WAUSAU — The 45th annual Possum Festival begins Friday, Aug. 1, with the Possum King and Queen Contest, which will begin at 6 p.m. The gates for the event open at 5 p.m.

Emma LeighAnne Donaldson was crowned 2014 Miss Fun Day on July 26 in Wausau when the Miss

Fun Day Pageant kicked off the 45th annual Possum Festival.

Nearly thirty contestants competed for titles at the pageant, including two young Fun Day King contestants.

Donaldson won the coveted Miss Fun Day title, while Cara McKinley Griffin was first runner-up.

The festival was cre-

ated by Dalton Carter, who is still a Wausau resident and often referred to as the "Father of the Possum Festival." Carter is expected to be in attendance, as well as a rumored appearance to be made by Gov. Rick Scott, or Lt. Gov. Carlos Lopez-Cantera.

The festival weekend begins at 5 p.m. Friday with the perennial favorite, the

Possum King and Queen Contest, and followed on Saturday with the annual Fun Day, which features food, music, and fun all day long.

The Possum Festival is sponsored by the Wausau Volunteer Fire Department.

All the events are held at or around the Possum Palace. The Saturday events

### Local girl sells lemonade to raise money for Love in Action

CHIPLEY — Sam Hagan, Director of local ministry and charity "Love in Action" wasn't quite prepared for the response he got after speaking about the organization to the 10 and 11 year old Vacation Bible School class at First Baptist Church in Chipley.

"You never know with kids how they will react or the depth with which they understand," said Hagan. "I explained to the children that there were children and families who aren't as fortunate as others, and that helping them doesn't always mean giving money,

that we can give items we no longer want or need to make a difference."

But 11 year old Keegan Welch, a rising sixth grader at Roulhac Middle School, not only understood; she decided to take action.

Welch became determined to help her community. She stopped by to see Hagan at his office shortly after his VBS visit, surprising him with a box containing dolls, clothing, and \$15 of her

own allowance.

"I was blown away," said Hagan. "I was moved by the impact this one little girl made all by herself."

But Keegan wasn't finished with her mission.

"Not everyone has a nice house or a mom and dad who loves them like I do," said Welch. "I felt like I could do something more to help."

She asked her parents, Chris and Wendy Welch of Chipley, if she could have a lemonade stand to raise money for the organization.

"Mr. Hagan told us how hard it is sometimes to keep Love in Action running, and my sister, Karley,

and I had a lemonade stand to raise more money," said Welch. "We made signs and set up at my aunt's house across from the (Washington Rehabilitation and Nursing Center), and we sold lemonade and cookies."

Welch was soon back in Hagan's office to present him with a \$163 donation.

"It brought tears to my eyes," said Hagan. "She challenges us adults to do what God wants us to do. For an 11 year old child to do something like this, what more can we do for others as adults?"

"It inspires me to no end that our children are still doing and teach-

ing us adults what we should be doing, and it says a lot about their parents."

Hagan says the organization will take the money and add it to funds which help pay electrical, water, and medical bills for local families in need.

The organization will also be providing two school outfits per qualifying child, as long as supplies last, during office hours for the first two weeks in August.

Love in Action is located at 1359 Watts Ave. in Chipley and is open from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays.

**Police seek tips on latest killing**

**PANAMA CITY** — Law enforcement officers requested residents keep information flowing Monday but asked residents to stop spreading rumors on social media after being inundated with false reports of dead bodies being found over the weekend throughout Panama City.

None of the people reporting suspiciously parked cars throughout the city have been charged with filing false police reports. But since Thursday's discovery of the body of Tavish Greene, 24, in the trunk of a 2004 Chevy Malibu behind 526 E. Eighth Court, law enforcement officials have experienced a surge in missing person reports and suspicious vehicles, Police Chief Scott Ervin told media outlets Monday during a press conference.

One of the three incorrect reports led Panama City police to a car in St. Andrews. Because of the report, police popped the car's trunk, which left it unsecured. Police then had the car towed to impound for safe keeping, Ervin said.

