Man dead after standoff with SWAT

A Navarre man is dead after three members of the Santa Rosa County Sheriff's SWAT team shot him on Friday, according to sheriff's reports.

Jeffrey Allen Wright, 55, died at the scene after a standoff with law enforcement officers, according to reports.

Sgt. Scott Haines said the incident began when deputies went

to Wright's home on Avenida De Galvez in Navarre to serve two warrants: five counts each for counterfeiting and passing a counterfeit bill, both felonies. Because the Navarre man "has had confrontations in the past with the Sheriff's office," multiple deputies responded.

"When Wright was encountered by deputies, Wright produced a black object from his pocket, appearing to be a firearm, and concealed it behind his back," Haines wrote. The man fled into

the garage area and up the stairs to a second floor. Once there, he barricaded the stairs, and Wright fired one shot, Haines said.

Haines said after barricading himself, Wright told deputies to "come get me" and told them if they came up the stairs, they would "not come back down." He allegedly told deputies "if you ever want to see your families again, you will leave." Reports say SWAT was called at this point, "due to the threats and violent nature of Wright," and deputies

backed off from the "immediate area."

Haines said after Wright's refusal to continue a dialogue with negotiators, the SWAT team deployed gas to the second floor. Wright began breaking out windows with a semi-automatic pistol, sheriff's reports said, and was repeatedly given orders to come out. Haines said Wright began to take down the items he used in the barricade and sat down at the top of the stairwell.

Haines said Wright was given

"lawful orders to surrender" but ignored those orders and "raised the pistol and pointed it directly at SWAT team members..." Haines said three deputies fired their weapons "simultaneously," striking Wright. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Deputies Sgt. Nathan Hall, Deputy Brian Miller and Detective Jerry Nash are on paid administrative leave, and the Florida Department of Law Enforcement

Variety of shops are home to unique items

Filling a house with mainstream items can be done quickly through department or home good stores, but locating unique pieces to bring character to a space is a process.

Antique malls are popular places to find one-of-a-kind pieces, but because it takes time and patience, having a large variety of antique malls in one location can be a benefit to shoppers.

"It's the kind of business you can cluster a lot in one spot," said Kim Macarthy, owner of the Copper Possum Antique Mall in East Milton. "People can antique shop all day long, but they can only eat three meals a day."

Many antique shops in the area have their own unique draw and "flavor," as Macarthy said. The Press Gazette spoke with several shop owners and managers to hear about what makes their shops unique.

Copper Possum

Copper Possum, 7060 U.S. 90 in East Milton, opened in 1999. The shop is almost 10,000 square feet. The owner, Kim Macarthy, has been drawn to the antique industry her entire life.

"My mom was always a big collector, so I grew up going to sales with her," Macarthy said. "When I became an adult, I followed suit."

Macarthy worked as a dealer for a



number of years before opening her own business. She said a key to having a successful antique shop is to have a certain number of "wow pieces" or "advertising pieces" that draw people in.

Some of her "wow" items in Copper Possum are a 5½-foot tall stained glass window from England and a watchmaker's bench.

Floridatown Station

Floridatown Station, 4372 Floridatown Road in Pace, opened in 2009. The store has about 92 vendors. Store manager

2nd biker killed at intersection

A second motorcycle accident at U.S. 90 and Smith's Fish Camp Road in less than two weeks has left a second biker dead.

The Florida Highway Patrol reported Stephen Craig Hughes, 52, of Milton, was killed as the result of a drunk driver failing to yield right-of-way to the motorcyclist.

The accident happened at 3:03 a.m. Sunday when James Ashley McGowan, 39, of Pace, was traveling in the westbound left turn lane at U.S. 90, coming to the intersection of Smith's Fish Camp Road, according to FHP reports. Hughes was going east in the outside eastbound lane on U.S. 90, coming to the same intersection.

48 apply for economic director post

After receiving 48 applications, Santa Rosa County officials hope to have the economic development director position filled by May.

