Previously, this season, the Cowboys beat Providence 48-6 in a game played Sept. 28 in Jacksonville.


Should the Cowboys win this rematch, they will face the winner of the

Phantom Vehicle Involved In Crash

A total of \$12,000 in damages occurred to two vehicles in an accident on NE Rocky Ford Road, approximately .25 miles south of Almond Avenue, on Monday evening, Nov. 12.

According to a Florida Highway Patrol report, an unknown vehicle

was stopped in the northbound travel lane of Rocky Ford Road, facing south at the bottom of a hill.

At the same time, a 1996 Chevrolet Caprice, driven by Tyler N. Brinson, 24, of Madison, was stopped on the east shoulder of the roadway in the driveway of the Madison County Road Department, facing south alongside

the unidentified vehicle.

Lee M. FerDon, 70, of Pinetta, was traveling north in a 2002 Ford Windstar, approaching the hill, and was unaware of the phantom vehicle causing an obstruction.

FerDon traveled over the hill and attempted to take evasive action to avoid the vehicle by traveling onto the

east shoulder of the roadway.

The Windstar struck the Caprice in a head-on collision type traffic crash.

The unknown vehicle fled the scene of the traffic crash.

No one was injured in the crash. FHP Trooper Manuel J. Smyrniotis was the investigating officer.

Next week, most households will be putting a turkey on the table. That bird is bigger than the other poultry you cook during the year; sometimes people want to take short cuts, or they forget how to "handle the thing" as one caller told me. The U.S. Department of Agriculture has established food safety guidelines for preparing your holiday bird; so once again, I'm sharing those recommendations with you. Hopefully, it will make your Thanksgiving feast an easy meal to prepare.

Picking the right turkey

Bigger is not always the best choice. Turkeys come in all sizes to fit everyone's holiday meal plan. They can be purchased whole or in parts, suitable for small families or those who have a preference for white or dark meat. They come fresh, frozen, self-basting or pre-stuffed. Some people buy the biggest bird they can find so they will have enough to serve guests with leftovers for sandwiches only to find they have leftover turkey for weeks. Because a turkey has bones, you can estimate one pound of turkey per person, so if you serving 15 people, look for a 15-16 pound turkey. You will have enough for your Thanksgiving celebration with leftovers for turkey sandwiches.

Thawing a turkey

People have been so create over the years, they fill the bath tub with water or leave it inside a paper bag on the counter top; neither method is recommended and would cause food safety issues. The safest method for thawing a turkey is in the refrigerator. Of course, the bigger the turkey the longer it will take. Plan to purchase your turkey far enough in advance to thaw in the refrigerator. Here is a quick guide:

Whole turkey

8 to 12 pounds - 1 to 2 days
12 to 16 pounds - 2 to 3 days
16 to 20 pounds - 3 to 4 days
20 to 24 pounds - 4 to 5 days

Pieces of large turkey

half, quarter, half breast - 1 to 2 days

If it's the day before and you forgot to thaw the bird, don't panic. It can be safely thawed in cold water, providing you change the water frequently. Keep the bird in its original wrap and make sure there are no tears, and place in the sink or a large pan and cover with water. Change the water every 30 minutes to be sure the water stays cold.

Thawing Time in Cold Water

8 to 12 pounds - 4 to 6 hours

Roasting Your Turkey

Set the oven no lower than 325 F. Pre-heating is not necessary. Be sure the turkey is completely thawed because times are based on fresh or completely thawed birds at a refrigerator temperature of 40° F or below.

Most turkeys come with roasting instruction that can be easily followed. USDA recommend placing the turkey breast-side up on a flat wire rack in a shallow roasting pan 2 to 2 ½ inches deep. Add ½ cup of water to the bottom of the pan. Loosely tent the bird with aluminum foil for 1 to ½ hours, then remove from browning. Or, a tent of foil may be placed over the turkey after the turkey has reached the desired golden brown.

If a meat thermometer is not available, cook stuffing in a casserole. Mix ingredients just before oven cooking and if you stuff your bird, stuff it loosely. Additional time is required for the turkey and stuffing to reach a safe internal temperature.

For safety and doneness, the internal temperature should be checked with a meat thermometer. The temperature must reach 180°F in the thigh of a whole turkey (center of the stuffing should reach 165° F) before removing it from the oven. Cook a turkey breast to 170° F, juices should be clear. In the absence of a meat thermometer, pierce an unstuffed turkey with a fork in several places; juices should be clear with no trace of pink.

A pre-stuffed turkey should not be thawed, follow the roasting instructions that come with the bird.

Let the turkey stand 20 minutes before removing stuffing and carving.

