# Trooper hits car during pursuit

An unidentified fleeing driver caused a trooper from the Florida Highway Patrol (FHP) to strike the back of a 2012 Chevrolet

Cruise as the trooper attempted a traffic stop.

FHP says the trooper received minor injuries in the crash.

Trooper Lebrun was working Interstate 10 Sunday morning in

Milton when he overtook the Chevy travelling 110 miles

per hour. The two vehicles exited the interstate, going north on Garcon Point Road, according to FHP. Lebrun turned on his emergency lights and siren to

initiate a traffic stop and the driver of the Chevy fled approximately two-tenths of a mile then "braked sharply," causing the patrol car to hit the back of the fleeing vehicle.

As the car continued to

flee, it traveled north on Woodville Road at a high rate of speed according to reports.

The pursuit was called off because the fleeing vehicle entered a residential neighborhood.

Troopers are looking for the vehicle, which was driven by a black male.

# Man dies after truck is submerged in East River

**NAVARRE** — As darkness fell on a cold and rainy night just north of Navarre Beach, a Ford pickup truck with a man's body inside was retrieved from the bottom of the East River.

Rescue workers, including the Santa Rosa County Sheriff's Office dive team, had spent much of Monday working to pull the truck from about 16 feet of water where visibility was less than a foot.

Sheriff's office spokesman Rich Aloy confirmed that a call of "a vehicle going into the water" had come into the county dispatch center at shortly after noon.

"Somebody saw the vehicle speeding into the water," Aloy said.

That somebody is believed to be a witness to what happened. Aloy said the witness was removed by deputies from the scene of the incident and questioned at another location.

The truck, a larger model Ford, went in nose first, Aloy said.

By 3:30 p.m., dive team members, working in 65 degree water and against strong currents, had located the truck and attached a cable to it.

Efforts to pull the vehicle out with a conventional-sized tow truck failed a handful of times before it was decided to bring in a bigger truck.

By the time the second truck arrived, near sunset, a crowd of about 30 onlookers had gathered on the bridge over the East River to watch the rescue effort.

# 2 charged with burglary

Two Milton men were charged with burglary

Thursday afternoon after Santa Rosa sheriff's deputies were dispatched to a burglary in progress call.

Several marked patrol deputies and undercover deputies responded to a building on Simpson Drive in Milton just outside the city limits behind McKenzie Motors when the call came in. Carey Eugene Copeland, 20, and Kevin Duane Enfinger, 18, fled on foot as law enforcement arrived. After a search of the area, they were found hiding in the woods near the crime scene.

Copeland, whose address was reported as being on Simpson Drive, and Enfinger were charged with burglary to an unoccupied dwelling and criminal mischief/property damage less than \$200. Bond was set at \$10,250 for each man.

# Girls' complaints result in sexual assault arrest

A man entrusted to offer mental health counseling to delinquent teenage girls has been charged with sexual assault.

Ernest Lerenza Parker, 52, 7000 block St. Josephs St, Milton, is in the Santa Rosa County jail under a \$1,010,000 bond. He is accused of "inappropriate sexual conduct" with multiple juvenile victims.

Sheriff's investigators said Parker worked at the Milton Girls Facility in East Milton. This is the same facility where Shannon Abbott, a correctional guard, was charged with felony battery after video revealed she slammed a 15-year-old client of the facility into a wall, the pinning her to the floor with excessive force, reports say.

A month after Parker was ar-

rested, it was announced the program director of the facility, Carol Andrus, was being investigated for excessive force. The facility was under contract as a privatized center with ultimate responsibility falling back on the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ).

DJJ closed the facility in December and moved the girls. It remains closed today.

Parker saw the court-committed girls as a Mental Health Technician II. One of the functions of

the Milton Girls Facility was to help troubled teens "in providing life skills, psychological counseling, behavior modification, and schooling while maintaining them in a secure environment," according to officials.

Sheriff's officials are looking for additional witnesses or victims. The Department of Children and Families, along with DJJ, the Office of the Inspector General, Santa Rosa County Sheriff's Department and the State Attorneys

Office First Judicial Circuit, are working together to conduct this investigation.

Parker's charges include four counts of battery, seven counts of sexual assault (victim 12 years old, special conditions), three counts of lewd lascivious molestation (victim 12-16 years old), one count of lewd lascivious conduct by person 18 years old or older and six counts of contributing to the delinquency or dependency of a minor.

# Rotarians to aid in food drive

Rotarians from Escambia and Santa Rosa counties will join together with Metropolitan Area Neighborhood Nutrition Alliance Food Pantries (MANNA) on Saturday, Feb. 23, to fight hunger in Northwest Florida.

The Rotary Against Hunger service project will involve all 13 Rotary Clubs that have committed financial support and volunteer participation to create more than 16,000 food packets for those in need. The result will be about 100,000 meals that the Combined Rotary of Pensacola will donate to MANNA for distribution to 17-plus partner pantries in the two county area.

This donation will benefit pantries that provide much needed food to those in need. But according to MANNA Executive Director DeDe Flounlacker, the hungry in our area will benefit the most.

"Many of our neighbors are

struggling to have enough food to eat, including thousands of children in Escambia and Santa Rosa counties. The need continues to grow, with Manna providing food to an average of 68 children a day," Flounlacker said.

