Milton woman facing 25 counts of fraud

A Milton woman remains in jail, facing violation of probation charges along with numerous fraud, counterfeiting and illegal use of credit cards after police say she used the identity of a woman for whom she was caring, according to Milton Police reports.

Ora K. Jones was originally arrested in late March, charged with stealing a Discover card from the victim's purse while the woman was at West Florida

Jones faces a larceny charge; 10 counts of fraudulent or illegal use of a credit card; fraud/impersonation — attempting to use the ID of another person without consent; 10 counts fraudulent/illegal use of credit cards — used more than two times in six months to obtain goods valued at 100 dollars or more; five counts of counterfeiting — public record or certificate; and five counts of uttering a false instrument.

Hospital, arrest reports note. Jones was employed as a housekeeper and was asked by the husband of the victim if she could sit at the hospital with his wife

because of his own health conditions, according to sheriff's reports.

A short period of time after Jones sat with his wife, the

complainant said he received a statement from the Discover card company with charges he and his wife did not make, reports said.

Sheriff's officials said their

investigation revealed that Jones, 60, Milton, admitted taking the card, but said she had permission to buy food and personal items. Jones alleged she traded sexual favors to the victim's husband in exchange for the use of the card. The husband denied the allegations and became upset when investigators told him what Jones said, according to a sheriff's report.

Deputies said Milton Police became involved in the case because all of the charges were

Fleeing driver shoots self

A 62-year-old man shot himself with a rifle while avoiding capture Monday afternoon, according to Santa Rosa County Sheriff's officials.

Deputies spotted Morris Junior Green driving in Navarre around 4:15 p.m. and attempted to pull him over, according to reports. Morris was involved in a traffic incident the day before and was wanted for an active arrest warrant after eluding apprehension, deputies said.

Green drove to an area home and parked his vehicle in an attempt to hide from deputies, the release said.

When deputies found him and approached him to make contact, Green fired a rifle, shooting himself. No deputies were injured during the incident.

Green was taken to an area hospital. His condition is not known at this time, the release said.

This was the second shooting in Navarre on Monday.

In an unrelated incident, 911 dispatchers received a call of a gunshot wound in Navarre, according to radio transmissions. Upon arrival, emergency medical personnel said they discovered a man who had been shot in the face.

Lifeguard Ambulance transported him to a Pensacola hospital. His condition and the circumstances surrounding the shooting are unknown.

County fair magic hits Santa Rosa

The heavenly smell of funnel cakes, deep-fried-Snickers bars wafted across a field glowing with the tinge of bright neon light.

Patrons were launched into the sky with raucous bursts of nervous cheer as the rides tantalized their senses.

Horses snarled and bucked in the rodeo arena. And the rhythm of distorted guitars pushed seemingly through the air, amassing a

crowd of endearing fans.

The Santa Rosa County Fair is back in town. And it's here for another weekend.

Thousands crossed the gates to catch a glimpse of what the fair had to offer.

"We had around 7,500 to 8,500 in attendance this weekend," said Rick Paschall, Santa Rosa County Fair chairman of the board of directors. "It's right where we should be at this time of year and we look forward to this weekend."

The gates stayed open late with the addition of "Midnight

Madness" on Friday.

"The crowds were just wonderful," Paschall said. "We had a transition gate to Midnight Madness and the crowds were so understanding to the change."

Despite forecasts, the weather was very cooperative for the weekend.

"It was absolutely perfect," Paschall said. "The wind gave some of the motocross guys a bit of a problem, but they were still doing flips and packing out shows. Those motocross guys are straight out of the X-Games."

Traditionally, the fair featured a variety of country music acts, but the line up this year extended to other genres, including rock and hip hop with acts such as the Red Jumpsuit Apparatus, Feel Good and local favorite Scream Out Loud.

"This weekend went really well," said Anthony Daughtry, entertainment coordinator for the event. "We went from one specific brand of music to a wider range of music."

Father and hero isn't gone

This month a year ago, on April 15, 2012, my dad died. The last lucid conversation I had with him was on Easter. We spoke, but he didn't sound right, so I had him put my aunt on the phone and she told me his chemo was changed the week before. It had to do with his blood and fluid levels. He was on the third type of chemotherapy for liver cancer. This last one didn't agree with him at all. We lost him so fast I wasn't prepared. Even though we all knew about the cancer, dad never said the words "stage four" to any of us. He just kept plugging along, making plans for when he would go back to work, never complaining. I couldn't figure out why he didn't tell us the end was close because he told me he would and I believed him. I asked dad for a two-minute warning and he said he'd give me five. But he didn't do it. My brother came to visit me recently and we talked about Dad. My brother told me dad never said it to anyone. He was in denial.