Red, White and True Mysteries

One-Hit Wonder's Novel A Thing Of Beauty

This is the story of Anna Sewell (1820 - 1878), an author who wrote only one book in her short literary career. This one-hit wonder, though, created a classic.

Like many authors, her name is unknown to most people. She only attained great fame after she died.

The main character of Anna's story's became very famous, though. In fact, there have been five movies written about the character since Anna penned her one and only novel back in 1877.

Born in England, she was the older of Isaac and Mary Sewell's two children. Her mother was a successful author of children's books, and Anna helped edit her books. This experience contributed to Anna's own success as an author.

When she was 14 years old, she injured both of her ankles one day when she fell on her way home from school. Her injury was treated incorrectly, and she walked with crutches for the rest of her life. She often used horse-drawn carriages to get around, and this also contributed to her success as an author.

You see, the purpose of her one and only book was to create a kinder

treatment of horses. It became an immediate best-seller, and has since sold more than 50 million copies to become one of the best-selling books ever written.

Yet when she wrote the book, from 1871 to 1877, her health was so bad that she could barely get out of bed.

It is not all that uncommon to see an author use a first-person, autobiographical style to tell a story these days, but Anna Sewell was one of the very first authors to use this narrative style when she wrote her novel. What made this style interesting, though, was that the main character of her story was a horse.

This meant that - you guessed it - you get the story straight from the horse's mouth (sorry, but I couldn't resist).

And just who was this famous horse, who had five movies made about him?

None other than Black Beauty.

In the first movie, released in 1946, Black Beauty was played by a horse named Highland Dale, who also played the title role of the TV show, *Fury*. Highland Dale was the second-highest paid animal actor in Hollywood at the time, trailing

only Lassie.

As the book successfully inspired good treatment of horses, it also inspired good treatment of people, and even though Anna Sewell did not originally intend for it to become a children's book, it has always been a hit with children.

AND THE WINNER IS?

An era of realignment of the voters is occurring, in Madison County. Disenchanted majority Democrats, once called "Yellow Dog Democrats," have bolted and changed the political face of our county, beginning with the Presidential election of 1964.

Only hard-core liberals still feel at home in the Democrat Party of today.

Madison's Story

That story is told with a look at how Madison County has voted, in presidential elections, from 1964, to this year's election.

1964

For the first time, Madison County gave its majority vote to a Republican candidate. A sea change began. The county gave Barry Goldwater the majority vote, 2,822 to Lyndon Baines Johnson's 2,121. Both State and nationally, LBJ wins going away.

1968

In this contest, the yellow dog Democrats came in second to the candidacy of George Wallace. Wallace created his own party, running on a platform that States' determined policy, not the courts. Wallace received 2,703 votes, Hubert H. Humphrey 1,378, and Richard Nixon, 654.

1972

Madison backs Nixon, 3,206 against regular Democrat George McGovern, who received 1,187 votes.

1976

North Florida is partial to Georgia politicians. Jimmy Carter was no exception. So it was no surprise that Carter carried the vote, 3,218 to the Republicans Gerald Ford, who received 1,761 votes.

1980

Still being partial to Southern Democrats, Jimmy Carter received 3,129 votes to Ronald Reagan's vote of 2,275.

1984

Walter Mondale's announcement that he would increase taxes gave Madison to Republican Ronald Reagan, in his re-election bid, 2,816 to Democrat Mondale's 2,101.

1988

The Massachusetts Liberal, Michael Dukakis, was easily dispatched by Ronald Reagan's GOP Vice President, George H.W. Bush. Dukakis, the tank driver, received 1,950 votes, to Presidential candidate Bush's vote of 2,556.

1992

William Clinton's bid was supported in Madison County with 2,200 votes; with the incumbent George H. W. Bush's re-election bid stymied at 1,750 votes.

1996

Democrat President William Clinton's re-election bid garnered 2,791 votes. The Republican, Robert Dole, carried off 2,195 votes.

2000

In one of the closest elections in American history, Madison's vote turned out to be pivotal. George Bush carried the county, with 3,038 votes. Close behind, was Albert Gore's 3,011. The Florida results had Bush winning by only 537 votes.

2004

For re-election, President George Bush received 4,197 county votes, against another Massachusetts Liberal, John Kerry's 4,050 votes.

2008

In the election between John McCain and Barack Obama, McCain carried the County, with 4,544 votes. Obama received 4,270 votes.

2012

In another close election, Mitt Romney led the Madison Republican team to victory, with 4,474 votes. Obama receiving 4,174 county votes.

Seniors Shine As Aucilla Closes With 35-6 Win Over Bronson, Finish 8-2

On a crisp, cold Friday night in Aucilla, seven young men made the inevitable transition from the present to the past, from now to nostalgia. Seven senior football careers, some four years in the making, others spanning eight years or more, joined the ranks of the "remember whens" in the lifelong rite of the ending of good things as the final whistle sounded in the final game of the season.

