## State seeks life for attempted murders

MILTON — A 22-year-old man arrested for stabbing his girlfriend and another victim has been found guilty, according to a press release from the State Attorney's office.

A Santa Rosa County jury found Jevon Marquise Lamar Husfelt guilty Friday of two counts of attempted first-degree premeditated murder with a weapon.

According to previous Daily News articles, Santa Rosa County Sheriff's Office deputies were dispatched to a home on Kabel Drive in

Milton around 5:15 p.m. Nov. 9, 2017, in reference to a possible stabbing. When deputies arrived they found Husfelt's girlfriend with stab wounds covered in blood. Another victim still had the knife still lodged in his head. There were blood spatters throughout the room, including on a bed with a methamphetamine pipe on it, according to the arrest report.

According to State Assistant Attorney Amber Rowland who prosecuted the

case, the girlfriend survived because the second victim came through a door as Husfelt was attacking her. That's when he stabbed the second victim and fled, according to reports.

"The testimony was," Rowland said, "(Husfelt) stabbed her 12 times. She had one collapsed lung that required serious medical intervention."

Both victims were transported to Sacred Heart Hospital. The two have recovered from their injuries, according to Rowland.

Husfelt fled on foot and was later detained about a mile

away. When he was questioned by SRSO, he denied stabbing either victim.

Husfelt will be sentenced on July 24 by Circuit Court Judge John Simon. He faces a maximum sentence of life in state prison, which the state will pursue. If not for the girlfriend's father coming in, Rowland said she believes Husfelt would have killed her.

"We're seeking a life sentence for sure. (The girlfriend) would not have made it had she not had medical intervention," Rowland said. "We feel he's a danger to the community, (but) I don't know what the judge will do."





#### Pace Library community center proposed

PACE — Residents of Pace could be getting a community center in the near future thanks to the Friends of the Pace Library.



Tom Twarkins, a representative of the Friends of the Pace Library private nonprofit, approached the Santa Rosa County Local Option Sales Tax committee at the June 19 meeting to ask for the community center addition to the library. According to Twarkins, 40 percent of Santa Rosa's population lives between Avalon Boulevard, Escambia River and Berryhill Road.

He says that the number of citizens will be drastically increasing in this area with in the next few years. "These people need public services," Twarkins said.

"And one of those services is a community center. There is no community center in this area. There is no place for assembly," Twarkins said that not all recreation includes a ball and bat.

"A lot of these people use the library and community groups and assembly as their recreation and they need a place."

Pace Library was conceived in 2005 and originally included a community center in the design.

However, after the devastation of Hurricane Ivan to Santa Rosa County that same year, plans were put on hold for the community center.

Twarkins said the land exists for the center and there is public demand for it.

### Milton High student to play in national symphony

MILTON — Milton High School junior Adeline Belova has made the 2018 National Symphony Association for Music Education All Nation Honor Band Symphony Orchestra. Belova will be one of only a select number of students who will represent the state of Florida in this national orchestra, which will perform in Walt Disney World in Orlando this November.

Belova currently plays in the Milton High School Mighty Black and Gold Marching Band serving as the head drum major as well as a featured soloist in the Milton High jazz band where she plays first alto saxophone. Belova has played in bands and orchestra since middle school and has performed in All-County, All-State, United States Nationals and

Troy competitions. Belova's father Manuel Valdez recalls when she was younger and was auditioning for her first all county band. "When she went to try out for all county she had a lot of doubts," Valdez said. "I told her that if she tried out I would buy her a piano and her eyes lit up. She tried out and now she has a piano."

Michael Schultz, assistant band director at Milton High, praised Belova for her achievement and dedication. "From the moment I heard Adeline play her first note for her chair audition for the Milton High School Band in the summer of 2016, I knew that she was something special," Schultz said.

"Adeline consistently pushes herself to go above and beyond with everything she does, both in the Milton Band and in Milton High School in general. Making potentially first chair in the All-National Symphony Orchestra is a resounding example of this."