Two weeks before he died, he and my brother changed the oil in his van. He was active and laughing. Then he's in the hospital for a week, hospice for a few hours and he took his last breath while I was driving down to Bradenton to see him for the last time. I did see him for the last time that day, but he was dead - in his bed at hospice. My sisters and one brother and some friends were in the room when I went in to see him. One of my sisters was standing at the head of his bed, the other was holding his hand and crying with her head on his chest. I walked into the room and to his side. I took one look at his pale, shrunken body and I laughed. My sisters looked surprised and I told them "He's not here. This isn't Dad." And I laughed again. They looked puzzled, but inside my heart and in my soul there was a connection to my father that is never-ending. And that connection told me Dad was still around, but he was no longer trapped by his given body. I felt such a joy and relief. My dad had moved on.

The past year has been filled with ups and downs. I went to therapy here in Milton, at Hospice. They have a counselor who is readily available, no wait, and who is trained in grief therapy. She helped me in two ways - by knowing what to say and knowing when to listen. She made a big difference in my daily life and in handling my grief. She told me I needed to find a new relationship with my father. The concept was exactly what I needed to hear because I could feel his presence so strongly, I just could not see his vessel, his body.

There was one particular morning about a month after he died that changed my entire life and what I knew about those who pass on. I had been crying for a while, with sobbing, painful tears...and suddenly I had a message come over me and it was strong. It said my dad was waiting to share his joy with me if I would just stop crying and holding on to the negative. I did it. I stopped crying and I felt my dad's presence as strongly as I did when he hugged me all during my life. That feeling of Dad never fades, though sometimes

I get busy and don't pay as close attention to it at various moments. Truth is, my dad's love and influence remains over me every second of every day and night. My mother told me a few months ago I had my dad's stubbornness and I laughed and loved to hear those words. I have so much of my father in me...when I was home after he died and we had his service, I listened to everyone talk about him and how he influenced their lives. It was the most precious gift to hear how my dad was considered "dad" by so many of my cousins, and second cousins, and relatives I barely knew. My dad touched many lives and he continues to touch mine.

I thought I would cry when I sat down to write this, but I haven't. I am joyful.

My dad has five children: Lynne Stewart (Hough); Howard Stewart Jr. (Tami); Bryan Stewart Sr.; Cheryl Stewart (Dan); and April Stewart (Brian). He has 11 grandchildren: Richard Jr., Kevin, Charla, Michael and Rayna; Angela; Bryan Jr., Sarah and Christie; Joey and Jamie; and 8 great-grandchildren: Wesley, Bradley, Macon, Haley and Brianna; Dessie; Krystalyn and Joel.

My dad is survived by numerous sisters and brothers as he was number seven of sixteen children. He joins his sweet mom in heaven, and many members of our family. He was born in Kokomo, Indiana. His name is Howard Lloyd Stewart, Sr.

He is my hero and I will love him always.

The advantage of the new e-filing system is that it will streamline the filing process as well as save on

postage and operating expenses. The Santa Rosa Clerk's Office currently accepts e-filings for criminal cases although they are not required to be compliant until Oct. 1, 2013.

Pastor Gallups, "Does the Old Testament speak of the resurrection of Jesus? I heard that there were prophecies of Jesus' resurrection but I don't know where they are. Can you help me with this?" Sam - Milton

Sam,

There are no Old Testament Scriptures that directly say "The Messiah will be resurrected after three days." So, in that sense the answer is "no." However, and this is important...There is much Biblical evidence that the references to the resurrection of the Messiah were there all along and that Jesus and the New Testament writers knew it. Consider the following facts:

Jesus refers to his resurrection as having been illustrated by Jonah in the belly of the whale for three days and three nights. Jesus said this would be an illustration of his own resurrection. (Matthew 12:40)

Psalms 16:10 declares of God - You will not let your Holy One (Messiah) see decay nor abandon him to the grave. The decay process set in after 3 days. That is why Jesus waited to the fourth day to raise Lazarus. Here is a prophecy of the Holy One coming to life before three full days is up.

I hope this helps you Sam. The resurrection of Jesus is the center point of the Gospel message and of our faith. The Old Testament prophesied it - the New Testament records it. You can stand on it!



