## Greenville Man Killed

A Greenville man was killed in a one-vehicle wreck on Christmas afternoon, Dec. 25.

According to a Florida Highway Patrol report, Drew Chappel Dyess, 55, was traveling west on Interstate 10 in the outside lane, approaching the 246-mile marker.

Dyess' 2000 GMC Sierra pickup traveled in a northwesterly direction across the paved apron and onto the grass shoulder. The pickup continued traveling in the same direction down the grassy sloped shoulder, where the front of it collided with a tree on the north shoulder.

Dyess' pickup came a final rest at the point of impact, facing northwest.

The Madison County Sheriff's Office, Madison County EMS and the Madison and Greenville fire departments assisted the FHP at the scene.

FHP Trooper John Sleighter was the investigating officer.



## GOVERNOR APPOINTS CLYDE ALEXANDER TO VACANT COUNTY COMMISSION SEAT

Governor Rick Scott today announced the appointment of Clyde Alexander Jr. to the Madison County Board of County Commissioners, District 4.



Alexander, 63, of Madison, is currently the director of fitness and wellness and minority recruiter at North Florida Community College. Alexander previously served on the School Board of Madison County from 1986 to 2012. He received his bachelors' degree from Canisius College and his

master's degree from Florida A&M University.

He will fill a vacant seat and is appointed for a term beginning December 21, 2012, and extending for the period of suspension, not to extend beyond the term.

Alexander fills the seat that was vacated by Alfred Martin, after he was suspended by Gov. Scott, following his arrest for grand theft.

## Man Charged With Leaving The Scene And DUI

A Madison man was charged with leaving the scene of an accident and DUI following a wreck on Yellow Pine Avenue early Wednesday morning, Dec. 26.

According to a Florida Highway Patrol report, Joseph L. Carter, 36, was traveling north on Yellow Pine Avenue, driving a 1972 Chevrolet pickup.

Carter said he was on his cell phone at the time and that he traveled north across the northbound lane of Yellow Pine Avenue onto the west shoulder where he struck a mailbox and a shrub with the front left of the pickup.

Carter left the scene and was later found at a residence on Brickyard Pond Road.

Carter was impaired and was arrested for DUI, DUI with property damage, leaving the scene and careless driving.

The Madison County Sheriff's Office assisted the FHP at the scene.

FHP Trooper Chuck Swindle was the investigating officer.

## County Commission Meets For Last Time in 2012

At the 4 p.m. public hearing on Dec. 19, the county commission voted to adopt the new flood plain management ordinance that would replace Madison County's 2010 flood plain ordinance and bring its flood plain management, building codes and policies into compliance with FEMA requirements.

Jeanne Bass of the Planning and Zoning Board explained the dif-

ference between the old and new ordinances: The 2010 ordinance stated that only structures serving as dwellings in floodplain areas had to be elevated - along the river, that means the structure's first floor must be at least two feet above the 'base flood level.'

The new ordinance requires that not only dwellings, but all buildings over 300 square feet, or any structures with plumbing and utility connections, no matter

what size, be elevated. Also, any structures under 300 square feet, without utility and plumbing connections, will either have to be mobile, so they can be moved if a flood threatens, or securely tied down in some manner.

Bass further explained that, although the elevation requirements for properties along the river had already been measured and determined, eleva-

# Red, White and True Mysteries

## 14<sup>th</sup> – Century Saint Shares A Coincidence With Writer's Family

Last week's story was about art imitating life. This week's story is about life imitating life, with history repeating itself. Well, sort of ...

Rita Mancini was born in Cascia, Italy, in 1381. She was canonized a saint in 1900. Saint Rita was an only child born to Antonio and Amata. Her parents were very religious Catholics who were very respected as the peacekeepers in their town. Any time someone had a dispute, it was Antonio and Amata who solved it.

Saint Rita was every bit as pious as her parents, and she planned on becoming a nun. As her parents aged, she attended to their every need. Antonio and Amata, though, wanted her to marry, and they even chose her future husband for her. He came from a very successful family, and appeared to be a good and decent man at first.

Saint Rita was just 12 years old when she married, and her husband proved to be very difficult to live with. He had a bad temper and would get angry at nearly everything she said or did. Yet through her patience and humility, she converted him into a good man.

She and her hus-

band had two sons. Then, after 18 years of marriage, Saint Rita's husband was killed by a member of a rival family. Saint Rita publicly forgave her husband's killer while at his funeral, but her two sons vowed revenge upon their father's killer. When Saint Rita encouraged them to forgive her, they ignored her; her two sons both ended up dying a year later of dysentery. Saint Rita went on to become known as the "Saint of the Impossible," and I'm pretty sure that her family life had something to do with that.

Coincidentally, my Mom's name is Rita, and there is something about Saint Rita's story that provides an even bigger coincidence with our family. Saint Rita's husband was named Ferdinand (although some historians referred to him as Paolo).

Ferd is short for Ferdinand, which was also my Dad's name. Saint Rita, meanwhile, was the first person to ever be named Rita, suggesting that her name may have come from God instead of from her parents.

