Registration underway for kindergarten

Parents and guardians of incoming kindergarten students are reminded that registration will be held at Perry Primary School June 20, 25 and 27 from 9 a.m. to noon.

Required documentation includes: current physical (dated after Aug. 19, 2012), current record of immunizations, certified copy of birth certificate and Social Security card.

Students who will be six on or before Feb. 2, 2014, are required by law to begin a kindergarten program during the 2013-2014 school year.

If a child was born in June, July or August of 2008, a parent may choose to delay enrollment in a kindergarten program until next year.

Store cited for violating 'spice' ordinance, closed for 31 days

An undercover "buy" operation by the Perry Police Department (PPD) has led to the 31-day closing of a local convenience store for violating the city's "spice" ordinance.

The Perry Code Enforcement Board upheld the violation notice

filed against the owners of Starmart, located on North Jefferson Street, and suspended their business license for 31 days. A \$500 fine was also levied against both the business owner and the store clerk who sold the product.

The order was effective

June 17 through July 18.

PPD Det. Sgt. Gene Franklin reports the store clerk (who is also the brother of the store's owner) sold synthetic cannabis to the undercover operative.

"The product was not out on display; the clerk had to retrieve the package from

an area where it was hidden in the store. He then rang up the purchase on the cash register and completed the sale. The substance has been sent to the lab for processing to see if it contains any banned substances. If it does, then the clerk who sold the product would face

charges," Franklin said.

The city's "spice" ordinance prohibits the possession and sale of items commonly known as synthetic cannabis and bath salts.

Montford briefs Rotarians on 2013 legislative session

Sen. Bill Montford was in town Tuesday to speak to the Perry Rotary Club, updating about 30 members and guests on several policies which came out of this spring's legislative session as well as the challenges continuing to face the state.

"I thoroughly enjoy coming to Taylor County," Montford began.

Although he has been in the Senate since 2010, this year was his first session representing Taylor County, which joined his district following reapportionment.

Montford praised local school officials, but warned that based on early indications, statewide school grades, expected to be released later this summer, "are about to bottom out" due to increased demands.

Statewide, officials are bracing for a 200 to 300 percent increase in the

number of "D" and "F" schools, he continued.

"This is no reflection on your superintendent or the quality of your teachers and staff," Montford said. "You've got a great school system here."

He added that the State Board of Education was also wrestling that morning (Tuesday) with the issue of dual enrollment and local school districts (see related story).

Noting the number of state employees who live in Taylor County, Montford praised the Florida Retirement System, pointing out that an effort this spring to end the program and convert new employees to a defined benefits package failed.

"The Florida Retirement System is very, very strong," he said. "It's one of the top 10 in the country in the terms of financial stability."

He also noted that the average retirement benefits received by employees who have worked 30 years are around \$17,000 annually.

"We've got to be careful about tinkering with the retirement system," Montford said, pointing out that it has historically been part of recruitment efforts for state employees, including teachers.

"We could tell them, 'You won't get rich, but you'll have reasonable job security and retirement.'"

State employees also received a raise for the first time in six years.

"Our state employees are not only underpaid, they're under-appreciated."

With one of the major issues facing the state being water, Montford spoke briefly about Florida's ongoing dispute with George

District to pay tab for dual enrollment courses

Thanks to an education bill passed during the waning days of the 2013 Legislative Session, school districts across the state will have to start paying tuition next year to colleges which provide dual-enrollment classes to their students.

According to Taylor County Superintendent Paul Dyal, the change is projected to cost the district approximately \$66,000 in tuition to North Florida Community College (NFCC) next year should participation remain at levels seen during the 2012-13 school year.

Originally, dual enrollment programs involved colleges allowing high school students to fill empty seats in college classes, Dyal said.

"After you reach a certain number of students, the class is paid for," he said. "The only charge to us was for textbooks."

As dual enrollment expanded, however, "college presidents complained to the legislature," Dyal continued. "For us, it's another unfunded mandate," he said of the new bill. "Our student allocation (from the state) is based on five hours of instruction. So if they take a full load and then take dual enrollment, we don't get paid for that."

Last year, the district received a \$3,028 allocation from

Tip leads to arrest of man sought on cocaine charges

A tip from a confidential informant led to the apprehension of a suspect wanted in connection with an 18-month undercover operation led by the Perry Police Department (PPD) narcotics unit.

Allen Griffin, 32, was arrested without incident Saturday, June 15, at a local motel. He was booked at the Taylor County Jail on charges of sale of cocaine, possession of a controlled substance and introduction of contraband.

Griffin was the 17th suspect rounded up during an arrest sweep that started Friday, June 7, and continued into the next week.

'Friends Helping Friends' takes aim at downtown DREAM grant

The City of Perry's downtown revitalization efforts remain in high gear with the initial phase of Rosehead Park nearing completion and other improvements, both public and private, underway.

