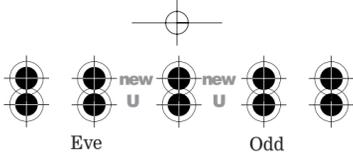

Man Killed In Semi Vs. Pickup Crash

A man was killed when his 2010 Ford F150 was hit by a 2007 Freightliner tractor-trailer on Tuesday evening, Nov. 17. According to a Florida Highway Patrol report, at approximately 11:25 p.m., William Butler, 43, of Plant City, was traveling west from the emergency lane on Interstate 10 near the 250-mile marker at a slow rate of speed. As he entered the outside westbound lane, he was struck from behind by the tractor-trailer, driven by John C. Kiefer, 54, of Springfield, La.

Butler's pickup traveled northwest onto the north shoulder and came to a final rest in the tall underbrush on the north shoulder, facing northwest.

Kiefer's semi came to a controlled stop on the north shoulder facing west.

Butler's passenger, Curtis Gordon, 54, suffered serious injuries in the wreck.

Neither Butler nor Gordon was wearing a seatbelt.

The Madison County Sheriff's Office, Madison County EMS and Madison Fire and Rescue assisted the FHP at the scene.

FHP Trooper John Sleigher was the traffic investigator and FHP Cpl. C.B. Yarborough was the homicide investigator.

Adult Ed And GED Programs Showing Results

Community urged to refer family and friends to this valuable resource.

While there will always be those self-made men and women who start with nothing and build great things for themselves and their family without an education, it is rare. The work environment of America is changing. Technology, for instance, continues to be introduced rapidly, and the Internet is definitely here to stay.

Education remains the key to getting ahead of the curve and into the game. This particularly applies to adult education, perhaps even more so than youth education.

Although everybody has reasons for dropping out of school or choosing not pursue higher education, experts agree it is seldom under positive circumstances. Of course, some leave to "get a job," but again, it is seldom a job that becomes a rewarding career. Instead, statistics show it typically turns into a vicious cycle of money shortfalls and relationship challenges. Fortunately, there is a solution, and the solution comes at no charge. That solution is adult education, starting with the GED, which is being sponsored through a timely partnership between the Madison County School District and Workforce.

Early results from numerous participants in the program demonstrate just how quickly an education can get back on track, regardless of age. In addition, significant resources are available for college education and vocational certification once the GED has been passed. And again, the only fee is the state's GED testing fee, which is moderate, and may be covered if the student is enrolled in other Workforce programs. In fact, the support and resources available from Workforce once the GED is attained are outstanding for job placement and/or further certification. Of course, assistance for locating college funding is also available.

Organizers gratefully invite all who didn't graduate high school to call the district - also urging their family and friends supporting them and even suggest they call - and take advantage of this incredible resource. All who have made the choice agree; it is a lot more difficult to stress over a lifetime of missed opportunities and constantly deal with financial stress, than it is to devote a few months to getting back on the road to success.

Currently, there are classes available in Madison and Greenville that are conveniently timed and allow the student to set a pace that works for their circumstances. And again, there are no charges for the coursework. Contact the Madison County School District at (850) 973-5022 for details.

Smart Worm Invades Internet

A smart worm is invading user's Internet and spreading damage and stealing information. Known as the Koobface Worm, it has adapted many styles and has targeted different sites. The most popular sites it targets are Facebook and MySpace.

The worm is usually spread when you get a message from one of your contacts on Facebook or MySpace, advising that they have found an old picture of you from days gone by. Since it's from one of the friends on your list, you click and instead of going to the friend's actual page, you go to the friend's infected page.

If you click on the message to look at the picture, the KoobFace worm will infect your computer. It can then steal your user IDs and passwords, any credit card or banking information you have stored, hijack your Facebook or MySpace page and send itself to all of your friends.

Commissioners Request More Information On Development Projects

The Madison County Board of County Commissioners decided to request more information regarding two property issues, one involving Loper Pond Subdivision and the other regarding an Agriculture / Multi-use Facility. Several decisions were reached, and among them was the selection of Roy Milliron to fill the vacancy on the Tourism Development Council.

