#### **Grow house** busted near elementary school

Sheriff's officials busted a marijuana grow house Monday a half-mile south of Rock Crusher Elementary School

No arrests were made at the time, but authorities removed dozens of cannabis plants and growing equipment.

According to the Citrus County Sheriff's Office, around 6 p.m. Monday the agency's Tactical Impact Unit executed a search warrant at 1243 S. Rock Crusher Road in Homosassa.

The investigation had spanned several months, according to the sheriff's office.

Inside the home, detectives reportedly located two bedrooms and a garage that had been converted into grow rooms. Thirty large cannabis plants were seized, along with several pieces of equipment used to grow the plants.

The home was unoccupied at the time;

# **Bishop: School on 'life support'** Low enrollment, costly repairs could shutter institution

LECANTO — Bishop Robert Lynch didn't mince words.

'The school's been on life support for a long time," he said, "and I've been administering the IV."

He was referring to Pope John Paul II Catholic School, whose 30-year history in Citrus County

could end permanently when this school year comes to a close.

Parents and staff were told Friday the school was closing due to low enrollment and costly repairs needed at the school property on West Homosassa Trail.

During a meeting Tuesday night with parents, alumni and other supporters, Lynch said he would wait until April 15 to decide whether to shut the school for good. Lynch said he wants by then a plan to keep the school open without additional subsidization

DEP wants higher standards for King's Bay

King's Bay's spring system is but one of three recent additions to the list of the state Department of Environmental Protection's proposed water quality restoration goals for impaired bodies of water.

Officials at DEP announced Monday that the restoration goals, known as Total Maximum Daily Loads (TDLs), will identify pollutant reductions necessary to meet the water quality standards that protect human health and aquatic life.

According to DEP. King's Bay's restoration goals will focus on total nitrogen and total phosphorus levels, while the targets for the springs address nitrates and phosphate.

King's Bay water quality levels are considered impaired based on pollutants present. The two other springs added to DEP's list were Weeki Wachee and Volusia Blue.

According to DEP, "Water bodies that do not meet water quality standards are identified as 'impaired' for the particular pollutants of concern — nutrients, bacteria, mercury, etc. — and TMDLs must be developed, adopted and implemented for those pollutants to reduce pollutants and clean up the water body.

According to 2012 data from the Southwest Florida Water Management District, at King's Bay's Hunter Springs and Magnolia Springs, nitrate readings were 0.62 and 0.59 mg/l, respectively. The EPA (Environmental Protection Agency) nitrate

threshold is 0.35 mg/l.

Rainbow Springs has nutrient-load readings of 2.34 mg/l from the same 2012 data, but water clarity in the upper portion of Rainbow River (more than 200 feet) is much better than it is at King's Bay (less than 10 feet).

Chris Anastasiou, the head of the water district's springs restoration team, said even though high nutrient loads are often accompanied by major algal blooms, the water clarity disparity between the Rainbow River and King's Bay speaks to something else.

"It shows that the issue of restoration is very complex and there are several factors at play. In this case, it something to do with water residence time," Anastasiou said.

Pollutants and fresh spring waters can spend up to seven days in King's Bay

# Judges rules evidence can be released in theater shooting case

DADE CITY — All evidence can be made public in the case of a retired Tampa police captain who fatally shot a man in a movie theater after a dispute over texting, a judge ruled Wednesday.

Judge Pat Siracusa ruled during a hearing in Pasco County Court after the defense and prosecution said they had no objections. The next court hearing was set for July 9, and the trial isn't expected to begin for several months.

Curtis Reeves, 71, is charged with second-degree murder in the killing of Chad Oulson, who died in a Wesley Chapel movie theater on Jan. 13.

Reeves is being held without bail in the Pasco County Jail. His attorneys said that Reeves was acting in self-defense. Reeves told police



# Authorities claim men would shoplift items, return them for gift cards

Three men face multiple charges stemming from thefts and fraudulent returns.

On March 11, Dustin Crickmore, Steven Taylor and Joseph Petralia were all charged with misdemeanor retail petit theft and felony trafficking in stolen property. Taylor also faces felony retail theft, along with resisting arrest.

Petralia, 46, is from Homosassa, while Taylor, 19, and Crickmore, 30, are from North Carolina.

According to records, video surveillance shows Taylor entering mart for a \$149 gift card.

# Rosier revenue forecasts from state economists

#### TALLAHASSEE

Economists modestly upgraded the amount of tax revenue the state is expected to take in during the budget year that begins July 1, giving lawmakers extra breathing room as they move closer to considering a spending plan.

At a meeting Wednesday, forecasters boosted their projections by \$150 million over the next 16 months, with \$26 million of that increase coming before July 1. Under the latest estimates, the state is expected to take \$1.4 billion in the next the current year.

Sales taxes are growing modestly as consumer spending recovers, said Amy Baker, the Legislature's chief economist. At the same time, revenue forecasters shaved some money off expected rebounds in real estate-related taxes as interest rates begin to inch up and federal programs targeted at homeowners with "underwater" mortgages taper off.

"Pretty much everyone who was going to refinance has now refinanced," Baker said.

Because of extra money in carried forward from the current budget and the

state will face — like growth in school enrollment — lawmakers will likely have a surplus of somewhere around \$1.2 billion as they sit write their down to budgets.

Some of that money is already earmarked, however. Gov. Rick Scott and legislative leaders have pledged to reduce taxes by \$500 million during the election-year session.

In 1996, a gunman burst into an elementary school in Dunblane, Scotland, and opened fire, killing 16 children and one teacher before killing himself.







before being flushed toward the Gulf, said Anastasiou.

Rainbow River. Anastasiou said, the water moves at a much faster pace, flushing the nutrients within hours.