"We are so grateful to Rotary for continuing to support the needs of the hungry through this project. Last year, MANNA provided the equivalent of 663,135 meals to 44,209 people. These are your neighbors and mine — folks who are the working poor, grandparents raising their grandchildren, moms and dads who do not have enough money to pay their bills and buy food. Thanks to Rotary, thousands of people will once again be helped this year through the gift of nutritious food."

This is the second year for the Rotary Against Hunger project and the second time in history that all Rotary clubs in Escambia and Santa Rosa counties have come together on one

day to work on a service project. Last year, more than 700 Rotary members and friends donated more than 1,200 hours of time to pack the meals.

"The Combined Rotary Clubs of Pensacola are pleased to join with MANNA Food Pantries and work on this Second Annual volunteer project to help feed the hungry in Escambia and Santa Rosa Counties," Rotary Project Chair Buz Eddy said.

"Area Rotarians have raised over \$25,000 for this project that will provide over 100,000 meals. On Feb. 23, Rotarians, their families and other volunteers will be assembling food packets at MANNA's headquarters that will be distributed throughout the year to folks in need.

"Rotary Clubs work globally as well as locally to mitigate problems such as Hunger," he said.

Ashley Dawn Krasinski describes herself as a super-mom by day and songwriter by night, but now she can add another accomplishment to her bio — actress.

The 28-year-old, who goes by the name Ashley Dawn, has been selected as a featured singer in a film about female country icon Patsy Cline, titled "Patsy."

Dawn graduated from Pace High School in 2002 and currently lives in Atmore, Ala., with her husband, three children and oldest stepson,

who is in college at Pensacola State.

She auditioned for "Patsy" in Mobile, Ala., in late December and received a call from Chance Film Productions last week with the exciting news.

According to John Russell, producer with Kansas City-based Chance Films, Dawn will be one of the 12 featured singers. The story revolves around a producer who does a nationwide search for someone to play the role of Patsy Cline. The final 12 artists who are considered for the role of Patsy will be featured singers in

the film.

Dawn started taking piano lessons at age 7 and later picked up the guitar, playing in the school band and performing at small venues.

As a musician and singer, Dawn considers herself a versatile artist and a folk/rock performer.

She became a member of the Nashville Songwriters Association International about three years ago and is currently a coordinator with Atmore/Brewton Region Chapter. She also mentors people interested in writing songs on a personal basis.

"We're not in an area with a lot of direction (for musicians or songwriters)," she said. "Someone who really

wants to do it, like I did, can feel lost."

Russell said the crew will start filming "Patsy" by the end of March, mainly in Alabama with special scenes shot in places such as Louisiana and Nashville.

"We're eager to get under way," Russell said. "When we auditioned in Mobile, we just loved it."

While looking forward to her role in the film, Dawn, the self-proclaimed "bubble gum chewin' guitar pickin' stay at home mama turned acoustic diva after bath time" is also working to record and self-produce her first radio ready album — "in between bleaching socks and grocery shopping," she said.

Two divers had to enter the water after the sun went down to reattach cables, but the second truck had no trouble dragging it off the mucky bottom.

Only after the truck was brought up, with visibility underwater having been so poor, could Aloy confirm a death had occurred. "We have one fatality," he said.

The body of the victim was not immediately identified.

Although suicide was mentioned as a possible finding when the cause of death is eventually determined, that could not be confirmed until the death is thoroughly investigated.

"We're just going to say unknown circumstances at this point," Aloy said.

**Ask the Preacher**  
...a weekly column answering your questions with Biblical answers about life.

Dear Pastor Gallups, "Does the Bible clearly prescribe a particular "way" of baptism? If I wasn't baptized by immersion, do I need to be re-baptized?"  
- K.L. - Milton

Dear K.L.,  
I think the answer to this question is best represented by the Greek word, "baptizo" translated in the Bible as "baptize". This Greek word means, "to dip or immerse." The word pictures of Romans 6:4 and Colossians 2:12, seem to strongly indicate that the original mode of baptism in the early church probably was a total immersion in water.

"Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:4-6 NKJV)

"...Buried with Him in baptism, in which you also were raised with Him through faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead." (Colossians 2:11-12 NKJV)

When Jesus himself was baptized by John, the Bible says "He CAME UP OUT of the water." Again, seemingly indicating that Jesus was completely immersed.

Most New Testament, evangelical denominations believe that the biblical standard is **believer's baptism** by immersion. Believer's baptism by immersion is an important symbolic act of identification with Christ. However, because salvation is by grace through faith in Christ, it is not, in my opinion, absolutely necessary that you be baptized in a particular way in order to be "saved".

There are several historical evidences (archeological and writings) that indicate that the early church preferred and most often practiced immersion, however from time to time even they would sprinkle or dip when immersion was not possible or practical. They understood that it was the spiritual symbolism of the act that was important.

In the final analysis, you must follow your own conscience in this matter, before the Lord and in light of the teaching of the Bible. Many people, once they understand what I have shared here with you, decide that they should willingly demonstrate their symbolic union with Christ through baptism by immersion even if they have already been baptized by another mode of baptism and especially if it was in a denomination that did not recognize the necessity of the individual profession of a saving faith in Jesus at the time of the Baptism.



