# Gaetz: It's about jobs, jobs, jobs

## Q & A with future Senate president

State Sen. Don Gaetz has been meeting with chambers of commerce throughout the area to

update residents on the 2011 legislative session.

Gaetz, a former superintendent of schools for the Okaloosa County School District and first elected to the Senate in 2006, is slated to serve as the Florida Senate president in 2013-14.

Recently, Gaetz sat

down with News Bulletin editor Michael Stewart to talk about, among other things, the state's \$3.8 billion budget shortfall, redistricting efforts and legislation he has supported.

**Q: You have been talking to a lot of people lately. What is on people's minds?**

**A:** It's economic issues. People are tired of hearing the rhetoric out of Washington, out of Tallahassee, out of anywhere else. It's about jobs, jobs, jobs.

They were very interested in the Oil Spill Economic Recovery Act. They had a lot of questions about another bill I sponsored that passed, that sets up a strike force in the state of retired military, retired mil-

itary contractors and business people to get ready for the next round of Base Realignment and Closure.

**Q: Alabama and some of our neighboring states have done a better job attracting business than we have. What does Florida need to do to compete?**

**A:** For too long, our economic policy in Florida was

# Hope on canvas


Artwork by cancer patients featured for 'Oncology on Canvas'

Lily Pharmaceutical and the National Coalition for Cancer Survivorship began a program in 2004 that gave those impacted by cancer a new outlet to vent their feelings — canvas.

The "Oncology on Canvas" art competition and exhibition invited those diagnosed with cancer, and their healthcare providers, family members, friends and caregivers, to put their emotions on canvas. Narratives are included with the art pieces on display at Crestview's 21st Century Oncology, which had an open house July 12 to highlight recent renovations and expansion of services.

The artwork will remain on display at 21st Century Oncology until July 27. The art is placed



among treatment equipment and hallways, patient dressing rooms and consultation areas.

Themes include good days, celebrations, depression, renewal, strength, loss, family, survival and remembrance. Some of the art pieces feature breast cancer pink and ovarian cancer teal. Others are starkly black and white, while some feature vibrant kaleidoscopes of color.


Since the Oncology on Canvas'

## City outlook positive

Mayor, council  
president to address  
'State of the City'

Mayor David Cadle and Crestview City Council President Charles Baugh Jr. were the guest speakers at the July 13 meeting of the chamber of commerce's Government Issues committee. During their "State of the City" reports, both assured the audience of civic and business leaders that Crestview's outlook is positive.

"They certainly have some big challenges," committee chairman Nathan Boyles said before the men spoke. "There are many issues in front of the city that people are interested in and talking about."

Cadle reported he and Fire Chief Joe Traylor have been working on having the city's fire services inspected by ISO, the insurance rating organization.

"ISO looks at data," Cadle explained. "One of the things we have worked on diligently and quietly is the response time to calls. The first five minutes of a fire emergency situation is the most critical. Our data shows that 90 percent of the time, we are arriving on scene within four minutes."

Cadle said since the ISO last visited Crestview in 1997, two new fire stations have been built and the ranks of firefighters have doubled. Cadle and Traylor are optimistic that the city's fire rating might improve after the ISO visit.

**ROAD REPAIRS:** Okaloosa County Public Works has contracted to make improvements to the following roads: Buck Ward Road in Baker, Fairchild Road in Crestview and General Bond Road in the Fort Walton

Beach area. Buck Ward Road, the longest stretch of paving, has already begun and will take about 20 working days to complete. The process for these improvements is called a Full Depth Reclamation (FDR), and involves taking the existing road, adding a strengthener (in this case cement), remixing and repaving.

Remaining projects will take about eight working days each, and citizens are asked to use caution when traveling these roads. General Bond Road will be closed to traffic during the FDR process and a public notice will be sent out prior to its closing. EJ Breneman is the contractor performing the work; however, if you have any questions, feel free to contact the 311 Citizens Information Line.

to wait at the welcome station with a glass of orange juice and a real estate map.

One thing I was able to sponsor, and get the Senate and House to pass and the governor to sign, was the Oil Spill Economic Recovery Act, which does three things.

Number one, for the next three years, the eight coastal counties of Northwest Florida — including north Okaloosa County, not just south Okaloosa County — get to be at the front of the line for all economic development programs and business incentives.