According to DEP, the primary nitrogen sources in the King's Bay system are wastewater sprayfields, septic tanks and stormwater runoff, including fertilizers from home gardens, lawns, golf courses and agricultural operations.

The agency recently gave more than \$1.1 million to help fund a reclaimed water project to capture wastewater effluent previously used at a sprayfield and send it to the Duke Energy Power Generation Complex. The project is expected to reduce the plant's water consumption by nearly 1 million gallons per day and also to reduce wastewater nutrient loading to the springshed by approximately 16 percent.

Both Houses of the state Legislature have pushed water initiatives this session, and Inverness Sen. Charlie Dean — himself sponsoring a springs protection bill, SB 1576 — was quick to praise the DEP.

# Low-wage jobs an unexpected way of life for many

#### Associated Press

WASHINGTON - For years, many Americans followed a simple career path: Land an entry-level job. Accept a modest wage. Gain skills. Leave eventually for a better-paying job.

The workers benefited, and so did lower-wage retailers such as Walmart: When its staffers left for better-paying jobs, they could spend more at its stores. And the U.S. economy gained, too, because more consumer spending fueled growth.

Not so much anymore. Since the Great Recession began in late 2007, that path has narrowed because many of the next-tier jobs no longer exist. That means more lower-wage workers have to stay put. The resulting bottleneck is helping widen a gap between the richest Americans and everyone else.

'Some people took those jobs because they were the only ones available and haven't been able to figure out how to move out of that," Bill Simon, CEO of Walmart U.S., acknowledged in an interview with The Associated Press.

If Walmart employees "can go to another company and another job and make more money and develop, they'll be better," Simon explained. "It'll be better for the economy. It'll be better for us as a business, to be quite honest, because they'll continue to advance in their economic life."

Yet for now, the lowerwage jobs once seen as stepping stones are increasingly being held for longer periods by older, better-educated, more experienced workers.

The trend extends well beyond Walmart, the nation's largest employer, and is reverberating across the U.S. economy. It's partly why average inflation-adjusted income has declined 9 percent for the bottom 40 percent of households since 2007, even as incomes for the top 5 percent now slightly exceed where they were when the recession began late that year, according to

the Census Bureau. Research shows that occupations that once helped propose to his girlfriend. elevate people from the minimum wage into the middle class have disappeared during the past fields despite an economic three recessions dating to 1991 One such category includes bookkeepers and executive secretaries, with average wages of \$16.54 an hour, according to the Labor Department. Since the mid-1980s, the economy has shed these middleincome jobs. That leaves many workers remaining in jobs as cashiers earning an average of \$9.79 an hour, or in number of lower-wage retail sales at roughly 10.50 - jobs that used to be entry points to higherpaying work. Hourly pay at Walmart averages \$8.90, according to the site Glassdoor.com. (Walmart disputes that figure; it says its pay for hourly workers averages \$11.83.) Since the Great Recession began, the share of U.S. workers employed by

the retail and restaurant sector has risen from 16.5 percent to 17.1 percent. "It really has contributed to this widening of inequality," Siu said.

The shift has injected new pressures into the economy. Older and better-educated retail and fast food workers have become more vocal in pressing for raises. Labor unions helped launch protests last year against such employers as Walmart, McDonald's and Burger King.

Fewer teenagers are staffing cash registers, prepping meals or stocking shelves, according to government data. Replacing them are adults, many of whom are struggling with the burdens of college debt or child rearing

They are people like Richard Wilson, 27, in Chicago. More than 2 1/2years ago, a Walmart store manager spotted Wilson cleaning the cafeteria at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Va.

A double major in biblical studies and busicommunications, ness Wilson had \$3,000 in tuition due and had maxed out on student loans. He said the recruiter suggested that a management job could eventually be within reach for him because. "Walmart is where people's dreams become a reality.

Wilson first worked at a Walmart near college before returning to his Chicago hometown without a degree but with \$50,000 in student debt and another job at a boutique Walmart specializing in groceries.

Today, Wilson earns \$9.45 an hour at that Walmart and lives on the city's western edge with his grandmother. He boards a bus most mornings at 3:30 a.m. and arrives for his 5 a.m. shift in the more upscale neighborhood of Lakeview East. He has applied for promotions. So far, no success.

# **Fla. House passes tougher** sexual-predator bills

 ${\rm TALLAHASSEE-Sex-}$ ual predators will be locked up longer and more could be committed for psychiatric review once they finish their criminal sentences under a package of bills the Florida House passed Thursday.

Three of the bills now go to Gov. Rick Scott and a fourth returns to the Senate with minor changes. The Senate passed the measures last week on the first day of the legislative session.

"We are making the state a much safer place. We are making our children safer from these sexually violent predators," said Rep. Gayle Harrell, R-Port St. Lucie.

The wide-ranging legislative package attempts to close loopholes in the Jimmy Ryce Act, which allows for the psychiatric review, or civil commitment, of sexually violent offenders even after they finish

One of the bills also creates a 50-year mandatory minimum sentence for people who rape children under 12, senior citizens and the developmentally disabled. Offenders would not be eligible for a reduced sentence for good behavior. Now, the mandatory minimum sentence for the worst sexual offenders is 25 years.

'Nobody has ever raped a child while sitting in a state prison," said Rep. Matt Gaetz, R-Shalimar. All of the bills passed

Lawmakers in both chambers have said the inspiration for strengthening the laws came from the death of 8-year-old Cherish Perrywinkle last June and a South Florida Sun Sentinel investigation on sexual predators who were released only to commit more crimes.

Cherish was raped and strangled after she was abducted from a Jacksonville Walmart. Her body was found the next day. A repeat sexual offender, Donald Smith, is charged with murdering her. Smith had been reviewed twice before for civil commitment and allowed to remain free. He was released from jail the month before the killing, but wasn't eligible for another review.