**Group pushes to end use of the 'R' word in Florida**

Dear Editor,  
ARC Gateway and the Arc of Florida are working to make changes to state laws that are long overdue. Senate Bill 142, the Intellectual Disabilities Bill, would remove the term "mental retardation" and replace it with "intellectual disability" in state statutes.

The field of intellectual disabilities has evolved over the last few decades. Thirty years ago, when an individual was born with an intellectual disability, he or she would usually be institutionalized.

*"Once considered a valid medical term, the R-word has become a hurtful slang that promotes negative stereotypes of people with intellectual disabilities. As someone who has been involved in this cause for many years and has a family member who is on the autism spectrum, I know it makes individuals with intellectual disabilities feel bullied."*

Today, we understand that people with intellectual disabilities can live a full and rewarding life in their community.

Terminology used by medical professionals also has evolved over time. An example of this is the term "mental retardation." The American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities replaced its official diagnosis with "intellectual disability." The American Psychiatric Association recently made a similar change. In late January, the Social Security Administration announced its intent to make the adjustment to its official "Listing of Impairments."

Once considered a valid medical term, the R-word has become a hurtful slang that promotes negative stereotypes of people with intellectual disabilities. As someone who has been involved in this cause for many years and has a family member who is on the autism spectrum, I

know it makes individuals with intellectual disabilities feel bullied.

Federal health, education and labor policy statutes were changed in 2010 when Congress passed and President Obama signed "Rosa's Law." Thirty-nine states also have changed their laws.

Everyone has the right to be treated with respect. This is an opportunity for Floridians to do just that. Please contact your state senator and representative. Encourage them to support the Intellectual Disabilities Bill and end the R-word in Florida.

## Sequestration just around the corner

In less than three weeks, across-the-board spending cuts known as sequestration are set to go into effect. But these cuts are not a new development. We have known since November 2011 that the country was threatened by these cuts. While House Republicans have worked to replace the arbitrary cuts in sequestration with commonsense spending reductions in other areas, the President and Senate Democrats have ignored the issue completely for more than one year.

Until late last year, the President continued to claim sequestration would "not happen." Even today, the President continues to claim sequestration was the idea of Congress, despite the fact that it was the President's current chief of staff Jack Lew and White House Legislative Affairs Director Rob Nabors who pitched the idea of sequestration to Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid on behalf of the President.  
Last week, after nearly fifteen months of delaying, the President finally unveiled his "plan" to avert the looming budget sequester set to go into effect on March 1. While it is good news the President has finally realized the seriousness of sequestration, his blueprint to avoid sequestration would seek to avert the automatic spending cuts with \$500 billion in new taxes. We cannot solve our spending problem by taxing hard working Americans more, and, once again, the President has failed to comprehend this important point.

Meanwhile, Senate Democrats have failed to even offer a plan. Just last week, the Chairwoman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, Senator Barbara Mikulski, called the Senate's sequestration plan "a work in progress," and Senate Budget Committee Chairman, Senator Kent Conrad, told reporters he was unsure of who would lead the Senate

effort and that the American people would have to "wait and see what is introduced."

The lack of urgency from the Administration and Senate Democrats is astounding, considering the potential impact of sequestration on our economy and national security. According to the Congressional Budget Office, sequestration is estimated to reduce economic growth by 0.7 percent this year, and the Bipartisan Policy Center predicts it will cost our economy one million jobs.

Of course, the impact of sequestration will have a significant impact on communities with a large military presence, like Northwest Florida. Sequestration will levy \$492 billion in defense spending cuts over the next ten years, on top of the \$487 billion in cuts that are already being implemented. They would result in job losses of approximately 350,000 from active duty and Department of Defense civilian work forces, and they would also have an impact on other activities, such as the potential cancellation of some of the Blue Angels flight demonstrations.

The Administration's sequestration threatens to reduce our military's readiness and throw our nation into another recession. House Republicans fully understand the seriousness of both sequestration and our larger fiscal problems and we have acted to address these issues. In contrast to the Administration and Senate Democrats, we have passed multiple measures to replace the scheduled sequestration cuts with commonsense measures that would not threaten our national security or economic prosperity.

In May 2012, the House passed the Sequester Replacement Reconciliation Act of 2012. This bill would have replaced sequestration with measured cuts in other areas of our budget. For example, our sequester replacement bill would

have saved billions by requiring Social Security numbers to claim the refundable child tax credit, making sure that individuals who aren't eligible to receive assistance from safety-net programs like food stamps do not receive these benefits, eliminated automatic funding set to be given to states to set up exchanges from Obamacare, and eliminated the bailout fund so that unelected bureaucrats cannot use tax payer funds to bail out the creditors of "too big to fail" institutions.

Just last week, Republicans unveiled legislation, which I also strongly support, known as the Down Payment to Protect National Security Act of 2013 to avert sequestration. This commonsense bill would replace the first year of sequestration by shrinking the Federal civilian workforce ten percent through normal attrition. If acted upon by the Senate Democrats and enacted by the President, this legislation would remove this year's devastating effects of sequestration while the Congress works to achieve a permanent solution.

