### Whitehead wins big

*Medical marijuana amendment fails; Gov. Scott wins by a hair*

A heated battle for Union County sheriff prompted many to count down the days and hours till Election Day 2014. Sheriff Brad Whitehead won big with nearly 70 percent of the vote against opponent Garry Seay.

When Union County Sheriff Jerry Whitehead passed away suddenly on Dec. 18, Gov. Rick Scott immediately appointed Chief Deputy Garry Seay, and then on Jan. 15 appointed Jerry's son, Brad Whitehead, as sheriff until voters could elect one — and choose they did.

In other county races, for School Board District 1, Allen Parrish beat Steve Peacock in a runoff with about 64 percent of the votes.

For County Commission District 2, Woody Kitler beat Steve Klein with nearly 57 percent of the vote.

4, incumbent M. Wayne Smith beat challenger Jeff Andrews with nearly 54 percent of the vote.

The sheriff's race may have been the reason for such a strong voter turnout for a Midterm Election. Over the past two decades, in Florida anywhere from 67 percent to 75 percent of voters have gone to the polls for a presidential election. However, just 47 percent to 66 percent voted in a midterm election. But over 72 percent of Union County voters turned out for this election — a strong showing. A total of 5,163 of the 7,170 registered voters cast a ballot.

Besides a heated sheriff's race, absentee and early voting may have helped boost turnout this year. A total of 1,054 voted absentee and 1,713 voted early, meaning over half the votes in this election were cast before Election Day.

A vicious governor's race and the medical marijuana amendment, number two, may also have gotten voters to the polls.

About 64 percent of Union County residents voted in favor of Amendment

1, almost 52 percent for Amendment 2 and over 46 percent for Amendment 3 — results that mirrored the state somewhat, meaning that only the first one will become part of the state constitution. An amendment requires 60 percent of the vote to pass.

Statewide, Gov. Scott narrowly defeated challenger and former governor Charlie Crist but failed to gain a majority thanks to third-party candidate Adrian Wyllie. Scott received 48 percent to Crist's 47 percent, with Wyllie taking 4 percent. County voters gave Scott over 55 percent of the vote to Crist's 38 percent and Wyllie's five percent.

The Republican cabinet won all their races. From county voters, Attorney General Pam Bondi received about 72 percent, Chief Financial Officer Jeff Atwater received over 76 percent and Commissioner of Agriculture Adam Putnam received over 76 percent.

Congressman Ted Yoho retained his seat statewide, with county voters giving him whopping 79 percent to Merihelen Wheeler's 19 percent and Howard "Term Limits" Lawson's 2 percent.

At the time of this writing, all election results were unofficial.

## LB man arrested for possession and transmission of child pornography

Agents with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Jacksonville Regional Operations Center today arrested Jeffrey Stephen Elliott, 28, at the Townsend House (235 Southwest Fourth Avenue) Unit 5 in Lake Butler on three counts each of possession of child pornography and transmission of child pornography.

Agents executed a search warrant at Elliott's residence today after receiving a tip that an electronic device was uploading child pornography to the Internet from the home.

Elliott was booked into the Union County Jail. The Office of the State Attorney, Eighth Judicial Circuit, will prosecute this case.

## LBMS ends drought, wins SMAC title

A game seemingly in control came down to the final seconds, with Willie Newsome and Trevor Rogers combining to tackle a Williston running back on the 1-yard line during a two-point conversion attempt to preserve a lead and eventually give the Lake Butler Middle School football team a 22-20 win in the Suwannee Middle School Athletic Conference championship game on Oct. 21 in Williston.

It was the first SMAC title for the Tigers since 2011.

Head coach Lamar Waters said it was good to see this year's eighth-graders rewarded with a trophy after a rough couple of seasons in 2012 and 2013.

"They had the opportunity to show people they could bring back a championship to Union County," Waters said.

The Tigers (7-1) earned the championship by avenging an earlier 28-14 loss to Williston—a game that saw Lake Butler fumble the ball nine times, make mistakes in pass coverage and commit other self-inflicted mistakes, Waters said.

Waters said the players did a good job of watching video of that

game, understanding what they did wrong and working to correct those mistakes. They entered the rematch in the SMAC title game with one purpose—to win.

"All the credit goes to the young men," Waters said.

Lake Butler jumped out to an 8-0 lead, thanks to a reception by tight end Josh Griffis. Williston, though, took advantage of a long kickoff return and a penalty on the Tigers, which had the host team begin the ensuing series on the Lake Butler 30-yard line. Williston would score, but a failed two-point conversion left the Tigers on top by a score of 8-6.

