MILTON — Santa Rosa County is looking to make business connections with the launch of Amplify Santa Rosa, the county's new communication platform. Amplify Santa Rosa, part of the Economic Development Office's five-year economic development campaign, is a "digital ambassador" program designed to take the power of word-of-mouth to the digital level. Through this

program, the EDO will be recruiting individuals whose connections in industry or profession may be relevant to economic development in the county.

Amplify Santa Rosa members will be able to share ideas and suggest ways to promote economic development in Santa Rosa County. They'll do so by sharing on social media and receiving suggested posts and links from a regular email.

# 'God spared my life'

97-year-old Milton resident talks service, racism, faith

MILTON — Milton Owens has been around a while. At 97 years old, he has a rare perspective as an African-American growing up in the south and serving in the military during one of the most memorable wars in history.

Owens' memory may not be what it was, but he does remember being a Christian since he was 9 years old. One of his earliest memories was building his own make-believe church and preaching.

"I built this church," Owens said. "My friends were the parishioners and I was the pastor."

During World War II, Owens was recruited to the United States Army when he was 21. He served for two and a half years until being discharged in 1945 after gallbladder surgery.

## Milton resident avoids potential scam

MILTON — Selling something on Craigslist? Milton resident Kim Sumner says an overpayment could be a scam.

Sumner was trying to sell a treadmill for \$300. She placed it on Craigslist and received an email from a user saying he would pay full price and would send a truck June 6 to pick it up. "I was thrilled," Sumner said. "I thought he was valid." Sumner said she received an email from the same person asking for her address and then another one asking for her to text him. Sumner sold the treadmill to another individual

when that person offered her cash in person. Sumner sent an email to the original user saying it had been sold. That's when things began to get suspicious. On June 16 Sumner received a priority envelope in the mail with no paperwork except a check for \$1,730.00 dollars stating nothing but "Re" plus the name of the Craigslist user who initially offered to buy the treadmill.

Sumner had been expecting a check for one of her investments and it wasn't until she noticed the name on the check that something stood out to her as being odd. Through research, she discovered that it could be a scam and notified the local police.

"I called the police department in Milton and they advised me to shred the check," Sumner

said. Captain Mike Cline, Milton Police Department said the particular scam referenced

happens a lot.

# Council on Aging of West Florida to help more vulnerable seniors this summer

PENSACOLA – Senior Chill Out, a one-day drive to acquire donations of new air conditioners, fans and/or funds to assist seniors with heat-related challenges took place June 15 in partnership with WEAR ABC 3, WFGX 35, Cat Country 98.7, News-Radio 1620, and Lowe's Home Improvement. The Pensacola, Gulf Breeze and Pace communities helped Council on Aging and its clients by contributing 269 window

AC units and approximately \$14,500, beating last year's numbers of 218 AC units and \$9,200. The agency also received 286 fans that will help circulate cooled air for the elders.

From 6 am to 6:30 pm, Council on Aging staff, volunteers, board members and business leaders gave their time at five area Lowe's locations to raise awareness of the challenges many elders face during Florida's summer heat.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, more people die from heat waves each year than from hurricanes, lightning, tornadoes, floods and earthquakes combined. It is not uncommon, for example, for homes without proper air conditioning to reach 90 degrees during the height of summer, a plight that is not only uncomfortable

but dangerous.

The elderly are particularly vulnerable to excessive heat due to their body's decreased ability to adjust to changes in temperature. Increased risk of heat stroke among the senior population is associated with other medical conditions and prescription medicines that can inhibit perspiration.

"In any other community, the day's thunderstorms may have deterred some potential donors," said John Clark, President/CEO of Council on Aging, "but Pensacola is no ordinary community. From the time the sun rose until it began to set, people braved the rain and the heat to contribute to this very worthy cause. For weeks, people have been calling our office to get placed on the list as they desperately await some relief. This year, thanks to the generosity of Escambia and Santa

Rosa counties, we will be able to provide that relief."

Council on Aging of West Florida would like to especially thank all of our media partners, as well as Azalea Trace, Barberi Heating & Air, Boutwell's Air Masters, Climate Control AC, Commissioners Lumon May and Grover Robinson, Home Instead Senior Care, Homestead Village of Pensacola, Pete Moore Chevrolet, Sears, Sue Straughn, TLC Caregivers, Walker Wilson and all the volunteers who made this day a success.

