## Milton Bank of America Closing

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MILTON — Bank of America customers in Milton will have further to travel to find a branch location come September when the doors of the Milton branch officially close. The bank sent a letter stating that “On Tuesday, September 11, 2018 the financial center located at 6204 Highway 90, Milton Florida is closing.” The letter listed the two nearest locations—6727 N Davis Highway and 5041 Bayou Blvd—both in Pensacola. People

responding to a Press Gazette Facebook post were mixed in their reactions. “As much as I feel like the customer service needs improvement there,” Liz Barragan wrote, “it will be a major inconvenience for me to go to Pensacola for routine banking.” Linda Barry wrote that “there are other options.” Mathew Daily, public information officer for Bank of America, said consolidation necessitated the closure. “We are constantly looking at the network centers’ changing needs and customers’ habits,” Daily said. “Many customers

are adopting online banking practices and we see that the financial centers are changing. They are being used for more complex but less frequent needs like retirement planning.”

There will be no impact to client accounts, according to Daily, which are accessible at any financial center or ATM, as well as the mobile and online banking platforms. He also said the company is working to ensure the best possible transition for the employees.

## NAS Whiting Field marks Battle of Midway anniversary

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MILTON — Naval Air Station Whiting field recognized the 76th anniversary of the Battle of Midway June 6 with a commencement speech at the base. The Battle of Midway took place June 4 to 7, 1942 at the island of Midway in the central Pacific Ocean six months after the attack on Pearl Harbor. The United States took the offensive in World War II after this

victory of the U.S. Navy over the Japanese Imperial Navy. After Midway, the tide of the war turned in favor of the U.S. and her allies. Speaking at the commemoration was Commander Donald “Droopy” Gaines, former Executive Officer of NAS Whiting field who retired from active service June 8. “The battle was considered one of the greatest modern day successes in U.S. Naval history,” Gaines said in his speech. Gaines

# Blackwater Pyrates count their ducks

MILTON — The civic organization, the Blackwater Pyrates, holds a single, annual fundraiser, the Great Mill Town Duck Race. In preparation for the race, the Pyrates had a duck inventory party June 2 to make sure all of the rubber "racing ducks" are all accounted for and in good racing form.

Pirate members completed a hands-on inventory of all 4,000-plus ducks.

Every year, one Pirate acts as the Duck King. This year, Dean Hinton, Pirate name "Maltese," certified all racing ducks

are healthy, and all numbers are accounted for, and are ready and excited to get in the water and race to the finish.

For the race, duck buyers receive a rubber duck with a number. A duck with the same number goes into a collection.

At 5 p.m. July 4, the Pyrates dump the ducks from the Marquis Bayou Bridge into the Blackwater River.

Pirate members monitor the ducks' travel in a designated path down the river, which narrows enough to allow the ducks to float single-file.

## ASK THE DOCTORS

### ONGOING RESEARCH INTO HIV TREATMENT SHOWS PROMISE

**Dear Doctor:** Is it true that HIV can now be considered a chronic disease? Does that mean people are no longer looking for a true cure?

**Dear Reader:** To answer this, we first have to agree on the meaning of "chronic disease," which, believe it or not, has more than a few definitions. Rather than take a deep dive into those important but perhaps snooze-inducing distinctions, let's go with the most common understanding of the term. That is, a chronic disease is one that cannot be cured, but with ongoing medication and treatment can be managed. And thanks to the stunning success of antiretroviral therapies, infection with HIV now fits that definition of chronic disease.

As most of our readers probably know, HIV is shorthand for the human immunodeficiency virus. The virus undermines the immune system by attacking certain white blood cells that are vital to the ability to fight infection. The loss of these white blood cells leaves HIV-positive individuals vulnerable to disease, infection and complications of illness. AIDS is the stage of HIV infection at which damage to the immune system is profound, and patients are unable to fight off a host of opportunistic infections. For people with AIDS, infections that a healthy immune system would brush off become potentially deadly.

According to one school of thought, the antiretroviral drugs that are now the main treatment regimen for people living with HIV amount to a functional cure. But just because infection with HIV is no longer a near-certain path to developing AIDS, that doesn't mean living with the virus is problem-free. The drugs, which must be taken daily and for the rest of an infected person's life, are extremely powerful. Cumulative toxicity becomes a real concern. And while the antiretrovirals do prevent an HIV infection from progressing to full-blown AIDS, the individual's immune system remains affected by the presence of the virus and, consequently, is less robust. Add in the ability of HIV, like all viruses, to rapidly mutate and become resistant to existing drugs, and infection remains a serious condition.

Compared to the early days of the HIV crisis, when each new development in decoding and understanding the virus was heralded, things may now seem quiet on the news front. But as researchers focus on both prevention and a cure, the science continues to move forward.

For many, the idea of a vaccine is the gold standard. In that regard, there has been encouraging news from researchers at the University of Massachusetts, who recently reported that they are about to enter into a phase 1 trial to assess the safety of a potential HIV vaccine. Other scientists are looking into topical medications that can stop the virus at the site of infection.

