Wounded can breathe easy

Hospital to add third hyperbaric chamber at treatment facility

The ship's bell rang last week as another patient graduated from the Wound Care and Hyperbaric Center at Citrus Memorial Health System.

The patient flipped the clapper and received congratulations and a complimentary gift bag. Best of all, though, was no more dealing with a stubborn wound.

Soon, the bell should ring more frequently, as treatment will be available to more patients once a third hyperbaric chamber is added to the center.

"Since we opened two years ago, the volume of patients grew," said Scott Filgo, manager of the center. "We expanded our oxygen promotes formation of new capil-

Even with the expanded hours, the wait time to start treatment could be as high as two weeks. That's a long time to wait to get help for a diabetic foot wound, for exam-

"Foot wounds are the hardest to heal," Filgo said.

When a patient uses a hyperbaric chamber, each treatment is called a dive. Sealed inside the chamber, the patient breathes 100 percent oxygen at two to two-and-ahalf times normal atmospheric pressure during the dive. Enclosure in the pressure chamber physically dissolves extra oxygen into the patient's blood plasma. The extra

With the installation of the third chamber, five more patients a day will get treated. The center got the go-ahead last month from the board of directors of the Citrus Memorial Health Foundation to arrange for the third chamber. The sum of \$108,900 was approved for a lease agreement with American Baromedical Corp. and costs for all construction work and additional medical equipment.

The center, on the third floor of the administration building in the Inverness campus, will have a hole opened in an exterior wall again, as it did two years ago for

Summit rallies local business

Speakers highlight opportunities

Commissioner Joe Meek gave a rousing speech Wednesday morning to at least 225 county business people sipping coffee during the Citrus Economic Summit. "Staying Strong in the Current Economy" was the theme.

"We're serious about waking Citrus County up to a better economic day," Meek said.

On cue, the Lecanto High School band, led by its percussion section, banged, clanged and bashed its way into the conference room at Central Florida Community College, circling the attendees and letting everyone know what a great noise to wake you up sounded like.

While the audience's ears still ringing, the keynote speaker, Jerry Ross, executive director of the Disney Entrepreneur Center, gave some details about his career as an entrepreneur. He had gone from boom to bust to boom again, sold the last business and now helps other Central Florida entrepreneurs.

Ross had been in a leadership position with the Bell Telephone System until it broke up. Then he sold mainframe computer software to the Pentagon, Library of Congress and industry.

Then Ross went to Florida and went broke.

"I was sweeping the floor of the Orlando Arena after a Rod Stewart concert," Ross said.

But, within a year and a half, thanks to his talent for marketing xenon lighting, Ross was back in his own business. The lighting company became the market leader in entertainment lighting, used in movies, at Walt Disney World and at Super Bowls. NASA bought the lighting to use for shuttles.

Ross sold the business after

eight years. "It shows that you can come back," Ross said. "The second time you go out in business is not so hard.

For the past three years, Ross has been the director at Disney Entrepreneur Center, where he said he works with 13 organizations.

"There is power in partnerships," Ross said, pointing out how the county organizations got together to make the summit hap-

According to his research, Ross said 93 percent of Citrus County businesses employ fewer than 10 people and account for 52 per-

Inverness shows off new water facility

The City of Inverness announces the grand opening of its water reclamation facility, one of the largest and most technologically advanced projects undertaken in Citrus County.

Urged by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) in 2004 to improve the quality of discharged wastewater, the city rolled up its sleeves to find processes, options and funding to design and build a long-lasting facility. The city was awarded in excess of \$12 million, with a final project cost to be approximately \$17 million, including \$2.2 million to build a 17,000linear-foot reclaimed water transmission line to the Inverness Golf and Country Club for irrigation demands.

The public is encouraged to tour the facility during the open house from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday at 3900 S. Florida Ave., south of the fairgrounds. Comfortable clothing and shoes are recommended.

The donors, including former state GOP chairman Al Cardenas, noted that Crist had \$7.6 million in his campaign account at the end of March and said anyone who wants their money back should have it returned.

cent of the jobs in the county. Only 5.6 percent of businesses in Citrus County employ between 10 and 100 people and those account for 32 percent of the jobs. Small business resources should aim to take the businesses with the fewer employees up to the next level to increase employment, Ross said. This was a strategy called economic gardening.

Ross said economic gardening is more effective than the long-established practice of attracting an industry to the county by offering initial economic incentives, because the industry often would leave when the incentives ran out and would take the jobs with them. By taking local established businesses from the first to the second stage of expansion, Ross said, the local economy would show an exponential increase in jobs.

Ross said businesses had to be sharply aware of who is competi-

"We are not competing with each other," Ross said. "We are competing with the world. There are more honor students in China than we have students.'

In his capacity as director, Ross said, he has spoken at conferences in foreign countries and had representatives of 36 foreign countries visit the center.

'The differences are only cultural," Ross said. "The business fundamentals are the same.'

Businesses have to get through this economy together, Ross said. He outlined with the letters A through F how businesses could fight back against the recession.

A is for attitude.

"In Citrus County, we are going to refuse to participate in this recession," Ross said.

This goal could be achieved by buying locally, a strategy operating in Orlando, he said.

B is for basics.

Ross said business people caught up in the operations of


Hyperbaric oxygen therapy is just one of the tools the center uses to treat wounds. They use bioengineered skin substitutes that stimulate growth like Miracle-Gro, one staff member commented.

"The wound closes faster and reduces infection," Filgo said.

The center also treats with advanced wound dressings, antibiotic therapy, growth factor therapy, negative pressure therapy and mist therapy using painless ultrasound.

In addition to diabetic foot wounds, the center treats chronic bone infections, compromised skin grafts and flaps, radiation damage to soft tissue and bone, bowel,

Elephants flee bees, new research shows

JOHANNESBURG Eek, a bee!

Lore has it that elephants are afraid of mice, but scientists have now discovered that elephants are truly afraid of bees — and that the pachyderms even sound an alarm when they encounter them. The researchers hope this discovery can help save farmers' crops from elephants.

And they hope it will save elephants too.

Conflict between humans like Kenya occur often. A single hungry elephant can wipe out a family's crops overnight. Farmers will huddle by fires all night during the harvest season. When an elephant nears, the farmers spring up with flaming sticks while their children bang on pots and pans. Not all fields can be guarded, and sometimes the elephants aren't frightened off.

Farmers sometimes kill elephants for raiding their crops. Rampaging elephants have also killed people, and they are then hunted down by park rangers.

The discovery that elephants emit low-frequency alarm calls around bees could help lessen these

conflicts, said Lucy King, a researcher into animal behavior whose paper on elephants' alarm calls was published in a journal of the Public Library of Science last week.

Farmers could make "bee fences" by stringing up hives on poles about 10 yards apart, King said. A strong wire connecting the poles would cause them to swing when an elephant walks into it, disturbing the bees. The swarm bothers elephants so much that they flee, emitting low and elephants in countries rumblings inaudible to the human ear that warn other elephants nearby.

> "It's impossible to cover Africa in electric fences," King said in an interview. "The infrastructure doesn't exist in many places and it would restrict animals' movement. This could be a better way to direct elephants away from farmers' crops.' King's findings are based

> on two separate experiments, part of a project by Oxford University and Save the Elephants. The findings have gener-

ated some excitement.

"This sort of initiative is very encouraging in helping prevent human wildlife conflict," said Paul Udoto, a spokesman for Kenya Wildlife Service.

The meaning of freedom

he Fourth of July came early this year. It fell, somewhat ironically, on the anniversary of the fall of Saigon.

On the morning of April 29, I was co-hosting a national radio show, when a woman named Kim called from Detroit. At 19 years old, she and her family were among "the boat people" who fled Vietnam in 1975,

escaping the takeover. Her father "knew that he didn't want to be there when (the Communists) took over Saigon." He had been born in Hanoi and moved south "because he wanted freedom," she said. And now he was going to make sure his entire family had it.

When Kim's family's boat failed, American servicemen took them the rest of the way and gave them water. "But these people don't know us," Kim remembered saying. One serviceman even gave Kim, she says, a \$10 bill. "He said I might need it. I didn't know the value of it." Kim and her family didn't know a word of English. But once she got to a refugee camp, she was taught it. "They didn't have to do that," she remembered, 35 years later, holding back tears. "This is the greatest country. I am forever grateful.

When Kim's family arrived on these shores, her father was full of hope and determination. "If you cannot succeed here, you cannot do it anywhere else," she remembers him declaring. "Set your goal and go after it." Kim did; she's a physician. Her early experiences provided the inspiration she needed to succeed. year in Vietnam and thanked me



Can we apply this thought to learning?



Senate votes down \$50B bailout fund

WASHINGTON - Republicans offered a weaker alternative to consumer protection measures that are central to President Barack Obama's Wall Street regulation plan, opening a new front Wednesday in the Senate debate over how to rein in financial institutions.

The Senate pivoted straight into that confrontation after reaching a compromise on how to dismantle large failing firms. In that agreement, senators voted 93-5 to eliminate a contentious \$50 billion fund that would have been used to pay for a firm's liquidation.

The Senate also voted 96-1 to protect taxpayers from losses. But the government would still have to put money up front to cover the costs of a firm's orderly dissolution. That money would be recovered through the sale of the failed firm's assets and by forcing shareholders and creditors to take substantial losses.

The Republican plan would limit the enforcement power of a proposed consumer protection bureau and make its rules subject to approval by a top banking regulator.

In contrast, the Democratic plan backed by the Obama administration would create an independent bureau within the Federal Reserve to police lending and other customer financial service transactions. It would have a freer hand to enforce its regulations.

Flood recovery worries poorer victims in Nashville

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Raging torrents had shot furniture through walls and pushed houses into the street near Nashville's historically black Fisk and Tennessee State universities. Only a few tent tops poked above the floodwaters on Wednesday where dozens of homeless once lived along the still-swollen banks of the Cumberland River.

As the city's country music scene gets attention, less affluent victims wondered Wednesday how they will recover from the floods.

Being a minority, we're the last on the list. That's just the way it is," said Troy Meneese, a 47-yearold custodian, as he aired out water-logged shoes, a couch, chairs in his yard in front of his brick one-story home in north Nashville.

