Congratulations, Citrus County: The Three Sisters Springs property is all yours

ometimes words aren't enough. Not to Helen Spivey, the former Crystal River City councilwoman and state representative, who has made manatee protection the focal point of

Not to Dr. K.C. Nayfield, a retired veterinarian, who wondered whether the good news that spilled Wednesday from Tampa would ever come.

Not to Lace Blue-McLean, who would not let setback after setback keep her down. Not to Andy Houston, the Crystal River city

manager who has never experienced anything similar during 25 years in government. And certainly not to Hal Flowers, the Tampa

businessman who knew right away that his land was meant not for homes, but for preservation. But all five uttered words of

praise, congratulations and even astonishment Wednesday as the long-awaited sale of the 57-acre Three Sisters Springs property was complete. "This is a very glorious day,"

Blue-McLean, president of the Friends of the Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge, said Spivey, co-chair of the Save the

Manatee Club, chimed: "It's probably the most fabulous thing I've ever heard of in my life and seen in my life and worked for in my life."

What started in early 2008 with the Crystal River City Council agreeing to act as the lead agency in seeking a state grant for the purchase — a path that meandered through a litany of government rules, appraisals

and politics — ended when Flowers and an ownership group agreed to sell the property for the exact amount it paid in 2005.

Flowers became a willing seller when environmentalists showed him the property's proximity with manatees that converge during the winter in the warm waters of Three Sisters Springs


"It didn't take long to convince me," said Flowers, who also participated in a manatee rescue just off the property. "When I went over to the spring tonight, I thought gosh, I don't own this anymore. The important thing is, nobody else does either."

Technically, the city of Crystal River and Southwest Florida Water Management District share ownership. Both have agreements with the U.S. Fish &

Wildlife Service, or USFWS, to manage the property. The federal agency, which contributed \$3.2 million toward the purchase, had made Three Sisters its top priority of the agency's 10-state southeast region.

Michael Lusk, manager of the Chassahowitzka National Wildlife Refuge in Crystal River, said the property provides both manatee protection and an access point for visitors to view manatees in their natural habitat.

MEET THE SISTERS

- 57-acre property at the corner of Kings Bay Drive and Cutler Spur, Crystal River.
- Originally a hardwood swamp.
- Includes a 15-acre, 40-footdeep borrow pit known as Lake Linda. A previous owner used dirt from the pit to fill the swamp, burying trees and vegetation, in the hopes of one day developing the property.
- The most recent owner planted pine trees to achieve an agricultural classification with the property appraiser's office, avoiding the payment of most property taxes.
- Three Sisters Springs is one of Florida's last remaining urban springs, an ecological marvel that supports a winter population of manatees in excess of 150, who rest, breed and give birth in the springs
- The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has ranked Three Sisters as its highest priority acquisition for conservation as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System in the 10state Southeast Region.

THE FUTURE OF THE SPRINGS

Highlights of the management plan for the Three Sisters Springs property:

- Continued unrestricted access to the spring run for canoes, kayaks and swimmers; partial or full closure to the spring run during "rare" extreme cold days to allow room for manatees.
- Observation platforms to view manatees.
- Kayak/canoe access from the water to the land. No launch from land to water.
- Education center
- Fishing dock and pier on Lake Linda.
- A water treatment wetlands to filter stormwater runoff before it reaches King's Bay.
- Projects will occur between 2011-15, depending on fund-

YOU HAVE QUESTIONS, **WE HAVE ANSWERS**

What happened **Wednesday?**

Tampa businessman Hal Flowers and a group of investors sold the 57-acre Three Sisters Springs property to the city of Crystal River and U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service for \$10.5 million.

Why is that significant?

The springs that border the property are known as a popular manatee gathering spot, especially in the cold winter months. Preserving the property from development is seen as significant protection for manatees.

Now that the property is public land, can I access it from the entrance or by water?

No. The USFWS considers it part of the Crystal River National Wildlife Refuge and access to the property, for now, is off limits. The refuge office is planning an open house to the public sometime in August or September.

Will the public ever be allowed onto the property?

Absolutely! The property was purchased to protect manatees, provide a stormwater filtering system, and encourage public education about manatees and their habitat. The USFWS has a state-approved management plan it hopes to put in place, in phases, over the next four years.

So the city now owns the property?

Technically, the city owns 70 percent of the land. It immediately turned over management to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, or USFWS.

Who owns the rest?

The Southwest Florida Water Management District bought 30 percent for a wetlands treatment system designed to filter stormwater runoff from nearby parking lots before it reaches King's Bay. The USFWS also will manage the wetlands system, once the district constructs it.

Who paid for the property?

A whole host of government agencies, private environmental trusts and citizens combined to raise the \$10.5 million that eventually became the final purchase price.

Does the purchase involve more than just the property?

Yes. Flowers had a state permit to bottle spring water for sale, though he never followed through on plans for a water-bottling plant. The USFWS bought those water-bottling rights from Flowers, even though the federal government will not be bottling spring water.