And thanks to ongoing advances in the field of immunotherapy, there is renewed hope of finding a cure. Earlier this year, researchers at the University of Maryland reported success in engineering immunotherapeutics that target and neutralize the virus on multiple fronts and across multiple strains. (And yes, that's a greatly simplified explanation.)

An estimated 36 million people worldwide now live with HIV, and while scientific advances don't always make headlines, they do make a difference.





Chasers is about. The members of the team said they are part of this because of their own personal experiences with paranormal activities. Jonathan Reidling joined the team four months ago. said that Midway was an important outpost because it lay between Hawaii and Australia and the Japanese

troops were interested in destroying it to cripple the United States forces. "In the end, the Americans lost one carrier, one destroyer and over one hundred airplanes and three hundred men," Gaines said. "The Japanese, though, took a

much greater toll. They saw four carriers lost, one heavy cruiser lost and over three thousand men killed." He said while the loss of several of the Japanese's well-trained pilots was a factor in their loss, a bigger factor was the high

## New business offers Blackwater River cruises



# ACUPUNCTURE

## helping addicts with recovery

CIRCLEVILLE, Ohio — As the man with the handful of tiny needles moved closer, Sarah Downs’ nervousness grew with his every step. She rocked back and forth in her plastic chair. She fidgeted. She bounced a leg.

She was there in the meeting room of the Pickaway Area Recovery Services (PARS) voluntarily, yet she still was unsure about what her friends had told her: that the acupuncture she was about to experience would ease the anxiety and fear that consumes her mind as she journeys through recovery from heroin and methamphetamine addictions.

Kenneth “Jimmy” Laux, a chiropractor and certified acupuncturist, knelt beside Downs and pierced each of her ears with five needles. As he did so, he explained what specific spot the needle stick was hitting and how it would help. Certain spots calm nerves and control anger, others deal with sadness and depression. Still more affect a person’s “fight or flight” response and will power.

Downs, 38, hoped the treatment worked. Celebrating three months sober this time around, she still is trying to get control of her feelings without using drugs.

“You feel really anxious all the time, just nervous. It’s a scary time,” she said. “This time, I’m trying anything possible to stay clean.”

She was one of eight women who sat for 30 minutes with the needles poking from their ears at this session, all part of a new program that includes Laux and his acupuncture as one of the weapons in the fight to beat addiction.

### Additional resources

It came about because Pickaway County Common Pleas Judge P. Randall Knece had earlier this year heard about auricular acupuncture (utilizing only external ear points) from a recovery home where he sometimes sends defendants from his court. He asked Laux if it was true that this practice could help those overcoming addictions. Laux said yes. He is certified by the National Acupuncture Detoxification Association and uses its method.

Knece said that after nearly a quarter-century on the bench, he never thought he would be talking about using acupuncture to

help drug users who came before him. But nothing stays the same, and he said he now sees it as a challenge to find new ways to balance justice and fix society.

“You can’t just lock people up and expect them to change. You have to do something,” he said. “We just can’t do it like we always did.”

Knece has pledged almost \$13,000 to help cover the \$55 cost per treatment for those in recovery who don’t have Medicaid or private insurance.

Knece underwent acupuncture himself because he wanted see how it felt. He winced a little as the first two needles went in, and laughed as he told the eight women gathered around the tables — some of whom he had earlier sent to prison or county jail — that they lied to him when they said it didn’t hurt.

Since mid-April, Laux visits PARS twice a week and has given 35 treatments to 15 people.

Tiera Rapp, 43, is in recovery from pain pill and heroin addictions. She has had four treatments and is among those who told Downs how much they helped.

“I’m way more mellow,” Rapp said about the effects of the acupuncture. “It helps me get out of my own head.”

It isn’t intended to be a solo treatment, just one part of a continuum of care that includes cognitive-behavioral therapy, Narcotics Anonymous and Alcoholic Anonymous meetings, counseling sessions and all things that go along with successful sobriety.

## TODAY’S WORKOUT

### Side plank with leg lift will challenge you

Abdominals, balance and leg strength sounds like a recipe for a great fitness session.

No matter what your fitness routine is, you need moves to fill in the gaps and challenge you.

Our move today is a side plank with a leg lift. You will need a flat surface and a mat for this one, and a little patience.

You will be working your abdominals in this plank, and by adding the leg lift your outer thighs will be engaged, and that’s where balance plays a big role.

Begin the move by lying on your side. Tuck your forearm under your shoulder and lift the upper body off the floor. Holding your core right, extend your legs out straight with your body and proceed to lift your hips off the floor,

creating a side bridge.

Once you get into position and are balanced, add the leg lift. Hold everything strong and slowly lift your top leg. You can keep this movement small by lifting only a couple of inches. As you build balance and

core strength, you will be able to lift your leg higher. If it is too difficult to lift up your hips in the beginning, keep them on the floor and just lift your leg. Slowly you will build strength and balance to lift the hips.

Keep this move slow, giving yourself five to 10 lifts on each side. Take a short break between lifts as your arm will fatigue quickly from holding the weight of your body. Shoot for at least three sets on each side.

This move is great to add to a lower-body routine or as a finisher to a total body workout.