Do you know of any other couples where the husband and wife both have the same names as your parents?

My Dad was very different from Saint Rita's husband, though. My Dad was always telling people about his wonderful wife, because she was the most important person in his life. Unlike Saint Rita's husband, my Dad never had an enemy in his life.

Saint Rita eventually achieved her most important desire in life: To become a nun, which she did at age 36 when she joined the Augustinian order in Cascia. One day, a thorn from a cru-

cifix fell and left a deep wound in Saint Rita's forehead, forming what is known as a stigmata.

The wound never healed, and even carried a terrible odor with it. On the day she died, the odor changed to a beautiful rose-filled scent.

Saint Rita is also credited as being the patron saint of baseball, as stated in the 2002 movie *The Rookie*. The movie is based on a true story about a pro baseball player named Jim Morris, but the scene in which Saint Rita is said to be the patron saint of baseball may have been the result of a producer taking some creative liberty with the film.

and determined, elevation requirements for the south and eastern portions of the county, that were low-lying and prone to flooding, would be determined on a case-by-case basis.

The commission voted to adopt the new flood-plain ordinance.

Another item the board considered was the option on the Pyramid Bakery to repurchase the real property; however, entrepreneur Nazih Sarkis, who has been trying to get the Pyramid Bakery business up and running, told the board members he was about to finishing putting together a new financing deal for the business and asked the board for a one-year extension. In fact, the board of Commissioners had just received a copy of a letter from Sarkis' financing company, stating that a deal was being negotiated.

Commissioner Ronnie Moore asked if there any other small businesses waiting in line to make use of the property, and learned there were none. The Pyramid Bakery is currently the only contender.

The board granted Sarkis the one-year extension.

The board was also looking at costs for replacing the worn carpet in the Courthouse Annex. At the last meeting, they had gotten a price of just over \$6600 for doing just the upstairs and downstairs hallways, plus the old supervisor of Elections Office, and decided to inquire about replacing all the carpet in the entire building in one fell swoop.

The tab for re-carpeting the entire building would be about \$24,000. Clerk of Court Tim Sanders reminded the board that the county had to upgrade the Courthouse's security system next year, a big-ticket item that was required. In view of the upcoming expense for that, the board voted to replace the carpet in just the two hallways and the old elections office as originally planned, and hold off on the rest of the building until a later date.

When it comes to revenue, Madison County may have an under-tapped source right in its own backyard, according to Walt Woodard of Communication Tax Solutions (formerly Cell Tower Solutions).

Woodard, who spoke to the board at the request of Madison County Property Appraiser Leigh Barfield, explained how his company used tech people, who knew the value of such things as cell towers, transmitters, receiving panels and other communication equipment, to go out to sites owned by communications companies and look at the property and equipment. Because they are familiar with such equipment, they know how much it costs and they can also determine the correct useful life and depreciation rate for it.

Many times, Woodard explained, the companies would expense their equipment at the corporate level and it would go unreported and unrecorded in the county where it was actually located. County taxing authorities would lose out on the tax revenue they could have collected if the

equipment were correctly recorded and assessed as personal tangible property of the business.

Woodard also cited examples of companies trying to list almost every piece of equipment on a tower site as "computer equipment" which has a much faster rate of depreciation than other types of digital or electronic equipment. Then there is the practice of communication companies leasing their lines to other carriers, something that frequently escapes the radar of county governments. Other times, the communications managers and directors "on-site," or even several bureaucratic layers up, really don't have any idea what the equipment is worth, because such information is seldom kept together in one place. Instead, it is usually parceled out and "siloed" in several different departments at several different bureaucratic levels within the corporate.

"At this point, it's a 'catch me if you can' situation," Woodard said of the large mega-corporations in the telecommunications industry.

What Woodard's company does is help county governments capture the tax revenue to which they are entitled, by getting all that scattered information back together in one place so the county property appraiser has accurate numbers to work with. It also helps the county permitting office by making sure all the equipment, structure and upgrades are properly permitted and the proper fees are paid.

Using adjacent Jefferson County as an example, Woodward stated that his company helped the tax collector's office there recover nearly \$45,000 in communications property tax revenue, and tripled the assessed value of real property owned by communications companies last year. Now that this property and equipment is correctly listed on Jefferson County's tax rolls, the county will reap the same tax benefit next year without the expense of Woodard's help. His fee is typically 25 percent of the first year's tax revenue recovery.

Barfield told the commission that, based on what she had seen in Jefferson County, she believed that there was a similar source of untapped tax revenue in Madison County, but that the county needed the expertise of Woodard's firm to find it. She was seeking the board's approval to retain Woodard's company, because it would require an amendment to her budget for his services.

Additionally, Madison County's level of communication service is currently 2G; in a few years, communications companies will probably upgrade directly to 4G, a common practice for small, rural areas. That kind of upgrade would mean an upswing in potential tax revenue, if the county already has everything accurately recorded in its tax records.

The commission voted to approve Barfield's request.

With the final item cleared, there appeared to be nothing else on the table, so the several commissioners wished everyone "Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year" as they adjourned.

