## New tenant drops in

### Bob Sikes Airport gets air ambulance service

With a roar, the newest tenant at Crestview Bob Sikes Airport dropped in — literally — during the Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce Airport Committee meeting Thursday afternoon. Quickly filling a void left by the elimination of air ambulance service in Niceville, a nationwide air ambulance company has relocated its DeFuniak Springs helicopter to Crestview.

In October, Air Methods Corp. announced it was eliminating the Niceville Twin Cities Hospital GULflight 1 service, which it had operated since 2006, because of a decrease in calls and a saturation of helicopter

## Analysis: Water rates 'in good shape'

### Leveling growth, revenue negate immediate need for rate hikes

With Crestview's sudden expansion beginning to level off, city officials believe that expanding a wastewater treatment plant, recently considered a necessity to keep up with growth, could be a project that can be kept in reserve for a few years.

"We have not seen the increase needed to justify us going in and completing this expansion," Public Works Director Wayne Steele told the city council. "Right now I don't think, in my judgment, that it will be beneficial to the city to proceed with the expansion of that plant."

ambulance services in the area.

"We had learned they were looking to relocate," said Okaloosa County Airports business development manager Mike Stenson. "I told them we have the infrastructure and the space for them to operate their business out of Crestview Airport."

When Air Methods made its announcement, Dino Villani, Okaloosa County public safety director, said the county would be interested in having a medical helicopter service available for the underserved Crestview area.

"Our strategy is to bring another (helicopter) to this county, probably in the north part of the county," Villani said in October.

Stenson said when offered the chance to inspect Bob Sikes Airport, Air Methods liked what they saw.

"We met them and toured them around, and they thought it would be a great fit," Stenson said.

"Really, it's a great location," Air Methods fields operations manager Larry Hall said. "We're

excited to come to Crestview, and it's been great working with everyone out here. It's kind of a blessing for us to see all the pieces fall together." Hall said the Niceville helicopter ceased operations Dec. 1 and immediately was flown to another

Air Methods base in South Florida. The Eurocopter AS 350 that was relocated to Crestview already had started operations. In fact, as airport committee members gathered for Thursday's meeting in Emerald Coast Aviation's hangar, the aircraft was returning from transporting a patient.

Air Methods' Crestview air ambulance operation is offered in partnership with Sacred Heart Health Systems' AirHeart service. Seventeen employees will be at the Crestview location, which rents hangar space from Qwest Air Parts. A portable crew quarters and office will house three on-duty personnel around the clock, including a pilot, critical care nurse and paramedic.

Air Methods also will perform maintenance work on its regional fleet at Bob Sikes Airport, servicing seven helicopters from throughout Northwest Florida and Southern Alabama. The company's goal is to be fully operational by Dec. 16, Hall said.

"Our goal is to grow with you,"

Hall said. "It's a great logistical location. Your community is going to help serve other communities."

"We saw a need, they needed a home, we showed them what we had to offer and they like what they saw," Stenson said. "Crestview Airport speaks for itself, and we like to show it off. They will be preserving a much-needed service in Okaloosa County."

Ron Mosley, director of Regional Transport Services for Sacred Heart, agreed, praising the Crestview airport's facilities during the Airport Committee meeting.

"I hope everyone realizes how lucky you are to have your airport advance to the level it has," Mosley said.

"It's great to know we have a new business coming to Crestview," chamber President Derek Lott said while welcoming the airport's newest business. "But we hope not to have to ride in your helicopter unless it's for fun," he added to laughter.

parade for about 50 years, and it's always the biggest event we do every year," Wing said. "It's something that people look forward to that helps get them in the spirit of the season."

Law enforcement officials from as far away as Escambia County and Century were on hand for the parade, but it was the local acts that drew the biggest cheers.

Crestview's band, the Big Red Machine, which will be appearing in the Tournament of Roses Parade, was joined by the bands for Davidson and Shoal River middle schools, Baker High School and Rocky Bayou Christian School.