As Nashville's Cumberland River continued to recede Wednes-

day, Mayor Karl Dean estimated the damage from weekend flooding could easily top \$1 billion. The flooding and weekend storms killed at least 29 people in three states.

In Meneese's neighborhood, some residents and community members said they felt neglected, especially compared to the attention they believed country music attractions and more affluent neighborhoods were receiving.

His next-door neighbor, 73-yearold Evelyn Pearl Bell, thumbed through her water-damaged items before she got so exhausted she had to take a break as temperatures climbed into the 80s. Volunteers had come by her house, saying they would help. But as of midday, no one had shown up.

Police conducted house-to-house searches in some parts of north Nashville on Wednesday, but some

said they should have come earlier. "Search and rescue teams seem like they just got here. It's a little late," said Howard Jones, 47, a pastor who came to see if he could help. He said the neighborhood was particularly vulnerable because many elderly residents lived there.

Only a few tents could be seen in the murky brown floodwaters at the city's so-called tent city, home to about 140 homeless people under an interstate bypass on the banks of the Cumberland. A scattering of residents were there Wednesday, looking to see if they could recover any of their possessions. Most were doubtful they would ever live there again.

"People are trickling down here all day long trying to see how far the water has receded and if they can go back in and get anything. But it's a toxic area, said Raphael McPherson, 47, as he looked for his cat. The one-room wooden structure that he built five years ago at the site was nowhere to be seen.

Tea party coming up short in primaries

WASHINGTON — Mark the first round down, shakily, for Republican incumbents and establishment favorites.

With one race in Ohio yet to be settled, tea partybacked challengers and other outsiders were shut out in competitive House and Senate primaries across three states on Tuesday the busiest night so far in an election season of optimism for Republicans.

While some of Tuesday night's Republican primary winners struggled to prevail — former Indiana Sen. Dan Coats' comeback bid advanced with 40 percent of the vote in a five-way race the results renewed a debate about the clout of the insurgents in the remaining primaries and on elections this fall.

Six months before the midterm elections, and with the country trying to shake off the effects of a deep recession, polls show a disaffected electorate, angry at incumbents and highly skeptical of government's ability to solve problems. As a result, even Democrats concede Republicans are in line to make gains this fall, when 36 seats in the Senate and all 435 in the House are

on the ballot. "The big question is whether the tea party is a tempest in a teapot. Do they have the organizational capabilities to compete with the Republicans?" said John Feehery, who advised former House Speaker Dennis Hastert, R-III., and is a Republican strategist.

"They're not organized and it's unclear to me whether they are going to be a force that is going to challenge the more establishment Republicans in primaries," he said.

U.K. election likely to reshape country's politics

LONDON — There's only one good bet in Britain's razor-edge election: It's likely to reshape the country's politics in historic ways.

Should Gordon Brown cling to power, his Labour Party will have pulled off one of the most unlikely political comebacks in modern times. Victory for the Conservatives' David Cameron would return his once-discredited party to office after 13 years.

More likely — in an election with important consequences for everything from the war in Afghanistan to the global economy — there

will be no clear winner, and a good showing for Liberal Democrat upstart Nick Clegg. Only months ago, most

thought the election would

be the Conservatives' for the

taking — but that was before the perfect political storm emerged.

An embarrassing expense scandal last year enraged voters after lawmakers were caught being reimbursed for everything from imaginary mortgages to ornamental duck houses at country estates, bringing trust in British politics to a record low.

Then came the surprise success of Clegg, an affable 43-year-old who called for a complete overhaul of British politics during the country's first-ever televised election debates.

The 43-year-old Cameron has also been hampered by his own elite background. Eton-educated and married to an aristocrat's daughter, many question whether he can relate to an electorate that has endured 1.3 million one of the most revolutionlayoffs and tens of thou-



Loop Current, I'll have more to say on the potential damage to our ecologyand our economy but, for now, let's just hope for the best and get to what I promised last week, a primer of sorts on tarpon, which should go "on the bite" in this area any day, now.

Tarpon are an ancient fish; tarpon-like fish have been found in fossils from the Cretaceous Period, 100 million years ago. There were many more species of tarpon then; now there are just two, one here and one in the Indo-Pacific area. North American species, Megalops atlanticus, is also known as the Silver King, because of its huge, silvery scales.

As one of more than two hundred species of finfish and marine life whose life cycle is inextricably tied to the macro system of the mangrove ecology, tarpon depend on a healthy inshore habitat in order to survive. The young feed, hide and grow in the roots of those mangroves but, unlike such species as snook, don't stay within the roots any longer than their size requires. Because their habitat is one with frequent anaerobic periods, tarpon have developed a way to breathe air, not instead of using gills, but as a means of supplementing them. They have a specialized swim bladder, high in the throat, with blood vessels which can absorb oxygen from the water in the bladder, which is why they will be seen "gulping air" as they roam.

Adult tarpon begin to gather in large schools in May and June, then migrate offshore to spawn. The familiar "daisy chain" circular pattern is thought to be a part of the prespawn ritual. During an aerial survey by the

Florida, where it joins (hence the need for that extra oxygen source), and grow rapidly, reaching a If the oil does get into the foot or more within two years and taking on the classic tarpon shape. (Tarpon larvae, called leptocephali, have a long, ribbon-shaped body and fanglike teeth.)

When they change shape and lose their teeth, tarpon develop a specialized jaw consisting of several boney plates held together with 'sutures," and it's this mouth that makes it so difficult to drive home a hook. Most experienced tarpon anglers will strike a tarpon three or more times, but, even at that, scientists estimate only 37 percent of hooked fish stay hooked all the way to the boat.

Tarpon feed on a variety of marine life, and will hit artificial lures such as jigs, flies and plugs, but using live bait will bring the most hookups by far. Blue crabs and ladylish are two of the most popular baits, the former hooked through one of the side points and the latter just behind the dorsal fin or in the lower lip. Choose your hook size according to the size of the tarpon in a school, and be sure it's razor sharp.

Live baitfish should never be hooked through both lips, as they must be able to open and fully close their mouths in order to force water over their gills. Pinning the mouth shut with a hook will greatly decrease the life span of a baitfish, and will reduce the liveliness of even a fresh baitfish. Baits should be livelined to the fish, or cast beyond them and slowly worked back to where the tarpon can see them. Plunking a onepound ladyfish into the water in close proximity to a tarpon is almost sure to spook the fish. If you want to target tarpon, your best choices are the Homosassa River and the Progress Energy discharge canal.



Red Sox 3, Angels 1

BOSTON — John Lackey pitched two-hit ball over seven innings against his old team, David Ortiz hit a solo homer and the Boston Red Sox sent the Los Angeles Angels to their sixth straight loss, 3-1 Wednesday night.

It was Boston's third straight win over the Angels, who have lost the first six games on a 10-game road trip. It's the first time the Angels have opened May at 0-5 in team history.

Adrian Beltre homered and drove in two runs for the Red Sox. Brandon Wood hit a solo homer off Lackey.

The Red Sox can complete the fourgame sweep when Daisuke Matsuzaka faces Scott Kazmir on Thursday night.

Lackey (3-1) left the Angels in the offseason and signed an \$82.5 million, five-year contract with Boston. He posted the Angels' highest winning percentage in team history, at 102-71. The right-hander played for the or-

ganization from 2002-2009 and was the first rookie to win Game 7 of a World Series since 1909, getting the victory when the Angels beat San Francisco in the 2002 decisive game.

Lackey 12 of 14 outs on grounders as he cruised through the middle innings. He walked two and struck out four overall, allowing Kendry Morales' single leading off the second as the only other hit.

Daniel Bard pitched a perfect eighth before Jonathan Papelbon worked the ninth for his eighth save.

Ortiz, back in the lineup as the DH despite an 0 for 4 game on Tuesday with two strikeouts and two double-play grounders, homered into the Green Monster seats against Joel Pineiro (2-4) seats to give Boston a 2-0 lead in the

fourth. The struggling slugger entered hitting just .149.

Wood homered into the first row of the Monster seats in the fifth.

Beltre made it 3-1 against Brian Fuentes in the eighth. The Red Sox had taken a 1-0 lead in

the second when Beltre's bouncer down the third-base line hit the bag and rolled into short left for a single, scoring J.D. Drew from second.


The loose puck was corralled by Milan Lucic, who got it to Satan for his fifth goal of the postseason and a 2-1 Boston lead.

Coroner: Pneumonia caused Haim's death

LOS ANGELES Actor Corey Haim had traces of several prescription and over-thecounter drugs in his system when he died two months ago, but that's not what killed him, the Los **Angeles County coroner**



38, died of natural causes from pneumonia that damaged his lungs,

con-

cluded.

Haim,

according to an autopsy report released Tuesday.

The pneumonia was complicated by an enlarged heart and narrowed blood vessels, the report said.

Low levels of eight drugs, including a prescription muscle relaxant, were found in Haim's system along with marijuana, coroner's spokesman Craig Harvey said.

'But nothing was at a level that would have contributed to his death," Harvey said.

The drugs in his system also included the antidepressants fluoxetine and olanzapine; the tranquilizers diazepam and meprobamate, which are found in Valium and other medications; the cough-suppressant dextromethorphan; and the antihistamine diphenhydramine.

Haim, who struggled with drug problems for years, died March 10 after collapsing in his mother's apartment.

Despite floods, Grand Ole Opry held across town

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The venue was different, the tickets were handwritten and the gear was cobbled together. But the floodwaters that deluged Nashville couldn't stop The Grand Ole Opry.

Marty Stuart kicked off Tuesday night's show, which was moved to the city's War Memorial Auditorium after 4 to 6 feet of water from weekend storms flooded the Grand Ole Opry House east of downtown.

Stuart, an Opry veteran, said it's not surprising the show went on: "That's what we do at the Opry."

The evening was as much catharsis as it was entertainment after a harrowing three days when floodwaters killed dozens, destroyed thousands of homes and flooded some of Nashville's most well-known attractions.