Runs by Newsome, Rogers and Phillip Harris helped the Tigers march downfield and get a score before halftime, with a Harris touchdown run putting Lake Butler up 14-6.

The Tigers opened the second half with a different look offensively, utilizing an unbalanced, eight-man line to move up and down the field, Waters said. This "nasty" formation resulted in another touchdown—a run by Newsome.

Williston was a little out of sorts offensively. The Tigers were hurt by the "waggle" in the teams' first meeting, the result being that Lake Butler worked for three weeks on the "waggle," Waters said.

After recovering a fumble, Williston lined up in a different offense, putting its quarterback out wide, while a running back took the snaps. It was a difficult matchup for the Tigers, with

Williston now lining up three players of at least 6 feet on the outside.

"That puts a lot of stress on you defensively," Waters said.

Williston scored with 1:13 to play, with a two-point conversion making the score 22-14. Williston attempted an onside kick, which bounced off the leg of one of the Lake Butler players and back into the hands of a Williston player. The eventual result was another touchdown, with the all-important two-point conversion to follow.

Waters said the Tigers were hurting, with linebacker Dalton Flanders out with a torn hamstring and linebacker Chesley Bivins hobbled some by a leg injury.

Fortunately for the Tigers, when Williston ran its play for the two-point conversion, it went away from the side of the field that had Bivins, a backup linebacker and the team's smallest cornerback. Waters said he liked his team's chances with Williston running a play toward

Rogers, who did just enough to hold the running back up until Newsome arrived to help finish the play off.

Williston's ensuing onside-kick attempt went out of bounds, capping what at one point in the season seemed improbable. Waters said Williston had been scoring an average of 50 points in most games, and other SMAC coaches didn't give the Tigers much of a chance. Waters himself admitted Williston poses quite the matchup challenge.

"The guys just believed," he said of his players.

Lake Butler opened this season 4-0 with wins over Mebane, Fort White, P.K. Yonge and Ruth Rains by a combined score of 86-26. After the 28-14 loss to Williston, the Tigers defeated High Springs 36-0 and Keystone Heights 46-0.

Waters and the rest of the coaching staff wish to express their thanks to all who supported the team—school administrators, parents and the community at large.

"The community just does such a great job supporting all of our athletic programs," Waters said.

a volleyball scholarship and major in criminal justice. Her plans are to join the Drug Enforcement Administration or FBI Behavioral Analysis Unit.







His woodcarvings are on display at places such as Georgia's Art Museum in Atlanta and here locally in Union County at Lowell Shadd's Museum of Florida Wild Life.

Set to begin at 10:30 a.m.,


the ceremony is timed to coincide with the anniversary of the end of major hostilities in World War I — the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, 1918.

## In case of heart attack: Use AED Or Hands-Only CPR

The Union County Fire Department has placed 10 AED (automated external defibrillator) units throughout the county in the event of a heart attack.

An AED is an easy-to-use computerized medical device to use when someone has gone into cardiac arrest. The device can check a person's heart rhythm and then recognize a rhythm that requires a shock, and automatically apply it an attempt to restart a heartbeat.

The AEDs installed throughout the county are Cardiac Science's Powerheart AED G3 Plus, which is fully automatic. "Clear voice prompts and helpful text screen guide the user through the entire rescue operation," according to the product website. After someone places two self-stick pads on the patient, the AED automatically

applies a shock when needed, and only then. It also provides a "CPR metronome functionality (to) pace users through chest compressions."

Fire Chief and EMS Director Mitch Andrews said that an AED has been placed at the Lake Butler Community Center, Union County Public Library, O.J. Phillips Recreation Complex, Worthington Springs Community Center and New River Regional Landfill. An AED has also been placed on each UCFD quick response (QR) unit. That means that every fire station has one on hand when the QR is there.

Plans for the location of a 10th unit is still undetermined.

## Making memories for others


Students in high school are making memories they'll look back fondly on, but art students at Bradford High School are also making memories for children in other countries.

Teacher Candy Woloshchuk and her students have been participating in the Memory Project—an activity in which students make portraits of disadvantaged, abused or orphaned children in other parts of the world.

"It's an opportunity for the kids to give back to the less fortunate," Woloshchuk said.

The Memory Project was developed by Ben Schumaker in 2004. While working at an orphanage in Guatemala, Schumaker saw that the children there had few belongings, such as photos, that would later serve as childhood memories.