Storms bring rain, damage to county

Thunderstorms rolled through the county late Wednesday afternoon.

According to BayNews 9 meteorologist Josh Linker, the afternoon showers are part of Florida's typical summertime weather pattern and places like Homosassa received at least an inch of rain.

While Linker stated the thunderstorms weren't severe. Mary Marler said at her home on Scarborough Avenue in Lecanto, two large trees fell in her yard. One damaged her fence, she added.

Foundation members say trustees need to fork over \$1.2 million, or else

Lacking the transfer of \$1.2 million from leftover funding and another sum for charity care reimbursement, the board that operates Citrus Memorial Health System decided Monday to maintain its notice of default on its board of trustees, rather than withdraw it. But it still would like to talk to the other side, and has yet to file the lawsuit.

"I recommend we do not withdraw the default notice," said Clark Stillwell, general counsel to the Citrus Memorial Health Foundation Board of Directors.

James Kennedy, an attorney with the law firm Buchanan Ingersoll & Rooney, said the lawsuit paperwork had been prepared.

attempt to prove the Citrus County Hospital Board of Trustees failed to serve the terms of its lease to provide funding from taxes. Specifically, the foundation has maintained that trustees owe it \$1.2 million from the 2009 financial year and reimbursement for indigent care expenses.

Since December, foundation directors have requested the sum of \$1.2 million that trustees have set aside in a restricted fund for capital expenses. According to Harry Kilgore, the trustees' finance director, only the trustees can decide what to do with the fund.

At the April meeting of the trustees, Deborah Osmond Frankel, secretary of the board of trustees, explained where the \$1.2 million came from. It had been itemized in the 2009 budget as a matching fund The foundation's lawsuit would for getting the hospital into the Low iron out the issues about funding \$1.2 million off the table to focus the indigent care policy.

Later last year, trustees learned the matching fund was not needed. Then, on Sept. 21, the trustees passed a resolution to carry the \$1.2 million forward on their budget because it reflected a project that had not been completed during 2009.

In May, the trustees held a budget hearing to allocate the \$1.2 million to the foundation, but have not released it. The trustees have asked foundation directors for documents to support their claim of reimbursement of \$1.2 million.

Stillwell laid out four recommendations to foundation directhat the notice of default not be withdrawn, he also recommended

Trustees passed a new indigent care policy at their July 6 meeting. The new policy reduces eligibility for treatment from an income level of up to 400 percent of the federal poverty level to between 100 percent and 150 percent. The two boards were to discuss the policy July 14, but trustees stayed away from the meeting, partly because the foundation had filed the notice of default and partly because of an issue about the public notice for the meeting.

Stillwell also recommended that the foundation should try to document its expenditures to claim reimbursement of the \$1.2 million. He also asked the foundation directors to authorize their chairman, David Langer, to authorize their attorneys to proceed with the tors. In addition to recommending litigation if it were necessary to do so before the next board meeting.

"I'm not optimistic this will

work," Langer said. "How can you play ball with people who keep changing the rules inside the game?'

Sandra Chadwick, foundation director, said the foundation did not have the current agreement for reimbursement for capital expenditure in 2009.

"They'll say they already paid it," Chadwick said.

Stillwell urged foundation members to produce receipts and take the issue off the table. He said it would narrow the scope of the matter at hand.

Ryan Beaty, CMHS chief executive officer, said the hospital could show that it had spent \$1.2 million on capital improvements in 2009.

Boil-water notice in **Sugarmill Woods**

Due to a leak in the main line on Black Willow Court South in Sugarmill Woods, a precautionary boil-water notice is being issued due to the loss of pressure in the distribution system. Because of the loss of pressure in the system, the bacteriological quality of the water is now questionable.

The Citrus County Utilities is recommending that all water used for consumption and cooking purposes should be roll boiled until further no-

Utilities will be flushing the affected lines and will collect two consecutive days of bacteriological samples as soon as all flushing and disinfecting is completed. This is a precautionary measure to ensure that the water meets all safe drinking water standards.

This notice will remain in effect until satisfactory bacteriological samples are received.

At that time, your door will be tagged with a rescinding notice.

Also, the precautionary boil-water notice issued on July 24 in the area of Sugarmill Woods, servicing homes located at 76 through 98 Woodfield Circle, is now rescinded.

Jim Taft: He was 'the human Energizer bunny'

When Jim Taft said he was going to do something, no matter how far-fetched his idea sounded to his family and friends, by golly, he

Or at least he gave it his best.

During his lifetime, Taft was a politician, father of five, a cattle rancher, real estate broker, general contractor, business owner, auctioneer and heart transplant recipient.

Just before he died on June 27, Taft bought himself an antique sailboat and started to refurbish it. He was going to sail around the world.

James Paul Taft, of Crystal River, was 75.