County Administrator Hunter Walker announced at Tuesday's commission meeting that the application process has closed and the recruiting firm, ContactIntelligence/KIJobGrowth, is completing preliminary screening and interviews.

"We are moving forward," Walker said. "I've been pleased with the work the recruiter has done; this is the first time we've ever used one."

"(The) applications are primarily from Mississippi. There are a number from Florida, mostly in the south-end of the state. (We will be) meeting with KI Jobs to look at the full lineup then start to go through the process."

In January, the county signed a contract





Traffic homicide investigators with FHP said McGowan "failed to recognize" Hughes approaching and pulled in front of him. As the Chevrolet 1500 pickup truck crossed the road, the 2013 Harley Hughes was riding struck the right side of the truck, throwing him against the vehicle.

Hughes was transported to West Florida Hospital, where he died, according to FHP. McGowan was arrested, charged with his fourth DUI and DUI manslaughter.

Less than two weeks ago, on Feb. 26, a Pensacola man, Kevin Murphy, 50, was killed in the same manner, according to reports, when a vehicle driven by Richard Conrad,

23, of Milton, hit the 2004 Yamaha motorcycle Murphy was operating. Murphy died on March 4 at Sacred Heart Hospital from injuries incurred in this crash, according to FHP. Alcohol was not a factor in this crash. Charges are pending.

Hughes is the sixth person to be killed while riding a motorcycle in the three-county area since the beginning of the year. Five of the crashes occurred in Santa Rosa County or involved Santa Rosa residents. with KontaktIntelligence in the amount of \$15,250 to recruit a new economic development director.

The economic development department in Santa Rosa County has seen some ups and downs in the past year.

TEAM Santa Rosa was a public/private partner-

ship that was the economic development contractor for the county from 1992 to Aug. 31, 2012. Longtime TEAM director Cindy Anderson resigned in February. Soon after, Shannon Ogletree was named the interim director of TEAM, and the organization was rebranded the Santa Rosa Economic Alliance.

The Santa Rosa County Commissioners then terminated their contract with the organization and created the new county economic development department on Sept. 1.

Ogletree remains the interim director of the new county economic development department.

Tami Twitchell said Floridatown is an out-of-the-way treasure that is less overwhelming than many other antique shops.

"We have big aisles, and it's comfortable," she said. "We don't have the hustle and bustle of some other (shops)."

Unique to Floridatown Station are cake decorating, knitting and jewelry classes. They also have an Amish food market next door to the antiques, with jellies, cheeses and candies.

"We're a store that's meant to be explored," Twitchell said. "We're laid back and a hidden treasure."

Milton Antiques

Two antique shops, the former Shoppe on Berryhill and Milton Antiques, have combined their efforts to keep the shop at 6705 Berryhill Road open for regular hours. The Shoppe on Berryhill opened at their first location, 6692 Berryhill Road, on Jan. 5, but moved to its new home within Milton Antiques on March 4.

By joining together, the shop is now open with regular hours from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Kyle Holley, owner of Milton Antiques, said in today's economy, small businesses should do everything they can to help each other.

Milton Antiques features boutique farm products, and The Shoppe on Berryhill displays unique furniture, handmade gifts and home décor.

The Old Post Office

The Old Post Office, 6821 Caroline St. in downtown Milton, opened in 2007. It is a multi-dealer mall and also features the Piano Café with all homemade food items.

Owner Cassandra Sharp said in the past, antiques were a hobby, but she religiously visited estate sales.

After opening Main Street Café, 6820 Caroline St., Sharp said she saw a big draw for antique shops, which is why she opened The Old Post Office.

Over the years, Sharp said some of the stand-out pieces that have come through The Old Post Office have been statues of Blues Brothers and old popcorn wagons.

"We try and get some of the really unique items," Sharp said. But the building alone is a draw to many people. "A lot of people actually come to see the building since it's a historic post office."

