Crestview FAMU center on schedule

School officials visit with city, county & state representatives

Jobs and permanent staff members are already starting to trickle into Crestview as work proceeds in earnest on renovations to the historic Alatex Building to convert it into the Florida A&M University Rural Diversity Healthcare Center, which will offer degrees leading to a pharmacy license.

"We've started reaching out to the community to get resumes," said David Delancy, president of One Day Came, the project's construction management firm, adding that between 20 and 40 construction jobs

will be available.

Delancy joined FAMU officials and dignitaries from the state, county and city of Crestview, as well as community civic and business leaders for a meet-and-greet Thursday at the Crestview Community Center. Among them was former state Sen. Durell Peaden, who initiated the project, and his successor, Sen. Greg Evers, who vowed, "You have my word I will continue Senator Peaden's legacy."

"The thing that really made us feel at home is when we had former employees of Alatex come out

It's B-U-L-L-D-O-G-S

Principal nudges Crestview High 'back to our roots'

Crestview High School Principal Bob Jones has a gentle reminder about the school mascot; it is spelled B-U-L-L-D-O-G-S, not D-A-W-G-S, Jones said.

"DAWGS," he said, belittles the school's distinguished traditions and diverts attention from its heritage.

"The crux of the matter is, when Crestview High School opened in 1922, at that time the nickname they picked was the Bulldogs, B-U-L-L-D-O-G-S," Jones said.

Jones, who was an

assistant football coach at CHS in the 1980s, traces the "Dawg" nickname to that era, a copycat in response to the University of Georgia, which had started referring to its mascot as a "dawg" instead of the original bulldog.

"It became a nickname adopted by one of our own coaches," Jones said.

Crestview High School rivals, at the south end of Okaloosa County in particular, took much delight in deriding the Dawgs as being country rustics who were too ignorant to even know how to spell "dog," Jones said. When he became principal of CHS in June, he again received gentle ribbing from fellow educators.

"Some people thought of Crestview as a bunch of country hicks who

TWEAKING THE BUDGET

Council revises budget, boosts mayor's salary, starts clerk search

The Crestview City Council unanimously passed a resolution at its Oct. 10 meeting adjusting the city's budget for the fiscal year that started Oct. 1, and gave Mayor David Cadle a \$5,000 raise at the same time.

"The reason for this resolution is, as I was pulling the budget together, there were some things that were inadvertently omitted from the budget as advertised," Finance Director Patti Beebe explained. "Since the budget was adopted, we have gotten word from a couple of sources that the revenue

we projected will not be as great as we expected."

The most significant increase was a \$161,000 expenditure in the general fund for police services, increasing the Crestview Police Department's budget to \$5.26 million. An adjustment of \$8,383 to the library's budget was needed when Okaloosa County informed the city that its original contribution was less than now projected.

A capital outlay of \$6,900 had been left off the street department's budget and \$8,239 in radon surcharge fees was not figured into the budget. Engineering fees of

couldn't even spell their own mascot's name correctly," Jones said. "All I'm trying to do is get us back to our roots. A lot of kids like calling themselves 'Dawgs,' but we're supposed to be a school and model good academics."

For some of the school's students, however, how they identify themselves isn't a very big issue.

"We're just going to go out and do our own thing," junior Ryan Vance said.

"Whether we're Dawgs or Bulldogs, we're still the Crestview High School. We're going to be ourselves and show everybody what Crestview's all about, whether it's sports or fine arts or academics or anything else."

And while he's at it, Jones has also reminded faculty, coaches and staff that the school colors are red and white. Black is not part of Bulldogs' palette, "though it can make the red and white pop out," he concedes.

The traditional Crestview High red-and-white color scheme, Jones points out, is even codified in the school coat-of-arms, a framed copy of which hangs in the main office.

"Black is a trim color and is OK when used to accentuate the red or white," he said. "But it's starting to take over."

When the football team showed up with black pants as part of their uniform and some student organizations started wearing black T-shirts, Jones decided it was time for a reality — and tradition — check.

"We're the Bulldogs," Jones said emphatically, "and our colors are red and white."

and sit in that hot sun with us to see that wonderful building transition from a factory to an educational center," FAMU President James Ammons said.

