Community turns out for annual Homecoming parade

Baker School 11th grader Kathryn Quigg didn't get to march in this year's Homecoming parade, but that didn't deter her from painting her face in maroon and gold colors and cheering just as loudly for her friends and classmates who marched by.

"We were supposed to have a basketball and volleyball float, but..." she said, her voice trailing off before she perked up again. "But now I get to watch the whole thing."

Kathryn was among the throngs of Gator fans lining the eight-block-long route of the parade, which got underway promptly at 1:30 Friday afternoon, heralded by a blast of school resource officer Dep. Don Fountain's squad car siren.

Farther down 15th Street, Jasper Petersen, 12, and his cousin Jonas Andrew, 6, waited for the parade in the back of a Volkswagen Beetle while their cousin Micah McVay, 11, visiting from Laurel Hill, sat in a folding camp chair. They had come to see Micah's brother Garrett, a player for the Baker Area Youth Association football

team, parade by.

This year's grand marshal was Parent Teacher Organization President Susan Holley, who has held the organization's presidency for five years.

"Mr. (Tom) Shipp (Baker

School principal) came to me and asked me to be the marshal," Holley said. "It's really an honor."

Transportation projects hit funding roadblock

Some \$6 billion is needed to fund transportation projects in Okaloosa and Walton counties over the next two decades.

The Okaloosa-Walton Transportation Planning Organization is expecting to receive \$192 million in discretionary state and federal road funds during that same time frame.

"We have \$6 billion in needs and we are trying to figure out how to spend \$192 million to meet those needs," Wiley Page, a senior transportation planning group manager at Atkins company, told members of the Okaloosa-Walton TPO steering committee at a recent meeting in Crestview. "Obviously that's a huge challenge."

The TPO is in the process of updating its long-range transportation plan through the year 2035 and will seek public input from residents in Okaloosa and Walton counties on how to best spend the limited money available.

"We want to educate everyone on what we are doing and get their input on what should be done," Page said.

TPO staff members are meeting with members of organizations such as the Kiwanis and Rotary clubs to explain transportation-planning options and will hold two public forums this month.

An Oct. 24 public forum will take place in

Incubator ready to hatch

CRA board approves application process, receives award

With Council President Charles Baugh Jr. absent, the Sept. 26 meeting of the Community Redevelopment Agency board was gavelled to order by Vice President Tim Grandberry. The board received a report about the CRA's business incubator program and an honor for the city from the Florida Main Street program.

Mike Roy, chairman of

the incubator committee, reported members began development of a program vision statement. The incubator program offers a qualified owner of a new business subsidized rent in the program building and business support services for a year in exchange for a commitment to remain in the CRA district, after the yearlong incubation period.

Because the program is in its infancy, Roy said the committee would work

with initial applicants to develop program criteria to assure they meet the needs of emerging businesses.

"Then we can go back and see if there are other things required when we see what types of businesses are applying," Roy said.

The probable incubator site, a recently renovated building on Woodruff Avenue, could be used for several types of business, including professional offices or retail space, Roy said.

"On the application pro-

cess, if you get four or five applications, do you have criteria for which types of business you will want to award the incubator to?" Council Member Phillip Berezo asked.

Roy said the program is open to any business that can present a sound business plan and has a feasibility of success.

After getting a nod from city attorney Ben Holley, the CRA board unanimously approved the application with a caveat that explains

the form is part of the information gathering process and could be revised. The board also unanimously asked Holley to prepare a lease agreement for the successful incubator applicant.

During the brief meeting, Main Street Crestview Association President Ellis Conner presented a Florida Main Street award of merit to Crestview for "Outstanding Public Improvement"

oldest son Nathan's position as this year's Baker JROTC battalion commander. When the parade began, with his saber gleaming in the afternoon sun, Nathan led his battalion and the rest of the parade.

Parading units ranged from cheerleaders riding on fire engines to trailers filled with football players, plus a procession of convertibles, each with a member of homecoming court royalty perched elegantly on the tonneau. Smokey Bear waved happily from atop a Division of Forestry Truck, and several floats sported mounted deer head trophies, a good-natured jab at the Gators' game-time opponents, the Bozeman Bucks.