Part of the Memory Project's mission, as stated on its website

(memoryproject.org), is "aiming to provide (children) with special memories that capture a piece of their childhood—portable pieces of their personal history."

Woloshchuk said, "So often the children in these orphanages and homes—they'll never

have the opportunity to have a yearbook or have a photograph taken of them."

That's where the BHS students and other participating students come in. They are provided with photos of children taken by Memory Project personnel.

Art students then make portraits from those photographs.

Bradford High School students made portraits of children in Cambodia during the fall semester of 2013 and did portraits of children in Haiti this past spring.

This semester, the BHS students are doing portraits of children in Thailand.

BHS art student Kurtis Melvin said the project has been an enjoyable way to go beyond the boundaries of Bradford County.

"I don't know how to explain it," Melvin said, "but I guess it makes you feel good because you're expanding the (number of) people you know."

"It's expanding your views, I guess," Melvin added.

Once the portraits are done, the BHS students will have their photos taken holding the portraits. The portraits and photos will then be delivered to the children in Thailand by Memory Project personnel, who will then photograph the children holding their portraits. Those photos will be sent to the BHS students.

It can be hard to determine if the child actually likes his or her portrait. Memory Project literature presented to the art students states: "When photographing the children with their portraits, some of them will not smile even if we stand on our heads and juggle marshmallows with our toes. Often they are just feeling too nervous and shy—imagine being a child and having strange foreigners hovering over you—though in certain cultures kids are simply not trained to

smile for the camera. (In certain cultures, they're actually taught to look serious in photos.)

"So if a child is not smiling, please do not think it's because she or he doesn't like the portrait. That is almost never the case."

Melvin admitted that was one

of the things that has made him nervous about doing the portrait, wondering whether or not the recipient will like it.

"You've just got to do your best and hope they do (enjoy it)," he said.

Woloshchuk said despite that understandable fear of the unknown, her students have enjoyed their participation in the

Memory Project.

"The kids have had a great time doing it," Woloshchuk said, adding that not only is the project a way for them to hone their skills in portrait work, but it is a way to earn community service points.

BHS students received fact sheets about Thailand, including such information as:

- Thailand's name in the Thai language is Prathet Thai, which means "land of the free. Thailand is the only country in southeast Asia that was never colonized by a European nation.

- Thailand's population is 67 million, and its size is just larger than Wyoming.

- Thailand's capital is known globally as Bangkok, but its formal name in the Thai language consists of eight words comprised of almost 170 letters. The English translation of the formal name is: City of Angels, Great City of Immortals, Magnificent City of the Nine Gems, Seat of the King, City of Royal Palaces, Home of Gods Incarnate, Erected by Visvakarman at Indra's Behest.
- In Thailand, the most


important part of the body is considered the head. No one must touch another person—even a child—on the head. Thais always try to keep their heads lower than the head of any person who is older as a way of showing respect.

- The famous Bunker twins—Chang and Eng—were born in a village near Bangkok in 1811. The brothers were joined at the sternum, and their condition and birthplace led to the use of the

term "Siamese twins."

The fact sheet also describes some of the conditions in Thailand. Deep poverty exists in urban and rural areas despite Thailand's economically strong cities. Many children have to work or beg on the streets, making them vulnerable to abuse, illness and even human traffickers.

Some youth in Thailand have also lost one or both parents to HIV/AIDS.

## Tigers dominate Devils, cap district play with 41-12 win

On Halloween, the Union County High School football team set the pace in its domination of the Williston Red Devils on its first play of the game following a Williston fumble on a kickoff, scoring on a 33-yard pass play from Caleb Cox to Zak Lee.

Things went downhill from there for the host Devils, who got spooked in the last District 7-1A game for both teams. Union, which won 41-12, finished 3-1 in the district and improved to 7-2 overall.

The Tigers, who led 7-0 less than 15 seconds into the game, took advantage of another early turnover, with Cox hooking up with Antwan Durn for a 15-yard touchdown. The PAT put Union up 14-0.

Good defensive plays by Alden McClellon, Jacquez Warren and Joseph Merriex helped force Williston to punt on the ensuing series. The Union offense worked it down the field before Cox threw his third touchdown pass of the first quarter—a 40-yarder to Isaiah Johnson. The Tigers, after the PAT, led 21-0 with 3:01 left in the first quarter.

