## Red and white were the colors du jour

Main Street was a sea of red and white Friday afternoon as the city turned out for Crestview High School's annual Homecoming festivities.

With all schools in the city letting out early so kids could attend the parade, the Crestview Police Department estimated that about 1,000 Bulldog

fans lined the street, with more choosing to cheer from the shady west side of the street on the sweltering late-summer day.

Dawn Garcia picked a prime spot, sitting under her umbrella in a folding chair on the corner of Courthouse Terrace and Main Street by 2 p.m. so as not to miss seeing her daughter Alyssa march by. The freshman is in her first year on the Crestview High School Band's color guard.

"This umbrella needs to be a lot bigger," Garcia lamented, trying to ward off the scorching sun.

Down the street, Karen Lusk, whose son Kody, a senior, was marching — make that dancing — in the parade with the high school's ballroom dance club, found the perfect combo: a bench shaded by one of Main Street's crape myrtles.

## CHS retains title as Okaloosa's largest school

1,911 Bulldogs registered

With the school year well under way, Crestview High School has retained its title as the most populated school in Okaloosa County, even though its enrollment has dropped by 18 students since the start of the school year. On Aug. 10, there were 1,929 Bulldogs registered. As

of Wednesday, that number had dipped to 1,911.

Now into the second month of the school year, the county's former largest school, Niceville High School, is down to 1,890 students from the 1,897 who attended on Aug. 10. Fort Walton Beach High School is up one student since the start of school, to 1,834 students, and Choctawhatchee High School is down to 1,651 from the 1,673 students it had when school began.

Crestview High Principal Ed Coleman pointed out that all local schools are experiencing declines in enrollment, though his school's decline is slower than those to the south. "We're all in a declining enrollment," Coleman said. "Some schools in the south end are in a more rapid decline."

For example, two years ago, his school enrolled 1,952 students, compared with Niceville's 2,082 and Fort Walton Beach's 1,905.

Last year those numbers fell to 1,914, 1,952 and 1,878, respectively.

While final enrollment figures won't be in until next month, any increase will not hurt Crestview High's ability to educate its students, Coleman assured. The building's capacity is more than 2,300 students, he said.

"So we're nowhere near full in our ability to service the community with the hometown high school," Coleman said.

## Business leaders urging 'No on 4'

Amendment would stymie growth, hamstringing local government, some say

For those who think Florida's proposed constitutional Amendment 4 is a great idea, local business leaders recommend they look to the small community of St. Pete Beach in Pinellas County. In 2006, the town's voters passed a local version of the proposed amendment.

"Since the measure was passed, the residents of St. Pete Beach have endured endless lawsuits and seen little progress," said Ward Friszolowski, then the town's mayor. "In St. Pete Beach, any proposed change to our town's comprehensive plan is thrust onto the ballot. Public planning has been replaced with political infighting, and a parade of unintended consequences has ensued."

In fact, Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce Government Affairs Committee Chairman Cal Zethmayr said, the taxpayers of St. Pete Beach have spent more than \$500,000 dollars just on

"Establishes that before a local government may adopt a new comprehensive land use plan, or amend a comprehensive land use plan, the proposed plan or amendment shall be subject to vote of the electors of the local government by referendum, following preparation by the local planning agency, consideration by the governing body and notice. Provides definitions."



litigation following the citizen referendum.

Zethmayr's committee addressed the chamber's opposition to the amendment at its monthly meeting Sept. 8. Noting the attendance by just seven Crestview business and community leaders, he commented, "I have a suspicion the small turnout is indicative of the small amount of interest that results in some of these amendments making it into the constitution."

In other words, he said, "feel-good" amendments, more easily put on the ballot in Florida than in most other states, appeal to voters' emotions, resulting in initiatives such as the class-size amendment, the "pregnant pig" and a high-speed train that would serve only two communities in South Florida all being enshrined in the state constitution.

"Someone once told me the safest thing you can do with amendments is to

vote 'no' on them and make the Legislature go back to work and do its job," Zethmayr said.