## Police are not the answer to every social ill

**A**s policymakers nationwide scramble to deal with policing issues — everything from excessive force; to disrespect for authority; to the role of police in troubled neighborhoods — the recurring question is, are we asking police officers to do too much?

Alex Vitale, Professor of Sociology at Brooklyn College, and author of "The End of Policing" told NPR, "The problem is that they've (police have) been given a limited set of tools and placed into circumstances where those tools often can be counterproductive."

Vitale is not alone. "What police have been forced to do in this country is perform triage," Dallas Police Chief David Brown told the Washington Post.

In Dallas, according to the Post, police work includes corralling potentially dangerous dogs, among other duties that extend well beyond routine crime. "We have got a loose dog problem — let's have the cops chase loose dogs," Brown said. "Schools fail? Give it to the cops."

Vitale said "the answer is to quit using police to solve every social problem under the sun. Instead we need to invest in new systems of discipline that treat people with

dignity and respect and try to identify what's driving problematic behavior and actually address those root causes."

The opioid epidemic has exacerbated the role of the police is addressing the community's social problems, whether criminal or not. Dallas Police Detective Chelsea Whitaker told Reuters, "We can be glorified social workers."

She described her contact with two teenagers who constantly got into fights at school. One of them had not been eating. Whitaker took her to grocery store to buy food.

"I had to take another girl to get sanitary napkins because nobody ever taught her that," Whitaker told Reuters. "She is angry and fighting all the time; of course, you would be angry."

"A lot of the officers are resistant to what we call social work. They want to go out and fight crime, put people in jail," Capt. Ron Meyers of the in Chillicothe, Ohio Police Department told the Washington Post. "We need to make sure the officers understand this is what is going to stop the (opioid) epidemic."

Officers are finding children who were barricaded in rooms while their parents got high, and they are responding to the same homes for the same problems. Feelings of exasperation course through some departments in which officers are interacting with the same drug users over and over again, sometimes saving their lives repeatedly with naloxone, a drug that reverses an opiate overdose, reported the Post.

Couple addiction with mental

illness and the tension between the police and a bad actor can escalate rapidly — often with disastrous results. Police departments are looking for new and innovative ways to cope with this growing menace.

Amy Watson, an associate professor of social work at The University of Illinois at Chicago, described Crisis Intervention Teams (CITs) for Social Work Today. The CIT Model is an innovative police-based first responder program designed to help law enforcement recognize and appropriately respond to a mental health crisis.

As money for mental health institutions evolved into community based treatment, prisons have become de facto mental health facilities. Police officers have become the caretaker in the community charged with protecting the public from the double malaise of addiction and mental illness.

Being a cop isn't easy. Sending him or her into the street to deal with issues beyond the scope of law enforcement is outrageous. Sure, training is available, but shouldn't police officers focus on public safety and law enforcement while other trained professionals deal with illnesses like addiction and schizophrenia?

U.S. Marine Corps Colonel David Morris served as the guest speaker for the time honored tradition that allows for the assembled crew, staff, friends and guests to welcome in the new commander, while also recognizing the achievements of the outgoing leader.

Commanding VT-2 was the latest stop for Aperauch on an 18-year military aviation career that began after graduating from Old Dominion University and earning his commission from Officer Candidate School in May, 2000. School (AWSTS) as a Fleet Replacement Squadron Instructor; Joint Staff J7 (training) division; and the USS San Antonio (LPD 17). He earned a Master's Degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Joint Forces Staff College. He is now headed to Sasebo, Japan and will serve as the air boss, responsible for all aspects of operations involving aircraft aboard USS Wasp (LHD-1).

Cmdr Aperauch offered the following parting thoughts to his squadron. "It's been my life's honor to serve as your commanding officer, and I pray you achieve every success that you set your heart to. Your willingness to serve unwaveringly to protect our freedoms around the world and to lay so costly a sacrifice on the altar of freedom is nothing short of heroic. He then reported to flight school and completed his primary flight training with VT-2. He "winged" in November of 1999 as a helicopter pilot from Helicopter Training Squadron EIGHTEEN before being stationed in Miami, Fla., where he flew the HH-65 Dolphin helicopter. Since then he has served tours at Coast Guard Stations in Elizabeth City, NC and Jacksonville, FL. He deployed to Central and South America, as well as Southeast Asia. Commander Jackson also completed advanced education at Old Dominion University, earning a Master's degree in Engineering Management.