Opry officials aimed for as much normalcy as possible. Hundreds of fans turned out to see the show at the auditorium, the Opry's home from 1939-43. As she has for 11 1/2 years, Minnie Pearl impersonator Tessa Swinehart greeted fans outside with a super-sized,

"Howdy!" She couldn't help but be affected by the devastation at the Opry House, though, after seeing pictures.

"It's very sad, very disheartening," she said.

Once the show got under way, Stuart was joined on stage by U.S. Sen. Lamar Alexander, who played piano on "Tennessee Waltz" and there were several poignant moments throughout the evening.

Longtime Opry member Jeannie Seely lost her house in the flooding. She said friends were surprised she was still going to perform a set, which she pulled off in borrowed shoes.

Well," she told the crowd, "it's not like I can sit and watch TV on the couch," before adding: "You can either laugh about it or you can cry, and I don't feel like crying.

The rest of the week's Oprv shows have been moved to the Ryman Auditorium, also a former site of the show and a part-time host currently.

Country stars have expressed concern about the state of the Opry House since it was flooded Monday. Stuart, in an interview

earlier Tuesday, said he'd been told of widespread devastation by those who witnessed it.

"What I understand is that as of yesterday one of my friends floated through the Opry House in a canoe and there was 4 feet of water on the stage at that time," he said.

It has yet to be determined if the Grand Ole Opry Museum, the Acuff instrument collection and the archives were lost. Stuart said if those things were destroyed, it would be "a profound American loss."

Gaylord Entertainment CEO Colin Reed says it will be a minimum of three months before the massive entertainment complex that also includes the Opryland Hotel and the Opry Mills Mall hosts guests again.

Opry General Manager Pete Fisher said it's too early to assess the damage in the Opry House. He called the evening historic because of the show's return to the auditorium and said it was a celebration of the enduring nature of the 85-year-old Opry.

"We're here to get the word out that the Grand Ole Opry is not a place, it's a show," Fisher said.

23-year-old wins \$1M in baseball video game contest

NEW YORK — Shh, don't your kids. Wade McGilberry just won a million dollars playing a video

The 23-year-old from Mobile, Ala., accomplished the feat in just an hour and a half, becoming the first to pitch a perfect game in Take-Two Interactive Software Inc.'s "Major League Baseball 2K10." He and his wife, Katy, plan to pay off their mortgage and start a family with the winnings.

"We are trying to be responsible with it. We are simple people," said Katy McGilberry, also 23.

It wasn't supposed to be that easy. In fact Wade has not been able to duplicate his feat since March 2, the day he bought the game at its midnight launch and played it after coming home from his job as a records keeper for 401(k) retirement plans.

Take-Two offered the \$1 million prize to the first person to pitch a perfect game. Jason Argent, vice presi-

dent of marketing at TakeTwo's 2K Sports business, said the company didn't know how many times the feat has been accomplished in the video game.

In a perfect game, no batter from the other team ever scores or reaches a base. That means no hits, no walk and no getting on base because he is hit by a pitch or for any other reason.

McGilberry said that when he bought the game, his wife suggested that he take the day off work so he could get a head start on the competition.

"I thought about it (and) the responsible thing to do was to go to work," he said. When he came home, he set up a video recording, started playing achieved the perfect game after "five or six attempts."

Comedian wins as 'mother-in-lawsuit' is dismissed

LOS ANGELES — A standup comedian who was sued for making mother-inlaw jokes has had the last laugh after a federal judge threw the case out of court.

Sunda Croonquist, whose shtick for years has been to describe her life as a halfblack, half-Swedish woman who marries into a Jewish family, was sued two years ago after her mother-in-law, sister-in-law and brotherin-law said her jokes were holding them up to public ridicule.

In a 21-page ruling issued

Friday, U.S. District Judge Mary L. Cooper of New Jersey concluded that the examples they cited including one in which Croonquist says her sisterin-law's voice sounds like a cat in heat — fell under the category of protected speech. Many of the jokes, Cooper had to incur," she said

said were clearly statements of opinion and not fact and therefore protected by the First Amendment. The catin-heat joke, the judge said, quoting from a previous court decision, was "colorful, figurative rhetoric that reasonable minds would not take to be factual."

The suit was filed in New Jersey because two of the plaintiffs. Croonquist's brother-in-law and sisterin-law, Neil and Shelley Edelman, live there. Croonquist lives in Beverly Hills and her mother-in-law, Ruth Zafrin, lives in the New York City borough of Brooklyn.

unday is Mother's Day, that special time when mothers, grandmothers and great-grandmothers the world over will be honored and feted with visits to their favorite restaurants or a sumptuous brunch or dinner at home.

And what old-fashioned scents make us think of moms? Lemon must be at the top of any list. Think crushed lemon verbena leaves, lemon meringue pie, fresh squeezed lemonade and sugared lemon

It is no coincidence that lemon, with its bright and refreshing aroma, is a favored ingredient in commercial air fresheners and cleaning materials. Lemons sing of spring and enhance most any salad, en-

"Good cooks everywhere recognize the culinary value of lemon — not only for its own refreshing taste, but also for the way it brings out flavor in other foods," observes Linda Carman, Martha White baking expert.

The following tips, courtesy of Martha White, will help you become better acquainted with how to use lemons to add zest to your favorite meals and

■ Lemons warmed just to the touch give

up juice more easily. Warm in a microwave for 30 to 40 seconds depending on microwave wattage and size of lemon. Then press and roll around on tabletop a couple of times.

■ For grated zest or peel, grate only the vellow peel; the white part is unpleasantly bitter. A fairly new kitchen gadget, the micro plane grater, which looks like a rasp, is very sharp and makes grating a

■ If your recipe calls for peel or zest and juice, don't forget to grate the peel first. It's much easier.

■ If you have too many lemons on hand, freeze measured amounts, 1 to 2 tablespoons, in an ice cube tray. Store cubes in a plastic bag.

■ To prevent browning, rub lemon juice on the surface of bananas, apples, pears or avocados, or add to the cooking water of vegetables like potatoes or cauliflower.

■ One medium lemon will yield about 3 tablespoons of juice and about 1 tablespoon of grated peel.

Sunkist.com advises: "A bowl of fresh lemons will add fragrance and color to a room for days. Add a slice or two of fresh lemon to a glass of water. It has visual appeal and makes the water taste and smell better. If you are reducing your sodium or fat intake, try squeezing a wedge of fresh lemon on salads, steamed vegetables, soups and stews. You'll never miss the salt or butter!"

- 2 cups Martha White All-Purpose

Gulf fare still safe

o doubt, many Florida residents and visitors are concerned about the quality of Gulf seafood in light of the devastating oil spill. Fear not, says a state spokesperson.

Florida Agriculture and Consumer Services Commissioner Charles H. Bronson said seafood currently (as of Monday, May 3) being harvested in Florida is safe and has not been impacted by the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico. He said he is concerned that misinformation about the conditions in the Gulf waters may unnecessarily impact the state's seafood indus-

Bronson's news release states that while the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) is restricting commercial and recreational fishing in federal waters from Louisiana to off Pensacola Bay, the ban does not yet impact waters extended out 25 miles from Escambia County. Currently, all species harvested from the closure line to shore — including grouper, snapper, golden tilefish, mullet, blue crab, oysters, flounder, sea trout and shrimp — are safe to

eat. Stone crab season is in effect until May 15 and is also unaffected by the ban. Federal agencies and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection are conducting ongoing tests of water samples and have not found any hydrocarbons in samples taken from Florida.

The release from the division of aquaculture also states it is monitoring oysters to assure their safety. and NOAA is working closely with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration and food safety officials in the Gulf states to assure that no unsafe seafood products are sent to markets.

"Our shrimp, shellfish and other seafood being harvested right now are fine, and I don't want people watching reports of the oil spill to think differently," Bronson said. "If and when Florida waters are impacted by the spill, we will take immediate action to close the waters to commercial and recreational harvesting.'

By the 1850s, Longworth was producing almost 100,000 barrels yearly.

It never did catch on nationally. harks back to the Greek California is home today to more than 3,000 different wineries and produces 90 percent of America's wine. Grape growing started off there a long time before Longworth's Ohio days, with the Spanish missions producing limited amounts of wine from what was called "mission" grape vines.

A maverick named Augustin Harazthy, a displaced Hungarian, is credited by some historians with the creation of the California wine industry. After acquiring land in Sonoma County, he went to Europe and brought back, some say, as many as 100,000 grape plants of every variety.

He himself faded into obscurity, but by the 1880s northern California had some 11,000 acres under vine, undertakings led by a number of immigrant German and Italian families, many of whom are still active today.

These American families drank wine just as their ancestors did back home in Europe, but hardly anvone else followed suit. And then came the American temperance movement fostered by years of lobbying, which resulted in the disaster called Prohibition. From 1918 to 1933, when repeal finally arrived, the country was a blood bath of black market wars for the right to sell alcohol.

The wine industry collapsed like a punctured balloon. It was not until the 1970s with a new emphasis on health education by the federal government (quit smoking, and by the way, let's cut down on the two-martini lunches), that wine began to make its way into America's consciousness.

Today all 50 states contain at least one bonded winery (Alaska, Hawaii and North Dakota make fruit wine). Ten states have 100 or more wineries.

So how come Americans don't (as do our Europeans cousins) drink more wine? It's simple, really; we were not brought up with the stuff. Kids in France, Italy and Spain are given wine mixed with water at an early age. It's not some forbidden alcoholic stuff to slug back on weekends on college cam-

Wine and the tradition of drinking with meals is an everyday occurrence in many countries other than our own. Alcoholism, by the way, is much lower where the wine culture is strong than it is in Amer-

So the question is: When will wine become the national drink favored by a majority of the ever expanding population?" My guess is, don't hold your breath.

For those who do enjoy a glass of wine, two I have tasted and enjoyed recently, especially with the onset of warmer days, are Robert Mondavi Woodbridge Sauvignon Blanc, and also their pinot grigio (pinot gris). Both are friendly, easy to drink without any fuss. Sit back at day's end, watch the sunset and sip enjoyable white wine. Reasonable at about \$7, and widely avail-

Add milk to oysters and stir. Individually, coat oysters with flour mixture and drop into hot oil. Fry for 2 to 3 minutes on each side or until browned. Place on absorbent paper to drain. Makes 6 servings.



