## Madison County Resident Has New Job As Assistant Coach At Tennessee State University

Former Cowboys standout, scholarship recipient at Tennessee Tech, and walk-on student-athlete to team captain at FSU, Mikhal Kornegay has been named a defensive assistant coach on the staff of Head Coach Rod Reed at Tennessee State University in Nashville, TN.

Mikhal is excited for this opportunity; he states, "I feel very blessed to have this opportunity. This will definitely be a stepping stone and a learning experience at the same time."

Mikhal, the son of Chiquita and Cedric Kornegay of Greenville, participated four years in football and track at Madison County High School, including being on the winning state football championship team his senior year; he then played one year on scholarship at Tennessee Tech before returning to Florida to walk-on at Florida State; playing defensive back and



special teams, Mikhal was named special teams captain his senior season, along with being given a full scholarship.

True to his humble roots, he was ready to take on the challenge, "I was raised the correct way at home and on the field and was always taught that hard work pays off. This all is a blessing from God and comes from the praying knees of my parents."

## Tri-County Health Of Greenville Partners With Local Pharmacy

With the closure of Jackson's Drug Store in Greenville, some Greenville area patients, particularly the elderly and those without transportation, were left with limited or no access to a pharmacy, said Shawn Hamm, Executive Director of Tri-County Health Care of Greenville.

With no local pharmacy to fill their prescriptions, and no means of transportation to the nearest pharmacies in Madison, Perry or Monticello, some of Tri-County Health's patients were left with the prospect of having to do without needed prescriptions.

"I'm happy to report Tri-County Health has found a solution," Hamm told the County Commission.

Tri-County has partnered with North Florida Pharmacy to have patients prescriptions delivered on a weekly basis – every Wednesday afternoon – to Tri-County, where patients can come pick them up.

Hamm added that North Florida Pharmacy was already doing deliveries to other Greeneville area health facilities and were happy to add Tri-County to the list.

## Taskforce Arrests Six



Madison County Sheriff Ben Stewart reports that on Friday, March 16, members of the Madison County Sheriff's Office Drug Taskforce conducted a "Round Up" of persons involved in the illegal sell of controlled substances. The "Round Up" was a result of several months of investigations that involved covert operations concerning these individuals involvement in the illegal drug trade on the streets of Madison County. The operation resulted in six separate arrests and additional arrests remain pending.

## Goliath And Bebe's World Now A Licensed Sanctuary

Goliath and Bebe's World, a no-kill animal sanctuary in Madison County, is now in full compliance with the county's ordinance concerning excess animals, Animal Control Director Jamie Willoughby told the County Commissioners at their March 21 meeting.

Willoughby had inspected the premises a few days prior to the meeting, and based on his findings, recommended that the commission grant the facility the necessary permit, making them a fully licensed sanctuary and animal habitat. The permit would be good for one year, at which time animal control would make annual follow-up inspections and the facility would apply for renewals.

## MCHS Baseball Begins "Rally 4 Ryan"

Asking Community To Help Support Ryan Casler and Family

The Madison County High School baseball team is asking the community to help them support a local family in need. The team is raising money and awareness for a boy that many people in the community might not never heard of.

Ryan Casler has been through more in the short 11 years he has been alive, than many people will go through in their entire lives. Ryan is in the 5th grade at Pinetta Elementary School, and like many boys his age, he loves video games and playing on the computer. He also loves wrestling and knows a lot of facts about different wrestlers. However, Ryan is not a typical 11 year old.

Ryan's life has been a struggle since day one. He was born at 25 weeks, and only weighed 1 lb. 14 oz. Then at 8 months, he was diagnosed with hydrocephalus, fluid on the brain, and had to have a ventriculo-peritoneal shunt placed going from

his brain to his stomach. While recovering from surgery, he contracted respiratory syncytial virus and pneumonia. At one and a half years old, his family discovered that Ryan had congenital glaucoma. Due to his dangerously elevated eye pressure, Ryan became one of the first babies at Shands to undergo glaucoma surgery.

