### Small business owners weigh in about issues facing local vendors

Nationally, economists believe the country is finally emerging from its worst recession since the Great Depression.

In Citrus County, foreclosures are at an all-time high, unemployment is in the double-digit range and many people have had to move out of the county to start their lives over. These facts have led to an overwhelming response to the "Staying strong in the current economy" economic summit set for 7:30 a.m. to noon Wednesday at the Central Florida Community College Citrus Campus in Lecanto.

The summit will include panel discussions from business experts on various topics from marketing techniques to navigating government resources. The event is sponsored by the Citrus County Chamber of Commerce, Citrus County Economic Development Council, Central Florida Community College, SCORE, University of North Florida Small Business Development Center and Workforce Connection.

Two local business owners talk about some of the issues facing them right now.

## Expert: Oil spill grows

Could move east

VENICE, La. — A sense of doom settled over the American coastline from Louisiana to Florida on Saturday as a massive oil slick spewing from a ruptured well kept growing, and experts warned that an uncontrolled gusher could create a nightmare scenario if the Gulf Stream carries it toward the Atlantic.

President Barack Obama planned to visit the region today to assess the situation amid growing criticism that the government and oil company BP PLC should have done more to stave off the disaster. Meanwhile, efforts to stem the flow and remove oil from the surface by skimming it, burning it or spiking it with chemicals to disperse it continued with little success.

"These people, we've been beaten down, disaster after disaster," said Matt O'Brien of Venice, whose fledgling wholesale shrimp dock business is under threat from the spill.

"They've all got a long stare in their eye," he said. "They come asking me what I think's going to happen. I ain't got no answers for them. I ain't got no answers for my investors. I ain't got no answers."

He wasn't alone. As the spill surged toward disastrous proportions, critical questions lingered: Who created the conditions that caused the gusher? Did BP and the government react robustly enough in its early days? And, most important, how can it be stopped before the damage gets worse?

The Coast Guard conceded Saturday. See OIL/Page A8

## Florida Bar files complaint against local attorney

Allegations of misappropriated funds and the mismanagement of a trust account have led to the emergency suspension and a subsequent Florida Bar complaint against an Inverness attorney.

According to the complaint filed in April by the Florida Bar, Steven Hill Lee Bowman was named the trustee of a testamentary trust he drafted for Janice F.

Trepiccione, of Inverness, in 2002.

When Trepiccione died in December 2004, Bowman was reportedly expected to notify United Cerebral Palsy, the beneficiary of the \$200,000 trust. In addition, Bowman allegedly was expected to sell the main asset of the trust — Trepiccione's home. However, the Florida Bar alleges Bowman never notified United Cerebral Palsy and failed to

# Return to Rosewood

Lizzie Jenkins said her favorite aunt, Mahulda Gussie Brown Carrier, was a teacher who settled and taught in the town of Rosewood in 1915. She taught in the small, predominantly black town for close to eight years, she said. But in January of 1923, Carrier and the other black residents of Rosewood were forced to leave when the community came under attack by gangs of white people fired up over a claim that a black man from Rosewood had raped a white woman from nearby Sumner.

Seven people were confirmed dead in the attack, and the town was abandoned. Homes were burned and the blacks who survived never returned to live in Rosewood.

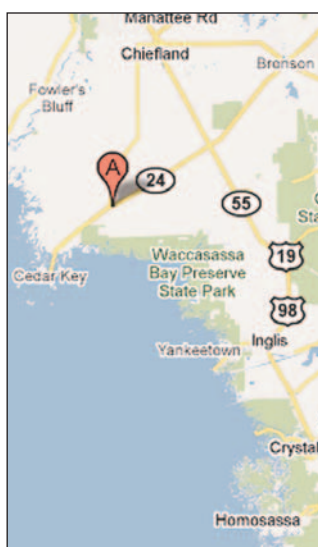
Carrier played a crucial role in helping get many of the Rosewood residents to safety, and she shared her story with those who would listen. There's a plaque in her honor at the Archer Historical Society building.

"I heard the story the first time when I was 5," Jenkins said. "That story just touched my heart, and it became a part of me. It just left me empty. We've got to keep the story alive."

Jenkins told a crowd of about 100 people April 24 at the first Return to Rosewood Celebration a little about the life of her aunt — a life Jenkins describes as forever haunted by what occurred at Rosewood. Jenkins plans to hold the event annually.

"She went through the struggle of having her town destroyed," she told the audience gathered at a park near where the original town once stood. "She never got over that."

Jenkins, the executive director of the Real Rosewood Foundation Inc., said her aunt changed her name several times throughout her life for fear of further retri-

bution.

"Everybody after the massacre, everybody changed their names."

Michael Grant, also affiliated with the foundation, told the crowd, "We need to know what it is we're doing here and why we're here. It's important that we keep this on the minds of individuals, that it's not forgotten."

Grant said keeping the memory of Rosewood alive would help ensure it never happens again.

When Jenkins was asked, before her presentation, if she felt there was reluctance for people of Levy County to talk about Rosewood, she admitted that there is, though she said she wasn't sure why.

"I tell people, 'You didn't create Rosewood, and I didn't create Rosewood.'"

But people have to be willing to acknowledge the fact that it happened, she said.

In 1994, the state of Florida became the first to make reparations on the basis of claims of racial violence. Rosewood survivors and descendants were awarded about \$1.5 million. In 2004, the state made the original site of Rosewood a Florida Heritage Landmark.

# Legislative session ends

## Candidates saw various agendas flourish, die

TALLAHASSEE — Florida politicians may have had one foot out the door the past few weeks ready to hit the campaign trail, but they were also pushing their own legislative agendas to use as political currency in the coming months.

Gov. Charlie Crist wanted a Seminole Gaming compact. Chief Financial Officer Alex Sink wanted pension reform. Attorney General Bill McCollum asked for fee caps for lawyers. And Sen. Paula Dockery hoped for an open records bill.

Their victories or losses could provide each candidate with fodder for campaign commercials, political talking points or attacks against opponents.

### Charlie Crist

Gov. Charlie Crist proved timing is everything in politics.

The governor's late-session veto of the teacher merit-pay bill pushed by House and Senate Republican leaders effectively rerouted his U.S. Senate candidacy. But just as that timing proved pivotal, Crist also

was helped by the lousy economy in finally getting a Seminole gambling compact through the cash-strapped Legislature.

Many ridiculed the governor in January when he included more than \$400 million from an envisioned compact in his budget proposal. Two earlier attempts at forging a compact had failed — but with lawmakers facing a \$3.2 billion budget shortfall, the governor's top priority was fast-tracked through the Legislature.

While Crist pushed for a build-up of affordable housing dollars, state and local housing trust funds were tapped for almost \$175 million, part of a sweep of trust funds that were used to plug budget holes in other programs.

### Bill McCollum

Bill McCollum tried to shore up his business credentials in his final year as attorney general as he goes up against pro-business Democrat Chief Financial Officer Alex Sink, a former Bank of America executive.

His top priority was thought to be a fee cap on private lawyers hired by the state, and that passed early and was signed by Crist in April. McCollum was strongly behind other measures seen as possible hits at the trial bar — a Democratic constituency, the opposition of which wins points in the business community, including a bill that shifts the

burden of proof in slip and fall cases to the plaintiff. That also passed.

McCollum said they were "pro consumer" bills rather than pro business bills, which he said are a part of his job.

"I didn't focus on them for campaign reasons," he said. "Right now I'm still wearing my attorney general hat."

### Alex Sink

The pension fund reform was the center of Chief Financial Officer Alex Sink's legislative agenda as she tried to polish her image as a financial executive and someone who could handle difficult financial problems facing the state.

In addition to the changes that have been included in H.B. 1307's pension reform, Sink pushed for an expansion of the SBA Board of Trustees, which now includes Crist, McCollum and herself. She has maintained that the trustees need to include more people with financial backgrounds. Crist and McCollum are both attorneys and Sink is a former banker.

Recommendations by Sink also formed the basis of S.B. 2386, which tried to make the contracting process more efficient. That bill passed on Friday and is awaiting the governor's signature.

### Paula Dockery

The dark horse in the governor's

race, Sen. Paula Dockery, R-Lake-land, had the most to prove in her legislative session, having been known outside the Capitol mostly for her fervent opposition to Sun-Rail, a proposed commuter rail system in Central Florida — an issue on which she lost last year.

"Knowing that I was in a statewide campaign, I really did not introduce many bills, whereas most senators may do 30 or 40 bills, I usually do only a dozen, and this year I did less than that," said Dockery, who chairs the Senate Criminal Justice Committee.

Dockery said that many of the issues important to her did get attached to bills in amendments.

One of her biggest priorities, however, was a public records overhaul bill, which was based on a report issued by Crist's Commission on Open Government. The proposal would have required officials to get open government training, prohibited agencies from charging for the cost of duplication if it takes less than 30 minutes to make the records available, and created a misdemeanor offense for any public official who willingly violates the Sunshine Law. But the bill went nowhere in either the Senate or House.

Dockery said the bill's failure was "disappointing" but said she didn't think the Legislature really cared for the issue in general.

## Property gives access to refuge

## New kayak launch, nature trails to open in Old Homosassa

Thanks to two years of hard work and a \$152,000 donation, the public will soon have land access to the Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge Complex property as well as three new trails and a new kayak and canoe launch.

The Friends of the Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge Complex recently completed construction of an observation tower and pavilion on the property on Mason Creek Road in Old Homosassa. Three trails, all between one-half and one-quarter mile long, have been cleared and the bulk of the work has been done for the new Chassahowitzka Salt Marsh Trails area.

"It's the only part of the Refuge that can be accessed by land," said Friends President Lace Blue-McLean. Paddlers will have ac-

cess to the Homosassa River and Mason Creek from the launch site.

Although most of the work has been completed, the area will not immediately be open to the public. No date has been set for the opening.

"It's mainly just paperwork that has to be done," said Refuge Complex manager Michael Lusk. "It will be open later in the year."

The observation tower that overlooks the salt marsh includes a lower level that is wheelchair accessible.

Friends volunteer and project leader Ross Knudsen said they still have to label trees along the interpretive trails and remove in-

vasive plants. The project will always be a work in progress, he said.

It is his hope that once it opens, local schools will bring students there to learn about the area. He also expects Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts to visit.

"Primarily what we want to do is get the kids to use it," he said.

The \$152,000 donation for the project came from the Lastinger Family Foundation.

The Friends had a dedication for the project Saturday, and a volunteer appreciation luncheon at the new pavilion during which Knudsen was recognized as volunteer of the year.

income-eligible people. Call the number below to find out the income limits. Opportunities are available in Inverness, Floral City and Hernando. Training is provided.

A commitment to work a minimum of 20 hours per week is required in exchange for a stipend, mileage allowance, paid vacation and sick time — while helping housebound seniors to stay independent in their homes.

NCVC is also looking for a Seniors on the Move coordinator in the Inverness area.

Residents 55 older who are looking for a rewarding part-time job and who own a vehicle are invited to consider becoming part of the program. The coordinator will receive a stipend and mileage allowance. Full training is provided for both programs.

Senior Companions typically visit their clients once a week and assist with a va-

riety of tasks, including doctor visits, grocery shopping and companionship.

Potential clients are also welcome to apply for both the Senior Companion and Seniors on the Move programs. In recent surveys, seniors in Citrus listed socialization as something they lacked.

The goal of Seniors on the Move is to change that. Nature Coast Volunteer Center officials say the program is an excellent way to meet

new friends.

Trips include visiting community centers, movies, flea markets, libraries, parks, the beach, the theater, and going on shopping trips, among others.

maintain the house. The complaint states Bowman "allowed the real estate taxes to become delinquent over a period of 3 years resulting in a tax deed sale being scheduled for December 2009."

After learning about its interest in Trepiccione's trust, United Cerebral Palsy made an immediate demand for a full accounting of the trust, but according to the Florida Bar, Bowman failed to provide a timely accounting and

could not explain why the money from the trust wasn't used to maintain and sell the home.

In addition, Bowman reportedly didn't resign as trustee until United Cerebral Palsy filed a complaint for his removal in January.

On Feb. 9, the Florida Bar states Bowman provided additional accounting records that showed he borrowed \$53,727.94 from the trust.

During a deposition conducted Feb. 15, the complaint reveals Bowman purportedly admitted that he failed to inform United Cerebral Palsy about being a beneficiary of Trepiccione's trust and that he borrowed money from the

trust without United Cerebral Palsy's permission. In addition, the complaint states the promissory note for the money Bowman borrowed was a demand note, which meant as the trustee, Bowman would have to make the demand on himself to make payments. Bowman reportedly said he made no demands of himself for payment in 2007, 2008 or 2009. According to the Florida Bar, Bowman also said he failed to post any type of collateral for the borrowed money, stating he didn't think he was a credit risk, and claimed he borrowed the money to pay his unpaid business taxes. In the complaint, the Florida

Bar states Bowman testified during his deposition that he made a partial repayment of \$39,500 from his personal savings and that he saved the money by "watching his expenses, paying down credit card expenses and by earning additional money by doing some consulting work."

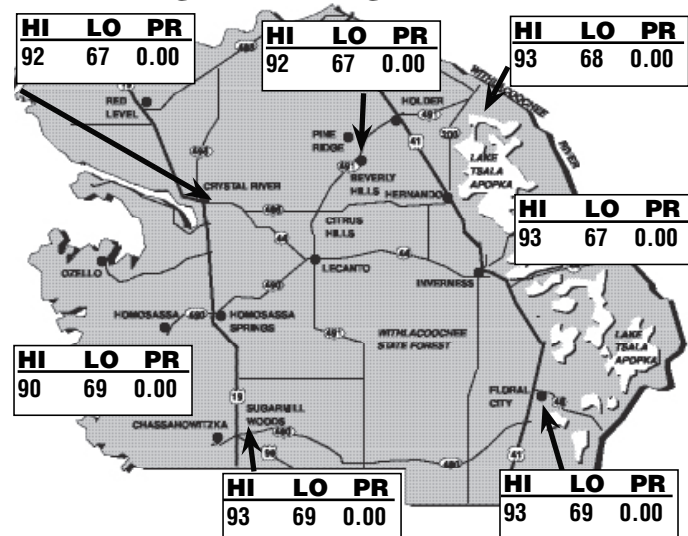
However, after being asked to supply "trust account records, records related to his consultation employment, tax records, settlement statements and a copy of his personal bank records," the Florida Bar states Bowman provided everything, but his personal bank records. According to the complaint, Bowman misrepre-

sented where the \$39,500 came from because documents showed the money was not from his personal savings, but rather from another client.

According to the Florida Bar's website, Bowman graduated with his Doctor of Jurisprudence from the University of Florida's Fredric G. Levin College of Law in 1984 and was admitted to the Florida Bar in October of the same year. His practice areas included elder, real estate, wills, trusts and estates.

The website also states Bowman isn't eligible to practice in the state of Florida and is listed as "suspended — with conditions."

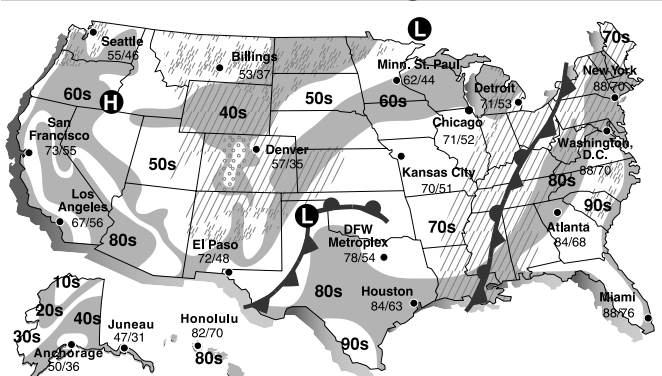

and sells appliance parts.

■ In business as it exists today since 1972; prior to that, Venero's parents owned and ran the company.

■ Located at 809 W. Main St., Inverness.

■ Member of the Citrus County Chamber of Commerce.

**James Cook, Cattle Dog Coffee Roasters**

■ Besides Cook, there are two full-time employees and one part-time employee.

■ Sells numerous varieties of coffee beans roasted on-site as well as coffee and tea beverages, salads, sandwiches and desserts.

■ Has been in business since Cook purchased it just over a year ago.

**What has government done or what can it do to help your business?**

**JC:** "If there was a way for (the county) to spread the payment out for the impact fee (for new businesses), then the county can get their impact fees and the business can still survive." Cook had this to say about the county working with him to reduce impact fees incurred by changing the original retail designation of his space to one that allows food prepared in an onsite kitchen: "At first, initially, it was sticker shock. It was \$10,000." But because only 20 percent of his sales come from sandwiches and salads, the county helped him and the end result was a reduced impact fee. "Otherwise, we would have had to close up shop. That (\$10,000 impact fee)

would kill any small business. The deli guy across the way had to pay \$20,000."

Cook wants the county to consider imposing regulations on new retail shopping centers to make them more supportive of the businesses that rent from them. He said rental prices for retail space have not gone down even though many spaces remain vacant, including four in the Heritage Hills Plaza where his business is located.

Cook also had help from SCORE in Lecanto, which assists small businesses with counseling, mentoring and education services when he purchased the business.

**VV:** "The only help or support we have had from any government

organization was the recent Energy Star appliance rebate program similar to the Cash for Clunkers automobile program last year ... Florida recently administered (its) own version, which was an overwhelming success for our company, appliance companies around the state and for the appliance industry." He added: "I believe that some type of property tax relief (should) be afforded to the local business(es) ... Another way tax relief may be afforded local business is for one business to help another within the county. Perhaps a tax credit of some sort to businesses who use ... services and materials purchased directly within the county."

**How has your business been af-**

**ected by the weakened economy?**

**JC:** "The first year we did about 20 percent more (sales) than what we projected," he said. "I got lucky compared to a lot of businesses."

**VV:** "We have not seen sales volumes this low to the builder market since the late 1970s. However, since our recent remodeling and expansion at our Inverness location, we have been able to recoup some of the volume lost on the builder side through increases in our retail sales. Although overall volume is still down, we have not cut hours and we have only had to lay off one person and that was just recently. We have been able to accomplish this by cutting expenses and just running the business smarter like many other

small local businesses who have been able to weather the storm."

**Do you believe the local Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development Council are helping you in your business?**

**JC:** "Right now the Chamber is more for me (having) my sign to show I'm part of the Chamber and being involved with the map; other than that I don't have too much involvement. Because I'm here all the time, I haven't been able to experience that other side yet too much. It sounds like I could get more out of it if I had more time." On the EDC: "After talking with some people and reading some articles in the last couple of days, it sounds like they're on the right path. Other than that, I can't answer."

**VV:** About the Chamber, he said: "I believe they are doing their best to help the local businesses with referrals and ... the mixer meetings, where we have shared ideas with other businesses." About the EDC: "Except for their recent participation with (allocating federal program funds), I am sorry, but I have seen no help for local businesses. However, I do not mean to diminish their efforts in trying to bring new business into the county. I applaud the Citrus County Board of County Commissioners and EDC in their new efforts to focus more towards local business."

### Plumbing

"As long as people live, they need plumbing," said Coy Merrick of American Plumbing Services of Florida.

Three years ago, the Crystal River resident took over his father's business, which was established in Citrus County in 1993. Before that, the business was in West Palm Beach for 20 years.

The construction boom gave Merrick's business some good years.

"During the new construction, we were doing very well," Merrick said. "Since then, we have relied on service to our customers. Our reputation preceded us and they feel safe with us."

At the summit, Merrick said he would look for ways to network with other businesses, and extend, expand and promote his own business.

### Auctions

The economy affects business differently for Dudley's Auction and Estate Services, said Chris Dudley, who said she registered for the summit to learn more about how local businesses are coping.