House Republicans do not want sequestration to go into effect, but we understand that we must rein in government spending now before it spirals even further out of control. The American people know that spending is the problem and that we cannot solve a spending problem by simply raising taxes. We should replace the President's sequester with responsible reforms to help balance our budget within the next ten years, and House Republicans stand ready to work across the aisle to avert sequestration. In order to get this country back on the right track, we can no longer afford to do the things we would like to do, only the things we have to do. It is time for the President and Senate Democrats to put aside their insistence on more tax increases and join us to institute the responsible fiscal policies that our nation and the American people require.



**REAL DOCTOR SHOULD CONFIRM INTERNET DIAGNOSIS**

DEAR HARRIETTE: One of my close friends has been taking a lot of online tests for the heck of it. The unusual results have led him to believe he might have Asperger's syndrome or autism. He thinks he has had it all his life. (He is 23 now.)

This came as a surprise to me, since I've known him for almost 10 years. I can see in him some of the characteristics of these two disorders, though I think they are too vague to say for sure.

I think it is great that he is learning about himself, but I think this news could negatively affect him and how he views his past and present life. Even if he does have either disorder, I don't think it is severe enough for him to take medication.

Do you have any advice on how to be there for him during this latest discovery? -- Dealing With Discoveries, Baton Rouge, La.

DEAR DEALING WITH DISCOVERIES: It's great that your friend has been learning about himself. But since he is not a doctor, nor are you, it is time for him to visit a doctor to find out if his suspicions are accurate and, if so, what his next steps should be.

Do not try to judge the evaluations he has made. Instead, suggest he make an appointment with his primary care physician. He should bring all of the data he has compiled with him and ask the doctor for guidance.

Many people who suffer from Asperger's or autism live relatively normal lives -- whatever "normal" means. If your friend has behavioral issues or other concerns he has identified for which he might need support, he should seek help from a professional.

# Navarre girls win program's first state weightlifting title

The irony was not lost on Navarre head coach Garrett Bagley.

Just moments after eking out a 24-23 state championship victory over two-time defending champion Spruce Creek, putting an emphatic end to their "always a bridesmaid, never a bride" streak of three consecutive runner-up finishes at state and giving the program its first team title, the Raiders yearned for a bounty of food fitting of their golden performance.

"We're going to Golden Corral," said Bagley, who all year added fuel to the fire by joking with his girls that silver goes with everything. "I tried to talk them out of that, but that's what they had their mind set on."

Wanting to continue their golden night, who could blame them for the buffet choice that — in a weird way — represented endless selections of leaders on their team?

Escaping the shadows of Spruce Creek, who entered Saturday winning eight of the last nine championships, Navarre had six lifters walk away with individual medals.

But none were more impressive than the piece of bling around Amanda Friar's neck, which just so happened to go with her team medal.

Following up an individual runner-up finish last year, the senior didn't even break a sweat cruising past her 110-pound competitors. Finishing with a collective lift of 305 pounds (benched 160, clean and jerk of 145), 20 pounds short of a 325-pound total she put up leading up to the state showcase, Friar outlifted runner-up Alex Hamilton of Clay by 20 pounds.

"We just told her to focus on her bench," Bagley said of a lift that ended up creating a 20-pound cushion for Friar headed into the clean and jerk. "She had a good start, and the next key was remaining relaxed and clearing that first clean and jerk."

Friar's individual gold was the first in the program's 110-pound history, and it was the program's fourth overall — Kayla Poole (unlimited) and Jameeka Anderson (119) in 2011, Janisha Thomas (119) in 2010.

Asked about the emotions going through her mind, Friar responded, "excitement and nervousness and disbelief."

But the senior couldn't celebrate her accomplishment just yet. At least not until the team had learned of its fate.

"Our coaches kind of led us on to believe we didn't win because they wanted it to be kind of a surprise," Friar said. "I didn't want to be happy about my gold with the team finishing second, but then they announced it. ... Definitely everyone was crying."

Following Friar were a pair of second-place showings from district champions Skye Barberi (119 pounds) and Praise Pettus (139).

Pettus' 355 total pounds lifted (180 bench, 175 clean and jerk) were 10 pounds short of River Ridge's Alexis LiCalsi, and Barberi's total of 320 pounds (170 bench, 150 clean and jerk) were 10 pounds short of Sunlake's Alexandra Ruiz. While proud of their showings, Bagley said both lifters were handicapped by two judging errors.

"They were situations that may have caused Praise a state title and threw Skye off a bit," Bagley said. "That little controversy kind of got people in the negative mind frame for a bit, but we came back from it."

The other three individual medalist were Alyssa Jones (110) and Kylie Shelley (119), each of whom finished fourth in their respective weight classes, and Chelsea King (154).

Jones, who dominated at 101 pounds for most of the season until joining Friar at a more comfortable weight, lifted a total of 275 pounds (120 bench, 155 clean and jerk).

"She had a great shot at 101, but we knew 110 was a better weight for her health-wise," Bagley said.

Shelley, meanwhile, lifted 295 (150 bench, 145 clean and jerk) to score three pivotal points, and King lifted 320 (160 bench, 160 clean and jerk) to score a point for a Raiders team hellbent on ending the string of second-place showings.

"I'm just super thrilled for the seniors," said Bagley, who mentioned the success wouldn't have been possible without the hard work of Aaron Daniel, who built the program before leaving for Niceville last year. "They've been on the other side of close calls so many times, so today it just felt the tide was going to turn our way and it did."

