## Florida's largest power company is getting a lot bigger

**Gulf Power purchased as part of \$6.475B deal**

TALLAHASSEE — In a major move in the state's utility industry, the parent company of Florida Power & Light said Monday it will buy Northwest Florida's Gulf

Power as part of a \$6.475 billion deal.

NextEra Energy Inc. plans to buy Gulf Power, the Florida City Gas natural-gas company and ownership interests in two power plants from The Southern Company. The purchase of Gulf Power and the stakes in the power plants, which are subject to federal approval, are expected to close during the first half of

2019, while the Florida City Gas purchase is slated for the third quarter of 2018, according to a NextEra Energy announcement.

The deal would expand NextEra Energy's already-massive footprint in the state. Its Florida Power & Light subsidiary is by far the largest electric utility in Florida, serving nearly 5 million customers.

Gulf Power, with about 450,000 customers in eight counties, is the largest utility in the Panhandle.

Florida City Gas has about 110,000 residential and commercial natural-gas customers in Miami-Dade, Brevard, St. Lucie and Indian River counties.

NextEra said it will buy a 100 percent ownership interest in a power plant

near Cocoa known as Plant Oleander, which has contracts to sell electricity to the Florida Municipal Power Agency and Seminole Electric Cooperative. It also will buy a 65 percent stake in a generating unit, known as Stanton A, at the Stanton Energy Center complex near Orlando.

## Butterfly house advocates swarm committee meeting

**Commissioner's suggestion to move house stirs debate**

MILTON — Panhandle Butterfly House volunteers came to Monday's Santa Rosa County Commissioner Committee to show support for a new facility in Navarre Park — and discourage moving the house to a different location.

In September 2017, Santa Rosa County Commissioners unanimously approved to take out a \$1.8 million loan to fund the first phase of Navarre Park improvements

and use future tourist tax revenues to repay the loan.

During last week's Tourist Development Council budget workshop, District 1 Commissioner Sam Parker said he was in favor of revisiting the funding for Navarre Park improvements, such as the proposed vivarium and educational center for the butterfly house, and asked to have the matter added to Monday's committee agenda. That news spread to social media, prompting butterfly house supporters and residents to show up at the meeting.

At Monday's meeting, Parker stressed that he "fully supports" the proposed improvements for Navarre

Park, but said he wanted to make sure he was "fiscally prudent" with tax dollars. To save money and consolidate natural attractions, he suggested the Panhandle Butterfly House could even move to the site of the new Emerald Coast Wildlife Refuge (ECWR) off Highway 87.

"I don't think it's too late for the TDC to revisit this," he said.

Mary Salinas, who works with IFAS extension in Santa Rosa County and the Panhandle Butterfly House, told commissioners that the butterfly house has been at the Navarre Park for 21 years.

# Prescription drug monitoring programs not shown to affect drug overdoses

GAINESVILLE — Amid a raging opioid epidemic, every state has now established a drug-monitoring database to encourage safer prescribing and to reduce abuse. Yet, there is scant evidence that such programs are having a positive effect on the number of drug overdoses, a new study by a group that includes a University of Florida Health researcher has found.

Prescription drug-monitoring programs aim to prevent overlapping or multiple prescriptions for frequently abused medications such as opioids, a practice known as “doctor shopping.”

“The big question is whether these databases are effectively reducing fatal and nonfatal overdoses. It’s a natural next step in an environment where so many competing and complementary policies are changing and being implemented to combat

the opioid epidemic,” said Chris Delcher, Ph.D., a health outcomes researcher in the UF College of Medicine, part of UF Health.

The answer: It’s hard to say whether these databases are impacting the number of overdoses.

Delcher and his collaborators parsed more than 2,600 academic publications and found just 10 of those articles linked prescription drug-monitoring programs to fatal opioid overdoses. An analysis of the 10 studies found extremely limited evidence of a reduction in fatal overdoses but not enough to draw firm conclusions, Delcher said. The findings are published in the *Annals of Internal Medicine*.

Now that prescription drug databases are ubiquitous and cover millions of patients, Delcher said it’s important to understand their impact and how they can be improved.

“Because they are promoted as a tool that will help reduce opioid overdoses, we needed to know

if that is actually true,” he said.

They also found some unintended consequences: Three studies reviewed by the researchers showed overdose deaths from heroin (an illegal opioid chemically similar to many pain medications) increased after prescription some drug-monitoring programs were implemented. Separately, a 2013 study of drug users in Philadelphia and San Francisco by other researchers found a shift from prescription opioids to heroin use was driven by

heroin’s easier availability and lower cost. In Florida, deaths from oxycodone (a legal prescription opioid) tumbled after the state’s prescription drug-monitoring program began in late 2011, but there was a concurrent rise in fatal overdoses from fentanyl, heroin and morphine, Delcher found in 2016.