The last one was memorable, to be sure. It ended with nearly 6 minutes left in the fourth quarter as the opposing squad from Bronson was disqualified due to unsportsmanlike conduct, a testament to equal parts of an approaching 35-6 Aucilla victory and Eagle frustration.

Fittingly, the final contest was the Warrior homecoming, an appropriate setting of fireworks, courts, and festivity that seemed to echo the one word that best described the evening: goodbye.

It was a game of highs, of record breaking performances, none more so than senior receiver Jared Jackson. Jackson, who already held the single season Aucilla record for receiving yards with his 1,138 yard junior season, shattered his own mark Friday evening with his two catch, 73 yard, one touchdown game that now sets the record at 1,209 yards, an incredible 120 yards per game average. Jackson also contributed 16 receiving touchdowns this year as the Warriors' most dangerous deep threat.

Just as impressively, Aucilla's own split backfield of senior running back stars Hans Sorensen and Bradley Holm secured dual 1,000 yard rushing seasons that effectively powered a Warrior offense that grinded its way to its first eight win season since 1993, before any current players were born.

Holm himself lacked only 53 yards to reach the 1,000 yard milestone entering into this game, gaining 79 bruising yards and a touchdown on only six carries to bring his season rushing totals to 119 carries for 1,026 yards and 16 touchdowns, an impressive 8.6 yards per carry.

Sorensen finished Friday night's game with 92 yards and two touchdowns on 11 carries, compiling a team-high season statistical total of 129 carries for 1,138 yards and 19 touchdowns, an 8.8 yards per carry average.

The two, affectionately known as the Two-Headed Monster, have been the single most important driving force behind an offense that exceeded all expectations after last year's veteran offensive senior class was lost to graduation, amassing 4,159 yards of total offense and 61 total touchdowns in only 10 games, 2,164 yards and 35 touchdowns of which belong directly to Holm and Sorensen.

Sophomore quarterback Wesley Smyrniotis finished the season on a high note with a workman-like 5-8, 186 yard, three touchdown and one interception performance that caps his season at 1,995 yards passing and 26 touchdowns with only 8 interceptions. While Smyrniotis did struggle in some high profile matchups, he looks to have made great strides in poise and mechanics and will clearly be the key to Aucilla's offense in future.

Rounding out the offensive stars was senior receiver Tres Copeland, the human blur, whose lateral speed produced touchdown catches of 65 and 40

yards Friday, as well as 30 yards rushing. Copeland finished the contest with 135 combined rushing and receiving yards, as well as the two touchdown receptions. For the season Copeland finished with nearly 800 yards of all-purpose production and seven touchdowns, including an electrifying 70 yard punt return for a touchdown against St. Francis.

Aucilla did struggle defensively early in this contest as Bronson clearly tested the middle of the Warrior rushing defense with what was an extremely active inside running game. However, this conservative game plan was the very reason why Bronson could not keep pace as Aucilla's explosive offense scored early and often, and simply outlasted the Eagles' offensive drives.

Leading the Aucilla defense once again, a unit which has rendered on average 10.9 points per contest, including four shutouts this year, was the emotional heart and soul of the front seven, senior linebacker Gus Smyrniotis. In the last action of his Aucilla career, Smyrniotis totaled 17 tackles, including an incredible 10 solo tackles. Amazingly, despite missing the first two games of the season, Smyrniotis finished the year with 124 total tackles, eight tackles for loss, and three sacks.

Nipping at Smyrniotis' heels was Holm, who also serves as outside linebacker for the Warriors, totaling 16 tackles for the evening, including one sack and one tackle for loss. For the season, Holm finished with 116 total tackles, nine tackles for loss, and six sacks.

Contributing from his position at safety, Sorensen totaled 13 tackles and one interception, bringing his season total to 73 total tackles and 8 interceptions as Sorensen terrorized opposing quarterbacks.

Rounding out the notable defensive games was sophomore defensive tackle Cole Schwab, who had 12 total tackles. Schwab turned in one of the great seasons in Aucilla history for a defensive tackle, totaling 75 tackles, 10 sacks, five tackles for loss, and two fumble recoveries, one of which he returned for a touchdown.

Among the other outstanding contributing defenders this season were underclassmen and seniors alike, including senior linebacker Jared Jackson, who finished the year with 103 tackles, four interceptions, eight tackles for loss, and two sacks; sophomore defensive end Casey Demott, who finished with 52 tackles, five sacks, four tackles for loss, and two fumble recoveries; sophomore defensive end Nick Roberts, who finished with 44 tackles, four sacks, four tackles for loss, and two fumble recoveries; and Brandon Holm, who finished with 57 tackles, three tackles for loss, and two fumble recoveries.

