## Lay-offs reported at Yates

An unknown number of workers with Yates Construction, which services the local Georgia-Pacific Cellulose plant, were terminated last week.

Sources indicate some 70 employees, mainly in office positions, were laid off; however, the figure could be as high as 150.

Yates officials did not respond to calls from **Taco Times** staff as of presstime Tuesday.

The lay-offs came on the heels of several site and employee changes announced for the mill. However, officials from both GP and Yates have declined comment.

It has not been confirmed that Yates is re-locating its offices from inside the mill site to a nearby office building that formerly housed Buckeye Community Federal Credit Union.

Representatives from the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity stated they had not been notified of any large-scale lay-offs in Taylor County.

## Five face meth, gun charges

The Taylor County Sheriff's Office arrested five Taylor County residents, including a mother and her adult son, late last week on numerous marijuana, methamphetamine and weapon charges.

TCSO Capt. Harper Gibson stated the investigation is on-going and said he could not comment on details surrounding the arrests.

Booking records for the Taylor County Jail show the five were arrested Thursday, Oct. 23.

Rachel Blanton, 21, was charged with possession of methamphetamine with intent to sell, felony possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of more than 20 grams of cannabis; and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon.

Glenda Cook, 63, was booked on charges of possession of methamphetamine with intent to sell, felony possession of drug paraphernalia, child abuse and possession of more than 20 grams of cannabis.


Dustie Beach, 34, was charged with possession of

## County pursuing grants for sidewalks along Old Dixie Hwy.

The Taylor County Commission is considering applying for a second Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) grant to help fund the construction of sidewalks along Old Dixie Highway, the scene of two pedestrian deaths in the past three years.

Last year, the commission applied for funding assistance through the FDOT Transportation Alternative Program to construct a 1.53-mile sidewalk from Jefferson Street to Southside Park at Plantation Road. In April FDOT approved \$328,000 for the project with no cash match required from the county, although work is not

expected to begin until 2019 or 2020.

"FDOT Transportation Alternative Program applications are submitted five to six years in advance," County Grants Director Melody Cox explained.

She noted that FDOT provided additional funding to install street lights along the proposed sidewalk.

Last week, the commission held the first of two public hearings on a potential Transportation Alternative Program grant application to complete the Old Dixie Highway sidewalk from Plantation Road to Foley Road (CR 30).

## Supervisor invites residents to 'Vote in honor of a veteran'

With the 2014 General Election less than a week away, Taylor County residents can still early vote through Saturday, Nov. 1.

The General Election will be held Tuesday, Nov. 4, and Supervisor of Elections Dana Southerland reminds voters--whether they are voting on Election Day or early in her office--to bring photo and signature identification with them.

Early voting will be available each day from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. in the supervisor's office, located on the second floor of the county courthouse.

Southerland asks those waiting until Election Day to vote to make sure they go to their correct precinct.

"If you are unsure, the best thing to do would be to call our office and ask," she said. As of Tuesday afternoon,

more than 1,280 local ballots had been cast by mail and

more than 640 ballots cast in early voting, according to figures from the Supervisor of Elections office. Of those, 1,193 were cast by registered Democrats, 657 by Republicans and 78 by those registered third-party or no party. Real time turnout data is available online at www.taylor-elections.com by clicking on "Voter Turnout QuickView."

Today (Wednesday) is the final day to request an absentee ballot, which can be requested by calling the elections office at 838-3515 or online by clicking on the "Absentee Request" button on the office's website.

## 'Why the school district needs .25 mill extended'

Digital Requirements to School District by House Bill 5101 (Education Conforming Bill)

HB 5101 is an education conforming bill that makes "permanent" changes in Florida Statutes to conform to the provisions of HB 5101. The provisions of a conforming bill do not automatically expire at the end of the fiscal year, but the provisions are only changed by legislation action.

This bill amends s. 1001.11(8), Florida Statutes for the implementation of a 5-year strategic plan for establishing Florida digital classrooms to assist districts in integrating technology in classroom teaching and learning to improve student performance.

It amends s. 1001.20(4) (a), F.S. to require the FLDOE develop the strategic plan to provide each district a guide of what must be done. The plan will require:

- How the district will integrate technology into classroom teaching to assist the state in improving student performance outcomes and enabling all students to be digital learners with access to

digital tools and resources. The technology requirements the district must have including specifications for hardware, software, devices, networking, security, and bandwidth capacity and guidelines for the ratio of students per device.

The requirements for professional development opportunities and training to assist teachers and staff with the integration of technology into the classroom.

The types of digital tools and resources that assist teachers and staff in the management, assessment and monitoring of student learning and performance.

HB 5101 creates s. 1007.2616, F. S. requiring public schools to provide students in grades K-12 opportunities for learning computer science, including computer coding and programming.

