Commissioners may ask for Tourist Development Council member's resignation

MILTON — The Santa Rosa County Board of County Commissioners will vote during Thursday's meeting on removing Jack Sanborn from his position on the Tourist Development Council following accusations of threatening social media remarks. Commissioner Rob Williamson moved to add Sanborn's removal to Thursday's agenda, which passed without objection. The decision for the vote came up at the June 11 meeting after Milton resident Pam Mitchell sent the council detailed information in which she outlined concerns over Sanborn's position on the council. Mitchell asked the commissioners to review information which

she claimed would "reveal the bullying tactics he and his wife have employed to harass and intimidate the citizens of our county that don't agree with their positions," she said in a letter written to them. Sanborn was not present for the meeting. Commissioner Bob Cole said it was inappropriate to discuss matters concerning Sanborn in his absence. Commissioner Rob Williamson thanked Mitchell for approaching the commission with her concerns and addressed his own concerns on Sanborn. He asked the commission to consider

asking for Sanborn's resignation. "We should thank him for his service and ask him to step down," Williamson said. Commissioner Don Salter supported Williamson's proposal to call for Sanborn's resignation. Sanborn had come under fire at an earlier TDC board meeting for a comment toward a female reporter at a May 17 TDC budget workshop. During discussion about funding a Navarre Beach Area Chamber of Commerce event, "Small Bites Under the Moonlight," reporter Jamie Gentry gave some information about it.

She opened with a disclaimer that as a reporter she has "zero opinion."

Commissioner Sam Parker, the current BOCC representative on the TDC said, "Not all reporters believe that."

Laughter followed. Shortly thereafter, Sanborn said, "And you're a female and no opinion."

"Jack. Uh uh," TDC Chairman Kyle Holley said. "I really appreciate that sexism. It's great," Gentry said.

"Oh my gosh. Stop it. Stop it. Stop it," Holley said.

The meeting continued into details of the event with no further discussion on Sanborn's remarks. Gentry was unavailable to provide a comment on her reactions to Sanborn as of press time. The commission will meet at 9 a.m. at Santa Rosa County Administrative Center Board Room, 6495 Caroline Street, Milton.

'Sticker shock' over fire fee increases

MILTON — Santa Rosa County Commissioners are looking to increase annual rates for fire district services in unincorporated areas in the county.

In February, Navarre Beach Fire Rescue went to the board to approve rate increases for fire services. But officials said that there would first need a study to assess department needs before a rate increase could be implemented. And instead of looking at just one department, they had the study cover nine other fire departments in unincorporated areas.

Navarre Beach Fire Rescue and other departments in the study are funded by its Municipal Service Benefit Unit (MSBU). Rates can only be changed annually, and all rate increases must be approved by the County Commission.

On Monday, Sandi Walker of Government Services Group, Inc. presented new rate calculations based on a five-year budget. Numbers were broken down to show rate increases from 70.7 percent to 100 percent. Commissioners expressed interest in a more modest 71 to 73 percent range.

Between January and October 2017, Navarre Beach Fire Rescue responded to 253 incidents. Navarre Beach Fire Rescue's annual fire fee for the current fiscal year is \$350 for residential property and \$900 for non-residential properties up to 10,000 square feet, with an additional rate of 14 cents per square foot over 10,000. With the proposed rate increase of 70.7 percent, it would raise the MSBU to \$425 for residential property and a significantly higher variable rate for non-residential properties.

The biggest increase would be for SpringHill Suites, a new 161-room hotel on Navarre Beach that would face an annual fee of \$49,530.64.

There are nine other MSBU fire departments in Santa Rosa County including Pace Fire Rescue District, which is the second busiest fire department in county, said Brad Baker, emergency management director. In the 2017 calendar year, the nine departments have responded to a total of 6,677 incidents. Current adopted MSBU rates for those departments are \$85 for residential properties up to 3,500 square feet and \$2.50 per 100 square feet for non-residential properties.

Sequoias, berries and the high cost of housing

‘California has worn me quite thin ... I just can’t wait to see you again.’ — from “Come Monday” as performed by Jimmy Buffett

When I was 17, I took a trip to California that included a visit to San Diego, a stop at Disneyland, Knott’s Berry Farm and the Hearst Castle, and a drive up that state’s spectacular coastal highway. The turns were both frightening and exhilarating, especially around Big Sur. Monterey, Pacific Grove and Carmel were gorgeous; the air was clean and fresh; the quality of light remarkable. The sequoia trees near Mount Whitney were awesome, and John Muir’s redwoods were equally majestic.

The climate was wonderful. When we landed it was 55 degrees with no humidity. In August. Most of us, I think, especially those of us who spend a lot of time in the South, dream about being able to enjoy a summer afternoon without stifling heat and bugs. You can do that in California. There was a sense then that California was a special place, a desired location to visit or live.