"It was very important to me that local jobs are going to be created from this project," Ammons continued. "Our primary goal is to get it done with local business people."

Bradley Will, vice president of operations for main contractor Peter Brown Construction, said his company has hired several local subcontractors through the state competitive bid process. The project is well-timed given the state of the economy, he said.


"It's not creating jobs, it's saving jobs," Will said.

"We believe in keeping the dol-

lars in Okaloosa County," Delancy added. Project architect David Vincent, senior vice president of Panama City-based JRA Architects, agreed.

"This has been a godsend to us," Vincent said. "Work has been slow."

Vincent said his firm's design will repurpose many of the wooden components salvaged from the original construction. Floor and baseboards are being refinished and the heavy wooden columns with their distinctive Y-braces will find new uses. He also praised the soundness of the historic downtown Crestview structure.

"We were shocked when we had a restoration expert look at the building," Vincent said. "He said it was built like a tank."

"It's going to have a building inside the building," Delancy said, describing the steel superstructure that will be placed inside the original red brick outer wall.

JobsPlus and Trojan Labor have been tasked with screening workers for the contractors involved in the project. Both were represented at the Thursday mid-day event.

"Our plan is to gather people from the local community," Amy Freeland, a Trojan Labor representative, said. Seven full-time professional positions have already been filled, said FAMU pharmacy school Associate Dean Dr. Myron Honeywell, including five Crestview residents. Among them is native Kristina Litrell, who will be the school's program assistant. "She will be responsible for making sure we get our accreditation," Honeywell said. "We're so happy to have her on board."

"It is so important to us to have local people on board to make this a success," Ammons said as he welcomed Litrell to the FAMU family.

FAMU has established temporary offices on Spring Street in downtown Crestview, within three blocks of the Alatex building, where an advance team of university officials are already planning for the pharmacy school's opening next summer. Crestview City Council President Charles Baugh Jr. said research by the University of West Florida Haas Center shows the school will ultimately generate 269 jobs and have between \$15 and \$20 million in financial impact on the community. "It brings the hopes and aspirations for 21,000 people in the city of Crestview," Baugh said. FAMU director of facilities Sam Houston said the project is on schedule, with construction planned to wrap up in June 2012 and the first class beginning in August. School officials plan to admit classes of 30 students each until the school reaches its 120-student capacity, Honeywell said. "We understand how special this project is, not only to FAMU but to the city of Crestview," Delancy said. "The more people I meet on this project and in Crestview makes me realize how important this project is."

Bright pink boas wrapped the antique chandeliers, pink flowers graced each table, and paper parasols hung from the private party area ceiling of Christopher's Uncorked Bistro for the American Business Women's Association's 4th annual breast cancer survivor dinner.

The event serves as the October meeting for the group and celebrates breast cancer survivors in the area. Nine survivors were honored. One survivor has celebrated 20 years of being cancer free, while another was two and a half years cancer free. The group has a combined 67 1/2 years of being cancer free after treatment. Early diagnosis and early treatment were attributed to the impressive numbers.

Survivors were treated to dinner and given a pink basket of breast cancer awareness items that included a coveted pink feather boa.

"I lost my grandmother to breast cancer," said ABWA member Anita Kirkland to the group. "Our hats are off to you as survivors."

Karen Englert is a breast-cancer survivor and shared her story as the guest speaker.

A senior account executive for Gentiva Health Services for the past 22 years, Englert was diagnosed with fibrocystic breasts in her 20s and had a benign papilloma and several cysts treated. In a 2006 visit to Dr. Angel Williamson, the doctor returned to the room with several places on her test results circled in red. Days later, at a follow-up appointment with a surgeon, Englert asked for them to "give her

the good news." The surgeon's response: "I wish I could."

"Now when I share my story, I always tell people to bring a loved one to any follow-up appointments because when those words — breast cancer — are said, you hear nothing else," she said. "My diagnosis after the lumpectomy was ductal carcinoma in situ."

Englert, 65, had 36 treatments of radiation and has been cancer-free for five years.

Renowned violinist Ingrid Roberts played "Somewhere Over the Rainbow" for the occasion and brought tears to the eyes of many audience members during the rendition, which she described as a song of hope.