“When you crack down on prescription opioids, it means that people sometimes turn to other sources,” Delcher said.

Opioid prescribing spiked 350 percent nationwide between 1999 and 2015, as did the rate of overdose deaths from heroin and prescription opioids.

The research also revealed which specific features of prescription drug-monitoring programs were most likely to have an impact on fatal overdoses. They included requiring doctors to review a patient’s medication history before writing another prescription, more frequent updates of patients’ prescription data, and

allowing more providers to access patient data.

Changes taking effect July 1 may improve the effectiveness of Florida’s program, Delcher said. Physicians will often be required to review patients’ history of controlled substances. Currently, use of the database use is voluntary. The new law also imposes a three-day limit on most opioid prescriptions for acute pain, although a seven-day supply can be issued if it is deemed medically necessary.

Studying the effectiveness of prescription drug-monitoring programs is one way of making them more useful and effective, Delcher said. For example, as a biomedical informatics tool, they could be made more sophisticated and intuitive to help busy physicians easily and quickly distinguish a patient’s risk of misuse, abuse or overdose. Delcher is currently working on improving patient-risk algorithms, overlapping medication

dashboards and other data-driven methods to enhance the database beyond a list of medications that a patient is using.

Researchers at Columbia University and the University of California, Davis led the study, which was funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse and the Bureau of Justice Assistance.

The latest research comes as Delcher and UF Health Forensic Medicine Director Bruce Goldberger, Ph.D., continue their work on a system that tracks drug use data and deaths throughout Florida. The Florida Drug-Related Outcomes Surveillance and Tracking System is funded by a three-year, \$600,000 federal grant meant to help fight prescription drug abuse. Data from that system was used in a recent analysis by a University of South Florida researcher, who found an association between opioid prescription rates and neglected children being put in foster care.

**Ask the Preacher**

Dear Pastor Gallups, “Does the passage about the rich young ruler teach that Jesus expects His followers to give up all of their possessions to follow Him?” – J. S., Milton

Dear J.S.,

It’s true that Jesus told the rich young ruler to give up his wealth and follow Him. This was not a blanket condemnation of wealth or a statement that somehow the young man could “earn” his salvation.

Consider the other times that Jesus **didn’t** rebuke friends who owned property or command them to sell their homes and businesses. In fact, He often ate with people and stayed at their homes. Friends like Mary and Martha or Lazarus were certainly not poor.

So why, then, did Jesus demand such a strict requirement for this particular young man? The answer is simple and very relevant to our lives. Jesus knew the young man’s heart. He knew that he was looking for a way to earn his salvation on his own terms.

He may have thought that Jesus would give him a specific task or good deed to perform that would win eternal life, one that wouldn’t require him to humble himself and unconditionally set his life under the authority of Christ. Instead, Jesus set up a requirement that clearly illustrated the basic issue: the rich young man’s desire to retain control of his life. His riches were more important than securing a personal, saving relationship with and through Jesus Christ.

Jesus wasn’t implying that salvation could actually be earned by good deeds. Even if the rich young ruler would have given away his riches and followed Jesus, he wouldn’t have “earned” his salvation. However, if he had done so, he would have surrendered his desire to be “Lord” of his own life and acknowledged God’s authority over his life.

Jesus felt compassion for this young man. But because He knew that the ruler was seeking to manipulate God, He had no choice but to send him away with a clear awareness of his spiritual failure.

# We are, because of who they were

Last week, I had the privilege of attending a military funeral at the Ohio Western Reserve National Cemetery in Rittman, Ohio.

Little is more humbling than passing row upon row of identical headstones bearing the names of Americans from all different walks of life who shared the common bond of service to this country.

The names engraved, from every nationality and ethnicity, remind us of the miracle that we are.

In the deep silence, the bickering and verbal jousting with which we seem to fill our times nowadays falls away.

The political issues and crises that occupy our attention and consume our time and energy fade into nothingness in the presence of those who helped to make this country possible.

The sight of so many markers, which are planted with geometric precision, is almost dizzying, but it forces you to refocus on this truth: America is still worth fighting for. Throwing stones

Places of honor such as Ohio Western Reserve National Cemetery remind us that patriotism is not found among the clamorous and phony who always are demanding that obeisance be paid. It's not among the self-appointed arbiters who think they alone can determine who loves America and how it should be done.