Cmdr. Wesley Barnes, U.S. Navy, will replace Jackson as Executive Officer for the squadron.

# Pensacola local earns her wings of gold

Macfarlane said it was the people who she worked with daily in the training squadrons that helped her through the rigors of aviation.

"The students I met and see every day in the ready room make any time waiting to fly pass faster," Macfarlane recalls. "Also, the instructors in advanced [training] care about making the most capable pilot for the fleet, but also care about you as a person."

Macfarlane said that she had "highs and lows" during her time in flight training and recognized how she handles the lows

has helped her grow into a better person.

I am very excited to fly aircraft and complete missions and do what I have been training to accomplish, but I am equally as excited to be working with a diverse group of individuals to achieve our squadron and fleet missions."

Macfarlane was winged by her mother Cindy Wasem. Her fiancé Tim Tracey, Father Russell Macfarlane, and guest speaker retired Rear Admiral White joined Ens. Macfarlane on stage for her long awaited moment to become a winged aviator.

# One dead, one injured in Navarre crash

NAVARRE — One driver is dead and another was transported to a nearby hospital after a crash at the intersection of U.S. Highway 98 and Panhandle Trail Monday morning.

Chief Ron Norton of Holley-Navarre Fire District said the accident between a pickup truck and minivan was a "T-bone type" collision, which means one vehicle drove into the side of another at a perpendicular angle. Firefighters were called to the scene around 11:30 a.m.

According to a press release from Florida

Highway Patrol, 82-year-old Claude Grice Griffith of Mary Esther was traveling westbound on U.S. Highway 98 in a 2010 Toyota Tundra, just east of the intersection at Panhandle Trail. As he approached the intersection, he turned in a northwest direction and left the roadway on the north shoulder.

The Toyota continued to drive through the grassy area on the north side of the roadway where it crosses Panhandle Trail and collided with the driver's side front door of a Dodge minivan, driven by 82-year-old Everett Franklin Ruzowski of Navarre.

The minivan rotated in a counter clockwise

direction and hit a power pole at the corner of Panhandle Trail and U.S. Highway 98. The truck continued west for several feet in a grassy area until coming to a final rest just north of U.S. 98. Norton said Gulf Power crews were on scene to restore power after the crash.

Ruzowski was pronounced dead at the scene, Norton said. Griffith was transported to Fort Walton Beach Medical Center via helicopter and is in serious condition, the release said.

Traffic was delayed Monday afternoon as first responders had to close one of two westbound lanes.

Charges are pending further investigation.


# Senator Nelson makes brief stop in Niceville

Democratic incumbent questions in midst of re-election bid

NICEVILLE — "Unrelenting pressure" from oil and gas interests continues to threaten the future of the military test range that covers nearly 120,000 square miles in the Gulf of Mexico, according to Sen. Bill Nelson, D-Fla.

Nelson addressed the test range issue during a brief Friday stop in Niceville to talk with local media. Also during the half-hour stop, Nelson touched upon a variety of issues and his re-election campaign. The three-term incumbent is facing Republican Gov. Rick Scott, who has reached term limits as governor.

The Gulf Test Range is used by a wide range of

military units, including Eglin Air Force Base's 33rd Fighter Wing and 96th Test Wing, and the Air Force Special Operations Command at Hurlburt Field. The range accommodates high-altitude supersonic air combat training, air-to-air missile testing, drone targeting, hypersonic weapons testing and space launches.

Currently, oil and gas leasing in the Gulf is prohibited within distances ranging between 125 and 235 miles of the Florida coastline. However, that ban is set to expire in 2022.

Nelson supports a total ban on oil and gas exploration in the Gulf of Mexico, but noted that the 2022 expiration of the

current ban means "we've got some time" to work toward at least extending the moratorium to 2027.

Addressing another military-related issue, Nelson said he stands with the Air Force opposition to reopening Navarre Pass, which was closed by a hurricane in 1965, two months after it opened

to connect the Gulf of Mexico to the Santa Rosa Sound.

Supporters of re-dredging the pass argue that it could provide an economic boost to the Navarre area.