Times change, though. A dozen mudslides and twice as many wildfires later, the Golden State has lost some luster. Especially if you want to own a home there. Consider this: the median price for a home in San Francisco recently rose to \$1.6 million, or double the cost from only five years ago. Are wages keeping up, so that most folks can afford that increase? No way.

So it’s no surprise that Californians are bailing. In addition to being one of the most highly taxed states, most folks simply can’t afford to buy a home. Home prices are high throughout the state. So where are Californians moving? Everywhere, apparently. But especially to places like Las Vegas. It’s close by, and home prices are still rebounding from the Great Recession. The median list price for a home in Vegas in April of 2018 was about \$280,000. Eight per cent of those Californians who left the state in the first quarter of 2017 landed in Las Vegas.

From 2006 to 2016, California experienced a net decrease of a million residents. Contrast that with a state like, say, Florida, which over the same 10-year time span grew from a population of 18.17 million to 20.66 million, a net increase of almost two and a half million residents.

Many people still desire to own a house, and paying a million dollars for a two-bedroom starter home is unappealing to most, even if you’ve landed a high-paying tech job.

True leaders create more leaders

Dear editor,
 What was once a peaceful, quaint, historic, little riverfront town nestled in the beautiful setting of mid-Santa Rosa has now become a breeding ground for political differences and strife. Sadly, it is tearing Milton apart and needs to stop.

First off, I will say that I love Milton. No, it is not perfect. No town is. But it is unique and filled with some of the best people around, people who care about and love their town.

I have owned residential and commercial property as well as been in business in Milton. I was proud to serve as Main Street Milton's second manager back in 2001-2003. We had a vibrant group of volunteers who worked diligently to implement the Main Street Approach to revitalize the historic downtown area. People were excited and things were happening!

Back then, Main Street generated oodles of publicity, with well-attended events and festivals and many fundraising successes. One was the MSM Patriotic Pageant that had contestants lining up out the doors to participate. That raised well over \$5,000.00. The other was a crazy fun event held at the Texas Roadhouse called “Main Street Milton...a Lot at Steak!” Local citizens, business owners, city and county officials, and many others worked closely together waiting tables for tips. Not only did it raise money, but also awareness for the organization.

Christmas on the Town packed the downtown area with visitors of all ages. They

enjoyed a snow machine, Santa's Secret Shop, petting zoo and a chili cook-off. Mardi Gras brought even more family-friendly excitement to the area. In 2003, Main Street did its best to purchase the Old Post Office but it went to a higher bidder.

Additionally, a Teen Board formed, which offered local youth the opportunity to get involved in the community effort. It was during that time that Main Street took home a large number of state awards and received national recognition. Times were good. People got along, and alcohol wasn't a thought much less a requirement.

The organization is still in existence, now headed up by new manager Ed Spears, who parted ways with Pensacola's Community Maritime Park several years ago.

The MSM website states that the organization depends solely on donations and fundraising for support. Despite multiple concerns voiced by an area authority on non-profits recently, the Milton City Council awarded the group \$125,000. Florida Main Street states that funding is 1/3 municipality, 1/3 private sector and 1/3 grants/donations.

Although a focus on revitalization is still much needed here, local citizens are concerned that MSM should not be used as a political machine.

Not only have its leaders pushed for the recent passage of the unpopular alcohol overlay ordinance, some have also lobbied for setting term limits for elected officials at City Hall. If this is to be the case, then let them “lead” by example.

Several members have been on the MSM board since its earliest days. It is never good to have board members who refuse to relinquish control. Community organizations should always be open to accepting new leadership, energetic volunteers, fresh ideas, financial support, etc. If the “12 is Enough” push is on for city hall, then why not for other community organizations?

United we stand, divided we fall? Another common sense concept would be that community groups and citizens with opposing ideas actually come together to work for the better good of the entire community.

Stop the online divisive posts, mockery and propaganda. It is old. It poorly represents organizations with which the poster is associated, and is detrimental in attracting people to a good cause. Not everyone sees things the same way and the attitude shouldn't be “it's our way or we slam you on social media.”

Again, I believe in the Florida Main Street approach but would like to see long-term board members step aside and give other citizens a chance to serve and lead. In closing, consider this. “True leaders don't create followers. They create more leaders.”

History a marker, and a mirror

Stark County (Ohio) Common Pleas Court Judge Frank Forchione can be counted on to do something interesting from the bench.

Recently, Forchione despaired over how many

defendants, particularly young men, who come into court and have no knowledge of events such as D-Day and American history in general.

In this latest instance, Forchione noted to three defendants that Americans who fought and died on D-Day were the same ages as they. As part of their sentences, he ordered

the defendants — two who stole from a store, and one who was drunk while carrying a gun — to read a book, “D-Day: June 6, 1944: The Climactic Battle of World War II,” and to submit written reports.