New website aims to help guide military careers

Establishing a professional network and having control over a career path can be challenging for military members. A new networking website aims to change that.

RallyPoint.com is an online professional network similar to LinkedIn that is free to people in the military. Launched in November, the site already has more than 11,000 users and is growing every day, said Yinon Weiss, co-founder of the company.

Users set up a profile that maps their careers paths from the start to the present, including dates when their assignments end. They can connect with people they have worked with previously or contacts they have made during their career.

"In the military, people's careers tend to be centrally managed, but having personal relationships helps them discover new opportunities," Weiss said. "They can use their relationships and connections to be competitive if they find something they want to pursue."

Weiss said that within the military it is often not discussed how people navigate and move through the ranks to get to higher positions. The information users post about their careers can help with that.

There also is no central location to find out about assignments that might be available. Information users post about when their assignments are set to end can help others.

People in the military often move from base to base, and it can be difficult to keep up with where they are stationed at any

one time. Connections at a base where a service member might like to be located could help them land a position there, Weiss said.

Benjamin Marshall, a 24-year-old second lieutenant stationed at Eglin Air Force Base, was one of the first users to sign up for the site. He said he hopes it will help him expand his contacts and plan the next moves for his career.

"There are 300,000 people in the military, so it's difficult to keep a pulse; this is what worked for this guy and this is what worked for that guy," Marshall said. "This gives a quantifiable method to see that. When people fill it out, you can see what ranks they've been promoted, where they went, their whole bio."

Marshall said he doesn't have a lot of contact with people outside his unit. One drawback of his job in acquisitions

procurement is that he works mostly with officers and doesn't have contact with enlisted ranks. RallyPoint is changing that.

"I've been connecting with people left and right," he said.

Weiss and co-founder Aaron Kletzing are Iraq veterans who saw a need for a better way to navigate the military's job openings.

"The U.S. military is the best training ground in the world for building the skills, discipline and values required to solve complex and difficult challenges," Kletzing said in a statement. "But the internal job market is extremely difficult."

It's a problem that the military recognizes, Weiss said.

The most recent chiefs of staff of the Air Force and Army, retired Gen. Norton Schwartz and retired Gen. George Casey, both serve on the company's

board of directors and are helping shape the website, he said.

Weiss is happy with the progress they've made so far, and he's seen proof that users are engaging with it.

He said 90 percent of the users visited the site at least once in the past 5 days and more than 70 percent returned in the last 24 hours. Many users also are inviting friends to join.

Marshall is doing his part. He said he spreads the word to his co-workers and invites new contacts to join. He said there aren't too many profiles yet, but it's growing.

"What I've noticed is the people who have been on there awhile, they are starting to get to that point where they fill out all their information," he said. "It's not a small task, but that's what will make this work."



Black unemployment: Why so high?

A couple of weeks ago, Black Entertainment Television founder Bob Johnson, speaking at The National Press Club, said the nation "would never tolerate white unemployment at 14 and 15 percent." Black unemployment has been double that of white Americans for more than 50 years. The black youth unemployment rate is more than 40 percent nationally. In some cities, unemployment for black working-age males is more than 50 percent. Let's look at this, but first let's look at some history.

From 1900 to 1954, blacks were more active than whites in the labor market. Until about 1960, black male labor force participation in every age group was equal to or greater than that of whites. During that period, black teen unemployment was roughly equal to or less than white teen unemployment. As early as 1900, the duration of black unemployment was 15 percent shorter than that of whites; today it's about 30 percent longer.

The typical answer given for many black problems is racial discrimination. No one argues that every vestige of racial discrimination has been eliminated. But the relevant question is: How much of what we see can be explained by discrimination? I doubt anyone would argue the reason for lower unemployment, higher labor force participation and shorter duration of unemployment among blacks in the first half of the 20th century was that there was less racial discrimination. I also doubt anyone would argue that during earlier periods, blacks had higher education and greater skills attainment than whites.

I was a teenager during the late 1940s, living in North Philadelphia's Richard Allen housing project. Youngsters in my neighborhood who sought after-school, weekend or summer jobs found them.

I picked blueberries in New Jersey, caddied at Cobbs Creek Golf Club, shoveled snow for the Philadelphia Transportation Co., delivered packages for a milliner, performed janitorial work at Horn & Hardart restaurant and huckstered fruits and vegetables.