Sharp said she looks for ways to bring the community together through the shop and has started a Pie in the Sky Politics Pie Social on the first Monday of every month after the Milton City Council Executive Council meeting at 4 p.m. Those who attend the meeting are invited to have complimentary pie, coffee and tea while they discuss some of issues brought up at the meeting.

"There's a lot of change going on in Milton," she said. "We want to provide a venue and get people involved so we can give city leaders more input."

is investigating. Both actions are common with officer-involved shootings, Haines wrote.

Sheriff's officials said in the past, Wright had claimed to them he was a "sovereign citizen," and he denounced his United States citizenship, also noting he did not acknowledge state laws and that he does not have to comply with law enforcement because their requests are "unlawful."

The chain of events that eventually led to Wright's death might have begun with a traffic stop for speeding. According to sheriff's reports from last year, Wright was pulled over on East Bay Boulevard in September 2012. Reports indicate he was driving a gray pickup truck 71 miles per hour in a 45 mph zone when a patrol deputy tried to pull him over. Deputies say he did not immediately stop, and when he did, he would not comply with requests for his driver's license. Instead, he turned over paperwork called "Af-

fidavit of Reservation of Rights" with his full name on it. The original deputy called for a supervisor to back him up, and when the supervisor arrived, Wright would not exit his vehicle when asked, according to reports.

Wright was arrested and charged with two nonmoving traffic violations; crimes against person; and resisting an officer without violence. In October, another sheriff's report was filed saying Wright attempted to pay his fines in Santa Rosa County at the Clerk's Office with fake money orders created on a computer. On the money order, the words "the money will come from the US Treasury Dept" were printed. Again, in November, sheriff's reports said he tried to pay with a similar money order. Numerous other payments were made in the same fashion in January 2013.

The warrants deputies were trying to serve on Friday resulted from the attempts Wright made to pay his fines last year.





‘Tosca’ to be at Saenger this weekend



Saturday, we printed a story detailing how motorcycle and bus crashes (not crashes BETWEEN the two) had increased this year.

Anytime accidents involving school buses are mentioned, eyebrows go up. How is it, people wonder, that our most precious cargo could see an increase in crashes? How, indeed? Did you catch the story about the Seminole County school bus driver caught on tape ... texting?

Even worse than drinking and driving, texting has become the bane of the modern motorist. So many people do it. Most argue there’s nothing wrong with it, but studies show otherwise.

That Seminole County driver was already suspended last year when he got in an accident. Yes, officials allege he was texting and driving then, too.

Now school officials have again suspended the driver, Robert Stancheski. There were no students on board when the most recent alleged incident occurred. Still, we wonder about the driver’s thought process. Had he forgotten the accident from last April? Had he forgotten the possible danger? Had he forgotten the system-installed camera constantly looking over his left shoulder?

“Yes” would seem to be the answer to all previous questions.

It will be difficult to convince new teen drivers of the dangers involved in texting while driving if we only slap the wrists of those caught doing it while transporting our children. We often wonder why we face tickets if we don’t buckle up, but some school buses don’t even have any seat belts.

Not to say that some put a price on life, but a study in Alabama is said to have found it would cost between \$32 million and \$38 million to equip all Alabama school buses with the safety straps, but that only a single life was likely to be saved.

It’s said the size of the bus protects the occupants from much potential damage. Also, the seat itself is said to be

Educational riot

American education is in a sorry state of affairs, and there’s enough blame for all participants to have their fair share. They include students who are hostile and alien to the education process, uninterested parents, teachers and administrators who either are incompetent or have been beaten down by the system, and politicians who’ve become handmaidens for teachers unions. There’s another education issue that’s neither flattering nor comfortable to confront and talk about. That’s the low academic preparation of many teachers. That’s an issue that must be confronted and dealt with if we’re to improve the quality of education. Let’s look at it.