A proponent of Amendment 4, Florida Hometown Democracy, is a New Smyrna Beach-based political

action committee headed by Lesley Blackner, a Palm Beach environmental trial lawyer, according to the St. Petersburg Times. She has poured more than \$800,000 of her own money into the effort.

According to the group's website, most of its supporters are environmentalist, anti-growth and community citizen groups, including the National Audubon Society and the Sierra Club, for which Blackner is an attorney.

"Mismanaged growth destroys communities," said Blackner, quoted on BallotPedia.org. She and her supporters say Amendment 4 will add "another layer of protection against unwanted developments."

Opposing the amendment is Citizens for Lower Taxes and a Stronger Economy, a coalition composed primarily of business, civic and labor groups, and statewide chambers of commerce. Its executive director, Ryan Houck, called the amendment "a stimulus package for special interest lawyers."

Quoted on BallotPedia, Houck said, "Amendment 4 is not designed to empower

voters; it's designed to empower special interest lawyers, and hand taxpayers the bill."

Critics said the amendment, if passed, would hamper development or drive it away.

"Anything that is a land-use change" would be subject to public vote, Zethmayr explained. Communities such as Crestview would have to hold a referendum on each tweak of its comprehensive plan, be it a zoning change, creating an access road or simply installing another traffic signal.

"That process takes way too long already," said Robyn Helt, a real estate agent with Brooks and Brooks Realty. "We have developers who want to come in and do projects and get so wrapped up in the red tape."

"On average, Florida plans undergo around 10,000 changes each year,"

said the Citizens for Lower Taxes Group. "Most of these changes are 'house-keeping' provisions designed to introduce new growth management techniques or technologies. Under Amendment 4, these technical revisions would clutter our ballots."

"Those of us who have been in the field realize there is a lot more to Amendment 4 than meets the eye," said Dennis Mitchell, a faculty member at the Troy University campus in Crestview who attended Zethmayr's presentation. He said the amendment's supporters include environmentalists who are opposed to any development.

"It's a nasty issue. These things are well-coordinated," Mitchell continued. "If you look at the court cases, the same people are involved over and over again. This has a lot of popular appeal — Local control! Local control!"

"There's just a little bit of shade," she said, continually shifting a bit farther south as the shadow slowly slid across her bench.

Promptly at 3 p.m., heralded by a quick wail of sirens, local law enforcement vehicles started the parade. ## A 9/11 memory

**‘The world was different. I was different.’**

*NOTE: Shoal River Middle School Principal Bob Jones shared with us this memory written by Lee Martello, one of the assistant principals at Shoal River.*

*“She was a guidance counselor at Emma Booker Elementary School in Sarasota, the school President George W. Bush was visiting on Sept. 11, 2001,” Jones said. “This*

*is her account of that day and the emotions she felt.”*

Tuesday! For many years, the day itself will echo boundlessly in the minds and hearts of America and the world. As the humid morning evolved into a sweltering September day, many lives were changed forever.

At the close of a restless night’s sleep, I quickly awakened Tuesday, Sept. 11, 2001, to thoughts of the day ahead. Today was the day I would meet the 43rd president of the United States of America! As I scurried around the house to prepare myself for the day’s excitement, I imagined the numerous

television cameras, photojournalists and reporters who would be swarming the beautiful Sarasota campus of Emma E. Booker Elementary.

While time progressed, the reality of the presidential visit grew more exciting. As my friend and I arrived at the newly constructed security checkpoint near the rear entrance of the campus, nervous anticipation overshadowed excitement. Media vans, trucks and satellites had replaced the area, which would ordinarily be crawling with school-ready children. Activity levels had been transposed into quiet curiosity and nervousness

as dark-suited men with stoic faces stood steadfast at many posts around campus. For approximately two hours, I felt extreme physical safety. After all, I was surrounded by many Secret Service men and women.

My colleagues and I, along with many students, family and community members, stood patiently in the school’s media center waiting for the special guest. The room permeated all that was right in the world. Success! The president was visiting because the students and staff of Emma E. Booker Elementary had worked feverishly over the years to maintain and show

continual academic growth. I would be celebrating each child’s success with the president. As a school counselor in America, what else could I ask for?