The 20 Burgers of Summer: Spike Mendelsohn

Associated Press

A burger so over-the-top it's just a hair shy of overwhelming. Kind of like the news media these days?

Either way, it's the sort of burger Spike Mendelsohn says is needed to fuel the people behind the world's largest news organization, and what he set out to create when asked to develop a hamburger inspired by The Associated Press.

Because, er, nothing says great burger like wall-to-wall coverage of war, politics and upset celebrities,

Despite the (lack of?) inspiration he was handed, true to his burgermaster cred — his Washington burger joint, Good Stuff Eatery, has become a hotspot for the likes of first lady Michelle Obama — Mendelsohn came up with a winner.

"For the people that never stop," Mendelsohn said of his 24/7 burger, the first in AP's weekly series — 20 Burgers of Summer, a celebration of the delicious diversity of the great American hamburger.

'Whether you're embedded with troops in Iraq, photographing the animals of Africa or live from the White House, here's the burger that will keep you going any time of day," said Mendelsohn, whose ode to burgers, "The Good Stuff Cookbook," is out later this month. But this burger is easy to love even

if you don't live life reporting on deadline. Mendelsohn starts with a pan-fried patty of ground sirloin, which he tops with bacon, a fried egg and a slice of American cheese. That gets placed on a toasted

brioche bun and topped with freshly made corned beef hash. He finishes it with his go-to burger condiment -Good Stuff Sauce. It starts as a homemade mayonnaise that is spiked with ketchup, molasses and vinegar.

24/7 BURGER

■ Time: 1 hour 15 minutes



Spike Mendelsohn's truly ingredient-packed 24/7 burger, includes egg, corned beef hash and bacon.

Servings: 6

For the Good-Stuff Sauce

- 2 large eggs
- 4 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 2 teaspoons white wine vine-
- 2 teaspoons salt, divided
- 2 cups grapeseed oil
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 2 tablespoons molasses 2 tablespoons rice vinegar
- For the corned beef hash
- 3 tablespoons unsalted but-
- 1 medium yellow onion, finely chopped (about 1 cup) ■ 3 cups finely chopped
- cooked corned beef ■ 3 cups chopped cooked Yukon Gold potatoes

- Chopped fresh parsley ■ Salt and ground black pep-
- per, to taste

For the burgers

- 30 ounces ground sirloin
- 6 brioche buns, halved and toasted
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 6 large eggs
- 1 pound applewood smoked bacon
- Salt and ground black pep-
- 6 slices American cheese

To prepare the sauce, in a food processor or blender, combine the eggs, mustard, vinegar and 1 teaspoon of the salt. Process for 30 seconds in a processor, or 10 seconds in a blender.

in the oil, slowly at first, then add in a thin, steady stream until all of the oil is added and the mixture is smooth. If the sauce is too thick, thin it with a little hot water. If too thin, process a little longer.

Add the ketchup, molasses, vinegar and remaining teaspoon of salt. Process until smooth. The sauce can be refrigerated in an airtight container for up to 1 week.

To prepare the corned beef hash, in a large (preferably cast-iron) skillet over medium, melt the butter. Add the onion and saute until translucent. Mix in the beef and potatoes, then spread the ingredients in an even layer over the pan.

Increase the heat to high or medium-high and press down on the mixture with a metal spatula. Do not stir the potatoes and corned beef, but let them brown. If you With the motor running, drizzle hear them sizzling, this is good.

When nicely browned on the bottom, use the spatula to flip sections over in the pan so that they brown on the other side. Press down again with the spatula. If there is too much sticking, you can add a bit more butter to the pan.

Remove the pan from heat and stir in the chopped parsley. Season with salt and pepper. Set aside.

To prepare the burgers, roll the meat into six 5-ounce balls, then flatten into patties. Place on a plate, cover and refrigerate.

Line a plate with paper towels.

In a lårge nonstick skillet over medium, heat the oil. One at a time, crack the eggs into the skillet, cover and fry for 2 minutes. Use a slotted spoon to transfer the eggs to the paper towel-lined plate to drain. Discard the oil.

Line a second plate with paper towels.

Return the clean skillet to medium-high heat. Add just enough canola oil to coat the bottom. Add the bacon and cook until crisp, about 6 to 8 minutes. Use a slotted spoon to transfer the bacon to the paper towel-lined plate to

Drain off the fat from the skillet but do not wipe clean. Heat the skillet over medium.

Working in batches, add the patties to the skillet. Season with salt and pepper and cook for 3 minutes. Flip and cook on the other side for 1 minute. Place an equal amount of the bacon, 1 fried egg and 1 slice of cheese on each patty.

Cook for another 2 minutes for medium-rare. Cover with a lid for the last 30 seconds to melt the To assemble the burgers, place 1

patty on 1 toasted bun bottom. Top the patty with corned beef hash. Dress with a generous amount of the sauce. Cover with the bun top. Wrap in waxed paper, then let rest 2 to 3 minutes before serving.



A message from the Citrus County Sheriff

Citrus County

Since early April, Colorado State University's renowned forecast team is predicting that the 2010 Atlantic hurricane season, which runs from June 1 to Nov. 30, will see above-average activity. Team members are calling for the possibility of 15 named storms, including eight hurricanes. Four of them could be intense. The probability for at least one major hurricane landfall on the U.S. East Coast (includes the Florida peninsula) is 45 percent, and 44 percent for the Gulf Coast.

That's why the Citrus County Sheriff's Office emergency management team works closely with community members year-round to stress the importance of being prepared for the threat of severe weather.

Maintaining not only a wellstocked disaster kit, but a wellrehearsed family (and/or business) disaster plan is only one key to survival. When faced with a major disaster, citizens should know it could be as long as 72 hours before any kind of public assistance is available.

On Saturday, May 8, the agency's **Emergency Management Section will** hold its free, comprehensive all-hazard and informational expo at the National Guard Armory, 8551 W. Venable Street in Crystal River (across from Home Depot). Citizens won't want to miss this opportunity to learn more about the latest tips, products and services available when it comes to protecting their family, home and business from severe weather and other hazards.

From 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., visitors will have the chance to see displays, watch demonstrations, pick up handouts and reentry tags, talk with vendors and listen to presentations, including one by Brian McClure, a meteorologist with Bay News 9. Drawings for free weather radios also are anticipated, along with refreshments for sale.

Because a major disaster typically impacts all of the county's resources, this year's expo will include valuable information from the offices of the Citrus County clerk of courts, tax collector, supervisor of elections and Fire Rescue. At least 30 vendors are expected to display

products and services designed to assist citizens as they prepare for the upcoming hurricane season.

The Sheriff's Office also maintains allinclusive emergency management pages on its official Web site. Just go to www.sheriffcitrus.org, and click on "Emergency Management." You'll find

useful information about shelter locations, distribution sites and pet-friendly shelters; where to pick up re-entry tags; plus what actions to take before, during and after severe weather strikes.

Citizens with special needs. such as restricted mobility or certain medical conditions, may register online at the site to receive critical assistance should an emergency threaten. Additionally, people can sign

up for CodeRED, emergency management's Internet-based high-speed telephone calling system. It's a good idea for everyone in the community to register their home, business and cell phone numbers to receive emergency notifications about

evacuation orders, boil-water notices,

The Citrus County Sheriff's Office also was the first sheriff's office in Florida to offer CodeRED Weather Warning to its citizens. This completely automated early warning system delivers severe weather notifications to telephones within seconds of being issued by the National Weather Service. Weather warnings include those for tornadoes, flash floods and severe thunderstorms, but not hurricanes, since communities typically have several days to prepare.

When moments count, the CodeRED Weather Warning system has the potential to save lives. Everyone is urged to take advantage of its timesaving benefits. Citizens will need to subscribe to this free-of-charge service by clicking on the CodeRED link posted on the Sheriff's Office Web site and following the in-

An all hazards approach to emergency preparedness

The key to surviving any disaster is planning. The Citrus County Sheriff's Office Emergency Management Section works year-round to ensure local officials are prepared for any type of critical situation, and educates the public on the proper steps to take for different emergencies.

Thunderstorms

A storm warning is issued when severe storm activity is sighted or indicated on radar.

Thunderstorms typically pro duce rain for 30 to 60 minutes.

Storms are considered severe if they produce hail at least 3/4s of an inch in diameter, have winds of 58 mph or greater, or spawn a tornado

Storm watches are issued if severe thunderstorms are likely

Stav tuned to local news to monitor where dangerous storms are heading.



The role of emergency management

The Emergency Management Section is responsible for emergency preparedness and recovery efforts before, during and after a catastrophic event. Here are some frequently used terms to describe what E.M. does:

Mitigation

Mitigation refers to the activity or pre-planning steps taken to help reduce or eliminate the effects of a major disaster. In Citrus County, mitigation efforts include response, planning and recovery.

Response

Recovery

Sirens alert - westside

During hazardous weather (or any emergency that threatens life or property, including problems at Progress Energy's power plant), Citrus County emergency management, in cooperation with the City of Inverness, City of Crystal River and the Board of County Commissioners. will activate the warning siren system located on the west side of the county.

If the sirens sound continuously for three to five minutes, it means that officials have important information for the public.

Tune your television or radio to one of the Emergency Alert System stations (listed on this website).

Know that the siren system is tested each Friday at noon (except on holidays), and there is no need for alarm during these times.

If a siren sounds and no emergency information follows, or you notice a siren that appears to be damaged or not working, please call 746-6555, or after normal business hours, call 911.





Re-entry – Getting back after an evacuation



In order to facilitate getting back into your neighborhood after an evacuation, Emergency Management officials use disaster re-entry tags.

The re-entry pass will be used when an area in the county has been evacuated for any reason. When the area is declared safe for re-entry, law enforcement will be looking for these passes that identify the holder as living in the

This will speed up the reentry process, and help deter looters and other people from entering the area.

If you don't have a re-entry pass, you will be stopped at a checkpoint before entering

the previously evacu-ated area, and will need to show photo identification with a listed address in the affected area.