Schools of education, whether graduate or undergraduate, tend to represent the academic slums of most college campuses. They tend to be home to students who have the lowest academic achievement test scores when they enter college, such as SAT scores. They have the lowest scores when they graduate and choose to take postgraduate admissions tests -- such as the GRE, the MCAT and the LSAT.

The California Basic Educational Skills Test, or CBEST, is mandatory for teacher certification in California. It’s a joke. Here’s a multiple-choice question on its practice math test: “Rob uses 1 box of cat food every 5 days to feed his cats. Approximately how many boxes of cat food does he use per month? A. 2 boxes, B. 4 boxes, C. 5 boxes, D. 6 boxes, E. 7 boxes.” Here’s another: “Which of the following is the most appropriate unit for expressing the weight of a pencil? A. pounds, B. ounces, C. quarts, D. pints, E. tons.” I’d venture to predict that the average reader’s sixth-grader could answer each question. Here’s a question that is a bit more challenging; call your eighth-grader: “Solve for y: y - 2 + 3y = 10, A. 2, B. 3, C. 4, D. 5, E. 6.”

Some years ago, the Association of Mexican American Educators, the California Association for Asian-Pacific Bilingual Education and the Oakland Alliance of Black Educators brought suit against the state of California and the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, charging that the CBEST was racially discriminatory. Plaintiff “evidence” was the fact that the first-time passing rate for whites was 80 percent, about 50 percent for Mexican-

Americans, Filipinos and Southeast Asians, and 46 percent for blacks. In 2000, in a stroke of rare common sense, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit found CBEST not to be racial discriminatory.

Poor teacher preparation is not a problem restricted to California. In Massachusetts, only 27 percent of new teachers could pass the math test needed to be certified as a teacher. A 2011 investigation by Atlanta’s Channel 2 Action News found that more than 700 Georgia teachers repeatedly failed at least one portion of the certification test they are required to pass before receiving a teaching certificate. Nearly 60 teachers failed the test more than 10 times, and one teacher failed the test 18 times. They also found that there were 297 teachers on the Atlanta school system’s payroll even though they had failed the state certification test five times or more.

Textbooks used in schools of education might explain some teacher ineptitude. A passage in Marilyn Burns’ text “About Teaching Mathematics” reads, “There is no place for requiring students to practice tedious calculations that are more efficiently and accurately done by using calculators.” “New Designs for Teaching and Learning,” by Dennis Adams and Mary Hamm, says, “Content knowledge is not seen to be as important as possessing teaching skills and knowledge about the students being taught.” Harvey Daniels and Marilyn Bizar’s text “Methods that Matter” reads, “Students can no longer be viewed as cognitive living rooms into which the furniture of knowledge is moved in and arranged by teachers, and teachers cannot invariably act as subject-matter experts.” The authors explain, “The main use of standardized tests in America is to justify the distribution of certain goodies to certain people.”

With but a few exceptions, schools of education represent the academic slums of most any college. American education could benefit from slum removal, eliminating schools of education.

Pre-diabetes prevention program begins

On March 14, the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County will begin a new program designed to help participants lose weight, make healthier food choices and increase their physical activity level with the goal of preventing or delaying the onset of Type-2 diabetes in individuals with pre-diabetes.

Led by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), the National Diabetes Prevention Program was initially started through a partnership between the YMCA of the USA and UnitedHealth Group. The program includes 16 core sessions, held weekly, and six post-core sessions, held monthly. Participants work with a lifestyle coach and attend group sessions. There is a fee of \$35 to cover the cost of course materials and lab work. Sessions will be held at the Florida Department of Health, 5527 Stewart St., in Milton. To register for classes, call 983-5200, ext. 154. Risk factors for developing pre-diabetes and Type-2 diabetes include:

- Being age 45 or older.
- Being overweight.

• Having a parent or sibling with diabetes.

• Being African American, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian, Asian American or Pacific Islander.