In 2015, he ordered the same of a man who stole

from a local VFW. There was a time when judges could offer such defendants a choice of jail or the military. But today’s military is too sophisticated and specialized and has no time to save people from themselves.

No one should be surprised that Americans have so little knowledge about our own history, except for those things we like to fight about.

Our knowledge gap is as quintessentially American as a cowboy movie. Last July 4, when NPR tweeted out The Declaration of Independence, a number of people didn’t recognize it and practically stormed the gates, furiously accusing the outlet of being seditious and un-American.

Marker and mirror Last week, even the president embarrassed himself by suggesting to Prime Minister Justin Trudeau that Canada burned the White House during the War of 1812.

It was the British. If you don’t believe it, just ask them.

What Canada did do however, is fight and die at our side on D-Day, and smuggle Americans out of Iran during the Islamic Revolution of 1978.

If we expect our presidents to know a little more about history than the average citizen, it’s because as president you’re a literal, living, breathing, chapter of American history.

But history isn’t just a marker, it’s also a mirror. It shows us the truth of who we are, not as we might wish to see ourselves, and no amount of spin or distortion can change it.

That alone is worth our knowing it.

But you can’t preserve, protect and defend what you don’t know. To ignore or not care about the history of the country in which you live endangers it.

A seamless cloth A 2014 report published by the National Assessment of Educational Progress found that only 18 percent of American high school students were proficient in history.

A previous study found that less than 20 percent of adults could identify the Emancipation Proclamation in a multiple-choice question. In another, half of the respondents placed the Civil War and the War of 1812 ahead of the American Revolution on a timeline.

It isn’t possible for us to master all of history, however. If truth be told, a lot of us couldn’t pass a U.S. naturalization test.

We are where we are because of the heroism exhibited on D-Day and other crucial events like it. Because “past is prologue,” our story is a seamless cloth, not a patchwork of luck and happenstance.

As the historian David McCullough puts it:

“We are all part of a larger stream of events, past, present and future. We are the beneficiaries of those who went before us, who built the cathedrals, who braved the unknown, who gave us their time and service and who kept faith in the possibilities of the mind and the human spirit.”

We benefit — and sometimes suffer — because of actions and decisions of the past, which is the essence of history and the message Forchione is trying to get across.

It remains to be seen if he succeeds.

assessment, rates could be raised about \$15 for residential properties and a slight variable increase for non-residential based on the 72.5 percent increase rate.

Baker said additional funding is desperately needed in all fire districts.

“They are woefully undermanned,” Baker said of some of the local fire departments. “Volunteerism is way down. Last week we had a structure fire in Allentown and there was only one firefighter

from Allentown that could go. The call volume is steadily increasing.”

Some board members admitted there was some “sticker shock” from the study. But Navarre Fire Rescue Chief Danny Fureigh said the study just goes to show how Navarre Beach and other MSBU fire departments have been operating at “bare minimum.”

“It’s been nine years since Navarre Beach has revisited an MSBU rate,” Fureigh said over the phone while at a fire chief convention in Las Vegas. “We haven’t kept up with the growth. I think the study proved a rate increase was

fair and equitable. The budget looks at replacing equipment, there’s no pay raises. We’re trying to sustain services.”

Commissioner Lane Lynchard said there will be a rate increase, they just have to assess how high they will go.

The board of commissioners will further discuss and set a maximum rate at Thursday’s meeting.

“You’ll get a budget increase,” he said. “It looks like 70 percent would be reasonable. Santa Rosa County is one of the fastest growing counties in the state. Budgets for fire departments haven’t kept up.”

6. I prepare for His answer [ask & you shall

receive] and I get prepared to figure out how to use His feedback that I know I will receive.

7. Praise the Lord and onward we go again.

Suicide, first, with no introspection and patience, to me, would be like telling the Lord he’s a liar and not trusting what He says. He says He will not give me any burden to carry that is too heavy. OK, so I’ll believe Him and trust Him! I could go through a whole laundry list of how He has watched over me over the years. Sometimes we don’t notice His role, though, until we look back over the years.

I don’t think suicide is a path to Christian Heaven. So, I’d recommend becoming a Christian, or a better Christian and practice leaning on God to defeat hopelessness and help prevent suicide.

University to conduct business study in Milton

MILTON — Graduate students from Florida State University will spend the next two months working on an incubator study for Northwest Florida with an emphasis on Santa Rosa County. The results will show what opportunities exist for a business incubator in the county.

"These graduate students in the masters in applied economics program at FSU are learning about economic development and how to diversify local economies," said Dr. Jerry Parrish, adjunct at FSU and chief economist of the Florida Chamber Foundation. "The program is ranked in the top five in the U.S. and these students will provide a detailed look at what type of incubator would be the right match for the area."

