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'It's a way to honor veterans'

Clay Shoot supports three Northwest Florida nonprofits

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PACE — The fifth annual Gulf Power Clay Shoot for America's Heroes received a record number of teams, 41, for its contest supporting veteran nonprofit organizations.

Organizers hope the fundraiser accrued more than the previous year's profits of \$90,000, which Gulf Power splits evenly between the three chosen nonprofits.

For 2017, the beneficiaries Gulf Power selected were Pathways for Change from Pensacola, Third Chance from Fort Walton Beach, and Friends of Clifford Chester Sims State Veterans Nursing Home from Panama City.

"It's a way to honor veterans," Gulf Power chairman, president and CEO Stan Connally said. "There has been a terrific response from the community in previous years and once again we have selected three great organizations that provide priceless support to our military veterans. Our employees are proud to bring awareness and funds to these local groups as we prepare to honor those who served on Veterans Day."

Pathways for Change plans on using the money it receives from the event to fund operations of its Clinton Cox Residence, which opened Nov. 1, according to Residence Director Michelle Desrochers.

"(Pathways') mission is to eradicate poverty," Desrochers said. "We wanted to meet the needs of the female veteran population. We did so well with our prison diversion program that we had a house for recovery but it was not needed."

The Clinton Cox Residence will offer various therapeutic services such as individual and group therapy, art therapy, mentorship and 12-step meetings. Fee-based

education services include GED preparation classes, certified nursing assistant classes and information technology classes.

Pathways founder and CEO Connie Bookman said Gulf Power's selecting Pathways was incredible and proceeds will cover a third of

the Cox Residence's operating costs for a year.

"That's huge for us," Bookman said. "We'll be able to breathe easy walking into a new ministry."

Bookman expects the residence

Milton poet laureate implements projects to promote creativity

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MILTON — Four months after the city named him the official poet laureate, Marc Livanos has implemented multiple projects for residents who enjoy poetry.

On Tuesday, Livanos hosted a Halloween party with the group of teens and adults who meet once a week at the Guy Thompson Community Center for a poetry workshop. Here, he reflected on the impact having a poet laureate has made on the community. At his weekly workshops, Livanos provides the group with a prompt.

Club members brainstorm, work together and come up with a poem. The best poem each week is published on MiltonLocal.com. "They're so creative, sometimes they come up with their own prompts," Livanos said. According to Livanos, the workshop regularly attracts more than a dozen people.

He supplies various educational books for the

members of the group to use as reference material, and food is always offered since the teens arrive directly after school. Aside from the weekly workshop, Livanos has made other strides in the local poetry community.

He and an adult member of the Milton poetry club recently went on-air 1330AM WEBY Northwest Florida's Talk Radio to read poetry and talk about the group's progress. Livanos works with students from Milton High School, and hopes to create a section in the Blackwater Literary Journal for the poetry of the high school students, as well as a poetry section for all residents of Santa Rosa County.

Regular Milton Council attendee encourages community involvement

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MILTON — Since the early '90s, Al Brewton has been involved with Milton community development. He frequently attends Milton Council meetings but wants to see more people involved.

His interest was personal at first, pushing for paving Jasmine Street and his mother, Raymoner W. Brewton, encouraging him to seek improvements on Clara Street.

After joining Men With Vision in 1995,

his community interest expanded. Working with the nonprofit, Brewton was a part of changing the name of Clara Street to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Drive in 2002.

Brewton advocates for being involved in local politics to see change.

"It's the only way to get something done," Brewton said. "If you're not at the table, you'll get the crumbs. That's why I go to meetings."

Being involved with local government started as a personal necessity to improve the streets where he grew up, according to

Brewton. Now he works to see development in his community.

"I'm not a city resident, but my heart is in the city, my property, my family," Brewton said. "The neighborhood I grew up in, I don't want to see it neglected any kind of way. To my last dying breath, I'll speak truth to power in that aspect."

Brewton retired from Sterling Chemical in 2002 and now owns Dimensions Barber and Beauty on Mary Street.


Do you play any other sports?

to have its 12 beds full by Christmas.

Third Chance expects to break ground on its housing project, The Lazarus Project, in about a week and possibly be open in nine months, according to Third Chance President Cecil Williams.

Williams is also the reverend of Gregg Chapel African Methodist Church, working in conjunction with Third Chance, Inc., to build an apartment complex of six one-bedroom units for homeless veterans in Fort Walton Beach.