Re-entry passes are avail-

- ◆ Sheriff's Office Emergency Operations Center in Lecanto
- ◆ Sheriff's Offices in Inverness, Crystal River and all resource offices
- ◆ Department of Development Services in Lecanto
- ◆ Tax Collector's Office in Inverness and Crystal River

The pass should be kept in the glove compartment until needed, and then hung on the rearview mirror of your vehicle during re-entry.



NOAA Weather Radio

The National Oceanic and At-National Weather Radio as a public service.

NOAA Weather Radio (NWR) is a nationwide network of radio stations broadcasting warnings,

watches, forecasts and other hazard information 24 hours a day. Working with the Federal Communication Commission's Emergency Alert System, NWR is an "all hazards" radio network, making it a single mospheric Administration provides source for comprehensive weather and emergency information. In conunction with federal, state and local emergency management and other public officials, NWR also broadcasts warnings and post-event

information for all types of hazards - including natural (such as hurricanes and tornadoes), environmental (such as chemical releases or oil spills), and public safety (such as AMBER alerts or 911 telephone outages).



The system is so quick that oftentimes, people who sign up for CodeRED Weather Warnings will receive a phone call before any other before a weather radio broadcast. For county residents, that means potentially life-saving time to take shelter before a possible tornado or flash

flood. CodeRED Weather Warnings include tornados, flash floods and severe thunderstorms.





What happens when schools must evacuate?

If your child attends one of the five schools located within a 10-mile area surrounding Progress Energy's power plant facility, they may be transported to another location as a precaution if conditions at the plant warrant such a move.

We have no reason to believe an incident that would endanger the public will occur, but the health and safety of these children has prompted the development of evacuation plans should such a need arise.

Should your child's school be evacuated for any reason, parents may pick up their children after they are transported to the new location.

Do not attempt to pick up your child at a Crystal River school - as they have priority bussing and will be transported to a safe facility in In-

Students evacuated will remain at the new location until picked up by a parent. Any student not picked up by 7 p.m. will be taken to the Withlacoochee Technical Institute on West State Road 44 in Inverness to wait for a

intensity over its lifetime. The best track contains the cyclone's latitude, longitude, maximum sustained surface winds, and minimum sea-level pressure at 6-hourly inter-

Cyclone: An atmospheric closed circulation rotating counter-clockwise in the Northern Hemisphere and clockwise in the Southern Hemisphere.

Eye: The roughly circular area of comparatively light winds that encompasses the center of a severe tropical cyclone. The eye is

either completely or partially surrounded by the evewall cloud.

Extratropical: A term used in advisories and tropical summaries to indicate that a cyclone has lost its "tropical" characteristics. The term implies both poleward displacement of the cyclone and the conversion of the cyclone's primary energy source from the release of latent heat of condensation to baroclinic (the temperature contrast between warm and cold air masses) processes. It is important to note that cyclones can become extratropical and still retain winds of hurricane or tropical storm force.

Hurricane Warning: A warning that sustained winds 64 kt (74 mph or 119 km/hr) or higher associated with a hurricane are expected in a specified coastal area in 24 hours or less. A hurricane warning can remain in effect when dangerously high water or a combination of dangerously high water and exceptionally high waves continue, even though winds may be less than hurricane

Hurricane Watch: An announcement for specific coastal areas that hurricane condi-

tions are possible within 36 hours. **Indirect Hit:** Generally refers to locations that do not experience a direct hit from a tropical cyclone, but do experience hurricane force winds (either sustained or gusts) or tides of at least 4 feet above normal.

Landfall: The intersection of the surface center of a tropical cyclone with a coastline. Because the strongest winds in a tropical cyclone are not located precisely at the center, it is possible for a cyclone's strongest winds to be experienced over land even if landfall does not occur. Similarly, it is possible for a tropical cyclone to make landfall and have its strongest winds remain over the water. Compare direct hit, indirect hit, and strike.

Major Hurricane: A hurricane that is classified as Category 3 or higher.

Storm Surge: An abnormal rise in sea level accompanying a hurricane or other intense storm, and whose height is the difference between the observed level of the sea surface

and the level that would have occurred in the absence of the cyclone.

Storm Tide: The actual level of sea water resulting from the astronomic tide combined with the storm surge.

Storm Warning: A warning of 1-minute sustained surface winds of 48 kt (55 mph or 88 km/hr) or greater, either predicted or occurring, not directly associated with tropical

Subtropical Depression: A subtropical cyclone in which the maximum sustained surface wind speed (using the U.S. 1-minute average) is 33 kt (38 mph or 62 km/hr) or

Subtropical Storm: A subtropical cyclone in which the maximum sustained surface wind speed (using the U.S. 1-minute average) is 34 kt (39 mph or 63 km/hr) or more. Synoptic Track:

Tropical Depression: A tropical cyclone in which the maximum sustained surface wind speed (using the U.S. 1-minute average) is 33 kt (38 mph or 62 km/hr) or less.





Pets and pet shelter information


There are many ways that you can be prepared to keep your pet safe during an emergency. According to Citrus County Animal Services, the first thing you should do is have your pet micro-chipped and do this right away, don't wait for an approaching storm. Hurricane Katrina displaced over 8000 animals; most of them never found their owner. Chipping and registering your pet nationally is the only positive way to identify a pet without being physically present to identify them.

If you plan to shelter your pet, work it into your evacuation route planning. In the event of a disaster, the pet friendly shelter will be located at the Lecanto Primary School. Dogs (80 pounds or less), cats and birds are welcome. Caging is available for dogs and cats; however if you have an avian friend, you must provide caging. All animals must be up-to-date with their county license and vaccinations: Rabies, DHLPP for dogs and Rabies, RCPC for cats. You must bring this information with you. You can pre-register your pet/pets to stay at the shelter by filing out the on-line registration form found on the Animal Services Web site.

Here is a list of what you'll need before going to the Citrus County pet friendly shelter, but you can always contact your veterinarian, local humane society and Citrus County Animal Services for further information.

- ☐ Dog/cat bed or bedding ☐ Food (at least a week's supply)
- Medications
- (at least a week's supply) ☐ Veterinarian's phone number
- ☐ Rabies Vaccination Certificate and shot records
- ☐ County License ☐ Collar/leash
- ☐ Favorite toy/ball

You must also stay at the shelter



Please keep in mind that your pet will not be sleeping in the same building as you; however, your pet will only be a hallway away!



Remember, law enforcement and other emergency workers will not respond to calls for service after the winds exceed 45 mph. The danger to rescue personnel is too great.

After the storm

Be careful around your home! Watch out for downed power lines, debris and other hazards caused by high winds and flood-

Be patient! It could take up to 24 hours for county distribution sites to open. or even longer after a catastrophic hurricane. Don't expect government to deliver supplies - be stocked and ready to support yourself for at least three to five

If you are at a shelter or evacuated out of the area. vou will not be allowed back in until authorities determine that conditions are safe enough for the public

To expedite getting back to vour home, obtain a free disaster re-entry tag prior to evacuating (see page 22).



Get Cash and Travelers' Checks Early!

During and after a storm, power outages and downed communication lines are a common occurrence. As a result, you may experience difficulty using credit, debit, and ATM cards so it's always good to have an adequate supply of cash and Travelers' checks on hand. Compared to cash, Travelers' checks provide an extra measure of security against theft or loss; if discovered missing, Travelers' checks can quickly be replaced.

Order Checks & Deposit Slips!

Make sure that you have enough checks and deposit slips to last two months, and take them with you if you evacuate, even if you rarely write checks. In the midst of a disaster, your payment habits may require change and by having your account information handy you can quickly authorize an important payment over the phone.

Debit, Credit & ATM Cards - Confirm Expiration Dates and PINs, and Activate Cards! Check the expiration dates on all of your plastic cards and make certain that dates are current and you have a valid card should you have to evacuate.

Flooding - What to expect

Floods can happen at any time and any place. Everyone lives in a flood zone – only the level of risk is different. Approximately one in four flood insurance claims are paid on policies in low to moderate risk areas. Even a slow moving rainstorm can cause flooding. In the high risk areas (A and V zones) your home or business has a 26 percent chance of being damaged by a flood over the 30 year life of a

Property losses due to flooding are not covered by standard homeowner's policies, but insurance can be obtained through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) for your home and contents. Flood insurance policies are available to homeowners, condo owners, apartment owners, renters and business owners alike.

The NFIP is a federal program that offers flood insurance at reasonable rates. The participating community utilizes flood management measures to help protect life and property from future flooding. The NFIP is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency through the Federal Insurance Administration. Citrus County is a participating community.

For more information about flood insurance, contact your local insurance agent. There is generally a 30-day waiting period before a flood insurance policy can take effect, so don't wait until a storm threatens to try to secure the flood coverage you need. Flood claims are paid even if the President doesn't declare a disaster.

Flood insurance reimburses policyholders for direct physical loss from floods, including limited coverage for services such as debris removal, moving insured property that is endangered by flooding and sandbags to protect endangered property from flood waters (subject to terms of policy).

Annually, flooding causes more property damage than any other type of natural disaster in the United States. While regulations and construction practices have made newer homes less prone to flooding, many older homes remain susceptible. Nationwide. there is a growing interest from property owners to develop practical and cost effective methods for reducing or eliminating their exposure to flood events.

Flood insurance is affordable. If you live in a low or moderate risk area, a preferred risk policy can cost just over \$100 a year. That's less than 30 cents a day to protect your property against a natural disaster. Even in the most high risk areas, the average policy cost is about \$500 a year.

Flood Facts

Citrus County is subject to flooding in the coastal areas generally described as west of US 19 as well as along the Withlacoochee River to the east and north. Depending on the duration and severity of the weather event, flooding will often occur outside of the floodplain due to poor drainage, soil saturation or debris-filled ditches and culverts.

You can protect yourself from flood hazards by taking measures to ensure your life and property are protected before, during, and after a flood occurs.

Copy your most important documents (mortgage papers, deed, bank information, passport, etc.) and keep the originals in a secure place such as a bank safe deposit

Take photos of your most valued possessions and store with your original paperwork.