Such opportunities include coding instruction in elementary and middle school, instruction to develop students' computer usage and digital literacy skills in middle school, and courses in computer science, computer coding, and computer programming in high school, including

earning related industry certifications.

Elementary and middle school should have digital classrooms in which students are provided opportunities to improve digital literacy and competency, to learn digital skills such as coding, multiple media presentations, and the manipulation of multiple digital graphic images; and to earn digital tools certificates and certifications and grade-appropriate, technology-related industry certifications.

High school student opportunities to take computer science courses to satisfy high school graduation requirements, include:

- High school computer science classes of sufficient rigor, as identified by the commissioner, such that one credit in computer science and the earning of related industry certifications constitute the equivalent of up to one credit of the mathematics requirement, with the exception of Algebra I, or up to one credit of the science requirement, with the exception of Biology I for high school graduation.

One of the mudtrucks from the infamous bog was being pressure washed nearby and returned to its pristine condition, before being dropped in the mud again. I've never understood that concept, but I think I'm the only one who doesn't see the logic.

On Saturday, the community had celebrated the "Forest Life." Thousands gathered.

On Sunday, I was the only one to celebrate underneath a tall oak tree which has watched my children grow and shaded our patio from summer's relentless sun.

Fall is a nice change for all of us.

In its honor, fall back in your favorite chair underneath the shade of a friendly tree, and then make sure your clock does the same this Sunday morning when Daylight Savings Time signs off and changes the landscape again.

While we wait for spring to return.

## Thousands celebrate 'Forest Life'

In its 59th year, the Florida Forest Festival celebrated the "Forest Life," with thousands of local residents and out-of-town guests joining together under the pines at Forest Capital State Park.

The month-long celebration of the state's forests and those who work and play in them culminated last week in what festival organizers are calling a "wonderful success."

"The weather was perfect," Festival Board

Member Dawn Taylor said. "The music was great. We had more crafters than we've had in years. We had more students at the Heritage Day field trips than ever before. We ran out of everything at the World's Largest Free Fish Fry."

Although there is no exact estimate of this year's

crowd, festival organizers say they feel the total number in attendance was up from previous years.

The festivities kicked off in earnest Thursday evening with the annual "Fabulous Fireworks Display" at Perry-Foley Airport.

On Friday morning, more than 1,200 local students

converged upon Forest Capital State Park for the Heritage Day Tours, during which they were able to interact with demonstrators detailing life before cellphones and television, listen to representatives from the Florida Forest Service talking about preventing forest fires and

watch expert lumberjacks showcase their skills. (For photos of the event, please see page A-5.)

The festival moved downtown Friday evening, with the Strutt Your Mutt Dog Contest followed by the Kids' Parade, which featured around a dozen homemade floats and

costumes celebrating "Forest Life." The parade also included Florida Forest Festival King and Queen Preston Denmark and Aubriana Vann, Distinguished Young Woman Jharmara Simmons and a bevy of state and

Early voting is now taking place in the Supervisor of Elections office on the 2nd floor of the county courthouse and will end on Saturday, Nov. 1, 2014. Early voting hours are from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. each day. Any registered voter in the county may vote early in lieu of going to their polling location on Election Day.

Once early voting ends any registered voter who wishes to cast a ballot in the General Election will need to do so at their designated precinct on Election Day.

As interim program director for Refuge House in Taylor County and a longtime outreach counselor, Monroe-Harris knows this message deserves 12 months' of attention.

But during October, which is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month, Refuge House took its message to a younger group.

"Playing off all the problems within the NFL, we decided to use the Homecoming game at Taylor County High School to enforce the 'no tolerance' message for our football players, students and their families."

Athletes, she said, wore purple ribbons on their helmets noting the awareness effort, while volunteers distributed information to those attending the game.

At the shelter in Perry, Monroe-Harris says toiletries are always needed (toothpaste and brushes, tissues and soap), as well as blankets, sheets and

pillows.

"The weather will be getting cool soon and we need to be prepared."

Although she observed a "slack" period for about a week and a half during October, "we have eight

now," she said, "and that number will increase during the holidays."

Much of her work is conducted at the 123 S. Washington Street office "for individuals who just need counseling, support

in court and that kind of assistance." You can reach her at 223-3981.

Glenda Cook was also charged with one count of child abuse; a three-year-old child was apparently in the residence during the time the alleged drug activity took place. The child was removed from the home and child services notified.

According to records, Padgett and Beach lived in a shed on the property, located at 7680 Airport Grade.

When deputies executed search warrants for the property, they discovered multiple items of drug paraphernalia along with firearms.

be turned into the elections office by 7 p.m. on Election Day," Southerland said. "If it's mailed and we receive it after Election Day, it is not valid."

Sample ballots have been mailed to voters throughout the county, and a sample ballot is included in today's **Taco Times**.

The only local candidate race features Taylor County Commissioner Pam

Feagle, a Democrat, facing Republican challenger David Woods, for her District 4 seat.