Regarding Loper Pond, James Coleburn was seeking relief from the high tax burden resulting from the classification of the land as a subdivision. He was seeking to vacate the plat, which would have returned to the land to acreage with an agriculture tax status. However, he was also seeking a provision

to still sell the lots as a subdivision, while under the agriculture designation. Although there was sympathy for the situation given the current economic climate, the exchange resulted in an official postponement to revisit the issue at a later date.

A multi-use, agriculture "fairgrounds" has been mentioned for years in both civic and governmental discussions - in part because of the dilapidated state of the current Ag Center, and also because of the potential revenues from hosting regional events. Accordingly, the Tourism Development Council requested a \$15,000 set-aside for that future use, targeting grants and other public funding. There was a technical issue regarding the wording though, so the board will revisit the decision in the next meeting.



November Is "I Am So Thankful" Month

With the economy being what it is and times being what they are, it is often very hard to have any positive thoughts at times. We all have the everyday worries or complaints, "Gas is too high, food is too expensive, wages are too low," pick your cliché. But what about reflecting on the positive from time to time? It's those reflections and positive thoughts, which can pull one through tough times.

Food Safety For Your Holiday Buffets

Buffet style is one of the most popular ways to serve food at Thanksgiving and other holiday parties. It is easy, you place all of the food on a table or counter top and let guests serve themselves to a wonderful feast. However, this type of food service, where foods are left out for long periods of time leaves the door open for uninvited guests - bacteria that cause foodborne illness. Festive times for giving and sharing should not include sharing foodborne illness. Before you serve your Thanksgiving dinner next week, here are a few tips from the USDA's Meat and Poultry Hotline to help you have a SAFE holiday party.

Safe Food Handling - Always wash your hands before and after handling food. Also keep your kitchen counters, dishes and utensils clean. Always serve food on clean plates - not those previously holding raw meat and poultry. Otherwise, bacteria which may have been present in raw meat juices can cross contaminate the food to be served.

Cook Thoroughly - If you are cooking foods ahead of time for your party, be sure to cook foods thoroughly to safe temperatures. Cook fresh roast beef, veal, and lamb to at least 145°F for medium rare and 160°F for medium doneness. Bake whole poultry to 180°F, poultry breast to 170°F. Ground turkey and poultry should be cooked to 160°F.

Use Shallow Containers - Divide cooked foods into shallow containers to store in the refrigerator or freezer until serving. This encourages rapid, even cooling. Reheat hot foods to 165° F. Arrange and serve food on several small platters rather than on large platter. Keep the rest of the food hot in the oven (set at 200°F - 250°F) or cold in the refrigerator until serving time. By using this serving method, foods will be held at a safe temperature for a longer period of time. Replace empty platters rather than adding fresh food to a dish that already had food in it. Many people's hands may have been taking food from the dish, which has also been sitting out at room temperature.

The Two-Hour Rule - Foods should not sit at room temperature for more than two hours. Keep track of how long foods have been sitting on the buffet table and discard anything that has been sitting out for two hours or more.

Keep Hot Foods HOT and Cold Foods COLD - Hot foods should be held at 140°F or warmer. On the buffet table you can keep hot foods hot with chafing dishes, slow cookers, and warming trays. Cold foods should be held at 40°F or colder. Keep foods cold by nesting dishes in bowls of ice. Otherwise, use small serving trays and replace them.

Bacteria is everywhere, you don't want them crashing your holiday meal. Unlike microorganisms that cause food to spoil, harmful bacteria that can cause food borne illness cannot be smelled or tasted. Prevention is safe food handling and taking precautions to correctly serve and hold food at the correct temperatures to reduce the risk of spoiling your dinner party. Falling leaves dancing o'er brightly green lawn


All senses enhancing - what a beautiful dawn!