• Being a woman who had gestational diabetes (diabetes while pregnant) or who gave birth to a baby weighing nine pounds or more.

• Being physically active less than three times a week (at least 150 minutes per week).

Early diagnosis and treatment of pre-diabetes and Type-2 diabetes can help prevent serious health problems such as loss of eyesight, kidney damage, stroke or heart attack. With proper treatment and lifestyle changes, individuals with diabetes can live longer, healthier lives.





Attorney General: Stay away from synthetic drugs

With spring break season in full swing, Attorney General Pam Bondi warns students about the dangers of synthetic drugs, sometimes referred to as "incense," "potpourri," "K2," "spice" and "bath salts," can cause psychotic episodes, hallucinations, seizures, paranoia, tremors and more. According to the Drug Abuse Warning Network report, more than 11,000 emergency room visits nationwide involved a synthetic cannabinoid product in 2010, and the majority of the visits were

from youths ranging in age from 12-17. In December, Bondi announced an emergency rule banning additional synthetic compounds, and this legislative session, she is working with other senators and representatives to permanently ban 23 synthetic compounds. "Synthetic drugs are extremely dangerous substances that are being marketed to our youth," Bondi said. "I urge students across the state to stay away from these drugs, and I remind retailers that carrying these substances is illegal under Florida law."

Spring wild turkey season almost at hand

For those who love to hunt wild turkeys in the spring, the magical time of the year is almost at hand. In the northern two-thirds of Florida, the spring season opens March 16 and ends April 21, except in Holmes County, where the season is shorter and ends March 31.

Those who are bitten by the spring turkey hunting bug will quickly tell you of the excitement in hearing a mature bird gobbling at daylight in the distance and the calls you make in an attempt to draw the bird into range. Sometimes the hunter succeeds and bags a tom; other times the gobbler figures out something isn't quite right and strikes out in a different direction.

Florida has a bag limit of one bearded bird or gobbler per day, with a two-bird bag limit for the spring season. There are five sub-species of wild turkeys in North America.

Florida is one of only a handful of states that have more than one sub-species. The Eastern bird is found in North Florida, including the Panhandle, but that's not the bird many hunters travel here to hunt. Instead, they are after the Osceola turkey, which is found south of a line running roughly from Jacksonville to Cedar Key.

Color wise and size wise, turkey purists say the Osceola bird is slightly darker than its sister birds and a tad smaller on average. Some who have hunted Osceolas say they are more wary and difficult to hunt than Easterns. Having sought both, they each are challenging birds to hunt. The slightest miscue, such as moving a hand or turning your head at the wrong time, being poorly camouflaged, or a dozen other things, and your hunt, at least for that bird, is over.

The vast majority of spring turkey hunters

pursue turkeys the same way. They set up and call to a gobbler, sometimes using hen or gobbler decoys.

Thanks to modern wildlife management and protection afforded by fish and wildlife agencies, wild turkey numbers have increased from an estimated 30,000 birds nationwide in 1900 to an estimated 6 million up to 7 million birds today.

Red tide bloom affecting manatees

A red-tide event in southwest Florida has claimed 174 manatees so far this year. Although results are preliminary, this is the highest number of red tide-related deaths in a single calendar year on record.

State and federal scientists are monitoring and responding to manatees affected by the ongoing red tide bloom along the southwest Florida coast.

To help with these efforts, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission ask the public to be on the lookout for manatees affected by red tide. Signs include a lack of coordination and stability in the water, muscle twitches or seizures and difficulty lifting its head to breathe.

With help from citizens in the area, the FWC and partners have rescued 12 manatees suffering from the effects of red tide so far this

year. The public is asked to report any manatees showing the effects of red tide, and any other distressed or dead manatees, to the FWC's Wildlife Alert Hotline at 888-404-FWCC (3922).

State and federal scientists are collecting and analyzing data aimed at helping them to better understand the long-term impacts of this ongoing event on the manatee population. Manatees are listed as an endangered species under the Endangered Species Act of 1973.