In other comments Friday, Nelson addressed President Trump's recent summit meeting with North Korean leader Kim Jong-un. Nelson said that Kim remains a threat to the world.

"He's got the nukes (nuclear warheads), he's got the missiles (to potentially deliver the warheads)," Nelson said. He conceded that the summit might be "a first step, albeit a shaky step," toward bringing North Korea into the community of nations.

Nelson rejected suggestions that the inspector general's report on the FBI's work during the last presidential election was an indictment of the entire FBI. The report was critical of former FBI director James Comey's conduct, Nelson said, but he added that the rest of the FBI is "dedicated to protecting this country."

Nelson went on to criticize the Trump administration's recent conduct toward long-time allies, saying, "I am quite concerned when we

condemn our best friends abroad."

Fielding questions on his re-election bid, Nelson pointed to polling in the race that has him relatively close to Scott, even as Scott's campaign spending has moved toward \$20 million, roughly five times the money spent on Nelson's re-election bid thus far. The Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee recently spent \$2.2 million on ads supporting Nelson, and the Senate Majority PAC put \$2 million into a statewide TV ad.

Meanwhile, RealClear-Politic's sampling of a variety of polls shows that Scott and Nelson have been within a few percentage points of each other for months, with a swing in recent weeks toward Scott.

With that as a backdrop, Nelson took aim at the recent decision by Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky., to keep the Senate in session through much of what would have been its regular August recess.

Asked if he thought McConnell's move was politically motivated, aimed at keeping candidates like himself out of their states in the run-up to the November election, Nelson said, "Of course it is."

The scam begins with the potential buyer saying a check will be mailed to the seller, sometimes for more than the asking price.

In this case, the buyer sent \$1,400 more than the original \$300 asking price.

The scam artist may give an excuse like citing

a secretarial error and ask for the seller to cash the check and wire the overpayment back.

Once this happens and the check turns out to be fake, the seller is out the money sent.

Here are some red flags on Craigslist scammers:

- A seller is marketing a household item and receives response from a buyer offering more than what it's worth.
- A seller lives a significant distance away and the item is not

- collectible.
- If it's too good to be

true, it probably is.

- You question the buyer and they respond in a 'nasty' manner.
- It's important to remember the scammer wants to be believable, so it may be difficult to detect in the language of the email.

Here are some tips to remember when placing an ad on Craigslist:

- Never put up personal information such as phone numbers, personal

addresses, or personal information in the ad. This is a good way for scammers to steal information and to use it against you.

- Never give out your phone number or street address to suspicious emails. A good rule of thumb is to have the person give you a contact number and call the person.
- Never give financial information to anyone requesting it online via Craigslist.

Always meet in person and deal in cash or use a secured form of payment such as PayPal so you don't have to reveal your credit information to the seller.

- When in doubt, take it down. If you feel like your ad is being hit by a scam artist, take the ad down and create a new one.
- If you suspect a scammer, report it to Craigslist immediately.

During his time in the service he was a supplier for the front lines and traveled overseas to Germany.

God saved Owens' life, he said, during the war. Owens went into the hospital for his gallbladder. He found out while he was admitted that the rest of his troop was killed in battle.

"If I had not been in the hospital then, I wouldn't have been here to tell this story now," Owens said. "God spared my life that day."

After his Army discharge, Owens took up various trades including working in a flea market business in Pea Ridge and working as a housing inspector for many years.

Owens also served for several years as a deacon for the Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church.

Owens said that during and after his time in the service, he saw racism first hand.

"I was standing on a bus and I was in uniform and there were two empty seats on either side of me, but I kept on standing the whole time," Owens said. "I just kept on standing. Because I knew what would happen if I sat down. I didn't want to want to take being beaten up."

Owens also spoke of an instance when he and a white co-worker were on lunch break and the co-worker refused to eat with him.

"I asked, 'Can't we eat together?' He said 'No thanks, I'd rather eat

alone.'"

Despite all this, Owens still feels strongly about his service to the nation.

"I am proud of my service," Owens said.

Owens has been married twice. His first wife Mary Ann passed away. Owens has been married to his second wife Rosa for 25 years.

Owens said his deep faith in God has carried him through his life. Owens has been close to death four times due to smoking and has since quit. He now suffers from lung cancer and COPD and relies on oxygen and has Regency Hospice that comes in to help take care of him. Despite this, Owens is still lively and joyful.

