

Bomb Threat

A bomb threat was received at the Rogers Professional Center (Madison Dental) on Monday, Jan. 21, at approximately 10:15 a.m.

According to the Madison County Sheriff's Office, Cpl. Jarrod Lauth responded to the call. Upon his arrival, he met with an employee in the office who said that she received the call from a female caller, who told her, "There is a bomb in your bathroom."

She advised that the caller had said nothing else and had hung up the phone.

Lauth completed a check of all the bathrooms in the building. He found nothing suspicious.

The caller ID on the phone said "CenturyLink pay."

Madison Dental was open for business and a number of patients had been in and out of the building prior to the complaint.

Lauth documented the incident in case any future incidents occur.

Arson

The Madison Police Department is looking for information on an arson.

According to MPD reports, on Friday Jan. 18, at 11:30 p.m., Ptl. Troy Stallings was dispatched to Madison Heights Apartment #E-4 on Martin Luther King Dr. in ref. to a structure fire.

On arrival, Stallings assisted Madison Fire Rescue with the fire.

After the fire was extinguished, Fire Chief Bruce Jordan inspected damage and notified the State Fire Marshal's office. On arrival of the Fire Marshal's office, a preliminary investigation was conducted on the cause of the fire.

The State Fire Marshal's office concluded that the fire was arson.

HIGH SPEED CHASE IN LEE AREA ENDS WITH ARREST



Madison County Sheriff Ben Stewart reports that on Wednesday, Jan. 23, at 12:39 p.m., a Sheriff's Deputy attempted a traffic stop on US 90 for a traffic infraction. The vehicle was a 1996 green Ford two-door, occupied by only the driver and traveling in an easterly direction. After stopping the vehicle, the deputy approached the driver, only to have the driver quickly back up and accelerate off. The deputy



Benjamin Joseph Koon initiated a pursuit, engaging blue lights and siren and requested assistance. The pursuit ended at the intersection of CR 255 and Plantation.

A second deputy had positioned himself at

this intersection and deployed a tire deflation device. However, the driver briefly stopped as the deputy unholstered his firearm and ordered the driver to exit the vehicle. The driver refused to follow the lawful commands and accelerated directly towards the deputy. The deputy discharged his firearm, striking the vehicle. The driver lost control of the vehicle and crashed.

Business Burglarized

Madison County Sheriff Ben Stewart reports that on Sunday, Jan. 20, at 9:22 p.m., Cpl. Kevin Stout was on routine patrol and conducting closed business security checks when he pulled into the Pit Stop located at 1407 East Base Street and discovered a large glass window on the West side of the building had been broken out.

Deputy David Myers, along with Captain David Harper, responded to assist Cpl. Stout. Stout and Captain Harper checked the perimeter while Cpl. Stout prepared to clear the interior of the building with K-9 Oynx. No suspect was located. Preliminary investigation showed that the window was broken out by the unknown suspects throwing a brick through it. The business security alarm failed to activate and the Sheriff's Office did not receive an alarm notification from the alarm company nor could an audible alarm be heard.

The Security Video showed that two subjects entered the business through the broken window at 9:04 p.m. and ran behind the counter where they took an undetermined amount of cigarettes before exiting out the same window. The video showed the subjects being dressed in all black with their faces covered and were in and out in approximately 40 seconds. Blood evidence was recovered at the scene suggesting that at least one of the subjects cut themselves on the glass when entering/exiting the building.

This investigation continues and anyone with information is asked to call the Madison County Sheriff's Office at 973-4001 or Crime Stoppers of Madison County at 973-2762. Callers may remain anonymous and may be eligible for a reward.

INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE

Madison County Sheriff Ben Stewart reports that on Tuesday, Jan. 8, Cpl. Kevin Anderson conducted a traffic stop on a black Honda SUV at westbound mile marker 244 on Interstate 10 for illegal window tint.

During the traffic stop, Cpl. Anderson detected a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the Honda. The driver identified himself as Edwin Thomas Mattox of Tallahassee.

Cpl. Anderson noticed that Mattox appeared to be attempting to conceal something in his waistline.

Cpl. Anderson then ordered Mattox out of the Honda and instructed him to walk back to the front of Cpl. Anderson's patrol vehicle. Mattox exited the Honda and walked to the front of the patrol vehicle and attempted to discard something from his pants.