Now Main Street Perry has announced a new program, "Friends Helping Friends," to assist local business owners take advantage of one of the city's original revitalization efforts, the DREAM grant.

The DREAM (Downtown Revitalization Economic Appearance Motivator) grant program is offered by the City of Perry to owners of commercial buildings in the Community Revitalization Area (CRA) who make qualifying improvements to the

exterior of their buildings.

The city previously allocated \$50,000 from CRA funds for reimbursements in the program.

While several property owners have accessed the program, it remains largely underutilized, according to Main Street Perry Program Manager Tracey Smith.

"After canvassing the business owners, we tried to address all the problems they had that prevented them from participating in the DREAM grant program during the past year. And we just want to do what we can to help them in the revitalization effort," said Jeff Bryson, Friends Helping Friends coordinator and Main Street Perry board

SRWMD asks DEP to adopt minimum flows and levels

The Suwannee River Water Management District Governing Board on June 11 passed a resolution requesting the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) to adopt minimum flows and levels (MFLs) for the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee rivers and priority springs.

The district passed the resolution based on Senate Bill 244, sponsored by Senator Charles Dean and by Representative Elizabeth Porter in the House. Senate Bill 244 requires adjoining water management districts to apply MFLs that are adopted by DEP. Therefore, the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee rivers and priority springs MFL would be applied in both the Suwannee River and St. Johns River water management districts.

Given that water management district boundaries are established along surface water hydrologic divides, groundwater withdrawals have the potential to affect water resources in an adjacent district. Senate Bill 244 addresses possible

cross-boundary impacts by requiring water management districts to apply the MFLs of adjoining districts that are adopted by DEP.

The district is developing the MFL and has committed to a voluntarily peer review of the science and all related technical documents in establishing the MFL. The peer review will be conducted by a panel of experts from the University of Florida Water Institute.

Prior to the legislation, water management districts could work together to address cross-boundary impacts. However, for one water management district to apply an adjacent district's MFL, that district would have to go through a duplicative rulemaking process.

Upon Senate Bill 244 becoming law, which has an effective date of July 1, DEP's adoption of cross-boundary MFLs will reduce costs and avoid duplicative efforts of two or more adjoining water management districts.


If adopted by DEP, the Lower Santa Fe and Ichetucknee rivers and priority springs MFLs could be the first cross-boundary MFLs adopted under the new law.

The DEP, Suwannee

River Water Management District and St. Johns River Water Management District have established the North Florida Regional Water Supply Partnership to collaboratively address cross-boundary water supply issues and solutions. Adoption of these MFLs by DEP is consistent with the partnership's cooperative strategies to develop a joint regional water supply plan for north Florida.

"The district is grateful that our lawmakers have put measures in place to effectively ensure our water resources that are impacted by groundwater withdrawals outside of our jurisdictional boundaries remain protected while streamlining the MFLs process," said District Executive Director Ann Shortelle.

MFLs determine the amount of water that can be removed from the natural system without causing significant harm to the water resources and the ecology. When use of water shifts the hydrologic conditions below levels defined by MFLs, significant harm can occur. When a water body currently does not or will not meet an established MFL, a recovery or prevention plan must also be developed.

'Hot as hell' is not just a figure of speech

I grew up in an era in the South when mud pies were common fare, yet statements of your individual personality.

I even had a mudpie oven at my aunt's house. Her husband was a carpenter and he had a two-step stool he had designed from wood, which served as a particularly efficient mudpie oven. Imagine my horror when, years later, I found similar silverplate items at antique stores. It's now the good stuff.

I, for one, took a lot of pride in my mud pies and specifically recall the time I chose to be the Julia Child of mud creations. I've always enjoyed food presentation more than food preparation, and I believe this tendency relates to my early mudpie creations. I'm sure I could get a psychologist to confirm that theory.

I remember vividly the summer day when I decided my mother's ornamental peppers would be the piece de resistance upon my gloriously fashioned mud pies. So while she ironed clothes inside, in 90-degree heat with fans roaring toward her, I labored outdoors on a veritable feast of mud creations---a quiche, a pie, a party cake, some appetizers and a centerpiece of mimosa blooms in an empty Coca-Cola bottle.

When my mother finished her hot task indoors, she grabbed a glass of iced tea and headed outdoors where I said, "Lah daaaaah..." and showed her the spread I had fashioned from mere earth.

"My peppers," she said with a faint wail.

"My peppers," she repeated again sorrowfully, and I feared she might reel over.

Could it be the heat?

I was sure she was going to tell me how nice my culinary delights looked, but instead she told me how wrong I was to pluck those peppers without permission. She told me how long she had waited for those plants to produce so beautifully. She more than hinted at how inconsiderate it was to take something which belonged to her.