## Two Milton nonprofits win \$25,000 grants

PENSACOLA — Two Milton nonprofits were among four in the Pensacola Bay area awarded \$25,000 each in grant awards from Sunday's Child, a Pensacola Bay Area nonprofit that promotes LGBT acceptance and inclusion in Northwest Florida.

The awards were announced after a live vote at the Pensacola philanthropic organization's fourth annual membership meeting held Sunday at the Pensacola Improv Center in Pensacola's Brownsville neighborhood.

The organizations that are recipients of \$25,000 each are Capstone Adaptive Learning and Therapy Centers, Feeding the Gulf Coast, OASIS Florida and the Pensacola Little Theatre.

"We are thrilled to

award \$100,000 this year to such deeply deserving organizations," Sunday's Child president Drew Buchanan said. "Sunday's Child has grown to record membership with 2018 being our most successful year yet. With this collective award of \$100,000, we've proved just how much the citizens of the Pensacola Bay Area care about diversity in their communities."

Launched in 2014, Sunday's Child is made up of members that donate funds annually. 100 percent of funds donated go towards grant awards, which members determine by voting in June. The group places an emphasis on grants to nonprofit organizations and initiatives that place value on diversity, inclusion, and equality in the Pensacola Bay Area of Escambia and Santa Rosa

counties. The four grants will go directly to the nonprofit recipients, funding a broad range of projects and activities:

- Feeding the Gulf Coast, Inc., founded and incorporated in 1981, will install a modern 12-by-40 outdoor produce cooler at its warehouse in Milton. The cooler will expand their produce storage capacity, allowing it to store an additional 20 pallets of fresh produce each week. With the addition of the produce cooler, Feeding the Gulf Coast estimates it will be able to increase the amount of fresh produce provided to its agencies in the Florida panhandle by at least 15 percent and distribute an additional 318,000 pounds—approximately 265,000 meals—of fresh produce to more than 6,000 individuals.
- Capstone Adaptive

Learning and Therapy Centers, Inc. will benefit through the establishment of the Capstone "Pet Barkery" Program, which will augment the existing employment and education training program at the Pet Place retail store in Milton. Funds will be used to purchase equipment to outfit the bakery including oven, hood, dishwasher, appliances, curriculum, and training materials. Students who work there will learn skills such as ordering supplies, baking, packaging, selling and marketing items and increasing their chances of later becoming gainfully employed. The "Pet Barkery" will bake homemade pet treats for sale at local farmers' markets, festivals, businesses and the new Pet Place pet supply store.

- OASIS Florida, which provides testing,

prevention, case management and other types of care and support for people living with HIV, will hire more staff members for their new Mobile Outreach Unit program and vehicle that serves Northwest Florida. It is anticipated that the increased testing numbers will provide the basis for additional state funding which will sustain the Mobile Outreach Program.

The Pensacola Little Theatre has been serving the Pensacola Bay Area continuously since 1936 making it the oldest continually operating community theatre in the southeastern United States. The grant award will benefit the PLT by allowing them to purchase the equipment necessary to present HD-quality films at PLT at a level a patron would expect at a modern movie theater. It will also provide an opportunity for Pensacola's LGBT film festival, Stamped, to grow and impact the community with their message. The funds will be used for the purchase and installation

of a theater-quality projector and screen.

"Through their dedication to inclusion and embracement of diversity, each of these organizations is sending a clear message to all of our LGBT citizens: your voices matter and your experiences count," Buchanan said. "After awarding more than \$330,000 since 2014, we continue to prove that the Pensacola Bay Area can lead the way to greater inclusion and acceptance of the LGBT community."

Funding for the Sunday's Child charitable grants comes from \$1,000 contributions from individual and ensemble group memberships. Sunday's Child has grown to more than 175 members since its founding and with this year's awards, the organization will have awarded more than \$330,000 to Pensacola Bay Area nonprofits since 2015.



## Canada: Lynchpin ally may reject U.S.

Canada has not yet announced building a wall on the nation's southern border, but at this point, such a step would not be surprising. Relations between the two nations have been deteriorating rapidly.