If you like floats, there were close to 60, with all the familiar themes of Christmas that included everything from "The Night Before Christmas" and the Grinch to those celebrating the birth of the Christ child.

Of course no parade is complete without Santa Claus, and after the parade,

he greeted children on the downtown plaza.

First-year Crestview football coach and athletic director Kevin Pettis was happy to serve as a parade judge when former city councilwoman Linda Parker asked for his help.

Pettis said he was impressed with everything about the parade.

"It was just like everything else in Crestview," he said. "They do things first class. It was a great parade. I was honored that Mrs. Parker asked me to do it."

Steele addressed the council at its Nov. 28 meeting during a presentation by Tetra Tech Vice President Michael Bomar, who presented a report of his company's analysis of the city's water revenue sufficiency and water impact fee.

"Overall, in our opinion you, as a city, are where you need to be," Bomar said. "You're in good shape as far as your rates."

In fact, he said, income from water service is so excellent it supports other water-related services.

"Your water system is currently operating at a cash surplus," he said. "You are subsidizing your wastewater system."

If the city were to follow its capital improvement plan over the next two years, however, Bomar's report recommended a modest rate increase, as well as raising by \$80 the current \$1,000 water impact fee assessed on new development. However, by deferring expansion of the wastewater treatment plant, rate and fee increases wouldn't be necessary, Steele said.

"The reason for the projected shortfall is the debt service on these grants we received to increase our wastewater treatment," Steele said, noting that by deferring plant expansion, the city wouldn't have to tap into the grant money.

In addition, Steele said, the new water meters the city has installed have resulted in more accurate readings.

"Our revenues, because of all the water meter replacements we have been doing this summer, have been up considerably," Steele said, noting increases as much as 13 percent or 14 percent.

Council President Charles Baugh Jr. asked if previous expansion projections should be "thrown out." Steele said those figures were based on data from five or more years ago when Crestview

was experiencing unprecedented growth. At the time, developers were planning even more new subdivisions.

"A lot of those developments have not taken place," Steele said, even though development orders had been approved.

"We don't want to spend money we'll just have to pay back," Steele said. "Right now I see no need for it. There's no driving need for it. It's much different now than it was five or six years ago."

"I like your recommendation," council member Tim Grandberry said. "Nothing has had a (negative) impact on our city like our

impact fees." "I would not be in favor of raising any of our rates," council member Robyn Helt said.

"We have sufficient time, and we have sufficient capacity," council member Ben Iannucci agreed.

Steele assured the council that Public Works was not turning a blind eye on future expansion of the wastewater treatment plant and would continue to monitor the city's sewage flow.

"I'm not saying we don't need to watch it. I'm just saying we don't need to move forward with it right now," Steele said. "It's the wrong thing to do."

# Food fight enters another round

## City might opt to run ballpark concessions on its own

With both previous bidders threatening legal action over bungled bids for concessionaire services at Crestview ballparks, the brouhaha took another twist at the Nov. 28 city council meeting when Administrative Services Director Mike Wing presented a proposal for the city to run the snack stands.

Wing, who oversees the Parks and Recreation department, presented data including last year's sales figures. New hires would be included in staff costs. Prior to the meeting, Wing discussed with council member Ben Iannucci, a strong proponent of recreational opportunities for Crestview youth, that concession stand staff could be teen employees.

"They're part-time positions at minimum wage," Wing said. "These workers would basically be the same kind that you see at McDonald's and Burger King."

"It's hard for 16 or 17 year olds to get jobs around the city," council member Phillip Berezo said.

However, as Council President Charles Baugh Jr. reminded his colleagues, "There are some other issues that have not quite been resolved."

While a city committee charged with selecting a bidder recommended the partnership of Gia DeMario and Vonda Todd, the council instead chose bidder Darlene Sledge. Assuming she had the job, Sledge said she started preparing the concession stands and purchasing equipment.

When Dimario and Todd formally contested the selection of a concessionaire,

the city was precluded from issuing a formal contract to Sledge, who then retained a lawyer and requested reimbursement for her time and expenses. City attorney Ben Holley said some of the costs incurred by Sledge could be reimbursed.