Tammy and Chris Odom own Christopher's Uncorked Bistro. Tammy is an active member of ABWA

and the couple worked at one time as certified orthotic fitters. Their work with prosthetics and women diagnosed with breast cancer led to their donation during the dinner of numerous prosthetics, specialized bras, and wigs to the American Cancer Society.

Diane Maldonado, ACS Unit executive director, accepted the donation and explained that the donations would go to the ACS "gift closets."

"One of the important outreach works of the ACS is our gift closets located throughout Okaloosa, Holmes and Walton counties," Maldonado said. "Women who need head coverings, mastectomy bras, and breast prostheses and can not afford them — as many do not have insurance — are assisted through the program. These will be put to great use as there is nothing like helping a woman to feel better about herself."

One dead in Wednesday wreck on S.R. 123

A 71-year-old man died Wednesday night from injuries sustained in a two-vehicle wreck on State Road 123.

Joe Robert Carson of Fort Walton Beach was pronounced dead almost an hour after the vehicle he was riding in was hit by an oncoming vehicle.

According to a Florida Highway Patrol release, Michael Andrew Panetti, 24, of Crestview, was driving in the northbound lane of S.R. 123 around 9:20 p.m. when, for unknown reasons, he allowed his vehicle to drift into the southbound lane.

Annie Payne Carson, 69, told troopers she saw the 2011 Hyundai Tuscon come into her path and tried to

make an evasive maneuver to avoid a collision, but could not get out of the path of Panetti's vehicle.

Carson's 2009 Nissan Altima and the Hyundai collided.

Joe Robert Carson was pronounced dead at 10:20 p.m. at Fort Walton Beach Medical Center.

Panetti, Annie Carson and Carson's backseat passenger, James Calvin

Payne, 52, were transported to Fort Walton Beach Medical Center with serious injuries.

Panetti was not wearing a seat belt. Annie Carson and her two passengers were belted into the vehicle.

Charges are pending further investigation.

Both vehicles sustained about \$12,000 in damages, the report said.

City RFPs receive close scrutiny

After the recent debacle involving the selection of a concessionaire to run Crestview's ball field concession stands, the Crestview City Council has become especially diligent in making sure city-issued requests for proposals (RFPs), requests for qualifications (RFQs) and subsequent contracts have been thoroughly scrutinized be-

fore they're issued.

After Finance Director Patti Beebe reported bids had been received for auditing services for the 2012-13 fiscal year, council member Robyn Helt asked if City Attorney Ben Holley had had the opportunity to review the RFP.

"The council has unanimously requested in the past that all RFPs be reviewed by Mr. Holley," Helt said. "There's no secret why that is. Every time we have an RFP and the council takes action, there are always questions."

The concessionaire contract was later rescinded by the council and will be reissued, but meanwhile both top-ranked bidders have retained lawyers and filed bid protests, with one of the lawyers threatening legal action against the city.

"Just to avoid any possibility of having to rebid, I would like for the city attorney to review both the RFP and the recommendation and the score sheets before the council takes action on the recommendation," Helt said.

When a contract for city informational technology services was brought up later in the same Oct. 10 meeting, Helt again warned that unless Holley had read the contract, she would not

recommend approval.

"I'm not taking action on something unless I know the i's were dotted and the t's were crossed in the RFP and the contract. Period."

Helt's colleagues agreed with her stance, voting unanimously to send the auditing service's RFP and documentation to Holley for review.

"There will be a two-week delay but I'd rather be right the first time," Council President Charles Baugh Jr. said.

After Holley said he had approved the IT contract, the council voted unanimously to accept it.

In other matters, the council:

- Received a report from council member Ben Iannucci following his recent participation in the statewide Energy Environmental Quality Committee. In his report, presented on green PowerPoint slides, Iannucci recommended the city adopt an energy action plan and extend its recycling program, among other suggestions.

- Discussed issues in the Parks and Recreation Department, including an unauthorized concessions vending truck that appears at city-sponsored athletic events, and a photographer offering photo

packages at youth athletic games, who is not operating under a city contract but allegedly represents herself as the city's official sports photography contractor.

- Approved an \$85,000 contract with the Panhandle Animal Welfare Society (PAWS) to continue providing animal control services to the city.

