Parents question bond in bonfire burning

The parents of burn victim Cody Healey are looking for answers about the events that lead to their son's injuries at a New Year's party in Allenton.

Cody Healey, 26, Pace, told his mom 2013 was going to "be his year" after a divorce and unemployment dropped hard times into his life in 2012.

But 2013 has proven to be worse. Just minutes after midnight witnesses say Healey was "sucker-punched" unconscious and landed in a bonfire, face first. He was down for "about 30 seconds" according to one witness. By the time Healey was

pulled from the fire, he had suffered second- and third-degree burns over his face, chest, hands and neck.

His dad, Craig Healey, was at the USA Medical Center Burn Unit in Mobile all day Thursday. He said his son is suffering tremendous pain and will likely be scarred the rest of his life.

"I'm a tough old bird," Craig Healey says, "I can take blood and guts ... doesn't phase me. But

I looked at my son and I couldn't stay in the room. I left after two minutes because I didn't want

him to see me cry." The man who is accused of punching Healey and knocking him into the fire is 24-year-old Devin Lee Bass of Milton. Bass was charged with two counts of aggravated battery and one county of obstructing justice. He was released on \$6,000 bond.

And that is what has Cody Healey's mother so upset.

Man pushing large globe to help bring awareness to diabetes

You've probably seen him in the past week. He's the man pushing the giant Earth along Santa Rosa roadways.

Walking along Highway 90 in Milton, Erik Bendl and his dog, Nice, are far from their home in Louisville, Ky.

And it is obvious he isn't on a leisurely stroll through town.

Bendl, 50, is pushing a 6-foot tall globe in hopes of raising awareness for diabetes. He started in Louisville last week and is heading south toward Tampa with no end goal in mind.

"I'm just going to walk until I hurt myself or need to do taxes," Bendl said jokingly. "If I (set) an end goal I'll end up breaking my foot or something and I won't make it."

This is the ninth walk Bendl and Nice, his 75 pound, 6-year-old, Blackmouth Cur, have done since 2007. They've walked more than 6,000 miles and have stepped foot in 38 states.

Milton man charged in New Year's stabbing

A Milton man was arrested on a warrant for aggravated battery with a deadly weapon Wednesday following a stabbing at a New Year's party in Munson, according to the Santa Rosa Sheriff's Office.

Camrin Bass, 19, is accused of stabbing Dillan Fretwell three times in the lower back and one time in the chest, witnesses told deputies. Fretwell was taken to Jay Hospital in a private vehicle and treated for his injuries. He was released the same night.

Fretwell told deputies Bass became upset by a comment the victim made toward a woman at the party, the Sheriff's Office reported. Bass then began stabbing the victim. He fled afterward.

A warrant was issued and deputies arrested Bass at on Wednesday. He was charged with aggravated battery with a deadly weapon.

Bass is being held at the Santa Rosa County Jail on no bond, the Sheriff's Office reported.

It was the second violent incident of the night.

Cody Healey, 24, was burned in a bonfire after being knocked unconscious by Devin Bass, according to witnesses and sheriff's reports. Another man allegedly lost two front teeth and received a cut to his face when he tried to help Healey. See related story, top of page one.

Bagdad fire is third in two weeks

A residential structure fire in the 6900 block of Ella Street in Bagdad represents the third candle to be extinguished on the "2012 Keep Your Holidays Bright" fire safety tree.

Santa Rosa County Emergency Communications received a call at 5:56 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 30 with the first crews arriving on scene at 6:02 p.m. The house was a total loss and the state fire marshal

is investigating the cause of the fire.

The American Red Cross was called to assist one resident displaced by the fire. Fire fighters from Bagdad, Avalon, East Milton, Skyline and Milton fire departments responded.

The first two candles were extinguished last week when two mobile home fires were reported in Navarre.

The first happened last Saturday when a residential structure fire in the

1900 block of Church Street in the Midway Fire District caught fire.

This fire represents the first candle extinguished on the "Keep Your Holidays Bright" fire safety tree.

Santa Rosa Emergency Communications was notified of the fire in a mobile home at 2:18 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 22. Crews arrived on scene at 2:20 p.m. and the fire was under control by 2:35 p.m. Units from Midway, Gulf Breeze and Holley-Navarre responded.

The fire, believed to be started by a space heater, destroyed the camper and displaced one adult. The American Red Cross was called to assist. No one was injured; however, a pet dog was lost in the fire.

The second fire was in the 8400 block of Sevilla Street in Navarre.

The fire was fully involved when crews arrived on scene at 6:01 a.m. The one resident of the home was transported to Gulf Breeze Hospital in stable condition

for smoke inhalation.

The mobile home was a total loss and the state fire marshal is investigating the cause of the fire. Holley-Navarre, Navarre Beach, Midway and Florosa fire departments responded.

Santa Rosa County emergency service agencies are teaming up for the sixth year to promote fire safety during the month of December with the "Keep Your Holidays Bright" campaign.