#### Scott to back in-state tuition for some immigrants

TALLAHASSEE - Florida Gov. Rick Scott is backing a bill that would allow qualified Florida students to pay instate college tuition even if they are in the country illegally.

Scott said Wednesday he





# **Stocks finish higher** after sluggish start

A click of the wrist

A late rise saved the stock market from its third straight day of losses.

The push was enough to nudge the Standard & Poor's 500 index into the green by half a point Wednesday, as investors bought up oil refiners, mining companies and technology stocks. Refiners such as Tesoro Corp. led the gains.

Stocks were down for most of the day, but began to crawl back in the afternoon. The S&P 500 index added 0.57 points, or 0.03 percent, to close at 1.868.20. The Nasdaq composite also rebounded. It gained 16.14 points, or 0.4 percent, to 4,323.33. Only the Dow Jones industrial average ended lower. It fell 11.17 points, or 0.1 percent, to 16,340.08.

The three major U.S. stock indexes are still down for the week. Investors have been worried about a sharp drop in China's exports reported over the weekend, which raised concerns that the second-largest world's economy is slowing. Since China is a big consumer of raw materials and energy, commodities such as cop-

per and iron ore have 2.4 percent, to \$18.41 and dropped sharply.

Some strategist say investors are pausing after the market hit three record highs last week.

Among the big winners Wednesday was Tesoro. It rose the most of any stock in the S&P 500 index, climbing \$2.13, or 4.1 percent, to \$54.50. Marathon Petroleum Corp., added \$3.21, or 3.5 percent, to \$94.50, while Valero Energy Corp., gained \$1.62, or 3 percent, to \$55.29.

Investors also took a shine to mining companies as metals prices increased. Cliffs Natural Resources Inc. rose 43 cents, or

Newmont Mining Corp. rose 66 cents, or 2.7 percent, to \$25.01.

Tech giants Google, Microsoft and Facebook also contributed to the day's gains. Together they make up about 12 percent of the Nasdaq composite. Google rose \$7.31, or 0.6 percent, to \$1,207.30; Microsoft added 25 cents, or 0.7 percent, to \$38.27 and Facebook climbed 78 cents, or 1.1 percent, to \$70.88.

Six of the 10 industry sectors in the S&P 500 index notched small declines, with industrials posting the biggest drop. Utilities rose the most as investors moved money into the relatively low-risk sector.

Among the index's big decliners were insurer Progressive, which shed 94 cents, or 3.8 percent, to \$23.58

Most of the publicly traded homebuilding companies were trading lower after Credit Suisse issued a broad downgrade on the sector. In addition, new data from the Mortgage Bankers Association showed home loan applications fell 2.1 percent from a week earlier. Meritage Homes posted the biggest drop among the decliners, shedding 85 cents, or 2 percent, to \$44.21.







Herbalife said that it received the civil investigative demand from the FTC on Wednesday. A representative from the FTC was not immediately available to elaborate. The FTC's website says that these are used to investigate possible "unfair or deceptive acts or practices."

The company, which has faced accusations of operating a pyramid scheme, said that it welcomes the inquiry given "tremendous amount of misinformation in the marketplace" about its business.

Herbalife said it believes it is in compliance with all laws and regulations and plans to cooperate fully. The company, which is incorporated in the Cayman Islands and based in Los Angeles, uses a network of distributors to sell its nutritional supplements and weight-loss products globally.

The FTC inquiry comes just a day after hedge fund manager William Ackman renewed his attacks on the company.

Ackman has bet against the company and said repeatedly that he believes it operates as a pyramid scheme.

Its shares fell \$5.57, or 8.5 percent, to \$59.92 in mid-afternoon, but fell as low as \$54.59 earlier. Its shares had fallen almost 17 percent so far this year through Tuesday's close.

#### **Microsoft names head of** investor ValueAct to board

REDMOND, Wash. - Microsoft Corp. has appointed Mason Morfit, the president of activist investment firm ValueAct Capital, to its board of directors.

Morfit has pushed for Microsoft to focus on its enterprise software products and cloud computing business rather than its flagship Windows computer operating system, which is being hurt by the declining sale of PCs.

The appointment, announced late Tuesday, had been expected. Microsoft entered into a cooperation agreement with ValueAct in August following the firm's purchase last year of some 66.9 million shares, or about 0.8 percent of the total outstanding. That stock is currently worth about \$2.55 billion.

Microsoft's board now has 11 members, including former CEO Steve Ballmer, founder Bill Gates and new CEO Satya Nadella.

Morfit's financial background, experience as a public company director and his perspective as a shareholder give him "valuable insights," said Microsoft Chairman John Thompson in a statement Tuesday.

Microsoft shares rose 24 cents to \$38.26 in late afternoon trading Wednesday.

#### Idaho hockey fans suing arena over beer prices

BOISE, Idaho - A handful of Idaho hockey fans sued a Boise arena on Tuesday, saying they were duped into thinking a \$7 beer contains more brew than a \$4 beer.

The lawsuit said CenturyLink Arena, home of the Idaho Steelheads hockey team, defrauded customers by charging \$3 more for a tall, narrow cup advertised as a "large" that actually holds the same amount of beer as the shorter, wider cup described as a "small."

The lawsuit came just two days after another hockey fan posted a video on YouTube of what the fan said was a beer purchased at CenturyLink Arena on March 8. That video shows a patron holding a large cup of beer and pouring it into an empty small cup. In both cups, the beer reaches nearly to the brim.

CenturyLink officials announced a short time later that the company would purchase new cups for the large beers that would hold 24 ounces instead of the previous 20 ounces for a bigger difference in size.