"We have to act on that kind of information to at least verify if there is or isn't, and there was no body in that trunk," he said. "A lot of it appears to be social media or somebody heard someone say this. It's all rumor; but wheels start to turn and they start drawing inferences on their own."

Sheriff Frank McKeithen and Springfield Police Chief Philip Thorne also were present and promoting community assistance in reporting unlawful activities.

Officials have not released the cause of Greene's death, but Ervin said Monday that investigators have enough information to work the case as a homicide investigation.

Greene had been missing since July 20 before being found in the trunk of his car Thursday morning. His mother said he had received death threats after witnessing a passenger in his car get shot in the head near KJ's Nightclub, 908 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd., about 3 a.m. June 9.

The shooting allegedly was fueled by a confrontation that started when 19-year-old Jshun Smith, Greene's passenger, bought a drink for a woman at the nightclub, according to police reports.

The confrontation continued out into the parking lot where other witnesses said they saw Khiry Ross, 24, and Marcus Mathis, 25, engage in a shootout with Smith.

Smith, of Atlanta, was struck in the head at some point and fell out of Greene's car onto the road as the vehicle sped away, police reported.

Ross and Mathis have been arrested in connection with the shooting. Ross was charged with an open count of murder and Mathis is charged with being an accessory. Both men are in

the Bay County Jail.

Smith's death was one of five recent gun-related slayings concentrated in a 1-mile area of the city.

"We've started increasing our resources in these particular areas and we're going to continue to do that," Ervin said. "There are things going on that we are concerned about — drugs and gun crimes."

Police also addressed a Saturday shooting at Andrews Place Apartments at 1914 Frankford Ave.

No one was injured in the shooting, which occurred about 2:30 a.m., police reported.

Darrian Aundre Guilford Hamilton, 36, has been charged in the shooting, and police said no direct link between the shooting and Greene's death existed.

A second person is believed to be involved in the shooting but has not been identified.

Police are offering an unspecified reward for information leading to the identification and arrest of the second person and asked people to look for official reports of missing persons or found bodies before turning to social media.


"A lot of people have information involving gang activity, drug activity and gun activity and we want them to report that," Ervin said. "If they don't want to call us directly, we have Crime Stoppers that they can remain anonymous and get that information to us, and hopefully we can prevent some of these things from happening."

# AAA: Gas prices fall to lowest level in 4 months

Gasoline is selling at the lowest price since March amid rising gasoline supplies and falling oil prices. The national and Florida average prices for a gallon of regular unleaded gasoline are on a 30-day streak of declines. Prices in Georgia and Tennessee have fallen 34 and 32 consecutive days


respectively. "Oil prices briefly rose following the crash of Malaysian Airliner Flight MH17, but gas prices didn't skip a beat last week," said Mark Jenkins, spokesman, AAA, The Auto Club Group.

"Motorists continue to enjoy discounts at the pump, and that's likely to continue this week."

The price of oil fell more than a dollar on the

NYMEX this week. WTI settled at \$102.09 a barrel Friday, \$1.04 cheaper than the week prior. Oil is trading lower as gasoline supplies reach a four-month high and outpaces demand.

The national average price for a gallon of gasoline is six cents cheaper than last week. The average price also fell five cents in Florida, Georgia and Tennessee.

I also found my peace with Susie. I know she was just trying to help, much like other friends and family members who try to get me to take another route when they fear I'm traveling down the wrong road.


Thank goodness for well-meaning folks, both real and electronic, who care enough to suggest you take a moment to cry on a shoulder and recalculate your route.

The Joseph Middlebrooks Park is wonderfully maintained and has beautiful foliage decorating the park. Not to mention there are nice garden swings throughout. I feel compelled to tell "the rest of the story." There is another face to Corrections that is never presented to the general public. Of the 22,398 employees in the Department of Corrections the vast majority are honorable, caring men and women. I've listened to many inmates tell me about officers like Major Duncan, who "is firm, but very fair, he treats us like he really cares about us." I've watched Assistant Warden Jordan and his team as they've gathered up discarded doors and other materials

to build a hydroponic garden for their inmates so they can learn a skill and have the satisfaction of working with growing plants inside the stark razor wire and hard concrete buildings. In the midst of this horrendous news could we also express appreciation and respect for these unsung public servants, the correctional officers who lay their lives on the line daily for long hours and minimal pay while putting their whole hearts into a job, sincerely longing and working to send prisoners back out of prison as productive citizens?