Third Chance will work with various service organizations to provide case management, career assistance and legal aid. Those include 90Works, Suit Up to Move Up, Veterans Court, according to Williams.

As most assumed, lobbyist and fired Trump campaign chairman Paul Manafort was indicted by Mueller's Special Counsel investigation.



RECENT NEWS ABOUT MAC AND CHEESE WORRIES PARENT

Dear Doctor: Could boxed macaroni and cheese really be as bad for you as news reports suggest? Sometimes, that's all my kids will eat.
Dear Reader: The recent news about the presence of chemicals called phthalates in boxed macaroni and cheese sent a shockwave through many American kitchens. Affordable, easy to prepare and beloved by the younger (and let's face it, more than a few of the older) members of the family, pre-packaged mac and cheese has become a mealtime staple.

However, a study funded by an advocacy group called the Coalition for Safer Food Processing and Packaging raised an alarm earlier this year. Testing for phthalates -- a family of chemicals used, among other things, to make plastics flexible -- the group reported measurable amounts in 29 of the 30 cheese products. These include boxed macaroni and cheese, as well as soft, hard and natural cheeses.

Concentrations ranged from 0.6 parts per billion to 295 parts per billion, with the lowest in natural cheeses. The highest were found in cheese packets in boxed mac and cheese. In all cases the phthalates migrated into the food via the packaging.

The chemicals, many of which were banned from use in infants' and children's products in 2008, are known as endocrine disrupters. That is, they interfere with the working of the body's hormonal system. Exposure in high amounts can affect fertility in adults, and is associated with disruptive behavior in children.

All of this sounds quite alarming. But before you banish all cheese products from your home, let's take a closer look. The concentration at which phthalates begins to cause problems is not known. Yet the study labels the 0.6 parts per billion to 295 parts per billion of phthalates that were found in the tested products as a "high amount." Additionally, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have found that, although we encounter phthalates in a variety of products, combined exposure remains extremely low.

To be honest, we think if you're going to be worried about the health effects of boxed mac and cheese, all you really need to do is read the sodium level on the nutrition label. And while mac and cheese out of a box is easy, sooner or later, for your children's long-term health, you'll have to bring fruit, veggies and other building blocks of a healthful diet into the mix.

Maybe start by making the boxed mac and cheese a special treat on a certain day of the week. Or find a recipe the family likes and make mac and cheese from scratch. It may not be as fast, but it's far more healthful. And, yes, we know these changes aren't easy. As parents ourselves, we face the same challenges of pleasing a picky eater's palate.

A final word: If the mac and cheese study has you worried about phthalates in general, take steps to cut them out of your food chain. Never use plastic in the microwave, as the heat can cause the chemical to move into your food. The same goes for the dishwasher -- wash any plastic ware by hand. For the greatest peace of mind, skip the plastic ware altogether and switch your food storage to glass or stainless steel.

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

Smell-O-Meter

Fragrances are often categorized by the amount of scent material they contain. True perfumes contain between 15 to 40 percent scent material. "Eau de toilettes" contain an average of about 10 percent. "Eau de colognes" contain an average of about 5 percent. Eau de colognes usually last around two hours, while eau de toilettes may last as long as four hours. True perfumes may last as long as 6 hours.

Many perfumes are made using materials gathered from plant parts such as flowers, bark, roots, leaves and resins. Other scents are created from animals such as musk deer, sperm whales, beavers, civets and honeybees. Synthetic fragrances are designed by chemists who create scents not found in nature.

Old Spice

Archaeologists believe many ancient cultures created scented perfumes using herbs, spices and flowers.

The ancient Egyptians began using perfume as part of their religious ceremonies more than 4,000 years ago.

The trail of scent left by a person wearing perfume is called "sillage."

How do you buy perfume? You pay through the nose.

One of the world's first chemists was a woman named Tapputi, who was listed as a perfume-maker in a 3,000-year-old Mesopotamian tablet.

During the 1600s and 1700s, perfumes were used mainly by the wealthy to hide body odors that resulted from poor bathing habits.

Coco Chanel launched her own brand of perfume in 1921. She named her now-famous perfume Chanel No.5 because it was the fifth fragrance in a line of 10 samples presented to her by perfumer Ernest Beaux.

The word perfume comes from the Latin words meaning "through smoke."