Edwin Mattox Cpl. Anderson immediately grabbed Mattox and could clearly see a large bulge. Cpl. Anderson removed a gallon size plastic bag from Mattox's waistline that contained a large amount of high grade marijuana.

Mattox was placed under arrest without further incident.

The marijuana had a total weight of 8 ounces and had a street value of approximately \$3,200.00.

Mattox was charged with possession of marijuana with intent to distribute.

Suspected Prowler Arrested

Sgt. Pitts and Captain Harper activated emergency lights to stop the subject. The subject turned into a yard and rode the bike around the back of the residence then got off and started to walk away. Sgt. Pitts ordered the subject to stop and he complied stating that he lived there. At that point the metal objects were more visible and recognized to

Two State Pursuit

Madison County Sheriff Ben Stewart reports that on Thursday, Jan. 17, Madison County Sheriff's Office Corporal Jarrod Lauth attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a white Ford F-150 truck on CR 145 near Delphinium Drive. The truck was driven by a white male, later identified as Gene Clyde Wall, 55, of Atlanta, Ga. Wall was operating the truck in a manner that demonstrated wanton disregard for the safety of other motorists, including making sudden stops in the travel lane and driving in the oncoming traffic lane.

Cpl. Lauth activated his blue lights and siren to signal Wall to stop; however, Wall ignored Cpl. Lauth and refused to stop. Wall continued to travel north on CR 145, driving erratically and Cpl. Lauth continued pursuit.

MCSO Captain David Harper and Sgt. Sharon Shadrack joined the pursuit north of Pinetta. The Sheriff's Office Communications Center called the Lowndes County, Ga. Sheriff's Office for assistance as the pursuit continued toward the county/state

The driver was identified as Benjamin Joseph Koon, 33, of Live Oak. The driver sustained apparent injuries from the vehicle crash and not the shots fired by the deputy. Koon was transported to Tallahassee Memorial Hospital for medical evaluation and released to the Madison County Jail.

In accordance with Madison County Sheriff's Office Policy and standard protocol, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) was contacted and requested to investigate the use of force and the criminal charges on Benjamin Joseph Koon.

Benjamin Joseph Koon was arrested and charged with aggravated assault, fleeing and eluding and resisting arrest with violence.

line at speeds reaching 75 miles per hour.

The Lowndes County Sheriff's Office advised they would assist and the pursuit continued crossing into Georgia. The Lowndes County Sheriff's Office deployed tire deflation devices in Clyattville and was successful in deflating the left front tire of the truck. The pursuit now included units from the Madison County Sheriff's Office, Lowndes County Sheriff's Office and the Georgia State Patrol. With the front tire of the F-150 now deflated, the truck turned into a power substation just north of the paper mill and was disabled.

Wall was arrested without further incident. Lowndes County deputies arrested Wall and transported him to the Lowndes County Jail. Cpl. Lauth requested a hold be placed on Wall and issued a warrant for felony fleeing and eluding, requiring Wall to be brought back to Madison County to face charges once his judicial proceedings in Georgia are complete.

Wall was arrested and charged with felony fleeing and eluding (enhanced second degree).



driver appear to be attempting to conceal something.

Deputy Knight requested Sgt. Dennis Pitts for routine assistance. Deputy Knight recognized the driver as Michael Miller of Greenville and ordered Miller out of the vehicle and conducted a pat down for weapons, finding none. During the pat down, Deputy Knight discovered a cigarette pack in Miller's right front pants pocket and Miller granted permission for Deputy Knight to look inside. Deputy Knight located two small straws with a white powder residue on the straw ends inside the cigarette pack. Deputy Knight recognized the straws had been used to consume illegal narcotics. Deputy Knight also located a small plastic baggy containing a white powder believed to be cocaine inside the cigarette pack.

Deputy Knight used a presumptive cocaine field test kit and received a positive result identifying the substance as cocaine. Deputy Knight placed Miller under arrest without incident. During the arrest Miller claimed the cocaine and stated that it was for personal use. Miller was transported to the Madison County Jail and charged with possession of cocaine, possession of drug paraphernalia and an improper start from a stopped position.