It is found in our service to our country and to one another. You can see its faithfulness in the elderly veterans who attend every ceremony for every soldier interred at Rittman. You can feel its confidence in the impossibly young Marines who present an American flag to every family.

True patriotism is not the product of cheesy slogans or bumper stickers that require no sacrifice; nor is it even the exclusive domain of military service, as some would have us believe. It's found among everyday Americans, too. In the farmer and the factory mom; in teachers, firefighters and hard-hat dads who know that to be American is to be unique and incredibly lucky.

Too many of us have become forgetful, seeing no value in our history and in the services rendered by others. Ungrateful, we sully the undeserved blessing of being American by throwing stones rather than casting bread.

## Choices to make

We must decide whether we will reclaim the mantle of moral leadership or retreat behind the forbidding walls of a house divided, where the people in it subsist on a steady diet of demagoguery, self-pity and cynicism.

We must make a choice between circling the wagons and withdrawing from the world, or fulfilling our promise as the world's best hope for human rights and freedom.

Rittman's national cemetery is a silent but unmistakable sign, a reminder that the idea of America is one still worth preserving; that the genius of America always has been in our immeasurable faith in our ability to do better.

# Has the Supreme Court thwarted the dark side of sports betting?

Former U.S. Senator Bill Bradley sponsored the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act (PASPA) when it was passed into law in 1992. Bradley knew a little something about sports. He was a basketball star at Princeton University, an Olympic gold medalist and won two NBA championships with the New York Knicks.

This week the U.S. Supreme Court struck down PASPA opening the door, nationwide, to betting on sporting events. PASPA worked like this — it didn't regulate gambling because that would have opened sports betting to places other than Las Vegas. The law didn't outlaw gambling that would have closed down Las Vegas. What Congress did was say that state legislatures that hadn't already legalized gambling could not enact sports betting legislation in the future.

The Supreme Court ruled that barring state legislatures from legalizing sports betting amounted to an unconstitutional commandeering of the state legislatures. Justice Samuel Alito wrote, "The legalization of sports gambling requires an important policy choice, but the choice is not ours to make."

In an interview with NorthJersey.com Bradley said, "I regret the ruling. I think the court ignored the impact that

the ruling will have on sports in America, and values you learn from sports. I mean, they've turned every basketball player, football player and baseball player into a roulette chip."

With the exception of Las Vegas sports betting has always been conducted in the shadows — and professional athletes have at times crossed to the dark side. From Shoeless Joe Jackson and Pete Rose in baseball, to Heisman Trophy winner Paul Horning and All-Pro Alex Karras in football, professional athletes and college athletes have paid the price for gambling.

Experts suggest that illegal betting in the United States is a \$150 billion business. To put that figure in perspective, in 2017 Major League Baseball saw gross revenues surpass the \$10 billion mark for the first time.

According to research by UNLV's Center for Gaming Research, legal sports betting in Nevada totaled nearly \$5 billion last year, led by football — both college and professional — which accounted for \$1.76 billion.

Will legal gambling lead to corruption? Professional sports are highly regulated and closely scrutinized. Technology is so sophisticated that betting action is monitored in real time to identify potential spikes in irregular betting patterns.

Professional athletes who are making millions of dollars are not likely to jeopardize that wealth for a chunk of money on the side. However, college athletes are more vulnerable. The college athlete will not share in the revenue of increased viewership or possible "integrity fees," that may

be paid to the NCAA by each state authorizing sports betting.

"College sports is the one realm where corrupters can influence athletes, because they're not paid market rate," Ryan Rodenberg, a sports law professor at Florida State University, told The Washington Post.

There was the Tulane University and Boston College basketball point shaving scandals of the 1970s and 1980s and University of Toledo football player Quinton Broussard who pleaded guilty to fumbling on purpose in a 2005 bowl game in exchange for \$500.

Ironically, the entities who stand to benefit the most from legalized sports betting are the very entities that sued New Jersey to prevent sports wagering which resulted in the Supreme Court decision — the NFL, MLB, NBA and the NHL.

The American Gaming Association conducted research for the NFL in 2016 and found that adults who bet on NFL games watched 19 more games during the 2015 season than adults who did not bet.

With potentially millions of more fans betting on games it is estimated that the number of NFL regular season viewers would jump from 40 million to 57 million. Advertising costs will soar and the NFL will cash in.

Just last year the organization hosted more than 15,000 visitors.

"People know we're here," she said. "And it when it came up for Navarre Park to have an improvement plan and include us to build a bigger, more beautiful facility, we were on board with that."

Salinas did mention that the butterfly house has plans to hire a full-time director to deliver year-round programming.

"We are looking at upping our game," she said.