Students will consider existing startup companies and other factors in determining whether a business incubator is needed in the area. Prospective sites will be suggested based on

drive times and patterns, as well as available property. Business incubators typically contain multiple office spaces and shared conference rooms.

"This idea came about while working with Gulf Power - we pitched an idea of having an incubator study to see if there was need for a space in Santa

Rosa County. A business incubator will allow small business owners to come to one location - it will get them beyond their garage and give them an office setting to have client visits, collaborate with other small business owners and bounce ideas off of each other," said Santa Rosa County

Economic Development Director Shannon Ogletree. "Having this space will help encourage more startups and allow us to further assist small businesses in the county."

Dear Pastor Gallups — "I saw on one of your sites on the Internet that you believe the Nephilim mentioned in the Bible were not the result of angelic beings leaving their holy estate and mating with humans. What do you do with the passage in Jude that says otherwise?" R.E. Pace

Dear R. E.,
 The passage in Jude simply does not "say otherwise." I will get to that in a moment. First use common sense with me for a moment.
 It would be an utterly shocking, life-changing thing if we were to discover that angels (or demons) actually "mated" with humans to create "another race." That sounds like a Hollywood horror story or science fiction. If that were actually so, doesn't it make sense that the Bible, God's Word for us, would have tons of information about this horrendous event? Yet, it simply does not have ANY information about anything like this. Jesus certainly doesn't even allude to the topic. (Please see my article from last week.)
 Now for the passage in Jude. You are referring to Jude 1:6 "And the angels who did not keep their positions of authority but abandoned their own home-- these he has kept in darkness, bound with everlasting chains for judgment on the great Day." (NIV)
 This passage simply speaks of what we already know from the Bible; that angelic beings "fell" with Satan in a cosmic rebellion. They will be judged and ultimately destroyed in the lake of fire mentioned in Revelation 20. The Old Testament talks about this, Jesus talks about this and here, Jude is speaking of it. There is no mention of mating with humans or the creation of an angelic/human race. It simply is not there, by any stretch of the imagination.
 I know that this "new-age" interpretation of one difficult passage in the Bible from Genesis 6 has gained much sensational popularity on the Internet. Family rescue among FWC incidents

MILTON — The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission filed these cases between May 13 and 24 in Santa Rosa County:

Officer Ramos, along with U.S. Coast Guard and a Pensacola Fire Rescue vessel, responded to a single vessel boating accident in Pensacola Bay. A family of four attempted to cross the rough bay in a small 14-foot boat when a large wave swamped the boat, sinking it. The two adults, a 4-year-old and a 9-month-old entered the extremely choppy water. Approximately 25 minutes later, a good Samaritan saw the distressed swimmers and maneuvered his catamaran to rescue the family. He, along with guests onboard, retrieved the four persons from the water. The two children were wearing personal flotation devices, the 9-month-old was not

breathing when taken out of the water. The Good Samaritan administered CPR on the infant and placed a distress call on his marine radio. A recovery vessel assisted by getting the distressed swimmers from the catamaran to a nearby dock where several EMS crews were standing by. The mother and baby were admitted to the hospital and released a few hours later.

Santa Rosa Medical Center wants you to A.C.T. to prevent heat-related car deaths

MILTON — Each year in the U.S., an average of 38 children and hundreds of dogs die from hyperthermia (heatstroke) in hot cars. While our initial reaction may be these are cases of blatant cruelty or negligence, the truth is many are due to tragic error on the part of otherwise loving, competent caregivers. The point? Yes, it's possible this could happen to you.

There are a couple of misconceptions that contribute to these tragic episodes. First, there's the assumption that if it's cool outside, it can't get very hot inside, and this is not accurate. It can be a mere 70 degrees outside, and on a sunny day a car can reach 100 degrees within 15 minutes. The perception that 'cracking the windows' will somehow keep the temperature in a safe range is another dangerous myth — open windows have

little effect on internal car temperatures on a sunny day. Body temperatures for children and dogs rise three to five times faster than an adult's, and brain damage or death can occur in a matter of minutes.

It's true that some children and pets are knowingly and negligently left inside hot vehicles. But in most cases, hot car deaths are a result of an adult's disastrous lapse in memory. Working parents are often tired, stressed and running on auto-pilot on their way to and from work or errands. The risk is particularly high when the child is sleeping in the back seat, or when the adult is traveling a path outside their normal routine.

Experts suggest you can reduce the risk by remembering to **A.C.T.**:

A - AVOID

Avoid heatstroke-related injury and death by never leaving your child

alone in a car, not even for a minute. Be sure to keep your car locked when you are not in it, so kids don't climb in on their own.

C - CREATE

Create a reminder by putting something in the back of your car next to your child, such as a briefcase, a purse, a shoe or a cell phone that is needed at your final destination. This is especially important if you are not following your normal routine.