"I envied his energy," said Curtis Rich, former Crystal River mayor. "He was one of the most energetic real estate developers I've ever met. When I knew him, he was always involved in the community. He loved politics and he liked helping people get elected. "He knew how to talk to rat."

Born in Manchester, Conn., Taft came to Pinellas County in 1943 with his brother, mother and William. He and his late

wife, Bonnie, moved to Citrus County in 1978. Inn Towne Café on Citrus and walked across Florida.

Commissioners approve budget

County commissioners gave unanimous approval Wednesday to a 2010-11 budget that cuts spending by 11.2 percent and holds the tax rate as is.

Commissioners set the tentative tax rate at 6.4967 mills about \$649 in county tax on a home with a taxable value of \$100,000.

Highlighting the budget cuts were the layoffs of 13 employees, including two planners and an assistant county attorney. The budget also reduces money set aside to match grants for waterquality projects.

The budget cuts were necessitated in a drop in countywide property values. Much of the county budget comes from property tax revenue.

Final public hearings on the \$214 million budget will occur in September. The fiscal year begins Oct. 1.

Shuttle contractor letting workers go

CAPE CANAVERAL — The private contractor that handles the bulk of the work servicing NASA's space shuttle fleet is notifying 1,400 employees in Florida, Texas and Alabama that they will be laid off in the fall.

United Space Alliance this week began telling workers, including 900 employees at the Kennedy Space Center, that they are expected to be let go by Oct. 1 as part of planned reductions from the end of the space shuttle program.


Laid off workers will receive between four and 26 weeks of pay, depending on their years of service.

The shuttle program now employs about 8,700 contractors, down from 12,000 employees in October 2008. It also employs another 1,200 civil servants, who are expected to be assigned to new programs after the shuttle.



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

Cheating raises questions about FBI

WASHINGTON — FBI Director Robert Mueller told Congress on Wednesday that he does not know how many of his agents cheated on an important exam on the bureau's policies, an embarrassing revelation that raises questions about whether the FBI knows its own rules for conducting surveillance on Americans.

The Justice Department inspector general is investigating whether hundreds of agents cheated on the test. Some took the open-book test together, violating rules that they take it alone. Others finished the lengthy exam unusually quickly, current and former of-

The test was supposed to ensure that FBI agents understand new rules allowing them to conduct surveillance and open files on Americans without evidence of criminal wrongdoing. If agents can't pass that test without cheat-

Asked about an Associated Press report about the cheating investigation, Mueller said he does not know how widespread the problem was.

"And I am not certain the IG knows how many either," Mueller said. "He has pointed out instances orally to me where there may be persons in a particular office where it was widespread and may be attributable to a lack of understanding and confusion about the procedures. Samuel Kunz, 88, had long been ignored by the German justice system, partly because of a lack of interest in going after relatively minor Nazi figures. But in the past 10 years, a younger generation of prosecutors has sought to bring all surviving suspects to justice.

Authorities recently stumbled over Kunz's case as they were studying old documents from German postwar trials about an SS camp named Trawniki. The papers were

Kunz was named the No. 3 suspect in April by the Simon Wiesenthal Center. He ranked fairly low in the Nazi hierarchy, but he was among the most-wanted suspects because of the large number of Jews he is accused of helping to kill.

Kunz had been living quietly at his home near the western city of Bonn. He received a letter last week saying he had been charged with three different cases of participating in the murder of Jews, authorities said.

He allegedly served as a guard at the Belzec camp in occupied Poland from January 1942 to July 1943.

Stocks take tumble on gloomy Fed report

NEW YORK — Investors cashed in some of their recent gains Wednesday after the Federal Reserve gave them more confirmation that the economic recovery is slowing.

The Dow Jones industrial average fell almost 40 points after the Fed released its regional survey of the economy, a report known as the "beige book." The Fed said economic growth has been steady during the summer in Cleveland and Kansas City, but has slowed in Atlanta and Chicago. The central bank described economic activity where as modest.

The arsonist still has matches

f a house is burned to the ground, you can whine about the firemen or criticize the building material — but first you blame the guy who started the fire, right?

Last week, a government worker named Shirley Sherrod was axed after a video clip of her speaking to the NAACP was used to paint her as racist. In the blink of an eye, her reputation was burned down.

But once the whole speech was $revealed -- proving \ the \ clip \ was$ way out of context — her bosses were booed, the NAACP was blasted, even President Obama was chided.

And the guy who started the fire? As of today, he still has matches. Andrew Breitbart is the conservative blogger who posted the edited video of Sherrod. He put it on one of his five websites. Breitbart, a former Matt Drudge groupie, one-time E! Entertainment employee, and a guy who called Ted Kennedy, hours after his death, "a special pile of human excrement," hoisted that clip as evidence of reverse racism by the NAACP. He claimed the audience applauded such sentiments. The video showed no such thing.

But Breitbart lit the fire. He blew on the flames.