## 'That was Spiva's leadership'

If anyone needed official notification that the era of dominance for Rutherford football was at an end, Ernest Spiva's death last week provided closure.

More accurately, it could be written that era ended in 2002, which was the last season Rutherford made the playoffs and exceeded 10 wins.

In recent years, it has taken the Rams up to four seasons to win as many games as the state runners-up of 1997 and 1999.

Make no mistake, it all started with Ernest Spiva. He made the hire of Steve Hardin in 1991, and that began a chain of events that brought Rutherford to a plateau of prominence on a statewide level that survived 10 years.

During 1996-2002 the Rams averaged 11 wins per season and twice reached the state championship game. Two other times, in 1993 and 1996, Rutherford was a state semifinalist.

It reached the point during Hardin's tenure that the question wasn't whether or not the Rams would field a strong team, but how lengthy a playoff run they would make.

Hardin made the drive from Jacksonville, where he currently is a high school offensive coordinator in St. Augustine, for Spiva's funeral on Thursday. He said he'd maintained his relationship with his former mentor upon leaving here a decade ago and had been in regular contact with Spiva since his health declined.

Hardin recalled their first meeting prior to his taking the Rutherford job in the spring of 1991.

"The guy just blew me off my feet, he was so positive," Hardin said. "I went over again (from Tallahassee) and we sat in there and talked, and Clyde Mills was in there, too, and he blew me away."

"Spiva had the it factor of putting a team together like football coaches do. Clyde, Larry Bolinger, Eddie

Comerford. I can remember that first spring jamboree where I said none of these kids have ever rode the bus from the stadium back to the school as a winner. I'm gonna coach this thing like it was a state title game. He said, 'Let's do it.'

By the time Hardin got off the phone he'd relived virtually every season the two worked together. The '91 shootout where Leon's Tamarick Vanover fumbled and Rutherford recovered. Hardin immediately discarded all of the strategy he'd planned, and after running a fake on first down because he knew Leon would be selling out to block a field goal, sent out place-kicker Corey Lydick to win it.

Rutherford became known for its travel during that era, often going out of state for games or sometimes to Orlando.

"I never ever worried with Mr. Spiva for saying we've got to get out (of school) on Thursday again," Hardin said. "The teachers; it was no problem. That was Spiva's leadership. The education, the IB program, the athletic program, and now it was the kids' school. When somebody would ask them they'd answer 'I go to Rutherford High School' right away instead of mumbling some answer. That was so important."

Hardin said that when every ninth-grade class came in, Spiva's goal was to know each student's name by the end of the semester. When students came late to school, or transferred in from out of the county, their first appointment was with Ernest Spiva to get acquainted.

"One thing I learned from him was that when a kid got in trouble he would get all over them, but by the time they left his office he would make them feel good," Hardin said. "He knew how to communicate with people."

When Rutherford returned to Springfield with its first district title in 1991, the team bus received quite a reception.

"He waited at the school, and that crowd in the parking lot on a Monday night was unbelievable," Hardin said. "He pulled all the han-

dles. I did the coaching and he let me do it. I tell people that I had the Cadillac of principals. He was constantly in my thoughts."

The truly giddy experience for Rutherford football was during those first two years of the sudden rise to prominence and beyond, and Ernest Spiva was a fixture stalking the sideline on Friday nights. In some ways, despite all the wins and titles accumulated, it never got better than that Monday night in November 1991.

When the Rams followed with nine wins in 1992, loyal supporters starved for so long happily went along for the joyride. That was the euphoric time. With success comes greater expectations and harsher scrutiny. Not all of the loyalists remained steadfast as the program continued to reach new levels, which sometimes were accompanied by rumors of impropriety.