In hindsight, signs of trouble appeared at the start of the current administration in Washington. President Donald Trump ignored the tradition of visiting Canada early and instead went to Saudi Arabia.

Saudi Arabia is currently pursuing a controversial and undeniably bloody intervention in Yemen. The Saudi government today pursues reform but remains relatively repressive.

In stark contrast, President Barack Obama, respecting tradition, made Canada his first foreign destination. On February 19, 2009, he and Prime Minister Stephen Harper met and found common environmental ground. They avoided open clash on the "Buy American" provision of the U.S. economic stimulus plan.

President John F. Kennedy eloquently summed up the relationship in an address to the Parliament of Canada in early 1961, noting, "Geography has made us neighbors, history has made us friends, economics has made us partners, and necessity has made us allies." Kennedy's national security adviser McGeorge Bundy said that the British represent "Someone to talk to" and the same has been true of Canadians.

Regional trade agreements further strengthen Canada-U.S. ties. The 1994 NAFTA agreement, now under attack, lowered trade barriers between Mexico and the rest of North America. An essential predecessor was the Canada-U.S. Free Trade Agreement of 1988, in turn facilitated by the successful Uruguay Round of multilateral trade negotiations.

Canada's government professionals traditionally foster cooperation with Britain and the U.S. on military security and wider diplomatic as well as economic matters, and are numerous among the professionals who staff the United Nations, NATO and the other substantial and influential intergovernmental organizations.

Such cooperation in promotion of international community has deep roots reaching back to the earliest phase of World War II. During that desperate time, U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt and British Prime Minister Winston Churchill met for their first summit on naval warships off the coast of Newfoundland, Canada. The meeting occurred in August 1941, several months before the attack on Pearl Harbor brought America directly into the war.

The principal result was the Atlantic Charter, a dramatic declaration of Allied strategy and goals, including the postwar period. Reflecting extraordinary determination and optimism during the bleakest phase of the global struggle, FDR and Churchill explicitly proposed the United Nations. Throughout the war, a series of conferences took place to hammer out the details of the new world organization.

Very nationalistic Canadian Prime Minister John Diefenbaker clashed with JFK. At the end of the 1961 presidential visit, Bundy accidentally left behind a briefing memo on which the president had scrawled a note asking his aide how to deal with the "SOB."

Diefenbaker's staff delivered the memo to him. He promptly flew into a rage and threatened to involve the press.

Kennedy pleaded poor penmanship and said he actually had written "OAS", the Organization of American States. At a press conference, the president pointedly praised Bundy.

# Study: Existing drug preserves insulin production in new Type 1 diabetes cases

GAINESVILLE — A drug used to help kidney transplant recipients ward off rejection of their new organs is showing promise in another area: preserving insulin production in newly diagnosed Type 1 diabetes patients.

A TrialNet study led by University of Florida Health researchers sought to determine whether the drug thymoglobulin, alone or in combination with another drug, could slow insulin loss. Clinical trial participants given a low dose of the medication, also known as ATG, had higher levels of insulin production compared with the placebo recipients, the research revealed. The drug also reduced significantly reduced hemoglobin A1c levels, a long-term measure of average blood sugar levels, in participants with new-onset Type 1 diabetes.

"It gives us hope that we really are on the right path to preventing and reversing Type 1 diabetes," said Michael Haller, M.D., a UF Diabetes Institute researcher and the study's lead author. "We still have a long way to go but this is a remarkable success that we should celebrate. These findings remind us and our patients that we are indeed making progress."

The findings by the TrialNet research consortium of 14 universities and research institutions were presented today (June 25) at the American Diabetes Association Scientific Sessions in Orlando.

TrialNet enrolled 89 people between ages 12 and 45 who were diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes in the past 100 days. Some study participants received ATG, while others were given a placebo or ATG combined with another drug. A year later, insulin production

had increased in those given low-dose ATG.

In Type 1 diabetes, the body's immune system attacks insulin-producing islet cells in the pancreas. The pancreas produces insulin to control the level of sugar in the blood. Elevated and uncontrolled blood sugar levels can lead to a variety of complications and, if left untreated, result in death.

