches are making preparations for Holy Week, which includes the religious holidays of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Vigil. Following those observances is Easter Sunday, long regarded as one

of the most sacred days of the Christian year. The celebration of Holy Week rites differs somewhat in the Eastern Orthodox liturgy and calendar. Easter is a moveable feast, meaning it falls on a different date each year.

On Palm Sunday, worshipers carry palm leaves, and some

## Mosquitoes threat to animals, humans

**CHIPLEY** — Pet owners and ranchers need to beware — this year's crop of mosquitoes can be a deadly threat.

The warm weather combined with the big rains has resulted in an early mosquito infestation, and things are bound to just get worse, said Washington County Extension

Director Andy Andreasen.

The mosquitoes can result in West Nile virus and Eastern equine encephalitis being spread to animals and even humans. The mosquitoes also can spread heartworms to dogs.

"The moisture we have had and the warm temperatures have helped them grow at an accelerated pace," Andreasen said.

"The process is algorithmic," he said. "One mosquito will lay 200 eggs, and those 200 mosquitoes will lay 200 eggs, and so on."

As the number of mosquitoes increases, so do the chances of disease being spread.

Migratory birds also play a part in the spreading of diseases, especially West Nile virus, Andreassen said. A bird can become infected by a mosquito, then fly 200 miles away, where it will in turn infect another mosquito,

passing the disease along.

The best protection against the diseases is vaccination, he said.

The disease also can be passed along to humans, Andreassen warned. "People need to be using DEET repellents if they are out in the woods, or out in the evening or early morning."

It is best to limit outside activities to the heat of the day, when mosquitoes are less active, he said.

also wear small crosses woven from palms. This is a remembrance of Jesus riding into Jerusalem while his followers scattered palms upon the ground as he passed by. Many Palm Sunday services begin outside of the actual church building, with people processing indoors while carrying palm leaves. There is often a reading of the Passion narrative, sometimes with parts of it being read or re-enacted by members of the congregation. Leftover palms from Palm Sunday are burned to obtain ashes for the following year's Ash Wednesday services.

Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper, and hence, the establishment of the Holy Eucharist (Communion). Some churches observe foot washing services at this time, following Jesus' example of washing his disciples' feet and honoring his commandment of brotherly love. Many churches strip the altar of all decorations at this time, or cover the altar in black. Crosses may be veiled.

Good Friday is the most solemn day of the Christian church calendar. This is the observance of Christ's death on the cross. In some churches, the cross is venerated. The Stations of the Cross may be observed, and some believers undergo religious fasting. The 3 p.m. hour is considered an especially holy time on Good Friday, as it is traditionally considered to be the hour at which Jesus died. Some churches hold services or prayers at that hour, while others vary service times to accommodate members who might be working during the afternoon.

Easter Vigil, or Holy Saturday, is a popular time in some churches for admitting new converts to the faith. It is observed on the Saturday before Easter Sunday. New members may be confirmed and/or baptized at this time, although some churches also hold Easter Vigil services without confirmation rites. The term "Easter Vigil" refers to the period of Holy Saturday after sundown, and is sometimes observed with the lighting of a fire or a new Paschal candle.

down," Putnam said. "Look at flat-screen TVs. They are a lot less expensive now than they were a few years ago."

"We have to become, as a nation, as energy independent as we can be. When my children look at the map of the Middle East, I want them to think that might be an interesting place to visit, to go see Biblical sites, but I don't want them thinking the economic future of their country is connected to what is happening over there every time a government changes hands. That part of the world needs to be irrelevant to our economy," Putnam said.

Putnam said BP is experimenting with sorghum crops for ethanol production in Florida. "We need to find

a better way to produce fuel using a crop other than corn. Using corn causes shortages of food supply and the prices of other things to go up," Putnam said. While sorghum is high in sugar content, it also is high in BTUs, which might make it an ideal alternative source for ethanol.

According to a 2009 Forbes magazine article, posted on Forbes.com, "corn ethanol swallows tax subsidies, jacks up food prices and doesn't do much to reduce the world's

carbon footprint.

"American farmers looking for a piece of the biofuels market should try growing sorghum along with sugarcane on their land," the article suggests.

A sorghum-sugarcane mix can yield double the ethanol per acre of land as corn, uses less fertilizer and doesn't raise food prices, according to Forbes.com. "Persuading farmers in the southern U.S. to give his fuel-producing plant a try would give his firm a nice boost but not have a huge impact."

Putnam said rural economic development isn't going to happen in Miami or St. Petersburg, but it is taking place in the agricultural parts of the state.

"We need to build on what we already have and revitalize our crops and family farms," Putnam said. "We want to look to these future trends and vertically integrate them, so our kids don't have to move away to get jobs, but they can come home and take agriculture into the future."