She could surely kill a party. Of course, I was far too unsophisticated to realize that this was not the appropriate time to push for a compliment on my garnishing ability.

But when I did, I got a quick slap on the bottom which would make some psychologist somewhere concur that this incident this surely hampered my enthusiasm for food preparation.

And to exacerbate my punishment, my hands somehow found a way into my mouth before they found their way to soap and water. Suddenly, I was on fire---hot pepper fire.

I now wonder if it was a glimpse of hell, and if I deserved it.

I huffed and puffed so much that, even in her grief, Mother felt great sympathy for me and gave me a tall glass of Koolaid to calm the fire.

Eventually, as eight-year-olds are prone to do, I got creative. My talents were not limited to the kitchen. Believing that greater relief would be achieved from greater wind gusts, I put on my roller skates, trying to accomplish enough speed to ensure a constant cool breeze entering my mouth. I skated in circles on the patio, with my mouth wide open.

And, Lord knows, she couldn't help but forgive me. In the spirit of forgiveness, she also noticed that I had produced a mudpie feast which was a sight for sore eyes.

When I became an adult, my Mother allowed me to admire her patio plants closely, but not without first reminding, "Don't bother my peppers."

Yes ma'am, already. She may have forgiven me, but she never forgot...and neither did I.

Hell's funny that way. I suspect you never forget.

member. The Friends Helping Friends program is an effort by Main Street Perry to promote the DREAM grant and ultimately assist property owners with their projects to revitalize the appearance of Perry's downtown, Smith said.

"Program participants will have the advantage of partnering with local building supply companies who are willing to give substantial discounts on supplies, access to a short-term financing program with Capital City Bank for their project needs and a team of volunteers willing to donate

their time and labor to help complete the approved building improvements," she said.

"A team from the Main Street Perry Design Committee will provide hands-on assistance in color selection and design ideas for the property owner in an effort to give downtown a cleaner, coordinated look to attract both residents and visitors. Search ongoing for two boaters missing from Horseshoe Beach

The search continues for the two men missing since Saturday, June 15, off Horseshoe Beach, Dixie County, according to Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) officials.

Thomas E. Morrison (DOB 12/22/49) of Jacksonville, and Glen S. Harris (DOB 03/23/43) of Keystone Heights, Clay County, are still missing after their boat overturned

in the Gulf of Mexico on Saturday, approximately 14 miles offshore of Horseshoe Beach.

Morrison and Harris, along with Frank DiPaula (DOB 03/01/35) and Thomas Grant (DOB 04/14/46), both of Keystone Heights, went out Saturday morning to go offshore fishing in a 1978, 21-foot Wellcraft center console open sport fisher.

At approximately 11:30 p.m. Saturday, FWC vessels began looking for the boat, which had been reported as overdue. FWC officers searched overnight with assistance from U.S. Coast Guard air assets.

The overturned boat was found approximately 14 miles offshore at about 8:30 a.m. Sunday by a U.S. Coast

Guard search plane. DiPaula and Grant were with the vessel and an FWC vessel rescued the two men.

FWC officers continued the search for Morrison and Harris until sundown on Sunday.

"We are continuing throughout the day to search for the two missing men," Capt. John Burton, acting regional commander for the FWC, said Monday, June 17.

The overturned vessel was recovered and towed back to the Horseshoe Beach marina by Sea Tow.

"Our hearts go out to the families of the missing men," Burton said.

The FWC is continuing the investigation into the accident.



Taylor's jobless rate falls to 7.4%

Taylor County's unemployment rate continued its downward trajectory in April, falling to 7.4 percent, just above the state average.

After staying mostly level around 9.2 percent in the last several months of 2012 and into January, the county's unemployment rate dropped almost a full percentage point to 8.3 percent in February and then to 7.7 percent in March.

April's rate is the lowest since October 2008, when it was 7.0 percent, and down 2.7 percentage points from its rate a year before.

Taylor had the 17th highest unemployment rate among Florida's 67 counties in April, with 697 people unemployed and 8,692 employed, according to figures released by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO).

Among Taylor's neighbors, Dixie and Madison counties had the highest unemployment rate at 8.3 percent. Below Taylor were Lafayette at 5.9 percent and Jefferson County at 5.3 percent. Like Taylor, all four counties saw drops in their rates in April.

For the month, Hendry County had the highest rate in the state with 9.9 percent while Monroe County once again boasted the lowest with 3.7 percent.


Florida's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.2 percent in April, also the lowest since September 2008 when it was 7.0 percent. The April rate was down 0.3 percentage point from the March rate of 7.5 percent and was 1.7 percentage points lower than the April 2012 rate. The national unemployment rate for April was 7.5 percent.