We have to have a solid program. We have to have good projects. But if we do, instead of getting the short end of the stick, which we've often gotten, we will be able to get a presumptive preference, which is what is in the law.

The second thing in the bill is that for the next three years, we will get \$30 million, \$10 million a year, for economic diversification. So, if somebody wants to come in here with 50, 100, 150 or 500 jobs, whatever it is, we take advantage of local incentives. We get first in line for state tax benefits and economic development programs and if we get close, but the guys in Alabama are ready to build them a warehouse, then we got \$30 million, so we can step up and

say, "We'll match it, and we'll give you a dollar more."

The third thing in that bill that I think will help us economically and that will help us with the competition issue, is by state law now three-fourths of the (oil spill) fine and settlement dollars that would come from BP or the federal government to the state must be spent to benefit Northwest Florida. It can't be drained away in Washington or Tallahassee. It must be spent here.

I met with the (Crestview) chamber of commerce's government affairs committee and their board of directors. And the appeal I made to them was that north Okaloosa County and the Crestview area have to develop some solid projects, some good ideas that really hold water in economic development.

**Q: It has been a tough budget year. What is the outlook for next year?**

**A:** Next year is going to be a year of more cuts. Will it be as deep? That will depend upon other parts of the economy and how much they recover. Government shouldn't view itself as being immune from the realities of the economy. When people have less, the government should have a lot less.

We are in a position right now where recovery is starting to occur. There are

heartbeats of recovery that are starting. That will create more economic activity and more tax revenues.

Once we have made cuts we should have made long ago, the worst thing we can do is say, if we get a little bit of recovery, now we can go back to some of the dumb things we used to do.

**Q: You are on the Senate chair for redistricting. How are Amendments 5 and 6 going to impact redistricting efforts?**

**A:** Amendments 5 and 6 are interesting because nothing like this has ever been forced onto a state in American history. These are new and unique mandates.

Let me quote to you from Amendments 5 and 6. Five applies to state officials and state districts, and six applies to federal officials and federal districts.

"No line shall be drawn with the intent to either favor or disfavor any incumbent or any political party."

Now, draw the first line. My hope is we can work through this process. We are doing our best to involve the people of Florida in it. We are having the most open, transparent, interactive process associated with redistricting of any state in the union.

We've put all of the demographic information from the Bureau of the Census online at [www.flsenate.gov/session/redistricting](http://www.flsenate.gov/session/redistricting).

We put the redistricting software that policy makers and the courts use to draw lines. We overlaid that on the demographic information we got from the census. So 19 million Floridians are seeing exactly the same thing as members of the Legislature or any judges would see, and we are inviting people to come forward and say, where do you believe we ought to change district lines.

**Q: So you are going to become the Senate president. What do you say to those people who expect you to bring home the bacon?**

**A:** There is no bacon. We went into this legislative session \$3.8 billion less in revenue than the previous year. State economist Amy Baker met with our budget committee, on which I serve, and said that for the next three years, she expects a slow, hard climb out of this recession. She's told us that for the next three years, she expects the revenues of Florida to be insufficient to cover the critical services of the state. There is no bacon to bring home. Whatever bacon we can find anywhere needs to be left in the private sector to create jobs. In good conscience, I can't do what previous presiding officers have sometimes done.

"Crestview stands at a 4," Cadle said, out of a scale of 1 to 10. "We would love to see that rating lowered to a 3 or 2. We're very hopeful that we could lower that by at least one number. You would see that on your insurance bill."

Cadle also reported that the Crestview Police Department has had a higher visibility on the city's streets.

"You have probably seen more and more police cruisers," Cadle said. "Visibility is the best deterrent to speeding. If you can slow traffic down, you can ease the accidents considerably."

Cadle also reported that for the second year in a row, CPD has been ranked in the top tier of Florida municipal police forces in the Click-It-or-Ticket seatbelt-use enforcement Chiefs' Challenge.

Baugh discussed city finances and budgeting, noting the thoroughness of the budgeting process continues to improve. Where once two workshops were held, the council now holds eight workshops to scrutinize each department's budget.

"In the past, the city of Crestview did not have a clear budgeting plan," Baugh said. "We intend to take care of some of the problems we did not address in the past to place Crestview on a firmer footing for the 2012-2013 budget year. We spend our budget wisely."

Baugh said the council is also investigating saving money by sharing resources with the county.

The decision to turn animal control services

over to the county contractor, for example, has saved the city more than \$140,000, he said.