"We're doing more auctions," Dudley said. "Usually, we do four or five auctions a month, but we did eight in February, 10 in March and 10 in April."

The auctions are general estate clearance and business liquidations. The company also auctions real estate property.

"We do a wide variety of services," Dudley said. "We just auctioned a house that the trustee could not hold any more."

In the current economy, some property owners have tried to wait out the lower house value until the market bounces back. But it's been slow. Finally, they may decide to sell by auction.

"We are happy with the returns we get on our auctioned houses," Dudley said. "They are not the best prices, but they are selling."

As with other auction houses, Dudley said her company has been getting inquiries about selling real and personal property from people needing to raise cash to pay bills. She said she is concerned for people facing the loss of their home, and she sits on the board of the Citrus County Family Resource Center.

At the summit, Dudley said she would be looking for new opportunities to learn more.

"The more you learn and share, the more you benefit," Dudley said. "We're a good tool to offer solutions."

### Realty

Sage Address is in business with his father, Noel Address, in Sunmark Realty based in Pineland. Their real estate firm specializes in vacant land and investment property. Both father and son are members of the Citrus County Economic Development Council.

"Land sales have been stagnant, but they're now on the uptick," Sage Address said. "The bank-owned property is starting to move and we're seeing more activity."

He said they would attend the summit to find out what the economic climate was like in Citrus County, what companies might be showing an interest in the community and to "get a feeling for what's going on."

### Automotive

Clifford Strong at East Cove Auto Center, Inverness, said he has a feeling for what is going on and

doesn't like it.

"My people are hurting," Strong said.

Strong described his business as a neighborhood garage where he has been in operation for 35 years repairing vehicles for hard-working young people with children and retired people living on Social Security.

"I know a lot of sad stories," Strong said. "People are losing their cars and their homes. These are families with both mom and dad working, and if one loses their job, that's it. They can't get by."

Strong said in the past he could carry some debt on car repairs to let customers pay \$100 or \$200 a month.

"But now, they can't afford \$20 a month," Strong said. "Last year was the hardest for my customers. And I've lost my retirement trying to keep it going."

Strong, who gave his age as 60, said he was emotionally involved with cus-

tomers he called "my people" because he has been in business so long.

"I have customers who are the grandchildren of my original customers," Strong said. "I'm going to the economic summit hoping to find some encouragement."

### Printing

Gregg Mackler of Homosassa Printing offers a service that has to follow the economic trends.

"If my customers are not busy, then I'm not either,"

Mackler said.

Mackler has been in business for 13 years, offering business forms, business cards and stationery to businesses and organizations. He said business is at its lowest ebb ever, and he hopes it will get no worse.

"We haven't seen a recovery yet," Mackler said. "Not in Citrus County."

Mackler said he would like to get some insights and fresh ideas from the summit.

"I'd like to uncover some

opportunities that the government might be offering."

Last year, Mackler took part in a government program that allowed him to hire an employee. But he had to let his employee go when the program ended because the economy had not picked up enough to pay the employee. He would like to find a similar incentive.

"You've got to go and find out," Mackler said about the summit. "I'm making the time to do it."

Florida LEGISLATURE

News Service of Florida

■ **CONVENES:** The Senate convened the 60th and final day of the 2010 session at 9:35 a.m. with Senate President Jeff Atwater presiding.

■ **UNTIL THE LAST BILL PASSES:** Sen. J.D. Alexander moved that session be extended until adjournment, sine die.

■ **SPECIAL ORDER:** The Senate then moved first to its special order calendar — the last chance for several bills on second reading to be clear for a final vote. Most of the measures were rolled to third reading, but votes weren't taken unless otherwise noted.

● **H.B. 631,** which removes requirement that the Department of Highway Safety Motor Vehicles adopt uniform written notice to be used to enforce provisions that prohibit parking motor vehicles on certain property for purpose of displaying motor vehicle as being for sale, hire, or rental. The measure was temporarily postponed with an amendment pending.

● **S.B. 978,** which creates a Fraternal Order of Police license plate and establishes an annual use fee for the plate. An amendment by sponsor Sen. Mike Fasano dealing with a Sea Turtle license plate was adopted and H.B. 289 was substituted. The rules were waived and the bill was reading a third time. The measure was approved 35-3 and now goes to Gov. Charlie Crist.

● **S.B. 220,** which deletes a requirement that a specified penalty is mandatory and may not be waived by the DOR. H.B. 173 was substituted and the measure was approved 37-0. The bill goes to the governor.

■ **INSURANCE:** ● The Senate took up S.B. 2044 related to property insurance, and added a 99-page amendment. The bill passed 32-6.

● **S.B. 382,** which requires the Florida Wildlife Commission to enter into an agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection relating to the uniform application of pesticides to the waters of the state.

An amendment by Sen. Charlie Dean (237206) that revising the criteria for a local government's adoption of additional or more stringent standards was adopted on a 21-18 vote, but the bill was temporarily postponed.

● **H.B. 631** was taken back up and the pending amendment was withdrawn. An amendment by Sen. Victor Crist dealing with driving improvement courses, and a technical amendment were adopted. The bill was read a third time and approved 38-0. The bill goes to the House.

■ **ANOTHER GOODBYE FOR CONSTANTINE:** Sen. Lee Constantine made additional farewell remarks because family members who were unable to attend earlier in the week were in the gallery. Several senators rose to pay tribute to Constantine, who is term-limited this year.

■ **THIRD READING:** The Senate then took up bills on third reading. The bills were:

● **S.B. 2252,** which has been referred to as the "Lying Lobbyist Bill." The bill was passed 39-0 and goes now to the House.

● **S.B. 1258** was temporarily postponed.

■ **REDISTRICTING:**

● **S.B. 382** was taken back up. A gun amendment by Sen. Paula Dockery that would exempt citizens who were licensed to carry concealed weapons from restrictions in the bill (72752) was adopted. An amendment by Sen. Charlie Justice dealing with dog racing (900920) was ruled out of order by Senate President Jeff Atwater after a point of order was raised by Sen. Dennis Jones that it was not germane to the bill and would have a negative fiscal impact. The bill was then approved 38-1, with Justice voting no. The measure will be sent to the House.

■ **TROUBLE FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY?** The Senate version of a re-

newable energy plan that would allow power companies to recovery costs for renewable projects without the approval of the Public Service Commission appeared in trouble. The language, which was tacked onto a bill that would allow local governments to issue bonds for energy efficiency, known as the PACE bill, was in an amendment that was withdrawn by Sen. Mike Bennett. Another amendment by Sen. Mike Fasano, which would eliminate some nuclear recovery for utilities, was taken up, but Bennett said it would imperil any deal on renewables in the final hours of session. "I believe at this stage of the game, now is not the time to kill renewable energy for the people of the state of Florida again as we're trying to do it," Bennett said. The Senate version of the legislation would allow utilities to recovery 1 percent of their 2009 profits this year and 2 percent going forward. The House would allow 2 percent. The bill was temporarily postponed.

■ **RECESS:** The Senate recessed for lunch at 1:27 p.m. to reconvene at 2 p.m.

■ **AND THE FINAL HOURS:** The Senate returned for the afternoon at 2:24 p.m. and immediately recognized the various appropriations staffs.

● **H.B. 545,** sought by Realtors, repeals a law requiring disclosures of residential property windstorm mitigation ratings to purchasers in wind-borne debris regions. It passed 36-0.

● **H.B. 907** outlines child support guidelines for the court. It passed 38-0.

● **H.B. 1193** designates the Adam Pierce Act, which revises the definition of "special risk member" to include certain members suffering a qualifying injury and provides eligibility requirements for membership in the Special Risk Class for certain members suffering a qualifying injury. It passed 38-0.

● **H.B. 1411** deals with the expedited foreclosures of timeshares. It passed 39-0.

● **H.B. 7217** is a CAT Fund bill which extends exemption of medical malpractice insurance. It passed 37-0.

● **S.B. 2318** defines the term "prosecuting authority" for purposes of the Florida RICO Act. The bill provides that the act be liberally construed to achieve the remedial purposes of curtailing racketeering activities and lessening the economic power of criminal organizations engaged in patterns of racketeering activities in this state. It passed 39-0.

● **S.B. 2070** creates a public records exemption for information held by the Office of Financial Regulation pursuant to an investigation of consumer collection agencies. It passed 39-0.

● **S.B. 198** permits the purchase of past service credits for those in special risk class of the retirement system. It passed 39-0.

● **H.B. 927** deals with a change of homestead ownership. It passed 38-0.

● **H.B. 119** is the sex offender measure that prohibits an offender from being within

300 feet of an area where children typically congregate. It passed 39-0.

● **H.B. 351** creates a Catch Me, Release Me license plate, a Florida Horse Park license plate, and a Florida Biodiversity Foundation license plate. It passed 37-2.

● **S.B. 838** authorizes a doctor of pharmacy degree program at the University of South Florida. It passed 39-0.

● **H.B. 7157** specifies the duration of liens securing the payment of unemployment compensation tax obligations and provides that the tax on deeds and other instruments relating to real property does not apply to property sold pursuant to a short sale. It passed 39-0.

● **S.B. 2176** bill prohibits an association, fund or pool from forming or managing a risk management mechanism from requiring participants to give more than 60 days notices before withdrawing their investment. The Senate concurred to a variety of House amendments. It passed 37-1.

● **H.B. 1307** is the SBA reform package. It passed 39-0.

● **H.B. 713** is the Department of Business and Professional Regulation bill. It passed 39-0.

● **H.B. 7219** provides for the adoption of the 2010 Internal Revenue Code. It passed 38-0.

● **S.B. 296** changes case documentation for state attorneys. It passed 39-0.

● **S.B. 2592** revises provisions related to petroleum contamination cleanup. The House bill, H.B. 1385, was substituted in and approved 38-0.

● **H.B. 83** is a specialty license plate bill that creates the "Endless Summer" plate. It passed 37-2.

● **H.B. 7203** authorizes certain community districts to create fees/taxes. It passed 38-1.

● **H.B. 663** revises building safety laws. It passed 39-0.

● **S.B. 1253** changes provisions of law regulating continuing care facilities; increases threshold amount for businesses that must be identified in application for provisional certificate; revises financial information required annually for each certified facility. It passed 38-0.

● **H.B. 7205** expands the state's incentive pay program to make money available to Florida communities for trying to entice teams to abandon Arizona's Cactus League for Florida's Grapefruit League. It passed 38-1.

● **S.B. 1254** would ask voters in November to amend the Florida Constitution to reduce the cap on non-homesteaded property assessments from 10 percent to 5 percent and provide an additional tax breaks for homeowners who purchase their first Florida home or have not purchased a primary residence in at least three years. It was temporarily passed.

Hofmeister, Linda Miller, Steve Naas, Lynne Oliver, Chris Ordway, Mike Reed and Marie Straight — chose to undertake a forward-looking, community-oriented graduation project. Many of these class members are still familiar faces in Citrus County, while others have moved on.

The class project undertaken was a citizen-driven Visioning process for Citrus County. The Leadership Citrus board of governors agreed and Citrus County's first Visioning was held to position the county for the future. Out of the first Visioning, Citrus 20/20 was born.

The name, Citrus 20/20, was initially intended as both a play on keen eyesight and keeping county residents focused on preparing our county for the future by linking it to the year 2020. The Visioning was posthumously dedicated to the memory of Rick Quinn and

Jerry Clark, who had founded a group known as "Project Pride" in the 1980s. Through their dedicated leadership and selfless commitment to our county, Citrus County's Adopt a Highway and Adopt a Shore programs were established. These programs have since inspired our current "Keep Citrus Beautiful" organization and Citrus 20/20's annual Save Our Waters Week.

The purpose of the Visioning was to gather a group of representative citizens to craft a foundational statement of community values — what they hoped the future of Citrus County might look like by the year 2020. With the focus on transitioning the county from the present to the future, it was not by accident that the language tense of the final vision statement was "future perfect," as noted by Jim Hunter, the Visioning report's principal drafter and editor.

Simply put, this was not another comprehensive plan (now in its third generation). For too many citizens, the comprehensive plan

has become so daunting and technical that only a few actually participate in its public hearings. Instead, this Visioning was intended to be broad based and to provide what might be termed a community philosophy or direction.

Such a statement might assist the technical and professional staff of the county charged with developing plans for the future of our county who could turn to see if it was achieving the Vision or not.

The mid-1990s in Citrus County were a special time of great optimism for the county's future, though some divisions still lingered in the community from growth pressures.

However, these divisions were largely overcome by the often-heard refrain that "We don't want Citrus County to become another New Port Richey." Diversities of opinion were, therefore, specifically sought to assure representation from all sectors and viewpoints.

To insure that viewpoints and

ideas would be effectively shared, the Florida State University's, Conflict Resolution Consortium was hired to assist with the facilitation of the Visioning.

During the Visioning session, approximately 140 people first gathered in Inverness, then Crystal River. The initial Visioning assembly created a Vision statement and 10 aspiration statements affecting the future of our community.

These 10 aspirations, which continue to focus our county's future, were: Education; Economic Development; Growth Management; Man & Nature; Infrastructure & Services; Identity, Culture & Society; Public Private Partnership; Eco-Tourism; Social Services; and Youth Needs.

Focus groups then developed action plans for each aspiration statement during the following six months.

Emanating from a humble beginning as a Leadership Citrus graduation project and a shoe-string budget of \$15,000, Citrus County did what few others in the

state had done or even thought of doing at the time. For that reason, the project won statewide awards for the citizen initiative.

Most gratifying to those of us involved in its beginning is that Citrus 20/20 still continues today. This says to me that citizens still want a voice in the future of their community and not just lip service. With the upcoming Vision Check scheduled for Saturday, May 15, public participation is fundamental to its success.

Accordingly, I encourage the public to participate.

With Citrus County having grown to from 103,000 to 142,609 people since 1994, let's hope the same enthusiasm still exists today and that a broad cross section of today's residents and businesses care enough to come to the table and roll up their sleeves to fine-tune the Citrus 20/20 Vision to assure its relevance for today and tomorrow.

● H.B. 945 requires assisted living facilities to possess automated external defibrillators. It was temporarily passed.

● H.B. 7179 authorizes local governments to finance certain home improvements through a property tax offset. It was postponed.

■ **CONFORMING BILLS:** At 3:45 p.m., the Senate began to take up the budget conforming bills. S.B. 1510 deals with statutes for the Department of Citrus. It was approved 38-0.

● S.B. 1514 is the conference report on licensing for anglers. It passed 39-0.

● S.B. 1516 is the conference report creating a real property database within the Department of Environmental Protection to accurately track all property owned by the state. It passed 37-2.

● S.B. 1484, which is the conference committee report relating to Medicaid. The bill was approved 39-0.

● S.B. 2020, which is the conference committee report relating to Information Technology. The bill was approved 39-0.

● S.B. 2374, which is the conference committee report relating to the State Group Insurance Program. The bill was approved 39-0.

● S.B. 2024, which is the conference committee report relating to the tax on Communications and Utility Services. The bill was approved 39-0.

● S.B. 2386, which is the conference committee report relating to State Financial Matters. The bill was approved 39-0.

■ **PSC BILL RETURNED TO SENDER:** The Senate took up S.B. 1034 and refused to concur with changes made by the House. Instead, sponsor Mike

Fasano followed through on a promise to amend the measure and send it back to the House, even at the risk the bill would not be taken up again in the House before the end of session. An amendment by Fasano to remove language that requires PSC commissioners to have a college degree and at least one member of the commission to be a certified accountant was unanimously approved. The amendment also adds the requirement communication between utilities and staffers be posted online within 72 hours and place fines for off-the-record communications on power company employees as well as PSC employees, which in the original measure passed by the Senate in the first week of session. The bill was then approved 39-0 and sent to the House.

● S.B. 1072 provides mental health services to young children in juvenile justice programs. Sponsor Stephen Wise asked the Senate not to concur on House changes to the Senate.

■ **WITHDRAWALS:** The Senate removed S.B. 642, S.B. 1980 and S.B. 2576 from committees of reference and placed them on the special order calendar.

● H.B. 911 is the electronic health records bill. The Senate decided not to take it with the House amendments.

● S.B. 1412 repeals obsolete provisions for agency. The Senate concurred with the House

amendments and approved it 38-0.

● H.B. 467 requires schools to integrate dating violence education programs in their health education curriculum. It passed 34-4.

● H.B. 945 requires assisted living facilities to possess automated external defibrillators. It passed 38-0.

● S.B. 1980 allows counties to increase penalties for ethnic violations by local officials. It passed 37-0.

● S.B. 2576 prohibits state agencies from issuing certain forms of documentation for any good, commodity, or thing of value to be exported to certain foreign countries. The House version, H.B. 1401, was substituted in and it passed 39-0.

● S.B. 942 is the tattoo licensing bill. The House version, H.B. 729, was passed 30-4.

■ **MORE APPOINTMENTS:** The Senate took up a report on several appointments. It was approved 39-0.

● S.B. 1126 The measure provides guidelines for local government land use development and local military establishments. The House version, H.B. 7129, was substituted in and it was approved 37-0.

● H.B. 665 provides the Florida Housing Finance Authority with an additional purpose for which it may exercise its power to borrow. The Senate wouldn't

accept the House changes and sent it back to the House.

■ **BUDGET:** At 5:54 p.m., Senate President Jeff Atwater announced that the budget conference reports had arrived from the House. Sen. J.D. Alexander, R-Lake Wales, introduced the full Florida budget that was ironed out earlier this week, noting that the Legislature was able to avoid massive layoffs and also not raise taxes. Next year, he added, will be even more difficult. "The economy is likely to have a slow recovery," he said. "Next year, federal stimulus money and FMAP are gone and more difficult decisions will face us." The Senate spent two hours on the budget before taking a final vote of 33-4. Sens. David Aronberg, Paula Dockery, Dan Gelber and Nan Rich were "no" votes.

■ **PASSING THE GAVEL:** Senate President Jeff Atwater handed over the podium to Senate President Designate Mike Haridopolos, who will lead the senate in 2010-2012.

■ **THE REMAINING CONFORMING BILLS:**

● H.B. 5311 deals with the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program and other programs. It passed 37-0.

● H.B. 5301 is a conforming bill related dealing with health care. It passed 37-1.

● H.B. 5101 is the implementing bill for the class size reduction. It passed 30-7.

● H.B. 5201 is a higher education conforming bill. It passed

36-1.

● H.B. 5603 is a conforming bill related to workers compensation at state agencies. It passed 38-0.

● H.B. 5607 is the conference report related to retirement rates for the Florida Retirement System. It passed 32-6.

● H.B. 5611 is a conforming bill dealing with the Department of Management Services. It passed 39-0.

● H.B. 5401 changes laws related to the court system, regional conflict councils and clerk of courts. It also redirects trust fund money. It passed 38-0.

● H.B. 5501 deals with the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. It passed 38-0.

● H.B. 5505 is the Department of State conforming bill. It passed 35-0.

■ **INTERNS:** The Senate chose to rename the Senate internship program the Al Lawson Senate Internship Program, after outgoing Senate Minority Leader Al Lawson, D-Tallahassee.