On Holley's recommendation, the council voted to discard the original bids and re-advertised for proposals.

"Our normal practice is to accept the bid, then negotiate a contract and get the contract back to the council for approval," Holley said.

"What about making improvements to the concession stand?" council member Robyn Helt asked. "We never authorized any changes."

Frustrated, Berezo moved to open the new proposals, reject them and have the city offer the concession services, "because I'm through with all this."

As if the situation wasn't complicated enough, Holley then informed the council that DeMario and Todd also filed a protest, requesting that Baugh and Iannucci recuse themselves from evaluating the proposals.

"This is as clear as

mud," Helt said.

When Berezo's motion failed 1-4, with Berezo voting yes, Iannucci moved to open the proposals at the meeting and rank the bidders at the next council meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Bert Moore, attorney for DeMario and Todd, expressed concern about the procedure because the bid opening was not advertised on the published meeting agenda. Moore said he was concerned this violated the state Sunshine law.

"If the bids had been opened when they should have been (at the council's previous meeting), when it was advertised, then you could not consider the city's proposal that was presented tonight," Moore said.

"The point was made at the last council meeting that a mistake was made in not opening the bids," Baugh said, moving discussion to the next agenda topic.

Deputy city clerk Patti Beebe then publicly opened bids received from the DeMario /Todd partnership and Kenneth Frost. The bids will be evaluated at the council's Dec. 12 meeting.

# Volunteers sought for IRS tax preparation programs

The IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs are looking for volunteers and additional partner organizations to help prepare federal income tax returns in communities throughout northern Florida.

A variety of volunteer positions are available, to include tax preparers, greeters, recruiters and equipment coordinators.

Training classes usually start in December and January. Training and certification are conducted at convenient locations throughout the state and online.

For more information, prospective volunteers can start by visiting [www.irs.gov](http://www.irs.gov) (search "Volunteer"). Then, those living in northern Florida can email [wi.spec.bhampartners@irs.gov](mailto:wi.spec.bhampartners@irs.gov) to be connected

with someone who will help direct them to VITA/TCE programs in their local communities. Prospective volunteers who may want to volunteer outside of the northern Florida counties can email [TaxVolunteer@IRS.gov](mailto:TaxVolunteer@IRS.gov).

VITA and TCE volunteers provide free tax preparation for seniors, military personnel and taxpayers with low to moderate incomes (generally, less than \$50,000) who need help filing their tax returns. VITA and TCE sites are typically located in community centers, libraries, schools, shopping malls and other convenient locations and are normally open evenings and weekends during the tax-filing season.

VITA and TCE volunteers come from all walks of life and backgrounds, and include professionals, retirees, college students, IRS employees and others mo-

tivated by a desire to help their communities. Prior tax preparation training is not required - partnering with local nonprofit, community and governmental organizations, the IRS provides free training and all needed materials to volunteers.

More than 88,000 volunteers made a difference by preparing 3 million-plus returns at thousands of sites nationwide earlier this year. That figure includes hundreds of Florida volunteers in Escambia, Bay, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa, Jackson and other northern counties.

The volunteers put their tax knowledge to use, helping community taxpayers reduce their tax liability by identifying and claiming tax credits and deductions that might otherwise have been overlooked, such as the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC).

# Crape myrtle or coat rack?

## 'Butchering' for blooms is ultimately more harmful

You've probably seen crape myrtle trees pruned to look like a coat rack. Hopefully, you're not guilty of doing this. The term "crape murder" was coined to describe this drastic topping of crape myrtles.

Properly selected and correctly placed crape myrtles need little pruning. A crape myrtle that requires routine pruning to force it to fit into a smaller space should be considered for replacement with a smaller-maturing cultivar. To avoid having to annually "butcher" a nice tree, choose a smaller maturing crape myrtle.