Taking advantage of the county and state purchasing departments can also benefit Crestview, he said.

"We don't have a very good purchasing program for the city of Crestview," Baugh said. "There are some savings to realize if we had a purchasing agent and maybe ride on some of the state's contracts."

"Even if you live in the city of Crestview, you still pay taxes to Okaloosa County, and it would be nice if we got some of those taxes back into the city," he said.

Baugh also praised initiatives that bring business to the community, including the Florida A&M University pharmacy school coming to the Alatex building, and a pharmaceutical company that is interested in locating in town.

"The city is morphing into a college community," Baugh said. "There are businesses looking to come to Crestview. The city needs to look at some of our impact fees. We have lost businesses to some of our sister cities in the south."

Citizen input is important as the council ponders the issues of the city, Baugh stressed.

"We're happy to see people standing in the aisles" at city council meetings, he said. "Input is what we're looking for."

"We get all sorts of input from our citizens. We get input all of the time, from the miracle of the Internet to visits to notes on the door, and raps on the window when you're in your car."

inception, more than 3,600 stories have been told through the art. A book of artworks is printed and the art is shipped to different locations, where cancer patients can view, appreciate, find solace and hope in the works. Many of the pieces submitted are the first art expressions ever committed to canvas by the person affected by the disease. The chosen works are displayed in fewer than 800 locations per year.

The artists also get a chance to enter a contest, with contributions made to the cancer-related charity of the winners' choice.

The 2010 best of exhibition, best entry by a person diagnosed with cancer, and best mixed media by a person diagnosed with cancer categories, were awarded to Annette Zalewski from Arizona.

Her piece, "Wild Water," is a result of her dealing with lung cancer. Her decision to put her feelings

on canvas resulted in a painting of a peaceful waterfall across a rocky area. She then cut the work into vertical and horizontal strips and wove them back together.

"My life after a diagnosis of lung cancer feels like it has been cut up, rearranged and become a different picture," she said. "The treatments and side effects, like the rocks in turbulent water, can make me feel bruised, battered and worn out."

"When scan results show improvement or stability, I can coast smoothly for a while, but any negative change leads to another bumpy ride down the falls. Yet as the rushing water continues on its path, I plan to continue surviving and weaving a beautiful life."

According to the American Cancer Society's website, 3,400 people in the United States are diagnosed with cancer each day. The National

Cancer Institute estimates that 8 million Americans are cancer survivors. With better treatment and early diagnosis, deaths from cancer have been on the decline since 2006, according to American Cancer Society statistics.

"Until 1986, patients from here had cancer treatments out of Pensacola," North Okaloosa Medical Center Radiation Oncologist Dr. Warren Amos said. "In 2005, it all came here and we have expanded and added programs and services and equipment and you are standing in the culmination of that."

# Scam updates

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office has received reports of possible scams circulating in our area.

In one of the most recent scams, residents have received phone calls from an individual stating he is with a credit card services company and is going to see if the person qualifies for lower interest rates on their credit card. He asks for a credit card number and the last four digits of the person's Social Security number.

In at least one case, the caller already had some basic information, such as the last four digits of a valid credit card. The Sheriff's Office Crime Prevention Unit wants to remind residents to never give out personal information via unsolicited phone calls, emails or other means.

Another scam the OCSO is warning people about is the "stranded" email scam. It targeted the acquaintances of a local man with the headline: "Am Stranded." The information below is false and the individual whose name was used was unaware of this scam attempt. A sample of the letter, with the individual's name removed, is listed here:

**Subject: Am stranded**  
**Hello,**

*Hope you get this on time. Sorry I didn't inform you about my trip in Spain for a program, I'm presently in Spain and am having some difficulties here because I misplaced my wallet on my way to the hotel where my money and other valuable things*

*were kept. I want you to assist me with a loan of (2800euros = \$4,000) to sort out my hotel bills and to get myself back home.*

*I have spoken to the embassy here but they are not responding to the matter effectively. I will appreciate whatever you can afford to assist me with. I'll refund the money back to you as soon as I return. Let me know if you can be of any help. I don't have a phone where I can be reached. Please let me know immediately. Regards I expect to pass through this world but once; any good thing therefore that I can do, or any kindness that I can show to any fellow creature, let me do it now; let me not defer or neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again.*

The Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office wants to make sure the public is aware of these type of schemes. They prey on people's generosity and desire to help someone in need, and in this case, actually used the name of an acquaintance. Investigators say this case may involve someone who hacked into another person's computer to get personal contacts.