As each vehicle passed, barrages of sweets flew through the air and showered the cheering crowds, and kids of all ages scrambled for a cascade of Sweet-Tarts, Tootsie Rolls, Smarties, Dots and Twizzlers.

in recognition of the streetscape improvements done to Main Street in recent years.

"I think that was really the spark that started the current ongoing revitalization process," Main Street program manager Ryan Arvey said later. "It was that investment from the city that turned things around."

Also recognized by the state organization was Crestview Plumbing and Hardware, a Main Street fixture since the 1930s that received the Outstanding Business award "for staying loyal to Main Street," Arvey said. MSCA board member Cal Zethmayr was presented an "Outstanding Local Volunteer" award of merit.

"He puts his heart into it," Arvey praised.

Conner also expressed his appreciation to the Okaloosa Arts Alliance-North committee, which produced a series of three Music and Arts on Main Street festivals again this year, for helping raise \$2,500 for the Crestview High School band's expenses to appear in the Rose Parade in Pasadena, Calif. (See story on A5)

In a report about upcoming downtown events, Conner reported that more than half the booths have been rented for the Oct. 29 Fall Festival. The MSCA will bring a circus to town on Nov. 10, 11 and 12, and members are getting ready for the annual Christmas pa-

An Oct. 25 public forum is planned in Santa Rosa Beach from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the Coastal Branch Library community room, located at 437 Greenway Trail.

At issue is the TPO's long-range transportation plan, which is updated every five years and will be submitted to the state in March of next year.

The TPO has come up with a "wish list" of road projects and transportation needs and has to decide what to fund on the list with available funds to develop a cost feasible plan, said Christy Johnson, a regional planner with the West Florida Regional Planning Council.

The planning council will present three transportation-planning scenarios to the Okaloosa-Walton TPO at an Oct. 20 meeting at the Niceville Community Center beginning at 3 p.m. The same planning scenarios will be presented at the public forums.

The problem is the high cost of transportation projects, which get more expensive each year. Take a proposed western bypass around Crestview using P.J. Adams Parkway that would cost an estimated \$100 million, said Okaloosa County Public Works Director John Hofstad.

"My annual CIP (Capital Improvement Project) funding is \$5 million to \$7 million, depending on what we have planned for that year," Hofstad said. "So how many years do I have to forgo road improvements to get that project done?"

TPO steering committee member Tom Stein, a public transit advocate from Walton County, believes more funding is needed for public transportation to help alleviate traffic congestion.

"It seems to me in the long run, it's a more prac-

tical solution than paving over the world until there's nowhere to go, except on the road," Stein said.

Hofstad agreed that public transportation would be helpful if people would use it.

"I don't get calls for, 'When are you going to increase the bus routes?'" Hofstad said. "We get those calls, but the bulk of the calls we get are about how do we move traffic from point A to point B."

"My concern is that I have capacity issues. I have corridor management issues. I have evacuation issues that need to be addressed in this county. Without expansion of (State Road) 123, without planning for a bypass around Crestview, without expansion of (State Road) 85, we're not addressing those issues."

There are other funds available. Some \$72 million in state and federal funds is earmarked for transportation improvements on roads in Okaloosa and Walton counties listed on the state's Strategic Intermodal System, or SIS.

That money can only be spent on roads on the SIS list, such as U.S. Highways 331 and 98 and State Roads 85 and 123.

Roads listed on the SIS are designated for major capacity expansion.

Money from the discretionary \$192 million, dubbed arterial dollars, can be spent on any transportation projects, however, including those listed on the SIS.

"For example, (future work on) State Road 123 is only funded (with SIS dollars) through right of way," Page said. "If we want to construct that, we have two choices. We can wait and see if DOT (Florida Department of Transportation) finds SIS dollars to put towards it, or, as part of the long-range plans, we can say that those projects are very important to this area, therefore we want to program our arterial dollars to get those constructed."

Truck crashes into pharmacy; none injured

Merchandise was scattered on the floor and a carved wooden sign, a framed photo and literature holders were scattered around on top of a dislodged section of countertop inside Moulton's Pharmacy after a Ford F-

150 pickup truck crashed into the north side wall of the North Ferdon Boulevard drug store around noon Thursday.

The driver, an older man, said he accidentally hit the gas pedal instead of his brakes as he was pulling into a parking spot.