T - TAKE ACTION

If you see a child or dog alone in a car, call 911 and stay with the victim. Emergency personnel are trained to respond to these situations, and one call could save a life. If help does not arrive quickly and you note signs of immediate distress such as lethargy, poor coloring or heavy breathing, engage witnesses and do what is necessary to ensure the victim's safety.

The Community Center's March 15 "Survey of Students in Poetry Program" found 85



County looks to improve Navarre Beach

MILTON — A few new improvements are being added to Navarre Beach amenities.

At Monday's Santa Rosa County Commissioner meeting Monday, commissioners moved to approve implementing signage and brochures to promote the Navarre Beach Marine Sanctuary Snorkel Reef. The improvements will be funded by a \$10,000 from the Coastal Partnership Initiative (CPI) program. Matching funds will come from the county's Tourism Development tax reserves, a move that was approved by the Tourism Development Council on May 3.

CPI is a program of Florida Department of Environmental Protection to promote the protection of effective management of Florida's coastal resources, according to the DEP website.

The Marine Sanctuary and artificial reef is located in the Navarre Beach Marine Park directly south of Sea Oat Pavilion. The reef is located 100 yards offshore near lifeguard

station No. 1. The park is free to the public and open every day sunrise to sunset.

"As active divers on the artificial reefs, we know the importance and need to educate the public about the unique ecosystems in

our backyard," said Charlene Mauro, director of Navarre Beach Marine Science Station.

Growing Santa Rosa Enterprises, which operates the Navarre Beach Fishing Pier, spoke to the

board at Monday's meeting about several approval requests including adding a temporary portable restrooms services until an ADA-compliant facility is available, installing new ice machine and adding

a second gate on the pier north of the dune line. The company also requested approval for a memorandum of understanding between Growing Santa Rosa Enterprises and True Blue Fishing Club to allow

members to fish from the pier after normal operating hours. Anglers in the club work alongside NOAA to do research on marine life.

Requests for approval were all moved to Thursday's meeting.

MILTON — American chaffseed isn't the most glamorous plant in the Panhandle. It's not vibrant and showy when it blooms. It doesn't dwarf its neighbors in height or mass. It's not carnivorous like some of its better-known neighbors. It is hard to find, though, which is part of its claim to fame.

Also known as *Schwalbaea americana*, the chaffseed is a federally listed endangered species and once was found throughout 15 southeastern and eastern states but now is limited to five.

A new population of American chaffseed recently was discovered in the Blackwater River State Forest.

This new population area makes the second known chaffseed site on the forest.

"The fact that it occurs on Blackwater is a good thing," said Craig Iversen,

forest ecology supervisor for Blackwater. "It shows us that our management, especially the use of fire and the protection of seepage slopes and other sensitive areas, has helped this species hang on."

According to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service, *Schwalbaea* is found in habitats described as open, moist pine flatwoods, fire-maintained

savannas. Most of the surviving populations, and all the most vigorous populations, are in areas that are still subject to frequent fire.

These fire-maintained habitats include forest management areas such as Blackwater that are burned to maintain habitat for wildlife, including the endangered red-cockaded woodpecker.

Four steps for a healthier, sharper brain

Want to give your mind a good workout? Instead of bingeing on online brain games, it's probably best to focus on living an active, healthy lifestyle, according to neurologists.

Take a walk. Eat your vegetables. Socialize with friends. Though it might seem surprising, the key to keeping your brain healthy and high-functioning as you age is adopting a holistic approach, not trying to spot-train your brain, said Dr. Geoff Eubank, OhioHealth's medical chief of general neurology. "Common sense would tell you to work the thing you want to preserve," Eubank said. "But you really don't want to pick just one thing, you want to pick all of them to be as healthy as possible."

It's advice that has proven effective for Merlane Fuller, 64, who was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, a neurodegenerative disorder, more than seven years ago. She participates in a "Delay the Disease" class that integrates robust workouts with voice exercises and even handwriting practice.


For Fuller, bonding with classmates has helped her stay social. While curbing her physical symptoms, creating those friendships has made her feel healthier overall, she said. "Now I'm socially connected with people who share my disease," she said. "That's really important to me."

Diet and exercise

Exercising and eating healthy are usually associated with building muscle and trimming fat, but neurologists say it's about so much more.

Any physical activity — yoga, walking, running, biking — is mentally engaging, and vigorous exercise has even been compared to "Miracle-Gro for the brain" in recent studies, said David Zid, Delay the Disease program director.

The key is finding one you enjoy so you keep at it. For foods, a colorful, plant-based diet that's low in saturated fats is best. Eating a well-balanced diet, rather than just a lot of one food that is marketed as

brain-healthy, is important. However, some research suggests that consuming fish one to two times a week could help reduce the onset of dementia, Eubank said.