While a joyous time of

year, cold weather, holiday decorations and festivities can create serious fire dangers. Fire fighters hope to reduce the number of fires in Santa Rosa County by promoting simple, life-saving holiday safety tips throughout the month.

In the first year nine candles were extinguished on the safety tree, three in the second year, six in the 2009 campaign, four in 2010 and six in 2011.

AG makes statement on Tax Relief Extension

TALLAHASSEE — Attorney General Pam Bondi issued the following statement on Congress' one-year tax relief extension for consumers who have mortgage debt canceled or forgiven due to financial hardship or a decline in housing values.

"The one-year tax relief extension for Florida's distressed homeowners is a substantial victory for homeowners who have mortgage debt forgiven. This extension will help struggling homeowners take full advantage of the assistance offered them by the national mortgage settlement and other foreclosure relief programs. We need to continue to do everything we can to help Floridians who are doing the best they can to pay their bills and stay in their homes," stated Attorney General Pam Bondi.

Under the federal Mortgage Debt Relief Act, in effect since 2007, mortgage debt that is forgiven after a foreclosure or short sale or through a loan modification provided to a homeowner in financial hardship may be excluded from a taxpayer's calculation of taxable income. This exclusion only applies to mortgage debt forgiven on primary residences, not second homes.

Forty-two state attorneys general joined Attorney General Bondi and Attorney General Jepsen in signing on to a letter to U.S. House and Senate leaders requesting them to extend this distressed homeowner tax relief. The relief has been extended until Jan. 1, 2014.

Bendl says he averages about 10 miles a day and as people pull along the side of the road, he simply explains his purpose.

"The more active you are the better you are," he said to a man passing by on Thursday. "Why not go for a walk everyday?"

The globe was previously a game ball used in an elementary school that is now covered in canvas, patches and glue, which makes it weigh more than 80 pounds when it's dry. Nice has become protective of the large ball and doesn't let strangers near it often.

Bendl also has a purple van where he keeps plenty of clothing for himself and nice blankets and other necessities.

During the day he pushes the globe and as the day ends he finds his "GPS" or Good People System — strangers who drive him back to his van so he can "leapfrog" back up to the location he ended.

"I've only had to take a cab twice," he said of all the walks he has done.

Although Bendl doesn't have diabetes, he walks in honor of family members who do. The disease took his mother in 1987 at the age of 54 and his brother-in-law this past year. His uncle,

who is now 85 years old, has lived with diabetes and is insulin-dependent, but has found a balance between diet and exercise to keep him going strong.

Bendl's foundation, www.world-guy.org, has links for ways to donate to the cause through the American Diabetes Association. He also keeps a daily blog on the site to update friends, family and followers on

where he is each day.

He said he hopes to make it to each of the lower 48 states, even if it takes him the next 10 years because he knows for a fact he is making a difference.

"People have told me that I am," he said. "As long as I get a hold of one person to listen to me I'm making a difference."

"My son is going to be in a burn unit for at least 30 days and that (person) who caused this is out in two days? He should at least be held for 30 days, like my son. My son is fighting for his life," Debra Healey said, "and that man is walking the streets? There is something wrong with that."

Josh Morrison was at the bonfire when the incident occurred. He said when Cody fell into the fire no one knew what to do. "We were kind of in shock," he says. "...it was horrible."

Morrison said someone grabbed Healey by the belt and removed him from the blaze.

"He didn't wake up until he was out of the fire. He started trying to touch his

face, but they wouldn't let him. He was burned on his face, arms, and neck."

Morrison said partygoers used their jackets to put out the fire that was burning Healey's clothing after he was removed from the bonfire.

Bass reportedly struck another person who was trying to help Healey out of the fire. The second victim, Bradley Cremeans lost two teeth and received a cut on his face.

Healey was transported to Scared Heart Hospital and then on to the burn center in Mobile. He is listed with third degree burns to his face and torso. His father said they removed the respirator that has been helping him breathe since he arrived.

"If his lungs are damaged he's going to die. My son is in bad shape. He is struggling for his life."

Craig Healey goes on to say, "His face is so swollen right now, I don't know if he can see. His lips, his eyes are burnt."

"I can't believe the person who did this is walking free while my son is fighting for his life. Cody was sucker-punched. It wasn't like two guys were fighting and one got knocked down. Cody doesn't even know him."

"This guy didn't even have the decency to pull (Cody) out of the fire. He went on to fight with another guy who was trying to help Cody," he says.

"Six hundred dollars is all it took to get (Devin

Bass) out of jail. That judge set a \$6,000 bond. If the judge could see my son, if he stood here and looked at him, that judge would never have let him out. Six hundred bucks and he's a free man."

"It is so hard to see my son like this."

Craig Healey said Cody was recently hired at Home Depot, but he fears now his son will lose the job due to time away for injuries from the fire.

"He has a 4-year-old daughter," he said.