As time lapsed, my questions multiplied. When would President Bush arrive? I imagined him reading and playing with our school’s second-grade students and preparing himself for his speech to America and the world. This would be the day the president outlined his education plan. And to think, I would be standing only a few steps behind him. My school and its success would be profiled to the world!

As I stood on the platform with amazement on my face and pride and honor in my heart, I watched a Secret Service agent walk in my direction. He quickly approached the two congressmen standing immediately in front of me, and my amazement turned to curiosity. I was able to hear all “the important stuff.” Within an instant, my curiosity shifted to disappointment as I heard the news of a plane crash into the World Trade Center in New York.

“Would the president still visit?” I wondered. Moments later, disappointment was replaced by extreme loss and guilt as I overheard the second conversation. A second plane had crashed into the World Trade Center, and it was considered a terrorist attack. As the news seemingly rippled across the media center, a steady hum replaced the once present buzz of multiple conversations. Cell phones began ringing, and media reporters and their cameramen quickly exited the room.

After a brief absence, both local and national media began trickling back into the room.

Another Secret Service agent approached the congressmen again and asked them to exit for a briefing with the president. It was at this moment that my life seemed to stand still while the world around me began to collapse.

Minutes later, a briskly walking man entered through the curtain beside me, and a hush fell over the room. Applause began, and I wondered why in the world people were clapping. Immediately, I focused on the medium-statured, slightly gray-haired man standing at the podium. He began to speak, and I listened not only with my ears, but with my heart. With bright lights shining in my face and grief in my heart, I fought back tears while he addressed the nation. He appeared like a father declaring justice for a massive injustice on his children.

Immediately following his statement to the world, President Bush turned to exit the room. Just before walking through the curtain, he turned in the direction of my colleagues and me. I will never forget the tone of his voice nor the tear in his bluish eyes. My heart raced as our eyes seem to water in unison. He simply stated with a nod of his head, “Thank you for allowing me to come here today (pause), and I’m so sorry I cannot stay.”

He then extended his hand in a firm handshake to myself and very few other colleagues. In my eyes, he walked away not as the president, but as a father, husband, son and leader.

He exited. I stood numb. I had a difficult time listening to United States Secretary of Education Rod Paige as he spoke of the president’s educational initiatives. I remember hoping the cameras would not focus on me as I needed to wipe a tear from my eyes several times. My previous sense of ultimate safety had been replaced with a fear of ultimate vulnerability!

After Secretary Paige and Florida Lt. Gov. Frank Brogan spoke, the room was once again full of activity. Reporters became scavengers as they approached anyone for a reaction to our national tragedy. As a reporter from the St. Petersburg Times approached me, I struggled to make sense of this horrific act. He asked me how someone like myself, a school counselor, would be responding to the children.

Within seconds, the professional side of me emerged with a fluid response, as the personal side seemed to gaze speechlessly in astonishment.

“You have to be strong,” I reminded myself. As a role model to children, my response would be crucial in the reactions of my 620 students. With hindsight, I survived this day because of my colleagues and my Emma E. Booker family.

Just as time continues, so did the school day. Life and its events had forced me to adjust from a tremendous emotional high to a devastating low. Parents hurriedly found their way to the front office to begin withdrawing their students for early dismissal. Some spoke softly, some lashed out in anger, but all shared a common need: the need to see and touch their

Join the Panhandle Butterfly House in celebrating "Monarch Madness!" The Fourth Annual Butterfly Festival will be 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Oct. 8-9. Located at 8581 Navarre Parkway on U.S. Highway 98 in Navarre, the festival offers fun for the entire family.

Kids can make and take fun butterfly-related crafts and have an opportunity to release a live butterfly. The entire family will enjoy strolling through the vivarium, a screen structure housing hundreds of butterflies and the plants they love.

Carefully timed to highlight the seasonal monarch migration, kids will also be able to participate in tagging monarch butterflies.

"Because of the severe mortality at the overwintering colonies during the winter of 2009, the number of

monarchs returning to the breeding areas this spring was fewer than at any time since the colonies became known to science in 1975," said Theresa Friday, extension agent in Santa Rosa County. "The numbers were so low that they are certain to impact the number of monarchs that return to Mexico next fall. Learning how to help monarchs during this critical migration is extremely important."