## MORE UNITED NATIONS NONSENSE

There is a United Nations Organization (UNO) initiative just recently discovered, covertly being implemented, and set to get people upset, big time.

The last session of the Alabama legislation passed a bill to eliminate the effects of the initiative there.

Things are really warming up in the State of Georgia. Seven leading members of the majority State Senate met at the Capitol, with others, for a seminar on Agenda 21. People Are Getting Riled Up!

More and more people are seeking remedial action to stop the implementation of Agenda 21. States are taking the lead to stop this top down approach to government. And a bill has been pre-filed, even here in Florida, to undo what has already slipped through as law.

Recognizing Agenda 21

Part of the problem is that people do not recognize the United Nations Organization at work in their community. Agenda 21 is a document created by the United Nations Organization 20 years ago. It is really a recitation of land-use planning techniques, on steroids. Among the buzzwords that betray influence by Agenda 21 include "best management practices," "historic preservation," "livable communities," "public-private partnerships," "comprehensive plans," "human resource," "zoning," etc.

The influence of Agenda 21 can already be detected in the Florida Department of Community Affairs, the North Florida Regional Planning Commission, and most all other efforts to detach people from their land. Actually, one can almost immediately recognize that some of this predates Agenda 21. This is the agenda currently to control people and their resources. For instance, zoning was declared "legal," by the New York courts, in the 1920's.

People Control

All Agenda 21 does is recognize the methods already used to control people, and their resources, except to dramatically intensify and enlarge that field of government control. The key word is land. And the insatiable desire to register, monitor, quantify and bar code it, gives away government's motives.


Doomsday Book







I've been so blessed, reading Jacob's Higher Call, which I've bought for both of my girls.


We can never say thanks enough for God's love, for the love of our family, of our church family, always, but especially over Christmas as we've been remembered in so many ways.

## Remembrance Of Things Past: Tony Hughey

Few folks can truly call themselves native Madisonians. Tony Hughey is one of the few who can say that honestly. Hughey was born and raised in Madison County and he is concerned that the amount of natives will continue to decline. "There aren't many people who are born in Madison anymore. Most people are born in Tallahassee or Valdosta. It's sad to me," said Hughey.

Hughey lived around Lake Francis for most of his life. He recalls when all of the roads around the lake were dirt. He also recalls that where the Madison First Baptist parsonage currently sits and all of the houses that are across from it used to be woods.

He was born in the front room of his grandparent's house, which was also located around Lake Francis. They lived at the intersection of Macon and Sullivan Street. He recalls his grandmother having a milk cow that she would take down to the lake to let it eat grass. Hughey can also recall when there was an ice plant near Lake Francis. The ice plant was located where the county shop is now. Hughey could also remember when there was a drain by Lake Francis that his grandfather built as a WPA Project during the depression.

Some other memories of Hughey's include when there were seminary buildings were CVS is now. The buildings separated the grades that were housed in them. First and second grade were in one building and third through sixth grade were in the other. Students were sent to the high school starting in seventh grade back then.

"I remember where McDonald's and Odiorne Insurance are now used to be the Vicker's home. They had a pecan orchard. Then past that was the Ragan's Motor Company, then the Henderson family store. The GNF Railroad was right down from that and the Cotton Gin was where the tombstone place is now."

His grandmother, Ida Flower's lived across from there. His parents rented an apartment from her. Eventually the home was purchased by the Phillip's and has since been torn down.

"I remember my grandparents telling me that when they were young there used to be two boats on Lake Francis. Couples could rent a boat and ride on the lake. That was when the water was clear and pretty, before it became so polluted."

On the other side of town, Hughey recalls that past Madison First Baptist Church and the Smith Mansion were homes, not businesses. He remembers when Highway 90 was a two lane, canopy road, covered with oak trees. He also remembers that all of the farmers came to town on Saturday to buy groceries, clothes and school supplies. "Where City Hall is now, was Well's Furniture. Beside that was a lot for the people that drove horse drawn wagons to leave their wagons during the weekend. Back then, there weren't many telephones or TVs, so people got together a lot then. They ate meals together. The kids played together. You were always surrounded by family back then. People didn't sit and stare at cell phones all the time. On Sunday the family al-

ways joined together around the radio."

Hughey recalled his first job, which was counting sticks for one of the shade tobacco farms. During the school year, on the weekends Hughey would work at grocery stores and meat markets. Then during the summer he would work in shade tobacco or help out at Madison's radio station. He also worked helping his uncle, Wallace Williams, during the summer while he was in college. After high school, Hughey joined the Coast Guard for four years. He then worked at the paper mill in Clyattville for a few months before going to school at North Florida Junior College. He then transferred to the University of Florida to get a degree in Forest Management. He worked for pulp and paper companies in the southeast for many years. That job took him away from Madison for a few years, but they were able to move back before he retired. He retired in 1996.

Hughey is married to Frances (Coody) Hughey. She was raised on her family farm near Pinetta. They have a daughter, Robyn, who lives in Phoenix, Arizona with her husband, Steve, who is in the Airforce. Robyn and Steve have two daughters, Tony and Frances' grandchildren, Cate and Bridget.