PROTECT, DON'T PUNISH!

Prices! Why don't we have 29 cent gas anymore? The price we had in the late 1950's.

Most of it is due to the cost of government, and the related factor, called inflation. Sen. Tom Coburn, of Oklahoma, says: "the government's twice the size it was 10 years ago. It's 30 percent bigger than it was when (Barack H.) Obama became President." (Meet the Press, 7/24/2011.)

WAR

War is expensive. And Dwight Eisenhower, President from 1953 to 1961, knew it. Joseph Stalin's death, in 1953, caused Eastern Europe to become unglued. And as anti-communists, we could have easily rushed in to stop Communism.

In May, 1953, thousands of Czechoslovak workers marched three kilometers from the Skoda factory to the city hall in Plzen, where they occupied the building, burned the Soviet flags, and threw busts of Lenin and Stalin out the windows. Strikes also began to spread among tobacco workers in Bulgaria. On June 17, 1953, mass strikes began in East Berlin. Cheered on by Stalin's death, over 500,000 people in 373 towns went on strike in about 600 enterprises. Between a million and 1.5 million people took part in demonstrations of some kind. (Based on Anne Applebaum's book, Iron Curtain, Doubleday, 2012.)

Eisenhower upon his election in 1952, had said, he would go to Korea, and end that war! And, he did! He had learned the lesson of history.

And of course, Vice Presidential candidate, Robert Dole, on 10/16/1976, complained of "Democrat Wars."

We no longer wait out wars, like Ike did, but we jump right in, and stay involved. That's mighty expensive! That's a big reason why we now borrow 40 cents out of every dollar, just to fund current government spending.

Locusts of Egypt

The people have always considered government employees as numerous as the "locusts of Egypt," blighting the potential of the country. Quoted from the Congressional Globe, 7/12/1862, p. 3304.

Cutting regulations would also help Congress cut the spending. The Atlanta Constitution, of May 17, 2011, says that the government's regulatory (red tape) budget is "about \$2.8 billion." That red tape impacts the private-sector in numerous ways, reflected by pushing up prices, and even shutting down private endeavors.

William Pitt, in talking about the rights of Englishmen, on 1/20/1775, said this about property rights, as recognized by the Magna Charta: "the right which God, and nature, and the constitution, had given a British subject to his property, was invariably inalienable, without his own consent; and that no power under heaven could touch it without that consent, either implied, or expressly and directly given."

President Obama says "We don't have a spending problem." Wall Street Journal, 1/7/2013. Or, as Honest Abe said, on 12/6/1864, "We owe it (debt) to ourselves."

This additional out of control government, is reflected in our cost of living.

Renee Curry Bensen: I was on lunch break from nursing school and was standing in the parking lot of the Suwannee Swifty Store with a classmate and we actually saw a ball of fire in the skyway off in the distance. Such a very sad day.



Brad Bemby: I was in drafting class my senior year. We brought a TV in to watch the coverage. I remember, for whatever reason, Nancy Reagan was at an event and they told her live on camera what had happened and her reply was "OH MY GOD.....NO!" That scene stays in my head.

Ralph Dillard: I was in a cane field in Hendry County, Florida. The smoke and vapor was very visible and the horror of what happened will remain with me forever.




Sarah Anderson: I was standing in a parking lot in Tampa watching the launch. I'll never forget the horror of seeing smoke and knowing something was terribly wrong.

Remembrance Of Things Past: Octavious Tookes

The number of people that truly grew up in Madison County is growing smaller and smaller. Octavious Tookes is one of the few and proud to be able to say that he really did grow up in Madison County. Tookes attended school in Madison from primary school through high school. From 1956 to 1960 he attended Hanson Elementary School. From 1960 to 1961, he went to Acquinn Jones Elementary School in Gainesville. He then returned to Madison County to go to Pinetta Elementary School, from 1962-1963. Then from 1963-1965 he went to Madison County Training School. He completed his high school career at Madison High School from 1965-1968. Tookes didn't stop there, though. He continued on to Florida A&M University in Tallahassee, from 1968 to 1972, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Sociology with a minor in Criminology. Then from 1978 to 1980 he went to Webster College in St. Louis, Mo., to get his Masters in Human Relations/Public Administration. Then from 1981 to 1983 he went to Horry Georgetown Technical College in Horry County, South Carolina to get his Associate of Arts in General Business Administration. Growing up, Tookes enjoyed not only playing outside, but also increasing his knowledge and working his brain. "Fun activities for me included hunting, fishing, swimming, playing chess and reading everything that I could get my hands on, especially science fiction, philosophy, and poetry," Tookes said. Tookes also has many thoughts of some of his favorite places and memories from his youth. "My mother's restaurant, the Royal Café, was always my favorite place to eat. And two of my favorite places to hang out when I was growing up were the skating