# Argos rally late to complete sweep

The No. 13 West Florida baseball team scored five runs in the final four innings to rally for an 8-4 win at Rollins on Sunday to complete a three-game sweep. The Argonauts improved to 6-0 with the win, marking the team's best start since going 7-0 in 1997.

"It was very gratifying to get that win today and be 6-0," said UWF head coach Mike Jeffcoat. "We have a lot of improving to do and things we want to work on, but we're finding ways to win. We're not clicking on all cylinders, but the guys are hanging together, and they have the will to win. That's the most important thing right now."

Senior center fielder Dustin Saulmon (Panama City/Alabama Southern CC) led the UWF (6-0) offense, hitting 4-for-5 with four runs scored. The leadoff hitter also belted a double and triple, and he now is hitting .476 with five extra-base hits this year.

"That's the job of a leadoff hitter," Saulmon said. "I try to go up there and put the ball in play, use some speed and get things started."

Saulmon got things started with a leadoff double in the first, and he came around to score the first run of the game on an RBI single by junior Kaleb Barlow (Florence, Miss./

Another Argonaut run came home in the fifth, as Saulmon tripled down the right field line and came around to score on a throwing error by the right fielder.

The Argos took the lead again the next inning, as junior catcher Garrett Flynn (Davie/Sagemont Upper School) singled home a run. UWF then added one insurance run in the




# Service announces annual Endangered Species Day Youth Art Contest

Elementary, middle and high school teachers are encouraged to have their students participate in the annual Endangered Species Day Youth Art Contest, an integral part of the eighth annual national Endangered Species Day, celebrated on May 17.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and numerous conservation organizations will observe Endangered Species Day to recognize conservation efforts underway across the nation aimed at helping America's

imperiled species. This year also commemorates the 40th anniversary of the Endangered Species Act.

Started in 2006 by the United States Congress, Endangered Species Day is a celebration of the nation's rarest plant and animal species. The Youth Art Contest provides students from kindergarten to high school with an opportunity to learn about threatened and endangered species and express their knowledge and support through artwork. Young artists who

are home-schooled and participate in youth groups are also eligible to submit their art.

Previous winners have come from California, Minnesota, New Jersey, Louisiana and as far away as Alaska. Entries must be postmarked by March 15.

This year, the Endangered Species Day Youth Art Contest finalists will be judged by a prestigious panel of artists, photographers and conservationists, including Wyland, renowned marine life artist; Jack Hanna, host of "Jack Hanna's Into the Wild;" David Littschwager, a freelance photographer and regular contributor to National Geographic Magazine; Susan Middletown, a photog-

rapher who has collaborated with Littschwager and whose own work has been published in four books; and Alice Tangerini, botanical illustrator for the Smithsonian Institution.

The International Child Art Foundation (ICAF) will select the 40 semifinalists from thousands of entries. It takes empathy, direct action and awareness to prevent the extinction of endangered species. Art can certainly play an important role.

The Youth Art Contest is an ideal platform to engage the next generation.

Winners will be chosen in four categories (K-Grade 2, Grades 3-5, Grades 6-8 and Grades 9-12) and will receive plaques and art

supply gift packs. In addition, one grand prize winner will be honored with their name engraved on a special trophy and receive a round-trip flight to Washington, D.C., with one guardian to attend a reception in May. The grand prize winner will also receive art supplies and a special art lesson (via Skype) from Wyland, the artist.

The Youth Art Contest is organized by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Endangered Species Coalition, the Association of Zoos and Aquariums and the International Child Art Foundation. ### NORTHWEST REGION Feb. 1-7

#### ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Just after midnight, Lt. Brian Lambert checked two individuals at the Quintet Boat Ramp on the Escambia River. The subjects had just returned to the ramp and their vessel was still in the water. They were in possession of a rifle, shotgun, and a spotlight. One of the individuals was acting nervous, stepped behind the vehicle, and attempted to dump something out of his pocket. The subject was found to be in possession of cannabis and drug paraphernalia and was issued a notice to appear citation for the violations. Both subjects said they were camping and returned to their vehicle to get more food and alcohol.

#### SANTA ROSA COUNTY COPS

Officers Royce Johnson, Joe Murphy, Steve Hoomes, David Jernigan, Reserve Officer Lila Wise, Lt. Eric Hall, Captains Mary Sumner and Rocky Clement, together with FWC Wildlife and Fisheries staff, worked the second weekend of the annual Mobility Impaired Hunt at the

Blackwater WMA - Hutton Unit. The officers teamed with staff from other FWC Divisions to provide the hunters with a meal each day, assist with tracking down deer, retrieve and clean deer and assist the hunters in enjoying a safe quality hunting experience. During the second weekend of the Mobility Impaired Hunt, 50 hunters and their hunt assistants participated in the annual event harvesting a total of 12 deer (one antlered, 11 antlerless).

#### OKALOOSA COUNTY

Lt. Mark Hollinhead and Officer Phillip Griffith responded to a complaint of dogs pursuing deer in the still hunt area of Blackwater WMA. Lieutenant Hollinhead and Officer Griffith were given a detailed description of the two vehicles involved. The vehicles and subjects were located exiting the management area. When the officers tried to identify a passenger in one of the vehicles, he was evasive, very nervous, and stated he did not have any identification. When the subject pulled out his trouser pockets, in an attempt to show the officers he did not have his identification, drug paraphernalia dropped to the ground. Realizing his error, he quickly fled

on foot into a wooded area. As the subject dove head first over a barbed wire fence, his wallet dropped to the ground. The wallet contained an identification card. Once he was identified, the officers discovered he was a habitual felony offender and had active warrants for felony drug possession and driving while license suspended.