Cody Healey was listed in critical but stable condition Thursday, according to his mother.

Editor's note: Cody Healey was breathing on his own Friday and was going in for grafting surgery.

New EBT contract to save DCF millions

TALLAHASSEE— A new Department of Children and Families contract to process Electronic Benefit Transfer services for clients who receive food and cash assistance was signed today, saving taxpayers at least \$8.6 million next fiscal year and an estimated \$21 million over the next three years.

"Our agency is constantly seeking ways to become more efficient while providing quality services to people in need across Florida," said Secretary David Wilkins. "This is another example of saving taxpayers money while helping our friends and neighbors who need temporary help."

DCF signed the contract with eFunds — a subsidiary of FIS Government Services, the world's largest provider of banking and payment technologies — after negotiations with several vendors to process these services. The contract term begins on July 1, 2013 and includes comprehensive electronic payment services for federal food assistance, Temporary Cash Assistance and also includes adding the state's Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program to the EBT card.

The team also negotiated substantial resources valued at \$2.4 million to be

included in the contract at no extra cost. These services include call center assistance, fraud prevention, consulting, hardware and more.

EBT cards are similar to commercial debit or credit cards, including a PIN for security measures. The new contract will not change the current card or customer contact information for EBT clients. DCF's Economic Self-Sufficiency Program is responsible for determining eligibility for public assistance and providing ongoing case management of public benefits.

The Food Assistance Program helps low-income individuals and families buy the food they need for good health. The Temporary Cash Assistance Program provides short-term cash benefits to families with children under the age of 18, or under age 19 if full-time secondary school students, as well as pregnant women in their last trimester. Both are federally-funded programs administered by the department.

The department currently has 3.6 million food assistance recipients and 99,823 who receive cash assistance. To apply for benefits, go to www.myflorida.com/accessflorida.

Ordene says he told the customer he's "never put ketchup on anybody's sandwich." He says Martinez got "mouthy." Martinez denies that, but Ordone admits he flew off the handle at that point.

Martinez called 911. Ordone left the building. No one was arrested. But now Ordone is looking for a new job.

Bill to help foster youths with school records

MIAMI — Federal lawmakers have passed a bill that will give social workers better access to school records in an effort to improve education for foster children.

Social workers had been required to get a court order to access a foster child's school records. But advocates say red tape has made it extremely difficult because foster youths change schools frequently as they move between different homes. Some students end up taking the same classes over because credits are lost or don't transfer.

Man faces 15 years for stepson's fatal beating

BARTOW — A central Florida man faces up to 15 years in prison for beating his toddler stepson to death.

As part of a deal with Polk County prosecutors, 31-year-old Marcus Brown pleaded no contest to manslaughter Thursday. The Ledger reports he was previously tried for first-degree murder, but jurors couldn't reach a verdict. A new trial had been scheduled to begin this month.

Authorities say Brown repeatedly beat 2-year-old Deondray Ashe with a belt during potty training. Rescue workers responded to the Lakeland home in June 2010 and found the boy dead.

Fiscal cliff points to larger problem with government

So, we didn't fall off the cliff. Well, we did ... "sorta." Washington lawmakers, with moments to go, did manage to pass a compromise bill designed to keep the country functioning, temporarily avoiding the much discussed "fiscal cliff." In the end, however, despite the compromise that will raise your taxes a bit and give Republicans some of the things they wanted, little was accomplished. Instead, the work on this deadline ended up creating three new deadlines. The first of these, coming in late

February, will be another showdown. That will deal with raising the debt limit. Republicans already are indicating they are not inclined to vote to increase the limit if there are not sweeping changes to things on which the country spends money. The president, on the other hand, has already said, "I will not have another debate with this Congress over whether or not they should pay the bills that they've already racked up through the laws that they've passed." You see how things are shaping up? Sound familiar?

Sequestration — automatic, across-the-board cuts — was pushed back for two months. That's guaranteed to be another fight. The third item kicked down the road? More work on the budget. You know how that one goes. We say all this to note: Things just don't change in Washington, and it's the reason more and more people are becoming disenchanted with the whole two-party system. Each party is too afraid the other might get credit to allow anything it did not have 100 percent credit for to pass. On

the other hand, those same politicians fear if they are 100 percent responsible for something, it could mean their political hide if things go wrong so, they're reluctant to pass even their own legislation. It's not clear who wins in this Washington game, but it's certain who loses: the American people. Is there any doubt the February "debate" over the debt ceiling will rage until the final seconds? How about the debate over cuts for the military, your Social Security check, Medicare? We're sure it will all be more of the same.

Things are not likely to change until the voting public puts the true fear of dismissal into every Washington politician. Alas, as we've noted before, voters tend to think all politicians are crooked except for their own senators and representatives. The problem is, of course, the only people they can vote out are their own senators and representatives. The result? Nothing changes. After every vote, spokesmen from each side of the aisle fight to reach the microphone and begin posturing. The saddest part is, however, they seldom really say anything.