Turn around don't drown

Do not drive through floodwaters. More people drown in their cars than anywhere else. It only takes two feet or less of water to sweep your vehicle off of the road - even SUV's.

Do not drive around barriers. The road or bridge may be washed

Do not walk through flowing water. Drowning is the number one cause of flood deaths usually during flash floods. Six inches of moving water can knock you off of vour feet. If you find it necessary to walk in standing water, use a stick or pole to see how deep the

Avoid power lines and electrical wires. The number two flood killer is electrocution. Report downed power lines to the power company or by calling 746-6555.

Get ready for the storm



What's in your disaster supply kit?

□ Water – Have at least one gallon per person, per day. Maintain a 5-day supply.

□ Food – Stock at least enough food for three days. Keep non-perishable, packaged or canned foods and juices in your kit. Make sure to include food for infants or the elderly, if needed. Snack foods, a manual can opener, cooking tools and fuel will be needed, as well as paper plates and plastic utensils.

☐ **Bedding** – Have enough blankets and pillows for each family member to stay dry and warm.

☐ Clothing – Include seasonal/rain gear and sturdy

☐ First-aid Kit – Stock generic medicines, plus a 30day supply of any needed prescription drugs.

☐ Specialty Items – Remember to plan for infants and the elderly, as well as pets if they are staying with you.

☐ **Toiletries** – Include hygiene items, moisture wipes and waterless antibacterial hand soap.

☐ Flashlights – Don't forget fresh batteries!

☐ Radio – Have a battery-operated radio and a NOAA weather radio, too.

☐ Cash (including small bills) – Banks and ATMs may not be open or available for extended periods after a catastrophic event.

☐ Toys, Books and Games – These help pass the time for adults and children!

☐ Important Documents – Secure them in a waterproof container or watertight, resealable plastic bag. Include insurance and medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card, etc.

☐ Tools – Keep a set with you during the storm for minor repairs, if needed.

☐ Gas Cans – Use them to fill up vehicles if fuel is in short supply, or to run other needed equipment.

Disasters and fire safety

One aspect of disasters that is often overlooked is the risk of fire. Preparing in advance can lessen or eliminate deaths. injuries, and property damage. In most types of disasters the risk for fire is increased due to loose electrical wires, broken gas lines, flooding, or the lack of electricity. In addition, fires in residences are a personal disaster striking hundreds of thousands of homes each year. For these reasons, each of us should take the time to find out how to be prepared. Citrus County Fire Rescue encourages you to review this disaster-specific information to help protect yourself, your family, and your home from the potential threat of fire during or after a disaster. You can greatly reduce your chances of becoming a fire casualty by being able to identify potential hazards and following safety tips.

Fire Related Hazards **Present During and After a** Tornado or Hurricane

- ◆ Leaking gas lines, damaged or leaking gas propane cylinders and leaking vehicle gasoline tanks may explode or ignite.
- ◆ Debris can easily ignite, especially if electrical wires are severed.
- ◆ Pools of water and even appliances can be electrically charged.
- ◆ Generators are often used during power outages. Generators that are not properly used and maintained can be very hazardous.
- ◆ Appliances that emit smoke or sparks should be repaired or replaced.

Smoke Alarms

Fires can occur in a variety of ways and in any room of your home. But no matter where or how, having a smoke alarm is the first key step towards your famil'y's safety. A smoke alarm stands guard around the clock and, when it first senses smoke, it sounds a shrill alarm. This often allows a family the precious but limited time it takes to escape.

Properly installed and maintained smoke alarms are considered to be one of the best and least expensive means of providing an early warning of a potentially deadly fire and could reduce the risk of dying from a fire in your home by almost half.

- **Chemical Safety** ◆ Assume all wires on the ground are electrically charged. This includes cable TV ◆ Look for combustible liquids like gasoline, lighter fluid, and paint thinner that may have spilled. Thoroughly clean the spill and
- ◆ Look for and replace frayed or cracked extension and appliance cords, loose prongs, place containers in a well-ventilated area. and plugs.
- ◆ Keep combustible liquids away from heat ◆ Never run extension or electrical cords under carpets or through high traffic areas.
 - ◆ Exposed outlets and wiring could present a fire and life safety hazard.

◆ Appliances that emit smoke or sparks should be repaired or replaced.

◆ Have a licensed electrician check your home for damage.

Propane/Natural Gas Safety

- ◆ If you believe there is a gas leak, immediately leave the house and leave the door(s)
- ♦ Never strike a match. Any size flame can spark an explosion.
- ♦ Before turning the gas back on, have the gas system checked by a licensed profes-

Generator Safety and Carbon Monoxide

Carbon Monoxide gas can come from several sources: gas-fired appliances, charcoal grills, wood-burning furnaces or fireplaces, and motor vehicles.

- ◆ Follow the manufacturer's instructions and guidelines when using generators.
- ◆ Use a generator or other fuel-powered machines outside the home. Carbon Monoxide fumes are odorless and can quickly overwhelm you indoors.
- ◆ Use the appropriate sized and type power cords to carry the electric load. Overloaded cords can overheat and cause fires.
- ◆ Never run cords under rugs or carpets where heat might build up or damage to a cord may go unnoticed.
- ♦ Always refuel generators outdoors and make sure they are turned off prior to refuel-
- ◆ Never connect generators to another power source such as power lines. The reverse flow of electricity can electrocute an unsuspecting utility worker.
- ◆ Purchase and install carbon monoxide detectors for your home.

Have a Sound Fire Escape Plan

In the event of a fire, remember - time is the biggest enemy and every second counts! Escape plans help you get out of your home quickly. In less than 30 seconds a small flame can get completely out of control and turn into a major fire. It only takes minutes

How storms affect citizens and property appraisers assistance

First take action to protect you and your loved ones, then secure your property as recommended by disaster agen-

Appraiser's records can assist citizens

Before a hurricane strikes, there are things a citizen can do. The Property Appraiser's Office records are of all properties are annually updated and certified each Oct. 1st. With computer access, you may download directly from our website any property's record card which details size, dimensions and other characteristics of improvements and land. A current annual aerial photo of your neighborhood where your home is located on your property may also be directly printed from the website. If you don't have computer access, please stop by either office in Inverness or Crystal River and request a copy of any of the above records. Place any photos you have taken or printed from our website in a secure location, where they can be accessed later after the storm has past. In the event that your property is damaged, this information can be invaluable for dealing with insurance companies as well as disaster relief agencies. This should be updated annually for greatest accuracy.

When storms strike, be ready

After a storm, the Property Appraiser's offices may not reopen immediately. The severity of the storm will dictate how soon power is restored and when normal operations can resume.

Know that your Property Appraiser's Office may also be busy in a support role to our local government agencies by providing maps and helping to assemble value information as well as potentially assisting on field damage assessment teams. Use of computer technologies like Imagery Photography and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) will greatly con-

tribute to the speed with which data can be gathered and analyzed. The new 2010 oblique aerials described below will be reflown for affected areas at no additional cost in the case of a declared disaster. This effort will be a priority for our office immediately after a hurricane

Appraiser occurs. In early 2010, new aerial oblique photography has been flown of Citrus County providing multiple views from all directions (N,S,E &W). During 2010, additional street-view photography is also being shot with 2 views of all structures. Prints may also be obtained by the public upon request, once the photography is complete. While primarily for internal use to provide cost saving desktop appraisals, copies of such photography may be obtained for a reasonable charge upon request to serve as additional baselines to augment the online web based aerial maps currently available.

You may recall that after the most recent Florida hurricanes in 2004, the Legislature took emergency action to give homeowners assessment and tax relief by allowing property owners to apply for a refund of a portion of their 2004 property taxes (sales tax for mobile home owners) to aid in replacing or repairing the damaged homes. This


was a one-time relief and would require new legislation to re-

The State Legislature has provided through Florida Statutes protections from assessment increases for structures damaged by any misfortune or calamity as long as the repairs or rebuild

are started within 3 years from the January 1st following the storm or other calamity event and additional size conditions are met. In the event that your structure is damaged and you plan to rebuild, please contact our office for details on the assessment protections for which you may be eligible.

Finally, please pay close attention as to whether the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) declares our county a "disaster area."

If so, that agency would likely take the lead in processing disaster damage claims. Stay tuned to local media, newspapers, radio, TV and the Internet, for update as to how and where to seek assistance. 



Hurricane Tips From the Experts!

outdoor units. Those that didn't replace their unit found out the AC System over time. The closer hard way. Within a year the coils failed and the unit had to be replaced. Most insurance policies cover the cost of replacing a flooded outdoor unit. Before the season hits – review your policy and make sure you are covered!

Remember – IF flooded – Have a Professional Bay Area Service Technician check your AC system. For your safety it is best NOT to turn your System back on until a professional checks it.

So in the event of a storm, to Protect and Care for your AC system:

- Turn your AC System Off
- Turn off the electrical breaker for your AC System
- Have your AC unit cleaned after the storm if you are near the coast.
- If flooded call the Professionals at Bay Area Air Condition and Heating

Remember – IF flooded – Have a Professional Bay Area Service Technician check your AC system. For your safety it is best NOT to turn your System back on until a professional checks it.

So in the event of a storm, to Protect and Care for your AC system:

- Turn your AC System Off
- Turn off the electrical breaker for your AC System
- Have your AC unit cleaned after the storm if you are near the coast.



Disasters and fire safety

One aspect of disasters that is often overlooked is the risk of fire. Preparing in advance can lessen or eliminate deaths. injuries, and property damage. In most types of disasters the risk for fire is increased due to loose electrical wires, broken gas lines, flooding, or the lack of electricity. In addition, fires in residences are a personal disaster striking hundreds of thousands of homes each year. For these reasons, each of us should take the time to find out how to be prepared. Citrus County Fire Rescue encourages you to review this disaster-specific information to help protect yourself, your family, and your home from the potential threat of fire during or after a disaster. You can greatly reduce your chances of becoming a fire casualty by being able to identify potential hazards and following safety tips.

Fire Related Hazards Present During and After a Tornado or Hurricane

- ◆ Leaking gas lines, damaged or leaking gas propane cylinders and leaking vehicle gasoline tanks may explode or ignite.
- ◆ Debris can easily ignite, especially if electrical wires are severed.
- ◆ Pools of water and even appliances can be electrically charged.