"I almost got it stopped," he said.

However, he still embedded the nose of the truck into the wall a few inches, creating a hole measuring approximately 8 feet wide by 5 feet tall in the brick facade.

Inside the store, a section of the Sheetrock wall was bowed inward and cracked, with pieces dislodged and merchandise

knocked off shelves in the vicinity.

"It was scary!" exclaimed a Moulton's employee who was working behind the prescription counter. "It sounded like a big, dang bomb going off."

As Crestview police and fire department responders investigated inside and outside the building, cus-

tomers continued to come and go, weaving around the officials outside the store and stepping over baskets of merchandise employees had gathered off the floor inside.

No injuries were reported in the mishap, and after firefighters cleared as many dislodged bricks as they could from the ve-

hicle's hood, a friend of the driver was able to back the vehicle out of the hole and over the concrete parking curb stop that the truck had jumped.

Crestview Police Department spokesman Lt. Andrew Schneider said officers are still completing their investigation of the accident.

March to Pasadena picks up steam 'Huge collaboration' yields \$2,500 for CHS band

The fruits of many Crestview High School band members' summer labors returned to the Big Red Machine the morning of Sept. 22 with the presentation of a check for \$2,500 to band director Jody Dunn and CHS Principal Bob Jones. The money came from a collaboration between the local arts organization and downtown businesses.

Proceeds from two of the Okaloosa Arts Alliance-North committee's Music and Arts on Main Street (MAMS) summer festivals, held in conjunction with the Main Street Crestview Association, comprised the bulk of the funds.

Viola Owens of Hart Printing, a MSCA board

member, had approached the arts alliance in 2010 to see if the organizations could work together to create a summer music and arts event in downtown Crestview to draw residents into the city's historic heart, OAA-N chairwoman Rae Schwartz explained.

"This year OAA-N wanted to show support for the Big Red Machine and help them on their journey to the Rose Parade, so we worked on ways to use the MAMS events to help the band," Schwartz said. "These efforts included having the jazz band as our featured performer for our July edition.

"This coincided with the Main Street Association's King of the Wings contest," Schwartz continued. "Band parents manned

the drinks concession arranged by the MSCA, and also received armband money from this event."

Schwartz, who is also an MSCA board member, came up with the idea for a "Tour de Main Street" restaurant crawl, which was held during the August arts festival. Band students helped at each restaurant, and received a percentage of the armband sales. The event also included an OAA-N-sponsored dance contest, judged by the Fred Astaire Dance Studio.

"All money from that, as well as from the art opportunities offered to attendees, was donated to the band," Schwartz said.

Main Street board member Nathan Boyles donated the use of his land title company's courtyard for the performers and for

private tables, with refreshments catered by local restaurants — Not Just Cakes in July and Christopher's Uncorked Bistro in August. MSCA promotion committee chair Viola Owens and OAA-N jointly covered the publicity.

"Revenues from this allowed for more donations to the band, as well as covering event insurance for all three MAMS events," Schwartz said. "It was a huge collaboration."

The \$2,500 proceeds will be applied toward the expense of transporting more than 200 members of the band and their equipment to Pasadena, Calif., for what is one of the most viewed parades in the world, Dunn said. Several students still need financial assistance to assure their participation in the parade, he added. Call 689-7181 to offer support.

Crestview attorney indicted

PENSACOLA — Pamela C. Marsh, U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Florida, announced Friday that Crestview attorney Chris Cadenhead, 56, and three Destin residents, Jackie T. Fair, 70, Jane M. McDonald, 58, and Randolph "Randy" Branham, 44, have been arrested pursuant to a federal indictment returned earlier this week, according to a press release.

The four-count indictment charges Cadenhead, Fair and Branham in count one with conspiracy to commit bank fraud, and in count two with bribery of a loan officer; the press release states. Cadenhead, Fair and McDonald are each charged in count three with conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud and in count four with mail fraud.

The indictment alleges that in order for McDonald and Fair to obtain a penthouse condominium located in Destin, Cadenhead, Branham and Fair conspired to defraud the financial institution Southwest Georgia Farm Credit, ACA, located in Bainbridge, Ga. The indictment further alleges Cadenhead obtained a fraudulent \$700,000 loan to help fund the purchase of a penthouse condominium.