The Founding Fathers on the 2nd Amendment

Rep. John Lewis, D-Ga., in the wake of the Newtown, Conn., shootings, said, "The British are not coming. ... We don't need all these guns to kill people." Lewis' vision, shared by many, represents a gross ignorance of why the framers of the Constitution gave us the Second Amendment. How about a few quotes from the period, and you decide whether our Founding Fathers harbored a fear of foreign tyrants.

Alexander Hamilton: "The best we can hope for concerning the people at large is that they be properly armed," adding later, "If the representatives of the people betray their constituents, there is then no recourse left but in the exertion of that original right of self-defense which is paramount to all positive forms of government." By the way, Hamilton is referring to what institution when he says "the representatives of the people"?

James Madison: "The Constitution preserves the advantage of being armed, which the Americans possess over the people of almost every other nation ... (where) the governments are afraid to trust the people with arms."

Thomas Jefferson: "What country can preserve its liberties if its rulers are not warned from time to time that their people preserve the spirit of resistance? Let them take arms."

George Mason, author of the Virginia Bill of Rights, which inspired our Constitution's Bill of Rights, said,

"To disarm the people — that was the best and most effectual way to enslave them."

Rep. John Lewis and like-minded people might dismiss these thoughts by saying the founders were racist anyway. Here's a more recent quote from a card-carrying liberal, the late Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey: "Certainly, one of the chief guarantees of freedom under any government, no matter how popular and respected, is the right of the citizen to keep and bear arms."

The right of the citizen to bear arms is just one guarantee against arbitrary government, one more safeguard against the tyranny which now appears remote in America but which historically has proven to be always possible." I have many other Second Amendment references at <http://econfaculty.gmu.edu/wew/quotes.html>.

How about a couple of quotations with which Rep. Lewis and others might agree? "Armas para que?" (translated: "Guns, for what?") by Fidel Castro. There's a more famous one: "The most foolish mistake we could possibly make would be to allow the subject races to possess arms. History shows that all conquerors who have allowed their subject races to carry arms have prepared their own downfall by so doing." That was Adolf Hitler.

Here's the gun grabbers' slippery-slope agenda, laid out by Nelson T. Shields, founder of Handgun Control

Inc.: "We're going to have to take this one step at a time, and the first step is necessarily — given the political realities — going to be very modest. ... Right now, though, we'd be satisfied not with half a loaf but with a slice. Our ultimate goal — total control of handguns in the United States — is going to take time. ... The final problem is to make the possession of all handguns and all handgun ammunition — except for the military, police, licensed security guards, licensed sporting clubs and licensed gun collectors — totally illegal" (The New Yorker, July 1976).

There have been people who've ridiculed the protections afforded by the Second Amendment, asking what chance would citizens have against the military might of the U.S. government. Military might isn't always the deciding factor. Our 1776 War of Independence was against the mightiest nation on the face of the earth — Great Britain. In Syria, the rebels are making life uncomfortable for the much-better-equipped Syrian regime. Today's Americans are vastly better-armed than our founders, Warsaw Ghetto Jews and Syrian rebels.

There are about 300 million privately held firearms owned by Americans. That's nothing to sneeze at. And notice that the people who support gun control are the very people who want to control and dictate our lives.

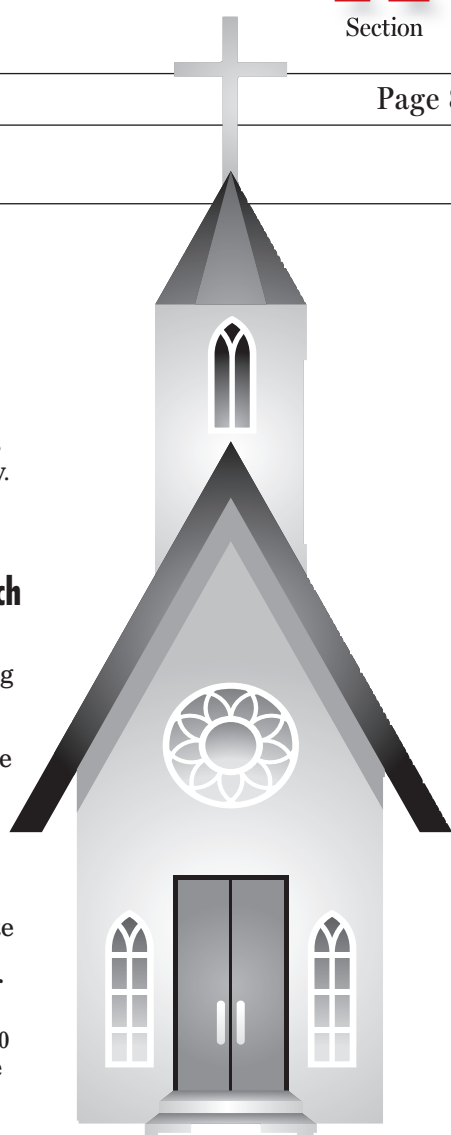

Keep your resolutions by making them realistic

The New Year is a time of resolutions. It's a time when people commit to making a change in their life. Losing weight, changing jobs, saving money, making money, a new relationship, getting in shape, going back to school or giving up smoking are just some of the goals people set for themselves on Jan. 1.