District 4 Commissioner Rob Williamson said he was surprised by the agenda item and that the Navarre Park plans were already moving forward.

debt, according to the announcement. The \$6.475 billion total includes NextEra Energy assuming \$1.4 billion of Gulf Power debt.

Subsidiaries of The Southern Company, which is based in Atlanta, operate in numerous states. In addition to Gulf Power, the subsidiaries include Alabama Power, Georgia Power and Mississippi Power. The Florida Public Service Commission last year approved a settlement agreement that set base rates for Gulf Power. In the announcement, NextEra Energy said that with the addition of Gulf Power, Florida City Gas and the power plants, the Juno Beach-based company "will be even better positioned to generate

long-term shareholder value through a more robust financial profile, greater scale and an expanded platform for growth."

But the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy, which frequently intervenes in utility cases in Florida, expressed concern Monday about the purchase.

"While Southern Alliance for Clean Energy is still reviewing this deal, it raises concerns that any one monopoly utility would control such a significant percentage of Florida's energy market," the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy said in a prepared statement. "Such consolidation of control may limit competition at a time when we need more and not less."

# Arc Gateway of Pensacola opens center in South Santa Rosa County

NAVARRE — Patrice Lavergne holds up a worksheet about cleaning to a handful of attentive eyes.

“What’s one of the first things you do when you wake up?” she asks the room.

Answers range from “brush teeth,” to “put clothes on,” and “have breakfast.” She gives positive praise to each one. One gentleman even got up to get a high-five. The answer she was looking for is “make the bed,” but those are all good things to do, she said.

It’s a rather unassuming afternoon at the Arc Gateway of South Santa Rosa but for the clients that go there, it makes a world of difference.

In April, the Arc Gateway of Pensacola opened its South Santa Rosa location in a strip mall across from the Gulf Breeze Zoo. The organization provides programs for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Arc Gateway of the Emerald Coast has a center in Milton, but this is a first the south end of Santa Rosa County.

“It all started with a group of women at a local church who had a respite program one day a week,” said Marilyn Ward, associate program manager. “With information from APD (Agency for Persons with Disabilities) we realized that there are about 120 people in this area that weren’t being served.”

Since opening their doors the South Santa Rosa center has gained 17 regular clients. And the community has been embracing the organization through volunteering and donations.

“It’s very heartfelt,” Ward said. “Everybody has been so welcoming.”

Ward said the program is important for individuals with special needs to have much-needed socializing time.

“We have one client who has been at home since he was out of school for the past 10 years,” Ward said. “A program like this is life changing. It’s healthy for them. Some people can feel left out of society. We try to let them have opinions and make decisions. We hope it improves their home life.”

And as much as the program benefits clients, it also provides some respite for caretakers who had no other resources before the Arc Gateway opened.

“One mother told me she didn’t know what to do with her time,” Ward said with a laugh. “Parents love it because they know their loved ones are being taken care of. We’re opening up their life experiences.”

Each day clients work on a different learning activity — like household chores — they also dance, exercise, color, play games and go on field trips. In the last month they’ve taken trips to Pensacola Beach and The Gulf Breeze Zoo. They plan to visit Navarre Park and Navarre Beach Sea Turtle Conservation Center soon.

“Everyone’s favorite day is Friday,” Ward said. “That’s movie day.”

Arc Gateway staff spends the extra time to get to know their clients on a personal level.

Keisha Davis, one of the program specialists said she loves coming to work each day because of the clients.

“I take all of these guys home with me,” she said with a smile. “Working here makes me feel great.”

Patrice Lavergne, another program specialist, said it’s important for communities to have resources like Arc

Gateway because it broadens the minds of residents.

“Many people are still very uneducated about this population,” she said.

“But there is no difference between them and you. They still want to do all of the things you do, they just have to do it in different steps.”

With the opening of the Arc Gateway site, resources for families with special needs has grown from the small program inside a church.

“It’s really magnificent to watch this dream come true,” Ward said. “It makes us feel good when clients are want to stay.”

They belong somewhere now.”



to an hour while Hickey and his adult son said it was 20 minutes while they went swimming, according to the report.

Hickey is from south-central Florida but was working day labor at Navarre Beach for a few weeks, the report said. Deputies believe Hickey had no other family, nowhere to live and he and his son were living out of the truck.

Authorities transported Hickey to jail and gave him a \$500 bond.



## America's Black Patriots



**Mini Fact:**

This famous painting of Washington crossing the Delaware River depicts two African-Americans on the crowded boat.

### James Armistead

In 1781, a slave named James Armistead volunteered to fight against the British. He was assigned to the Marquis de Lafayette, a French nobleman who had joined George Washington to fight the British.