rink and the Dinette, which was a social club for teens." He also stated this when asked of one of his favorite memories, "Among the many fond memories from my youth are attending 4-H camp and taking the short course with Mrs. Deloris Jones and Rev. James C. Miller."

Tookes has seen Madison County change in many ways since his childhood. He explained, "Madison County has shifted from a conservative community, where a focus on family and faith has been replaced by superficial practices, resulting in social stagnation. Madison was once a community that stood firm on moral principles and didn't fear reprisal for doing right if it was according to the word of God. Today, many are afraid to use the name of God, afraid to stand on His word and trust that He will prevail in all situations. This new 'theology' has further diminished opportunities for our children, socially and spiritually. When I was growing up in Madison County, we had social activities, such as a movie theater, a skating rink, social clubs, swimming pools, and more. Our children now gather in parking lots and have tree parties. Dealing drugs was not a business then; economic security was found in wholesome work that supported the family and community. Immoral behavior was frowned upon and not tolerated, versus the complacency, tolerance and apathy that exists today. There was a time when this community's foundation was built on love and a respect for one another, and we weren't afraid to stay the course in order to ensure a sustained future for generations to come." However, he also feels that Madison has remained the same in some ways. "It continues to be a small agricultural community, although without the substantial economic stimulus that represented when I grew up. However, it is still a quiet, comfortable place to live and raise a family; we wouldn't trade it for any other place on earth."

Over the years, Tookes has seen many places come and go. He recalled some places that used to be a part of Madison County, "The Royal Café, which was operated by my parents in downtown Madison, is gone. Others are: Cason's Barber Shop, which was next door; JR Surlles, which was down the street; Mickler's Cleaners, which was next door to JR Surlles; Cantey Motor Company; Western Auto; Van H. Priest 5&10 Store; Eagles Department Store; A&P Grocery Store; Seltzers Grocery Store; Smith Drug Store; Rexall Drug Store; Shell Station owned by JB Davis; Cargo Gas Station; Bakery Shop; Lucille's Dress Shop; Daylights Department Store; and the Hardee Ford Car Dealership." He has seen Madison gain some new businesses as well including: Mc-

Donald's, Burger King, the shopping centers, the Chinese Restaurant, the Mexican Restaurant, and places at the I-10 exits, including the hotels and other eating establishments.

Tookes has held many jobs over the years, most of which have been in Madison County. "My first job was serving as probation officer in Miami, Florida. Since then, I have held positions with the following organizations: Florida Employment Service, Perry, Florida; United States Air Force, Worldwide; Horry County Commission on Alcohol and Substance Abuse, Conway, South Carolina; Self-Employed, South Carolina; Dixie Packers, Night Time Quality Control Supervisor; Greenville Hills Academy, North Side Site Director; Natural Bridge Recovery Center, Assistant Director; Partnership for Strong Families, Case Management; Madison County School District, Safe Schools/Healthy Students Initiative, Project Director; Assistant Pastor, Damascus Missionary Baptist Church & St. James Missionary Baptist Church; and Pastor, Saint James Missionary Baptist Church, all in Madison, Florida."

Tookes is the son of Sam and Argatha Tookes. His father was a well-driller, plumber, electrician and businessman and his mother was self-employed and ran a restaurant for 29 years. She is still going strong at 93 years old. He has been married to Pearl Jackson Tookes for 16 years, and they have eight children: Tomeka Tookes, Tonya Cason, Octavious Tookes, Jr., Tiffany Cason, Micah Tookes, Jerome Cason, Jervais Tookes, and Anastasia Tookes. They are also blessed with 16 grandchildren.