Such opportunities for early work experiences are all but gone for today's teens. A

major reason is the minimum wage law, which makes hiring low-skilled workers a losing economic proposition. In 1950, only 50 percent of jobs were covered by the minimum wage law. That meant the minimum wage didn't have today's unemployment effect. Today, almost 100 percent are covered. Today's child labor laws prevent youngsters from working in perfectly safe environments. The minimum wage has destroyed many jobs. That's why, for example, in contrast with the past, today's gasoline stations are self-service and theater ushers are nonexistent.

Then there's education. Black youths are becoming virtually useless for the increasingly high-tech world of the 21st century. According to a 2001 report by Abigail Thernstrom, "The Racial Gap in Academic Achievement," many black 12th-graders dealt with scientific problems at the level of whites in the sixth grade; they wrote about as well as whites in the eighth grade. The average black high-school senior had math skills on a par with a typical white student in the middle of seventh grade. The average 17-year-old black student could only read as well as the typical white child who had not yet reached age 13. That means an employer hiring the typical black high-school graduate is in effect hiring an eighth-grader.

Same-sex marriage: the way forward

made inside the city limits. Video of Jones using the card was obtained from numerous businesses in Milton. Officials say the businesses where Jones used the card are: Dollar General on Stewart St.; Shell Station on Stewart St.; Pic-n-Save on Stewart St.; Beall's Outlet on Highway 90, along with Fred's and the Food Outlet. The total charges come to \$370.95.

Jones faces a larceny charge; 10 counts of fraudulent or illegal use of a credit card; fraud/impersonation — attempting to use ID of another person without consent; 10 counts fraudulent/illegal use of credit cards — used more than two times in six months to obtain goods valued at 100 dollars or more; five counts of counterfeiting — public record or certificate; and five counts of uttering a false instrument.

Jones' original bond was \$160,000, but went to a no bond when her probation was violated two days after her arrest. She remains in the Santa Rosa County jail.

Officers Howard Jones and Steve Hoomes and Lieutenants Doug Berryman and Brian Lambert responded to the scene of a single vessel crash involving a 39-foot vessel. The crash occurred several hundred yards from Shoreline Park in Gulf Breeze.

The 61-year-old owner/operator was

killed in the crash. Four passengers, including the owner's 42-year-old son and 14-year-old granddaughter, were injured. The passengers were transported to Baptist Hospital in Pensacola. One passenger was transported to Alabama UAB Hospital on Sunday.

The accident is under investigation.

a vessel was moored at the marina without permission. Officer Cushing conducted computer checks on the vessel registration and contacted the owner. The owner reported that his vessel had been stolen the week earlier. At approximately 2 a.m., Officers Kenneth Manning, Randall Brooks,

John Clark, Faris Livesay, and Lt. Dan Hahr worked with NOAA Officer Grant Demesillo to conduct an Individual Fish Quota (IFQ) inspection on the fishing vessel Mary Joyce. After the vessel docked, the captain and deckhand offloaded four large coolers containing approximately 600 pounds of red snapper. The offload of fish is prohibited between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. A truck met the vessel crew at the dock and loaded the coolers into the bed. As the truck

attempted to leave, the officers conducted a stop and inspection of the vehicle and vessel. The captain stated he was going to sell the fish to several individuals to make extra money on the side. The four coolers containing 587 pounds of red snapper and one undersized cobia were seized. Federal charges against the captain are pending.

Officer Heath Nichols made contact with a

subject consuming alcoholic beverages at Henderson Beach State Park. As Officer Nichols approached, the subject tried to conceal the alcoholic beverage. A computer check revealed an active outstanding warrant for violation of probation stemming from a domestic violence charge. The subject was cited for possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages within the state park. He was transported and booked into the Okaloosa County Jail on the warrant.

National infant immunization week is April 20-27

National Infant Immunization Week is an annual observance to highlight the importance of protecting infants from vaccine-preventable diseases and to celebrate the achievements of immunization programs in promoting healthy communities throughout the United States.

During the last week in April, hundreds of communities across the United States will join those in countries around the world to celebrate the critical role vaccination plays in protecting our children, communities, and public health. NIIW will be celebrated this year simultaneously with World Immunization Week, an initiative of the World Health Organization.

Immunization is a shared responsibility. Families, healthcare professionals, and public health officials must work together to help protect the entire community.

Young children rely on the champions in their lives to keep them safe and healthy. Those champions may be parents who keep a record of their child's vaccinations and ask at each doctor appointment whether their child is up-to-date on immunizations. And, those champions may also be doctors, nurses, physician assistants, and other healthcare professionals who share scientifically accurate, up-to-date information about

vaccines with parents.