Stay social

When you exercise and eat that healthy meal, it's best to do it surrounded by people. A good discussion may be just as hearty of a brain workout because of the complexities of sharing stories, judging social cues and recalling memories, said Dr. Douglas Scharre, director of Wexner Medical Center's division of cognitive neurology.

Getting involved with volunteering, clubs and other groups as you age helps maintain a good social circle.

"I don't think people realize the amount of their brain they use just for day-to-day tasks like carrying on a conversation," Scharre said.

'Use it or lose it'

Doctors say there is no proof as of yet that playing so-called brain games, such as crossword and Sudoku puzzles and mind teasers on your cellphone or computer, have a better long-term impact on overall brain health than other cognitively engaging activities.

If you enjoy them, keep playing, they said. If you don't, don't start just because of how they're adver-

tised. Plenty of everyday activities — such as doing jigsaw puzzles, reading, learning a foreign language or playing piano — can build up your "brain reserves," providing a protective cushion as your brain deteriorates with age, Scharre said. Even something as routine as filing taxes can keep your brain active. It's often explained with the phrase "use it or lose it," Scharre said.

Avoid bad habits

In addition to practicing good habits, avoiding bad ones can ensure your brain thrives as you age, neurologists said.

Avoid smoking. Wear a helmet when bicycling or riding a motorcycle to avoid trauma.

And if you have sleep apnea, which decreases the brain's oxygen supply, potentially destroying brain cells, get tested and treated as early as possible.

Though you can't avoid being genetically predisposed to brain-related issues, lifestyle changes can only help, the doctors said.


This move will have your abs in shape in no time

With summer almost here, our abdominals become No. 1 on our fitness list. There are many exercises that we already do that automatically tone and shape our core simply by holding proper posture and contracting during movement. But it is good to dedicate a few exercises solely to the midsection.

Our move today is a weighted pulsing crunch. You will need a medium hand weight for this movement, and also a yoga mat.

Begin this move by lying on your back. Grasping the weight in both hands, extend your arms straight

out in front of your body. Bending the knees, place your feet flat on the floor hip width apart. Press your back into the mat, rotate the hips upward, roll your shoulders back and down and create a space between your chin

and chest, keeping the neck neutral. Now you are ready to start pulsing.

Slightly lift the upper part of your body off the mat, creating a deep contraction in the abdomen, then lower, giving your body a pulsing motion.

Keep this movement going for either a determined count, eight to 16 counts, or shoot for 20 to 30 seconds. Take a quick break, then repeat. Shoot for at least three to five sets. If you need more intensity, increase the weight. If you notice back or neck issues, drop the weight and extend just your arms.

This exercise, along with a few others, should have your midsection toned and ready for all of your summer activities.



WOMAN QUESTIONS NEED TO USE LABELS IN RELATIONSHIP



Will you be watching the 2018 FIFA World Cup Russia™ this month? This international sporting event, which takes place every four years, kicks off on June 14 in 11 different cities in Russia. Let's find out more about the tournament!

What is FIFA?

FIFA (FEE-fah) is a French acronym for the International Federation of Association Football. (In the U.S., we call this game soccer.) It is the organization in charge of the World Cup and other international soccer tournaments.

Getting organized

FIFA organizes members into six confederations, or groups. Each confederation hosts a tournament to determine which teams qualify for the FIFA World Cup™.

This year, for the first time since 1986, the United States team did not qualify for the World Cup. The country hosting the matches qualifies automatically.

The FIFA World Cup has two stages, or parts: group play and knockout play. In group play, each team plays the other three teams in its assigned group. If a team wins, it receives three points; a draw, or a tie, is awarded one point. The two teams with the most points in each group then advance to the knockout stage, where a loss means elimination.



Munson residents unhappy with school sale

MILTON — Community members of the Munson area are unhappy with the pending sale of Munson Elementary School. The school, which closed operations in 2010, has since been sitting vacant and has been a drain on the financial resources on the Santa Rosa County School Board according to superintendent Tim Wyrosdick.

The board has for years tried to reach out to several entities including the Santa

Rosa County Commission and the Black Water State Forest to take the properties. According to the school board both turned it down. So the board made the decision to sell the property, holding a public auction for the purchase of the school. A public service announcement about the auction appeared in the Santa Rosa Press Gazette in the April 7, 14 and 21 editions.