At three and a half, Ryan's hips collapsed, this is known as

legg perthes disease, and he was forced to wear

leg braces for the next two years. His

hips never properly reformed and by

the age of six he developed rheumatoid arthritis and hip dysplasia. At

seven, Ryan had a cyst removed from

his neck and ended up developing an

infection that put him under intensive

care. It was not much later that the

We are still in March, National Nutrition Month, so this week, let's look at another updated recommendation from the revised Dietary Guidelines. Americans need to work on reducing daily consumption of two food categories; solid fats and added sugars. A new acronym, SoFAS has been coined by USDA to describe this trend in the American meal patterns; the "SoF" stands for solid fat and the "AS" represents added sugars. While the intention is a catchy phrase, it might leave some people confused.

Let's break this down and look at solid fats (SoF) first. Fats are categorized into three groups known as fatty acids; they can be saturated, polyunsaturated and monounsaturated. All fats contain a combination of three fats, but they are in different amounts. Saturated fats are solid at room temperature; the exceptions are palm and coconut oils. These fats tend to raise cholesterol levels in the human body, which over time can cause a plaque build-up in blood vessels leading to coronary heart disease. Foods high in saturated fats are meat, whole dairy and baked products made with palm or coconut oil.

Healthier fats are liquid at room temperature, are higher in poly or monounsaturated fats and do not contribute to cholesterol levels. Oils that are high in monounsaturated fats are canola, safflower, olive and peanut oils. Examples of polyunsaturated fats are corn, cotton seed and soy bean oil. This gives you a variety of fats to use, but always use fats sparingly.

Trans fats are also a fat that can lead to increased cholesterol levels, these are formed during food processing. When hydrogen is added to a fat to make it more solid, trans fats are formed making the fat more saturated. Synthetic trans fatty acids are found in margarines, snack foods, peanut butter and pre-

pared desserts. Small amounts are naturally found in meat and milk foods.

How does all of this information translate into the food choices you make every day? Eat lean cuts of meat and choose low-fat and fat-free dairy foods to reduce solid fats and naturally occurring trans fats. Consume less prepared desserts and snacks to reduce trans fats and saturated fats that are added to foods as an ingredient.

Consumers always have questions about margarine, there are so many on the market. Read the ingredient list and start with a spread that has a monounsaturated fat as the major ingredient. Then, read the nutrition label and find the smallest amount of saturated and trans fats with a higher number of unsaturated fats.

In food preparation, both monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fats are much better alternatives to solid fats. While they still have the same amount of calories, unsaturated fats have a more positive effect in your body.

Now, for the "AS" or added sugars in SoFAS, by itself, it is not a bad ingredient and it adds sweetness to our foods and serves as a browning agent in many foods and most have few nutrients, and are high in calories. According to the Dietary Guidelines, added sugar contributes an average of 16% of the total calories in the American diet. This translates into added calories and excess calories can only mean extra pounds.

Sugars come in many forms. Read the nutrition labels, added sugars may be

high fructose corn syrup, corn syrup, malt syrup, maple syrup, fructose, dextrose molasses or honey.

Can you guess the food source highest consumption of added sugar? Sugary drinks like soda, energy drinks and sport drinks account for 36% of extra sugar in our diet. Sugar sweetened fruit drinks account for about 10% of the extra calories in the American diet. Sweetened tea, which adds extra calories to our Southern diet is a sweetened drink. The message is to cut back on foods high in sugar; eat or drink them less often.

Solid fats and added sugar can contribute a large portion of calories to the American diet. It is estimated that on average 800 calories per day come from these two food ingredients. Remember too, most foods that are high in these ingredients are also low in other nutrients and it is well documented these foods contribute to weight gain. The recommendation from USDA is to eat these foods less often. Instead, focus on nutrient-dense forms of foods from all food groups.

In his last seasons with the Seminoles, he has had the chance to work under blossoming Coach Mark Stoops. Mikhal is appreciative of the exposure and experiences, "Learning from great coaches like Mickey Andrews, Bobby Bowden, Mark Stoops, Lawrence Dawsey, and many others, I'm sure I'll be fine."

Showing a propensity to cross again bridges once traveled, Mikhal now returns to where he started his college career, in the state of Tennessee; Tennessee State University is one of the oldest Historically Black Colleges and Universities, and has traditionally fielded good football teams, and of course, has an outstanding band; the 9,000 plus students there come from all over the world. Last year's football team finished 5-6 including a season

family learned that Ryan suffers from left sided cerebral palsy. Because his left side is so much weaker than his right, Ryan has problems doing daily tasks like buttoning buttons and zipping zippers.