"God will provide," Owens said. "God will take care of me."

One thing Owens is not shy of is speaking about the gospel with anyone who is willing to listen. He loves to sit and talk about his life and how he has been blessed. He said he is not afraid of death and believes each person on Earth has a purpose. He also has some advice to share with people.

"Think before you speak," Owens said. "Because when it comes out you can't take it back."

On the wall in his home, Owens has a collage of pictures of his life with the quote that reads "Through the years, God has been good to me."

Owens said when he dies he wants the song "Down Through the Years the Lord Has Been Good to Me" to be played at his funeral.

"Because he has been good to me," Owens said.



will be the people that serve on the staff that volunteer. That is what we're here to celebrate."

People were invited to the groundbreaking and tour of the property to get a sense of what the finished product would look like. Refuge animal ambassadors such as Petunia, the Virginia opossum, and Landlord, the gopher tortoise, were on hand to greet people.

Parmelie McManamy has been a volunteer with the Emerald Coast Wildlife Refuge for six years. Like many supporters, she said she's looking forward to the new facility.

"(The current facility) is asphalt and no space," McManamy said. "This natural habitat will be so much better for the animals. They'll be away from the urban noise and fire trucks. It's less of a shock

# FWC asks continued support in fish survey

Participation in the Gulf Reef Fish Survey has led the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), for the first time ever, to be able to manage the harvest of recreational red snapper in both state and federal waters in the Gulf. Participants in the survey are helping improve fisheries management in Florida.

Since April 2015, recreational anglers who fish from private boats on the Gulf coast of Florida have been asked to sign up for the Gulf Reef Fish Survey. Signing up is required to legally harvest red and vermilion snappers; gag, black and red groupers; gray triggerfish; and amberjack species.

The purpose of the Gulf Reef Fish Survey is to provide timely and precise data to state and federal agencies that are responsible for managing reef fish and making decisions that impact recreational anglers in Florida. By signing up for the survey, anglers are eligible to receive a questionnaire in the mail about recent fishing activity. Each month, angler responses from the mail survey are used to estimate the numbers of recreational trips taken on the west coast of Florida to fish for Gulf reef fish species.

By working collaboratively with NOAA Fisheries, the Gulf Reef Fish Survey produces data that are complementary with the existing Marine Recreational Information Program. When information collected

from the two surveys is used together, estimates of landings are more precise, and this allows fishery managers to have greater confidence in our data. Later this year, the FWC will request NOAA Fisheries certify the Gulf Reef Fish Survey for use in regional stock assessments and fisheries management.

The Gulf Reef Fish

Survey is the primary data collection method for private recreational anglers to help improve recreational data collection for use in fisheries stock assessments and fisheries regulations. For red snapper, anglers can also use a smartphone/tablet app called iAngler Gulf Red Snapper to voluntarily log red snapper fishing trip data. Anglers

who report through the app are still asked to participate in the Gulf Reef Fish Survey if they receive a questionnaire in the mail or are interviewed by an FWC biologist at the dock. Participation in the survey, MRIP and the iAngler app is important for fisheries management.

fill out the questionnaire and return it to the marked address. Return the questionnaire even if you did not fish during the month of the survey. If an FWC biologist greets you at a boat ramp or marina, the interview takes just a few minutes of your time. By participating in an interview for the Gulf Reef Fish Survey, you are making an important contribution

to help conserve Florida's recreational fisheries.





— Too Busy for Mom, Atlanta



If you've been out in the hot sun this summer, your skin may have turned red or brown where the sun's rays touched it. Sunshine helps our bodies produce vitamin D, and experts say sunlight makes our moods happier.

But exposure to the sun's rays can also damage our skin and cause some health problems. This week, The Mini Page learns more about being safe in the sun.

### What is UV light?

Ultraviolet, or UV, radiation comes from the sun. Our eyes can't see this light, but these are the rays that can burn our skin when we're in the sun too long.

There are several types of UV radiation, but only UVA and UVB rays reach the surface of the Earth.

Have you ever heard someone announce the UV Index on the news or weather report? The index is a prediction of the intensity level of UV light in a certain region.

For example, if it's cloudy in your city today, the UV Index will be lower than in another town where the sun is shining.