A new feature is a photo contest. Photos of butterflies, larvae, pupae and/or butterfly eggs may be submitted from through Sept. 20. The contest is open to all photographers, professional and amateur. There are five entry categories: professional adult, amateur adult and students ages 6-10, 11-14 and 15-18.

Admission is free, but donations are encouraged and appreciated. Only through the generosity of the butterfly house's visitors are they

# Suspects in burglary tracked through woods, captured

Two men accused of burglarizing a Laurel Hill home ran into the woods and were tracked with a K-9 and captured.

When a Crestview police officer stopped a truck pulling a trailer shortly before midnight Sept. 8 on State Road 85 near the Shoal River bridge, two occupants in the truck fled the scene.

All three of the suspects were charged with burglary and larceny theft in connection with the Senterfitt Road burglary and are suspects in another residential burglary as well, the sheriff's press release states.

King and Nailon face an additional charge of resisting an officer without violence.

The stolen property was returned to the owner.

children. Fear on their faces, like none other I'd seen, was my initial evidence of the terrorists' newly waged war.

As a parent, I shared the same need. I so wanted to see and hold my 2-year-old like I'd never held her before. I sought refuge in my office with a closed door and a brief call to my husband. For a moment, I felt safe, then began to cry. I quickly caught myself. Remember, I had to be strong. In a temporary effort to squash any emotion, I terminated the call with the voice which

represented once known safety and security.

Like waters in a breaking dam, tearful anger finally emerged from my petite southern body after arriving home. My small body would lie lifelessly in a state of mental, emotional and physical exhaustion. What had happened to America? What will happen to the many wives, husbands, mothers, fathers, sons and daughters whose lives had been shattered? Tears continued as I listened to the many tributes on the television. I repeatedly

found myself unable to answer my own questions. The world was different. I was different.

In the days to follow, I could no longer allow myself to continue to feel threatened or weakened by this devilish, cruel, and unwarranted act of hate. My resolve began to heighten! I was an American! WE were Americans! WE were joined with tremendous solidarity!

With the passing of time, I have felt the heaviness of my heart transform itself. Occasionally, I catch myself

smiling as I drive down the road. I see American flags flying high and proud. I softly ask God to grant peace to the many victims' families. I ask for the safety

of the many men and women who are preparing for war. I often pray, as this is my small contribution to the war. Our soldiers and our country need

prayers of protection and guidance. We are fighting for "enduring freedom."

America is resilient. America and its people will live on!



**BAKER** — It was back to work for the Baker football team Monday after the Gators broke a 12-game losing streak with a 20-0 win over District 1-A foe Sneads on Friday night.

The Gators (1-1, 1-0) will try to make it two wins in a row when they travel to Vernon to take on a talented Yellow Jacket team Friday.

Baker senior Christian Mainor said Friday's win has given the Gators a big boost.

"It feels pretty good," he said. "Going 0-10 last year, it kind of left a bad taste in our mouth. We worked real hard over the summer, and we finally got to see the hard work paying off."

"They are offensively a lot like Sneads," Baker coach Bob Kellogg said, "but with Sneads you just had to focus on stopping one guy, and Vernon has about four guys."

"Everybody they've beat, they've big-played them. When you look at their backs, they are all making 60-, 80-, 90-yard runs. They are not really a team that is driving the ball (on long-scoring drives). They just have skill people that will break it out of the gate and go the distance on you. Our goal is to stop the big play."

# Bulldogs ready for first road test

The Crestview football team hits the road for the first time this season Friday when the Bulldogs travel to Escambia County to take on Tate.

Game time is set for 7:30 p.m.

The Aggies (1-1), who are coming off a 32-9 loss to Pensacola High School, opened the season with a 30-20 win over Washington.

Crestview (2-0) has yet to be tested, beating Baker 49-20 in the opener and then making short work of West Gadsden 47-6 in Friday's homecoming game.

Things will get a lot tougher Friday night.