Suspected scams or fraud attempts can be reported to the sheriff's Fraud Hotline at 651-7574. The hotline has already received more than 1,000 calls since its inception, according to OCSO Crime Prevention Specialist Ashley Bailey.

# Council approves day care, office park

Should the city council approve plans Weeks Engineering presented for the construction of Riverwalk Office Park? Originally put on the July 11 consent agenda, this question raised a lot of discussion after it was removed and added to the regular agenda.

The set of plans the council had been given didn't meet nine of the stipulations made by city engineer Fred Cook.

"I see some sites plans here and I see some discrepancies," Councilman Ben Iannucci said. "It's hard for me to say I approve of something when all the questions aren't answered."

The project calls for an 8,750-square-foot day care center and a 5,750-square-foot professional office building south of Interstate 10 and west of State Road 85.

Two weeks ago, another Weeks Engineering project was rejected by the council for similar reasons, a coincidence that made engineer Jim Weeks say he was feeling "a little bit discriminated against."

"You meet each of those items (stipulations) or you don't get your development

order. It seems like one's being held hostage against the other," Weeks said.

The council does not intend to repeat mistakes made in the past, Councilwoman Robyn Helt said.

"In essence, the city has learned from its past mistakes," Helt said. "We're not left holding the bag like at Eagle's Landing."

In 2007, alleged negligence by a former Public

Works director left the city responsible for the maintenance of storm water ponds for Eagle's Landing, a residential development off Antioch Road.

Because of this precedent, Steele had to assure the city council his office would not issue development orders needed to begin construction until developers satisfied every stipulation. In the case of

some projects, multiple permitting agencies might be involved, Steele and Weeks pointed out.

Helt hastened to assure Weeks he had no reason to feel discriminated against and that the city is business friendly.

After discussion, the motion passed 4-1, with council President Charles Baugh Jr. voting nay.

In other matters, the city council also:

- Unanimously redefined the requirement for a special exception to keep a horse in a residential area. The properties must contain at least 5 acres, with at least one acre dedicated to the dwelling, and the accessory buildings must be located at least 100 feet from any property line.

- Unanimously passed an ordinance establishing a twice monthly water billing system with a minor typographical error corrected.

- Held the first reading of ordinance 1469, allowing alcohol sale in public buildings. A workshop was scheduled for July 25. A second reading of the ordinance will be held at the council's Aug. 8 meeting, at which time the council could vote to approve or reject it.

# DOH, FDLE & strike forces conduct compliance checks

On July 5, the Florida Department of Health (DOH), the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, and Florida's Regional Drug Enforcement Strike Forces visited physicians' offices across the state to

ensure compliance with House Bill 7095, Florida's new prescription drug law.

The administrative inspections were conducted pursuant to the declaration of a public health emergency on July 1.

Since the bill was signed into law on June 3, DOH

has been actively notifying physicians no longer authorized to dispense selected controlled substances to dispose of their inventory. Physicians must return the drugs to wholesalers or turn them over to law enforcement for destruction before they become contraband on Aug. 1.

The inspections were designed to remove the drugs quickly and safely and minimize the chance they will be dispensed into local communities.

During the inspections, physicians had to surrender the substances for destruction; surrender them to law enforcement to be quarantined while the physician determines if they can be returned to the wholesaler; or request that the substances be quarantined at the location of the clinic or practice. The role of the Strike Forces in the inspections was to safeguard and secure the drugs, either on-site or at a law enforcement agency. The drugs quarantined will either be destroyed or returned to wholesalers.

A total of 23 physicians in 24 locations statewide were inspected, with the bulk of visits occurring in south Florida. The locations visited included general practitioners, anesthesiologists, and internists.

The inspections are part of Florida's comprehensive and multi-faceted plan to address an epidemic of prescription drug abuse. House Bill 7095 increases penalties for overprescribing Oxycodone and other controlled substances,

requires tracking of the wholesale distribution of certain controlled substances and provides support for the continued efforts of state agencies, law enforcement and state prosecutors. The bill also bans doctors from dispensing selected controlled drugs except under specific circumstances.