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Department responded with a K-9 Officer and searched for the subject until the officers determined he got a ride from a nearby residence and left the area. The subject's vehicle was located and discovered to have an altered tag attached which was not registered to the vehicle. The sheriff department's K-9 alerted on the vehicle, and a subsequent search confirmed the vehicle contained illegal drugs. Contents of a methamphetamine lab were removed from the vehicle and residue on items tested positive for methamphetamine. Charges will be direct-filed with the State Attorney's Office for manufacturing methamphetamine, possession of methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, hunting violations, possible possession of a firearm by convicted felon, and resisting arrest without violence.

# Stay informed with new saltwater fishing publication

Looking for an easy way to get all of your saltwater fishing regulation information in one place? You are in luck. The January-June 2013 Florida Saltwater Recreational Fishing Regulations booklets are on the shelf at many of your favorite bait and tackle stores. Pick up your own copy today but remember, they are only at stores that also sell saltwater fishing licenses.

The newest edition has a striking photo of the invasive lionfish on the cover and features an article requesting public assistance removing these fish from Florida's waters. It also includes information on upcoming regulation changes for giant anemone, unicorn filefish and Atlantic black sea bass. Love fishing for spotted seatrout or red drum? Check out the new maps detailing special management zones

within the Gulf and Atlantic.

Having tangible reference materials to carry along is a wonderful thing. But keeping the public up-to-date with all the seasons, bag limits and size limits via a printed booklet can be challenging. The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) manages more than 500 saltwater species and has five decision-making meetings each year. Fishing regulations can and do change, and while these booklets may be nice, due to cost they cannot be updated and redistributed every time a new regulation takes effect. Many anglers believe regulations become effective only on Jan. 1 and July 1, when the saltwater booklets are distributed, but that is simply not the case.

Sometimes, important rulemaking decisions have not been made when we go to print. For example, when you get your copy of the new booklet, take

a look at the "Closed Season" information for Gulf gag grouper and red snapper (pages 12-13). While these are two of the most important recreational fish in the Gulf, we were unable to include the open season dates for 2013, as those dates have not been determined.

What is an angler to do? Always be sure to check our electronic versions of the regulations, which are accessible on the Internet or through our mobile website, before hitting the water. At [MyFWC.com/Fishing](http://MyFWC.com/Fishing), regulatory updates can be made at the touch of a button, instantly, and at no cost to anyone.



## Pope Benedict XVI, 85, announces resignation

“ Dear Brothers, I have convoked you to this Consistory, not only for the three canonizations, but also to communicate to you a decision of great importance for the life of the Church. After having repeatedly examined my conscience before God, I have come to the certainty that my strengths, due to an advanced age, are no longer suited to an adequate exercise of the Petrine ministry. I am well aware that this ministry, due to its essential spiritual nature, must be carried out not only with words and deeds, but no less with prayer and suffering. However, in today’s world, subject to so many rapid changes and shaken by

questions of deep relevance for the life of faith, in order to govern the bark of Saint Peter and proclaim the Gospel, both strength of mind and body are necessary, strength which in the last few months, has deteriorated in me to the extent that I have had to recognize my incapacity to adequately fulfill the ministry entrusted to me. For this reason, and well aware of the seriousness of this act, with full freedom I declare that I renounce the ministry of Bishop of Rome, Successor of Saint Peter, entrusted to me by the Cardinals on 19 April 2005, in such a way, that as from 28 February 2013, at 20:00 hours, the See of Rome, the See of Saint Peter, will be vacant and a Conclave to elect the new

Supreme Pontiff will have to be convoked by those whose competence it is.

Dear Brothers, I thank you most sincerely for all the love and work with which you have supported me in my ministry and I ask pardon for all my defects. And now, let us entrust the Holy Church to the care of Our Supreme Pastor, Our Lord Jesus Christ, and implore his holy Mother Mary, so that she may assist the Cardinal Fathers with her maternal solicitude, in electing a new Supreme Pontiff. With regard to myself, I wish to also devotedly serve the Holy Church of God in the future through a life dedicated to prayer. ”

# Grammy Awards voters spread the love to surprise winners

**LOS ANGELES (AP)** — Mumford & Sons wrapped up a completely unpredictable Grammy Awards with perhaps the most surprising win of the night, taking home album of the year.

It was an event that even shocked the London folk-rockers.

“We figured we weren’t going to win anything because The Black Keys have been sweeping up all day, rightfully so,” Marcus Mumford said.

Dan Auerbach of The Black Keys ended up the night’s top winner with four trophies, including producer of the year and three rock category victories with bandmate Patrick Carney. But it was hardly a clean sweep as The Recording Academy’s thousands of voters spread the love for the year’s top singles.

Fun. took home major awards best new artist, in something of an upset over Frank Ocean, and song of the year for the transcendent anthem “We Are Young,” featuring Janelle Monae.

“I didn’t think we were going to win this one,” lead singer Nate Ruess said after the best new artist win. “Frank Ocean. The Lumineers. Everybody, amazing.”