"We are working with the FWC along with other researchers and state partners to assess what is needed immediately in response to this event, as well as what this and other recent events may or may not mean for manatee recovery," said Leopoldo Miranda, assistant regional director for Ecological Services in the USFWS's Southeast Regional Office. "Our priority remains the animals, not the process."





COLLEAGUE HIJACKS CLIENT MEETING

DEAR HARRIETTE: I went to a meeting with a colleague the other day where I was supposed to make a presentation to our client. My colleague was supposed to be there as an observer and to help answer any questions.

Suggest that you divide up duties so both of you will have important roles in meetings, since clearly he does not want to be an observer. But it is important to establish ground rules for how you can best work together.



Rome braces for conclave crowd control challenge

ROME (AP) — You're expecting hundreds of thousands of guests. You don't know where they're coming from, or when they'll arrive. You don't even know the date of the celebration.

And heaven only knows the name of the man being feted.

Planning for the moment when the next pope is proclaimed to the world, and for the installation ceremony a few days later, is a big-time guessing game. And that adds up to an ungodly logistical headache for the city of Rome.

When white smoke pours out of the chimney atop the Sistine Chapel, throngs of Romans will drop what they're doing and race to St. Peter's Square to cheer the new pope when he steps out onto the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica. If the next pontiff hails from somewhere in Italy, thousands can be expected to pack trains to the capital.

Then there are all the foreigners flying into town to capture the historic moment — an influx that may become overwhelming if cardinals break with tradition and elect the first pope from Latin America, home to 40 percent of the world's Catholics.

A tented field hospital

went up in a square near the Vatican by the eve of the start of the conclave Tuesday, ensuring that emergency medical treatment will be just around the corner if any pilgrim feels ill or stumbles in the rush to glimpse the new pope.

While there are no other special plans for the conclave itself, Rome authorities have a detailed game-plan for the papal installation that takes place a few days after the pope is elected. The audience for that momentous event in St. Peter's Square will include presidents, prime ministers, religious leaders and tens of thousands of pilgrims, along with the throngs of accidental tourists who happen to be in town.

Police helicopters will whirl overhead. Thousands of extra police will be summoned to duty to keep streets safe and unclogged. Officers on motorized rubber dinghies will glide down the Tiber, ready to dive into the river's murky waters to pick out anything suspicious. Bomb-sniffing dogs will poke their noses down manholes and trash bins in security sweeps along the routes that both VIPs and faithful will cover en route to the square.



Hot chicks

At 60, Peeps more popular than ever

BETHLEHEM, Pa. (AP) — It's Easter morning. A boy rouses his younger brother, and they run to the living room to find their baskets filled with — what else? — Peeps.

"Peeps are THE candy of Easter," the excited boy tells his wide-eyed sibling, who pops a yellow marshmallow chick in his mouth.

"You can eat 'em, smash 'em, microwave 'em, deep fry 'em, roast 'em on a stick," the boy explains. That's not all. You can make "historically accurate Peeps dioramas ... Peeps pop art ... You can make a Peeps topiary." On he goes, all day and night. "Peeps jousting ... hide-and-go Peeps ... Peepshi ... that's sushi made out of Peeps."

As the storied candy brand celebrates its 60th anniversary this year, Peeps' first TV ad in a decade captures an essential truth about the spongy confection made of sugar, corn syrup and gelatin: Love them or hate them, people do all sorts of things with Peeps, only some of which involve giving them to kids at Easter or eating them straight from the box.

And they're not shy about sharing.

"Everyone seems to have a Peeps story," says Ross Born, third-generation operator of Just Born Inc., which hatches 5 million Peeps a day at its plant 60 miles north of Philadelphia. "And they are free and willing to talk about how they eat their Peeps, how they cure them, how they store them, how they decorate with them. And these are adults!"