 ◆ Generators are often used during power.
- ◆ Generators are often used during power outages. Generators that are not properly used and maintained can be very hazardous.
- ◆ Appliances that emit smoke or sparks should be repaired or replaced.

Smoke Alarms

Fires can occur in a variety of ways and in any room of your home. But no matter where or how, having a smoke alarm is the first key step towards your famil'y's safety. A smoke alarm stands guard around the clock and, when it first senses smoke, it sounds a shrill alarm. This often allows a family the precious but limited time it takes to escape.

Properly installed and maintained smoke alarms are considered to be one of the best and least expensive means of providing an early warning of a potentially deadly fire and could reduce the risk of dying from a fire in your home by almost half.

Propane/Natural Gas Safety

- ◆ If you believe there is a gas leak, immediately leave the house and leave the door(s) open.
- ◆ Never strike a match. Any size flame can spark an explosion.
- ◆ Before turning the gas back on, have the gas system checked by a licensed professional.

Generator Safety and Carbon Monoxide

Carbon Monoxide gas can come from several sources: gas-fired appliances, charcoal grills, wood-burning furnaces or fireplaces, and motor vehicles.

- ◆ Follow the manufacturer's instructions and guidelines when using generators.
- ◆ Use a generator or other fuel-powered machines outside the home. Carbon Monoxide fumes are odorless and can quickly overwhelm you indoors.
- ◆ Use the appropriate sized and type power cords to carry the electric load. Overloaded cords can overheat and cause fires.
- ◆ Never run cords under rugs or carpets where heat might build up or damage to a cord may go unnoticed.
- ◆ Always refuel generators outdoors and make sure they are turned off prior to refueling.
- ◆ Never connect generators to another power source such as power lines. The reverse flow of electricity can electrocute an unsuspecting utility worker.
- ◆ Purchase and install carbon monoxide detectors for your home.

Have a Sound Fire Escape Plan

In the event of a fire, remember - time is the biggest enemy and every second counts! Escape plans help you get out of your home quickly. In less than 30 seconds a small flame can get completely out of control and turn into a major fire. It only takes minutes

How storms affect citizens and property appraisers assistance

First take action to protect you and your loved ones, then secure your property as recommended by disaster agencies.

Appraiser's records can assist citizens

Before a hurricane strikes, there are things a citizen can do. The Property Appraiser's Office records are of all properties are annually updated and certified each Oct. 1st. With computer access, you may download directly from our website any property's record card which details size, dimensions and other characteristics of improvements and land. A current annual aerial photo of your neighborhood where your home is located on your property may also be directly printed from the website. If you don't have computer access, please stop by either office in Inverness or Crystal River and request a copy of any of the above records. Place any photos you have taken or printed from our website in a secure location, where they can be accessed later after the storm has past. In the event that your property is damaged, this information can be invaluable for dealing with insurance companies as well as disaster relief agencies. This should be updated annually for greatest accuracy.

When storms strike, be ready

After a storm, the Property Appraiser's offices may not reopen immediately. The severity of the storm will dictate how soon power is restored and when normal operations can resume. Know that your Property Appraiser's Office may also be busy in a support role to our local government agencies by providing maps and helping to assemble value information as well as potentially assisting on field damage assessment teams. Use of computer technologies like Imagery Photography and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) will greatly con-

tems (GIS) will greatly tribute to the speed with which data can be gathered and analyzed. The new 2010 oblique aerials described below will be reflown for affected areas at no additional cost in the case of a declared disaster. This effort will be a priority for our office immediately after a hurricane

Appraiser occurs. In early 2010, new aerial oblique photography has been flown of Citrus County providing multiple views from all directions (N,S,E &W). During 2010, additional street-view photography is also being shot with 2 views of all structures. Prints may also be obtained by the public upon request, once the photography is complete. While primarily for internal use to provide cost saving desktop appraisals, copies of such photography may be obtained for a reasonable charge upon request to serve as additional baselines to augment the online web based aerial maps currently available.

You may recall that after the most recent Florida hurricanes in 2004, the Legislature took emergency action to give homeowners assessment and tax relief by allowing property owners to apply for a refund of a portion of their 2004 property taxes (sales tax for mobile home owners) to aid in replacing or repairing the damaged homes. This

was a one-time relief and would require new legislation to repeat.


The State Legislature has provided through Florida Statutes protections from assessment increases for structures damaged by any misfortune or calamity as long as the repairs or rebuild

are started within 3 years from the January 1st following the storm or other calamity event and additional size conditions are met. In the event that your structure is damaged and you plan to rebuild, please contact our office for details on the assessment protections for which you may be eligible.

Finally, please pay close attention as to whether the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) declares our county a "disaster area."

If so, that agency would

likely take the lead in processing disaster damage claims. Stay tuned to local media, newspapers, radio, TV and the Internet, for update as to how and where to seek assistance. 



Flooding - What to expect

Floods can happen at any time and any place. Everyone lives in a flood zone – only the level of risk is different. Approximately one in four flood insurance claims are paid on policies in low to moderate risk areas. Even a slow moving rainstorm can cause flooding. In the high risk areas (A and V zones) your home or business has a 26 percent chance of being damaged by a flood over the 30 year life of a

Property losses due to flooding are not covered by standard homeowner's policies, but insurance can be obtained through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) for your home and contents. Flood insurance policies are available to homeowners, condo owners, apartment owners, renters and business owners alike.

The NFIP is a federal program that offers flood insurance at reasonable rates. The participating community utilizes flood management measures to help protect life and property from future flooding. The NFIP is administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency through the Federal Insurance Administration. Citrus County is a participating community.

For more information about flood insurance, contact your local insurance agent. There is generally a 30-day waiting period before a flood insurance policy can take effect, so don't wait until a storm threatens to try to secure the flood coverage you need. Flood claims are paid even if the President doesn't declare a disaster.

Flood insurance reimburses policyholders for direct physical loss from floods, including limited coverage for services such as debris removal, moving insured property that is endangered by flooding and sandbags to protect endangered property from flood waters (subject to terms of policy).

Annually, flooding causes more property damage than any other type of natural disaster in the United States. While regulations and construction practices have made newer homes less prone to flooding, many older homes remain susceptible. Nationwide. there is a growing interest from property owners to develop practical and cost effective methods for reducing or eliminating their exposure to flood events.

Flood insurance is affordable. If you live in a low or moderate risk area, a preferred risk policy can cost just over \$100 a year. That's less than 30 cents a day to protect your property against a natural disaster. Even in the most high risk areas, the average policy cost is about \$500 a year.

Flood Facts

Citrus County is subject to flooding in the coastal areas generally described as west of US 19 as well as along the Withlacoochee River to the east and north. Depending on the duration and severity of the weather event, flooding will often occur outside of the floodplain due to poor drainage, soil saturation or debris-filled ditches and culverts.

You can protect yourself from flood hazards by taking measures to ensure your life and property are protected before, during, and after a flood occurs.

Copy your most important documents (mortgage papers, deed, bank information, passport, etc.) and keep the originals in a secure place such as a bank safe deposit

Take photos of your most valued possessions and store with your original paperwork.

Turn around don't drown

Do not drive through floodwaters. More people drown in their cars than anywhere else. It only takes two feet or less of water to sweep your vehicle off of the road - even SUV's.

Do not drive around barriers. The road or bridge may be washed

Do not walk through flowing water. Drowning is the number one cause of flood deaths usually during flash floods. Six inches of moving water can knock you off of vour feet. If you find it necessary to walk in standing water, use a stick or pole to see how deep the

Avoid power lines and electrical wires. The number two flood killer is electrocution. Report downed power lines to the power company or by calling 746-6555.

Get ready for the storm



What's in your disaster supply kit?

□ Water – Have at least one gallon per person, per day. Maintain a 5-day supply.

□ Food – Stock at least enough food for three days. Keep non-perishable, packaged or canned foods and juices in your kit. Make sure to include food for infants or the elderly, if needed. Snack foods, a manual can opener, cooking tools and fuel will be needed, as well as paper plates and plastic utensils.

☐ **Bedding** – Have enough blankets and pillows for each family member to stay dry and warm.

☐ Clothing – Include seasonal/rain gear and sturdy

☐ First-aid Kit – Stock generic medicines, plus a 30day supply of any needed prescription drugs.

☐ Specialty Items – Remember to plan for infants and the elderly, as well as pets if they are staying with you.

☐ **Toiletries** – Include hygiene items, moisture wipes and waterless antibacterial hand soap.

☐ Flashlights – Don't forget fresh batteries!

☐ Radio – Have a battery-operated radio and a NOAA weather radio, too.

☐ Cash (including small bills) – Banks and ATMs may not be open or available for extended periods after a catastrophic event.

☐ Toys, Books and Games – These help pass the time for adults and children!

☐ Important Documents – Secure them in a waterproof container or watertight, resealable plastic bag. Include insurance and medical records, bank account numbers, Social Security card, etc.

☐ Tools – Keep a set with you during the storm for minor repairs, if needed.

☐ Gas Cans – Use them to fill up vehicles if fuel is in short supply, or to run other needed equipment.



If you are at a shelter or evacuated out of the area. vou will not be allowed back in until authorities determine that conditions are safe enough for the public

To expedite getting back to vour home, obtain a free disaster re-entry tag prior to evacuating (see page 22).



In addition to preparing for your personal safety should a hurricane strike, you need to prepare for the financial challenges associated with a hurricane like having access to cash, financial services, and personal identification should you need to pay for supplies, temporary housing, or to conduct your personal financial matters. Here are some practical tips that can help you prepare should a hurricane strike!

Financial Preparations for Before a Hurricane Strikes:

Get Cash and Travelers' Checks Early!

During and after a storm, power outages and downed communication lines are a common occurrence. As a result, you may experience difficulty using credit, debit, and ATM cards so it's always good to have an adequate supply of cash and Travelers' checks on hand. Compared to cash, Travelers' checks provide an extra measure of security against theft or loss; if discovered missing, Travelers' checks can quickly be replaced.