Tate's offense centers on a power running game, as the Aggies ran for 436 yards against Washington and came back with 194 yards on the ground against PHS. Crestview coach Matt Brunson expects more of the same this week.

Tate beat Crestview 44-15 last season, which serves as an extra incentive for senior defensive end Steven Noble.

"We are going to try and compete and come out with a win," he said. "We have to compete well. That's what I think about."

On a night when it took the Gator offense a while to get going, it was the Baker defense that shined, holding the Pirates to 121 yards in total offense and just four first downs.

Even more impressive was the fact that Baker (1-1, 1-0) held Sneads (0-2, 0-1) to 18 yards in offense in the second half without allowing a first down.

"So far this year we have played good defense," Kellogg said. "Good teams play good defense, and that's kind of our mark right now."

"We are making a lot of mental errors and mistakes on offense, but if you can play good defense, you've got a chance, and I think it showed tonight."

Wagner then hit Mainor with a pass on the 2-point

conversion to put the Gators up 8-0. Smith was quick to share the credit with his teammates on his touchdown run.

"I had great blocking," he said. "I didn't have to break no tackles. When they do their job, it's easy for me to do my job."

The Gators were just getting started.

On their next possession, they went 45 yards on nine plays for their second score of the night.

Vada Moore, who had five carries for 12 yards on the drive, scored from a yard out with 1:09 left in the third quarter on a fourth-and-goal.

Moore might have picked up the score, but he had plenty of help from his friends, with fullback Cory Harper picking up a big first down with a 21-yard run.

Not that they needed it, but the Gators picked up an insurance touchdown with three minutes left in the fourth quarter when Colten Bouchard scored on a 4-yard run.

When the final horn had sounded, Baker had 321 yards in total offense.

The Gators had a balanced attack, with five players rushing for more than 30 yards as they rushed for 238 yards on 40 carries.

Harper led the way with 93 yards on just eight carries. Wagner had 60 yards rushing to go along with 83 yards passing. And Moore finished with 44 yards on the ground, and Smith 37 yards.

Mainor had six catches for 73 yards.

Kellogg acknowledged that the Gator defense would need another big effort to stop Vernon. He also wants to see the offense avoid the mental mistakes and breakdowns that go with having an inexperienced offensive line.

If the offensive line can do its job, Kellogg thinks the Gators have a shot to beat Vernon.

"I think the thing we are doing good is we are spreading the ball around to a lot of people, and that creates problems for defenses," he said. "We are spreading the ball around and are creating problems for people on who they want to take away (try to stop while leaving other offensive players open)."

"Our offensive line has got to execute the game plan, and we can't have mistakes in critical situations. If they do, I think we can put some points on them."

As kids across the county are settling into their school routines, you are probably starting to think about grades, if you're anything like me.

We, as parents, work hard to provide the best opportunity we can for our kids to succeed in school and subsequently in life.

There are several things we do daily to help our kids; a good night's sleep, good breakfast, set aside time for homework each day and encourage reading daily. But what about extracurricular activities? Do they help or hinder kids' success in school?

A lot of research has been done on this topic. Overwhelmingly, the answer is yes, extracurricular activities help, in moderation of course. You can have too much of a good thing!

The Search Institute conducted several studies and developed a list of 40 Developmental Assets that help youth grow into successful adults. One of these assets is being engaged in child/youth programs. Of course, the amount of time that is appropriate for youth to spend engaging in these programs varies by age.

All youths benefit from participation but can be overscheduled easily. The

Search Institute suggests participation in at least one sport, club or organization weekly for youth ages 5-8, two or more times per week for ages 8-12, and three or more hours per week for ages 12-18.

4-H is definitely one of those organizations that can help youth succeed in school and life. 4-H Clubs normally meet once or twice a month, so youth still have time to participate in other activities such as religious activities and sports, without being overscheduled.

A study conducted in Montana revealed that 4-H participants are more likely than other kids to succeed in school, getting more A's than other kids in the study.

So, if you're a parent like me, who worries about helping your child do the best they can in school and in life, go ahead and encourage participation in extracurricular activities. Just be careful not to overdo a good thing.