#### **OxyContin maker to offer** abuse-resistant version

WASHINGTON — The maker of OxyContin said it has completed testing of an abuseresistant version of the painkiller hydrocodone, a surprise development that could derail sales of the recently launched Zohydro, a similar medication that has been criticized for lacking such safeguards.

Purdue Pharma said it plans to submit its extended-release hydrocodone drug to the Food and Drug Administration later this year. The company's tablets are designed to prevent users from crushing them for snorting or injection.

Shares of rival Zogenix Inc. plunged more than 20 percent after the announcement, which appears to jeopardize sales of the company's just-launched drug Zohydro. Physicians would presumably be more likely to prescribe a harder-to-abuse form of hydrocodone to try to protect their patients from addiction and abuse.

# GOP will live or die by economy

the economy is still bad, and that President Obama is doing a poor job handling it.

With unemployment at 6.6 percent, and only that low because millions of frustrated, jobless workers have left the labor force entirely, issues that consume media attention

should be forced to bake a cake for a gay couple - will inevitably fade in importance compared to the economy when voters go to the polls in November.

Apart from the month last fall when the Obamacare computer system Obama's crashed, job approval rating has never been

lower, according to a recent poll from the New York Times and CBS. Just 41 percent of those surveyed approve of the job the president is doing, while 51 percent disapprove.

On the question of Obama's handling of the economy, 38 percent approve, while 57 percent disapprove.

The president's party is hit hard, too. In the so-called generic ballot question — "If the election were held today, would you vote for the Republican or Democratic candidate as your representative?"-Republicans lead Democrats, 42 percent to 39 percent.

There's little doubt that economic conditions, coupled with the burdens imposed on millions of Americans by Obamacare, are behind the Democrats' troubles now, and most likely in November, too.

What is unclear is whether Democrats are fully aware of the peril. Of course, savvy candidates and strategists are, but

ost Americans think the new Times poll shows that, Chris Christie bridge scandal. as a whole, Democrats have a far more positive view of the economy than everyone else.

The pollsters asked respondents to rate national economic conditions as very good, fairly good, fairly bad or very bad.

Sixty percent of Democrats said economic conditions are fairly good or very good, while like whether a shop owner just 33 percent of independents

and 17 percent of Republicans said the same.

Note that in each group, most who said economic conditions are good chose the "fairly good" option; very few, even among Democrats, said "very good."

In addition, 72 percent of Democrats

approve of Obama's handling of the economy, compared to just 33 percent of independents and 8 percent of Republicans. (Obama's overall approval rating on the economy is 38 percent)

Numbers like that reflect a mindset among Democrats that could have a significant effect this November. If Democrats have talked themselves into believing the economy is better than it is, they are less likely to demand candidates who will concentrate relentlessly on the economy. And that will produce candidates who focus less, or at least less effectively, on the voting public's No. 1 concern.

Such a mindset could affect press coverage, too, in a world in which most reporters, opinion writers and editors at large media outlets are Democrats.

If many journalists see a better economy than most other Americans see, it's not surprising they might devote a disproportionate amount of coverage to, say, gay wedding cakes or the

Of course, it's possible most Democrats do, deep inside, believe the economy is still bad, and their poll answers reflect partisanship more than anything. That's a danger for Republicans, too, who could overstate the economy's problems.

But in the bigger picture, there is a huge opportunity for the GOP this November. Large majorities in the Times poll said both parties should do more to address the needs and concerns of the middle class. Seventy-six percent of independents said the GOP should do more, while 72 percent of the same independents said Democrats should do more.

The middle class is where the votes are, and the party that does the better job of addressing "middle-class squeeze" (a term House Majority Leader Eric Cantor has taken to using frequently) will win in November.

Some Republican officeholders and conservative thinkers are devoting a lot of time and energy to coming up with policy proposals for middle-class relief, and the GOP candidates who are most open to those ideas will have a big advantage in attracting votes outside the Republican base.

By keeping their focus on the economy and embracing new ideas to extend their appeal, Republicans can build on the advantages they have now, 10 months before Election Day, while Democrats and some of their allies in the press distract themselves with side issues.

The payoff for Republicans could be huge, not only this November but as they prepare for 2016, too.

# Satellite images could show lost plane

LUMPUR, KUALA Malaysia — Satellite images on a Chinese government website show suspected debris from the missing Malaysia Airlines jetliner floating off the southern tip of Vietnam, near the plane's original flight path, China's Xinhua News Agency reported Wednesday.

The revelation could provide searchers with a focus that has eluded them since the plane disappeared with 239 people aboard early Saturday.

The Xinhua report said the images from around 11 a.m. on Sunday appear to show "three suspected floating objects" of varying sizes, the largest about 79 feet by 72 feet.

The report includes coordinates of a location in ward India.

the sea off the southern tip of Vietnam and east of Malaysia. The images originally were posted on a national defense technology website.


No other governments have confirmed the Xinhua report, which did not say when Chinese officials became aware of the images and associated them with the missing plane.

With the passage of time since the satellite images were taken, it is far from certain that whatever they show would be in the same location now.

#### **Rare redwood** could be cut down for train

SAN FRANCISCO - It's a tree so rare that there are believed to be fewer than 10 of its kind in the world, and it could be chopped down to make way for commuter trains in Northern California

Preservationists are hoping to stoke public awareness and save the albino chimero coast redwood growing in the small Sonoma County town of Cotati.

Standing 52 feet tall, the tree features a unique mixture of normal green leaves and white, albino sections. It's believed to be the largest of its kind on the planet.

But Sonoma-Marin Area Rail Transit (SMART) officials said the decision to remove it is out of their hands. Federal regulators have determined the tree must come down for safety reasons.

"We have federal safety clearance requirements we must comply with," said Carolyn Glendening, a SMART spokeswoman.