Armistead knew the Virginia roads well, so Lafayette assigned him to pose as a runaway slave loyal to the British and spy for the Continental Army. British officers would talk about their strategies in front of Armistead, and he made written reports that he sent back to Lafayette.

Armistead's inside information helped Washington and Lafayette defeat the British at the Siege of Yorktown in 1781.

After the war ended, Armistead went back to being a slave. Lafayette found out that he was still not free and wrote a letter to the Virginia General Assembly, and in 1787 Armistead was emancipated, or freed. He farmed in Virginia until his death at age 72.

America's men and women in uniform include people of many races: black, Asian, Hispanic, caucasian, or white, and others. But our military was not always open to people of color. In fact, the armed services weren't fully integrated, or equally open to non-whites, until after the Korean War, in the early 1960s.

This week, in honor of Memorial Day, The Mini Page learns about our earliest African-American heroes, who fought in our country's Revolutionary War against the British.

### Salem Poor

Salem Poor was a black soldier who fought for our freedom from Britain. He was such a brave soldier that 14 officers signed a petition (made a written request) on his behalf. They asked the state of Massachusetts to give him a reward. (Soldiers were often given land or money for their service.)

Salem Poor was one of the 5,000 African-American soldiers and sailors who fought in our war for independence.

### The Black Regiment

When the Revolutionary War started, George Washington was not in favor of recruiting black men, either freemen or slaves, to serve. But during the terrible winter of 1777-78, the state

of Rhode Island was having trouble finding enough men who would sign up. So in February 1778, Rhode Island's general assembly voted to let black men serve, and offered freedom from slavery after their military service. Eighty-eight slaves, along with some freemen, enlisted with the 1st Rhode Island Regiment of the Continental Army, which became known as the "Black Regiment."

### Crispus Attucks

Before the Revolutionary War began, in 1770, a brawl in Boston between British soldiers and a crowd of civilians ended with five people dead of gunshot wounds.

The first person to die in the Boston

Massacre was a man of African-American and Native American descent, Crispus Attucks. He was a runaway slave who had been working at sea and on the docks. He and the others who died were honored as heroes, and in 1888 a monument was built on Boston Common in memory of him and the four others who died. In 1998, a silver dollar coin was issued in Attucks' honor.

# Santa Rosa Jail receives funding for improvements

MILTON — The Santa Rosa County commissioners at the May 10 meeting approved \$733,659 for the jail to cover funding costs for the 2018 fiscal year. This funding will go toward the renovations to the jail annex as well as staffing of additional maintenance medical, and law enforcement staff needed to accommodate the

building. Sheriff Bob Johnson thanked the commissioners for the funding and said how much it was needed. "We are very pleased with the Board of County Commissioner's decision to fund the transition of our old work release center into a 120-bed jail annex," Johnson said. "The Board of County Commissioners showed tremendous foresight in realizing the need to expand our jail due to the rising population." Johnson said the first phase of the project will start

soon and that they will have and additional 60 beds within the next three months which will alleviate the overcrowding that is expected to occur this summer. While the addition of the annex will help with growing inmate numbers the jail faces, it will not completely solve it, according to Johnson. The ultimate goal ultimate goal is to see an expansion of the existing jail that would accommodate 500 more inmates than the current maximum capacity of 682.

Rhino calves are born weighing between 80 and 140 pounds. Fully grown

females like mother, Katie, weigh roughly 3,000 to 4,000 pounds, while adult males like Robbie weigh up to 5,000 pounds. Wild rhinos are facing the worst poaching streak in history, leaving less than 20,000 Southern white rhinos in the wild.

Despite their name, white rhinos are actually grey in color, with two horns on the bridge of their head.

Some cultures falsely believe rhino horns, which are made of keratin like our fingernails, can cure diseases. This leaves wild rhinos severely vulnerable and without continued conservation efforts. It is estimated the wild populations will be extinct in less than 20 years.

"When a species is this endangered, every birth is special but we've waited a long time for this particular baby so we're thrilled" said Director Jesse Pottebaum.

Katana and her rhino family are currently available for viewing daily from the guided train ride, weather dependent, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

We are not sales people and we are not affiliated with any insurance company."

Seniors on Medicare should know that in April Medicare began mailing out new Medicare cards to members, according to Hearn.

"This new card has a unique number," she said. "Old cards had the member's social security number, which put them at a higher risk of fraud."

Hearn said that Florida was not on the first wave of cards being mailed out. Members should be looking for them in the mail. The new cards will be paper. Upon receiving

the new ones, Hearn advised destroying the old card immediately.