But as attrition occurred, success also bred an extended family of supporters who reveled in the attention of statewide notoriety.

Hardin would have a one-word slogan each season on a sign where the players entered and exited the practice field. Whether it was B-E-L-I-E-V-E or C-O-M-M-I-T-M-E-N-T players would jump up and slap the sign each practice.

"There wasn't a day when he left school and we were practicing that he did not come out there and be seen by those kids," Hardin said. "Spiva was so funny, because he would jump up and hit the sign like every kid that played for me. One day he said, 'You've got that sign a little too high.' I had Clint (McCrory) go out and move it down."

In recent years, Spiva was just as anxious to talk about Florida State football, or perhaps the ferry that at one time transported travelers from Panama City to Panama City Beach before the first Hathaway Bridge was constructed.

He remained informed, committed, provocative and curious, which isn't too shabby an epitaph for both the educational system he fashioned his professional career around, or a lifetime well served.


## It turns out some names are all wet



**BBB warning: Fun runs promise more than they deliver**

Better Business Bureau, has been hearing lots of complaints about various fun runs that have been canceled with short notice, often with no refunds. Last week, BBB of Greater Cleveland reported on a 5K Foam Fest that was canceled with just four days' notice. An email to paid participants said,

"Unfortunately, we're not able to provide you with a refund." A similar event scheduled for southern California also was canceled with the same "no refund" email. The race website says they have ceased operations as of July 17. Another race company has offered Foam Fest participants a discount code for future theme races.

The two 5K Foam Fest events were to be

put on by Round House Racing Team, which is based in Utah. Since the cancellation was announced, BBB Utah has received 90 complaints from participants looking for refunds of the \$45 to \$75 registration fees they were charged. The BBB is processing those complaints now, and an alert was added to the company's BBB Business Review.

This cancellation news came just a month after Runners' World reported that the Electric Foam 5K had shut down after numerous race cancellations and an F rating with BBB for its parent company, Color Mania 5K. A number of BBB's and at least one national media outlet had been investigating the canceled Electric Foam 5Ks when the company

announced it was closing down all the events. Some participants received refunds through Groupon. The company's website said it was filing for Chapter 7 bankruptcy.

If you are thinking about participating in a themed fun run, here are some BBB tips:

- **Do your research.** Check out the company's BBB Business Review and search online for additional information before signing up.

- **Understand the terms and conditions.** In some cases, promoters say on their websites they don't offer refunds, but many consumers don't read the fine print before hitting "I agree" to long online documents.


- **Check the local venue.** Contact the park or other venue to confirm that the event is scheduled.

- **Pay with a credit card.** Charges made on a credit card can be disputed after a purchase, whereas debit, cash or wire transfer transactions cannot.

- **Keep documentation of your order.** After completing the onlineregistrationprocess, you should receive a confirmation receipt. Print out and keep a copy of the confirmation and any supporting documentation for future reference.

- **Check out the charity.** Most fun runs are for-profit, but if the promoters claim a portion of the proceeds will go to charity, check it out on give.org to make sure your donation is going to a trustworthy charity. Be wary of sound-alike names similar to more famous charities.

# March of Dimes reminds parents to immunize children for new school year

March of Dimes, the leading organization for mom and baby health, urges parents to immunize their children against infectious diseases before the beginning of the 2014-2015 school year. Influenza, pertussis (whooping cough), and measles are just a few of the serious vaccine-preventable diseases that still affect children and adults in the United States today.

"Immunizations are as important today as they were in the age of polio in the 1950s, when the March of Dimes funded the pioneering work that resulted in the vaccine that still

is used today against this deadly disease," said Dr. Karen Harris, Chair of the Program Services Committee for the March of Dimes Florida Chapter. "Back-to-school season is the time of the year when we especially encourage kids to get their shots to protect their health."

Even small groups of unimmunized people can quickly spread disease, Dr. Harris says. In the U.S., both measles and whooping cough are at epidemic rates.