Cox wasn't done, though, thanks to an opportunistic defense that

recovered another fumble. The quarterback connected with Franklin Williams twice, with the second pass resulting in an 11-yard touchdown with less than two minutes left in the opening quarter. The extra point by Brenan Clyatt put the Tigers up 28-0.

Just into the second quarter, Williston went for it on fourth down, but the Tigers' defense pushed the Devils back. However, Cox threw his one interception of the game to give Williston the ball back.

The Devils were forced to punt, and the Tigers quickly scored again with a 30-yard touchdown pass from Cox to Cody Miller on third down. The extra point put the Tigers up 35-0.

On the ensuing kickoff, Union County's McClellon leveled Williston's receiver, garnering several "Ooohs!" from the sideline.

Williston was forced to punt, but the Devils recovered a fumble on the return at the Union 30-yard line. The Red Devils gained a couple of first downs and benefited from a pass interference penalty, but with the ball at the 1-yard line, the Tigers' Lee made an interception in the end zone for a touchback with less than three minutes left in the half.





down, but an errant shotgun snap was recovered by the Indians' Chris McLean at the Bradford 46-yard line.

Four straight runs by Noble moved the Indians to the 29-yard line. Bradford's Don Jeffers made a tackle for a loss of a yard, while Carlton Hankerson broke up a pass, helping to force Keystone into a fourth-and-6 situation. The Indians went for it, with Harvin connecting with Gibbs on a 9-yard pass for a first down at the 16.

Noble had five straight runs, with the fifth taking him into the end zone from 3 yards out. However, a flag for holding nullified the score and put the Indians back on the 14. Harvin scrambled out of the pocket for a 13-yard gain, which set Noble up for a 1-yard touchdown run that

counted. J.J. Schofield added his second PAT of the night to put the Indians up 16-0 with 2:19 remaining in the third quarter.

The Keystone defense helped preserve the shutout with three turnovers on Bradford's ensuing three drives.

A 20-yard run by Jenkins (seven carries for 62 yards) gave the Tornadoes a first down at their own 46. A 15-yard run by Noble gave the Indians a first down at the Bradford 33, but Jeffers, Jacob Alvarez and other Bradford defenders made tackles behind the line of scrimmage on two straight plays before Aaron broke up a pass on third down, forcing Keystone to punt.

Bradford began the ensuing drive on its own 10, but a 13-yard run by Carter (10 carries for 48 yards) got the Tornadoes off to a good start. An 8-yard reception by Aaron and a 4-yard

run by Carter resulted in another first down, while a 33-yard run by Luke helped Bradford overcome a holding penalty and gain a first down at the Keystone 27. It was just the second time Bradford had crossed midfield and the first time the Tornadoes had penetrated Keystone's 30-yard line, but the drive ended when the Indians' Raysin forced a fumble, which was recovered by Keystone's Earl Hall.

## Recent arrests in Bradford, Clay or Union

The following individuals were arrested recently by local law enforcement officers in Bradford, Union and Clay (Keystone Heights area) counties:

### Bradford

Oscar Adams, 24, of Starke was arrested Nov. 2 by Starke police for burglary and resisting an officer. According to the arrest report, Adams was at his brother's residence in Starke with other people watching a football game, drinking and hanging out around a fire in the back yard. A neighbor also had a fire going, and people continued drinking until late into the night. After the neighbor went into her residence for the night, Adams entered the home a short time later while the victim was on the phone. She heard a noise, saw Adams and yelled at him to get out of her home. A few minutes later, as she was checking on her doors and others in the home, the victim found Adams still in the home, hiding behind a door in another room. She yelled again for him to leave, and he ran out of the door while the victim called the police. The police went to Adams' brother's residence next door and arrested him, with Adams resisting their efforts initially. Bond was set at \$25,000 for the charges.

Scott Patrick Adkins, 35, of

Starke was arrested Oct. 31 by Starke police for disorderly intoxication. According to the arrest report, police were called to a residence on Madison Street in Starke about a man passed out in the front yard. When the officer arrived, the man had left the yard walking on Myrtle Street. The officer encountered Adkins nearby and noted he was staggering in the roadway as he attempted to not fall down as he walked. Adkins told the officer he was heading to Butler Street, but he was actually walking in the opposite direction. He also stated he drank 14 alcoholic beverages earlier in the evening. Due to Adkins being a threat to harming himself or other motorists or property, he was arrested and transported to jail. Bond was set at \$1,000 for the charge.





## Recent arrests in Bradford, Clay or Union