■ **AND IT ALL COMES TO AN END:** The Senate adjourned sine die at 8:47 p.m. ending the 2010 legislative session

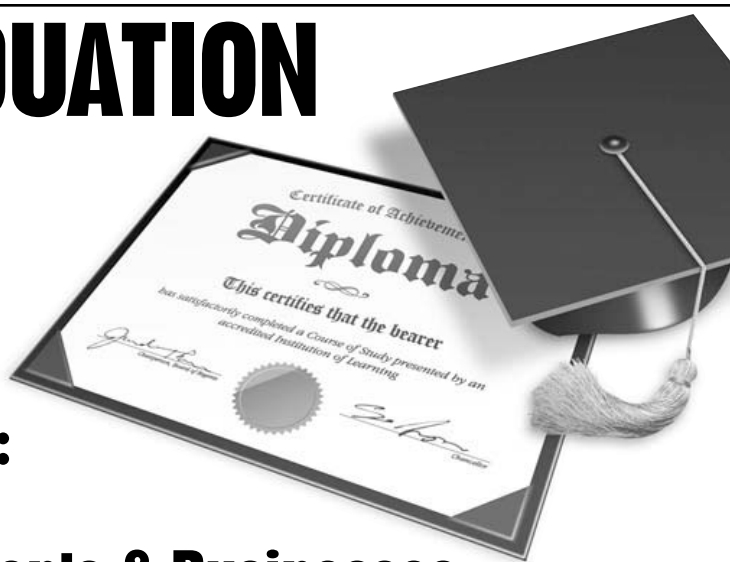

urday that it's nearly impossible to know how much oil has gushed since the April 20 rig explosion, after saying earlier it was at least 1.6 million gallons — equivalent to about 2 1/2 Olympic-sized swimming pools. The blast killed 11 workers and threatened beaches, fragile marshes and marine mammals, along with fishing grounds that are among the world's most productive.

Even at that rate, the spill should eclipse the 1989 Exxon Valdez incident as the worst U.S. oil disaster in history in a matter of weeks. But a growing number of experts warned that the situation may already be much worse.

## Spreading fast

The oil slick over the water's surface appeared to triple in size over the past two days, which could indicate an increase in the rate that oil is spewing from the well, according to one analysis of images collected from satellites and reviewed by the University of Miami. While it's hard to judge the volume of oil by satellite because of depth, it does show an indication of change in growth, experts said.

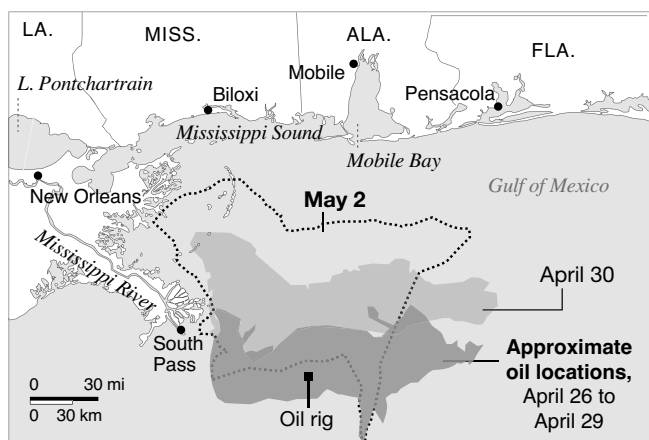
"The spill and the spreading is getting so much faster and expanding much quicker than they estimated," said Hans Graber, executive director of the university's Center for Southeastern Tropical Advanced Remote Sensing. "Clearly, in the last couple of days, there was a big change in the size."

Doug Suttles, BP's chief operating officer for exploration and production, said it was impossible to know just how much oil was gushing from the well, but said the company and federal officials were preparing for the worst-case scenario.

In an exploration plan and environmental impact analysis filed with the federal government in February 2009, BP said it had the capability to handle a "worst-case scenario" at the Deepwater Horizon site, which the document described as a leak of 162,000 barrels per day from an uncontrolled blowout — 6.8 million gallons each day.

## Hitting Florida

Oil industry experts and officials are reluctant to describe what, exactly, a worst-case scenario would look

like — but if the oil gets into the Gulf Stream and carries it to the beaches of Florida, it stands to be an environmental and economic disaster of epic proportions.

The Deepwater Horizon well is at the end of one branch of the Gulf Stream, the famed warm-water current that flows from the Gulf of Mexico to the North Atlantic. Several experts said that if the oil enters the stream, it would flow around the southern tip of Florida and up the eastern seaboard. "It will be on the East Coast of Florida in almost no time," Graber said. "I don't think we can prevent that. It's more of a question of when rather than if."

## Guessing game

At the joint command center run by the government and BP near New Orleans, a Coast Guard spokesman maintained Saturday that the leakage remained around 5,000 barrels, or 200,000 gallons, per day.

But Coast Guard Adm. Thad Allen, appointed Saturday by Obama to lead the government's oil spill response, said no one could pinpoint how much oil is leaking from the ruptured well because it is about a mile underwater.

The Coast Guard's Allen said Saturday that a test of new technology used to reduce the amount of oil rising to the surface seemed to be successful.

During the test Friday, an underwater robot shot a chemical meant to break down the oil at the site of the leak rather than spraying it on the surface from boats or planes, where the compound can miss the oil slick.

From land, the scope of the crisis was difficult to see. As of Saturday afternoon, only a light sheen of oil had washed ashore in some places.

The real threat lurked offshore in a swelling, churning slick of dense, rust-colored

oil the size of Puerto Rico. From the endless salt marshes of Louisiana to the white-sand beaches of Florida, there is uncertainty and frustration over how the crisis got to this point and what will unfold in the coming days, weeks and months.

## Expert concerns

The concerns are both environmental and economic. The fishing industry is worried that marine life will die — and that no one will want to buy products from contaminated water anyway. Tourism officials are worried that vacationers won't want to visit oil-tainted beaches. And environmentalists are worried about how the oil will affect the countless birds, coral and mammals in and near the Gulf.

"We know they are out there" said Meghan Calhoun, a spokeswoman from the Audubon Aquarium of the Americas in New Orleans. "Unfortunately the weather has been too bad for the Coast Guard and

NOAA to get out there and look for animals for us."

Fishermen and boaters want to help contain the oil. But on Saturday, they were again hampered by high winds and rough waves that splashed over the miles of orange and yellow inflatable booms strung along the coast, rendering them largely ineffective. Some coastal Louisiana residents complained that BP, which owns the rig, was hampering mitigation efforts.

"I don't know what they are waiting on," said 57-year-old Raymond Schmitt, in Venice preparing his boat to take a French television crew on a tour. He didn't think conditions were dangerous. "No, I'm not happy

with the protection, but I'm sure the oil company is saving money."

## The big kaboom

As bad as the oil spill looks on the surface, it may be only half the problem, said University of California Berkeley engineering professor Robert Bea, who serves on a National Academy of Engineering panel on oil pipeline safety.

"There's an equal amount that could be subsurface, too," said Bea. And that oil below the surface "is damn near impossible to track."

Louisiana State University professor Ed Overton, who heads a federal chemical hazard assessment team for oil spills, worries about a

total collapse of the pipe inserted into the well. If that happens, there would be no warning and the resulting gusher could be even more devastating because regulating flow would then be impossible.

"When these things go, they go KABOOM," he said. "If this thing does collapse, we've got a big, big blow."

BP has not said how much oil is beneath the Gulf seabed Deepwater Horizon was tapping, but a company official speaking on condition of anonymity because he was not authorized to discuss the volume of reserves, confirmed reports that it was tens of millions of barrels — a frightening prospect to many.

# Census gets ready for door-to-door count

NEW YORK — It sounds simple enough. Knock on some doors, ask some questions, get some answers.

But for the more than 600,000 people going door-to-door to reach those who haven't mailed in their census forms, it's not.

When census enumerators set out this Saturday, they could encounter a range of responses at the 48 million addresses they need to check. People who never seem to be home. People who don't speak English. People who say they're too busy. People who swear they mailed in their responses. People who want to know what business is it of the government how many people live in their house, anyway. People who question what will happen to the information that gets collected.

Census workers around the country have spent most of the last week getting trained in all the things they need to know to get the job done, from how to deal with people who are reluctant to answer to what to do at homes with guard dogs.

They've been taught the big things: All the information is kept confidential. (That means they can't talk about anything they've

seen with anyone, either.) That it's important to answer because census information is needed for many things, such as Congressional representation and federal funding for programs. If someone says they're too busy at that moment, ask for a specific time to come back.

They've also been taught the smaller things: Wear comfortable shoes. Make sure your pencils are nice and sharp to fill out the forms (and yes, they have to be No. 2 pencils). If there's a dog, ask if the householder would mind moving the animal away. Don't ask to enter someone's home. Smile and be confident.

"We did a lot of practice role-playing all week," said Lesley Rubinger, 61, a Manhattanite who will be leading a crew of census workers in her first door-to-door count. "What to do if somebody gets hostile, or they refuse to answer your questions."

The Census Bureau tries to encourage as many people as possible to mail in their responses — this year's response rate was 72 percent, the same as in 2000. That's because door-to-door canvassing is the most expensive part of the count, as well as the most vulnerable to mistakes.

The more than 600,000 workers who will canvass residents around the country earn between \$10 and \$25 an hour, working until mid-July.

Enumerators have very specific rules about how they're supposed to work, to ensure consistency, said Tim Olson, assistant division

chief in the Census Bureau's Field Division.

That means the same rules for everyone, from the number of contact attempts per address (up to six) to how to properly canvass a block (start at one place, then move clockwise.)

Olson said for the most part,

census workers don't meet with extremely negative responses to their visits.

"What our enumerators will encounter, by and large, are households that simply have forgotten or misplaced their forms or just were too busy," he said.

"People want to part be of the census," he said.

Of course, there are some differences in what gets emphasized in training sessions around the country. At a New York City training, it didn't make sense to discuss the section on evaluating mobile homes and trailer parks in depth, Rubinger said.

The door-to-door count has its challenges — in some immigrant communities, limited English proficiency could hamper responses and in some rural communities, people are spread out and hard to reach.

The stakes are high. The results of the decennial census are used to apportion seats in the House of Representatives. States such as New York, California, Texas, Arizona and Florida were average or below average in mail-in participation rates, according to census tallies released this past week, putting them in danger of losing congressional seats.

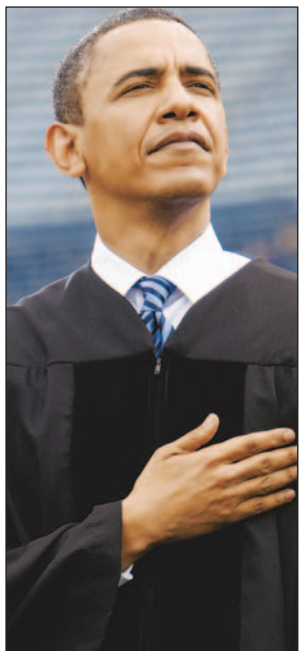

# High court lacks regional diversity

WASHINGTON — Forget liberal vs. conservative justices. The Supreme Court is way out of regional alignment: It's heavily tilted toward the Northeast corridor and could become even more so as President Barack Obama prepares to fill an upcoming vacancy.

Five of the nine justices have strong ties to Boston, New York and central New Jersey. Chief Justice John Roberts is a Midwesterner raised in Indiana, but he went to college and law school at Harvard and has spent his entire professional life in Washington.

Even Justice Clarence Thomas, who stresses his Georgia roots, has lived and worked in Washington since 1983.

Eight justices have Ivy League law degrees, which explains this joking response when a law student asked Roberts if too many justices came from elite schools. No, the chief justice said, "Some went to Yale." The only non-Ivy Leaguer, Justice John Paul Stevens, is leaving the court at the end of this

term; he graduated from Northwestern.

At least three of the known, serious candidates to replace Chicago native Stevens fit the Northeastern profile: Solicitor General Elena Kagan, appeals court Judge Merrick Garland and Harvard Law

School's dean, Martha Minow. Garland and Minow were born in Chicago. But, unlike Stevens, they studied, worked and lived on the East Coast as adults.

Not since the Allegheny Mountains (ranging through Pennsylvania, Maryland, West Virginia, and

Virginia) were the western frontier of the newly created United States has the high court's membership been so concentrated.

Diversity on the court often is measured by gender, ethnicity, religion and race, and the current candidates are being assessed by those measures. But there could be some value, both in the politics of the nomination and a familiarity with issues a new justice might bring, in choosing someone who lives far from Interstate 95, the principal north-south route along the Eastern Seaboard.

"The impetus to appoint someone from the West is a really good one. Geographical diversity is important on the court. Do you really want water rights issues decided by people from Amtrak's Northeast corridor?" said Roy Englert, a Harvard-educated Washington lawyer who argues regularly in front of the Supreme Court.

Two Westerners and two from the Midwest are on Obama's list. Homeland Security Secretary Janet Napolitano was Arizona's governor and appeals court Judge Sidney Thomas is from Montana.

# Can overhaul law save Medicare?

WASHINGTON — President Barack Obama's health care overhaul law cuts about \$500 billion from Medicare in the next 10 years and spends most of that to cover uninsured workers and their families.

Democrats say retirees have nothing to fear because those cuts will help push off Medicare's insolvency until 2029 — a full 12 years from current projections.

"This law doesn't weaken Medicare. It strengthens it and extends its life," Obama said at a Miami fundraiser in April.

Sound too good to be true? Sorting out what the overhaul means for Medicare's finances can be confusing. Federal accounting practices allow the health program for people 65 or older to get a credit — an IOU — for savings that actually will largely get spent to cover younger generations.

Some questions and answers on what's looming as a sensitive issue in the congressional elections this fall:

**Q: Can the government use Medicare savings in the health care law to pay for covering the uninsured now — and also apply them to make good on future obligations?**

A: No. That would be like spending the same money twice.

The Medicare trust fund for inpatient care will get a credit for savings obtained under the law — a special interest-bearing Treasury security that can't be traded on the open market. But when those IOUs must be cashed in to cover hospital care for baby boomers, the government will have to borrow, raise taxes or cut spending somewhere.

Two agencies that provide nonpartisan advice to lawmakers have reached the same conclusion.

The Congressional Budget Office said the majority of the Medicare savings under the legislation "would be used to pay for other spending and therefore would not enhance the ability of the government to pay for future Medicare benefits."

Recently, Medicare's own economic forecasters issued a similar verdict in

a report to lawmakers that discussed how the overhaul law affects Medicare's trust fund.

"In practice, the improved (Medicare) financing cannot be simultaneously used to finance other federal outlays — such as coverage expansions — and to extend the trust fund, despite the appearance of this result from the respective accounting conventions," said Medicare's Office of the Actuary.

**Q: OK, I'm not an actuary. Translation, please?**

A: Economist John Palmer, a former Medicare trustee who helped oversee program finances, uses a simple analogy to describe what's happening.

Imagine the government as a family, said Palmer, and Medicare as a student getting ready to go to college. He saves money and puts it in a cookie jar. The parents take the money out of the cookie jar and leave behind an IOU, while spending the money for the family's day-to-day needs.

"When the time comes for the kid to go to college, he is going to cash in the IOUs," said Palmer. "The kid has got a guarantee he is going to get that much money back from the parents, but the family as a whole doesn't have any more resources."

**Q: It sounds like a Ponzi scheme. Does that mean seniors will be left high and dry?**

A: Palmer says he does not think so.

"It's hard to imagine that the government would actually default on that, rather than decide to raise taxes, or increase the deficit," said the economist, now with the Maxwell School at Syracuse University. "The least palatable option would be to suddenly tell senior citizens, 'I'm sorry, you are not going to get the Medicare that you expected.'"

But make no mistake — closing Medicare's future funding gap will be harder now that some of the easier sources of savings have been tapped to finance the health care bill. Lawmakers may have to face wrenching decisions, such as raising the age of eligibility from 65. And the bill will come due at a time when a nation struggling with higher debt is even less able to pay than it is now.

# Immigration rallies dot the country

CHICAGO — Angered by a controversial Arizona immigration law, tens of thousands of protesters — including 50,000 alone in Los Angeles — rallied in cities nationwide demanding President Barack Obama tackle immigration reform immediately.

"I want to thank the governor of Arizona because she's awakened a sleeping giant," said labor organizer John Delgado who attended a rally in New York where

authorities estimated 6,500 gathered.

Police said 50,000 rallied in Los Angeles where singer Gloria Estefan kicked off a massive downtown march. Estefan spoke in Spanish and English, proclaiming the United States is a nation of immigrants.

"We're good people," the Cuban-born singer said atop a flatbed truck. "We've given a lot to this country. This country has given a lot to us."

Public outcry, particularly among immigrant rights activists, has been building

since last week when Arizona Gov. Jan Brewer signed the legislation. Supporters say the law is necessary because of the federal government's failure to secure the border, but critics contend it encourages racial profiling and is unconstitutional.

Around the country:

■ Organizers estimated about 20,000 gathered at a park on Chicago's West Side and marched, but police said about 8,000 turned out.

■ In Denver, where about 3,000 people rallied.

■ In Dallas, police esti-

mated at least 20,000 attended a Saturday rally.

■ In Tucson, Ariz., a few dozen people from the group Arizonans For Immigration Control showed up in support of the new law and Brewer.

Obama once promised to tackle immigration reform in his first 100 days, but has pushed back that timetable several times. He said this week that Congress may lack the "appetite" to take on immigration after going through a tough legislative year.

Among the ideas listed in the \$20 paperback: ziplining, wildlife encounters, extreme eating contests, like the famous Coney Island hot dog competition, and the annual Gloucestershire Cheese Rolling Race in England.

**DK EYEWITNESS TRAVELS BACK ROADS:** Road trips are a beloved way to explore America, but DK Eyewitness Travel has launched a new series this spring to inspire road trips in Europe. The "Back Roads" series includes guides to France, Italy, Great Britain, Ireland and Spain. Each \$25 paperback describes two dozen "leisurely drives" designed to take anywhere from a day to a week.

Each guide also includes commentary from celebrity chefs, with Mario Batali providing his thoughts on Italy, including a recipe for tortelloni with sage butter and his recommendations for favorite restaurants: Cibreo and Teatro del Sale in Florence; Al Covo, Da Fiore and Lina d'Ombra in Venice, and Ristorante Matricianella, Roscioli, Antico Forno and Checchino in Rome.

The set of six, packaged in a beautiful oversized box, costs \$140. The books will be available in Luxury Collection guest rooms, in Assouline Boutiques in Las Vegas, Los Angeles and New York, and online at [www.luxurycollection.com](http://www.luxurycollection.com) and other retailers.

**THE SMART FAMILY'S PASSPORT:** This book from Budget Travel, \$14.95, is subtitled "350 Money, Time & Sanity Saving tips." Among the suggestions: Bring powdered iced-tea or fruit-punch packets to theme parks and add them to cups of water to save money on expensive drinks; find out if a membership to your local museum has reciprocal privileges at other institutions where you can get in free when you travel; and make your own picture dictionary. # LaHood: Tarmac delay rule to be strongly enforced

WASHINGTON — Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood sent a message Tuesday to airlines who might be tempted to violate his department's new three-hour limit on tarmac stranding: Do so at your peril.

"There will be strong enforcement," LaHood told reporters in a conference call. "I just think that has to be part of our plan to make sure that passengers understand and that airlines understand we're serious about this."

LaHood sidestepped a question about whether he will seek the maximum fine against airlines that break the rule — \$27,500 per passenger. But he pointed to his department's recent \$16.4 million fine against Toyota for its slow response to sticking gas pedals as an indication of his inclination.

"I don't think anybody thinks that Ray LaHood is not going to have strong enforcement," he said.

The rule limiting to three hours the amount of time airlines can keep passengers waiting in planes on tarmacs goes into effect on Thursday. After three hours, planes must return to a gate unless the flight's captain decides it's unsafe to do so or it would interfere with airport operations. The rule also requires airlines to provide passengers with working toilets and, after two hours, food and water.

Airlines have complained that they may be forced to cancel flights, causing passengers to re-

### American Airlines delays Chicago-Beijing route

NEW YORK — American Airlines is delaying the launch of flights between Chicago's O'Hare International Airport and Beijing until it gets approval for certain takeoff and landing times from Chinese authorities.

The airline, based in Fort Worth, Texas, is tentatively delaying the start of flights until May 4. It claims Chinese aviation officials haven't given it the times it asked for in October.