# New credit card rules in effect

The next phase of new rules governing credit cards went into effect recently. Here are some of the major changes that began Aug. 22:

- **Reasonable penalty fees:** Under the new rules, your credit card company cannot charge a late-payment penalty of more than \$25 — unless one of your last six payments was late (then your fee can be \$35), or if your

company can prove that the cost of late payments justify a higher fee. Your credit card company cannot charge a late fee that is higher than your minimum payment or an over-the-limit fee that is more than the amount which you exceeded your limit.

- **Additional fee protections:** No more inactivity fees. Your credit card company can't charge you a fee for not using your card. Also, the company can't charge you more than one fee for a single event or

transaction.

The redesigned credit card statement required by the new regulations will make these fees and other facts about your credit card account much more clear and understandable.

**Gift cards**

The new rules also provide important protections when you purchase or use gift cards. (Please note that these rules are not retroactive to gift cards given or re-

ceived before Aug. 22, so if you have old cards, use them up!) Here are some key changes that apply to new gift cards sold on or after Aug. 22:

- **Limits on expiration dates:** The money on new gift cards must be good for at least five years from the date the card is purchased.
- **Limits on fees:** Under the new rules, many gift card fees are limited. These restrictions apply to fees such as dormancy or inactivity fees for not using your gift

card, usage fees when you do use the card, or maintenance fees. However, it is important to start spending on the gift card soon, as fees may be charged if you haven't used the card for at least one year. You can also still be charged a fee to replace a lost or stolen card. All fees must be clearly disclosed on the gift card or its packaging, so read the fine print.

These rules are the latest in a series of regulations that implement the Credit Card

Accountability, Responsibility and Disclosure Act (Credit CARD.) For more information, see the Federal Reserve Board website at [www.federalreserve.gov/consumerinfo](http://www.federalreserve.gov/consumerinfo).

## FHA short refinance option now available

**WASHINGTON** — In an effort to help responsible homeowners who owe more on their mortgage than the value of their property, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development is now providing an additional refinancing option for “underwater” borrowers.

Originally announced in March, this enhancement of Federal Housing

Administration refinance program will offer certain “underwater” non-FHA borrowers who are current on their existing mortgage and whose lien holders agree to write off at least 10 percent of the unpaid principal balance of the first mortgage, the opportunity to qualify for a new FHA-insured mortgage.

The FHA Short Refinance option is targeted to help people who owe more on their mortgage

than their home is worth — also known as being “underwater” — because their local markets saw large declines in home values. As announced earlier this year, this change, as well as other programs that have been put in place, will help the Obama Administration meet its goal of stabilizing housing markets by offering a second chance to up to 3 million to 4 million struggling homeowners through the end of 2012.

To facilitate the refinancing of new FHA-insured loans under this program, the U.S. Department of Treasury will provide incentives to existing second lien holders who agree to full or partial extinguishment of the liens.

To be eligible, servicers must execute a Servicer Participation Agreement with Fannie Mae, in its capacity as financial agent for the United States, on or before Oct. 3.




lated over 2,750 total flying hours in fighter and supersonic trainer aircraft.




# Cook It Raw

## Chefs draw inspiration from, attention to, wild eats

**LEVI LAPLAND, Finland (AP)** — Rene Redzepi was crouched and using a sharp knife to scrape lichen from rocks. The tiny green tubes usually feed reindeer in this land above the Arctic Circle.

"If animals can eat it, we can," said Redzepi, who was among 14 of the world's most influential chefs at a gathering in Lapland earlier this month. The goal was to dig their hands into the soil and make a meal from whatever they could find in one of the last untouched places on earth.

Called "Cook It Raw," the event marked the third time in just over a year that these chefs have hunted, fished and foraged together — each time in a new location — then prepared a meal while leaving the smallest possible footprint on the environment.