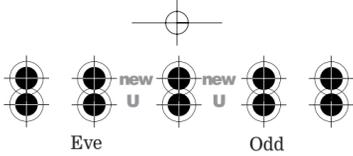

Sweet Potato Biscuits



INGREDIENTS: • 1¼ cups all-purpose flour • 2 heaping tablespoons sugar • 4 teaspoons baking powder • 1/2 teaspoon salt • ¾ cup mashed cooked sweet potatoes • ¼ cup (½ stick) softened butter • 2 to 4 tablespoons milk (depending on the moisture of the potatoes)

DIRECTIONS: (1) Preheat the oven to 450 degrees F. (2) Sift together flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. In a separate, large bowl, mix the sweet potatoes and butter. Add the flour mixture to the potato mixture and mix to make a soft dough. Then add milk a tablespoon at a time to mixture and continue to cut in. Turn the dough out onto a floured board and toss lightly until the outside of the dough looks smooth. Roll the dough out to ½-inch thick and cut with a biscuit cutter. Place the biscuits on a greased pan and coat tops with melted butter. Bake for about 15 minutes. (Watch your oven: If the biscuits are browning too fast, lower the temperature.)



Sweet Potato Casserole




INGREDIENTS: • turkey giblets and neck • 1 ½ quarts water • 2 chicken bouillon cubes • 1 onion, quartered • 1 medium carrot, quartered • 2 ribs celery, with leaves • 1 tsp salt • pepper, to taste • 6 tablespoons flour • ½ cup water • 2 hard-cooked eggs, sliced or chopped • ½ to 1 tablespoon Kitchen Bouquet or Gravy Magic

DIRECTIONS: (1) Place the liver in a small bowl and place in refrigerator. Cover neck and remaining giblets with water in a pot. Add bouillon cubes, onion, carrot, celery, salt, and pepper. Simmer, covered, for 1 hour. Add liver and cook 15 minutes longer. Remove turkey to a warm serving platter and place turkey roaster with drippings on stovetop. 



A WILD WEEKEND PLANNED FOR THE 14TH ANNUAL PLANTATION WILDLIFE ARTS FESTIVAL

Saddle Up For St. Jude Trail Ride A Great Success

On Nov. 7, a perfectly beautiful crisp fall day in Madison County, a benefit horseback ride was held east of Lee at the Ellaville Tract of the Twin Rivers State Forest to raise money for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Two area trail riding clubs, the Madison County Trail Riders (MCTR) based in Madison and the South Georgia Trail Riders (SGTR) based in Lowndes County, Ga., joined together to organize and sponsor this event, which was two months in the making.

For those not familiar with facts about St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, here are just a few. It was founded by entertainer, Danny Thomas, and opened in Memphis, Tennessee in 1962 as a pediatric cancer center with the mission to find treatments

and cures for children with cancer and other very serious diseases. Families never pay for treatments not covered by insurance, and no child is ever denied treatment because of the family's inability to pay. The majority of its funding comes from donations

In August of this year, C. B. Knight of Madison County and a member of both riding clubs responsible for this effort, was contacted by a St. Jude Coordinator Support Representative to see if he would like to coordinate a "Saddle Up for St. Jude" riding event. When asking for help, C.B. was greeted with such great enthusiasm from the Madison County and South Georgia Trail Riders that there was no doubt that the much-needed support was available and members were willing and ready to help. Joan Knight, C. B.'s wife and a very special woman and dear friend to members of both trail-riding clubs, had recently lost her battle with cancer in April of 2009. MCTR and SGTR members agreed that sponsoring a benefit ride for St. Jude would be a perfect way to honor Joan's memory while raising money for a very worthy cause. So, C. B. Knight officially became a "Saddle Up for St. Jude" Coordinator. A committee was formed consisting of C. B. Knight, Jackie Kinsey, Jo Williams, Bernita Broome, Carolyn Roddey, Cheryl Keltz, Steve Chaney, Becky Crittenden and Betsy Pertierra.

The Ellaville tract of land owned by the Suwannee River Water Management District and managed by the Florida Division of Forestry was selected for the ride location for several reasons: its close proximity to Madison and Valdosta, its large acreage containing beautiful trails through the woodlands and along the Suwannee River, and last but not least, the size of the trailer parking area to accommodate a large crowd. The date was selected because no hunting was scheduled for the Nov. 7 weekend.