American was scheduled to start service on Monday. The airline is rebooking customers on other flights or offering full refunds.

### Southwest fined \$200,000 for bumping passengers

DALLAS — Southwest Airlines Co., which bumped more passengers than any U.S. carrier last year, has been fined \$200,000 for violating rules on kicking passengers off oversold flights.

The Transportation Department said Tuesday that it reviewed passenger complaints and found many cases of Southwest failing to promptly pay bumped passengers and give them written notices of their rights.

Airlines are allowed to sell more seats than they have because some passengers don't show up.

In other businesses, that would violate laws against deceptive sales tactics. Airlines get a break under the theory that they can offer lower fares if they don't get stuck with empty seats because of no-shows.

Last year, Southwest bumped 13,113 passengers — 80 percent more than the next closest carrier. However, Southwest carried the most U.S. passengers, and travel-

ers faced a greater chance of being bumped on some other airlines, with American's regional affiliate, American Eagle, being the worst.

Federal rules require airlines to first ask for volunteers who will give up their seats in exchange for compensation. After that, airlines can begin to bump passengers who bought tickets. Most passengers bumped from flights are entitled to up to \$800 in cash.

Airlines are required to give bumped passengers a written statement detailing their rights and explaining how the airline decides who gets bumped when flights are oversold. The airlines can offer travel vouchers, but only after telling the passengers that they are entitled to get cash or a check instead, and the amount that they're owed.

In a consent order, the Transportation Department said it would waive \$90,000 of the civil penalty if Southwest doesn't break the rules again in the next year. Also, Southwest can use \$20,000 of the fine to develop ways to notify passengers of their rights and the airline's policy on overselling flights.

In the consent order dated Tuesday, the company said it mostly follows the rules — the number of violations was not disclosed — but would provide more training for employees to improve compliance. The airline also said it would give customers more notice of their rights when they buy tickets on the company website.

Southwest spokeswoman Brandy King said the alleged violations involved "a small percentage" of the airline's flights.

"However, we take every violation seriously and are working to improve our procedures to ensure full compliance with DOT regulations and to provide the best possible experience for all of our customers," she said.

book flights and creating greater inconvenience than if they had continued to wait onboard for clearance to take off.

Last week, LaHood turned down requests from five airlines for temporary exemptions to the three-hour limit at congested New York,

New Jersey and Philadelphia airports.

LaHood said Tuesday that it's important the new rule be applied

consistently. He noted that the rule applies only to domestic flights and will not affect international flights.

Airlines that violate the three-hour rule are supposed to report their violations to the Transportation Department, LaHood said. If they don't, their passengers probably will, he said.

Airlines intend to comply with the three-hour limit, said Elizabeth Merida, a spokeswoman for the Air Transport Association, which represents major airlines.

"We're just not going to violate it, plain and simple," Merida said. "We do think it will lead to unintended consequences."

LaHood announced the new rule in December. Once it became clear that the Transportation Department was determined to follow through on the three-hour limit, airlines began making adjustments to their operations, Merida said.

The impetus for the new rule was a Continental Express flight that was diverted to Rochester, Minn., last August due to thunderstorms. Forty-seven passengers were kept overnight in a cramped plane because employees of another airline refused to open a gate so that they could enter the closed airport terminal.

The futuristic planning has been a boon to Panama City.

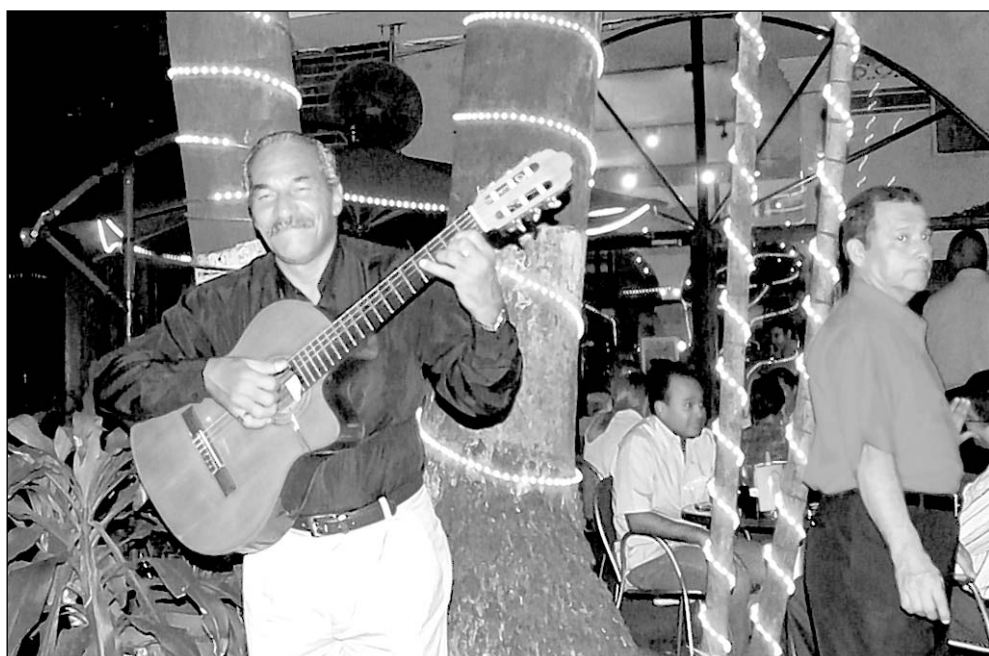

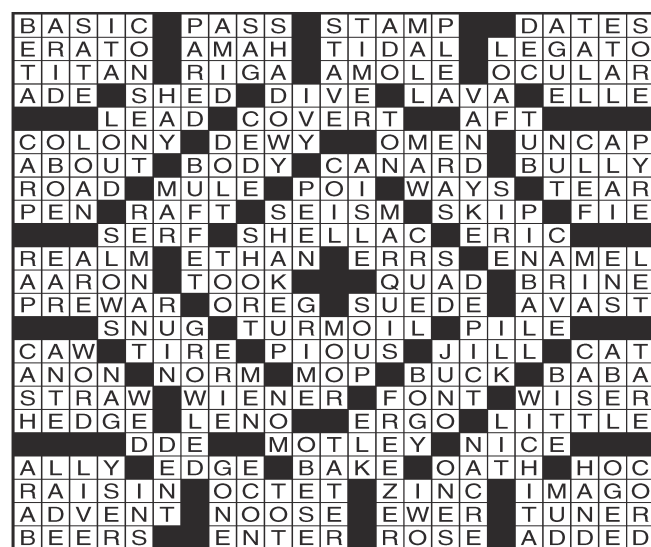
that we used every known excuse to justify going back to the causeway, without regrets.

**S**poiler alert! If you haven't had a colonoscopy yet, don't read any further. I don't want you to miss all the fun. First of all, everyone's happy to see you. The doctor was amazingly cheerful as he told me he'd never perforated anyone's colon yet, but there was a one in 5,000 chance he would.

"How many colonoscopies have you done?"

"About 4,999. Now if you could just sign this form that says I told you about the one-in-5,000 chance, we can give you something to relax, and I'll go to work."

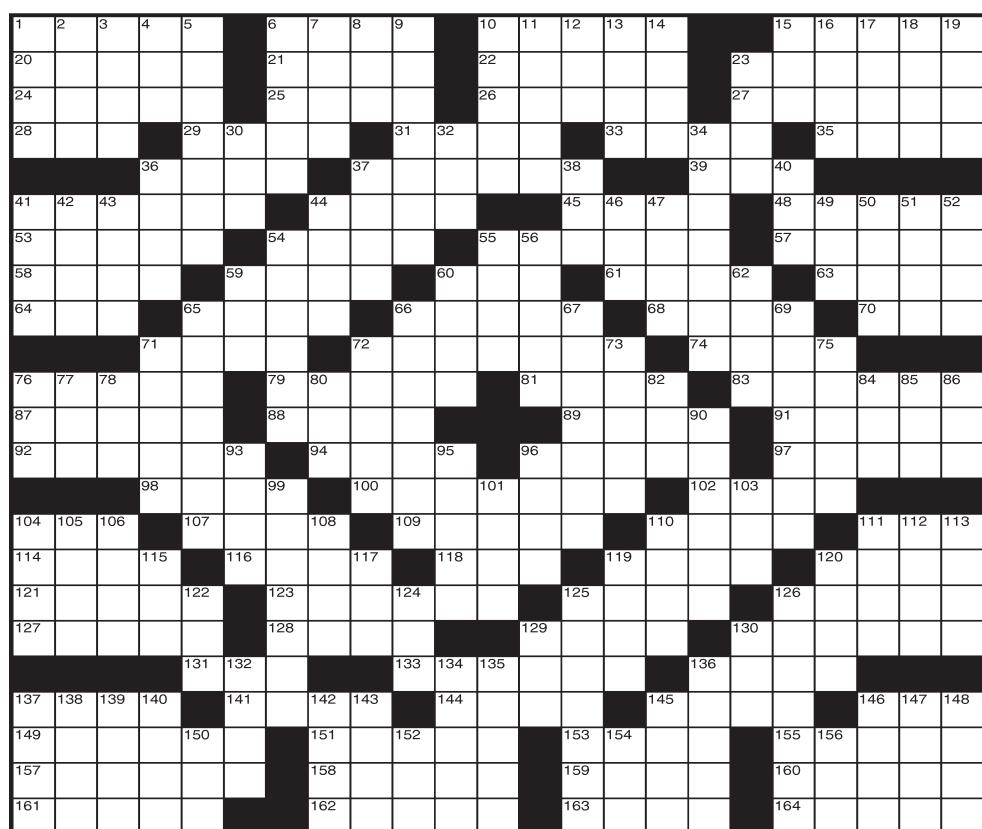

### Super Saver breaks his trainer Pletcher's 0-24 record with win

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — They don't call him Bo-rail for nothing.

Calvin Borel grabbed the rail and didn't let go Saturday, sloshing through the slop with Super Saver on another flawless ride to win his third Kentucky Derby in four years.

The most wide-open Derby in years ended with a sure thing — Borel crossing the finish line and punching the air with this right fist, this time raising it toward a leaden sky.

The jockey's magic touch on his home track gave trainer Todd Pletcher his first Derby victory after 24 failures with a 2 1/2-length victory over Ice Box.

"Calvin Borel is a great rider anywhere he goes, but at Churchill Downs he's even five lengths better," Pletcher said.

"He knows how to ride this track and gets along with his colt beautifully."

Borel's ride nearly duplicated the one he turned in last year aboard 50-1 shot Mine That Bird, except he

and Super Saver went off at lower odds and were never in last place.

He was confident enough in his colt and his knowledge of the track to take him off the lead in the early going of the 1 1/4-mile race. In all but one of his six previous races, Super Saver had never been farther back than second in the early stages.

Borel knew that strategy wouldn't work in a 20-horse Derby field on a tiring, sloppy track that had been pelted by heavy rain early in the day. Breaking from the No. 4 post, he immediately tucked his colt along the rail — a predictable move considering

## Clearing new heights

### CR senior sets school record, finishes second at state meet

WINTER PARK — Did you leave it all out there?

That's the question posted on the gate as spectators and athletes exit Showalter Field.

For the past five years, the Winter Park venue has been the annual site of the state track and field meets. On Saturday evening as the sun baked down on competitors and spectators alike, at least one Crystal River athlete — Ryan L'Heureux — exited the complex with his head held high.

He had competed at the highest level in his event, the pole vault, and cleared a height he had never before done in competition. "Ryan is a super kid. He's been a great inspiration to a lot of the younger kids and he is definitely going to be missed," Crystal River boys head track coach Tim Byrne said. "It's just great to see a kid like Ryan go out on a

Quail Hollow Championship. Now comes a chance for the real thing.

Mayfair kept the ball in play Saturday and kept the lead at Quail Hollow, shooting a 1-under 71 to take a two-shot lead over Masters champion Phil Mickelson and Carolina favorite Davis Love III.

A victory would be his first

since the 1998 Buick Open, and the first time a Monday qualifier won on the PGA Tour since Fred Wadsworth in the 1986 Southern Open.

"Today was a real test for me," Mayfair said. "I kept it going for 18 holes and still have the lead going into tomorrow."

It is hard for Mayfair not to get caught up in the possibilities.

He lost his PGA Tour card after the worst season of his career, and a victory would sure take care of that. He only got into Quail Hollow because of a Monday qualifier that he almost missed. Mayfair was late arriving in Charlotte, had to race to the course to make his tee time and then shot a 65, his best score of the year.

# Dixon darts to 2nd IRL win

*Driver victorious in season's first oval race*

KANSAS CITY, Kan. — Waiting for the final green flag out of a caution, a few laps from the finish, Scott Dixon jokingly asked his crew if he could save some horsepower boosts for the Indianapolis 500 later this month.

Obviously, the answer was no. The way Dixon kicked off IndyCar's oval season, he might not need them anyway.

Making few changes to a fast-off-the-truck car, Dixon cruised to his second straight IndyCar Series victory at Kansas Speedway on Saturday, firmly placing himself atop the list of favorites for the big race on the bricks.

"Success for us here has been fantastic and I just hope we can carry this momentum for another 30 days," Dixon said after his 22nd career IndyCar victory.

Loose early and fast the rest of the way, Dixon barely used his push-to-pass button. He led the final 150 of the 200 laps on the 1.5-mile oval and finished more than 3 seconds ahead of runner-up Dario Franchitti.

Dixon takes the early lead in IndyCar's new oval championship and becomes a front-runner for the Indy 500, a race he won in 2008. He's also the second straight repeat winner at Kansas, giving Target Chip Ganassi Racing four straight wins following Dan Wheldon's 2008 defense.

"He was just fast," said Tony Kanaan, who finished third despite a miserable day of qualifying that had him breaking stuff at the team trailer on Friday. "I wish I had some of it."

Dixon got the season off to a decent start on the road courses.

He opened with a sixth in Brazil and followed a disappointing 18th at St. Petersburg with two top-five finishes, including a runner-up to Ryan Hunter-Reay in Long Beach two weeks ago.

All that was missing was a victory. Back on the comfortable Kansas oval — he's finished in the top four each of the past five races there — Dixon was an uncatchable force.

The two-time IndyCar Series champ was fastest in the lone practice session Friday and lost a little speed in qualifying, though was still fast enough to start on the front row with pole-sitter Ryan Briscoe.

Dixon was strong from the opening green, escaping an early bobble to pass Briscoe on Lap 33, then holding his position through two pit stops, one on a green flag and another on a cau-

tion midway through the race. A final pit with 22 laps left went smoothly and had the added luck of being just before a caution after Jay Howard folded up the right side of his car with a slide into the wall.

Dixon used his horsepower-boosting pass button just a handful of times during the race, his car good enough to push him to the Kansas checkers and give him momentum into Indianapolis.

"He had just a little bit extra today," said Franchitti, Dixon's Ganassi teammate. "When I leave the truck today, I'm going to go try to find out what it is."

Though Kansas is nothing like Indy, it is an oval and the last tuneup for the biggest race of the year.

A record 27 cars were in the field at Kansas and Indy figures to be wheel-to-wheel in a crowded field, so this was a chance to get the feel for running in traffic.

It also was an opportunity to see how the oval newbies — Mario Romanicini, Takuma Sato, Simona De Silvestro and Bertrand Baquette — would handle the high speeds and hold-your-line racing after four road-course races to start the season.

The inexperienced oval drivers were even warned during the morning drivers' meeting about the end of runs, when low fuel loads and worn tires would hamper handling.

There were no major mishaps, only a loose-into-the-wall crash by E.J. Viso on Lap 72, Howard's crash and a restart wreck involving Japanese drivers Hideki Mutoh and Sato with 14 left.

The problems came from lapped cars, not the rookies.

Throughout the day but particularly late in the race, drivers trying to make up ground had trouble getting around cars no longer on the lead lap, needing several attempts to pass.

# Snead aims to earn roster spot with Bucs as free agent

TAMPA — Former Mississippi quarterback Jevan Snead insists he has no regrets about passing up his final season of college eligibility, only to watch the NFL draft come and go without hearing his name called.

Disappointed but undeterred, the one-time top prospect — whose stock dropped during an inconsistent junior year — signed a free agent contract with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and is participating a rookie minicamp this weekend.

"I didn't really know what to expect. I certainly didn't have my hopes up too high or anything like that. I knew that anything could happen, so I was ready for anything," he said. "It didn't go exactly the way I had hoped, but I'm here now. I'm here to make the best of it."

Snead began his college career at Texas before transferring to Ole Miss. He appeared well on his way to being a potential high pick after throwing for 2,762 yards and 26 touchdowns in his first season with the Rebels two years ago.

He threw for 2,632 yards and 20 TDs in 2009, leading Ole Miss to nine wins and moving into second place behind Eli Manning on the career touchdown list with 46. But he also tossed 20 interceptions after finishing with 13 the previous season.

The decision to turn pro early surprised some scouts, who felt he regressed as a junior and should stay in school. The 22-year-old scoffed at speculation that one of the reasons he left the Rebels was he wasn't guaranteed to retain his starting job.

"I graduated in December with my marketing degree. That was a huge thing for me, and really I felt like it was my time to go," said Snead, who played behind Colt McCoy at Texas in 2006.

"A bunch of people say it was because of competition, and I'll tell you right now, that's ridiculous," he said. "I've never been afraid to compete. I wouldn't have come out if I was afraid to compete because I know that the next level is all about competing. Anybody that said I was afraid to compete doesn't know what they're talking about."

Snead and two other undrafted quarterbacks — South Florida's Matt Grothe and Texas Southern's Bobby Reid — hope to impress the Bucs as they were given crash courses on offense.

# Nadal pulls out tough win in Rome Masters

ROME — Rafael Nadal withstood a serious test from Ernests Gulbis before finally wearing down his 40th-ranked opponent to pull out a 6-4, 3-6, 6-4 win in the semifinals of the Rome Masters on Saturday.

It was the first time in nine matches on clay this year that Nadal dropped a set.

"It was a really hard match and I didn't play well," Nadal said. "It's really difficult to play against Gulbis. His serve was really unbelievable."

Routinely putting first serves in at 133 mph, Gulbis didn't allow Nadal his usual rhythm on his return game and the Spaniard converted only two of 12 break points.

Nadal broke Gulbis in the opening game of the match and didn't do it again until the final game.

Upon sealing the 2-hour, 46-minute match, Nadal let out a big scream and jump with a series of fist pumps.

"I was really happy that I

won such a difficult match," Nadal said. "The mental part was very good for me."

Nadal will be aiming for his fifth Rome title in six years when he meets David Ferrer in today's title match. His fellow Spaniard beat a sluggish Fernando Verdasco 7-5, 6-3 to advance to the first Masters Series final of his career.

The 21-year-old Gulbis was attempting to become the first player to beat both Roger Federer and Nadal in the same clay-court tournament, having stunned the top-ranked Swiss in the second round.

"I knew I could play with the top players if I play good. With my serve and my powerful shots I know I'm tough to play against," Gulbis said. "I lost but I'm satisfied with this week."

While the match against Federer was error-ridden on both sides, this match provided a sharp contrast in styles, with Nadal providing his usual steady and mostly error-free play and Gulbis going for winners.

# WinStar Farm ends Derby drought

*Super Saver completes dream for co-founders*

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Kenny Troutt's 9-year-old daughter Savannah had a message for her father on the morning of the Kentucky Derby.

She leaned in and told the co-founder of WinStar Farm that WinStar's Derby drought was finally over.

"She said, 'Dad, I think this is our year, I really believe we're going to win the Derby,'" Troutt said.

Good call. Super Saver's decisive win in the Run for the Roses did more than stamp jockey Calvin Borel as a superstar and end trainer Todd Pletcher's 0 for 24 mark in the Derby. It served as a breakthrough for the thriving central Kentucky farm.