Breitbart is where this sad story begins, where the blame lies and where the punishment should be doled out — if there were any you could dole out.

Sadly, how do you punish a blogger like Breitbart? He simply slithers back into the muck that some confuse with journalism. Who does he have to answer to?

Nobody.

Not the whole truth.

There are several things wrong with that statement. First, I doubt he counts that much.

Second, his journalism? It's not journalism if you only look for one point of view, post other people's stuff and don't even acknowledge how using chopped-up material to paint a full picture is wrong.

"Let me think about that," was what Breitbart said when asked if he might have vetted the Sherrod footage more carefully if given another chance.

Let me think about that?

Some people have called this incident a referendum on racism. I don't think so. It was a referendum on editing. A referendum on Internet blogging. A referendum on our blazing desire for explosive moments — even out of context — and our creeping slowness to see the full picture.

Anyone who watches the whole tape of Sherrod's speech sees an honest woman who tells of an incident with a white farmer 24 years ago that made her question her own prejudices. She goes on to say such things as:

"Working with him made me see that it's really about those who have vs. those who don't ... and they could be black; they could be white; they could be Hispanic...

"God helped me see that it's not just about black people ... I've come to realize that we have to work together ... we have to overcome the divisions that we have"

Yet, even after all that, Breitbart's website contains pieces "I am," Breitbart boasted to the like "If Anyone Needs To Apolo-

gize, It's Shirley Sherrod." Breitbart actually said the following of Sherrod: "This person has not gotten past black vs. white.'

Sounds like he can't get past something himself.

What standards?

And that, of course, is hate. Hate makes the political world spin, particularly the blog world. The shrieking Ann Coulter, who can't possibly be taken seriously, actually claimed Breitbart was a 'victim" of whoever set him up with this video. Sorry, but you can't fan your fame with "blockbuster" revelations, then blame others if they turn up bogus. It's like knocking over souvenirs in a curio shop; you break it, you bought it.

Breitbart broke it, he bought it, but instead of taking responsibility for it, he spins and points to anyone else, the liberals, Obama, the NAACP, even Sherrod herself, a woman who was nothing more than a pawn.

"I believe that I'm held to a higher standard," Breitbart actually told Politico. "If this video showed a picture of a Caucasian talking in the exact same way but talking about a black person with an audience affirming and clapping that behavior, the reporter would be getting a Pulitzer Prize right now.

Response: 1) No, he wouldn't. Showing an edited video is not "reporting." 3) You, Breitbart, are not held to any standard.

And that's the problem.

For veterans bill, Republican reps put aside budget ax

Republicans who have spent months demanding spending cuts blanched Wednesday at their first opportunity to actually make them, instead joining Democrats in treating a bill to pay for veterans programs in 2011 as politically sacrosanct in an election year.

The veterans measure is the first of a dozen spending bills for the upcoming 2011 budget year to come up for a vote. Democrats, meanwhile, were doing some Congress each year — has Boehner said. ducking and weaving of their own to avoid time-consuming floor debates and politically difficult votes on other measures.

It's of little surprise that Democrats picked the Veterans Affairs bill as the first in the appropriations pile to bring to a vote. It passed by a 411-6 vote.

Only a handful of others are likely to get as far before the November election, even though all 12 are supposed to pass both the House and Senate and be signed by the president before Oct. 1. Last year at this time, the House had passed all 12 bills.

House Minority Leader John Boehner, R-Ohio, offered the only amendments to cut the veterans bill but withdrew them as soon as Democrats started making political hay out of them.

Boehner wanted to cut the Veterans Affairs Department's rapidly growing policy office as well as its congressional lobbying operation and skim \$45 million from the VA's \$3.3 billion request for computer systems, which the agency itself admits was too high.

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

Congress narrows cocaine prison gap

WASHINGTON — Congress on Wednesday changed a quarter-century-old law that has subjected tens of thousands of blacks to long prison terms for crack cocaine convictions while giving far more lenient treatment to those, mainly whites, caught with the powder form of the

The House, by voice vote, approved a bill reducing the disparities between mandatory crack and powder cocaine sentences, sending the measure to President Barack Obama for his signature. The Senate passed the bill in March.

The measure changes a 1986 law, under which a person convicted of crack cocaine possession gets the same mandatory prison term as someone with 100 times the same amount of powder cocaine.

The bill also eliminates the five-year mandatory minimum for first-time possession of crack, the first time since the Nixon administration that Congress has repealed a mandatory minimum sentence. It would not apply retroactively.

152 die in Pakistan jet crash

ISLAMABAD — A passenger jet that officials suspect veered off course in monsoon rains and thick clouds crashed into hills overlooking Pakistan's capital Wednesday, killing all 152 people on board and scattering body parts and twisted metal far and wide.

The Airblue jet's crash was the deadliest ever in Pakistan, and just the latest tragedy to jolt a country that has suffered numerous deaths in recent years due to al-Qaida and Taliban attacks. At least two U.S. citizens were on the plane, which carried mostly Pakistanis.