Because of the success of vaccines in preventing disease, parents may not have heard of some of today's vaccines or the serious diseases they prevent. These diseases can be especially serious for infants and young children. That is why it is important to promote the recommended immunization schedule to protect infants and children by providing immunity early in life, before they are exposed to potentially life-threatening diseases. One example of the seriousness of vaccine-preventable diseases is the increase in whooping cough (pertussis) cases or outbreaks that have been reported in a majority of states during 2012. Preliminary data from CDC reports more than 41,000 cases of whooping cough (pertussis) in the US, including 18 deaths, the highest number of pertussis cases in any one year in the US since 1955. Most of these deaths were in children younger than 1 year old. Provisional data indicates Florida had 577 confirmed and probable cases of pertussis in 2012. Santa Rosa County reported two confirmed cases of pertussis in 2012.

Immunizations are available at the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County at no charge for uninsured children through the age of 18. For more information on infant immunizations, visit www.cdc.gov/vaccines/parents/index.html.

10 THINGS TO KNOW IN 2013



TIGER WOODS

1 THE GUY IN A RED SHIRT WANTS ANOTHER GREEN JACKET

Tiger Woods won the Masters four times in his first nine years on the PGA Tour. Since then, he has been shut out. Woods has gone seven years since he last won at Augusta National, his longest drought in any of the majors. Arnold Palmer and Jack Nicklaus first played a practice round with Woods when he was an amateur, and they predicted he would win more green jackets than their 10 combined. And at age 37, Woods is not even halfway there.

2 HALFWAY HOME

Rory McIlroy is only 23 and already is halfway home to the career Grand Slam. He already has won the U.S. Open and the PGA Championship. A green jacket would give him the third leg of the Grand Slam. McIlroy had a four-shot lead going into the final round at Augusta in 2011 and shot 80. He was one shot out of the lead going into the weekend last year and went 77-76. If he wins this year, Boy Wonder would join Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson, Tom Watson, Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer as the only players to win majors in three successive years dating to 1960. Pretty strong company.

3 TWO WOMEN IN A GREEN JACKET

The biggest change at the Masters is the membership. For the first time in the 80-year history of Augusta National, the club invited two females to join. That means former Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice and South Carolina financier Darla Moore have something dozens of players at the Masters want — a green jacket.



4 A BOY AMONG MEN


Now this will make Tiger Woods feel old: One of the players at the Masters wasn't even born when Woods won his first green jacket in 1997. Guan Tianlang, a 14-year-old from China, won the Asia-Pacific Amateur in November to earn a spot in the field. Guan is the youngest player in major championship history.

5 STARS & STRIPES

After three years of another "golden era" in European golf, looks who's winning all the tournaments. Four Europeans had been at No. 1 in the world for 125 consecutive weeks until Tiger Woods returned to the top. Along the way, Americans began the year by winning the first 14 events on the PGA Tour schedule, the longest such streak since Americans opened the 1984 season with 14 straight wins. There's little chance of a record streak, though. Americans won all 44 tournaments on the PGA Tour schedule in 1982.

6 ANCHORS AWAY

The Masters is the only major no one has won using a belly putter or a broom-handle putter pressed against the chest. Golf's ruling bodies have proposed a rule that would outlaw the anchored stroke used with long putters. A final decision is expected in the spring. One reason for the proposed ban is that three of the last five major champions used a belly putter — Keegan Bradley at the 2011 PGA Championship, Webb Simpson at the 2012 U.S. Open and Ernie Els at the 2012 British Open.



BUBBA WATSON

7 LEFTIES GET IT RIGHT

This is the 10-year anniversary of Mike Weir showing the way for southpaws. Throw in the three Masters won by golf's most famous "Lefty" — Phil Mickelson — and Bubba Watson's victory last year, and left-handed players have won five of the last 10 green jackets. Could Ted Potter Jr. be next?

8 RETURN OF THE BIG EASY

Ernie Els felt his heart get ripped out in 2004 when he was on the putting green hopeful of a playoff until he heard the ground-shaking roar of Phil Mickelson making a birdie on the 18th to win. Worse yet was the Big Easy failing to qualify last year, missing the Masters for the first time in 18 years. He returns as the British Open champion, giving the South African at least five more tries at the major he wants so desperately to win.