Just when it seemed like things couldn't get worse, Ryan began suffering from severe headaches, numbness in his fingers and toes, fatigue and back aches. An MRI revealed that he had chiari malformation with a syrinx present. This means that the brain tissue is protruding into this spinal canal. This causes the skull to press on the brain and push it downward into the spine. The syrinx is a pocket of fluid on the spine that stops the fluid from getting to the brain.

Then in September, doctors discovered that Ryan's shunt had stopped working. They went to Shands on September 27 and had his shunt replaced. During surgery, Ryan's ventricles collapsed and he lost all of the fluid from them. The doctors removed him from surgery to get a CAT scan and then back into surgery. The doctors discovered that Ryan had so much scar tissue that his shunt had grown into it.

In December, after visiting his dad, the family noticed that Ryan's whole head began twitching and his eyes blinking too much. It came to be so bad that his whole head would twitch continuously for hours at a time. The twitching caused Ryan to be in so much pain that at times he did not even want to leave his house. He was put on pain medication and muscle relaxers, but all that Ryan could think was "Why me?"

Then last month, the family went back to Jacksonville for a repeat MRI. Though they all prayed for good results, that is not what they received. The doctor informed them that the syrinx had gotten larger and

a second one had formed as well. The pressure from his brain had caused him to have three herniated disks in his back. Surgery could no longer wait. They were told not to wait more than a month or two because if they did then Ryan could become paralyzed.

So Ryan went into surgery on Wednesday, March 21. The surgery is the chiari decompression. It is suppose to remove part of his skull and tissue from his brain. The surgery has a 90 percent success rate. It should allow the brain to have the room it needs and the syrinx to dissolve and allow the fluid to flow normally from his brain.

In order to help Ryan and his family handle the expenses involved with surgery and traveling to hotels, the MCHS Baseball team will be putting out donation buckets in local stores, restaurants and offices for community members to donate to. They recently donated 100 percent of the money made at one of the home games including ticket sales and concession stand profits. That total ended up being \$700. There is a bank account open at Madison Community Bank for the Rally 4 Ryan and anyone can make a donation to help Ryan and his family. The team will also make announcements and accept donations during every home game. The money raised will also be used to help Ryan go on his fifth grade end of the year trip to Tennessee. Going on that trip is one of Ryan's biggest goals right now.

Ryan's mother, Tawny, works at Ken's Bar-B-Q. She said, "I would like to thank all of the community so much for all they have done. They have put a smile back on Ryan's face that hasn't been there for a long time. We really appreciate all that everyone is doing."

### HEALTHY PRAYER NEEDED

On March 26, the Supreme Court will begin hearings regarding the constitutionality of portions of the Affordable Care Act. 

Madison. We had a jewelry store and several department stores too. We have lost all of that. I believe that the population has stayed about the same, but the commercial businesses have faded away."



## SRWMD Board Declares April As Water Conservation Month

The Suwannee River Water Management District (District) governing board has joined with other agencies and local governments throughout Florida in designating April as Water Conservation Month.

The proclamation, adopted by the board earlier this week, calls upon residents, businesses and visitors to protect our precious water resources by practicing and promoting conservation measures both indoors and outdoors.

"We're asking the public to water as little as possible," said Jon Dinges, District director of Water Supply and Re-

source Management.

A long-term rainfall deficit, declining river and lake levels, and record low groundwater levels have prompted the District to call for increased conservation.

Landscape irrigation accounts for the largest percentage of household water use in Florida; therefore, the greatest amount of water savings can be achieved by reducing outdoor irrigation and following other Florida-Friendly Landscaping™ principles.

"We strongly encourage the use of Florida-Friendly Landscaping™ and skipping irrigation days when it

rains near the time you plan to irrigate," said Dinges.

Although the mandatory, year-round landscape irrigation rule allows lawn and landscape watering two days per week during Daylight Saving Time (but not between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.) residents are urged to water as little as possible.

Ways to save water indoors include checking for leaks; installing low-flow, water-efficient showerheads, faucets and toilets; and purchasing water-efficient appliances such as clothes washers and dishwashers when shopping for new ones.