### At least three dead in blast; authorities point to gas leak

NEW YORK — A gas leak triggered an earthshaking explosion that flattened two apartment buildings on Wednesday, killing at least three people, injuring more than 60 and leaving nine missing. A tenant said residents had complained repeatedly in reweeks about cent "unbearable" gas smells. By evening, rescue workers finally began the search for victims amid the broken bricks, splintered wood and mangled metal after firefighters spent most of flames. Heavy equipment, including back hoes and a bulldozer, ar-

#### **Gaza militants** fire large rocket barrage at Israel

JERUSALEM — Militants in the Gaza Strip fired dozens of rockets Wednesday into southern Israel, sending civilians rushing into bomb shelters but causing no casualties. The Israeli military said it was the largest rocket barrage since 2012, when it launched an eight-day air campaign in Gaza it said was aimed at stopping the attacks.

The Israeli military said its aircraft targeted terror sites in the Gaza Strip in retaliation late Wednesday.

Gaza health official Ashraf Al Kedra said nobody was hurt in the Israeli strikes that he said targeted training sites used by the Islamic Jihad and Hamas militant groups.

# Obama issues new overtime pay decree

WASHINGTON - Bypassing Congress, President Barack Obama intends to order changes in overtime rules so employers would be required to pay millions more workers for the extra time they put in on the job.

The rules, which would not likely take effect until 2015, are aimed at workers currently designated as supervisory employees but who are exempt from overtime because they get paid a salary of more than \$455 a week. Obama plans to order his Labor Department to recommend regulations that would increase that salary

threshold and change the definition of what constitutes a supervisor.

Obama's attention to overtime dovetails with his emphasis on correcting wage disparities, a theme that he has said will be central to the remainder of his presidential term. It also serves his political ends during a midterm election year, giving him a populist issue along with his calls for a higher minimum wage and better pay for women.

The president's directive, to be announced Thursday, leaves the details of a proposed rule to the Labor Department, which is not expected to come up with a recommendation before the fall. Still, it drew swift

protests from Republicans who complained he was sidestepping Congress and from the business community, who said such rules would increase burdens on employers.

The salary limit separating those who get overtime and those who don't was increased to \$455 in 2004 during the Bush administration. At the time, it hadn't been increased since the mid-1970s.

Overtime and minimum wage rules are set by law in the Fair Labor Standards Act that Congress originally passed in 1938. The law gives the administration some leeway to define the rules through regulations.

The Revis move saved the Bucs a \$1.5 million bonus that would have been due if he remained on the roster with his \$16 million salary. It also freed

With Broncos executive John Elway showing the same ability to close a deal that he did during his Hall of Fame career as a quarterback — and used two years ago to lure Peyton Manning to Denver-Ware's first team visit resulted in a deal that includes \$20 million in guaranteed money.

"It's a perfect fit for me," Ware said at a news conference.

He'll pair with linebacker Von Miller to give AFC champion Denver a pair of quarterback chasers. Elway has been busy upgrading the defense during

trail, with only the most gentle of curves along the way. Couple that with gorgeous scenery, great small communities to explore and good trailside services, and you have something pretty special. It's no wonder folks love this place.

On March 22, hop on your bike and take a spin on the Withlacoochee State Trail during the Clean Air Ride. Don't have a fancy, brand-new road bike? No worries, the Clean Air Ride is one of those events where you can see everything with wheels and pedals, from top-shelf touring bikes all the way down to home-brew creations. It's a biker's bonanza, and even if you don't ride, it's still fun to watch. Bring the kids, the neighbor's kids (you might want to ask their parents first, of course), your grandparents and everyone else you can wrangle into a day of bike riding. I'm positive you won't have many people turn you down.

As hard as it is to imagine, I'm sure there are local folks who haven't explored the Withlacoochee State Trail yet. If that's the case, take some time to see what all the fuss is about and learn what a bike trail can do for small communities. Any one place along the trail is wonderful by itself, but when you connect them with a pathway, amazing things happen. Independent businesses flourish. People have the ability to travel safely without using an automobile. Health improves. Corridors are protected and preserved for future generations to enjoy.

I sometimes wonder how different Floral City and downtown Inverness would be without the Withlacoochee State Trail. In both of these towns, being situated on such a popular trail has transformed what might otherwise be just places that people would pass through without stopping into a major attraction. That's just something to mull over while you are tooling along on your bike during the Clean Air Ride.



#### Florida KR Debose granted sixth year

GAINESVILLE — The NCAA has granted Florida receiver/kick returner Andre Debose a sixth year of eligibility. The Gators announced the decision

Wednesday night.

Debose missed all of last season after tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee. He injured his knee during a non-contract drill in practice in early August and missed his senior season, which was expected to be his fifth and final year of eligibility. But Debose applied for a medical hardship waiver, which restored a year of eligibility. He missed his freshman year in 2009 following knee surgery.

Debose has 29 receptions for 543 yards and four touchdowns. His biggest contribution came on special teams, where he owns a school record with four kickoff returns for touchdowns.

Coach Will Muschamp said Debose will be cleared for non-contact practice March 28.

#### Kobe Bryant won't be coming back this season

EL SEGUNDO, Calif. - Kobe Bryant won't be back on the court for the Lakers this season.

The Lakers said Bryant was examined Wednesday by team physician Dr. Steve Lombardo, who determined that the injury that has kept Bryant out of the lineup still hasn't healed. Bryant is recovering from a fractured lateral tibial plateau of his left knee.

Bryant issued a statement through the team saying that this has been a disappointing and frustrating season. He added, "But I appreciate all the support I've received from the Lakers and the fans, and look forward to being back and ready for the start of training camp."

#### **Musburger, Palmer to call SEC Network games**

ESPN said Brent Musburger will be the lead play-by-play announcer for its new SEC Network, with former Florida quarterback Jesse Palmer as analyst.