Although it's possible for anyone to make a change or a new start, it takes determination, commitment and persistence. A new goal must be your own. You have to really want it. Without a burning desire, your motivation will fade quickly. It's virtually impossible to make a change because of external pressure.

You might agree to what someone else wants you to do, but it's very difficult to succeed without an internal drive. So, in order to successfully make a change or reach a goal, you have to make sure it's what you really want.

Don't start off on the wrong foot by making excuses as to why you will probably fail. If you don't truly believe you can do it, you won't. People who do this will say something like, "I'll try to do it, but ..." Or you may hear, "I tried before and it didn't work, but I'll give it another go." Before you begin, make sure the only things you are telling yourself are, "I can," "I will" and "I will do whatever it takes."

A new beginning is a three-step process. You have to first know what you want, formulate a plan to achieve it and then take the necessary action to get it. Setting a specific goal is essential. The more detailed the better. If you want to lose weight, how much and by when? If you want a new job, what will it be and how much will it

pay? If you want to save money, how much and how often?

Next, you need a plan. Just like your goal, your plan must be as detailed as possible. If you are going to lose weight, what will be your menu each week? Are you going to go on a specific diet, cut out certain foods or just eat less? For finding a new job, what will be your strategy? Do you need a new resume? Will you look online, in the classifieds, use an employment agency, network, cold call or all of these? If you want to save more money, in what areas will you cut back? Do you know where your money is going? Have you created a budget?

You want your plan to be doable. The smaller the steps are, the more likely you will be to succeed. Any time you feel a step is too big, break it down further. It doesn't matter how small each step is so long as you keep going and never give up.

Losing 20 pounds might feel overwhelming, but dropping two pounds a month doesn't seem too bad. If you keep at it for 10 months, you will reach your goal. Saving \$3,000 might appear beyond reach, but cutting back \$9 a day on family spending is manageable.

Finally, you must take action. The best goals and greatest plans will go nowhere without action. The reason you divided your plan into small sections is so it would be easy to take action, one day at a time. All you have to do is keep going, until you achieve your goal.

No. 7: Russell selected by Oakland

Addison Russell has experienced an interesting past 48 hours. Saturday, Russell and his fellow Pace High Patriots walked across the stage at the Pensacola Civic Center for commencement exercises.

Monday night Russell became a major league baseball player as the Oakland A's selected him in the first round with the No. 11 pick overall.

"I have been looking forward to the draft," said Russell prior to his graduation. "The big leagues are a dream. I have two options on Monday and that is three years of school or starting my professional career."

"I will be happy with whatever happens, but we are looking at going in the top 15 or I will just go to (Auburn)."

Russell, who was a member of the USA U-18 National Team who brought home gold from the 2011 COPABE 18U/AAA Pan American Championships, signed to play baseball at Auburn University in this past January.

With Monday's draft Russell is the highest Major League Baseball draft choice in Santa Rosa County since Drew Cumberland, who was selected by the San Diego Padres in the 2007 MLB Draft with the 46th pick in the supplemental round.

"This has been a heck of a year for Addison and this is one heck

of an accomplishment," said Pace head coach Charlie Warner. "Today was a great day for the Russell family, the Pace High family, and Santa Rosa County."

"Good things happen to good people and Addison is an awesome person."

Russell, who has been under a microscope since he busted on scene as a freshman in Pace in 2009, was criticized by some due to his size.

That was not an issue to Russell who came into the 2012 high school baseball season leaner and ready to show his desire to play at the next level after high school.

"Addison is a pretty focused on what he wants and is very goal oriented," Warner said. "He knew what was being said about his size and he came into the 2012 season 20 pounds lighter to help him reach his goal."

"He has been that way since I have known him."

The recent Pace graduate, who admitted his love of fishing and eating pizza before a game, has dealt with the pressure rather well during his high school years.

"At times it has been stressful," Russell said. "It is not easy being under the microscope all the time."

"But in some ways it has been good as I have become a role model for younger players in the area and that is a good point."

During Russell's career at Pace he has played in three state finals for the Patriots and was a member of the 2010 Class 5A State Championship, which also won the ESPN Baseball America High School National Title.

Russell finished 2012 batting .358 with eight home runs and 33 RBI's for the Patriots, who lost in

For his career at Pace he batted .460 with 37 home runs.

For the Oakland Athletics, Russell is the first high school senior

the franchise has drafted since 2001 when the organizations drafted Jeremy Bonderman.

Since 1991 the A's have only other high school players taken in the first round include Eric Chavez (1996) and Ben Grieve (1994).