In order to obtain the loan, it is alleged that Cadenhead paid a \$50,000 bribe to a loan officer and also paid \$25,000 to Branham. Afterwards, McDonald allegedly obtained loans in her name for the penthouse condominium with the assistance of Fair and Cadenhead. It is alleged that McDonald made false statements on her loan applications.

If convicted, counts one and two each carry a maximum sentence of 30 years in prison, and counts three and four carry a maximum sentence of 20 years in prison on each count, the press

release states.

Larry J. Malone, 56, of Bainbridge, Ga., former chief lending officer for Southwest Georgia Farm Credit, was indicted by the grand jury in its July session. As part of a plea and cooperation agreement with the government, on Sept. 22, Malone pleaded guilty as charged to conspiracy to commit bank fraud and receipt of gifts or commissions for procuring a loan, the press release states.

Each of those offenses is punishable by up to 30 years in prison.

The investigation was conducted by the newly formed Northwest Florida Mortgage Fraud Task Force, a partnership between the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office.

"Investigating white collar crime can be labor intensive and time consuming," Okaloosa County Sheriff Larry Ashley stated in a press release issued after the indictment was announced. "But today's announcement from the U.S. Attorney's Office is a prime example of why those investigations are well worth the required time and effort. By participating in this new cooperative effort between local, state, and federal authorities, our agency is able to maximize our resources and our effectiveness in pursuing and catching white-collar criminals. That's not just good for law enforcement; that's good for the citizens we protect."

The case will be prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Tiffany H. Eggers.

An indictment is merely a formal charge by a grand jury that a defendant has committed a violation of federal criminal law, and each defendant is presumed innocent unless, and until, proven guilty beyond every reasonable doubt at trial.

Golden fall in the Panhandle

Each fall, nature puts on a brilliant show of color throughout the United States.

As the temperatures drop, autumn encourages the "leaf peepers" to hit the road in search of the red, yellow and orange leaves of the northern deciduous trees. Here in the Florida Panhandle, fall color means wildflowers.

As one drive the roads it's nearly impossible to not see the bright yellows in the ditches and along the wood's edge. Golden Asters (*Chrysopsis* spp.), Tickseeds (*Coreopsis* spp.), Silkgrasses (*Pityopsis* spp.), Sunflowers (*Helianthus* spp.) and Goldenrods (*Solidago* spp.) are

displaying their petals of gold at every turn.

These wildflowers are all members of the Aster family, one of the largest plant families in the world. For most, envisioning an Aster means a flower that looks like a daisy.

While many are daisy-like in structure, others lack the petals and appear more like cascading sprays. So if you are one of the many "hitting the road in search of fall color," head to open areas. For wildflowers, that means rural locations with limited homes and businesses.

Forested areas and non-grazed pastures typically have showy displays, especially when a spring burn was performed earlier in the year. With the drought we experienced, moist, low-

lying areas will naturally be the best areas to view the many golden wildflowers.

Visit the Florida Wildflower Foundation website at www.flawildflowers.org/bloom.php to see both what's in bloom and the locations of the state's prime viewing areas.

And if you want to add the Asters and many other wildflowers to your landscape join the Master Gardeners for their fall wildflower sale to be held Saturday, Oct. 15, from 8 a.m. to noon at the Okaloosa County Extension Annex, 127 N.W. Hollywood Blvd., Fort Walton Beach.

Almarante Cemetery cleanup was a chance to reminisce

The records are a little vague, but what is known is Almarante Cemetery's oldest inhabitant was born in the 1700s and that the graveyard was already established before the Civil War, decades before Laurel Hill sprung up just down the hill.

Almarante Cemetery is one of those places where a sense of history and sense of community combine. Saturday morning, about 30 volunteers, armed with

rakes, brooms, bow saws, loppers, water buckets, shovels and doughnuts, assembled in the shadow of the landmark blue water tower for the cemetery's annual cleanup.

Cemetery commissioners Tracy Curenton and Glenda Lanasse oversaw teams of workers who attacked youpon, smilax and other nuisance foliage that had sprouted up around the final resting places of many north-county families' ancestors, and reflected on the bonds of family and friendships that form

the heart of small communities like Laurel Hill.