Musburger's move to the SEC Network opens the play-by-play spot on ESPN's Saturday prime-time game. ESPN has not announced who will take

that job though there has been speculation Chris Fowler, the host of GameDay whose contract with ESPN is expiring, will move into that play-by-play role alongside analyst Kirk Herbstreit.

The SEC Network launches next season. The first football game on the network will be Texas A&M at South Carolina on Thursday, Aug. 28. Musburger and Palmer will call that game and a game every Saturday on the SEC Network.

Musburger and Palmer will continue to be part of ESPN's college football coverage.

#### FIU's Coley moves up to No. 5 in scoring

EL PASO, Texas - FIU's Jerica Coley started Wednesday No. 9 on the NCAA's career Division I women's career scoring list

She ended it at No. 5.

Coley scored 42 points Wednesday, increasing her career total to 3,054 and lifting the 13th-seeded Panthers past fifth-seeded East Carolina 87-75 in the second round of the Conference USA tournament.

Coley is averaging 29.6 points this season. During Wednesday's game alone, she passed Southern California's Cheryl Miller (3,018), Tennessee's Chamique Holdsclaw (3,025), Connecticut's Maya Moore (3,036) and Delaware's Elena Delle Donne (3,039) on the list.

Drake's Lorri Bauman (3,115) is No. 4 on the list. Coley would likely need at least two more games to have a realistic chance of catching her.

# Not so easy being cheesy

Would Parmesan by any other name be as tasty atop your pasta? A ripening trade battle might put that to the test.

As part of trade talks, the European Union wants to ban the use of European names like Parmesan, feta and Gorgonzola on cheese made in the United States.

#### WASHINGTON

The argument is that the American-made cheeses are shadows of the original European varieties and cut into sales and identity of the European cheeses. The Europeans say Parmesan should only come from Parma, Italy, not those familiar green cylinders that American companies sell. Feta should only be from Greece, even though feta isn't a place. The EU argues it "is so closely connected to Greece as to be identified as an inherently Greek product."

So, a little "hard-grated cheese" for your pasta? It doesn't have quite the same ring as Parmesan.

U.S. dairy producers, cheesemakers and food companies are all fighting the idea, which they say would hurt the \$4 billion domestic cheese industry and endlessly confuse consumers.

"It's really stunning that the Europeans are trying to claw back products made popular in other countries," says Jim Mulhern, president of the National Milk Producers Federation, which represents U.S. dairy farmers.

The European Union would not say exactly what it is proposing or even whether it will be discussed this week as a new round of talks on an EU-United States free trade agreement opens in Brussels.

European Commission spokesman Roger Waite would only say that the question "is an important issue for the EU."

That's clear from recent agreements with Canada and Central America, where certain cheese names were restricted unless the cheese came from Europe. Under the Canadian agreement, for example, new feta products manufactured in Canada can only be marketed as feta-like or feta-style, and they can't use Greek letters or other symbols that evoke Greece.

Though they have not laid out a public proposal, the EU is expected to make similar attempts to restrict marketing of

U.S.-made cheeses, possibly including Parmesan, Asiago, Gorgonzola, feta, fontina, grana, Muenster, Neufchatel and Romano.

And it may not be just cheese. Other products could include bologna, Black Forest ham, Greek yogurt, Valencia oranges and prosciutto, among other foods.

The trade negotiations are important for the EU as Europe has tried to protect its share of agricultural exports and pull itself out of recession. The ability to exclusively sell some of the continent's most famous and traditional products would prevent others from cutting into those markets.

Concerned about the possible impact of changing the label on those popular foods, a bipartisan group of 55 senators wrote U.S. Trade Representative Michael Froman and Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack this week asking them not to agree to any such proposals by the EU.

Led by New York Sen. Charles Schumer, D-N.Y., and Pennsylvania Sen. Patrick Toomey, R-Pa., the members wrote that in the states they represent, "many small- or medium-sized, family owned businesses could have their businesses unfairly restricted" and that export businesses could be gravely hurt.

Schumer said artisanal cheese production is a growing industry across New York.

"Muenster is Muenster, no matter how you slice it," he said.

Trevor Kinkaid, a spokesman for the U.S. trade representative, said conversations on the issue are in the early stages but that the U.S. and E.U. have "different points of view" on the topic.

The agency wouldn't disclose details of the negotiations, but Kinkaid said the U.S. government is "committed to increasing opportunity for U.S. businesses, farmers and workers through trade."

Large food companies that mass-produce the cheeses are also fighting the idea. Kraft, closely identified with its grated Parmesan cheese, says the cheese names have long been considered generic in the United States.

"Such restrictions could not only be costly to food makers, but also potentially confusing for consumers if the labels of their favorite products using these generic names were required to change," says Kraft spokesman Basil Maglaris.

Some producers say they are incensed because it was Europeans who originally brought the cheeses here, and the American companies have made them more popular and profitable in a huge market. Errico Auricchio, president of the Green Bay, Wis., company BelGioioso Cheese Inc., produced cheese with his family in Italy until he brought his trade to the United States in 1979.







# Drink what you like, forget about the critics

ine makers and grape farmers play a major role in what people drink, and I also believe the attitudes of people who write about wine (myself included) help shape gentle readers' outlooks towards what they may enjoy. After 20 years of appearing on these Thursday Chronicle pages I have a pretty good idea of what local area folks are thinking about wine.

What has come about in Citrus County over the past two decades is a wine explosion. from almost zilch bottling on local shelves to a cornucopia of fabulous goods, from all over the world. And as I have said often, prices for good, everyday products have stayed reasonable. The average price of a bottle of wine in America today is about \$6. There are more than a dozen red and white grapes types available, such as merlot and chardonnay to fit every taste profile, as well as a bevy of the sweeter flavors many prefer, such as white



#### zinfandel, etc.

As a wine reporter and sometime critic, my ongoing guideline for gentle readers is "there is no right or wrong" when it comes to choosing a label. Drink what tastes good to you and forget about what the pundits and blogs recommend. Of course, this advice comes with a slight drawback. I certainly do have my own criteria, including likes and dislikes when it comes to flavor.