In March 2011, Gov. Rick Scott announced a Statewide Drug Strike Force, headed by FDLE Commissioner Gerald Bailey, to combat the criminal distribution of prescription drugs in Florida. With support from Attorney General Pam Bondi and state and local law enforcement leaders, the Strike Force is charged with stopping the flow of dangerous drugs into communities by disrupting the major illegal supply points.

On July 1, in accordance with House Bill 7095, State Surgeon General Dr. Frank Farmer issued a statewide public health emergency declaration in response to the ongoing problem of prescription drug abuse and diversion in Florida. The declaration requires dispensing practitioners who are no longer authorized to dispense controlled substances in listed in Schedule II and Schedule III of Section 893.03, Florida Statutes, to dispose of any inventory and cooperate fully with DOH, FDLE and local law enforcement personnel.

The declaration will remain in effect for 60 days unless amended or rescinded, or renewed with the concurrence of the governor.



movies to the big, wide screen to TV and the Broadway stage, Twain's creations have sprung to life in various incarnations.

One of the most successful was "Big River," and not just because the stage musical, being the most original American performing arts form, makes the perfect vehicle for one of the most original and iconic American stories.

The show's combination of a relatively faithful adaptation of Twain's "Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" with the music of legendary folk and country composer/singer Roger Miller was nearly tailor-made for the Great White Way.

When it opened at the Eugene O'Neill Theatre in 1985, it promptly snagged

seven Tony Awards, including Best Musical, Best Score and Best Book of a Musical.

"Big River" is a buddy story complete with splashy sets, a few lavish production numbers, some breathtakingly plaintive solos and duets, a nearly perfect score, a tormented lead character, derring-do, plenty of laughs, and a frank examination of a dark period of American history that wisely refrains from over editorializing and preachiness.

And the production opening tonight on the Main Stage of the Mattie Kelley Arts Center is about as nearly perfect as a stage musical could be in every way. Dr. Cliff Herron helms a cast and crew that

brings vividly to life the world of Huck, played engagingly and sincerely by Matthew Ruff, and his runaway slave pal Jim, played by Fliery Robinson II, who gave his performance an elegance and strength.

Contrasting with previous summer shows at NWFSC, two of "Big River's" centerpiece numbers are not huge production spectacles, but intimate duets, confined by the restrictions of a log raft floating down the mighty Mississippi River. "River in the Rain" is my favorite, and admirably displays the vocal strength of both lead actors.

A strong supporting cast accompanies Huck and Jim on their journey south from St. Petersburg, Mo., where

they encounter recaptured runaway slaves, two con men scoundrels, a community of Arkansan rustics, a family in mourning, and ultimately, Huck's reunion with his buddy Tom Sawyer, played with enthusiasm and verve by recent Crestview High graduate Jesse Hinton.

Occasionally, supporting cast members got to have their moments in the limelight, including Crestview resident Shelby Steverson, who drew appreciative chortles as the Arkansas hillbilly Andy, and performed with gusto as Dick, one of the boys in Tom Sawyer's gang. Hannah Teel, another familiar face from the Crestview stage, was delightful in dual roles of Jo Harper and

Joanna Wilkes.

Several evocative dance numbers choreographed by Joseph A. Taylor and Kelly Murdock proved effective vehicles for emotional portrayals of the anguish of those bound into slavery, propelled by an excellent eight-member pit orchestra.

I would be remiss if I did not credit lighting designer Bob Whittaker, who doused the stage with color, shadow and brilliance as needed. His work was particularly effective during night scenes and as Huck and Jim polled set designer Clint Mahlie's raft down river.

Mahlie's period sets were gorgeous in their simplicity, including a nostalgic projected ornate frame, the

contents of which suggest various locations, including the many moods of Ol' Man River himself. Adding wonderfully to the production were Jennifer Boudette's period costumes, proving that under a deft and sensitive director, all elements of a production can play harmoniously to produce a perfectly marvelous three hours at the theater.

Banish those dreary summer doldrums and take a raft down a lively, visually beautiful and well-performed "Big River," playing at NWFSC through Saturday evening. Get there early for a "pre-show" performance of mood-setting music by various cast members.

# Have fun in the sun, but be safe

Summer is a great time to have some fun in the sun. But too much of a good thing can be painful; sunburns hurt!

Too many UV rays can also lead to other problems like skin cancer, older looking skin, cataracts and a weak immune system. Just a few serious sunburns can increase your child's risk of skin cancer later in life. So let's do what we can to protect our children from this disease.