Like Mumford & Sons, Gotye busted up the predictions, taking record of the year for 2012’s top-selling single, the haunting “Somebody That I Used to Know,” featuring Kimbra, and finished with three awards.

Prince, in hood and sunglasses and carrying a sparkly silver cane, presented him with the record of the year trophy and the Australian paid tribute to The Purple One’s influence.

“A little bit lost for words, to receive an award from the man standing behind us with the cane,”

Gotye said. “Many years listening to this man’s music growing up and a big reason I was inspired to make music. Thank you.”

Jay-Z and Kanye West had three wins — sharing one award with Ocean — along with Skrillex, and a slew of nominees Ocean had two wins apiece, including former best new artist winner Esperanza Spalding.

Ocean was shut out in the major categories but took home two trophies, including best urban contemporary album. Only Chris Brown, with whom Ocean scuffled last month, remained seated as the 25-year-old R&B winner walked to the stage during a standing ovation. Ocean beat Brown, who attended with girlfriend Rihanna, in the category.

Ocean won also won best rap/sung collaboration

for “No Church in the Wild” with fellow top nominees Jay-Z and West, and The-Dream. The win came after victories for Jay-Z and West for best rap song and best rap performance for “... in Paris,” another “Watch the Throne” track. Ocean also performed his song “Forrest Gump,” the love song written about a man that first started the buzz that led to his announcement that his first love was a man.

The Black Keys took best rock performance for “Lonely Boy” during the main telecast and earlier in the day won best rock song for “Lonely Boy” and best rock album for “El Camino.” He also got an assist — but no trophy — on Dr. John’s best blues album “Locked Down,” which he produced.

Other winners included Rihanna, Beyonce, Mumford & Sons and Taylor Swift, who opened the show as the Mad Hatter. Swift dressed in white top hat, tails, shorts and tall boots during the surreal version of her hummable hit “We Are Never Ever Getting Back Together” that included a troop of mime clowns and a guy on a tricycle with a flame-thrower attached.

The singer pretended to talk to the offending boyfriend on the phone: “I’m busy opening the Grammys and we’re never getting back together.”

Justin Timberlake debuted new tracks “Suit & Tie” with Jay-Z and “Pusher Love” in a performance that was broadcast in retro black and white. Rihanna and the extended Marley family paid tribute to Bob Marley. Sting and Bruno Mars helped each other out on their hits “Locked Out of Heaven” and “Walking on the Moon.” Elton John and Ed Sheeran teamed on “The A Team” and Miguel and Wiz Khalifa

joined forces teamed up on “Adorn.” Alicia Keys played drums during Maroon 5’s “Daylight,” before Adam Levine’s band backed her on “Girl on Fire.”

Jack White brought both his male and female bands on stage, tearing through “Love Interruption” and “Freedom at 21” before a standing ovation from the crowd. And Elton John, Mavis Staples, Brown, Mumford & Sons and Brittany Howard of Alabama Shakes paid tribute to the late Levon Helm with a spirited rendition of “The Weight.”

Adele won the first award of the night on the main telecast, taking home best pop solo performance for “Set Fire to the Rain (Live),” in one of the night’s least-surprising moments — though the singer was somewhat taken aback.

“I just wanted to be part of the night, because I loved it last year, obviously,” she said of winning a record-tying six

awards in 2012.

Carrie Underwood won best country solo performance for “Blown Away,” Zac Brown Band won best country album for “Uncaged” and Kelly Clarkson turned in the night’s most exuberant acceptance speech after winning best pop vocal album for “Stronger.” After hugging much of the front row and momentarily getting stuck to Miranda Lambert’s dress, Clarkson charged the stage with a giant smile.

“Miguel, I don’t know who the hell you are, but we need to sing together,” she said. “I mean, good God. That was the sexiest dancing I’ve ever seen.”

Skrillex won best dance recording for “Bangarang,” featuring Sirah, best dance/electronic album for “Bangarang” and best remixed recording a year after winning those same awards in his first appearance at the Grammys.

“You know what, I thought I’d get used to it, but I tripped over every word when I was up there,” Skrillex said of his acceptance speeches. “I felt like I just wanted a pool of ice water and just couldn’t even breathe or think. It was crazy. I think it was even crazier than last year.”

Celebrities rolled down the red carpet in the early afternoon under heavy police guard during a continued manhunt for an alleged cop killer. Many stars showed a fair amount of skin — check out the Twitter pic of Ellen DeGeneres ogling Katy Perry’s revealing dress — despite CBS’s mandate that stars dress appropriately with butts, breasts and other sensitive areas covered adequately. Nevertheless, Jennifer Lopez showed up on stage in a dress slit all the way to her hip.

“As you can see, I read the memo,” Lopez joked.

Contenders to be his successor include Cardinal Angelo Scola, archbishop of Milan, Schoenborn, the archbishop of Vienna, and Cardinal Marc Ouellet, the Canadian head of the Vatican's office for bishops.

There also will be a very big spotlight cast on Cardinal Gianfranco Ravasi, the Italian head of the Vatican's culture office, who has long been on the list of "papabile." Benedict selected him to preside over the Vatican's spiritual exercises during Lent.