The ballot also includes a countywide Taylor County School Board referendum asking voters to consider renewing a 0.25 mill critical needs property tax for an additional four years to help cover increased technology costs. This would continue the existing .25 mill tax approved by voters in 2010.

Other races which are

on the ballot include U.S. Representative, Florida Governor, Florida Attorney General, Florida Chief Financial Officer, Florida Commissioner of Agriculture and U.S. Representative.

The ballot also features three proposed amendments to the Florida Constitution on variety of subjects, including medical marijuana, water conservation funds and the appointment of judges.

Southerland encourages people to vote this cycle in honor of a veteran.

"The sacrifices our veterans have made on behalf of this great state and nation stand as examples that emphasize the need for us to take our responsibilities seriously, especially our right to vote," she said.

The Vote in Honor of a Veteran program includes the Wall of Honor, which features photos of local veterans inside and outside the Supervisor of Elections Office.

Veterans and family members of veterans who wish to participate in the program can submit a photo and complete a biography form--which can be picked up at the supervisor's office or online at the office's website.

"All Taylor County voters are encouraged to vote in honor of a veteran," Southerland said.

"And it's not necessary to be related to a veteran to vote in honor of one. Any registered voter in Taylor County can vote in honor of a veteran by remembering to cast your ballot during the election cycle."

# Additional sidewalks will fall in 2019 FDOT funding cycle

"It is anticipated FDOT District Two will award and divide \$5 million between 18 counties for the Transportation Alternatives Program Fiscal Year 2021,"

Cox told commissioners last week. "This is approximately \$275,000 per county. A cash match is not required. If the project requires design, engineering and bidding services, FDOT will provide these services for a portion of the funds awarded.

"These funds can be used for the construction of off-road pedestrian and bicycle facilities, safe-routes-to-schools projects, trails, trailheads, walkways, and other applicable

infrastructure projects," Cox continued. "The county must own all right-of-way required for the project prior to grant application submission."

"Grants staff asks the board to consider requesting funding assistance for the construction of sidewalks from the corner of Plantation and Old Dixie Highway to the corner of Foley Road and Old Dixie. There was a second pedestrian fatality on Old Dixie Highway in January 2014.

"The proposed 2.8 miles of sidewalks would complete the Old Dixie Highway corridor."

No one from the public spoke at last week's hearing. The second and final public hearing on the grant application will be held

Monday, Nov. 3, at 6 p.m. at the Courthouse Annex on Green Street.

In addition to the Old Dixie Highway sidewalk, the county was awarded funding in the 2019 cycle for the construction of a 0.79 mile sidewalk along Green Street from Arena Street to Howard Street for foot traffic arriving at and leaving Taylor County Elementary School.

Additionally, the county is set to receive funding for a trailhead at the Keaton Beach Coastal Park, as well as a multi-use trail from the park to Dark Island. Both of those projects will help the county meet requirements set forth in the land acquisition grant they used to purchase the property on which the park was built.



# Dyal: State funding not enough to cover new technology expenses

Florida Statute 1011.62 is amended to require each school board to adopt a district digital classroom plan and submit the plan for approval to the Department of Education. The plan must include:

- Measurable student performance outcomes.
- Digital learning and technology infrastructure purchases.
- Professional development activities.
- Digital tool purchases.
- On-line assessment-related purchases.

Also, each school district must provide teachers, administrators, students and parents with access to:

- Instructional materials in digital or electronic format. (Textbooks)
- Digital materials, including those digital materials that enable students to earn certificates and industry certifications.
- Teaching and learning tools and resources,

including the ability for teachers and administrators to manage, assess and monitor student performance data.

This bill, HB 5101, amends s. 1003.4203 in Florida Statutes to add each school board, in conjunction with the superintendent must make available CAPE (Career and Professional Education) industry certifications for students Prek-12th grade.

Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year:

- Digital materials should include CAPE Digital Tool certificates, workplace industry certifications and OSHA industry certifications identified for students with disabilities;
- Each student's individual educational plan for students with disabilities must identify the CAPE Digital Tool certificate and CAPE industry certifications the student seeks to attain before high school graduation.

By July 1, 2018, the legislature intends that at least 75 percent of public

middle school grades students earn at least one CAPE Digital Tool certificate.

To date with the submission of our Digital Classroom Plan, we will receive \$275,000 toward implementing our plan. First year implementation will require \$590,000 for the first three grades.

We will have to fund year two of the next three grades, and year three for the next grades. Upon submission of our Professional Development Plan for implementing our Digital Classroom Plan we will receive \$75,000 toward funding the training that will be needed. We anticipate this expenditure to be \$225,000 over the three-year implementation plan.

The funding revenue that we will receive is not sufficient to cover all of the projected expenditures that will be needed to meet the requirements of the statutes. This is what the extra .25 mill being requested on the ballot will be used for.