- **Sunscreen** — Look for a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 15 or higher and reapply at least every two hours. Apply more often when you are swimming or sweating. Keep sunscreen handy!

- **Sunglasses** — Eyes need protection too! Look for "broad spectrum" glasses that block 90 percent to 100 percent of UVA/UVB rays.

- **Hats** — Protect your face, neck and shoulders by wearing a wide brim hat. The wider the brim the more protection!

- **Clothing** — Cover up that precious skin and block the rays! Special sun protection clothing is available for children and adults.

- **Shade** — When your shadow is shorter than you are, seek shade. This is when the UV rays are strongest, typically between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

- Be a good role model for your children and protect your skin too! It will keep you looking younger and reduce your risk of skin cancer too!



# Crestview's Asheville connection

## Flight connects innkeeper, Hub City hometown

A long weekend getaway, a family reunion or a great vacation of arts, shopping, hiking and tours of America's largest private home are just a tad more than an hour's flight away from Northwest Florida Regional Airport. And when you get there, a Crestview native is waiting to welcome you.

About 12 years ago, Jodee Sellers — whom classmates in the Crestview High class of '73 remember better as Jodee Curenton — and her husband, Doug, opened Bent Creek Lodge up in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains outside Asheville, N.C. Only a 15-minute drive from the regional airport, the rustic lodge is a sanctuary in which daily stresses magically melt away, augmented by Jodee's spectacular breakfasts.

Sellers, who holds a degree in social work from the University of West Florida, originally worked in family counseling, where at a camp for "emotionally disturbed boys," she met Doug. Neither counseling nor a position with a clothing store telemarketing center fit her adventurous spirit.

"I got tired of corporate America," she said. "I'm a much more goal-oriented person, but you don't see that in social work. I'm glad there are people who can do it, but my personality didn't fit."

Turning to one of her real loves, Sellers attended culinary school. After a stint as personal chef to a business entrepreneur, Jodee and a culinary classmate considered opening a restaurant. Then Doug had a better idea.

"Doug reminded me that when we first got married, we had talked about opening a B&B," Jodee said. They sold their home and started searching for the perfect old house to convert into a bed-and-breakfast.

"We looked and looked and looked," she said.

Then their real estate agent suggested they look at a piece of property up in the hills.

"The realtor's four-wheel-drive got stuck, and we had to hike the rest of the way," Jodee recalled.

When they saw the sweeping, forested hillside where Bent Creek Lodge now sits, they knew they found the perfect spot. During the next year, they cleared the land, sending many of the pine trees to a local mill to turn them into lumber for the lodge's clapboards.

Simultaneously, they created a business plan. Their architect, however, refused to design to their specifications and was promptly fired.

"I thought I could do it better myself," Doug

Sellers said. "We visited a place in West Virginia that was rustic, and we liked that idea. There are over 50 B&Bs in Asheville; we wanted to do something different. I had been around construction

enough to know what a set of plans looked like."

Inside, the heart pine trim came from an old home in South Carolina. The great oak curved-top

### Jodee's vegetable egg bake

Jodee Curenton Sellers shared this recipe for her popular breakfast casserole. "The best part is you can prepare it the night before, then bake it the next morning," she said.

- 10 large eggs, beaten
- ¼ cup butter, melted
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- ½ tsp. salt
- Pepper to taste
- 2 cups small curd, low-fat cottage cheese
- \* 1 cup grated Gruyere cheese
- \* 3 scallions, thinly sliced, using the white part and small amount of green tops
- \* 1 cup baby spinach leaves
- \* 4 each Roma tomatoes, thinly sliced

1. Preheat the oven to 375°. Lightly spray a 9x13-inch baking dish with cooking spray.
2. Beat eggs in bowl of electric mixer fitted with paddle attachment until frothy. Add butter, flour, salt, pepper and cottage cheese. Mix well.
3. Evenly spread cheese, scallions and spinach over bottom of baking dish. Pour egg mixture over this. Top with sliced tomatoes.
4. Bake for 40 to 45 minutes until set. Let sit covered in a warm place for 10 minutes before cutting and serving.

\*You can use numerous variations for the last four ingredients. Jodee suggests Monterey Jack cheese, chopped green chilies, 1 cup cooked and crumbled sausage, and 1/3 cup sliced and sautéed red peppers. Another variation is 1 cup Fontina cheese, 4 tbsp. chopped, fresh basil, ¼ cup chopped sun dried tomatoes and ¼ cup sliced black olives.