Essentially, ATG works by killing immune cells that have "gone rogue." It targets white blood cells that attack and kill insulin-producing beta cells instead of attacking viruses or bacteria that invade the body. Low-dose ATG appears to target these "rogue" cells without disrupting other types of beneficial white blood cells, Haller said.

ATG's long history of FDA approval for use in kidney transplantation is particularly encouraging because that could accelerate its potential approval as a Type 1 diabetes drug should ongoing studies show promise, Haller noted.

"We are excited about these important findings and the potential to conduct additional studies to test ATG even earlier in the disease process, prior to symptoms and clinical diagnosis, as well as later in the disease process for

patients with more established Type 1 diabetes," he said.

The findings resulted from years of research that started in animal models and progressed to humans. While it's not a way to permanently cure or prevent the onset of Type 1 diabetes, Haller said it's an important milestone that underscores the need for more research funding.

All participants in the trial will complete two years of study follow-up by August. Final findings will be reported in 2019.

Low-dose ATG carries some side effects, although researchers deemed them predictable and manageable. Typically, they include a few minutes of muscle soreness, nausea or headache during the intravenous infusion, and two-thirds of patients receiving low-dose ATG experienced two to three days of flu-like symptoms about a week later.

The ultimate duration of ATG's effectiveness isn't yet known, but Haller said it may be possible to prevent additional insulin loss by re-treating patients with the drug or other interventions. Haller said he would also like to study the drug's potential for preventing diabetes in those who have biological markers that precede Type 1 diabetes.





## SWAT students advocate for tobacco free 4th of July celebration

JAY – SWAT students representing the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County are wasting no time making this an active year in tobacco free advocacy. Newly appointed county SWAT officers, Jake Benton and Avri Anderson, both from Milton High School, joined County SWAT Coordinator, Matthew Dobson, and met with the Jay City Council on Monday, June 18th in Jay.

"We requested to be added to the town's meeting agenda and they obliged," said Dobson.

The students made a short presentation about the harmful and ill-effects of tobacco use and asked if the town council would designate the Jay Celebrate Freedom 5K event on July 4th as a tobacco free event. After some open discussion the town council unanimously decided to proclaim all planned events in the park on July 4th as tobacco free.

"It was a win for the tobacco free Florida initiative and we are very pleased," said Dobson.

County SWAT student chairperson Jake Benton said, "SWAT stands for Students Working Against Tobacco. We are a united movement of Florida empowered youth working toward a tobacco free future."

In November 2006, Florida voters overwhelmingly approved a state constitutional amendment, Article X, Section 27, that called for establishing a comprehensive tobacco education and use prevention program using a percentage of the state's tobacco settlement fund. As a result, Tobacco Free Florida launched in 2007. TFF is administered through the Florida Department of Health's Bureau of Tobacco Free Florida and funded by money derived from the state's tobacco settlement agreement with the major tobacco companies in 1997. These tobacco lawsuits were intended to punish cigarette makers for decades of fraud and racketeering and to help states pay for the Medicaid and other public health expenses to cover sick smokers. Florida was among three other states – Texas, Mississippi and Minnesota – that settled with the tobacco industry before the Master Settlement Agreement of 1998 between the other 46 states, Washington, D.C., Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Resources, tobacco use remains the leading cause of preventable death and disease and if current smoking rates continue, 270,000

Florida children alive today who are younger than 18 years of age will die prematurely because of smoking. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that changing behaviors related to tobacco is critical in Florida, where each year about 32,300 adults die from smoking. The CDC also adds that smoking costs the state \$8.6 billion in medical costs annually.

A mandate of the constitutional amendment is that the TFF program follows the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Best Practices for Comprehensive Tobacco Control Programs.

This guide helps states plan and establish evidence-based comprehensive, sustained, and accountable tobacco control programs to prevent and reduce tobacco use. Following these principles, TFF reaches millions of Floridians through hard-hitting media campaigns, public relations, social media, evidence-based tobacco cessation services, grassroots initiatives, county-level grants that advance tobacco-free policies, a youth-led movement called Students Working Against Tobacco, school-based interventions, and surveillance and evaluation to ensure effectiveness.