# Alford man arrested on moonshine charges

**CHIPLEY** — An Alford man was arrested on charges of making moonshine by ATF agents, the Jackson County Drug Task Force and the Washington County Drug Task Force on March 28, according to a news release.

Paul Daniels was arrested in Jackson County in connection with charges of sale or delivery of untaxed liquor (moonshine) and possession of more than 1 gallon of moonshine. Paul Daniels will appear in Washington County court on March 30 in connection

with charges of possession of a moonshine still and possession of less than one gallon of moonshine.

An investigation by agents with the Federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, and investigators with the two county drug task forces led to a search of the residence of Paul Edward Daniels, which is at 170 Kent Mill Pond Road in Washington County.

An investigation into the sale of untaxed "moonshine" alcohol in the area of Graceville was initiated March 15. Information

indicated Daniels regularly sold gallons of homemade "moonshine" alcohol. During the course of the investigation, agents purchased 1 gallon of "moonshine" alcohol from Daniels in Graceville, according to the release.

A search of Daniels house and property was conducted March 22. As a result of the search, investigators found Daniels in possession and control of a homemade still, still piping and a still worm designed and adapted to manufacture an alcoholic beverage, according to police. Also found in Daniels' possession was

a receptacle containing mash, a fermented liquid capable of being distilled into an alcoholic beverage, police said.

Certain raw materials such as whole corn, rye, oak chips, yeast and other material used in the manufacture of distilled spirits as well as plastic and glass containers that are commonly used to store or deliver "moonshine" alcohol were located on the premises and in control of Daniels. Daniels also was found to be in possession of a quantity of finished "moonshine" alcohol.

After the search of the

residence and property, all items deemed for use in the manufacture, delivery or storage of "moonshine" alcohol were seized and transported to the Washington County Sheriff's Office for safe storage until such a time when all items will be destroyed.

Any person violating the provisions of the law pertaining to the possession of a still apparatus or any part thereof as listed above or the manufacture or sale of "moonshine" alcohol is guilty of a felony of the third degree. Criminal charges are pending on Daniels.

## RMS holds Black History program

### Chipley man arrested on marijuana charges

Yohn conducted a traffic stop of 1999 Pontiac for equipment and registration violations and said he detected the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. Yohn conducted a search of the vehicle and found more than 20 grams of marijuana.

### Chipley man arrested on drug charges

Jr., 42, of Chipley was arrested when task force members executed a search warrant at a residence in Chipley following several months of investigation, according to a Chipley Police Department news release.

Beachum was arrested on charges of possession of cocaine, possession of crack cocaine with intent to distribute, possession of marijuana with intent to distribute and trafficking in hydrocodone (arrest warrant), according to police.

Task force member who executed the narcotics search warrant said Beachum was in possession of a significant amount of crack cocaine, marijuana that was packaged for distribution and cocaine.

Beachum was taken to the Washington County Jail, where he was booked on an outstanding warrant and charges resulting from the execution of the warrant.

### Westville man dies in motorcycle accident

**BONIFAY** — A Westville man was found dead after an apparent motorcycle accident on State Road 81 in Walton County, according to a Florida Highway Patrol report released Thursday. Cecil Durwood Harrell, 43, of Westville was found dead along State Road 81 just south of J.C. Siples Road by a passerby, according to the report.

The report said Harrell was riding a 2003 Suzuki GSX-R600Z motorcycle heading north when the motorcycle drifted off the paved portion of the roadway and onto the east shoulder of State Road 81.

According to the report, the motorcycle began to spin and overturned, throwing Harrell from the bike and onto a concrete culvert.

The bike was totaled.

First, it's a miracle that any plant I've personally handled is still living. Secondly, it's miraculous to see vibrant, green growing life arising from tiny seeds. I'm aware that I have nothing to do with actually producing the life force that stirs inside the newly forming plant. The plant awakens and begins seeking out the sun without my personal input or advice. Regardless of whatever triumphs and accomplishments I may have in my lifetime, I can't top that for sheer beauty. Without that life force, planting a seed in the ground becomes pointless. One might as well plant a stone.

The life force is known by many names. My father sometimes used the term "Innate Intelligence." I've heard people use the terms "Cosmic All," "the Divine" and other phrases, while many people of faith simply say "God." I am a tremendous fan of science and technology, but when I walk through the forest, my thoughts often turn

toward God rather than to the cleverness of man. A saying attributed to Jesus in the apocryphal Gospel of Thomas is worth noting here:

"Split a piece of wood; I am there. Lift a stone, and you will find me there."