# Mustangs off and running

There's a fine line between the end of summer workouts and the official start of preseason camp for first-year Shoal River Middle School head football coach Ryan Gillis.

"One runs into the other," he said. "We came back July 11 after we gave them off the Fourth of July week. Since school has been moved back this year (starting Aug. 22), we are going to have plenty of time to get all of our offensive and defensive sets in."

"But really, if you have to put a dividing line on them (summer camp and preseason camp), it would be the first day in pads and the day before. That's when football actually begins."

That first day in pads for Okaloosa County middle schools will come sometime around Aug. 10, but Gillis said there is more than enough to do before the pads come on and the hitting starts.

"This time of the season — before pads and after weightlifting — we are putting in our base packages, our base offense and our base defense," he said. "That's all you can do. You can teach techniques, but this is where you get your offense installed, and then when you get in pads, you figure out who is going to be in those spots."

"What we hope as coaches is the guys we have in those spots are going to end up there, but far too many times, that isn't the case. There are football players

in pads and football players without pads. There will be several changes (in the depth chart), but you don't want to spend too much time (figuring out who will play where) after you get into pads."

Gillis, who previously was the Mustang defensive coordinator, turned philosophical when discussing why some kids don't have the makeup to play the game.

"Everybody is not a football player," he said. "Everybody is not a math teacher. The fear factor is going to come in, and some of them get over that hump, and some of them don't."

"That's where us as coaches have to make the decision, 'Is he scared or


# Selig sides with Leyland about irked umpires

Selig, asked directly about Leyland's comments, said, "Jim is right in some sense. We need to remove some of that tension."

Weiner said players approached him at an All-Star Game get-together to express concern about the state of relations with umpires.

In the final few weeks before the break, a couple of unusually bitter episodes erupted between umpires and either managers or players.

"Given what happened in the course of the last week or so," Weiner said, "there have been informal discussions between union officials and commissioner's office personnel to try to address this. I hope the process will continue."

He emphasized the importance of the issue to the players.

Selig said his office reviews major league umpiring daily. The official in Selig's office in charge of the umpires is Joe Torre, the longtime player and manager now in his first year as executive vice president for baseball operations.

Torre said at the All-Star Game that he has spoken with Leyland a few times about Leyland's concern over the relationship between umpires and teams.

"We're conscious on all sides — players, managers, umpires — to all reach the place we all want to get to," Torre said. "I'm very involved in the umpire situation. I've talked to managers about it. I've talked to several players about it. I want to get everybody's perspective and just find this place we all need to get to."

not? Is he good enough to make the play?"

About 40 players came out for the first two days of summer drills.

Gillis said that is a good number for the three-man Mustang staff, which also includes Rhett McSween and Karl Lavine, to work with.

"Last year we started our first game with 62 kids," he said. "In today's budget crunch, with three coaches, that's too many. You don't do justice to the kids. But 40 is a very manageable number."

"You would love to have a fourth coach, but again, the money situation won't allow it. But it's very manageable for three coaches to work with (40 players)."

Gillis praised his eighth-grade players for their leadership on and off the field and said he has challenged them to understand that as leaders on the team, they will determine how many games the Mustangs win or lose this year.

The Mustang veterans have their jobs made a little easier in that Gillis plans no noticeable changes in the offensive and defensive schemes.

Gillis will continue to coach the defense, and McSween, who has been on staff for several years, will call the plays on offense. McSween knows the offense well, as he worked closely with former Mustang coach Chris Sweatt before Sweatt accepted a job at Crestview.

"Different personalities are going to do little things to fit their personalities, but from the outside looking in, you are not going to be able to see a difference," Gillis said when asked about possible changes in how the Mustangs do things.

Gillis continues to count down the days until the players get into full gear.

"We are always anxious to get in pads," he said. "The kids are anxious to get in pads, and that's a good thing. Sometimes you may be a little gun-shy, but not this group."

"They are ready to get in and bang on each other now. And when they get tired of that, hopefully it will be about the time we get to bang on somebody else. I'm looking forward to it."

getting ready for the 2011 season.

The next few weeks, the Panthers will work mostly on conditioning and installing their offense and defense.



Things will pick up July 27, when local middle school teams can go in helmets for the first time. The heat will be turned up even more when teams put on full pads for the first time Aug. 1.