Surnames on the markers are shared by many of the volunteers and their neighbors: Campbell, Steele, Jones, Rogers, Gaskin, Folman, Fountain, Moore, Garrett, Cadenhead, Locke, Curenton, Reeves and Stokes, to name just a few.

"This is a fun place to browse," Laurel Hill resident Janet Twitty said as she uncovered a homemade slab that had been covered by soil and weeds.

"There's a lot of history out here," agreed Bertie Ann Curenton, who had just finished raking magnolia leaves out of one of the oldest plot enclosures in the cemetery.

Markers ranged from elaborate to simple; ornately carved marble memorials or a name and dates lovingly drawn in wet cement, in which sea shells or flat stones were imbedded for decoration. There were the solemn flat slabs provided by the government for military members, as well as the rustic stone tree stumps carved for members of the Woodmen of the World.

The stories of those buried beneath those markers contribute to the richness of the region. Before there was Laurel Hill, there was the Almirante community (it was spelled a little differently back then). Family historian Mark Curenton paused while yanking shrubby roots out of the planter in front of the cemetery's sign to share some background.

"The Almirante Presbyterian Church was on this site," he said, waving his hand toward the towering magnolias in the center of the cemetery. "I remember there was an

old chapel over there," he said, pointing to the northeast section.

"The cemetery really didn't get started until the railroad came through in the early 1900s," Curenton said.

Many of the markers also record moments in the nation's history. Warriors from America's wars are everywhere, including heroes from both sides of the Civil War, plus the Mexican-American War, World War I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War.

Scouts of Crestview Boy Scout Troop 30 did a survey of the cemetery in 2009 and identified 1,194 graves. But there are new ones that have since been added, plus quite a few more they couldn't have found.

"There's a bunch of graves that just aren't marked," Tracy Curenton said. "They had wooden markers that rotted away, or stone markers that got carried off."

The circle of life was evident Saturday morning. Among the volunteers, pushing a wheelbarrow of pulled weeds, was Tristan Locke, 3, who joined three generations of family members tidying up the graves of their ancestors and friends. They took a breather to gather with their dearly departed to sing "Happy Birthday" to Tristan's grandmother, Pat Locke.

"All these little children have worked so hard today," Glenda Lanasse observed.

Their ancestors were undoubtedly smiling contentedly.



Bridgeway cancels services contract

Bridgeway Center Inc. announces the cancellation of their contracts with the Northwest Florida Area Agency on Aging as the lead agency for Okaloosa County for the General Revenue contract, Older Americans Act contract and the Home and Community Based Waiver Aged and Disabled Adult Case Management Referral Agreement contracts effective as of Sept. 30.

BCI completed a comprehensive review of the Senior Services contracts, as well as considered different reimbursement schedules as it is anticipated that the current state of Florida reimbursements will continue to decline.

BCI has experienced a reduction in funding from the state of Florida. This resulted in the decision to relinquish these contracts after six years.

Daniel Cobbs, MPA, FACHE, chief executive officer of BCI, said, "The continuing reduction of short-term and long-term Senior Services' federal, state, and county funding hampers our ability to balance the Senior Services budget. We exhausted all remedies to maintain BCI's quality standards

and balance the Senior Services' budget."

BCI's costs for safety, regulatory and quality requirements, i.e., medical records, building costs, facility/equipment maintenance costs, as well as insurance costs as a psychological healthcare center continue to escalate in the face of declining reimbursements.

It is projected that the new contractor will be announced in October by Northwest Florida Area Agency on Aging. BCI will work closely with the NWFAAA and the new contractor to transition these programs with minimal disruption to the Senior Citizens currently receiving services.

In her letter to BCI confirming the change, Dottie Peoples, Northwest Florida Area Agency on Aging executive director, said, "It is with regret that we lose your agency as a lead agency in Okaloosa County. You and your staff are to be commended for the professionalism, courtesy and quality of service provided to seniors in Okaloosa County since you were awarded the contract in November 2005. You are a great group to work with and I appreciate all you have done for us."

Fla. insurer agrees to phase in rate hike

TALLAHASSEE (AP) — Florida's largest insurer of homes and businesses has agreed to lower a proposed rate hike for sinkhole coverage that would take effect next year.