The divine essence really is everywhere. It's in the elements of earth, air, fire and water that keep our planet alive. It's in the tiniest flower seed. Plant that seed and tend it carefully, and you'll witness the miracle of life with your own eyes. As much as I enjoy ornate architecture, I don't need a massive

cathedral in order to find spiritual inspiration. A flower, a friendly dog or a kind gesture from a neighbor will do just as nicely. These are all manifestations of the life force. We're intertwined with life in a sacred dance, and it's a dance that no one can sit out. We are, by necessity, active participants in the processes of life and nature.

Of course, nature isn't just about daffodils and fluffy kittens. It can also generate truly catastrophic events. My husband and I used to live near the Oklahoma state line. Thunderstorms are serious business in tornado country. When a storm would come rolling in, sometimes we'd sit outside on the yard swing and watch massive, horrific clouds coming in from the west. Everyone else, meaning all the sane people, would go scrambling indoors for cover. Not us. We'd sit there holding hands and looking for signs of rotation in the dark, rolling clouds. We wouldn't go inside

until we started getting pelted with hailstones. Why?

Because it was beautiful. I'm a weather geek. I feel a sense of unparalleled excitement before a major storm. It gives me a special, unique sense of awe. One year, while I was attending a Good Friday evening church service, the weather was unusually severe. During the readings about Jesus dying on the cross, the storm took a definite turn for the worse. The sky was suddenly filled with bizarre reddish-orange lightning and howling winds. It looked like the end of the world outside. But the service continued, even when we temporarily lost power and were reading by candlelight. The weather completely paralleled the Gospel reading. It seemed as if nature itself were expressing outrage over the indignities suffered by Christ.

I may come off as hopelessly naive by saying that I can sense life in a seemingly inanimate force like a storm, but there are times when I feel it keenly. A storm has a presence all its own. It can bless a field with rain or kill an entire household without thought, hesitation or remorse. It conveys the idea of life in both its renewal and destruction. Meteorology has made incredible strides in the past century, but make no mistake: mankind has not yet vanquished nature. I understand the theological fallacy of worshipping a creation (Nature) instead of a creator (God), but I'll admit that gale force winds make me want to pray. But so does seeing a plant growing. To me, the entire cycle of life is holy. It's holy because of the force that lies

behind it. With every leaf or flowing stream, every display of nature, I'm overwhelmed by a sense of relentless, unstoppable, magnificent life.

Even death, because it is a component of the life cycle, is sacred to me. A very gifted author once wrote some interesting words on the subject. In his book "Cat's Cradle", Kurt Vonnegut described a fictitious religion called Bokonomism. Particularly intriguing are the words that compose this religion's last rites. The words have stayed with me ever since I first read them as a teenager. Many critics assert that this passage is satirical and intended to poke fun at organized religion, but it doesn't really matter to me. I find it moving, nonetheless. So I'll leave you with this small excerpt from "Cat's Cradle":

God made mud.  
God got lonesome.  
So God said to some of the mud, "Sit up!"  
"See all I've made," said God, "the hills, the sea, the sky, the stars."  
And I was some of the mud that got to sit up and look around.  
Lucky me, lucky mud.  
I, mud, sat up and saw what a nice job God had done.  
Nice going, God.  
Nobody but you could have done it, God! I certainly couldn't have.  
I feel very unimportant compared to You.  
The only way I can feel the least bit important is to think of all the mud that didn't even get to sit up and look around.  
I got so much, and most mud got so little.  
Thank you for the honor!  
Now mud lies down again and goes to sleep.  
What memories for mud to have!  
What interesting other kinds of sitting-up mud I met!  
I loved everything I saw!  
Good night.

plans back off the shelf." The 11,512-square-foot medical office building will be built on the northeast side of the hospital's property. The cost of \$1.7 million includes construction and furnishings.

"The building will house three physicians' practices and other medical services," said Janet Kinney, NFCH chief operating officer. "The building will also free up some space in the hospital."

The building will be constructed with brick to match the existing facility.

Kinney said she hopes the building will be completed in 6 to 7 months.

The new building will allow the hospital to provide needed services, she said. "It will give us the ability to bring in more physicians and will grow medical care for the community."

The more services NFCH can provide, the less patients will have to travel for medical care. "Some of our patients can't afford to travel for their treatments," she said.

Another area the new building will affect is the DaVita dialysis service at the hospital. The plan is to provide more space in the hospital for DaVita once the new building is completed.

DaVita is one of the country's largest dialysis providers. As of Sept. 30, DaVita operated or provided administrative services at 1,777 dialysis facilities, serving approximately 138,000 patients, according to davita.com.

NFCH is a 59-bed health care facility that includes a 25-bed critical access hospital, a 34-bed long-term care facility and a home health agency.