WinStar's previous nine entries failed to reach the winner's circle, their closest finish a distant second with Bluegrass Cat in 2006.

Borel left no doubt, expertly guiding the bay colt

through the 1 1/4-mile test to deliver on a dream Troutt and co-founder Bill Casner had when the first met in the late 1970s.

The two operated a small claiming horse operation before opting to give it up. They talked about giving it another shot one day on one condition: they couldn't be small-time.

"We learned that if you're going to do this business that you're going to have to do it at the very highest echelon," Casner said. "We left the racetrack when we were 31 years old and at that time we really vowed that we wouldn't come back unless

we couldn't do it at a high level."

The two spent most of the next two decades building their respective fortunes. Troutt founded a long-distance telephone company while Casner ran a heavy equipment business.

It allowed them to bankroll WinStar, which focuses on all parts of the business, from breeding to training. The farm bred 2003 Derby winner Funny Cide, but there's little doubt where Saturday's romp in the slop ranks.

"This is like putting the cherry on top of that ice cream, and we feel like we

his nickname — and there they stayed almost the entire way.

Super Saver was timed in 2:04.45 as the 8-1 second-choice behind favorite Lookin At Lucky, whose 6-1 odds tied Harlan's Holiday in 2002 for the longest priced favorite in 136 runnings. He paid \$18, \$8.80 and \$6.

Pletcher let out a whoop and slapped his hands together after his colt crossed the finish line, snapping a skid the Eclipse Award-winning trainer was eager

to end.

He seemed to have a lock on his first Derby win until expected favorite Eskendereya was withdrawn last weekend with a swollen leg. That left Pletcher with four horses in the race, but none as highly regarded.

His other finishers were: Mission Impazible, 10th; filly Devil May Care, 10th; and Discreetly Mine, 13th.

Pletcher's only other Triple Crown race victory was in 2007 at Belmont with the filly Rags to Riches. The lack of a Derby win by the 42-year-old former assistant to D. Wayne Lukas was the most glaring omission on his resume and

something he was constantly asked about.

It wasn't for lack of trying. In 2007, he saddled five in the Derby, with none finishing higher than sixth.

"It's the one thing that was important to me," he said. "The one thing I wanted to do while my parents were still here to see it."

Borel is the first jockey to win three derbies in four years; Bill Hartack won three in five years from 1960-64.

"Calvin Borel is amazing. He is fearless," trainer Bob Baffert said. "He takes control of the race, and you have to give him a lot of credit. He's a great rider."

BALTIMORE — Ty Wigginton and Matt Wieters homered in a six-run fifth inning against Daisuke Matsuzaka, and the Baltimore Orioles defeated the Boston Red Sox to win their first series of the season.

The teams combined for nine home runs, including two apiece by Wigginton and Boston's David Ortiz.

Matsuzaka (0-1) gave up seven runs, six earned, and seven hits in 4 2/3 innings. The right-hander was making his season debut after spending a month on the disabled list with a neck strain.

Wigginton also connected in the sixth against Tim Wakefield, who ended a string of 162 consecutive starts with his first relief appearance since June 9, 2004. The knuckleballer yielded five runs in 2 1-3 innings.

Nick Markakis went 3 for 4 with a homer and five RBIs for the Orioles, who also beat the Red Sox on Friday night in the series that concludes Sunday. The two-game winning streak matches Baltimore's longest of the season, accomplished once previously.

# Miyazato leads by single stroke

*Lincicome, Wie close behind at Tres Maria event*

MORELIA, Mexico — Ai Miyazato handled the gusting, canyon-blown wind better than her two long-hitting playing partners.

Miyazato moved into position for her third victory of the season, shooting a 2-under 71 on Saturday to take a one-stroke lead over Michelle Wie and Brittany Lincicome in the Tres Marias Championship.

"I like to play in the wind because I grew up in a windy place," said Miyazato, raised in the small village of Higashisono on the Japanese island of Okinawa. "It's still tough playing in the wind for me, but I have a good image in my head even if I am playing in tough, windy conditions."

The winner of the season-opening events in Thailand and Singapore, Miyazato had a 13-under 206 total at Tres Marias Country Club.

Wie, a stroke ahead after two rounds, shot a 73, and Lincicome had a 72 on the mountainside course. Wie won her lone LPGA Tour title 5 1/2 months ago in the Lorena Ochoa Invitational in Ochoa's hometown of Guadalajara.

Ochoa, the top-ranked star retiring after the tournament to raise a family and work on her charity foundation, was sixth at 10 under after a 70. She has won the tournament three times in the last four seasons, finishing at 25 under the last two years.

Miyazato, far shorter off the tee than Wie and Lincicome, used her control and accuracy to play more consistently. All players battled the 6,500-foot altitude, where the ball travels about 10 percent farther.

"Honestly, I thought some holes

were not fair because they (Wie and Lincicome) hit too long," Miyazato said, drawing a laugh.

"But I have confidence with my short game and my putting is really comfortable right now."

Miyazato fell four strokes behind Wie after five holes, but patiently worked her way back with birdies on Nos. 6 and 7. She also birdied 12, dropped a shot on 15, but birdied 16 and closed with two pars on the two

tough finishing holes.

"That definitely got me going," Miyazato said of the back-to-back birdies. "I thought the par 5s were very difficult today so it helped me that I was able to make birdies on those par 4s."

Wie bogeyed two of the last four holes after closing with two bogeys Friday.

Wie's 73 was by far her worst score, following opening rounds of 66 and 68.

"It was a bit of a struggle today," she said. "I didn't really hit the ball as well as I wanted to, never putted the way I wanted to, but I'll hopefully straighten things out for tomorrow. ... I just didn't feel comfortable out there today."

Ochoa will be boosted by thousands of Mexican fans expected on Sunday.

"The only thing I wanted to do was to enjoy every moment and give myself a chance on Sunday," Ochoa said. "So it doesn't matter if it's second place, fourth place, first place. Nobody is going to take this week away."

Ochoa said she's cried each day of the tournament, and expected more tears Sunday as she says farewell.

"Not in a sad way, but I know I am not coming back, so it's a hard feeling."

Ochoa took the No. 1 ranking just over three years ago — April 23, 2007 — from Annika Sorenstam. According to the tour's unofficial calculations, she needs to finish at least fourth to be guaranteed of holding the ranking for at least one more week.

A finish below that could open the door for No. 2 Jiyai Shin and No. 5 Miyazato.

Shin is playing an event this weekend in Japan, and could move to the top of the rankings by winning there, provided Ochoa finishes fifth or lower: Miyazato could also do it if she wins the Tres Marias title and Ochoa finishes 10th or worse.

# Three tied for lead in Champions Tour event

SAUCIER, Miss. — David Frost shot a 6-under 66 on Saturday to equal the course record and join Brad Bryant and David Eger atop the Champions Tour leaderboard for the inaugural Mississippi Gulf Resort Classic.

Bryant, who had a one-shot lead heading to the final hole, bogeyed 18 for his second consecutive 68. Eger also shot a 68 in the second round at Fallen Oak Golf Club.

"In the wind like this, it's not so much about momentum as it is about patience and control," Bryant said.

Jay Haas (68) was in fourth, two shots off the pace, and Tom Kite, Joey Sindelar, Roid Spittle and Tommy Armour III were at 5 under.

Gary Hallberg also shot a 6-under 66 and was tied for ninth with four others, including first-round co-leader Bob Tway, who shot 2-over 74. Robin Freeman had seven birdies but finished with a double-bogey and bogey to complete a 68. He had a share of the lead before the double-bogey on the par-3 17th.

Leonard Thompson, who shared the first-round lead with Tway, struggled most of the day, shooting a 5-over 77 that dropped him into a tie for 26th.

Because of the threat of inclement weather, tournament officials moved up the start of Sunday's final round and announced they will use split tees, beginning on No. 1 and No. 10.

# With Tiger gone, crowd goes wild for Mickelson

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — The large crowd bunched together near the clubhouse was yelling "Phil! Phil!" when Phil Mickelson was still inside signing his scorecard.

A man started chanting "Here we go Lefty, here we go!" as Mickelson began a television interview.

Eliminate Tiger Woods from the weekend, add a few afternoon cocktails to a Saturday crowd that didn't seem to be thinned much by the world's No. 1 player missing the cut, and Mickelson became the top attraction at the Quail Hollow Championship.

"I think that's Charlotte, though,"

Mickelson insisted after his 1-under 71 left him tied for second, two shots behind Billy Mayfair. "We get a lot more people at this tournament and they're very supportive. I think it might be that."

But it's clear with Mickelson coming off another Masters victory and in contention for his first win here, he'll be followed by a large gallery on Sunday when he's in the next-to-last group.

"To be within a couple shots of the lead, I felt like I had to fight hard today and play hard because I didn't have my best stuff," Mickelson said as the fans shouted his name again. "I had to control my misses."

## Good and Bad

Davis Love III was born in Charlotte and attended North Carolina. His daughter is with him this week and he heard plenty of "Go Heels!" chants while shooting a 4-under 68 on Saturday to put himself into contention for his first victory in two years.

But he's not the only golfer who enjoys coming to Quail Hollow. Even a guy who missed the cut didn't want to leave.

"I went out to pitch this morning and Derek Lamely was out there just working on his game and he goes, 'Isn't this place so nice?'" Love said. "I'm like, 'Yeah.' I guess he missed the cut and he was just out practicing, and he was happy."

Lamely didn't make the weekend

after shooting 75-72. But his feelings about Quail Hollow are shared by many.

"This is a great place to play golf," said Love, who went bogey-free Saturday to move within two shots of the lead and earn a pairing with leader Billy Mayfair in the final group Sunday. "It's like a mini-major."

# Foster leads Spanish Open after 3 rounds

SEVILLE, Spain — Mark Foster of England shot a 3-under 69 to take a three-shot lead after the third round of the Spanish Open on Saturday.

Foster had four birdies in difficult, breezy conditions in a round that left him at 12-under 204 in his bid to end a seven-year victory drought on the European Tour.

Carlos del Moral (70) and Alvaro Quiros (67) of Spain and Raphael Jacquelin (71) of France were at 207.

Foster, who has not won a European Tour title since the 2003 Dunhill Championship in South Africa, was surprised how relaxed he felt starting the third round a shot behind Johan Edfors of Sweden.

While many players struggled with the wind, the 34-year-old Foster kept his head with the help of Janet Spring, the caddie he borrowed for the week from the injured Jeev Milkha Singh.

"She is just a brilliant caddie," said Foster, who has worked with Spring before. "In the tricky conditions I needed help and she is a good person to have working for me this week."

Edfors and Sebi Garcia of Spain, who like Foster began the third round just one shot off the lead at 9 under, both saw their challenges quickly derailed.

Edfors bogeyed four of his opening six holes. He avoided a complete disaster with birdies at Nos. 12-13 en route to a 76.

Garcia, ranked 1,272nd in the world, had five bogeys in seven holes halfway through his round. After a 75 he joined Edfors in a group of six players at 6 under.

Big-hitting Quiros overpowered a course measuring just 6,134 yards in producing a 67. He started with three birdies in his opening four holes, then at the 514-yard, par-5 fifth, he hit the green with a driver and made a 20-foot putt for an eagle.

Quiros was happy to find himself in contention after suffering a shortage of confidence caused by missing the cut at the Masters for the second straight year.

Police say 20-year-old Aquiles Sanchez, 20-year-old Edgar Raul Salgado and a 15-year-old are being held on suspicion of homicide.

LAS VEGAS — Las Vegas is celebrating Latino music icons Gloria and Emilio Estefan with two days of fanfare culminating with a star placed in their honor on the Las Vegas Strip sidewalk.

## ESPN winning kudos for its documentary series, '30 for 30'

ESPN's "30 for 30" sports documentary series is approaching halftime with an upbeat spirit and momentum on its side.

The sports network launched "30 for 30" last October as a celebration of ESPN's 30th anniversary and as a bid to more deeply explore memorable sports moments in the last 30 years. With a dozen films aired so far, it's also a clear foray into territory historically owned by HBO.

The most notable difference is the freedom ESPN has given its filmmakers. The results may be a mixed bag, but they have all had the stamp of personal passion.

The series was spawned from a 2 a.m. e-mail sent to network high-ups by ESPN.com's pop culture and sports columnist Bill Simmons, also known as "the SportsGuy." It's since grown into a multimillion-dollar operation and the films have played at the country's top festivals. Several "30 for 30" docs premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival, which concludes today.

"My biggest contribution with this series was probably convincing ESPN to let the people that we hired explore their vision," says Simmons.

The series has attracted top documentary filmmakers like Steve James ("Hoop Dreams"), Alex Gibney ("Taxi to the Dark Side"), and Albert Maysles ("Gimme Shelter"), as well as Hollywood directors like Peter Berg and Barry Levinson.

The topics covered have ranged from the serious (the implications of race in Allen Iverson's journey) to the idiosyncratic (Reggie Miller's rivalry with the New York Knicks).

Filmmakers involved say they appreciate the rope given to them.

"They've found a format for difference," says Gibney, whose documentary about scapegoats — Chicago Cubs fan Steve Bartman and former Red Sox first baseman Bill Buckner — will air later this year.

"HBO has their format on the sports films where they're all about different subjects but they're rigorously produced with exactly the same style," Gibney says. "30 for 30" is doing just the opposite. They're saying, 'Each one of these is going to be wildly different.'"

Simmons, who co-created the series with Connor Schell, said one of the "major battles behind the scenes" was persuading ESPN, which is owned by Walt Disney Co., to relinquish its control. That outsider perspective isn't always common on a network with on-air talent

populated by former players and general managers, and which has broadcasting deals with many of the leagues it covers.

Keith Clinkscales, senior vice president of ESPN content development, which oversees ESPN Films, says the network has "learned along the way" how to handle the films.

"This series has shown us that the documentary film does work for our audience," says Clinkscales. "We will continue to innovate after '30 for 30.'"

Ratings for the films have ranged from the 2.35 million that watched Billy Corben's "The U" (about the University of Miami's '80s football team) to 355,000 viewers for the fantasy sports documentary "Silly Little Game."

Some films are garnering considerable critical acclaim, particularly "Two Escobars" by Jeff and Michael Zimbalist. It not only screened at Tribeca, but will play at this year's Cannes Film Festival.

Simmons calls the film — about the intersection of soccer and the drug trade for Colombians Andres Escobar and Pablo Escobar — one of the best sports documentaries ever made.

"30 for 30" was always positioned as an antidote to HBO's sports documentaries, and a rivalry has developed between the networks.

## Doc: Michaels' will to live 'undeniable'

LOS ANGELES — Bret Michaels' is expected to make a full recovery, according to his doctor.

The 47-year-old former Poison frontman's will to live is "undeniable," said Dr. Joseph Zabramski, chief of cerebrovascular surgery at the Barrow Neurological Institute at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center in Phoenix, who has been leading the team treating "The Celebrity Apprentice" contestant since he suffered a brain hemorrhage last week.

Michaels, who was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes at age 6 and underwent an emergency appendectomy

April 12, was rushed to St. Joseph's Hospital last week with a severe headache. He was later diagnosed with a subarachnoid hemorrhage, which causes bleeding in the fluid-filled spaces around the base of the brain. The cause of the hemorrhage is still unknown.

"There is no doubt that Mr. Michaels' condition is serious," Zabramski added.

He said Michaels, who has two daughters, 9-year-old Raine Elizabeth and 4-year-old Jorja Bleu, "did not want his family to wake up and see him lying unconscious in the middle of the floor." He also said immediate medical attention and Michaels' "fight to stay conscious dur-

ing the hemorrhage" enabled doctors to stabilize his condition.

Other doctors said it is possible that Michaels could be healthy enough to appear on "The Celebrity Apprentice" live finale May 23. He is currently one of seven contestants remaining on Donald Trump's competitive reality series, including pop singer Cyndi Lauper, reality TV diva Sharon Osbourne, celebrity chef Curtis Stone and actress Holly Robinson Peete.

If Michaels ascends to the final showdown, it would be unprecedented in "The Apprentice" franchise history if he is not present to defend himself in the boardroom.

## From writer to editor to HR guy

Those who have called the *Chronicle* with a story tip or who have attended our weekly editorial board meetings know Mike Arnold. If you played high school sports in the 1990s, you may well know Mike, too.

If not, there's a good chance you don't know the large-framed, levelheaded, longtime Citrus Countian who has served as managing editor of the newspaper for the past seven-plus years.

While reporters, photographers and sports writers are out and about, Mike's primarily been an in-office guy for the past decade or so. What he's done behind the scenes is to orchestrate news to be published seven days a week, 365 days a year. The managing editor supervises the news reporting team and is a key go-to guy for all the supervisors as well as managers in other departments and the public at large.

Back in the early 1990s, I was a copy editor who sat closest to the editorial department entrance. Every week or so, in the evening hours, this big guy would show up at the door and

## Analysis: Fixing the deficit may be painful, but the consequences of doing nothing are much worse

WASHINGTON — The costs of solving the United States' federal deficit problem are more than many people want to pay — higher taxes on a wide swath of Americans and cuts in benefit programs that reach into millions of homes.

But the results of inaction on the steadily growing debt threat are even more costly: fundamental damage to the U.S. economy and a lower standard of living for future generations.

The warnings from deficit hawks are much more urgent since the country's fiscal health went from bad several years ago to drastically worse with the financial crisis and recession of 2008 and 2009. Last year, the government borrowed \$1.4 trillion, nearly 40 cents of every dollar it spent.

"The path forward contains many difficult trade-offs and choices, but postponing those choices and failing to put the nation's finances on a sustainable long-run trajectory would ultimately do great damage to our economy," Federal Reserve Board Chairman Ben Bernanke told President Barack Obama's 18-member deficit commission at its first meeting Tuesday.

As Bernanke testified, the stock market began a precipitous dive after Standard & Poor's downgraded the debt of Greece to junk bond status. The Mediterranean country is mired in a debt crisis that has shaken its economy and markets.

The United States is a long way from where Greece is. But U.S. deficits — like last year's \$1.4 trillion — that continue well in excess of 4 percent of the country's total economic production are unsustainable, most major economists say. Such deficits would push interest rates higher, crowd out private investment and ultimately erode living standards.

"Substantial deficits projected far into the future could cause the market to rapidly lose confidence in the government's creditworthiness, producing a spike in interest rates and fundamentally disrupting economic activity more broadly," White House budget chief Peter Orszag said.

With interest payments on the debt growing without respite, future generations would have to pay for the lack of corrective action. That means higher taxes and fewer government services — and a potentially weaker economy.

"We know for a fact, it's irrefutable, that we're giving the next generation an inferior standard of living," said Republican Congressman Paul Ryan. "We've never done that before in this country. You know, the legacy of this country has always been you take on the challenges before you to make sure that your kids and grandkids have a better life."

Tuesday's mantra, mostly among Democrats, was that all options should be on the table, which signaled that politically toxic tax increases will be under consideration.

"I'm not going to say what's in. I'm not going to say what's out," said Obama, who has promised repeatedly not to raise taxes on American families with incomes less than \$250,000. "I want this commission to be free to do its work."

It's a task, though, that won't be easy: Produce a deficit no bigger than \$550 billion by 2015, an amount equal to about 3 percent of the total U.S. economy. That would require deficit savings in the range of \$250 billion or more in 2015 alone.

Deficits have worsened largely because of a drop in tax revenues and increasing costs for safety-net programs like unemployment insurance due to the recession. Spiraling costs of federal health care programs also have been a major contributor.

The problem is too large to be handled with easy Washington chestnuts like cut-

ting foreign aid and ending waste, fraud and abuse, undoing the Wall Street bailout or rescinding what remains of Obama's \$862 billion economic stimulus bill.