Two interested parties placed bids at the auction. The district accepted \$125 thousand bid, the higher of the two. However, members of the community are

dissatisfied with the offer, saying they knew nothing of the auction. Resident Wes Gadits said the community always thought a state park would buy the property if it needed to be sold and said he had other hopes for its future. "We would like to see it go back to the county commission," he said. "They have a ball field that they take care of." Howard Gravis, a member of Springhill Baptist Church, said he had an interest in putting a Christian school on the property and wanted to know if the sale was final. Wyrosdick said it was and said the

board had tried to reach out to programs to take over the property before. "We have been approached by individuals several months ago expressing interest in purchasing the property," he said. "The board presented this idea and was charged with making a public notice of sale of the property." The board affirmed they advertised for the legal amount of time required by state law. County commissioner Bob Cole requested that the board table the issue until the commission had a chance to revisit the issue as he was not

aware of the notice of sale. He indicated that things were different in past years when the board approached the commission before and since that time there is a greater need for this property for a community center for the area. The school board however denied holding the issue and voted unanimously to accept the bid and proceed with final negotiations for the sale of the school. Paul Green, attorney for the school board said there are some issues with the title that will have to be addressed prior to the final sale.



MILTON — Cmdr. Jim Brownlee became the Command Executive Officer of Naval Air Station Whiting Field in Milton, Florida on Monday, May 15, following an already distinguished career in Naval Aviation.

Brownlee was born in 1970 in Upper Black Eddy, Penn., a small town on the Delaware River where he spent much of his youth boating and fishing

up and down the river. "Not much has changed in town over the years," Brownlee said, whose parents still live in the house they bought just after he was born. "When I visit, it really is like coming home."

As a child, Brownlee was given his first exposure to flying in a Cessna by his parents, Rita and Art Brownlee.

"It was my mom, sister and me along with the flight instructor," Brownlee said. "I got to sit in the front seat and from that point on I wanted to fly."

After high school, Brownlee attended the University of Nebraska at Kearney, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in aircarlow science management in 1994. The degree required Brownlee to earn his professional pilot's license, giving him a greater sense of life in the cockpit, and leaving him wanting more.

"Aviation was what drew me to the Navy," Brownlee said, who by then had solid knowledge and experience in the profession to build upon.

Brownlee joined the United States Navy after college, reporting to NAS Pensacola for Aviation Officer Candidate School in 1995. After commissioning as an Ensign, Brownlee reported to NAS Corpus Christi, Texas to fly the T-34C Mentor II in Training Squadron Twenty-Eight (VT-28), followed by NAS

Whiting Field, Florida to fly the TH-57 Sea Ranger in Helicopter Training Squadron Eight (HT-8).

Brownlee earned his Wings of Gold as an Unrestricted Naval Aviator onboard NAS Whiting Field in 1998, and learned to fly the MH-53 Sea Dragon at Marine Helicopter Training Squadron 302 (HMT-302), Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) New River, North Carolina. At that

MILTON — Bank of America customers in Milton will have further to travel to find a branch location come September when the doors of the Milton branch officially close. The bank sent a letter stating that “On Tuesday, September 11, 2018 the financial center located at 6204 Highway 90, Milton Florida is closing.” The letter listed the two nearest locations—6727 N Davis Highway and 5041 Bayou Blvd—both in

Pensacola. People responding to a Press Gazette Facebook post were mixed in their reactions. “As much as I feel like the customer service needs improvement there,” Liz Barragan wrote, “it will be a major inconvenience for me to go to Pensacola for routine banking.” Linda Barry wrote that “there are other options.” Mathew Daily, public information officer for Bank of America, said consolidation necessitated the closure. “We are constantly looking at the network centers’ changing needs and customers’ habits,” Daily said.

“Many customers are adopting online banking practices and we see that the financial centers are changing. They are being used for more complex but less frequent needs like retirement planning.”

There will be no impact to client accounts, according to Daily, which are accessible at any financial center or ATM, as well as the mobile and online banking platforms. He also said the company is working to ensure the best possible transition for the employees.

NAS Whiting Field marks Battle of Midway anniversary

MILTON — Naval Air Station Whiting field recognized the 76th anniversary of the Battle of Midway June 6 with a commencement speech at the base. The Battle of Midway took place June 4 to 7, 1942 at the island of Midway in the central Pacific Ocean six months after the attack on Pearl Harbor. The United States took the offensive in World War II after this victory of the U.S. Navy over the Japanese Imperial Navy. After Midway, the tide of the war turned in favor of the U.S. and her allies. Speaking at the commemoration was Commander Donald “Droopy” Gaines, former Executive Officer of NAS Whiting field who retired from active service June 8. “The battle was considered one of the greatest modern day successes in

U.S. Naval history,” Gaines said in his speech. Gaines said that Midway was an important outpost because it lay between Hawaii and Australia and the Japanese troops were interested in destroying it to cripple the United States forces. “In the end, the Americans lost one carrier, one destroyer and over one hundred airplanes and three hundred men,” Gaines said. “The Japanese, though, took a much greater toll. They saw four carriers lost, one heavy cruiser lost and over three thousand men killed.” He said while the loss of several of the Japanese’s well-trained pilots was a factor in their loss, a bigger factor was the high loss of technicians. time, the Navy had a detachment assigned to HMT-302.