Merchants and banks in the Madison and Val-

dosta area began making donations of merchandise for a silent auction and door prizes. Nestle Waters North America of Madison County donated 600 bottles of water for thirsty riders. Representatives from Little Debbie and Lance donated snack and dessert items for use during lunch. Ted Ensminger of the Madison Chamber of Commerce provided maps and area information for distribution to participants. The Madison County Sheriff's Department provided tables and chairs for the day of the event. Altrua Marketing and Design of Tallahassee donated a custom made 3' x 6' vinyl "Saddle Up for St. Jude" banner and smaller directional signs for use at the ride's entrance. Steve Carpenter of the Florida Division of Forestry issued a Special Use Permit to the riding clubs to allow for trail trimming and access, and had foresters mow an additional parking area. Trails were checked and trimmed by J.L. and Jo Williams, David Crockett, Don Snyder, Steve Chaney and Becky Crittenden. Marcus Lashley, Wildlife Biologist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, provided a water source for the horses, electricity for use as needed and the use of a portable toilet for participants in the event. AAA Porta-Serv of Lake City donated an additional portable toilet. Staff of the Suwannee River Water Management District provided books containing District Lands information as well as door prize items from their R.O. Ranch office. Community support was abundant.

The big day finally arrived and the weather couldn't have been more perfect. Registration began at 7 a.m., with the ride out time set for 9 a.m. Sheriff Posse members Rollie Sieple, C. B. Knight, David

Crockett, Jason Kinsey, Jeremy Kinsey, Rodney Crowell, Ronnie and Kathy Bass, Jackie Kirkland, Laura Sykes and Mike Morris directed the trailer parking on horseback as club volunteers scurried to prepare for registering participants and checking horses for proper paperwork. Betsy Pertierra of the Greenville, Florida and Jefferson County area organized the silent auction with club volunteers while Richard and Carol Cruce of Taylor County set up the P. A. system for announcements and door prize drawings. Richard Cruce officiated as the M. C. for the day's activities.

MCTR and SGTR club members who also helped with just about everything and are not already mentioned elsewhere in this article were Roger and Betty Parsons, Jean Stick, Lauren Williams, Lynn Corbin, Cindy Crowell, Sandra Kulikowsky, Barbara Grimm, Carol Candler, Pat Shartran and Valerie Lawson. This entire

event was possible because members of MCTR and SGTR helped whenever and wherever needed.

Members of the Madison County 4-H Saddles and Spurs Club, assisted by organizational Leaders, Jacinda Jesse and Sonya Morris with help from Donny Salter and Jake Bentley, began an early set up for lunch, which they prepared and sold for \$5 per plate. It consisted of a delicious Bar B Q sandwich with baked beans, coleslaw, dessert, chips and a drink. Providing lunch for this crowd of trail riders was such a very important part of this fund raising event and during a break from the door prize drawings, 4-H Saddles and Spurs Secretary, Tara Redditt, presented half of the 4-H lunch profits in the amount of \$168.50 to C. B. Knight as a donation to St. Jude!

Prior to the official start of the trail ride, Delbert Redditt, Pastor of the Faith Baptist Church of Madison, delivered a beautiful prayer. Sixty eight horseback riders from the local area, surrounding counties and even as far away as Tampa and Rome, Ga. participated in the 3 hour, 10 mile ride lead by "Trail Boss," J. L. Williams, through this beautiful woodland along the Suwannee River. Some riders had actually never ridden along the river and were thrilled to view it from horseback. Outriders, Don Snyder, David Crockett, Ron Smoak and Jo Williams maintained walkie-talkie contact with the trail boss as posse members assisted when needed. Bottled water was handed out by SGTR members, Chuck May and Patti Baumgardner, about half way through the ride.

Combining sponsor monies donated by club members, the 4-H Saddles and Spurs donation, ride fees, silent auction and door prize ticket sales, approximately \$3,100 was raised for the St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. The exact amount has not yet been determined since some sponsorship monies are not in at this time. What a great success...what a great Trail Ride!!! Be on the lookout for future "Saddle Up for St. Jude" Trail Rides in our area. There will definitely be more!!

A very special "Thank You" goes out from the Madison County and South Georgia Trail Riders to all who contributed in some way to this beautiful day for St. Jude. God had provided the opportunity for all to give something back.