### Tripletail


- The minimum size limit will increase to 18 inches total length.

## Planting flowers for beginners

Are you trying your hand at flower gardening for the first time this year? Lucky you. You're about to embark on an exciting adventure. There's nothing quite like helping to bring lovely flowers out of the bare soil, or nurturing spindly seedlings to full, luscious life. Here's a

### Flower gardening must-haves

- A place to plant, such as flower beds or containers.
- Flower seeds or seedlings.
- "Diggers": A sturdy stainless steel hand trowel is a must. Add

a shovel for large-scale flower gardening.

- Sharp shears for pruning plants – and cutting a bunch of beautiful blossoms to decorate your home.
- A garden hose or a watering can with sprinkler head.
- A flower garden journal (more about this later).

### Choose seeds or seedlings

Start with easy flower species like pansies or geraniums. Look for varieties that will thrive in both your local USDA Plant Hardiness Zone and your particular yard. Buying ready-to-plant seedlings from a nursery is great for impatient gardeners – like kids or kids-at-heart – who want to see beautiful blooms right away. If you prefer the old-fashioned way, try sowing with heirloom seeds. These are open-pollinated traditional seed varieties, which tend to require less care in terms of water and fertilizer than modern hybridized types.

### Where to plant

Your yard may already have beds laid out. If not, choose a sunny, well-drained corner, with easy access to a source of water. Be sure to position flower patches where their sight and scent will enhance your outdoor enjoyment (perhaps adjacent to your backyard patio) and may even attract birds and honeybees to the landscape. Container gardening has become uber popular these days ... and with good reason. Strategically placed raised beds, window boxes, or planter pots allow you easily to optimize growing conditions. Because there's limited bending involved, they also minimize strain on your back and knees.

### How to water

No need to install a landscape irrigation system just yet. As a beginner, you can water your new flower patch using a hose with a removable sprayer head. For a container garden, a watering can will be just perfect, not to mention fun. A good rule of thumb is to water flowering plants infrequently – once or twice a week is usually enough – but deeply, so that the water will reach right down into the soil to nourish the roots. Avoid wetting the leaves or watering only one side (which tends to encourage uneven root growth).

### Care and feeding of flowering plants

Nourish your flowers with organic fertilizer or compost matched to your garden soil, especially during periods of active growth. When the posies are past their prime, they should be deadheaded. No, we're not making musical recommendations here but rather, talking about pinching or clipping off withered blossoms. This is not just for good looks, but also to direct the plant's energies away from developing seeds and into making more flowers. Woody plants, such as roses, will benefit from an occasional pruning of their stems; best times are early spring or after blooming season.

### Keep a garden journal

Make the most of your first flower gardening experience. Keep a journal in writing or online to document your garden journey. List any or all of the following:

- the flower varieties you tried
- the weather in your area this year
- how much and how often you watered
- whether you added fertilizer or compost
- which tools you used
- what succeeded; what not so much
- what surprised you
- what you'll need to know for next year
- how you felt about the whole enterprise.

# Online tool provides exemption estimates

The owners of certain homesteaded properties in Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Walton and most other Florida counties can go online to find out whether they would benefit from a possible third Florida homestead exemption.

In the Nov. 6 general election, voters statewide will be asked whether to approve a proposal that would amend Florida's Constitution and provide for a third \$25,000 exemption.

If the proposed Amendment 1 is approved by at least 60 percent of the voters, the new exemption would take effect Jan. 1, 2019. It would apply to homesteaded properties with an assessed value between \$100,000 and \$125,000.

That portion of a home's value would be exempt from all property taxes other than public school taxes, and the current maximum exemption of \$50,000 would be increased to \$75,000.

In that scenario, the owner of a \$125,000 home would only pay taxes on \$50,000 of its valuation.