But some critics said the move didn't go far enough and they still want state legislators to change the law that allowed the state-backed Citizens Property Insurance Corp. to propose increasing rates for sinkhole coverage by more than 400 percent statewide and as much as 2,000 percent in counties such as Orange and Hillsborough.

The board that oversees Citizens held an emergency

conference call last month and voted to cap rate hikes for sinkhole coverage to 50 percent in 2012 and then phase in future hikes over the next several years.

The move comes amid a growing backlash from the public and politicians over the proposed rate hikes, which still must be approved by state regulators.

Carlos Lacasa, chairman of the Citizens board, said the decision to phase in the rate hikes was an attempt to highlight "the severity of the sinkhole claims crisis while allowing time" for provisions of a new state law to "moderate future rate need."

State legislators this year

passed a sweeping property insurance bill that they contended would help to drive down costs for private insurers and would help stabilize the state's fragile market.

A significant portion of the new law took aim at sinkhole coverage, and it allows Citizens to raise its rates to whatever level it believes is necessary to offset losses. The company has more than 1.4 million policyholders across the state.

In 2010, Citizens received about \$32 million in premiums for sinkhole coverage, with ultimate losses and loss-related expenses estimated to total \$245 million. Since the last major

hurricane hit Florida in 2005, sinkhole claims have skyrocketed, totaling nearly \$2 billion in the last four years. Most of the claims have come from Hernando, Hillsborough and Pasco counties, part of the Tampa Bay area.

The new law includes provisions intended to cut down on sinkhole claims including putting a time limit on when claims could be filed.

Chief Financial Officer Jeff Atwater and other Republican leaders who backed the new law contended Citizens officials were not taking into account how it would cut down on claims.

By state law, the committee is required to be made up of representatives from a variety of demographic groups that are, in one way or another, involved in high school sports.

The committee meets in Gainesville four times a year. We had our first meeting of the 2011-12 school year on at noon Sept. 25. It's not my idea of a great Sunday morning to get up at a 6 a.m. and drive across the state for a meeting, but I'm honored to serve on the committee, and it was worth the trip.

The first meeting was something of a get acquainted time, but we did discuss some issues that were brought to the table.

Being new to the committee, I'm still learning what we do, but the following paragraph taken from the FHSAA website at www.fhsaa.org details the responsibilities of the Public Liaison Advisory Committee.

"The authority and duties of the Public Liaison Advisory Committee are to act as a conduit through which the general public may have input into the decision-making process of the Association and to assist the Association in the development of procedures regarding the receipt of public input and disposition of complaints related to high school athletic and competition programs; to conduct public hearings annually in each of the four administrative sections during which interested parties may address issues regarding the effectiveness of the rules, operation,

 In a cruel twist of fate for Crestview, Godby's first score came when Jalen Richard recovered a Cougar fumble and advanced it six yards into the end zone, capping the long drive with the game's first touchdown.

Ironically enough, the first Bulldog score of the night, a safety, came after a Khalil Foster pass was intercepted inside the Godby 10-yard line.
 The snap got away from Cougar quarterback Dennis Andrews, but Andrews was able to beat Crestview to the ball in the end zone as the Bulldogs took a 2-0 lead.

Crestview managed to gain just 19 yards after setting up shop at the Bulldog 49 following the Cougar free kick.

When the Bulldog drive stalled at the Cougar 32, Godby went to the short passing game on the ensuing drive as Andrews hit Khalid Thomas and tight end Laith Harlow on a series of quick passes.

The Cougars were on the Bulldog 19 when Andrews hit Thomas with a pass that popped loose around the 6, but Richard scooped up the ball and carried it in for the score with 5:51 left in the half.

Godby scored late in the first half when Jaylin Heyword scored from seven yards out following a Bulldog fumble.

Foster's second interception of the game led to a 33-yard touchdown pass from Andrews to Kenny Young, as Godby took control of the game, leading 20-2.

The Bulldogs (2-3) still had some fight in them.

Early in the fourth quarter, Andrew Thomas rumbled 39 yards for Crestview on a fake punt to give the Bulldogs a first down at the Godby 12-yard line. Four plays later, Micah Reed scored Crestview's only touchdown of the game from four yards out.