A pair of Italians, a restaurant consultant and a food writer, first organized Cook It Raw as a prelude to the U.N. Climate Change Conference in Copenhagen last year. At that gathering they asked the chefs to prepare dishes using little or no conventional energy, leading to memorable creations such as Redzepi's squirming live prawns or Massimo Bottura's "pollution" soup, illustrating a projected future in which the oceans contain only squid and jellyfish. The group then came together again in January in Friuli Venezia Giulia, Italy, where the ingredients used included raw venison and rare Rosa di Gorizia radicchio.

This time, the chefs flew to Helsinki from as far afield as London, New York, Sao Paulo and Tokyo, took a 14-hour train ride north, then marveled at the bounty of a land where the northern lights shimmer like an electric green cloud and the indigenous people have 90 words for snow. But civilization is taking its toll here, too, with global warming driving up temperatures and foreign companies mining for gold.

As the planet transforms, an increasing number of chefs are stepping out into the wild and creating food defined by a specific time and place — a way of cooking that has become the next big movement after the science projects of molecular gastronomy.

One of its pioneers, Redzepi, who is from Denmark, shot to first place on Restaurant Magazine's list of the world's 50 best restaurants this year with his Copenhagen restaurant, Noma. In Lapland, he saw a world of gastronomic possibilities in the

fuzzy mosses and mushrooms of the forest floor. For the dinner, he covered carrots with pine needles and steamed them so their essential oils impregnated the vegetables.

"We are showing others how to harvest in nature, because the things you find there taste better than anything grown," he said. "Try one of those blueberries, then a stupid one grown in a greenhouse. Your reference point for what a blueberry tastes like has changed forever."

Superstar chef David Chang of New York's Momofuku restaurants also participated. He was struck by the abundance of edible shoots

and leaves to be found at the top of the world. "To be able to forage everywhere, it's crazy," he said. He created a Lapland version of Japanese dashi soup, with spruce and reindeer milk.

Bottura, the highly conceptual chef of Osteria Francescana in Modena, Italy, cooked reindeer tongues sous vide for 22 hours. And he did it in his bathroom so he could check their progress throughout the night. He purposely chose a body part other chefs might discard.

"Our cuisine is no longer about liking or not liking something," he said. "It's about trying to influence

everyday life. If I put aesthetics and ethics together, that is the future of cuisine."

Brazilian chef Alex Atala flew in from Sao Paulo, where his restaurant, D.O.M., features ingredients from the Amazon, another endangered region. Outraged that hunting is illegal in most of Brazil yet deforestation is not, he has acquired 57,000 acres of rainforest in an effort to protect it. He said, "Like Rene and Massimo, my ethical awakening came from my job as a chef, searching for products in nature."

Inaki Aizpitarte and Petter Nilsson, from the wildly popular Chateaubriand and La Gazzetta restaurants in Paris, teamed up to create a dish from beginning to end, waking at dawn and fishing, cutting woodchips to smoke their catch, mixing a broth from lichen and mushrooms they gathered, garnishing it with berries and sorrel.

"It had a taste of where we had put our feet," Nilsson said.

One morning the group witnessed a reindeer slaughter, and the blood inspired several chefs. Daniel Patterson from Coi in San Francisco roasted beets in the hearth until their skins were black, then served them with a sauce of beets, blueberries and blood, a simple dish that was sweetly intense and gamey.

Then pastry chef Albert Adria, who made his name alongside his brother Ferran at the Spanish restaurant elBulli, created snow-like freshly fallen powder next to a lingonberry cocktail that was warm like blood.

"If you are lost for three weeks in the wilderness here, you will eat reindeer and drink snow," he explained.

Tears of emotion came to the eyes of the Japanese chef Yoshihiro Narisawa when he presented his dish. He had splattered white bowls with a lingonberry sauce that echoed the blood spurting from the reindeer's neck that morning. Nestled in the sauce were strips of meat from hare who might have fed on the berries. Over this, he poured a clear consommé made from wild hare, snow grouse and the leg of a bear. The dish represented how much life it takes to offer us life.

Meanwhile, the hard-partying Italian chef Davide Scabin, from Combal Zero in Turin, packed salmon trout in moss and baked it in a hole in the ground.

"I wanted to do something different," he said, lighting up a cigarette with one of the logs. "I didn't travel 3,000 kilometers to do the same thing I do every day."