The plane left the southern city of Karachi at 7:45 a.m. for a two-hour flight to Islamabad and was trying to land when it lost contact with the control tower, said Pervez George, a civil aviation official. Airblue is a private airline based in Karachi, Pakistan's largest

Judge blocks parts of controversial law hours before it was to go into effect

PHOENIX — A federal judge dealt a serious rebuke to Arizona's toughest-in-the-nation immigration law on Wednesday when she put most of the crackdown on hold just hours before it was to take effect.

The ruling by U.S. District Judge Susan Bolton shifts the immigration debate to the courts and sets up a lengthy legal battle that may not be decided until the Supreme Court weighs in. Republican Gov. Jan Brewer said the state will likely appeal the ruling and seek to get the judge's order overturned.

The judge also delayed parts of the law that required immigrants to carry their papers at all times, and made it illegal for undocumented workers to solicit employment in public places — a move aimed at day laborers. Life forever changed

GRAND ISLE, La. — A hundred days ago, shop owner Cherie Pete was getting ready for a busy summer serving ice cream and po-boys to hungry fishermen. Local official Billy Nungesser was planning his wedding. Environmental activist Enid Sisskin was preparing a speech about the dangers of offshore drilling.

Then the oil rig Deepwater Horizon exploded off the coast of Louisiana, and life along the Gulf Coast changed for good.

The 100 days since the April 20 explosion have been a gut-wrenching time for folks who work, play and live along the Gulf Coast. The Gulf is a sanctuary for some, an employer for others, and now, a tragedy.

Here are some of their stories. The seafood broker

A hundred days ago, Darlene Kimball was getting ready for a busy summer at her family's docks in Pass Christian, Miss., waiting for the buyers who would snap up hundreds of pounds of shrimp from the backs of boats, loading them into ice chests and hauling them back to giant freezers.

Now the place is empty, and the only boats she sees are the ones used by BP contractors cleaning up the spill.

Kimball's family has been in the Mississippi seafood industry since 1930, and she's never wanted to do anything else. But recently the 43year-old had to do the unthinkable draft a resume so she could look for another line of work.

"Everything's different," she said. "My life has gone from fastpaced to nothing.'

Most of all, maybe, she misses the sound of the seagulls circling the boats long before they come into town.

"There's nothing around me," she said. "My culture is gone, my livelihood is gone.'

A hundred days ago, Florida environmental activist Enid Sisskin was scanning through oil spill data from the Minerals Management Service, preparing a speech on the dangers of offshore drilling.

Sleep suffers with athletes needing to combine training with study and/or work. Late nights and poor quality sleep in association with early mornings hurt

training and competition quality. Many athletes accumulate hours of sleep debt every night. This lack of sleep can result in negative effects on mood, cognitive function, and reaction time. Cognitive function is the mental process of acquiring knowledge, understanding it and appropriately acting on it.


As the captain of the baseapartment in Tampa with ball team at Lecanto, Choto batted .364 with five home

ologists call "hostile environments," which can be anything from hard bottom with no grass to muddy bottom, anything that will prevent scallops from migrating beyond a certain point. These populations exchange embryonic scallops and juveniles,

called "spats," and also establish new populations as the tides and currents disperse fertilized eggs and young in various stages of development.

A relatively new macro population, say one only nine or ten months old, will have many scallops within its boundaries, but, because they're so young, many will be small. As the population ages, the scallops get larger, but many are also lost to predation by starfish, and so on. The rebut will have lost many of predators human harvesters.

That population will continue to expand due to an influx of spats and other immature forms of the bivalves, and as the larger ones die off or are taken by predators, the population will once again be dominated by smaller scallops. What this all amounts to is if you're finding all the scallops you want, and don't care that they're small, stay where you are; but if you want larger ones, you'll be better off to do a bit of scouting. Of course, there's such a thing as too small, especially since the adductor muscle is the only edible part of a scallop, so if all you're going to get is a snippet of meat, leave that population to continue maturing, and make a note for next year, when they'll have grown considerably.



Red Sox 7, Angels 3

ANAHEIM, Calif. — Marco Scutaro hit a tiebreaking grand slam in the eighth inning, and the Boston Red Sox wrapped up a 10-game West Coast road trip with a 7-3 victory over the slumping Los Angeles Angels on Wednesday, sweeping the three-game series.

Kevin Youkilis tied it with a seventhinning homer, while Adrian Beltre and Bill Hall hit early inning solo shots as the Red Sox improved to 7-0 this season against the club that sent them home from last season's playoffs.