Just Born calls it the "Peepsonality" of consumers who buy Peeps not only to eat, but also to play around with.

"If you had asked me about this 25 years ago, I would've been rather bewildered about the whole thing," Born confesses. "We were candy makers."

Not that he's complaining. Just Born had its best year financially in 2012.

His grandfather, Russian immigrant Sam Born, started the candy company out of a Brooklyn storefront 90 years ago. Born advertised the freshness of his product with a sign that said "Just Born." The name stuck.

The burgeoning business moved to Bethlehem and acquired the Peeps brand with its 1953 purchase of Rodda Candy Co. of Lancaster. Best known for its jelly beans, Rodda had also introduced a small line of marshmallow chicks and bunnies, employing dozens of women who hand-squeezed them out of pastry bags. "It was really very difficult, and these women were strong," said David Shaffer, Sam Born's nephew and co-CEO along with Ross Born.


Ross's father, Bob Born — a physicist and engineer by training — automated the process in the mid-1950s, and a version of the machine he invented is still in use today, extruding millions of those familiar shapes on peak-Peep production days.

The company, whose other brands are Hot Tamales, Mike and Ike, and Goldenberg's Peanut Chews, has never suffered an unprofitable year. But its growth has always been relatively slow, steady and controlled, and a few years ago, Born and Shaffer decided they wanted to accelerate it.

The longtime partners brought in a new management team, spent heavily on marketing and broke back into the chocolate business, introducing chocolate-dipped Peeps as well as Peepsters, small chocolate candies filled with marshmallow-flavored cream.

(New for this year is a yellow chick nestled in a hollow chocolate egg.) They also focused on holiday seasons other than Easter, particularly Christmas.

The result: Shaffer says last year was "off the charts." While Just Born is privately held and does not disclose revenue, he says it posted double-digit growth across all brands. And Shaffer sees more growth potential as the confectioner works to position its products in warehouse clubs and convenience stores.



Just Born certainly benefits from being part of a \$33 billion candy industry that is seen as basically recession-proof, offering an inexpensive indulgence during tough economic times.

"Candy did not seem to take the hit that some other industries faced in recent years. We think a big reason for that is candy's place in our hearts and minds," says Susan Whiteside of the National Confectioners Association, a trade group.

Long associated with Easter, Peeps have penetrated the pop-culture consciousness in a way that other candy brands have not.

Aficionados send chicks into battle in a microwave "sport" known as Peeps jousting. They enter Peeps art contests, dozens of which are held around the country this time of year. They innovate recipes like "Peepza," a desert pizza. They write cheeky blog entries with titles like "101 Fun Ways to Torture a Peep."

Hoping to capitalize, Just Born recently opened three Peeps & Company retail stores in Pennsylvania, Maryland and Minnesota.

While the company churns out more than 1 billion Peeps this Easter season — a record — it sees the 60th anniversary

the number of Peeps that will be made this Easter season

as another marketing opportunity and a chance to connect with its fans via social media. In addition to the TV ad campaign, it's promoting a Facebook survey that asks knowing questions like this one: Do you like your Peeps fresh, frozen or "aged to perfection"?

So which is it, Ross Born? Fresh or stale?

He's happy to address that perennial Peeps debate. Just don't ask him to take sides.

"There's a lot of gray area here," Born says

diplomatically. "There are people who tell me they put a one-inch slice in the film (that seals the box), and they'll lay it on top of their refrigerator for two days. No more, no less. Then they are PERFECT to eat.

"So it's not necessarily stale, it's just a little firmer. All right? It's just like politics," says Just Born's commander-in-Peep.

"You've got people way on one side, and way on the other side, but there are a whole lot of people in the middle."

Michigan LaughFest breaks record — for fake mustaches

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich. (AP) — Magnum P.I., Ron Burgundy and Ron Swanson would be impressed.

Organizers of an annual laugh festival in Michigan say they've broken the world record for the most people wearing fake mustaches.