"Spending cuts will have to affect programs we all care about and benefit from and revenue increases will have to come from a wide swath of Americans," Urban Institute President Robert Reischauer said. "In other words, raising taxes on the rich or corporations, closing tax loopholes, eliminating wasteful or low-priority programs and prohibiting earmarks simply won't be enough."

But summoning the political courage to propose, say, tax increases for a majority of Americans or making people work another year to qualify for Social Security benefits is far easier said than done.

Obama is but the latest example. His February budget was a cautious document that punted the tough decisions to his new bipartisan commission. And the panel's instructions are to deliver its recommendations after November's midterm elections.

"There are few issues on which there is more vigorous bipartisan agreement than fiscal responsibility," said Obama, flanked by former Clinton White House Chief of Staff Erskine Bowles and Republican former Sen. Alan Simpson, the two men he asked to head the panel. "But in practice, this responsibility for the future is often overwhelmed by the politics of the moment."

## Gap between Chinese, U.S. cultures slowly shrinking

I have recently returned from a trip to China sponsored by the Chinese United States Exchange Foundation (CUSEF) and the China Association for International Friendly Contact (CAIFC). I was in Beijing, Xi'an and Shanghai. This was my third trip to China. The first was in the mid-1980s before Tiananmen Square with Loret Ruppe, head of the Peace Corps. The mission was to try to bring the Peace Corps to China. It did not work. The next trip was after Tiananmen Square, when I led the first official delegation into China to test the waters in September 1996.

The report will be divided into a

look at the relationship between China and the U.S., overview of China from U.S. government sources, an overall summary of the trip, coverage of individual meetings, and a review of the recommendations from the 1996 trip.

The relations between China and the U.S. are greatly important but somewhat tenuous. For instance, while economic ties are deepening, and people-to-people exchanges are increasing, a level of mistrust persists that is

based on different political systems and disparities in cultures. Although China no longer has a command economy, the Communist Party maintains single-party political control, and there is not a foreseeable prospect of conversion to multi-party democracy. There are no free elections except some at the municipal level. There is minimal freedom of the press and freedom of religion and yet there is a healthy free enterprise system. The U.S. has these freedoms yet is

# EU designed to fail

The downgrading of Greece's debt rating to junk bond status sent shivers throughout industrialized markets, raising concerns in Europe about whether a planned \$60 billion bailout can survive this latest obstacle in skeptical European capitals. With public opinion in Germany strongly against aiding Greece, German Chancellor Angela Merkel is wary of any bailout without enforceable conditions on the Greek government to cut spending and reduce the country's large and bloated public sector.

One of Greece's options would be to drop out of the European Union and reclaim its right to print money, which is what the U.S. Treasury does when money is short. But it's too late for Greece to do that; it would be the laughing stock of Europe, if not the world, and wouldn't have any credit to borrow money anywhere.

The Greek government has been spending way beyond its means, and its efforts to cut back have been met with fierce resistance by the public. Striking dockworkers have left tourists stranded on ships; transportation workers stopped bus and train service for six hours to protest cuts in pay and pensions; and that's just the beginning. Unions representing 2.5 million workers are planning a mass march next week to protest the government's austerity measures.

The European Union was created in 1993 to maximize Europe's clout as a trading bloc, but Greece has severely strained the one for all, and all for one spirit that brought 27 member nations together. Greece's debt is now 124 percent of its gross domestic product (GDP), more than double the 60 percent that EU nations had agreed was the maximum sustainable amount.

Germany's resistance to backing a bailout which would have to get the backing of the Bundestag is a symptom of a larger problem, and that is whether an economic union can survive in the absence of a political union. Germany's political leaders doubt that Greece can shrink its spending and trim the government's payroll in the face of such massive public opposition, and if Greece falls short, other European governments, some strapped themselves, are unwilling to be the safety net.

Greece could be the first crack in the armor of the EU, threatening its survival as an organization willing and able to care for its own. Standard & Poor's, the premiere rating agency, also downgraded Portugal to junk bond status, and as world markets tumbled in response to the news, word came that Spain was also getting a ratings downgrade.

When the European Union was created, part of the deal was that each country would give up its national currency to adopt a common currency, the Euro. British voters refused to go along with that, voting down the measure in a referendum; the pound remains the British currency. It's more than symbolic, as the Greek government is discovering. When they got in over their heads, they couldn't print Euros and are probably more reliant than they would like on their fellow Europeans.

Critics of the mounting debt that the politicians are running up in Washington warn that America could go the way of Greece. The facts are otherwise. The U.S. deficit as a percentage of GDP is only 10.64 percent. Even at the height of World War II, when the percentage was at its historic high, it was only 28.05 percent. It is no wonder that the dollar is regarded by capitals around the world as a safe haven.

If the economic dominoes continue to fall in Europe, however, the EU may prove to have been nothing more than a failed experiment in economic dependence without political dependence.

## Iraqi PM's power grabs threaten stability

BAGHDAD — Prime Minister Nouri al-Maliki's efforts to retain power despite his failure in last month's elections threaten to undercut the democratic process that has been hailed as a key achievement of the U.S. invasion and occupation.

He is also potentially gambling away the country's security with steps that, if successful, are certain to leave Iraq's minority Sunnis feeling cheated after they overwhelmingly backed his secular challenger, Ayad Allawi. The resulting anger could fuel new sectarian bloodshed and reinvigorate an insurgency against the country's Shiite-dominated leadership.

Illustrating the risk, suicide attackers detonated two car bombs Wednesday evening in a Shiite enclave of Baghdad, killing seven people.

Allawi, a former prime minister, is fighting back, demanding an internationally supervised caretaker government and warning he might withdraw from the political process altogether, potentially prompting the barely contained Sunni-Shiite tensions to explode just as U.S. troops prepare to go home.

Al-Maliki came out of the March 7 parliamentary election with a two-seat deficit to Allawi, a decision that was met with dancing in the streets by Allawi's backers, many of whom are Sunni Arabs who resent al-Maliki's perceived sectarian policies.

Al-Maliki has vigorously fought the outcome, using the powers of his office and a judiciary of questionable independence to try to change the results.

He successfully pushed for a recount of the Baghdad votes — which has not yet been carried out — and benefited from a vetting panel targeting former members of Saddam Hussein's ruling party that has set its sights on several of Allawi's candidates. Either tactic could tilt the election outcome in al-Maliki's favor.

"Certainly what is going on is a theft of the Iraqi will and democracy, jeopardizing the safety of the country," Allawi told Iraq's al-Sharqiya channel in an interview early Wednesday.

Allawi called on international organizations like the U.N., the Arab League, the EU and the Organization of Islamic Conference to help es-

tablish an impartial interim government, and a spokesman said his Iraqiya coalition would consider quitting the political process altogether or demand a repeat election if its demands are not met.

He has also been touring neighboring countries in an attempt to drum up support for his candidacy and is set to hold talks with the Cairo-based Arab League Wednesday.

With no end in sight to al-Maliki's efforts, U.S. officials appear worried and impatient.

Speaking to reporters this week, U.S. Ambassador Christopher Hill did not mention al-Maliki specifically, but his frustration was palpable.

"It seems it is time to get this show on the road here," he said.

It was always going to take a long time to form a government in Iraq, a fractious country in which every political decision deteriorates into a showdown, but what is surprising to many is the degree to which al-Maliki has battled results even before the negotiating for the new government has started.

"Almost every day, we see new procedures and possible decisions that could change the results and have a grave impact on the political process," said Baghdad-based political analyst Kadhum al-Muqdad.

Even if the recount is in al-Maliki's favor and a number of Allawi's candidates are booted from the race, it still won't give the prime minister's coalition the majority needed to form a gov-

ernment outright. But that may not be his aim.

Baghdad-based political observer Hadi Jalo said al-Maliki is trying to strengthen his negotiating position before serious talks to form a coalition government.

Al-Maliki has said his legal appeals are simply designed to make the process fair and that he will abide by all court decisions.

In some ways, al-Maliki is simply a sore loser, some Iraqi politicians say privately.

But the cost of his political machinations could be extremely high. Sunnis were outraged after the news last week of a secret prison run by Iraqi forces that mostly held Sunnis.

In a report released Wednesday, the New York-based Human Rights Watch said Iraqi men held for months at the prison were systematically tortured, including some beaten so badly they lost teeth and urinated blood for days. Others were raped, given electric shocks to their genitals and deprived of air, the report said.

The Iraqi government quickly shut down the prison after the torture was revealed by the *Los Angeles Times* and either released or transferred its 431 detainees. The government has denied al-Maliki had any knowledge of the facility and vowed to investigate the abuses.

But many Sunnis see the prison as proof the Shiite-dominated government is persecuting them and has changed little since the days when Shiite death squads roamed the city.

Adding to frustrations, the lack of information about the court handing down rulings favoring al-Maliki has raised questions about its independence.

Its three anonymous judges approved al-Maliki's call for a Baghdad recount and upheld a decision to bar 52 candidates from the election — including one from Allawi's list who won a seat. But the decisions were not publicly released and word leaked out piecemeal.

The man who oversaw the elections and is tasked with carrying out the recount, Faraj al-Haidari, railed against the court this week in an interview with The Associated Press, calling their decisions entirely political.

The Chinese are extending their economic reach throughout the world. They will have a positive growth rate of over 7 percent again this year. They are competing with the U.S., but the U.S. is still a major trading partner for both imports and exports. The Chinese have actively attempted to establish a strong presence in African and Latin America. They have bought copper from Chile, and loaned Chavez \$20 billion, and the third language in Chile is now Chinese. They are exerting their influence

through their part of the world using a new strategy called "far sea defense." They are looking for their Navy to help secure Chinese interest in the resource rich South and East China Seas. The Chinese Navy will have aircraft carriers as part of this new strategy.

When you go to the Forbidden City, you work your way through various temples, all of which promise some kind of harmony. Their foreign policy, which is centuries old, is based around stability and patience. They are not going to rush to help the U.S. and our foreign policy goals. For instance, China looks for "quiet diplomacy" to be the

answer in both Iran and in North Korea.

The Chinese people we met have always been extremely courteous and polite and one can only marvel at the economic changes over the last 20 years. I don't believe there

is an inherent dislike of the individual Americans, or of our country. Many Chinese students indicated they hope to go to America to study for a while, learn and come back. Indeed approximately 100,000 Chinese are studying in the United

States, as against 20,000 Americans studying in China. These exchanges should be encouraged, but this imbalance should be rectified. It's important that we recognize China's willingness to encourage these exchange programs. America still represents the land of opportunity.

The basic question is what can these two nations do to eliminate or marginalize the mistrust between them and how can they work together to build a strong and stable world economy which will lead to world peace. The Chinese are going to have to learn how to deal with the directness of most Americans. The Americans are going to

have to learn how to deal with the indirect approach to issues taken by the Chinese. It is going to take a lot more work and exchange programs to build a foundation for a better and positive relationship. Yet the work and effort are essential and not optional. A military conflict would be a disaster for both nations and the world, as would be a trade war that could devolve into a global Depression.

# Hospitals must adapt or continue to suffer

Hospitals play a critical role in caring for those who are acutely ill. Victims of major trauma, patients needing long and complex operations and those needing around-the-clock nursing care cannot be managed, cannot survive, outside of our hospitals. But many hospitals are themselves struggling to survive in today's highly competitive lower-revenue environment.

Early in my surgical career, hospitals had little competition. Surgeons did all but minor skin surgeries in a hospital operating room. Patients stayed in the hospital up to a week after having a simple hernia repair. Patients having their gallbladders removed were kept on IV fluids for two days before being allowed to eat. Hysterectomy was a one-week stay. We even admitted patients overnight to have X-

ray studies on the bowels. Hospitals, then, had the only well-equipped labs for analyzing blood and other specimens. There were few physician-owned X-ray facilities that could do complicated studies accurately. Hospitals earned more than enough money to cover charity care and still show a profit.

Fast forward to today. Advances in medical technology have enabled community hospitals to perform complicated procedures like open-heart surgery, taking patients from regional medical centers. In Aachen, Germany, one medical center, to meet the competition, is doing complex heart procedures with post-operative stays so short as to rival outpatient care.

Procedures and diagnostic workups, which traditionally required long and expensive hospital stays,

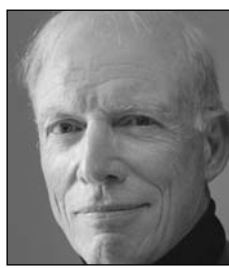
are now done routinely in doctors' offices and in free-standing surgery centers. Surgeons remove a diseased gallbladder using new mini-cameras and miniaturized surgical instruments, reducing scars and post-operative pain. Many such patients can be discharged just a few hours after the procedure.

Surgical robots have been developed that can perform complex procedures more precisely than the surgeon who operates them — sometimes from afar. Robotic and minimally invasive surgical procedures reduce hospital stays and affect hospital revenues.

As a result of the stunning advances in technologies, health care has permanently

shifted from the hospitals to outpatient facilities, physicians' offices and even to the homes of patients. In these settings, medical care has become less expensive for patients, for insurance companies and Medicare. It is much more accessible, convenient and saves patients time. But this transition of care away from hospitals without accompanying improvements in how hospitals are compensated has left them critically short of revenue.

Knowing that this evolution of health care is irreversible and hoping to increase revenues, some hospitals expanded their services from acute hospital care to outpatient settings and to employed physicians.

refuses to pay fairly for the in-hospital services. In this environment, I believe hospitals should focus on providing acute care where they have exclusive expertise and facilities. Hospitals competing for outpatient services where they have no expertise, I believe, may well experience widening financial losses.

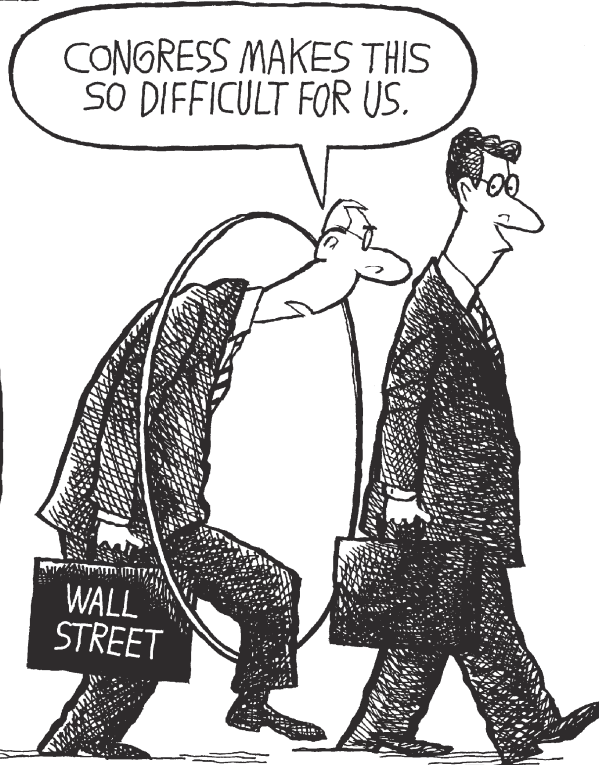
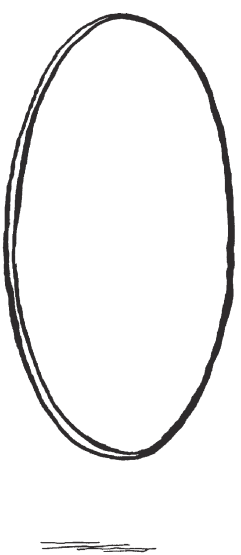

This is for the lady having the problem with the fleas. We encountered the same thing the past two years, especially in the spring and fall, and the vet told us to give them an extra tablet for

one month called Comfortist. It can be used with whatever flea product she's using, but she'd have to ask her vet, and it's worked very well. It's just the fleas are real active right now. Hope it helps her out.

### Capstar

I'm calling to respond to the man or the person who wrote about the flea dip for his dog to get rid of fleas. We were plagued with problems ourselves until last year when our son told us about a fairly new product called Capstar. It has done wonders for our dog, where Frontline and Advantage and all the others did not seem to work any longer. It's a once-a-month pill and it has solved the problem of fleas with our dog.

He earned his fortune as one of the founders of Digital Computers (DEC) along with his brother Ken. One of his jobs at Digital was to travel the world and find the right locations for the company's manufacturing sites.

So it wasn't an accident that Olsen — along with Sam Tamposi and Jerry Nash — first set their eyes on the beautiful rolling hills of central Citrus County. Where most of us only saw watermelon fields and dirt roads, this trio of visionaries

saw new communities. And not just any community — these guys set about to build large and elaborate communities with amenities that were beyond our previous experience.

Later Olsen broke off on his own to build Black Diamond. Lots of folks might not remember, but the old rock mine that later became Black Diamond was at first a major eyesore in the central part of the county. As Beverly Hills was built just to the south and east of the mine, the blasting activities involved in removing the rock became a huge controversy to retirees who first moved here.

## Stan Olsen came to Citrus County and he made big things happen. He built communities, golf courses, restaurants and other recreational facilities that set a new standard of excellence.

When the mine finally shut down, the residents of Beverly Hills cheered, but everyone wanted to know what would happen to the craters that now scarred the landscape.

Stan Olsen had a vision about what could be done. Most folks, myself in-

cluded, doubted that his vision would ever get legs. It just seemed too farfetched.

He proved everyone wrong. He built the exclusive high-end golf-course community and won recognition from around the country. Many call it the best golf course in the state of

Florida — and there are a lot of golf courses in Florida.

Later, when he looked at the old GTE satellite site on Rock Crusher Road and announced he was going to build a concert venue, those who doubted him were a little hesitant to speak.

This guy Olsen obviously knew how to make things happen that we regular people couldn't quite visualize.

It is a shame that part of the reason Stan Olsen has decided to take his retirement now is that he has been involved in a nasty lawsuit with some disaffected property owners in Black Diamond. At his age,

he shouldn't be wasting his energy or time on such things.

Stan Olsen came to Citrus County and he made big things happen. He built communities, golf courses, restaurants and other recreational facilities that set a new standard of excellence.

His footprints, and those of his wife, Betty, will remain in the sands of our community for many decades to come.

Medicare pricing

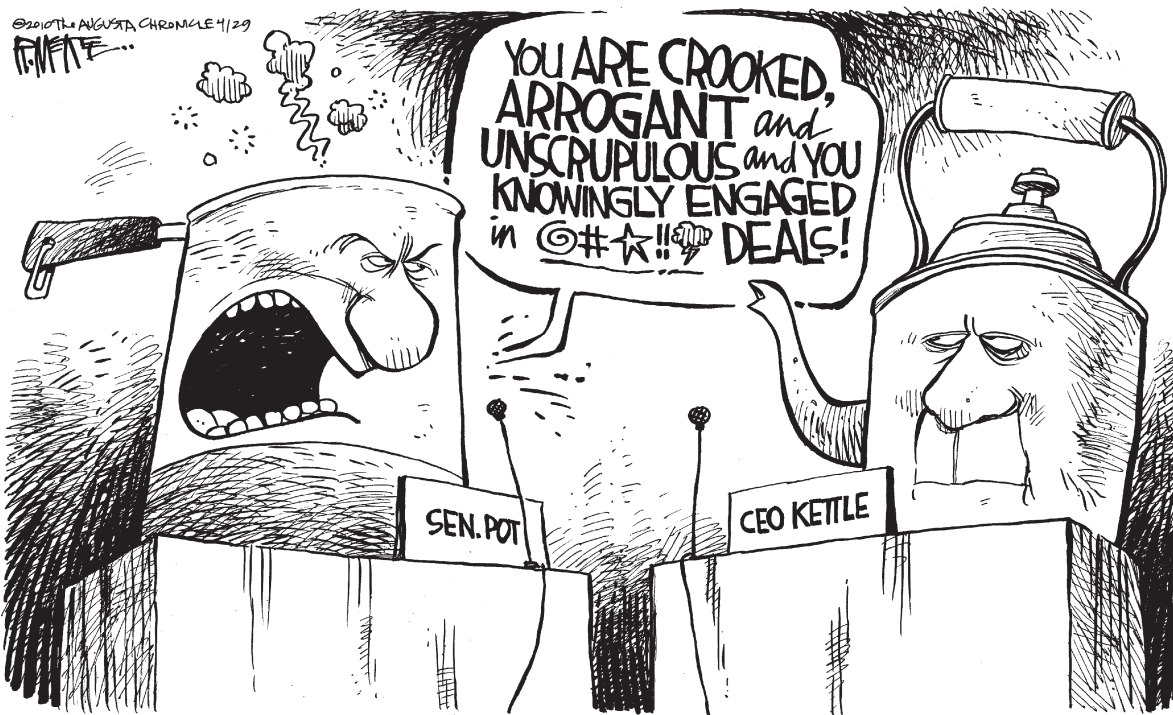

If we don't purchase it at age 65, we are penalized for every month past that, that we don't purchase it. So in another year, my costs would be going up 12 percent more. And, yes, we are paying this out of our pocket. Now that I'm on Medicare, my doctor only spends 6 minutes with me because that's all Medicare will pay them for. If they are spending 20 minutes with me, they don't get paid for their 20 minutes.