The UV Index is a scale from 1 to 11+, where 1 represents a slight risk of too much exposure to the sun, and 11+ tells us that the risk is very high.



UV rays are partially filtered by the ozone layer, a protective layer of gas around the Earth.

### Skin and sun

Exposure to UV light is the biggest risk factor for skin cancer. But we can easily prevent damage to our skin from the sun and lower our chances of getting skin cancer.

Researchers believe that getting sunburns in childhood increases a person's risk of having skin cancer. So it's important to take care of your skin now and throughout your life.

### Staying safe

Even though we think of summer as the sunniest time of the year, the sun's rays strike us all year long. If you plan to be out in the sun for any length of time, use sunscreen.

People who need to be even more careful about sun exposure are those who have:

- pale skin
- blond, red or light brown hair
- a family member who has had skin cancer.

But skin protection is important for everyone. The Environmental Protection Agency advises people to:

- Wear clothing that covers the skin — long-sleeved shirts, pants and broad-brimmed hats.
- Reapply sunscreen at least every two hours.
- Wear sunglasses.



Limit time in the sun, especially between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

# Milton chooses new attorney

MILTON — The city of Milton officially has a new city attorney.

City Council held a special council meeting June 11 to hear from two law firms for their candidacy to replace Heather Lindsay who resigned June 4. At the June 12 city council meeting, city council voted to appoint Gulf Breeze resident Alex Andre as the new city attorney in a 3 to 5 vote with Councilwomen Pat Lunsford, Sharon Holley and Heather Hathaway casting the nay votes. Andre will officially become city attorney

following Lindsay's last day on July 31.

The two applicants for the position were Kimberly Kopp, managing attorney of Romano Kopp Law, and Andre, associate attorney with Moore, Hill & Westmoreland Law.

Kopp, who has 16 years of law practice and is a board-certified attorney by the Florida Bar, currently represents the city of Destin. Kopp lives in Oviedo, Florida, which is near Orlando.

"I have a thorough understanding of government laws," Kopp said.

Councilwoman Sharon Holley said she was impressed by Kopp's education and asked if she could commit to moving

to Santa Rosa County.

"I don't know if I could commit to a time limit but it is my ultimate goal,"

Kopp said. Kopp acknowledged there would be a schedule conflict with some meetings due to her work with the city of Destin but she has attorneys in her law firm that will be committed to attending the meetings in her stead.

A resident of Gulf Breeze, Andre has worked with the city of Milton on other occasions. He is a board-certified attorney based out of Pensacola. He also teaches as an adjunct with the University of West Florida.

Councilwoman Pat Lunsford asked Andre if he had ever had

any dealings with historic Milton or the preservation board. Andre said he had not. "My hope is I would serve as

# County looks to improve Navarre Beach

MILTON — A few new improvements are being added to Navarre Beach amenities.

At Monday's Santa Rosa County Commissioner meeting Monday, commissioners moved to approve implementing signage and brochures to promote the Navarre Beach Marine Sanctuary Snorkel Reef.

The improvements will be funded by a \$10,000 from the Coastal Partnership Initiative (CPI) program.

Matching funds will come from the county's Tourism Development tax reserves, a move that was approved by

the Tourism Development Council on May 3.

CPI is a program of Florida Department of Environmental Protection to promote the protection of effective management of Florida's coastal resources, according to the DEP website.

The Marine Sanctuary and artificial reef is located in the Navarre Beach Marine Park directly south of Sea Oat Pavilion.

The reef is located 100 yards offshore near lifeguard station No. 1.

The park is free to the public and open every day sunrise to sunset.

"As active divers on the artificial reefs, we know the importance and need to educate the public about the

unique ecosystems in our backyard," said Charlene Mauro, director of Navarre Beach Marine Science

Station.

Growing Santa Rosa Enterprises, which operates the Navarre Beach Fishing Pier,

spoke to the board at Monday's meeting about several approval requests including adding a temporary portable restrooms services until an ADA-compliant facility is available, installing new ice machine and adding a second gate on the pier north of the dune line.

The company also requested approval for a memorandum of understanding between Growing Santa Rosa Enterprises and True Blue Fishing Club to allow members to fish from the pier after normal operating hours.

Anglers in the club work alongside NOAA to do research on marine life.

Requests for approval were all moved to Thursday's meeting.