Josh Beckett (2-1) yielded five hits over seven innings in his first victory since April 10 for Boston. Angels starter Joel Pineiro strained

a muscle in his left side moments before the first pitch, sidelining him with an injury that will keep him out for six to eight weeks. The Angels were swept at home for

the first time in 80 series, ending the majors' longest streak since Atlanta went 84 home series without being swept from 2003-06. Los Angeles hadn't been swept in Angel Stadium since June 2007 against Kansas City. With their seventh loss in eight

games, the Angels are plummeting out of the race for their sixth AL West title in seven seasons — and Pineiro's long-term absence won't help.

Pineiro strained an oblique muscle while warming up in the bullpen, and immediately had an MRI exam that indicated he'll be out for well over a month. The right-hander has been a dependable starter in his first season with Los Angeles, going 10-7 with a 4.18 ERA.

With a day off Thursday, Los Angeles used five relievers in Pineiro's

first start in nearly seven years. The strategy worked until Fernando Rodney (4-1) struggled in the eighth, and the Red Sox made another late rally. Boston scored 13 of its 17 runs in the series after the sixth inning, including all four in Tuesday's 4-2 victory.



able to acquire skill sets in training and be able to understand and use them. This 'cognitive' function is severely affected by inadequate sleep.

The negative effects of inadequate sleep can be eliminated totally if athletes make sleep a priority. This may be more correct if they increase sleep to more than the usually recommended 8-10 hours per night. In reality, it's not easy to do for any of us.

In an often quoted and overused study at Stanford dealing with athletes and sleep, it is noted that athletes who get an extra amount of sleep are more likely to improve their performance in a

The loss of sleep impacts people because of the effect on our body and brain while doing sports whether training, competing, playing the club golf or tennis tournament or getting ready for the state meet

Loss of sleep hours reduces the performance of the front of the brain, the region responsible for the most important mental functions in sport including focus or concentration, decision-making and processing information. There is not one sport or activity that does not include concentration and focus.

The loss of quality of sleep, that is to say the very deep sleep, known as rapid eye movement or REM sleep, effects the organization of activities, tasks and skills learned that day. REM or deep sleep is vital for motor learning and acquiring skills.

Lastly, the proper number of hours of sleep promotes the stimulation of growth hormone, which is the natural way of stimulating cell growth. Growth hormone increases muscle mass and thus strength. Growth hormone is vital in regenerating and repairing tissue damaged in training

In addition, growth hormone stimulates the immune system. Ever wonder why you get sick on those occasions when you are burning the

candle at both ends, working out more and not getting enough sleep. Your growth hormone production is decreased.

Lack of sleep elevates cortisol, a stress hormone that interferes with tissue repair and growth needed following a workout.

The lack of sufficient sleep does not give your body the ability to repair itself after training nor your mind the needed and proper concentration and focus. You get sick easier.

This all leads to a gloomy outlook, less enthusiasm for your sport as well as being an irritable and grouchy person.

There are encyclopedic treatises on how to go to sleep or get the best sleep. The key is to find a routine that works

The bible of sleeping, rule one is don't exercise before bedtime.

Go to bed at about the same time. Have a personal quiet time and minimize stress. That means turn off the computer, TV and don't read emails, text messages, etc. There is not much that can't be handled in the morning.

If a hot cup of coffee calms you down great. I personally can drink coffee at night. I find big-ish meals near bed time prevent me from getting that deep REM sleep.

Even for those of you not training, it is most important to maintain your own individual sleep requirement and not accumulate a large sleep debt.

Current articles note as we get older our required sleep is about six hours per night. That is great if you want to have fuzzy thinking, be in a poor mood, and have an even slower reaction time than what aging provides.

Getting enough sleep or even 30 minutes more per night will most likely result in better performance, a healthier outlook and an improved state of alertness.

Get some sleep, be bug eyed and bushy tailed for vour spouse, friends and colleagues. Most importantly you may win your next big competition.

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

Condoleezza Rice teams up at Philly concert with Queen of Soul

PHILADELPHIA — Condoleezza Rice is no stranger to the whims of royalty. So when the Queen of Soul herself, Aretha Franklin, decided the two should get together to play a song or two for charity, it was decreed.

The former U.S. secretary of state and Franklin took the stage Tuesday evening at Philadelphia's Mann Music Center in a rare duet for Rice, the classically trained pianist, and Franklin, the divalicious voice of a generation. Their aim was to raise money for urban children and awareness for music and the arts.

"It is a joint effort for the inner-city youth of Philadelphia and Detroit,' Franklin told The Associated Press the night before their concert with the Philadelphia Orchestra.

"We decided to give it a try," Franklin said. "So here we are, in the city of Brotherly — and Sisterly Love."

Their appearance in the three-hour concert before an estimated crowd of 8,000 overflowed with Franklin's catalog of hits and arias from the world of opera and classical music.

Rice, better known as a diplomat and national security adviser, played piano while Franklin sang her hit "I Say A Little Prayer," as well as "My

Country 'Tis of Thee." Earlier in the tion, Rice recalled. "We were just talkprogram, Rice performed a selection from Mozart's Piano Concerto No. 20 in D Minor with the orchestra, a piece she said she practiced furiously.