According to the Florida Department of Health, the most recent school year (2013 – 2014) immunization status reports for all 67 Florida counties indicate rates of:

- Kindergarten: 93.2 percent (state and National goal is 95 percent)

- Seventh grade: 96.6 percent (state goal is 95 percent; national goal is 90 percent)

- Two-year-old (2013): 86.72 percent (state and national goal is 90 percent)

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says diseases can spread when infected people cough, sneeze, or even talk. Children may spread the flu virus for up to three days before they show any symptoms and for longer than a week after getting sick, putting their classmates at risk of becoming sick, too.

The CDC, the March of

Dimes, and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists all recommend that, in addition to children, all pregnant women and those planning to become pregnant should get an annual flu shot in the fall. The normal biological changes of pregnancy put pregnant women at increased risk of the harmful effects of flu. Recent research suggests that the flu vaccine may also lower a woman's risk of having a stillbirth or miscarriage. "The flu vaccine helps protect your body from infection, and this protection is in turn passed on to your baby during pregnancy," Harris said, explaining that immunization during pregnancy

helps keep the newborn safe during the first few months of life until he or she is ready for the first set of vaccinations.

Parents, grandparents, caregivers, and anyone in close contact with an infant should get an adult pertussis vaccine to help protect themselves and to help stop the spread of the disease to the newborns in their lives.

Newborns are most at-risk for this highly contagious and often serious disease because they don't begin receiving their own vaccinations until they are two months old and may not be protected until they have received at least three doses of an infant pertussis vaccine.







# The dangers of leaving Fido in a hot car

If we find the scorching summer temperatures unbearable outside of our cars, imagine how our furry friends feel when trapped inside. Dog fatalities from extreme heat in cars are avoidable and all-too common. Although leaving your pet in the car while you run a few errands might seem harmless, dogs can suffer from heatstroke in a matter of minutes, even if parked in the shade with the windows cracked.

"One study in the Journal of Pediatrics showed that cars parked in the sun showed an average of 40 degrees

increase in internal temperature," said Dr. James Barr, assistant professor at the Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine & Biomedical Sciences. "This means, in 100 degree temperature, the car could reach 140 degrees."

Although rolling the car windows down might seem like a workable solution, this is not the case, even if you only plan to leave Fido in the car for a short period of time. Exposure to extreme heat for less than 20 minutes still can cause internal damage

and be extremely harmful in the long run.

"That same study in the Journal of Pediatrics showed that the rate of temperature rise was slower if the car window was rolled down, but still remarkably dangerous and reached the same levels after 60 minutes," Barr said. "So just rolling the window down is not sufficient."

When humans overheat we sweat, and as the sweat dries it takes excess heat with it. Our four-legged friends only perspire around their paws, which is not enough to cool the body, and pant to rid themselves of excess heat. While this is efficient in controlling their body heat,

it is of extremely limited effectiveness in high humidity or when in close quarters, such as a car.

"The body's internal temperature rises when the gain of heat outpaces the ability to dissipate heat," Barr said. "When locked in a car, body temperatures reach dangerous levels and organ damage can occur."

While letting Fido tag along on your grocery store run during cooler temperatures is safer, keep in mind that temperatures inside of the car can still rise 40 degrees above the outside temperature. "This means that the car temperature can reach 115 degrees when the temperature is

75 degrees outside," said Barr.

Also keep in mind that some states even have laws deeming it illegal to leave an animal in a confined vehicle, as well as numerous local ordinances prohibiting this. Even without a specific state or local law, this action could still constitute cruelty under some circumstances, and you ultimately might lose custody of the animal in question.

"Also be especially cautious if your pet has a medical condition," Barr said. "Respiratory, cardiac and neurologic conditions may all impair the pet's ability to dissipate heat, so it is especially important

to take precautions."

If you must travel somewhere with your pet during the summer, make sure they have access to plenty of water and proper ventilation and that the temperature they are kept in is reasonably low. Fatalities from heat stroke occur far too often, and our furry friends are relying on us to keep them out of harm's way.