Longshots include Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York. Although Dolan is popular and backs the pope's conservative line, being from such a world super power will probably not count in his favor. That might also rule out Cardinal Raymond Burke, an arch-conservative and the Vatican's top judge, even if he is known and respected by most Vatican cardinals.

Given half of the world's Catholics live in the global south, there once again will be arguments for a pope to come from the developing world.

Cardinal Antonio Tagle, the archbishop of Manila, has impressed many Vatican watchers, but at 56 and having only been named a cardinal last year, he is considered too young.

Cardinal Peter Kodwo Appiah Turkson of Ghana is one of the highest-ranking African cardinals at the Vatican, currently heading the Vatican's office for justice and peace, but he's something of a wild card.

There are several "papabile" in Latin America, though the most well-known, Cardinal Oscar Andres Rodriguez Maradiaga of Honduras, is considered far too liberal to be elected by such a conservative College of Cardinals.

# Pope to resign Feb. 28, says he's too infirm

**VATICAN CITY (AP)** — Declaring he lacks the strength to do his job, Pope Benedict XVI announced Monday he will resign Feb. 28 — becoming the first pontiff to step down in 600 years. His decision sets the stage for a mid-March conclave to elect a new leader for a Roman Catholic Church in deep turmoil.

The 85-year-old pope dropped the bombshell in Latin during a meeting of Vatican cardinals, surprising even his closest collaborators even though he had made clear previously he would step down if he became too old or infirm to carry on.

Benedict called his choice "a decision of great importance for the life of the church."

Indeed, the move allows the Vatican to hold a conclave before Easter to elect a new pope, because the traditional nine days of mourning that would follow the death of a pope doesn't have to be observed.

Benedict already has hand-picked the bulk of the College of Cardinals — the princes of the church who will elect the next pope — to guarantee his conservative legacy and ensure an orthodox future for the church.

"Without doubt this is a historic moment," said Cardinal Christoph Schoenborn, a protege and former theology student of Benedict's who himself is considered a papal contender. "Right now, 1.2 billion Catholics the world over are holding their breath."

Cardinal Andre Vingt-Trois, the archbishop of Paris, called the decision a "liberating act for the future," saying popes from now on no longer will feel compelled to stay on until their death.

"One could say that in a certain manner, Pope Benedict XVI broke a taboo," he told reporters in Paris.

The Vatican stressed that no specific medical condition prompted Benedict's decision, that he remained fully lucid and took his decision independently.

"Any interference or inter-

vented Jews and Muslims alike and, more recently, a scandal over leaked documents by his own butler. Many of his stated priorities as pope also fell short: he failed to establish relations with China, heal the schism and reunite with the Orthodox Church, or reconcile with a group of breakaway, traditionalist Catholics.

Still, most Vatican watchers saw his decision as the best thing to do for the church given his diminished capacities.

"It is an act ultimately of responsibility and love for the church," said the Rev. John Wauck, an Opus Dei priest who teaches at the Pontifical Holy Cross University in Rome.

All cardinals under age 80 are allowed to vote in the conclave, the secret meeting held in the Sistine Chapel where cardinals cast ballots to elect a new pope. As per tradition, the ballots are burned after each voting round; black smoke that snakes out of the chimney means no pope has been chosen, while white smoke means a pope has been elected.

Whoever Benedict's successor is, he will face a church in turmoil: The sex abuse scandal has driven away thousands of people, particularly in Europe. Rival churches, particularly evangelical Pentecostal groups in the developing world, pose new competition. And as the pope himself has long lamented, many people in an increasingly secular world simply believe they don't need God.

The timing of Benedict's announcement was significant: Lent begins this week on Ash Wednesday, the most solemn period on the church's calendar that culminates with Holy Week and Easter on March 31. It is also the period in which the world witnessed the final days of John Paul's papacy in 2005.

By Easter Sunday, the Catholic Church will have a new leader, a potent symbol of rebirth in the church that echoes the resurrection of Christ celebrated on Easter.

**PRECEDENTS FOR PAPAL RESIGNATIONS**

Popes are allowed to resign but church law says the decision must be "freely made and properly manifested." Still, only a handful have done it in the two millennia history of the Catholic Church.

- **Marcellinus:** This early church pope abdicated or was deposed in 304 after complying with the Roman emperor's order to offer sacrifice to the pagan gods.
- **Benedict IX:** Sold the papacy to his godfather Gregory VI and resigned in 1045.
- **Celestine V:** Overwhelmed by the demands of the office, this hermetic pontiff stepped down after five months as pope in 1294. Pope Benedict XVI prayed at his tomb in the central Italian city of L'Aquila in 2009.
- **Gregory XII:** The last pope to resign, Gregory XII stepped down in 1415 to help end a church schism.

vention is alien to his style," Vatican spokesman the Rev. Federico Lombardi said.

It has been obvious to all that the pope has slowed down significantly in recent years, cutting back his foreign travel and limiting his audiences. He now goes to and from the altar in St. Peter's Basilica on a moving platform to spare him the long walk down the aisle. Occasionally he uses a cane.

During his tenure, Benedict

charted a very conservative course for the church, trying to reawaken Christianity in Europe where it had fallen by the wayside and return the church to its traditional roots, which he felt had been betrayed by an incorrect interpretation of the modernizing reforms of the Second Vatican Council.

His efforts though, were overshadowed by a worldwide clerical sex abuse scandal, communication gaffes that out-