# Heat's Wade addresses NBA Finals debacle, lockout

DAVIE (MCT) — As he stood in front of dozens of children at his fourth annual basketball camp, Heat guard Dwyane Wade was asked by one of the counselors to give the kids advice about playing the game.

"I don't think I should be the one giving advice," he cracked. "Up 15 points, Game 2, we lose."

Last month's disaster against Dallas still stings Wade, who addressed several topics Wednesday exactly one month and one day after the Mavericks won the NBA Finals on the Heat's home court.

"The sting is always going to be there when you lose," he said, taking a brief break during his three-day camp at Nova Southeastern University in Davie. "It was obviously my first time ever losing a Finals."

"I haven't watched ESPN in a long time. Sorry, ESPN. I love the network and all. It's still hard to watch basketball. But you've got to move on. We've got a lot more basketball left in our lives, and we'll get another crack at it."

Trying to put the season in perspective, Wade said, "We wanted to win a championship. We understand that it was a failure. It was a failure for the Miami Heat and for every team that didn't win. Outside of the Dallas Mavericks, everyone else failed."

"But the things we did aren't erased. We had a good year. We had a darned good year. If we had won the championship, it would have been a pretty amazing year. It wasn't pretty amazing, but it was pretty good."

For the second time in six days, Wade said he would consider playing overseas if the NBA lockout stretches into next season.

"One thing I can say is I'm not ruling it out," he said. "At the end of the day, we get that itch as a basketball player. You want to play the game. I have no idea when I will get that itch. We've never been here before. It's not something you wake up every day thinking about."

Asked when that would be an appealing option, Wade said, "I don't know."

One effect of the lockout is that the Heat players cannot go to American Airlines Arena to work out, something they are accustomed to doing on their own.

"I'm so used to driving up to 601 Biscayne Boulevard," Wade said. "But there are other gyms I'm able to go to. I have a few gyms I've been a part of building up. I won't have a problem getting into a gym anytime I want."

"I don't miss it yet. I'm only a month away from the game. I've got two more weeks to relax before I get

back to it."

But if the lockout stretches into September and beyond, "Obviously, I will miss it, and everyone will, because you're used to getting into a rhythm and schedule," Wade said. "When that schedule is off, everything is off."

Meanwhile, Wade remained noncommittal about whether he will play in next summer's London Olympics. Wade was a member of the U.S. Olympic teams in 2004 and 2008.

"I'm in the middle," he said. "It depends on health. It depends on if I have a position, (if) the team needs me. I'd be honored, but there will be a lot to go into that decision. That's so far

away from right now."

For now, Wade will focus on this camp, his fantasy camp (for people 35 and older) and an August trip to China on behalf of Nike.

"I haven't been back to China since the (2008) Olympics. I'm excited to finally go back over there and enjoy China," said Wade, who attended a fashion show in France last month. "I read on Twitter and Facebook a lot of the fans want me to come back (to China) and are already marking the day I come over there."

"I told Brand Jordan I want to go where the magic happens, where the sneakers are made. I'm a sneaker guy. These sneakers that I've been loving for

so many years, I want to go over and shake their hands that made them and thank them for doing it. When my box is coming, and I know I have some new sneakers, you know how excited I am? I want to give them that same excitement if I can."

Wade was amused by some of the questions from the campers, who are between 7 and 18.

"They asked me, 'Was LeBron (James) too selfish?' Somebody asked me about my girlfriend (actress Gabrielle Union). Someone asked, 'Did you really get fired from KFC?' Yeah, I got fired. No lockout questions. They're sensitive to them. They're stay-

ing away from it.

"The first question was, 'Is it hard to play basketball?' I said, 'No, it's not hard to play basketball. It's hard to be good.'"

Wade takes a hands-on role at the camp, which sold out all 475 slots, with a waiting list of more than 300.

"They signed up for an experience," said Wade, who held a football/basketball camp last week with Bears and former UM receiver Devin Hester in Chicago. "You want to

make sure you deliver. If I can give them my time, hopefully that means a lot to them. We're here to not only teach kids about basketball (but also) skills of life."

Wade is holding his camp in conjunction with Katina Taylor's dance camp for girls ages 6 to 14. Taylor said her husband, Jason Taylor, who will be a free agent when the NFL lockout ends, is "getting ready so that if a team calls, he will be playing."