Busbee recently had a "third homestead estimator" link added to the homepage of the county Property Appraiser's website at okaloosapa.com. The estimator also is on the homepage of the Walton County Property Appraiser's website at

waltonpa.com. The estimators on both of those sites include estimates for properties in most Florida counties, including Santa Rosa County.

With this online tool, property owners simply enter their address to

see if they would benefit from the third possible exemption.

The estimator uses 2017 values and therefore provides only an estimate, according to Busbee.

Currently, the state Constitution provides for an exemption on the

portion of home values between \$1 and \$25,000 and \$50,000 and \$75,000.

If Amendment 1 is approved, the average homeowner would receive an estimated \$240 tax break, but municipal and county governments statewide would lose

more than \$730 million during the first year, according to the Florida Association of Counties.

Busbee gave a presentation on the third homestead estimator to the Okaloosa County Commission earlier this year. After the presentation, Commissioner Nathan Boyles said the county would take a "several million-dollar budget hit" if voters approve the third exemption.

"There will be no equivalent reduction in the services to be provided," Boyles said. "We'll still be looking at the equivalent costs (of services such as stormwater services and Sheriff's Office protection).

The result will be a transfer of that cost from the citizens who will receive a benefit from the homestead exemption to those who don't."

In response to a question from Commission Chairman Graham Fountain, Busbee said there are about 43,000 homesteaded parcels in Okaloosa County.

"About 30 percent (or about 13,000) of those will not see any effect from this (proposed third) homestead exemption, he said.

# Should I buy a home with a standing water problem?

Reader Question: The house I am buying has a sump pump because of a standing water problem. I have looked at the home three times and each time I saw standing water in the next door neighbor's yard. They had dug a long trench which runs along the side of their house facing my house. The channel is about 6 inches deep. I can deal with my standing water issue, but I fear the neighbor's water trench will attract mosquitoes, rats, and more. I have already signed a contract. What are my options?

Monty's Answer: There are many questions about your situation to explore before deciding on a solution. The neighbor's problem may be one where you can do little or nothing. Here is an article at <http://bit.ly/2LCy4i6> about water issues with neighbors from a homeowner to provide you with additional information. You seem confident that you can manage your water situation, but if the neighbor is not cooperative, or the cause of the water's presence goes beyond your neighbor, it may be in your best interest to investigate further before you take the title.

**Water, water, everywhere**  
According to a large insurance company that insures home inspectors, water intrusion and water damage contribute to the two most common claims against home inspectors.

Many property insurance companies have water at or near the top of their claims list for frequency, but not severity. Geographical location plays a role in water issues and they can be elusive. For example, there will be water in one basement, and the next door neighbor's basement is completely dry.

### Some questions to consider

- Do you have a "out" from the contract? Could you walk away without a penalty?
- Do you have a survey from a licensed land surveyor that identifies the exact location of the boundary between your home and the neighbor that includes the location of the trench? It is important to ascertain that the trench does not encroach on the property.
- Does the neighbor have a sump pump?
- You state you can deal with your standing water issue. Is it because you have a sump pump?
- Where is your sump pump located, and where does the drain exit your lot?
- What have you been told about the standing water? Who has transferred this information to you? The seller? The seller's real estate agent? Your real estate agent?
- Were you furnished with a Seller Disclosure Report (sample at <http://bit.ly/2kXxyjc>)? What does it say about water?
- When did the neighbor dig the trench? If they filled the trench,

would the water then migrate into your yard? Understanding the topography would be helpful in answering this question.

- Do the homes in the area contain basements or are they built on shallow footings?
- Do all the homes in the area have a standing water problem?

### A chronic issue?

If remedies are costly or non-existent standing water can affect the home's value. Here are some suggestions to determine this:

- Go to the county or city website to the GIS link (example at <http://bit.ly/2HCOMVt>). The GIS maps have layers the user can click on that identify certain property conditions. Topography, wetlands, floodplains, boundaries, aerial photos that may identify the location of the trench to the lot line (GIS maps disclaim accuracy). Small towns and rural townships likely have this information on the county GIS maps.
- Contact a few of the neighbors to see what they may know about mosquitoes, vermin, flooding, etcetera, particularly near the home you are buying.
- If alarm bells go off, contact the municipality's Public Works Department. Speak with an engineer that is familiar with the neighborhood. Does the city answer unusually high call volume about high water or other water-related issues in the area?