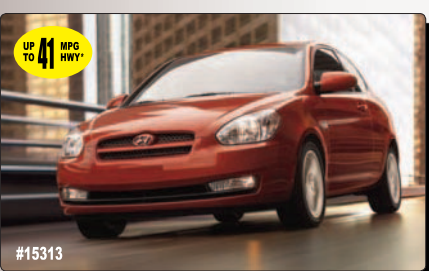

# MOTHER'S DAY ON THE CHEAP

*Some wily ways to save for Mom's special day*

Your inbox is likely starting to swell with Mother's Day deals from retailers and restaurants angling for a piece of the \$14.88 billion consumers are expected to spend this year on the moms in their lives.

Retailers always heavily promote spending for the second-largest annual gift-giving holiday. But that figure from industry research firm IBIS-World is 4 percent above last year's, so the heat is on.

With more than a week to go, you may still have time for a craft project or to plan a meal at home or do something personal like assemble a family photo album — joining kids of all ages in the effort to save.

If not, here are a few less-typical ways to find Mother's Day deals:

■ Seek reward programs through your credit card, work-

place or school: Retailers aren't the only ones pumping up Mother's Day.

Among promotions coordinated by credit card companies and retailers are a host at [visa.com/MothersDay](http://visa.com/MothersDay), including 15 percent off flowers from Proflowers.com if you use your Visa card, for example. MasterCard's program, at [marketplace.mastercard.com](http://marketplace.mastercard.com), just launched this month. Just remember to stick with discounts on things you already planned to buy.

At work, check with your human resources department for employee-discount programs with deals specific to Mother's Day on gifts like jewelry and flowers. And your school, or your children's school, may offer coupon books, gift certificates and other forms of scrip for fundraisers. Buying it can be a triple win: a discount for you, a donation for the school and a nice gift for Mom.

■ Use the federal rebate program to get a discount on new appliances. It might feel too practical, less of a gift than flowers or candy, but a brand new standup mixer might be just the thing for a foodie mom. The cash is for appliances certified as energy-efficient so you'll be treating Mom and helping the environment at the same time.

■ Give the gift of computer savviness. Electronics are expected to be top sellers this Mother's Day, with sales projected at \$97 million. But electronics are only as useful as you make them. Showing mom your favorite smart phone apps, how to download an e-book or connect on Facebook will value exponentially to any electronic gift.

■ Check online coupon sources, including group coupon sites, for discounts on a gift or brunch.

Even if your neighborhood favorite is offering a Mother's

Day prix fixe, check [Opentable.com](http://Opentable.com) for its state-by-state list of restaurants offering Mother's Day specials. And [Restaurant.com](http://Restaurant.com) offers discounted gift certificates.

Also try Groupon, which offers daily deals in cities around the country, that come together only if a minimum number of people sign on. A recent deal in New York was a \$205 spa day for \$68, for example. Groupon competitor LivingSocial e-mails members one deal per day on a local restaurant, spa or event.

Do a Web search for other sites that gather coupons from various sources. Most helpful may be those dedicated to parenting, like [coupons.mamanista.com](http://coupons.mamanista.com), which links to promotional codes for mom-friendly products like shoes and toys. Also try poring over [retailmenot.com](http://retailmenot.com), [promotional-codes.com](http://promotional-codes.com), [coupons.com](http://coupons.com) and other aggregator sites that pop up.

## Stand up to the downturn

Individuals without extensive health care experience will receive a handout covering medical terminology, basic anatomy and physiology and coding terminology prior to the class. Classes may be split into two groups to accommodate different levels of understanding of health care.

## Government getting ready to rate how lenders treat their borrowers

WASHINGTON — The Treasury Department is planning to rate mortgage companies on how they treat customers as part of the Obama administration's \$75 billion foreclosure relief effort.

The new report will include measurements of how each company is handling borrowers and is expected by July, Treasury Secretary Timothy Geithner told Senate lawmakers on Thursday.

More than 100 companies participate in the program, which is designed to help up to 4 million borrowers avoid foreclosure.

Speaking in unusually strong lan-

guage, Geithner said many companies "are not responding to the needs of responsible and increasingly desperate homeowners."

If they don't comply with the program's rules, he said, "we will withhold incentives or demand their repayment."

The program is designed to lower borrowers' monthly payments by reducing mortgage rates to as low as 2 percent for five years and extending loan terms to as long as 40 years. Mortgage companies get taxpayer incentives to reduce borrowers' monthly payments. Homeowners have to complete at least three months of payments to qualify for permanent loan modifications.

About 231,000 homeowners have

completed this process so far. That's about 20 percent of the 1.2 million borrowers who started the program over the past year.

Many experts say that's inadequate. "Families are tragically being foreclosed on when foreclosure was preventable," said Richard Neiman, New York's top banking regulator and a member of the independent Congressional Oversight Panel. The panel was set up to oversee the government's financial bailout programs.

And the number of dropouts is rising. About 155,000 homeowners didn't complete the initial trial phase. Another 2,900 fell out even after their loans were modified. Many more are still in limbo.

## Fannie Mae tightens lending standards

WASHINGTON — Battered by a tidal wave of loan defaults, mortgage finance company Fannie Mae is tightening standards for the adjustable-rate and interest-only loans that fed the housing boom and contributed to the bust.

The company said Friday it will require mortgage lenders to consider how high a borrower's mortgage

payments might rise after teaser rates expire.

Fannie Mae also will enact tighter standards for "interest only" loans that allow borrowers to avoid making principal payments for several years. To get those loans, borrowers taking out new mortgages must have a down payment of at least 30 percent and enough assets for two months of living expenses.

Washington-based Fan-

nie and sibling company Freddie Mac buy mortgages from lenders and sell them to investors with a guarantee against default. They have effectively been owned by the government since they nearly collapsed in September 2008.

Freddie Mac has already enacted similar policies for adjustable rate mortgages and no longer purchases interest-only loans, a spokesman said.

Many consumers did not understand the terms of mortgages they took out during the housing boom. When their teaser rates expired and higher interest rates kicked in, a flood of loan defaults commenced and the housing bubble burst more than three years ago.

Fannie Mae's new rules, which go into effect in September, affect loans that adjust in five years or less.

## Small businesses may be pressed to retain their top workers

NEW YORK — This scene is likely to play out at many small businesses in the coming months:

One of the company's top performing employees comes in to see the owner and says, "I've been offered a job at XYZ Widgets. They're going to give me a substantial raise. Can you make me a better offer?"

Many owners will be hard-pressed to come up with money to keep staffers who want to leave for better-paying jobs. But small companies can win a bidding war by offering more intangibles and flexibility than their larger competitors.

### A JOB IS NOT JUST ABOUT MONEY

Rob Wilson, president of Employco, a Chicago-based resources outsourcing company, said his small business clients are starting to see employees recruited by larger firms. And many small businesses still have tight cash flows, making it hard to give a big raise.

What they can offer, however, are non-monetary benefits such as flexible scheduling and more vacation time. Wilson noted that many people start new jobs with a minimum of vacation time. A current employer can use extra vacation time to be competitive.

But, Wilson said, there are other benefits that will appeal to ambitious employees, including the chance for professional growth. Wilson said owners need to point out to employees that because they work for a small business, "you are much more involved than you would be with a larger company."

Wilson said workers also need to know what their roles will be as the

economy improves and business picks up. He recommends telling an employee, "you've helped me through the last years, getting through the recession. You're a key person. Help shape the future."

Leza Raffel, president of The Communication Solutions Group Inc., a Philadelphia-based public relations firm, has had such a talk with a senior staffer who was considering what her other work options might be.

Raffel talked with the staffer about the future, and told her that when Raffel is ready to stop running the firm at some point, "I want my core people to be the ones who carry this business on."

### TALK WITH STAFFERS LONG BEFORE THEY WANT TO GO

Human resources consultants say open communication is a good strategy when you're trying to persuade an employee to stay. But they say it's also something companies need to be doing all along. Communication can be the proverbial ounce of prevention, helping employees to feel valued and that they are truly part of a team.

Raffel, who has four employees, practices what she calls open book management.

"I find it is best to share all financials with my team so that they can see what we have to work with as far as revenues go and what our expenses are," Raffel said. "I update them on new business prospects constantly, so they know that I am working to address the economic hurdles."

She also offers flexible scheduling and, for senior staffers, profit shar-

ing. Raffel also brings personal touches into the workplace, including birthday celebrations and giving \$100 gift certificates on the company's anniversary.

Keeping an upbeat attitude in a company will also make staffers less likely to leave.

Fred Meyers, president of The Queensboro Shirt Co. in Wilmington, N.C., said "being successful and making sure that your business is winning" is a way to retain your best employees.

"One thing that everyone responds to is being a winner, being in a productive and positive environment," he said.

### ANOTHER VIEW: LET THEM GO

Michael McKean, CEO of The Knowland Group, a Salisbury, Maryland, business software company, said he learned the hard way that it's not worth trying to hold on to staffers who want to leave.

A high-level staffer said she was leaving. So the company gave her more pay and a car, "an offer that was amazing for someone in her position," McKean said.

"Quite frankly, if she had left, it really would have hurt the company," he said.

Then, about six months later, "we discovered some fairly serious malfeasance on her part," McKean said. He declined to give details.

Now, if a staffer says he or she wants to leave, "we say, 'Good luck, more power to you,'" McKean said.

"If you've got to throw money to get them to stay in your business, you've got to wonder where their loyalty is," he said.

McKean also learned something else from the company's experience: No employee should be so indispensable.

I would go back to the attorney or another and be absolutely certain that that situation is airtight. Since you can expect, and probably don't want, any help from your brothers, I would suggest that the attorney include in the will that you receive a normal percentage for being the executrix. Further, and perhaps most importantly, should you have this process handled by an estate attorney? You bet your life! I would, however, discuss the fees with your attorney in advance. An hourly rate would be far more to your advantage than a percentage, particularly since you indicate that this is a large estate. Unfortunately, your brothers will likely give you flack and that is why I want you to have the will looked at again.

send one and one letter only to the collection agency, certified mail return receipt requested. This will give you absolute proof that your letter was delivered. In that letter, you will tell them the circumstance that you've outlined to me; and that you will entertain no thought of meeting this alleged obligation. Further, until such time as they give you definitive written information about their claim, you will have no further contact with them. You will tell them that you are well aware of the collection laws and will complain to the appropriate agencies at any time they violate these laws. I think they will take a look at this and that will be the end of that. Obviously, you are going to indefinitely keep the receipt and any information that you do have in your files about the alleged obligation.

DEAR BRUCE: I am purchasing a new SUV. I wanted to put about half of the money down (about \$10,000) and take the loan for three years. Someone suggested that I take the money I would use as a down payment and invest it in a CD, taking the five-year loan. The total amount of the cost is going to be \$24,500 with taxes included. — A.T., via e-mail

DEAR A.T.: There was a time when your plan may very well have been worth following, but that time has long passed. You are thinking about taking a five-year loan and then putting the proceeds, say for example \$10,000, into a CD. The problem is that most CDs today are paying such a miserly rate — at this writing at about 1.25 percent for a one year note — and your car loan even after all the baloney of no percent down, no interest rates and so forth will truly have an effective rate of somewhere around 5 percent or more. You are far better off to put the money down rather than the investment approach.

DEAR BRUCE: My husband is an academic and has accepted a new position. The position is one that he has wanted for many years. Our house is worth about \$125,000 and is paid for. The question is, we don't know how long this position will last because obviously he has a long way to go before tenure. Should we buy a house immediately or perhaps rent an apartment? 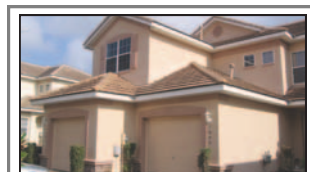

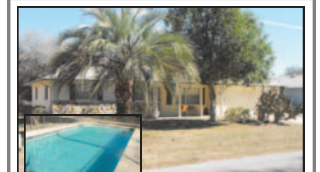

once a month if kept 3 inches high. Use sharp blades to reduce tearing grass leaves. Let Bahia, Centipede and Zoysia self-seed to thicken your lawn. Weekly deep watering encourages deep rooting. Irrigate every other week in winter when turf grass is dormant.

Following these simple procedures will help homeowners maintain a healthier, more drought-tolerant and smaller lawn.

Root damage from excavation and earth moving causes the potentially disastrous condition of extensive decay hidden at the base of the tree. When a tree is wounded, it produces callus tissue to seal the wound. A young, vigorous, fast-growing tree may be successful in sealing the

wound and preventing decay. Any microorganisms entering the wound will cause discoloration and decay, which may involve heartwood, as well as sapwood. The greater the microorganism invasion, the greater the decay. A qualified professional can properly evaluate the severity of a wound to determine if decay has begun and to what extent, as well as offering solutions.

# A schedule for lawn care in Florida

Most Florida lawns are installed on sand mixed with left-over construction debris. Seven species of non-native, exotic grasses are used for turfgrass; Bahia, Bermuda, Carpet, Centipede, Rye, St. Augustine and Zoysia.

Any time of year, be sure to edge beds and remove stray grass runners. Enlarge beds and tree rings to desired size and shape. Kill unwanted green grass with glyphosate, wait two weeks, then till or topdress the bed. Alternatively, gardeners may cover

unwanted grass with several layers of biodegradable newspaper and simply top with pine needles for an instant cover-up. Months later, till, add compost, re-till and plant with a durable, Florida friendly species.

**January:** Mulch leaves on a lawn with a mulching mower. Rake shed leaves and pine needles to mulch beds or add to your compost pile. Recycle yard waste at Central Landfill on Highway 44.

**Mid-February:** While soil temperature is below 65 degrees,

broadcast 0-0-8+Pre-M selective pre-emergent herbicide to kill sprouting weed seeds. It lasts about 10 to 12 weeks. A 50 pound yellow bag covers up to 10,000 square feet and costs about \$32.

**Mid-March:** After the danger of frost has passed, fertilize with slow-release 21-0-10 with Talstar insecticide. A 50 pound red bag covers 10,000 square feet and lasts about eight to 10 weeks. It kills insects like fire ants, crickets, grasshoppers, grubs, etc. No bugs means armadillos won't dig for them.

**Mid-May:** Top dress lawns with .5 to 1 inch of organic compost. A cubic yard covers 664 square feet a half inch deep, or 332 square feet at one inch deep.

Invite fellow gardeners to help.

**Late May:** Broadcast drought-resistant Bahia grass seed over the compost. Regular rains start in June, decreasing the need for irrigation. Argentine Bahia with fener and shorter seed heads costs about \$5 a pound. Cheaper Pensacola, at \$3.50 a pound has many 10 inch seed heads. Centipede and Bermuda seed is more expensive and takes 2 years to show good coverage. Patch holes in a failing St. Augustine lawn with freshly cut Zoysia or St. Augustine plugs.

**July-August:** Apply iron to keep a lawn green throughout the summer of heavy rains. Nitrogen will rapidly percolate into the aquifer:

**Early September:** Apply a slow-release fertilizer, with or without insecticide, e.g., 21-0-10.

**Late September:** Top dress with .5 to one inch organic compost (no sand in it). Over-seed with Rye grass if you want green grass to cut all winter. Rye will help shade out new sprouting weed seeds in February and March. Rye will die out in Florida's hot, wet summer to add nutrients to soil.

Mow Bahia and St. Augustine as high as possible no more than once a week. Never remove more than a third of the grass blade at any time. Pest-free Zoysia and Centipede need rotary cutting

# Tree decay can have many different culprits

Decay in living trees is the most damaging disease of all species to trees worldwide. It usually kills trees slowly, rendering them worthless for products and eventually useless or even hazardous. Tree decay begins with wounding, any break in the bark that exposes underlying wood. The extent of decay depends on the wounds: when they happen, how many, how deep, and where on the tree they occur. Therefore, one of the first tasks for the arborist is to inspect the tree and survey it for wounds.

create exposed wood that rots away, leading to deep openings into the tree and extensive internal decay. Fire and machinery damage trees, especially near the base, which can also lead to decay. Birds, insects, squirrels, beavers, bears and other animals wound trees. People can also wound trees, especially those who are inexperienced in their attempt to perform tree care. Recreational activities in forests, parks and construction, such as home site preparation, also can wound a tree.

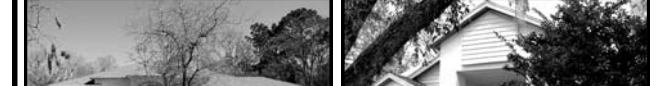

## Home renovation gives couple "blank slate" for project

Newlyweds Nuala and David thrive on excitement. They've traveled the world participating in adventure races and fell in love in the wilderness. After the wedding, they tackled a complete renovation of their house built in 1926. They've been living with her parents while managing a construction process that has left them so exhausted they couldn't imagine what to do with their blank slate of a bedroom. While they may live for adventure, Nuala and David definitely

play it safe when it comes to decor. So safe, it borders on blah. But a neutral palette doesn't have to be boring. That's where I come in, with my trusty team to create a space that combines the couple's love of the outdoors with the easy, modern elegance they've longed for. Freshly dry-walled, the room was the perfect size for a master suite and already had a spacious walk-in closet — a key ingredient for a happy relationship. Vintage stained-glass windows, a nonworking fireplace and radiators add a sense of history. The high, vaulted ceiling gives an

airy feeling, and a lovely wall of windows frames the gorgeous view. The secret to decorating with neutrals is to use texture, depth, pattern and layers to add excitement, richness and elegance. With some beautiful fabrics and shades of neutral gray for inspiration, I chose a soft bluish-gray paint for the wall color, a crisp coat of creamy white for the baseboards and cabinetry and had dark hardwood installed on the floors. The next task: Turn the non-working fireplace from an eye-

sore into a focal point in the seating area. Because the couple LOVE the outdoors, I decided to bring a taste of the outside inside by creating a cool feature above the mantel. We built a deep frame and filled it with small pieces of wood cut from split logs, then highlighted the rustic wood

with crystal sconces. Above, we installed a crystal chandelier in a style in keeping with the vintage flavor of the house, but in polished chrome to add modern flair: I added a soft gray-blue love seat, perfect for lounging. And to complete the seating area, custom cabinetry provides storage and display space while discreetly concealing the old radiator. I believe every bedroom deserves delicious finishes.