'The incredible shrinking woman'



Pace resident appears on People cover

Ashley Donahoo, Pace, has become an inspiration to countless people after losing nearly half her body weight simply by walking, running and eating healthier.

Donahoo lost 137 pounds in 20 months and appeared on People magazine's 11th annual Half Their Size issue. They heard about her story after asking the public for people who lost more than 100 pounds to write in. Her friends told her if she didn't do it, they would.

The 27-year-old was born and raised in Pace, and is the project manager at Dan Stewart Law Firm. Besides being on the cover of People magazine on Wednesday, she was also featured on Good Morning America on Wednesday and 20/20 on Friday.

Weighing in at 288 pounds in 2010, Donahoo said her doctor was pushing her to start getting healthy.

"I was depressed and hopeless and didn't think I could do it," she said.

Her husband, David then said one day, "We're going for a walk."

"We were living in Iowa at the time and we got half way down our city block when I was out of breath and in pain," she said. "I started crying."

That's the moment the mother of two young boys, Zachary, 10, and Connor, 5, decided to make a change.

"My husband and I would put one of the kids in the stroller and the other on the back of a bike," she said. "I lost all my weight with a pair of tennis shoes and a workout DVD."

She didn't kill herself going to a gym for several hours every day. She didn't starve herself, take diet pills or get surgery - she just started walking.

"We would increase the pace a little

more each time and finally when I got to where walking was fine we would jog," she said. "You just have to constantly be striving for progress. I'm never going to be perfect but I know as long as I'm doing a little better I'm doing good."

Thinking back to that time, she remembers the struggles of the journey, like weeks when she would gain a couple pounds.

"It was frustrating. You want to scream and punch a wall," she said.

But now when she shows her youngest son, Connor, photos of when she was 288 pounds he doesn't believe that it's actually her.

"He looks at pictures and says, 'That's you?' When I started this he was only 2 1/2 years old," she said. "They love the happier more energetic mom. I think I did it right at the right time for my kids."

Now instead of sitting at home watching TV or going to the movies, Donahoo said she likes to play sports and be active with her children.

And her husband, David, is on his own weight-loss journey, having lost 50 pounds. Together the couple lost 187 pounds.

Although she never expected to get this much recognition for her accomplishments, Donahoo said she welcomes it.

"I'm a small town girl from Pace. I've never been to New York (before now) but this is my third time in seven weeks," she said. "After I saw so many people turning to pills and surgery I wanted to tell people that I've done it (without the pills and surgery)."

On her 20-month journey, which ended around March of 2011, she took progression pictures at each milestone.

"I look like the incredible shrinking woman," Donahoo laughs.



Follow 'rule of halves' in managing for turkeys

Whether you oversee a large tract of land or own a smaller parcel, there are many wildlife management techniques you can use to help attract and keep wild turkeys on your property.

Wild turkeys, like deer, are "edge species," because of their need for more than one type of habitat. Most of the time, with large tracts of land, this isn't a problem because the vast landscape is diverse enough. But in the case of small-acreage, one-habitat properties, it's up to you as the landowner to create varied, preferred habitats if you expect turkeys to use the property.

For optimal turkey habitat, most experts believe a "rule of halves" should be applied to the landscape. What that means is that half of the area (and if you own a small tract, then include surrounding properties) should be in mature forests and the other half in early-succession openings, such as fields or clear-cut and plantation-cut landscapes.

To create even better and more varied habitats for turkeys, you should offer differing age classes of forests and early-succession areas – and make prescribed burning a big part of your management plan. This will enable new growth of succulent, woody ornamentals, native grasses and weedy-type flowers.

Hardwood lowlands provide travel corridors that turkeys and deer use extensively and feel

comfortable moving through. Most wild turkeys prefer to roost in trees over or near water, so it's important to leave these areas undisturbed and free from timbering.

Buffer strips of native grasses and woody ornamentals should be left unmowed where clear-cut areas meet pine or hardwood forests. Hens require this thick understory cover for nesting.

In Florida, most hens begin laying their eggs in late March or early April and the eggs take about 25 days to hatch, so take care not to burn or mow through August. After hatching, poults will roost on the ground for the first 14 days, and during this period, approximately 70 percent of these young birds won't survive, primarily because of predation from raccoons, hawks, coyotes, foxes and bobcats.

Attempts to control these predators are usually ineffective and economically unfeasible, so your efforts are better spent creating and maintaining good-quality brood habitat.

Good brood habitat should hold food in the form of seeds, insects and tender, new-growth vegetation for young poults to feed upon throughout the summer. It should consist of 1- to 3-foot-tall grass and weeds open enough to enable the young poults to move about, yet dense enough to provide cover from the above-mentioned predators.

There is great interest nationally in the planting

of food plots for wildlife, including for turkeys. Within extensive closed-canopy forested areas, food plots and/or game feeders are essential to keeping turkeys on your property. Where an open forest structure is maintained by adequate timber thinning and the use of fire, such supplemental feeding is not as necessary because there is enough natural browse vegetation on which game can feed.