## Meet a Supreme Justice

On Aug. 30, 1967, Thurgood Marshall took a historic oath. He became the first African-American appointed as an associate justice to the Supreme Court of the United States.

This week, The Mini Page honors Marshall's 110th birthday by telling the story of a little boy born in Baltimore who made his way to the highest court in the country.

### An interest in law

Thoroughgood Marshall was the second son of a kindergarten teacher and a steward, or headwaiter, at a club. His father's father was an escaped slave who ran a grocery store in Baltimore.

Born on July 2, 1908, Thoroughgood got tired of his long name as a child and changed it to Thurgood. He convinced his mother to change the name on his birth certificate. He had already started winning arguments!

When Thurgood's father wasn't working, he would take his boys to the courthouse to watch trials and arguments. Afterward, they would debate the cases and try to come up with better arguments.

### Segregated schools

Thurgood grew up in a neighborhood with both white and black people, but he had to attend a segregated, or all-black, elementary school. Biographers say he was not a good student, and sometimes his eyes would wander to the police station next door to the school.

He noticed that the black prisoners were beaten more than the whites. He felt that the

unfair treatment was wrong, and he started to think about becoming a lawyer.

When Thurgood got into trouble at school, teachers would make him read the Constitution of the United States. By the time he graduated, he knew it by heart.

### A law degree

In college at Lincoln University in Pennsylvania, Thurgood started paying more attention to his studies. He wanted to go to law school at the University of Maryland, but it did not accept African-American students.

Instead, Marshall went to Howard University Law School in Washington, D.C. When he had time, he would go to the Supreme Court and watch lawyers argue cases before the justices.

After graduating from law school, Marshall and his former professor, Charles Houston, defended a black man who sued the University of Maryland over its discrimination against African-Americans. They won, and the school was forced to integrate, or accept all races, in 1935.

Marshall continued his career and argued many cases, concentrating most on integrating schools. He worked with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

## Brown v. Board of Ed.

One of Thurgood Marshall's most famous

cases was Brown v. the Board of Education of Topeka (Kansas). In 1954,

Rev. Oliver Brown, an African-American, wanted his daughter to go to the school closest to their home, but it was a white school. Thirteen other families joined the lawsuit, and the case made it to the Supreme Court.

Thurgood Marshall argued the case, and the justices ruled unanimously (all in agreement) to end school segregation. Marshall became famous.

### Serving his country

President John F. Kennedy offered Marshall a new job in 1961: a federal judgeship on the U.S. Second Circuit Court of Appeals in New York City. In 1965, President Lyndon Johnson asked him to be solicitor general, or the government's lawyer in cases before the Supreme Court.

Finally, in 1967, Johnson appointed Marshall to the Supreme Court. He served for 24 years, and he continued working for civil rights for all Americans.

## 'God spared my life,' local says

97-year-old Milton resident talks service, racism, faith

MILTON — Milton Owens has been around a while. At 97 years old, he has a rare perspective as an African-American growing up in the south and serving in the military during one of the most memorable wars in history.

Owens' memory may not be what it was, but he does remember being a Christian since he was 9 years old. One of his earliest memories was building his own make-believe church and preaching.

"I built this church," Owens said. "My friends were the parishioners and I was the pastor."

During World War II, Owens was recruited to the United States Army when he was 21.

He served for two and a half years until being discharged in 1945 after gallbladder surgery.

During his time in the service he was a supplier for the front lines and traveled overseas to Germany.

God saved Owens' life, he said, during the war. Owens went into the hospital for his gallbladder.

He found out while he was admitted that the rest of his troop was killed in battle.

"If I had not been in the hospital then, I wouldn't have

been here to tell this story now," Owens said.

"God spared my life that day."

After his Army discharge, Owens took up various trades including working in a flea market business in Pea Ridge and working as a housing inspector for many years.

Owens also served for several years as a deacon for the Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church.