So in the sleeping area, we painted the feature wall a deep silvery blue and created a headboard in rich charcoal-gray velvet with silver nail trim. We dressed the bed with luxurious fabrics in shades of gray, silver, white and cream. Flowing linen drapery panels with an elegant blue and brown stripe mesh and brown stripe mesh with the blue of the walls and the chocolate shades of the floor and woven wood blinds.

More excitement comes from eclectic and unexpected touches. An exotic fan worthy of the African Queen draws your eye up to the vaulted ceiling while keeping the room comfortable. at my library shelves (full of books) and my dusty little TV and say, 'TV doesn't play a big part in your life, does it?' I do have another, larger TV in my bedroom, but again, it goes for weeks without being switched on. You will love it. It's like being taken off of narcotics." ■ EXERCISE: Too busy to fit in daily exercise? Think again. You don't have to join a gym. Start a walking or bicycling group. Or if you can't live without TV, use it to play fitness DVDs, which

you can borrow from the library. Equipment such as dumbbells, a jump rope, stretch bands, aerobic step or resistance stretch bands can be bought cheaply, too. ■ TAKE A CLASS: Add to your frugal skill set. Examples of skills that are good to have are gardening, home repair, hair cutting, sewing, home and pressure canning, cake decorating, carpentry, upholstery, wild food foraging, cooking from scratch (cheese making, homemade yogurt or bread, grind grain, etc.), soap making and homemade cleaners. ## Home renovation gives couple "blank slate" for project

Newlyweds Nuala and David thrive on excitement. They've traveled the world participating in adventure races and fell in love in the wilderness. After the wedding, they tackled a complete renovation of their house built in 1926. They've been living with her parents while managing a construction process that has left them so exhausted they couldn't imagine what to do with their blank slate of a bedroom. While they may live for adventure, Nuala and David definitely

play it safe when it comes to decor. So safe, it borders on blah. But a neutral palette doesn't have to be boring. That's where I come in, with my trusty team to create a space that combines the couple's love of the outdoors with the easy, modern elegance they've longed for. Freshly dry-walled, the room was the perfect size for a master suite and already had a spacious walk-in closet — a key ingredient for a happy relationship. Vintage stained-glass windows, a nonworking fireplace and radiators add a sense of history. The high, vaulted ceiling gives an

airy feeling, and a lovely wall of windows frames the gorgeous view. The secret to decorating with neutrals is to use texture, depth, pattern and layers to add excitement, richness and elegance. With some beautiful fabrics and shades of neutral gray for inspiration, I chose a soft bluish-gray paint for the wall color, a crisp coat of creamy white for the baseboards and cabinetry and had dark hardwood installed on the floors. The next task: Turn the non-working fireplace from an eye-

sore into a focal point in the seating area. Because the couple LOVE the outdoors, I decided to bring a taste of the outside inside by creating a cool feature above the mantel. We built a deep frame and filled it with small pieces of wood cut from split logs, then highlighted the rustic wood

with crystal sconces. Above, we installed a crystal chandelier in a style in keeping with the vintage flavor of the house, but in polished chrome to add modern flair: I added a soft gray-blue love seat, perfect for lounging. And to complete the seating area, custom cabinetry provides storage and display space while discreetly concealing the old radiator. I believe every bedroom deserves delicious finishes.

So in the sleeping area, we painted the feature wall a deep silvery blue and created a headboard in rich charcoal-gray velvet with silver nail trim. We dressed the bed with luxurious fabrics in shades of gray, silver, white and cream. Flowing linen drapery panels with an elegant blue and brown stripe mesh and brown stripe mesh with the blue of the walls and the chocolaty shades of the floor and woven wood blinds.

More excitement comes from eclectic and unexpected touches. An exotic fan worthy of the African Queen draws your eye up to the vaulted ceiling while keeping the room comfortable. And a chair, table and zebra-print rug tucked into the nook on the far side of the bed finish the room with panache. Nuala and David's big white box of a bedroom had no sense of adventure,

at my library shelves (full of books) and my dusty little TV and say, 'TV doesn't play a big part in your life, does it?' I do have another, larger TV in my bedroom, but again, it goes for weeks without being switched on. You will love it. It's like being taken off of narcotics." ■ EXERCISE: Too busy to fit in daily exercise? Think again. You don't have to join a gym. Start a walking or bicycling group. Or if you can't live without TV, use it to play fitness DVDs, which

you can borrow from the library. Equipment such as dumbbells, a jump rope, stretch bands, aerobic step or resistance stretch bands can be bought cheaply, too. ■ TAKE A CLASS: Add to your frugal skill set. Examples of skills that are good to have are gardening, home repair, hair cutting, sewing, home and pressure canning, cake decorating, carpentry, upholstery, wild food foraging, cooking from scratch (cheese making, homemade yogurt or bread, grind grain, etc.), soap making and homemade cleaners. 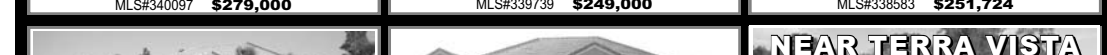

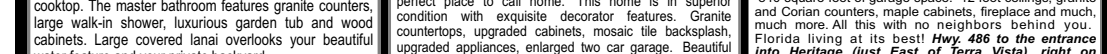

# A schedule for lawn care in Florida

Most Florida lawns are installed on sand mixed with left-over construction debris. Seven species of non-native, exotic grasses are used for turfgrass; Bahia, Bermuda, Carpet, Centipede, Rye, St. Augustine and Zoysia.

Any time of year, be sure to edge beds and remove stray grass runners. Enlarge beds and tree rings to desired size and shape. Kill unwanted green grass with glyphosate, wait two weeks, then till or topdress the bed. Alternatively, gardeners may cover

unwanted grass with several layers of biodegradable newspaper and simply top with pine needles for an instant cover-up. Months later, till, add compost, re-till and plant with a durable, Florida friendly species.

**January:** Mulch leaves on a lawn with a mulching mower. Rake shed leaves and pine needles to mulch beds or add to your compost pile. Recycle yard waste at Central Landfill on Highway 44.

**Mid-February:** While soil temperature is below 65 degrees,

broadcast 0-0-8+Pre-M selective pre-emergent herbicide to kill sprouting weed seeds. It lasts about 10 to 12 weeks. A 50 pound yellow bag covers up to 10,000 square feet and costs about \$32.

**Mid-March:** After the danger of frost has passed, fertilize with slow-release 21-0-10 with Talstar insecticide. A 50 pound red bag covers 10,000 square feet and lasts about eight to 10 weeks. It kills insects like fire ants, crickets, grasshoppers, grubs, etc. No bugs means armadillos won't dig for them.

**Mid-May:** Top dress lawns with .5 to 1 inch of organic compost. A cubic yard covers 664 square feet a half inch deep, or 332 square feet at one inch deep.

Invite fellow gardeners to help.

**Late May:** Broadcast drought-resistant Bahia grass seed over the compost. Regular rains start in June, decreasing the need for irrigation. Argentine Bahia with fener and shorter seed heads costs about \$5 a pound. Cheaper Pensacola, at \$3.50 a pound has many 10 inch seed heads. Centipede and Bermuda seed is more expensive and takes 2 years to show good coverage. Patch holes in a failing St. Augustine lawn with freshly cut Zoysia or St. Augustine plugs.

**July-August:** Apply iron to keep a lawn green throughout the summer of heavy rains. Nitrogen will rapidly percolate into the aquifer:

**Early September:** Apply a slow-release fertilizer, with or without insecticide, e.g., 21-0-10.

**Late September:** Top dress with .5 to one inch organic compost (no sand in it). Over-seed with Rye grass if you want green grass to cut all winter. Rye will help shade out new sprouting weed seeds in February and March. Rye will die out in Florida's hot, wet summer to add nutrients to soil.

Mow Bahia and St. Augustine as high as possible no more than once a week. Never remove more than a third of the grass blade at any time. Pest-free Zoysia and Centipede need rotary cutting

once a month if kept 3 inches high. Use sharp blades to reduce tearing grass leaves. Let Bahia, Centipede and Zoysia self-seed to thicken your lawn. Weekly deep watering encourages deep rooting. Irrigate every other week in winter when turf grass is dormant.

Following these simple procedures will help homeowners maintain a healthier, more drought-tolerant and smaller lawn.

Root damage from excavation and earth moving causes the potentially disastrous condition of extensive decay hidden at the base of the tree. When a tree is wounded, it produces callus tissue to seal the wound. A young, vigorous, fast-growing tree may be successful in sealing the

wound and preventing decay. Any microorganisms entering the wound will cause discoloration and decay, which may involve heartwood, as well as sapwood. The greater the microorganism invasion, the greater the decay. A qualified professional can properly evaluate the severity of a wound to determine if decay has begun and to what extent, as well as offering solutions.

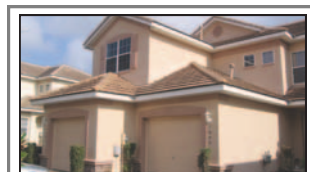

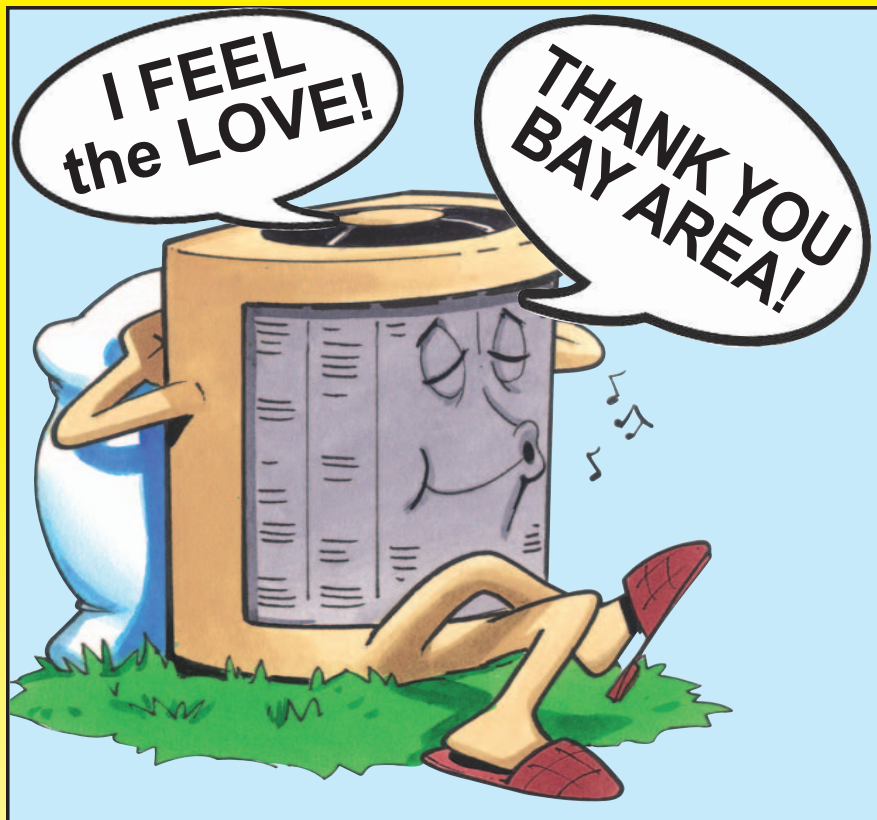

# Saturday night's all right for Betty White on 'SNL'

When she began her career, Betty White had no concept of Facebook ... much less that it would land her a big job.

Through popular demand by her fans who use the social-networking Web site, the beloved, six-time-E Emmy-winning veteran of "The Golden Girls" returns to NBC's Saturday schedule — "live from New York" this time — as host of a new "Saturday Night Live" May 8.

The Mother's Day weekend airing will be a big show: The musical guest is Jay-Z, and White reports "SNL" alumnae including Tina Fey, Amy Poehler and Molly Shannon are expected to return.

"I couldn't believe this!" White says of the grass-roots movement to get her on the program. "It just came out of left field. I told my agent to thank (SNL) very much and tell them I appreciated it, but, 'No, thank you.' And he said, 'You've got to do this. If you don't, I'll divorce you.' So now I'm doing it, and I am absolutely panic-stricken."

If so, it's not because it will be White's first time performing on live television. For that, you'd have to go all the way back to 1939.

"When I graduated from high school," she recalls, "they did a test thing in downtown Los Angeles at the Packard automobile showroom. I wore my graduation dress for it."

More than 70 years later, White realizes what a different animal "Saturday Night Live" is.

"I turned it down three times, years ago," she reveals. "It's so New York, and I'm not that at all. I felt like I might be a fish out of water, but here I am. I love the show, and I get a lot of laughs out of it, but doing it is a whole other number: I may run away from home between now and then."

Also renowned as sweetly sarcastic "Happy Homemaker" Sue Ann Nivens on "The Mary Tyler Moore Show," White says "SNL" is giving her a "veto power" over any material that may not be to her liking. She intends to remain respectful to the projects and roles that brought her fame, should those be suggested for spoofing.

After scoring big as a co-star of last summer's Sandra Bullock movie "The Proposal," then returning to the CBS daytime serial "The Bold and the Beautiful" — along with receiving lifetime achievement awards from the Television Critics Association, the Screen Actors Guild and American Women in Radio and Television — White is launching another busy chapter with her "Saturday Night Live" stint. She also guest stars as a school librarian in the May 19 season finale of the ABC sitcom "The Middle," then starts another series of her own.

The TV Land comedy "Hot in Cleveland" premieres June 16,

with White playing what that network logically terms the "sassy" overseer of the Ohio home of three newly arrived West Coast women-played by fellow genre veterans Valerie Bertinelli, Jane Leeves ("Frasier") and Wendie Malick ("Just Shoot Me!").

"I did the pilot with the proviso that it was just a guest shot," White explains, "with no obligation to do anything more afterward. I wasn't really interested in doing a series because of the time involved. Well, the chemistry between those three girls is just wonderful. They're not only all so nice, they spark one another, and it's just lovely to see. They got picked up for 10 episodes, and the producers came back to me ... and I'm so round-heelled, here I am, doing all 10."

As White's current phase of bountiful activity continues, she often thinks of her late husband, "Password" game show host Allen Ludden.

"He was always so supportive," she reflects, "and we had such fun together, because we both loved working. Being in the same business, we always understood the other person's ups and downs, highs and lows. He would just be thrilled to pieces about this."

# Saturday night's all right for Betty White on 'SNL'

When she began her career, Betty White had no concept of Facebook ... much less that it would land her a big job.

Through popular demand by her fans who use the social-networking Web site, the beloved, six-time-E Emmy-winning veteran of "The Golden Girls" returns to NBC's Saturday schedule — "live from New York" this time — as host of a new "Saturday Night Live" May 8.

The Mother's Day weekend airing will be a big show: The musical guest is Jay-Z, and White reports "SNL" alumnae including Tina Fey, Amy Poehler and Molly Shannon are expected to return.

"I couldn't believe this!" White says of the grass-roots movement to get her on the program. "It just came out of left field. I told my agent to thank (SNL) very much and tell them I appreciated it, but, 'No, thank you.' And he said, 'You've got to do this. If you don't, I'll divorce you.' So now I'm doing it, and I am absolutely panic-stricken."

If so, it's not because it will be White's first time performing on live television. For that, you'd have to go all the way back to 1939.

"When I graduated from high school," she recalls, "they did a test thing in downtown Los Angeles at the Packard automobile showroom. We were up on the fifth floor doing 'The Merry Widow,' and if our parents wanted to see it, they had to stand downstairs among the cars and look at this one little monitor. I wore my graduation dress for it."

More than 70 years later, White realizes what a different animal "Saturday Night Live" is.

"I turned it down three times, years ago," she reveals. "It's so New York, and I'm not that at all. I felt like I might be a fish out of water, but here I am. I love the show, and I get a lot of laughs out of it, but doing it is a whole other number: I may run away from home between now and then."

Also renowned as sweetly sarcastic "Happy Homemaker" Sue Ann Nivens on "The Mary Tyler Moore Show," White says "SNL" is giving her a "veto power" over any material that may not be to her liking. She intends to remain respectful to the projects and roles that brought her fame, should those be suggested for spoofing.

"I haven't seen or even talked to anybody there, except that I had one nice conversation with (executive producer) Lorne Michaels. Beyond that, I haven't a clue, and I'm just going to bite the bullet. It could end my career!"

They got picked up for 10 episodes, and the producers came back to me ... and I'm so round-heelled, here I am, doing all 10."

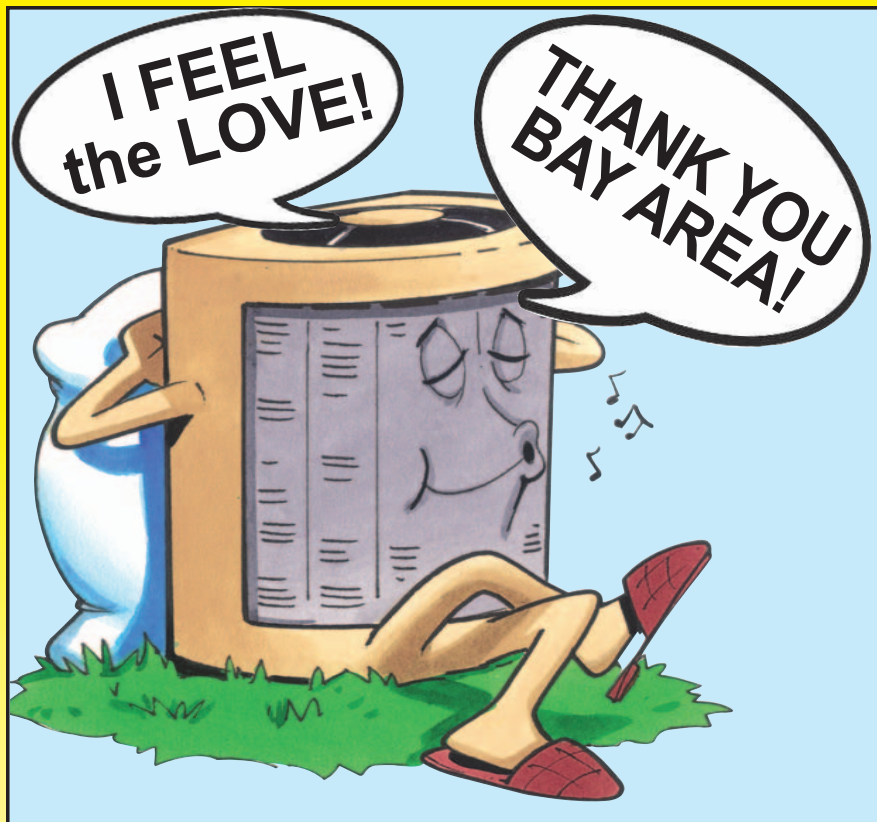

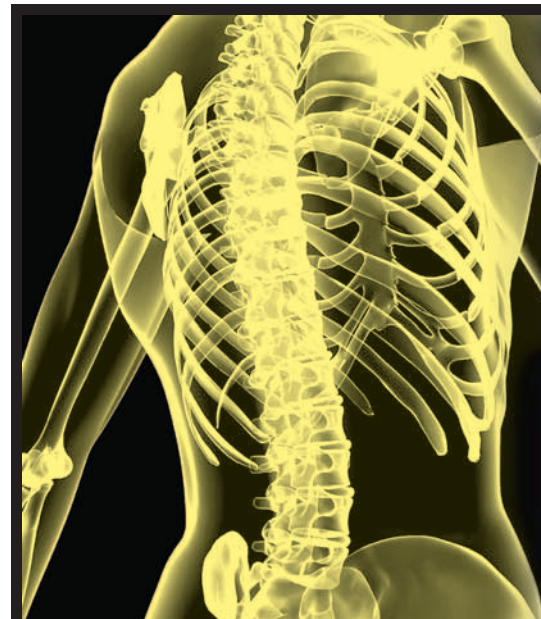