- Agreed to receive training on new iPad tablet computers each council member had received at the recommendation of council member Tim Grandberry.

- Discussed uses for a piece of property offered to the city for purchase across Woodruff Avenue from the Crestview Fire Department's main station. Uses could be a 26-space parking lot, satellite library or skate park, council members said.

The council agreed to look at the property before making a decision. The owner is asking \$38,000 for it, though the county appraiser values it at \$29,907.

- Unanimously approved directing city staff to draft an ordinance that specifies that the city's "image or likeness," including the city crest, should not be utilized by former employees.

These easy-care plants can really catch the eyes

If you've gone through every tree and shrub at the nursery, tried your hand at perennials and flowering annuals, and even experimented with conifers and bulbs, you might be ready to pop a few ornamental grasses in your landscape.

Not that you need experience to grow them. If you had to place ornamental grasses on a difficulty scale, they would easily land in the lightweight group. Grasses are easy.

But ornamental grasses can be an acquired taste. To some gardeners, they can appear untidy or even weedy. And if browns bother you, you won't want to use them.

But if you love a plant that blows in the breeze, brings fresh green to your spring, beiges and browns to fall, and sparkle when a frost settles in, grasses can be the star of all your seasons.

Some, such as the giant Miscanthuses, Arundos and Cortaderias, are so tall they can be used to screen an ugly view or hold a hill.

There are grasses such as Acorus, Carex and Juncus that love moisture. Others, such as Festuca, Koeleria and Muhlenbergia, can go weeks without water.

Colors can range every which way from yellows and golds to bronze and blue. The choices for color are endless.

Most will be larger than you expected, so keep that in mind when you plant. If you have a tiny patio or balcony garden or would like to grow grasses in pots, try the tiny Ophiopogon, Pennisetum and Carex.

Think through where you want to plant your grasses. You might try placing them in their pots around the landscape to get an idea of how they look.

Placement might be the most important part of planting ornamental grass-

es, because once they grab and grow a season or two, digging them up is difficult. They have roots that grab like few other plants.

Note how much water they need or not and whether they prefer sun or shade. Place them where their requirements are met. Consider the height when fully grown.

Dig a hole as big as the root ball in their nursery pots, pop them in the ground and tuck them in with backfill. There is no need to amend your soil or compost, feed or perform other fussy tasks.

Maintenance requires a yearly cutting to remove last year's blades to make room for new spring growth.

You can cut them down in fall, but I like to wait until winter is over because grasses provide texture, winter color and sparkle during the cold months.

Wear long sleeves. Some blades, such as Miscanthus', can slice up your arms with indiscernible

razor cuts. You won't feel it while you're working with the plant, only later when you hop in the shower. Sting!

At the end of the season, use hand pruners or hedge shears to cut your grasses to about a foot above the soil. They'll pop back quickly in spring.

Also, be a responsible gardener. Don't plant grasses that are considered invasive if you garden near open, wild lands. Some, such as pampas

grass (Cortaderia), all of the fountain grasses and the popular Stipas, have escaped gardens to grow and crowd out native plants in parks and recreation trails.

But mostly think about the many ways you can pair grasses with other plants. They look spectacular popping out behind boulders, soften the gangly canes of roses, look great in the back of the garden, can easily edge a path, and are perfectly happy in pots.

"We play better when we play positive because


when we get down on each other, we fall apart," she said. "I think we stayed really positive today."

BAKER — It only took the Baker volleyball team a little more than an hour to put away District 1-1A foe Northview on Tuesday.

When the final stats were tallied, the numbers showed just how well the Gators had played as a team.

Steele led the way up front with 11 kills and seven blocks, to go along with two aces. Morgan had six kills, five digs, nine assists and an ace. Wickery had 10 assists to go along with six aces, seven kills, three digs and a block.

Roy had seven assists and seven aces. Wagner had an ace, three digs and four kills. And Jordan Linzy had an ace, a block, two digs and two kills.

Kerrell hopes the Gators can keep flying high as they head down the home stretch of the regular season.

"We want to have momentum and to keep playing the way we are playing and doing what we need to do," he said. "We need to carry that momentum into the district tournament and all the way to state."

Baker won the JV match in three sets.