With 9:34 left in the game, Crestview trailed 20-8.

their hands full with the Vikings.

"I think that Fort Walton Beach is a great football team," Pettis said. "Coach (Mike) Owens and his coaches do a great job."

"They've got some cats that can play. We've got to show up and do what we do. We've got to play."

Pettis said the keys to the game will be limiting turnovers, playing good defense and keeping Viking quarterback Ryan Thompson in check.

"We have to make sure that quarterback doesn't get

out and hurt us, because he's pretty good," Pettis said. "We've got to keep their offense off the field and give our defense some breaks and just not put our defense in bad situations."

"We have to make them drive the field on us, because I feel pretty good about our defense."

The Bulldog offense should get a big boost with the return of starting quarterback Dakota Dean, who has missed the last two games recovering from an ankle injury.

"It is huge having him

back," Pettis said. "He can run our offense. Without him, it limits what we can do on offense."

"Until we can throw the ball a little bit, it's going to be tough. We do a great job of running the football, and our offensive line is good. We have to be able to get them (the defense) out of the box (crowding the line to stop the run)."

After running the gauntlet of a tough non-district schedule, Pettis knows the Bulldogs have little or no room for error the rest of the season with only district games

left. Pettis also knows the importance of the game for the Vikings.

"Our next five games are must-wins if we want to win our district," he said. "It is good if we can find a way to win this game because it will put us in a great position going into the Choctaw game (next week)."

"I think from this point out, every game is a must win. I think if you are 0-2 in the district, you need an awful lot of help. I know they are going to be geared up for this game because it is their second game."

If you have a complaint, there's a link for public input on the FHSAA website that will send the question or complaint to the committee.

I'll be the first to admit that there have been times that I have felt that the FHSAA was just another big organization that had lost sight of the main thing involving high school athletics in Florida. What I'm now learning though is the FHSAA does care in ways that often get lost in the process as the

organization sets the rules and regulations needed to govern the more than two dozen sports and thousands of student-athletes in the state.


The FHSAA is trying to provide our young people with an enjoyable athletic experience. I can assure you people at the FHSAA are listening as well.

Triploid grass carp an aquatic plant management tool

Florida's freshwater fisheries and wildlife are dependent on natural aquatic vegetation. Rooted aquatic plants stabilize shorelines, prevent erosion, reduce turbidity (muddy water), provide cover for fish, feed insects and waterfowl, help reduce algal blooms and help anglers locate sport fish.

Invasive plant species, however, can be harmful and have few natural checks. The spread of water lettuce, hyacinth and hydrilla are examples of nonnative plants that require management.

Proposals in the late 1960s and early 1970s to stock open water bodies with diploid (fertile) grass carp to feed on nonnative plants quickly became controversial. These Asian carp spawn in similar habitats to striped bass, and naturally reproducing populations could have gotten out of control

and wreaked havoc on native plant and wildlife communities.

Florida helped lead the way with grass carp research, determining their food habits and helping create triploid (functionally sterile) grass carp. Florida biologists also developed the certification program using Coulter Counters, which the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and many state agencies use to ensure only triploid grass carp are stocked. However, even with sterile fish, if too many grass carp are stocked and plants are

eliminated, the problem might last as long as the fish are alive or longer, and that can be more than 15 years.

Thus far, in Florida, there are no documented cases of grass carp spawning in the wild. Recently, however, Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) biologists discovered a few diploid escapees in the Suwannee River, having come from flooding in bordering states. This caused renewed concern and the need to repeat the message about the importance of stocking only

triploid grass carp.

So legitimate concerns revolve around use of grass carp, and a full gamut of options for aquatic plant management is considered, depending on circumstances. In 2008, the FWC participated in "A Risk Analysis Pertaining to Use of Triploid Grass Carp for Biological Control of Aquatic Plants." The review concluded that in public waters, agencies should develop management plans for each stocking. The safest approach was determined to be an initial herbicide treatment followed by low-level stocking of triploid grass carp.

The FWC's Invasive Plant Management Section also recently concluded a public review process to create a new "Agency Position on Hydrilla Management." The position recognizes that native aquatic plant communities provide ecological functions

to support diverse fish and wildlife populations. Hydrilla, as an invasive, nonnative plant, requires management. However, in water bodies where hydrilla is established, the FWC will manage it in light of the primary use of the water body. Plans will incorporate public input, be adaptive and reflect local conditions.