9 THE THREE AMIGOS

Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus and Gary Player were the original "Big Three," and they combined to win every Masters from 1960 through 1966. They get together once a year at Augusta National, where they officially

10 WITHER THE AZALEAS?

So much for that myth that Augusta National puts ice on the azaleas bushes to make sure they bloom during tournament week. Because of an early spring in the South last year, the azaleas, camellias and dogwoods bloomed before the opening tee shot. The few flowers remaining were wilting fast. The Masters had gone green. The course was beautiful. But it was green.

Yards 445
(Tea Olive)

This slight dogleg right plays uphill and has a deep bunker, requiring a 317-yard carry off the tee. The bunker has a tongue on the left side, so anything that enters the front of the bunker might be blocked by the lip.



2 Par 5
Yards 575
(Pink Dogwood)

A dogleg left that can be reached in two by the big hitters. A fairway bunker on the right comes into play. A big drive kept down the left side shortens the hole, but leaves a downhill lie to a green guarded by two deep bunkers in the front.



3 Par 4
Yards 350
(Flowering Peach)

One of the best short par 4s in golf. Big hitters can drive the green, but not many even try because of all the trouble surrounding the L-shaped green that slopes sharply from right to left. Most players hit iron off tee to stay short of four bunkers on the left side.



4 Par 3
Yards 240
(Flowering Crab Apple)

This has become a long iron for big hitters, fairway metal for others. A deep bunker protects the right side of the green, with another bunker to the left. Club selection remains crucial because of the deceptive wind. The green slopes to the front. This hole features the only palm tree on the course.



5 Par 4
Yards 455
(Magnolia)

An uphill, slight dogleg to the left with two very deep bunkers guarding the left side some 300 yards from the tee. The green slopes severely from back to front, and a small bunker catches anything long. If an approach is long and misses the bunker, it could roll down the slope and into the trees.



6 Par 3
Yards 180
(Juniper)

An elevated tee to a large green with three tiers, with significant slopes marking the three levels. Getting close to the hole is a challenge. The easiest pin might be front left. The hole has not been changed since 1975.



7 Par 4
Yards 450
(Pampas)

This hole literally has come a long way, from 320 yards to 450 yards. The tee shot is through a chute of Georgia pines. The green is surrounded by five bunkers, the most around any green.



8 Par 5
Yards 570
(Yellow Jasmine)

An accurate drive is important to avoid the fairway bunker on the right side. The hole is uphill and features trouble left of the green. No bunkers around the green, just severe mounding.



9 Par 4
Yards 460
(Carolina Cherry)

The tee shot should be aimed down the right side for a good angle into the green, which features two large bunkers to the left. Any approach that is short could spin some 25 yards back into the fairway.



10 Par 4
Yards 495
(Camellia)

A long hole that can play shorter if the drive catches the slope in the fairway. It is difficult to save par from the bunker right of the green. The putting surface slopes from right to left. It has played as the most difficult hole in Masters history.

Back on top and ready for the Masters

Coming off his third win in five PGA Tour events this season, will this be the year Tiger Woods moves ahead of Arnold Palmer in green jackets? Back to No.1 in the world ranking for the first time since the final week of October 2010 – the longest spell of his career – he heads to the Masters looking to end a five-year major drought. Four of Woods' 14 major titles have come at Augusta National, where he last won in 2005.


12 Par 3
Yards 155
(Golden Bell)

Among the most famous par 3s in golf, and the shortest hole at Augusta National. Club selection can range from a 6-iron to a 9-iron, but it's difficult to gauge the wind. Rae's Creek is in front of the shallow green, with two bunkers behind it and one in front.



13 Par 5
Yards 510
(Azalea)

An accurate tee shot to the center of the fairway sets up players to go for the green. A tributary to Rae's Creek winds in front of the green, and four bunkers are behind the putting surface. From tee to green, there are about 1,600 azaleas.



14 Par 4
Yards 440
(Chinese Fir)

Only hole on the course without a bunker. Even if the drive avoids trees on both sides of the fairway, the green has severe contours that feed the ball to the right.




15 Par 5
Yards 530
(Firethorn)

A cluster of pines is starting to mature on the right side of the fairway, making it critical to be straight off the tee. The green can be reached in two with a good drive, but a pond guards the front and there is a bunker to the right. Even for those laying up, the third shot requires a precise wedge.




16 Par 3
Yards 170
(Redbud)

The hole is played entirely over water and eventually bends to the left. Two bunkers guard the right side, and the green slopes significantly from right to left.





The Eisenhower Tree to the left of the fairway is prominent at 210 yards from the tee, requiring another accurate tee shot. The green is protected by two bunkers in the front.