Owens said that during and after his time in the service, he saw racism first hand.

"I was standing on a bus and I was in uniform and there were two empty seats on either side of me, but I kept on standing the whole time," Owens said.

"I just kept on standing. Because I knew what would happen if I sat down. I didn't want to want to take being beaten up."

Owens also spoke of an instance when he and a white co-worker were on lunch break and the co-worker refused to eat with him.

"I asked, 'Can't we eat together?' He said 'No thanks, I'd rather eat alone.'"

Despite all this, Owens still feels strongly about his service to the nation.

"I am proud of my service," Owens said. Owens has been married

twice. His first wife Mary Ann passed away.

Owens has been married to his second wife Rosa for 25 years.

Owens said his deep faith in God has carried him through his life.

Owens has been close to death four times due to smoking and has since quit. He now suffers from lung cancer and COPD and relies on oxygen and has Regency Hospice that comes in to help take care of him. Despite this, Owens is still lively and joyful.

"God will provide," Owens said. "God will take care of me."

One thing Owens is not shy of is speaking about the gospel with anyone who is willing to listen. He loves to sit and talk about his life and how he has been blessed. He said he is not afraid of death and believes each person on Earth has a purpose. He also has some advice to share with people.

"Think before you speak," Owens said. "Because when it comes out you can't take it back."

On the wall in his home, Owens has a collage of pictures of his life with the quote that reads "Through the years, God has been good to me."

Owens said when he dies he wants the song "Down Through the Years the Lord Has Been Good to Me" to be played at his funeral.

"Because he has been good to me," Owens said.

## Milton resident avoids potential Craigslist scam

MILTON — Selling something on Craigslist? Milton resident Kim Sumner says an overpayment could be a scam.

Sumner was trying to sell a treadmill for \$300. She placed it on Craigslist and received an email from a user saying he would pay full price and would send a truck June 6 to pick it up.

"I was thrilled," Sumner said. "I thought he was valid."

Sumner said she received an email from the same person asking for her address and then another one asking for her to text him. Sumner sold the treadmill that person offered her cash in person. Sumner sent

an email to the original user saying it had been sold. That's when things began to get suspicious. On June 16, Sumner received a priority envelope in the mail with no paperwork except a check for \$1,730.00 dollars stating nothing but "Re" plus the name of the Craigslist

user who initially offered to buy the treadmill. Sumner had been expecting a check for one of her investments and it wasn't until she noticed the name on the check that something stood out to her as being odd.

Through research, she discovered that it could be a scam and notified the local police.

"I called the police department in Milton and they advised me to shred the check," Sumner said.

Captain Mike Cline, Milton Police Department said the particular scam referenced happens a lot. The scam begins with the potential buyer saying a check will be mailed to the seller, sometimes for more than the asking price.

In this case, the buyer sent \$1,400 more than the original \$300 asking price. The scam artist may give an excuse like citing a secretarial error and ask for the seller to cash the check and wire the overpayment back.

Once this happens and the check turns out to be fake, the seller is out the money sent.

Here are some red flags on

Craigslist scammers:

- A seller is marketing a household item and receives response from a buyer offering more than what it's worth.
- A seller lives a significant distance away and the item is not collectible.
- If it's too good to be true, it probably is.
- You question the buyer and they respond in a 'nasty' manner.
- It's important to remember the scammer wants to be believable, so it may be difficult to detect in the language of the email.

Here are some tips to remember when placing an ad on Craigslist:

- Never put up personal information such as phone numbers, personal addresses, or personal information in the ad. This is a

good way for scammers to steal information and to use it against you.

- Never give out your phone number or street address to suspicious emails. A good rule of thumb is to have the person give you a contact number and call the person.
- Never give financial information to anyone requesting it online via Craigslist. Always meet in person and deal in cash or use a secured form of payment such as PayPal so you don't have to reveal your credit information to the seller.
- When in doubt, take it down. If you feel like your ad is being hit by a scam artist, take the ad down and create a new one.
- If you suspect a scammer, report it to Craigslist immediately.