Chemical control is expensive (up to \$750 per acre per year). Mechanical control is about twice as costly as chemical control. Biological controls using insects or diseases have not proved suitable for managing hydrilla, leaving triploid grass carp as the most effective biocontrol.

These fish can control certain aquatic plants in moderate-sized lakes at a cost of \$20 to \$250 per acre. In private ponds, golf course ponds, irrigation ditches and similar locations, where sport fishing is not the primary activity, certified

triploid grass carp provide an environmentally sound, cost-effective way of controlling aquatic plants. Such stockings require a permit from the FWC. The Invasive Plant Management Section issues nearly 1,500 such permits annually, saving users money and reducing herbicide use.

FWC personnel also plan and stock triploid grass carp in public waters. Currently, staff is monitoring about 100 locations. However, in situations where sport fisheries and waterfowl hunting are important, the fish might eat too many plants, destroy important habitat, adversely affect recreation and negatively affect the local economy.

Huntin' season is crankin' up

Football season is in full swing, and the 2011-12 hunting season is cranking up. Heck, in Zone A, they're already into general gun season. But for the rest of us, I'd like to cover the rules and regulations regarding two hunting seasons that are just around the corner: muzzleloading gun and the first phase of dove.

Immediately following the close of crossbow season in each zone, the muzzleloader gun season begins. Season dates run Nov. 19 to Dec. 2 in Zone B, Oct. 22 to Nov. 4 in Zone C and Dec. 3-9 in Zone D.

During muzzleloader gun season, bows and crossbows are also legal methods of taking game on private lands, in addition to muzzleloaders. But

on wildlife management areas (WMAs), only muzzleloaders may be used.

The most common types of game to take during muzzleloader season are deer and wild hog. Only

bucks may be taken, and one antler must be at least 5 inches long above the hairline. The daily bag limit on antlered deer is two. You can hunt wild hogs year-round on private lands, and there are

no bag or size limits. It's also legal to shoot gobblers and bearded turkeys during muzzleloader gun season. You may take only one per day, and there's a two-bird fall-season limit. But you can't hunt turkeys in Holmes County during the fall and winter. On WMAs,

bag limits and antler/size restrictions can differ, so check the specifics of the area before you hunt.

Legal shooting hours are a half-hour before sunrise to a half-hour after sunset. Except for turkeys, hunters may take resident game over feed such as corn on private lands. No baiting is allowed on WMAs, however. For hunting deer, muzzleloaders firing single bullets must be at least .40-caliber. Guns firing two or more balls must be 20-gauge or larger. You may not use muzzleloaders that take smokeless powder, ones that can be loaded from the breech or those with self-contained cartridge ammunition capabilities during muzzleloader gun season.

The first phase of the mourning and white-winged dove season begins Oct. 1 and ends Oct. 24 statewide.

Shooting hours during this first phase are noon to sunset, and there's a 15-bird daily bag limit.

The only firearm you're allowed to use for hunting doves is a shotgun, but you can't use one larger than a 10-gauge. Shotguns must be plugged to a three-shell capacity (magazine and chamber combined).

You may hunt doves over an agricultural field, as long as the crop has been planted and manipulated under normal agricultural practices. However, it's against the law to scatter agricultural products over an area for the purpose of baiting.

Some things you can't do while dove hunting include using rifles, pistols or crossbows; shooting from a moving vehicle; and herding or driving doves with a vehicle.

In addition to a Florida hunting license, you'll need a \$5 muzzleloader gun permit to hunt during muzzleloader season. To hunt deer, you need a \$5 deer permit, and if you'd like to take a fall turkey, you'll need a \$10 turkey permit (\$125 for nonresidents). If you're going to hunt doves, you'll need a no-cost migratory bird permit, and if you hunt on a WMA, you also must have a management area permit, which costs \$26.50.

All are available at your local county tax collector's office; through license agents; by calling 888-HUNT-FLORIDA; or by going online to www.fl.wildlifelicenses.com.

So if you're going after that monster buck during the muzzleloader gun season or dove hunting with friends and family, I hope I've helped explain some of Florida's rules and regulations.