On very large tracts of land, sufficient supplemental feeding can be quite expensive. In these cases, proper use of burning and timber-thinning management are more economical ways of providing food for turkeys and other wildlife.

Food plots, though, are a lot more cost-effective at feeding game than using feeders on moderate-sized pieces of property. In cases of smaller tracts, perhaps where food plots can't be utilized because the landscape is all lowland and you have a closed canopy, game feeders filled with corn or soybeans are your only option for attracting turkeys.

When thinking about good food plot sites, avoid excessively wet or dry areas, and don't place them along heavily used roads to minimize disturbance and possible poaching.

Look to create these openings along an edge where upland pines meet a hardwood drain. This way, you'll have an area where three separate habitats converge. Keep in mind that it is recommended that 2 percent to 3 percent of the land should be in these permanent openings.

The best food plots

are long and narrow rectangular shapes that follow the contour of the land. When possible, create food plots where the length (longest part) runs east to west. That way, the planted crops will receive the most direct sunlight.

In the fall, cereal grains like wheat, oats and rye can be planted along with Austrian winter peas, clover and brassicas like turnips, rape and kale. Except for clover, these crops grow well in most of Florida.

Clover requires a higher soil pH – between 6.5 and 7 – and it often won't grow in the sandy soils that make up most of our state, unless you apply enough lime to bring the pH level up. In the northern-tiered counties that border Alabama and Georgia, the soil is richer with red clay, and several varieties of clover and

other legumes will grow well there.

All of the above-mentioned cool-season forages can be planted by "broadcast" method after Oct. 1. At least twice as much fertilizer should be applied. Slightly cover the seed by pulling a drag over it, and try to put your crop in the ground when the soil is holding some moisture and rain is in the forecast.

In the spring after May 1, you can plow under your "browned-up" fall crop and replace it with any combination of soybeans, cowpeas, browntop millet, sorghum or peanuts. If you can afford it, turkeys are especially fond of chufa. That, along with the other warm-season forages, can be broadcasted and planted just like the cool-weather crops.

Hopefully, using some or all of these wildlife-management practices will

help bring in turkeys and increase your property's carrying capacity for birds. If you need assistance, contact the FWC's Landowner Assistance Program, the National Wild Turkey Federation, Natural Resources Conservation Service or your county agricultural extension agent. Here's wishing you luck obtaining your management goals and objectives.

"If we're running we think about different members that didn't quit when they felt like it, and that motivates us to keep going," he said.

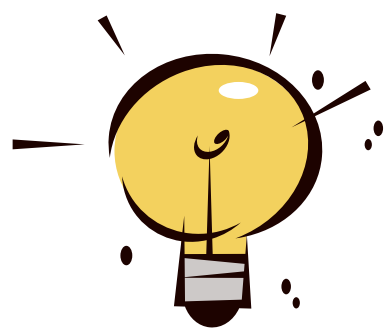
Tips from Fox to achieve your new year's fitness resolution:

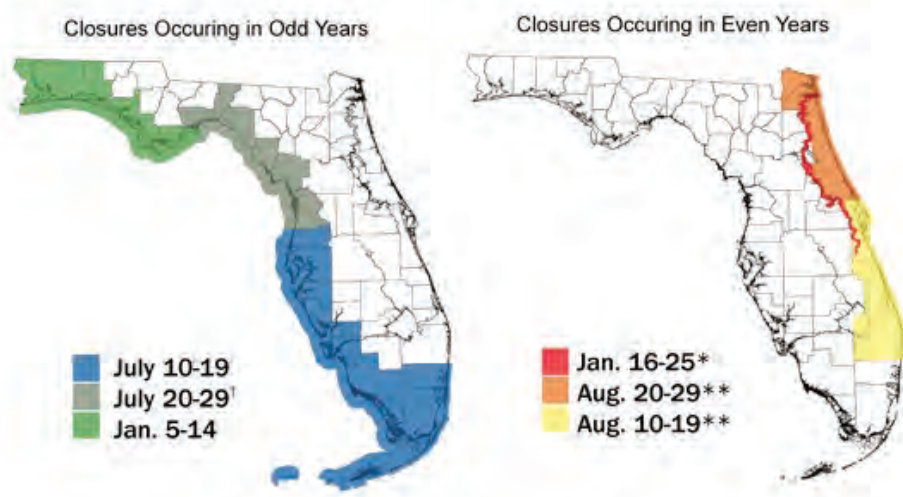
Panhandle blue crab trap closure starts today

Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission

Recreational and commercial blue crab harvesters in certain areas of the Panhandle can no longer have their blue crab traps in the water as of Jan. 5, the first day of a 10-day trap closure. This closure will give groups authorized by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) the opportunity to identify and retrieve lost and abandoned blue crab traps from the water.