Franklin even tickled the ivories a few times Tuesday night, including for a song off her new album "A Woman Falling Out of Love," to be released later this year. She also sang a duet — "The Way We Were" — with surprise guest Ronald Isley.

Rice's given name is derived from the Italian opera stage instruction con dolcezza, meaning "with sweetness." Long a musician of note, she played from elementary school through college and beyond, in quartets and performing chamber music.

She has even played with cellist Yo-Yo Ma. But, she said this was "the first time I've played with an orchestra since I was 18."

When she learned that Rice played classical music, Franklin sent for one of her recordings "to hear what she sounded like.'

Previously, she said, "All I had seen of Dr. Rice was in a political atmosphere. It just seemed foreign that she would be a classical pianist."

Franklin was surprised. "She really does play," Franklin

said. "She's formidable."

The two met at a White House func-

ing and chatting and she said 'You play, don't you?' And I said, 'Yes.' And she said we should do something together.

Rice told the AP their plan to play together was born of their mutual appreciation for music and determination to keep it near and accessible to children.

Franklin, relaxing in her hotel suite and holding a single long-stemmed peach-hued rose, deplored school budget cuts of music and arts programs as "a travesty" that cannot be al-

"Imagine what all of this would be without music. If you have to cut, cut something else. Not the music. We need the music. It soothes the savage beast. We need the music.'

Rice, in a separate interview,

"Nothing makes me more unhappy than when I hear people talk about music education in the schools as extracurricular," Rice said.

Both women lauded each other's talents, and abilities, but Rice made it clear she'll leave the singing to Franklin.

"You do not want to hear me sing!" Rice said. "I'm a good choir musician, but I think I will stick to playing the piano."

Lighter meals, frosty drinks perfect for summer

Today's Flair for Food offers perfect, tasty pick-me-ups for folks languishing through the dog days of summer trying to catch a

There is really no limit to the variety of beverages one can concoct, both alcoholic and non-alcoholic, made with fruits and berries, coffees and teas and various flavors from chocolate to exotic guavas and mangoes.

National Tequila Day was July 24, and what some surveys say is the fastest-growing liquor on the market is a perfect base for the ever-popular Margaritas that help you hang on.

From south of the border also comes the Horchata, a non-alcoholic cooling drink made with rice and blueberries, and the Michelada, a combination of beer and tomato or Clamato juice, usually a dash of Tabasco sauce, and fresh lime juice. Be sure to salt the rim of the glass. You can also make a Michelada with non-alcoholic beer if you wish to forgo spirits.

The clamor for Micheladas in this country by the Hispanic population, according to Wikipedia.com, inspired the Miller Brewing Co. to produce Miller Chill, a "Chelada-style light lager with a hint of salt and lime." An-

heuser-Busch is manufacturing Budweiser Chelada and Bud Light Chelada as a combination of lager, clamato, lime juice, and salt.

Conjuring up icy blends to beat the heat is a great way to make good use of the bounty of fresh fruits. Indeed, July is Berry Month, signaling the availability of blueberries, raspberries and blackberries.

Variations on salads are almost infinite and also a fine way to use the summer harvest of vegetables such as squash, tomatoes, cucumbers, peppers, broccoli and scallions. Today's Florida-style Vegetable Nachos are a good example of a main dish salad and a boon for calorie counters, too.

Another main dish possibility is today's Confetti Salad, with its tangy dressing and papaya mixed with greens, avocado, corn and black beans.

The heat is here to stay for a while, but you can outsmart it with the following recipes compiled by the Florida Department of Consumer Services:

BLUEBERRY HORCHATA

- 1 cup fresh blueberries
- 1 cup uncooked rice
- 1/2 stick cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon lime zest
- 5 cups water
- 1/2 cup sugar

Grind the rice in a blender until it is ground smooth. Toss with cinnamon stick and lime zest. Let rest overnight. After resting, place rice mixture into blender with blueberries and blend until smooth.

Add in 2 cups of water to mixture and soak for 2 hours. Strain the liquid through a fine sieve or cheesecloth a few times to remove any residues. Add in the remaining 3 cups of the water and stir in sugar until dissolved. Garnish with a mint sprig. Makes 2 to 4 servings.

FLORIDA-STYLE VEGETABLE NACHOS

- 2 cups low-fat refried beans
- 1 cup broccoli florets, chopped small
- 1 cup radishes, chopped small ■ 1 cup squash, chopped small
- 2 cups shredded pepper jack cheese
- 1/4 cup fresh scallions, chopped small
- 1/4 cup fresh cilantro, finely chopped Low-fat sour cream, guacamole and fresh salad for garnish

Tortilla chips

Spread refried beans at the bottom of a baking dish and sprinkle chopped broccoli, radishes and squash on top. Bake in the oven at 300 degrees for 7 minutes. Remove baking dish from the oven and add cheese and tortilla chips on top and bake in the oven for 3 minutes more.