Order Checks & Deposit Slips!

Make sure that you have enough checks and deposit slips to last two months, and take them with you if you evacuate, even if you rarely write checks. In the midst of a disaster, your payment habits may require change and by having your account information handy you can quickly authorize an important payment over the phone.

Debit, Credit & ATM Cards - Confirm Expiration Dates and PINs, and Activate Cards! Check the expiration dates on all of your plastic cards and make certain that dates are current and you have a valid card should you have to evacuate.





Crystal River Schools – evacuation plan

What happens when schools must evacuate?

If your child attends one of the five schools located within a 10-mile area surrounding Progress Energy's power plant facility, they may be transported to another location as a precaution if conditions at the plant warrant such a move.

We have no reason to believe an incident that would endanger the public will occur, but the health and safety of these children has prompted the development of evacuation plans should such a need arise.

Should your child's school be evacuated for any reason, parents may pick up their children after they are transported to the new location.

Do not attempt to pick up your child at a Crystal River school - as they have priority bussing and will be transported to a safe facility in In-

Students evacuated will remain at the new location until picked up by a parent. Any student not picked up by 7 p.m. will be taken to the Withlacoochee Technical Institute on West State Road 44 in Inverness to wait for a

Advisory: Official information issued by tropical cyclone warning centers describing all tropical cyclone watches and warnings in effect along with details concerning tropical cyclone locations, intensity and movement, and precautions that should be taken.

Best Track: A subjectively-smoothed representation of a tropical cyclone's location and intensity over its lifetime. The best track contains the cyclone's latitude, longitude, maximum sustained surface winds, and minimum sea-level pressure at 6-hourly inter-

Cyclone: An atmospheric closed circulation rotating counter-clockwise in the Northern Hemisphere and clockwise in the Southern Hemisphere.

Eye: The roughly circular area of comparatively light winds that encompasses the center of a severe tropical cyclone. The eye is

either completely or partially surrounded by the evewall cloud.

Extratropical: A term used in advisories and tropical summaries to indicate that a cyclone has lost its "tropical" characteristics. The term implies both poleward displacement of the cyclone and the conversion of the cyclone's primary energy source from the release of latent heat of condensation to baroclinic (the temperature contrast between warm and cold air masses) processes. It is important to note that cyclones can become extratropical and still retain winds of hurricane or tropical storm force.

Hurricane Warning: A warning that sustained winds 64 kt (74 mph or 119 km/hr) or higher associated with a hurricane are expected in a specified coastal area in 24 hours or less. A hurricane warning can remain in effect when dangerously high water or a combination of dangerously high water and exceptionally high waves continue, even though winds may be less than hurricane

Hurricane Watch: An announcement for specific coastal areas that hurricane condi-

tions are possible within 36 hours. **Indirect Hit:** Generally refers to locations that do not experience a direct hit from a tropical cyclone, but do experience hurricane force winds (either sustained or gusts) or tides of at least 4 feet above normal.

Landfall: The intersection of the surface center of a tropical cyclone with a coastline. Because the strongest winds in a tropical cyclone are not located precisely at the center, it is possible for a cyclone's strongest winds to be experienced over land even if landfall does not occur. Similarly, it is possible for a tropical cyclone to make landfall and have its strongest winds remain over the water. Compare direct hit, indirect hit, and strike. **Major Hurricane:** A hurricane that is clas-

sified as Category 3 or higher.

Storm Surge: An abnormal rise in sea level accompanying a hurricane or other intense storm, and whose height is the difference between the observed level of the sea surface

and the level that would have occurred in the absence of the cyclone.

Storm Tide: The actual level of sea water resulting from the astronomic tide combined with the storm surge.

Storm Warning: A warning of 1-minute sustained surface winds of 48 kt (55 mph or 88 km/hr) or greater, either predicted or occurring, not directly associated with tropical

Subtropical Depression: A subtropical cyclone in which the maximum sustained surface wind speed (using the U.S. 1-minute average) is 33 kt (38 mph or 62 km/hr) or

Subtropical Storm: A subtropical cyclone in which the maximum sustained surface wind speed (using the U.S. 1-minute average) is 34 kt (39 mph or 63 km/hr) or more. Synoptic Track:

Tropical Depression: A tropical cyclone in which the maximum sustained surface wind speed (using the U.S. 1-minute average) is 33 kt (38 mph or 62 km/hr) or less.

Re-entry – Getting back after an evacuation



In order to facilitate getting back into your neighborhood after an evacuation, Emergency Management officials use disaster re-entry tags.

The re-entry pass will be used when an area in the county has been evacuated for any reason. When the area is declared safe for re-entry, law enforcement will be looking for these passes that identify the holder as living in the

This will speed up the reentry process, and help deter looters and other people from entering the area.

If you don't have a re-entry pass, you will be stopped at a checkpoint before entering

the previously evacu-ated area, and will need to show photo identification with a listed address in the affected area.

The pass should be kept in the glove compartment until needed, and then hung on the rearview mirror of your vehicle during re-entry.



NOAA Weather Radio

The National Oceanic and At-National Weather Radio as a public service.

NOAA Weather Radio (NWR) is a nationwide network of radio stations broadcasting warnings,

watches, forecasts and other hazard information 24 hours a day. Working with the Federal Communication Commission's Emergency Alert System, NWR is an "all hazards" radio network, making it a single mospheric Administration provides source for comprehensive weather and emergency information. In conunction with federal, state and local emergency management and other public officials, NWR also broadcasts warnings and post-event

information for all types of hazards - including natural (such as hurricanes and tornadoes), environmental (such as chemical releases or oil spills), and public safety (such as AMBER alerts or 911 telephone outages).







Sirens alert - westside

During hazardous weather (or any emergency that threatens life or property, including problems at Progress Energy's power plant), Citrus County emergency management, in cooperation with the City of Inverness, City of Crystal River and the Board of County Commissioners. will activate the warning siren system located on the west side of the county.

If the sirens sound continuously for three to five minutes, it means that officials have important information for the public.

Tune your television or radio to one of the Emergency Alert System stations (listed on this website).

Know that the siren system is tested each Friday at noon (except on holidays), and there is no need for alarm during these times.

If a siren sounds and no emergency information follows, or you notice a siren that appears to be damaged or not working, please call 746-6555, or after normal business hours, call 911.



The role of emergency management

The Emergency Management Section is responsible for emergency preparedness and recovery efforts before, during and after a catastrophic event. Here are some frequently used terms to describe what E.M. does:

Mitigation

Mitigation refers to the activity or pre-planning steps taken to help reduce or eliminate the effects of a major disaster. In Citrus County, mitigation efforts include response, planning and recovery.

Response

How well local government responds initially to a critical situation involving widespread power outages, severe personal property loss, or even death, is extremely important. Citrus County works from a written response plan that prioritizes meeting the most important

Perhaps the most important role of emergency management is the planning process when asking, "What would we do

> if..." Sheriff's Office emergency management officials continuously train for "worst-case" scenarios that could affect Citrus County, from terrorism to natural disasters. The planning phase is enormous, and includes personnel trained in Radiological Emergency Planning and all phases of mitigation, response and recovery.

Recovery

Recovery is the phase that con-Joe Eckstein tinues until all daily life routines power, debris removal, basic needs, etc. - return to normal or as close to

normal as possible. The recovery process can take days, weeks, or even years depending on the size and scope of a disas-

A message from the Citrus County Sheriff

Since early April, Colorado State University's renowned forecast team is predicting that the 2010 Atlantic hurricane season, which runs from June 1 to Nov. 30, will see above-average activity. Team members are calling for the possibility of 15 named storms, including eight hurricanes. Four of them could be intense. The probability for at least one major hurricane landfall on the U.S. East Coast (includes the Florida peninsula) is 45 percent, and 44 percent for the Gulf Coast.

That's why the Citrus County Sheriff's Office emergency management team works closely with community members year-round to stress the importance of being prepared for the threat of severe weather.

Maintaining not only a wellstocked disaster kit, but a wellrehearsed family (and/or business) disaster plan is only one key to survival. When faced with a major disaster, citizens should know it could be as long as 72 hours before any kind of public assistance is available.

On Saturday, May 8, the agency's **Emergency Management Section will** hold its free, comprehensive all-hazard and informational expo at the National Guard Armory, 8551 W. Venable Street in Crystal River (across from Home Depot). Citizens won't want to miss this opportunity to learn more about the latest tips, products and services available when it comes to protecting their family, home and business from severe weather and other hazards.

From 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., visitors will have the chance to see displays, watch demonstrations, pick up handouts and reentry tags, talk with vendors and listen to presentations, including one by Brian McClure, a meteorologist with Bay News 9. Drawings for free weather radios also are anticipated, along with refreshments for sale.

up for CodeRED, emergency management's Internet-based high-speed telephone calling system. It's a good idea for everyone in the community to register their home, business and cell phone numbers to receive emergency notifications about



The Citrus County Sheriff's Office also was the first sheriff's office in Florida to offer CodeRED Weather Warning to its citizens. This completely automated early warning system delivers severe weather notifications to telephones within seconds of being issued by the National Weather Service. Weather warnings include those for tornadoes, flash floods and severe thunderstorms, but not hurricanes, since communities typically have several days to prepare.

When moments count, the CodeRED Weather Warning system has the potential to save lives. Everyone is urged to take advantage of its timesaving benefits. Citizens will need to subscribe to this free-of-charge service by clicking on the CodeRED link posted on the Sheriff's Office Web site and following the in-

An all hazards approach to emergency preparedness

The key to surviving any disaster is planning. The Citrus County Sheriff's Office Emergency Management Section works year-round to ensure local officials are prepared for any type of critical situation, and educates the public on the proper steps to take for different emergencies.

Thunderstorms

A storm warning is issued when severe storm activity is sighted or indicated on radar.

Thunderstorms typically pro duce rain for 30 to 60 minutes.

Storms are considered severe if they produce hail at least 3/4s of an inch in diameter, have winds of 58 mph or greater, or spawn a tornado

Storm watches are issued if severe thunderstorms are likely

Stav tuned to local news to monitor where dangerous storms are heading.