Head coach Colby Roberts, who has now finished his sophomore season with a 15-5 record in which he has outscored his opponents by a margin of 735-263, summed up the season by saying, "I am proud to be a part of this team, to lead this group of young men to what they've been working toward for the better part of two years. So much blood, sweat, and tears has gone into the success that we've built. It's overwhelming, and I sincerely hope that this is a sign of things to come for Aucilla. This coaching staff wants to bring the Warriors back to a place of respect in the eyes of our peers, and I believe that we're well on our way. There is still a lot of work to be done, but we're going to enjoy this for now."

Thinking of the life of Vicar Ben Pfeil and his preaching of God's message of love and forgiveness all the years.


The urgency of making sure one if ready to meet God at the end of Life is the timely message preachers give.

Remembrance of Things Past: Elesta Pritchett

Elesta Pritchett was born and raised in Greenville and she has dedicated a large portion of her life to improving and giving back to the community that raised her. Pritchett was not only a teacher for many years in Greenville, she also served the Town of Greenville and has made many efforts to improve the economics of the city.

Pritchett spent her youth moving around the Town of Greenville following her father's work. Her father worked for several mills in the town including Prince Mill and Charlotte Creek Mill. Working for these mills had her father moving from the New Chapel community to Shamrock and to other places in the town. One of the moves took the family to a place that Pritchett's mother didn't feel was safe for her children, so the kids stayed with their grandmother during that time.

Pritchett attended New Zion Baptist Church School for a short period of time before her mother moved her to the New Chapel School. The New Chapel School was a one-room school house. Pritchett then went to Greenville Training School and Greenville High School. She dropped out at 17 to get married and have a family. She had a job working for the mill for a while before they closed down and then after she had her last child she decided to go back to school. "I wanted to get an education and a good job so that I could do good for my children and show them that it was possible," she said. Pritchett began attending a GED program that was held at the Greenville Training School in 1959 and received her GED and diploma in 1960. From 1961 till 1963 she attended Suwannee River Junior College. She rode the school bus every day for two years from her home in Greenville to campus. She graduated with her Associate in Arts degree in 1963. After receiving her AA she decided to continue her education at Florida A&M University. She took the Greyhound bus from Greenville to Tallahassee three days a week (Monday, Wednesday and Friday). She would board the bus at the drug store in Greenville, take that bus to Tallahassee and then take a city bus to the FAMU campus. On Tuesdays and Thursdays she was able to stay home with her youngest son and spend the afternoons with her older children. She graduated with her Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education in 1965.

In 1965 Pritchett began teaching in Greenville. She taught almost every grade that they offered throughout her career. While she was teaching, she also began taking night and summer courses through FAMU to receive her Masters degree. At the same time, her second son was attending college to get her BS in Elementary Education. The two graduated together. She with her Masters in Elementary Education and he with his BS in Elementary Education, in 1971. She continued working for the Greenville school for 38 years until she retired in 2003.

Aside from teaching, Pritchett has also been active with the Town of

Greenville. She has served as a councilperson for the Town of Greenville for 19 years. She also served as mayor at one time. Pritchett is very active in many other organizations as well. She is the President of Mission Ministries at her church, New Zion Missionary Baptist. She is the President of the Madison Ministers, Deacons, Laymen's Union's Women's Auxiliary. She is the District President of the First Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Association's Woman Auxiliary and the third Vice President of Florida General Baptist Convention's Woman Auxiliary. She is active in the Zeta Pi Beta sorority, a member of the Madison County Economic Development team, the Madison County Senior Citizens board and she is a member of the Chamber of Commerce.

Pritchett has also been instrumental in bringing the spotlight to the fact that Ray Charles was born and raised in the Town of Greenville. She was friends with Ray Charles during her youth and knew him very personally. The two lived very close together for a long time. She tried to stay in contact with him once he left Greenville, but according to Pritchett, due to his manager not giving him the information, Ray Charles did not get the invitations she sent him. After Charles' death, she and Jim Parish went to Tallahassee to get the state to help them build a few monuments in Ray Charles' childhood home. They received \$48,000 that helped build the replica of Ray Charles' childhood house that currently is in Greenville. The state also supplied the money to build the statue that is still in town.

Pritchett said of Greenville, "It's such a nice place to live and I love it. Everybody knows everybody and the people here are caring. I don't know about everyone, but a lot of the people I deal with are church going and good people. I wouldn't want to live anywhere else and I will try to stay here for as long as I can. I know there is not much here now, but there used to be. I hope that one day we will get something going that will help that all come back here one day."