There are crape myrtle cultivars that grow only 2 to 3 feet in height, such as Pocomoke. There are semi-dwarf cultivars that grow to about 12 feet or less in height, such as Acoma. Intermediate crape myrtle cultivars, such as Osage, grow

to 29 feet or less in height. But standard "tree form" cultivars, such as Natchez, grow greater than 20 feet in height.

Topping trees is a bad practice. It weakens a tree by removing food reserves stored in the now removed wood. It radically reduces the size of the canopy, decreasing the plant's ability to produce food through photosynthesis. The large open cuts caused from topping invite wood-rotting organisms and ultimately decay. Topping results in dead stubs throughout the tree. Topping a crape myrtle forces the tree to produce unsightly root suckers. Ultimately topping results in an ugly, odd-looking, higher maintenance and short-lived crape myrtle.

Many people believe crape myrtles must be cut way back in

order to produce an abundance of blooms.

Flower clusters might be slightly larger on topped trees but topping usually delays flowering up to one month. And since the tree is smaller, it produces fewer flowers.

The long, weak shoots supporting large, heavy flower clusters on topped crape myrtles bend awkwardly and are more likely to break away from the plant.

When pruning crape myrtle trees, avoid cutting back or shortening branches much larger than the diameter of your finger, although cutting larger branches back to a side branch or to the trunk when needed is fine.

# Silly good fun at CHS

## Fall comedy was dumb but enjoyable

Craig Sodaro's "Touchtone M for Murder" isn't a great play. It's sophomoric and cliché-ridden and you've seen it before on late-night television. So what made the Crestview High School drama club's production worth seeing? It was fun.

It was fun because the troupe producing it had fun, including the 19-member cast, the more than 20 crew members and the adult community advisers, including parent director Michelle Martin and set designer Jim Crose. When everyone involved in producing a play has fun, the audience will too, no matter how insipid the material.

When everybody involved in a show is there because they want to be there, not because they're being graded, getting extra credit or in the case of the community and parent volunteers, getting paid, I am more than willing to overlook the occasional miscue, sound glitch or a picture abruptly dropping off the wall of the set.

The set, which was fantastic, was the lobby of the Clam Cove Inn on a remote island as a hurricane bears down on guests and staff — and a murderer. The cast was spirited, student director Kersten Lindberg kept them perking along, and the show was filled with lots of exits and entrances,

slamming doors, and characters hiding behind furniture, all of which I love.

A shout-out needs to go to Ryan Vance, who had missed several rehearsals due to appendicitis. Rid of that pesky organ and back on stage, Ryan did a great job of being an on-book actor playing an off-book performer playing Sam Slade, a parody of every 1930s and '40s film noir private eye.

Shattering the fourth wall, Ryan's rapport with the audience, embrace of his character, and his gift for adlibbing helped cover periodic perusal of his omnipresent notebook, which contained more than notes about the mysterious murders of family members of Col. Horace Clamskey,

played with fabulous bluster by Jack Barr.

Bella Serrano as Lila Dean, Sam's femme fatale, was delightfully engaging, escaping to the inn to perfect her recipe for fried clams when someone spikes it with arsenic and kills Col. Clamskey's nephew Calvin (Justice Kesinger, an enthusiastic performer who we would've enjoyed seeing more of).

Aubrey Adkins was a perfect fit as lanky cowboy Tex Dayton, and there was even a killer clown disguised as bird-watcher Adelaide Twitterman, a fun role for Jessica McMillan.

Crystal Bradshaw, Angeles Alexander and Naomi Campange deserve kudos as inn staff Faith, Hope and Charity Beaupree respectively, while Darion Harrington and Chloe Cox were enjoyable as inn owners Mr. and Mrs. Wilton. As their kids Rodney and Rhonda, Kelli Cunningham and Bridget Worth were perfectly irritating (in a good way).

But what I love most is that a combination of dedicated student thespians, parents and community volunteers pulled off a fall show and had a good time doing so. Theatre is meant to be fun and not just for the audience, and "Touchtone M for Murder" was a good laugh. Encore! Encore!