Prime rule is never select "plonk" meaning tasteless wine. Just as I don't care for

bland foods, you will never find identifying distinctive aromas bargain wines wanting flavor as recommendations here. Price to quality ratio or "PQR" is this writer's personal benchmark. In our wine shop back in Connecticut, the goal was to provide customers with better quality wines for less money. I have tried to do the same here with assertive recommendations. For example, a \$10 value worth at least \$20 in quality is a good deal.

One admission concerns my personal palette. I like the quote by wine merchant Harry Waugh who said when asked: "Have you ever mistaken Bordeaux (blends of Cabernet and Merlot) for Burgundy (Pinot Noir)"? His answer: 'Not since lunch."

I have several friends whose tasting palette is, I believe, much more acute than my own. But then, the joy of wine is not a guessing game, like detecting soil composition or weather factors re: old vintages. And really, for me, it's not about

to see who has the keenest sense of smell or taste in the middle and back of the tongue. Connoisseurs may play these games, and so be it, but working on details such as this just adds in my view for newcomers, and even experienced tipplers, as well a dash of angst.

I am more than willing to admit that my career in wine has been peppered with gaffes. Blind tastings, for example, are my nemesis, like trying to sort out Merlot from California versus the same grape from France

I can tell you the difference between a good harvest where the taste is sweet and balanced from another with grapes picked so unripe they are harsh.

I may not be able to convey with simple words the real delight that comes as what happened at one tasting where my friend Dan Sullivan walked over and said, "You've got to

taste this Chianti", a swallow which absolutely blew my mind. Can this 2006 "Petra Alto Sangiovese" from Italy's Tuscan region really rate a rating of 100, a perfect wine? The fact that it cost about \$50 retail made it a true bargain, a best buy among trophy wines, so delicious, with a finish so long (about 60 seconds) as to almost defv expression.

If you are contented with wine in general, drink a favorite bottle and ignore the hyperbole published by wine writers. If these pages are helpful in providing you with worthy "QPR" suggestions then that's good enough.

"Tres Picos" a smooth and soft Spanish Grenache, at about \$15, is a "QPR" special.

# Iranian coffee lovers flock to wave of cafes

TEHRAN, Iran -Shoulder to shoulder, cheek to cheek, young women and men sit next to each other while a thick film of cigarette smoke fills the dimly lit cafe in central Tehran. Bob Dylan's "Knockin' On Heaven's Door" blares from the speakers.

Young Iranians with slick smart phones and packs of American-made cigarettes who frequent the cafe come for the chance to hang out, away from the eyes of moralizing elders. They also form a bloc of strong support for moderate President Hassan Rouhani as he works to allow greater social freedom in the Islamic Republic.

It is a reflection of a boom in cafe culture that has led to a mushrooming of similar coffee shops over the past two years, providing an outlet for young middle-class Iranians who suffer from a lack of public places to meet.

With a box of black Marlboros on his table, Mahnaz Ghassemi, 20, who voted for Rouhani June, said she comes to the cafe for the freedom it offers. "Here, I can smoke freely. At home, both my mom and dad regularly complain about it," she said

chatting with his girlfriend Maryam. Both voted for Rouhani.


"In the past we had fewer chances to meet." he said. "In recent years we have more chances simply because of increasing number of public places, like this."

For years, Iranian authorities kept the number of cafes limited since they were seen as a symbol of Western influence and places to spread non-Islamic beliefs. But reports of cafes being shut because they violate "Islamic dignities" have dropped markedly in recent months, suggesting a growing tolerance by the authorities.


During his campaign, Rouhani vowed that young people would have more social freedom.

"We have invested years and years making these cheeses," Auricchio says. "You cannot stop the spreading of culture, especially in the global economy."

He says that companies who make certain cheeses would have to come together and figure out new names for them, which would be almost impossible to do.

His suggestion for Parmesan? "I Can't Believe It's Not Parmesan," he jokes.

Jaime Castaneda works for the U.S. Dairy Export Council and is the director of a group formed to fight the EU changes, the Consortium for Common Food Names. He says the idea that only great cheese can come from Europe "is just not the case anymore.'

He points out that artisanal and locally produced foods are more popular than ever here and says some consumers may actually prefer the American brands. European producers can still lay claim to more placespecific names, like Parmigiano-Reggiano, he savs.

"This is about rural America and jobs," he said

### **Bean soup** with ham

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 1 pound navy or pinto beans
- 5 1/2 cups water
- 1 ham bone with some meat on it (you may use 1/4 lb. bacon ends instead of ham bone)

- 1/2 chopped celery
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt

1/4 teaspoon black pepper


■ 1/4 teaspoon oregano or other seasoning

# **Broadcast Booze:** TV shows getting into the wine biz

Mr. Carson, bring me my wine! And you, too, Mr. Spock. In what is perhaps the strongest evidence yet of wine's power to unite, fans of upper-crusty period drama "Downton Abbey," sci-fi classic "Star Trek" and the proudly down home show "Duck Dynasty" can all buy wines bottled under license to their favorite show.

Must drink TV?

The Downton Abbey wines, a white and a red (retailing at \$16.99), come from Wines That Rock, a company that makes wine under the names of rock groups, including the Rolling Stones. They're made by Dulong Grand Vins, a Bordeaux winery, which makes sense since the show has featured a number of wines from that famous French wine region.