Gilda's LaughFest is reporting that 1,544 people donned various shapes and sizes of dark 'staches on Thursday, the Grand Rapids festival's opening day.

The record is awaiting Guinness World Record certification.

If it sticks, the record would be the third set at the festival in as many years. Last year the festival broke the record for the most people wearing fake animal noses. The year before, it was people tossing rubber chickens.

LaughFest officials say the previous fake mustache record of 648 participants was set in September at a St. Louis Rams event.

Brazilian police puzzle over 7 gift-wrapped skulls

RIO DE JANEIRO (AP) — Police in the Brazilian city of Sao Paulo are baffled by a macabre puzzle: someone has been leaving gift-wrapped human skulls around town.

Investigator Paul Henry Bozon Verduraz described the case to the Folha de Sao Paulo newspaper in a story published Thursday.

The first skull in cherry-red wrapping was found on February 20 in a planter near a residential building downtown. Since then, seven others have been found near Mormon temples or consulates, including those for Russia, the Czech Republic and South Africa. The skulls are old, with traces of dirt.

Verduraz says security cameras captured images of a woman in an ankle-length skirt leaving the skulls, which seem old, with traces of dirt. He thinks this may be part of some sort of ritual.

People, pooches team up to fight flab at Illinois gym

CHICAGO (AP) — Can't get rid of that paunch?

A Chicago-area gym suggests working out with your pooch.

K9 Fit Club offers bow wow boot camps and other classes for people and their puppies to exercise together in Chicago and nearby Hinsdale, Ill.

The fitness center opened last year after founder Tricia Montgomery exercised with her dog and lost 130 pounds. Montgomery says her late basset hound, named Louie, lost 22 percent of his body weight.

Fans of the gym say classes are beneficial to both man and man's best friend.

Montgomery says dogs struggle with the same weight issues that people face, including heart problems and diabetes.

People who work out at K9 Fit Club say exercising with their dogs keeps them motivated.

Classes cost about \$20.

Owner seeks to unload football team via Craigslist

CEDAR RAPIDS, Iowa (AP) — A co-owner of the Cedar Rapids (Iowa) Titans football team is selling his stake through Craigslist.

The Titans announced earlier this week that owner Mike Polaski is trying to sell his 20 percent stake in the two-year-old Indoor Football League team. Polaski writes on Craigslist that a downturn in his business as a restaurant owner is the reason and he's asking for \$80,000.

The team's general manager and co-owner, Chris Kokalis, says Polaski was influential in bringing the team to Cedar Rapids. He says Polaski's decision to sell has no impact on the Titans' daily operations.

The Titans (3-0) were in first place in IFL's United Conference and face the Wyoming Cavalry on Friday.

106-year-old Massachusetts man gets high school diploma

BEVERLY, Mass. (AP) — Fred Butler was married for 65 years, raised five children, served in the Army during World War II and worked for years for the local water department, but the fact he never earned a high school diploma always bothered him.

Not anymore.

The 106-year-old was awarded his honorary diploma Monday during an emotional ceremony attended by school officials, state lawmakers and Beverly Mayor Bill Scanlon.

"I thank everybody who is responsible for this," he said, wearing a mortar board hat and tassel and holding the prized document in his hands. "I certainly appreciate it."

Butler dropped out of school before the ninth-grade to accept a full-time job at a print shop to support his mother and five younger siblings.

Daughter-in-law Cathy Butler says he regretted dropping out and always emphasized the importance of education to his children and grandchildren.

A grandson, Mike Calabro, said Butler gave him \$5 for every A on his report card.

Cathy Butler launched the effort to get her father-in-law his diploma as a way to raise his spirits following the death of his wife, Ruth, last year.

Fred Butler's only concern was that he hadn't earned it.

Scanlon put that concern to rest. "It's a long time to wait for your diploma," Scanlon said, "but you've obviously earned it very well."