After removing the baking dish from the oven, sprinkle nachos with scallions and cilantro. Add low-fat sour cream, fresh salsa and guacamole on the side. Serve immediately. Makes 2 to 4 servings.

For example, as of July 25: "Welcome to the Florida Seafood Hotline for Sunday, July 25. This report is updated every day at 2 p.m. or as conditions warrant.

"A portion of coastal state waters offshore of Escambia County are closed to fishing at this time. The closure includes state waters from the beaches out nine miles into the Gulf from the Alabama line east to the Pensacola Beach water tower. Interior bays and estuaries remain open to fishing. This area covers approximately 23 miles of Florida's coastline in Escambia County, where oil from the Deepwater Horizon spill is now present."

The advisory further notes that 98 percent of all state waters are still open for fishing.

"Grouper, flounder, mullet, blue crabs and clams are all in steady supply and prices are normal. Yellowtail snapper is in steady supply and prices are low. Shrimp are in steady supply and prices are up slightly. Oysters are in light supply and prices are up slightly.'

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Celebrity chef spends lifetime crafting burger

Editor's note: Celebrate the delicious diversity of the great American hamburger. Each week for 20 weeks the AP will feature a new burger created by the biggest names in the food world.

Crafting the perfect burger has been a lifetime project for longtime celebrity chef Martin Yan.

"I am so passionate about this homemade burger recipe that I have spent my entire life trying to perfect it — and I am still working on it!" he said in an e-mail. "I'm using chopped fresh vegetables and herbs and incorporating Asian seasonings/spices, trying to find the right combination/proportion of ingredients to bring the flavor to a new level."

And not surprisingly, the man who has spent more than 30 years introducing home cooks to Asian flavors draws inspiration from that palette.

"The addition of some chopped shiitake mushrooms (soaked, softened and coarsely chopped) and chestnuts (coarsely chopped), will give the burger some extra texture," he wrote in an e-mail. "I would also add some chopped garlic, ginger, and cilantro for extra flavor.'

Yan, whose numerous television series credits date to 1978 and include "Yan Can Cook," says he first created this recipe several years ago for a party.

Trained for disaster

USCGA member participates in cleanup

It is not hard to notice Bob Beck when he is participating in a local event. He is the big (6 feet, 5 inches) guy wearing a Coast Guard Auxiliary uniform giving out information on boating safety.

He is usually seen with his trailer, which has been equipped as a Marine Safety Unit and contains displays of information on safe boating. The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary places the Marine Safety Unit at events to familiarize the general public with the local presence of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, to recruit new member to the auxiliary and to promote boating safety.

The auxiliary supplements the Coast Guard in performing its mission by having a trained cadre of skilled volunteers who are willing to devote

their time to learning the steps to help in boating safety. Auxiliary members receive training and develop skills that can be used in real situations. Each skill is added to the Coast Guard Auxiliary members' capability to supplement the Coast Guard in performing its

The Coast Guard Auxiliary became involved in the Gulf Oil disaster in late June when a call was issued for pollution investigators. One of the skill sets Beck has is as an "assistant pollution investigator." Beck volunteered to participate in an overflight program. It soon became clear this was no normal

After intense training received from National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) experts, Beck and the other Coast Guard Auxiliary member trainees boarded a Coast Guard C-130 for an orientation flight at 447-1180.

across the Gulf of Mexico, over the Gulf oil spill site. During the flight, each trainee was given the opportunity to observe and record the surface conditions for analysis. After training, the trainees were assigned to either the C-130 Hercules aircraft, or a HH-60 Jayhawk helicopter.

Beck is a member of Flotilla 15-02 in Yankeetown. When he is ordered to go on assignment, he boards the HH-60 and takes the observer seat, from which he photographs and records on detailed maps all of the various surface anomalies observed such as oil spill sheen, seaweed, algae, jellyfish and sea foam. At the completion of the mission, Beck reports his sightings to the U.S. Coast Guard command stricture.

Yesterday, we looked at responder's negative double over a weak jump overcall to show length in an unbid major.

That works fine at the one-level and two-level, but, higher than that, the requirements for a negative double must be made more flexible.

Look at the North hand in the diagram. South opens one diamond, and West overcalls four spades. What should North do?

With 13 high-card points, he cannot pass. With only three-card support, he can hardly raise to five diamonds. And to play a double as purely for penalties is unrealistic. Yes, here careful defense defeats four spades doubled by three tricks; but that is only plus 500 against a vulnerable slam. 

After West leads the spade king,

how should South plan the play? Declarer has 12 top tricks: one spade, one heart, seven diamonds and three clubs. However, the bidding strongly suggests that West has eight spades. If so, East is void. To ensure those 12 tricks, South must play low from the dummy at trick one (and low again at trick two if

West leads another spade). Calling for the spade ace costs the contract because East ruffs, and declarer will have an unavoidable heart loser.