Wine has been a big part of the British series, with butler Mr. Carson taking great pains over which wines to serve with dinner. One of the wines served at the big dinner party in the second episode of the fourth season was a 1919 Chateau Coutet, a big thrill for the family that now owns the southern Bordeaux winery (which produces a well-regarded dessert wine).

Producers of the show, who are known for their faithful attention to detail, approached the family and asked for permission to use the name, then made a prop bottle to use in filming. "We were thrilled," says Aline Baly, co-owner and director of marketing and communications for Chateau Coutet.

Meanwhile, "Duck Dynasty," an A&E show about a family business that makes products for duck hunters, primarily a duck call, might not seem such a seamless fit for the wine world.

But Bob Torkelson, chief operating officer of Trinchero Family Estates, the Napa Valley winery that makes the Duck Commander wines, says the Trincheros and the Robertsons (the Louisiana family featured on the show) have a lot in common in terms of running family businesses.

The Robertsons met the Trincheros after asking around for recommendations on wineries.

Willie and Korie Robertson have visited the winery and contributed to decisions on blending and packaging. The wines, released late last year and retailing for about \$10, are available in a red blend, a chardonnay and a pink moscato; a pinot grigio also is planned.

The show stirred unwelcome

publicity last December when family patriarch Phil Robertson made a number of controversial statements to GQ magazine, including calling gay sex a sin. However, sales of the wine have been robust, passing 100,000 cases in about four months.

And what of "Star Trek?" Is there a space-wine continuum?

Yes, actually, there is, says Peter Messa, spokesman for Vinport which handles marketing for the Star Trek wines.

"Star Trek has many wine references in it, the most famous probably being Klingon bloodwine," he notes. In fact, food and drink plays a big part in the series, with toasts often raised to celebrate interspecies diplomacy and other milestones.

The Star Trek wines are based on the original series, or TOS to fans who are primarily Baby Boomers (major consumers of wine). The wines feature labels based on poster art by Juan Ortiz, who was commissioned by CBS to make posters of the iconic series.

The first release of the wine was made in California's Sonoma County and is a red blend of merlot, sangiovese, cabernet franc, dolcetto and tinta cao. The bottles cost about \$25 and were produced in a limitededition release of 1701 cases. Not fan-boy or -girl enough to get that reference? It's the registry number of the original Enterprise.

The wine was released under three labels commemorating the shows — Trouble with Tribbles, Mirror, Mirror and City on the Edge of Forever, which is, of course, the greatest Star Trek episode ever made.

Not a Trekkie? Or a fan of mansions or mallards? Not a problem. For you, there's a "Game of Thrones" beer from a partnership between HBO and Brewery Ommegang in New York — Take the Black Stout.

# McDonald's new game plan to win back customers

NEW YORK — McDonald's is fighting to hold onto customers amid intensifying competition.

On Monday, the world's biggest hamburger chain said an important sales figure fell again in the U.S. The company blamed bad winter weather in part, but also conceded that "challenging industry dynamics" played a role.

At a time when chains like Chipotle and smaller players like Five Guys Burgers and Fries are growing, here are a few strategies McDonald's Corp. is focusing on:

#### **CUSTOMIZATION**

People want to be able to dictate exactly what they want on their orders. It's why chains like Chipotle and Subway have done so well in recent years.

So McDonald's is trying to allow for more customization, in part by rolling out new prep tables at its more than 14,000 U.S. locations. The new tables can hold many more toppings and sauces than the old tables, signaling that McDonald's plans to offer greater variety.

The chain is also testing a "buildyour-own-burger" concept in Southern California. Even if the test is successful, however, don't expect to see it at a McDonald's near you anytime soon rolling out that kind of product across all restaurants would require considerable changes in the kitchens.

#### BREAKFAST

McDonald's has long dominated the breakfast hours and plans to play up favorites like the Egg McMuffin as it faces more competition as people increasingly buy breakfast on the go.

Taco Bell, for instance, is readying for its national breakfast rollout, and Starbucks recently revamped its sandwiches.

To strengthen its No. 1 position in the morning, McDonald's says it will also push the quality of its coffee in marketing. Executives note that quality coffee has become a priority for many people and that it can bring them in the door. It's one of the reasons the chain's coffee cups were recently redesigned.

#### CORE MENU

McDonald's executives have conceded that they rolled out too many new items too quickly in the past year. That led to kitchen operations becoming too complicated and orders taking too long to fill

So the chain says it will slow its pace of new offerings. It's also trying to add variety using items already on its menu. That might mean introducing McWraps and Quarter Pounders with different toppings and sauces, rather than new burgers entirely.

George Bernard Shaw said, "I never resist temptation, because I have found that things that are bad for me do not tempt me.

At the bridge table, though, it can be difficult to recognize bids and plays that will prove to be bad for you. In this deal, for example, defending against a contract of four spades, West leads the club ace: three, two, eight. What should he do next?


The auction was straightforward. North made a three-spade game-invitational limit raise, showing 10-12 support points (high-card points plus shortage points, not that he had any of those here) and eight losers (one spade, one heart, three diamonds and three clubs). South had an easy raise to game.

One of the most irresistible temptations for a defender is to cash a winner. Here, less experienced players would take the club king at trick two, then look around for inspiration. But declarer would be in clover, losing only two clubs and one heart.

Instead, West should trust his partner's trickone signal. East dropped the two, his lowest card being discouraging. (If you and your partner use upside-down signals, East should play the nine at trick one.) This denies the queen (unless he has exactly queen-two-doubleton, which is very unlikely).

So West should shift at trick two, hoping his partner can get on lead early enough to push a club through South.

Here, any lead other than a spade at trick two defeats the contract, assuming East leads a club when he gets in with his heart ace.

A better definition of an affair is that it's something that violates trust. My husband




Dear Annie: Your answer to "Annoyed Grandma" about a grandchild with no boundaries was right on.