The January trap closure includes state waters from the Florida/Alabama state line through the Franklin/Wakulla county line. Waters of the Ochlockonee

River and Bay are not included in this closure. Traps can be placed

back in the water Jan. 15. Until then, blue crabs may be harvested with other

gear, such as dip nets and fold-up traps. Blue crab harvesters may also

use standard blue crab traps during the closure if the traps are attached to a dock or other private property.

Lost and abandoned blue crab traps are a problem in the blue crab fishery, because they can continue to trap crabs and fish when left in the water. They can also be unsightly in the marine environment, damage sensitive habitats and pose navigational hazards to boaters on the water.

The closure is one of three regional, 10-day blue crab trap closures that will occur in 2013 on the Gulf coast of Florida. Coastal waters from Broward through Pasco counties will close to traps July

10-19, and waters from Hernando through Wakulla counties, including all waters of the Ochlockonee River and Bay, will close to traps July 20-29. There are six regional closures total: three in even-numbered years on the east coast and three in odd-numbered years on the west coast.

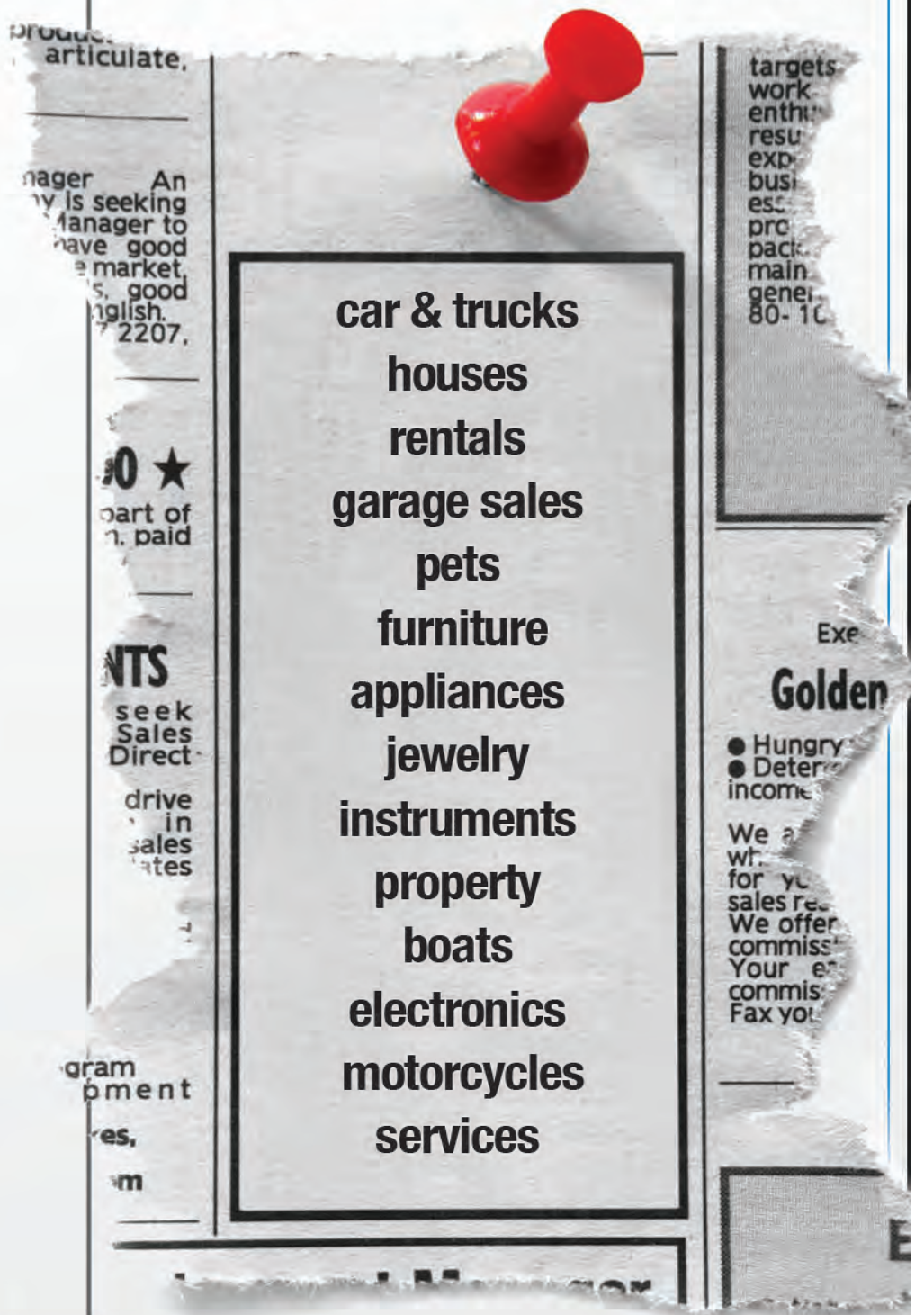