“Although we were on a Marine base at a Marine squadron, we flew with Navy instructors,” Brownlee said.

Following HMT-302, Brownlee learned tactics and warfare at AMCM Weapon Systems Training School before reporting to Helicopter Combat Support Squadron Four, NAS Sigonella, Italy in

April of 1998.

His time at Sigonella was an especially memorable one in Brownlee’s career, and he encourages others to take advantage of the opportunities and life experiences their careers present. “Get out and experience as much of the culture as you can,” Brownlee suggests.

Brownlee spent a tour of duty in HC-3, in San Diego, Calif., as a flight instructor and onboard the USS Nassau (LHA-4) as the safety officer. He returned to HC-3, Norfolk, Virginia as a department head until the squadron was

deactivated in 2007, and he was transferred to HSC-2.

“San Diego was my first instructor tour,” Brownlee reminisced of his time in HC-3. “It’s where I realized how much I enjoyed being a flight instructor, directly impacting the students coming through the Fleet Replacement Squadron. Training the next generation of aviators just prior to them going to their first operational tour was very rewarding.”

Brownlee spent a significant portion of the past decade in Norfolk, working on NATO-level strategic planning, serving in Carrier Strike

Group 12, earning a Master of Science degree in Aeronautical Science from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University in 2008, deploying on the USS Enterprise (CVN-65) for the ship’s final deployment, and then transferring to Tactical Training Group Atlantic in nearby Naval Station (NS) Dam Neck, Virginia.

“Working with all the NATO nations was eye opening,” Brownlee said. “As one of the most successful alliances in history, it was incredible to experience working with such a vast number of countries with vastly different cultures.”

In January 2018, Brownlee reported to NAS Whiting Field as the prospective executive officer, where he began training for the command position, as well as requalifying in the TH-57. Brownlee has two goals for himself as the Executive Officer of NAS Whiting Field - to effectively lead and support the Sailors and civilians he works with, and to find a way to leave the base even better than the CNIC award winning installation that it is today.

“NAS Whiting Field is a great place to work. I’m very proud to be here,” Brownlee said.

MILTON — There is a new paranormal investigative team in the gulf coast offering their services to the general public at no charge. Shadow Chasers, a non-profit and self-financed organization, performs investigations into paranormal activities across the United States. No client ever pays for their services. Sarah White founded the organization and it consists of a seven-member team, each skilled in different ways.

Origins

A Louisiana native, White’s background is in singing. She’s always had a passion for paranormal activities from childhood.

White organized her team after working with several other over the years. She said after working with these teams she felt they did not hold the true values of what paranormal hunters should be about and decided to form her own team. “I started Shadow Chasers fifteen-plus years ago based on my own personal experiences with the spirit world,” White said. White said that while she worked with other teams she saw that they would stage paranormal activities, break client confidentiality contracts, and perform investigations to promote fame which White said is not what Shadow Chasers is about. The members of the team said they are part of this because of their own personal experiences with paranormal activities. Jonathan Reidling joined the team four months ago. “After my grandfather had passed I saw his presence in the house,” Riedling said. “It has always intrigued me and I was kind of scared I guess.” Austin Williams, who serves as an investigator and clairvoyant for the team says that he became interested in the paranormal at an early age. “I had my first experience when I was 14,” Williams said. “I have a medical condition that caused me to have sort of an out of body experience an ever since that experience I have been able to connect with the spirits. It is emotionally and physically draining

but the gift is so wonderful. Spirits use your energy to communicate.”

The reality of paranormal investigating

According to their website, all team members are specialists of different groups, religions, cults, cultures and practices.

White said that she wishes to dispense with the idea that paranormal investigators are people who do not hold any Christian religious values. Most of the team is either Baptist or Methodist, according to Williams. “We do not worship Satan,” White said. “Lots of people will shy away. We are not calling up demons. Each one of us on the team are faith based.” White says the main purpose is to help people who are having problems and who do not understand when they encounter a supernatural presence. She said they will go in, show their clients what they do, council them and help give them answers.

Williams says they’re authentic. “It bothers us when we are compared to

Ghostbusters or something like that,” he said. “We are not staged. We are the real deal.”

Strange occurrence

Williams recalls an occurrence when the team performed an investigation at Murder Creek in Atmore He said he witnessed the team’s camera moving on its own and menu options activating when no one was touching the camera. “We were watching the camera doing things on its own when there was no way it could have,” he said.

Upcoming events

According to their website, Shadow Chasers is planning investigations in the Santa Rosa County area. Those include the Imogene Theatre, Arcadia Mill and the Exchange Hotel. On July 7 they will be holding a meet-and-greet at Pensacola Vinyl Boutique, 7841 Pine Forest Road in Pensacola. 
