## Water department hours to change

Crestview City Clerk Betsy Roy requested the city council allow her to reduce the Utilities Billing Department hours after a month-long study determined that few water customers visited the service's City Hall office in the early morning and late

afternoon hours.

In October 2010, as a cost-cutting measure, the city implemented a four-day, 10-hour workweek, with administrative offices closed on Fridays.

In July 2011, however, at the request of water customers, the utilities department opened for business on Fridays again. But the department kept the 10-hour workdays.

Roy requested reverting back to an 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. schedule Monday through Friday after reducing the number of cashiers from three to two. She also requested the same hours be kept in the city's payroll department.

Roy's request was unanimously approved at council meeting.

"Our anticipated time of hours change would be

June 25," Roy stated in a letter to the council.

"Scheduling with this reduction (in staff) would be greatly enhanced by the change in hours and would make sure we have full coverage and availability of customer service," Roy wrote in the letter.

Before asking the council for the change of

## 'Citizen of the Year' Mae R. Coleman

Crestview community activist Mae R. Coleman is the city's first Citizen of the Year.

The Crestview City Council voted unanimously Monday to create what will become an annual award to be presented to an outstanding resident. The council not only selected Coleman as the first recipient, but named the award in her honor.

"I have decided that the Citizen of the Year award will be known as the Mother Coleman Award," council President Ben Iannucci III said. "We have to figure out the logistics of it."

"I think that is a good idea," council member Charles Baugh Jr. said. "I can't think of anyone right now that has the spirit of (former) Mayor (George) Whitehurst and our other great citizens than Mrs. Coleman. Mrs. Coleman, thank you for being the mother of all of us."

"I don't think there's any more fitting name than the Mother Coleman Award," council member Robyn Helt said. "What I love about Mrs. Coleman is, she is always here and lets us know how she thinks we're doing. If she doesn't think highly of us, she'd let us know, too."

Coleman is familiar to council members for her regular attendance at council meetings and for her praise when she believes the body is acting in the best interests of the city. She is equally known for not hesitating to chastise council members or others whom she feels are "pulling us down."

A retired nurse and member of the Mt. Zion AME Church, Coleman is active in multiple civic causes, including tutoring and supporting incarcerated youths, improving educational opportunities for underprivileged children, and encouraging community involvement.

Last summer Coleman spearheaded a campaign to raise supplies for victims of the Alabama tornadoes, enlisting the aid of Crestview's police and fire departments to gather the donations. An off-duty Crestview

helicopter will land and its crew will offer tours of the aircraft. Live music will be provided by celebrated local jazz vocalist Cheryl Jones of Jones and Co., an instructor in the Fine and Performing Arts Division of Northwest Florida State College. JamRock Reggae is also on the entertainment lineup.

Past Military Appreciation Recognition Celebrations have included exhibits of classic cars, a rock-climbing wall, bounce houses, demonstrations and displays by local law enforcement officers, including the U.S. Army Rangers' popular snake exhibit.

Free lunches will be provided for members of the military and their families, and Wright promises "a whole bunch of other family activities and displays to enjoy." The celebration continues through 3 p.m.

Also this morning, members of the American Legion Post 75 will begin preparations of a more somber observance as they plant their 11th annual "Flanders Field" of poppies, flags and crosses on

the front lawn of the post, 898 East James Lee Blvd. (U.S. Highway 90).

"We will place 500 crosses, 500 small flags, 600 poppies and 200 large flags," organizer Linda Martens said. Post members credit Martens with originating the idea of the organization's Flanders Field, named for the site of a dreadful World War I battle in Belgium.

Martens invites veterans, families and friends to join in the planting of the memorial symbols, starting at 7 a.m. today.

"Please bring a hammer and long screw driver and also something to kneel on," she said.

The field will be dedicated to America's military war dead on Memorial Day, May 28, following the city's annual Memorial Day observance.

Organizers remind members of the public that unlike Armed Forces Day and Veterans Day, Memorial Day is not a day of "celebration," but of remembrance to honor those who gave the ultimate sacrifice in defense of their country.

hours, Roy had her staff count the number of customers who came to the department on a daily basis during the month of March.

"The number of citizens that are served by the utility department from 7 a.m. until 8 a.m. is 1.37," on average, Roy reported. On 10 of March's 22 business days, no customers called at the department at all between 7 and 8 a.m.

"From the hours of 5 to 6 p.m., the average number of citizens served is 3.15," she wrote. "This number is skewed slightly by the number of late customers on (billing) due date."

Roy assured the council "we have absolutely no problem" remaining open five days a week, but based on the low usage in the current first and last hours of operation, she asked to reduce opening hours "with the understanding that on bill-due dates, we would have somebody here until 6 p.m." to make sure all payments received that day are processed.

On a recent afternoon, Crestview resident Forrest Jenkins stopped by the office to have water turned on at his new home. Jenkins said he foresaw no problem with the reduction in hours.

"If people have something they need to get done, they're going to make time for it," he said. "I didn't even know they had early hours. I figured they had regular office hours like other government offices."

*"What can I say? What can I say? I thank you so much. I want to thank the city and the people of the community. I will never forget this night, May 14. I thank you for thinking of me."*

Last December, the Cooks made the decision to start the adoption process.

"We have a lot of love to give and we will raise a happy, healthy and responsible adult," Misty said. "We are staying positive and hope that God will bless our family."

"I see how John is with our nephews and nieces when they come to visit," she said. "We often take care of them, but then they have to go home."

Misty said officials with the adoption agency visited her and John multiple times, interviewed the pair, fingerprinted them and checked their backgrounds before approving them for adoption. The first part of the adoption process was completed March 15.

"The process of adoption is very complicated and expensive," Misty said. "...we will need to raise funds."

The adoption costs around \$22,000. This sum includes support, training, home study services, birth parent expenses and legal fees. The Cooks used their savings to pay for the first \$7,000, and continue to save more to cover additional costs.

Misty also created a website to solicit donations. The site has raised \$2,500, but they're hoping to raise enough money by July 8 to move forward with the adoption.

# Gordon joins city council

## Valves, employee recognition and building inspector also discussed

Monday evening's meeting of the Crestview City Council began with a brief ceremony to swear in the body's newest member. Crestview businessman Thomas Gordon took the seat vacated by Phillip Berezo, who resigned at the conclusion of the council's March 26 meeting.

First Judicial Circuit Judge Michael Flowers began the ceremony by commending Gordon for taking on the often-difficult role of a public servant.

"Public service is one of the callings someone can have, to serve their community," Flowers said. "You'll hear a great deal about the honest mistakes you might make and you may not hear too much about the hard work you do. I applaud your decision to serve. It is a high calling."

After being sworn in, Gordon remained at the podium and asked council President Ben Iannucci

III, "Do I have to make a speech?"

"You can come and sit down now," Iannucci said to laughter.

To applause from members of the audience, including his parents Brady and Edna Gordon, his sister Anne and her husband Frank Sauls, Thomas signed in.

"City of Crestview, you now have your new, full 2012 city council," Iannucci said to the audience.

Student members of the Bob Sikes Elementary School student council attended the meeting to see how municipal government works.

"These students took time out of their personal lives to be with us tonight," Iannucci said to applause.

In other matters, the council:

- Heard from resident Landrum Edwards, who said he has heard salt water was intruding into ground water as far north as three miles above Niceville. Edwards also said the city should build something other than a sports com-

plex if the tourist development tax passes.

- Discussed a program to recognize employees who go above and beyond their regular duties. City staff will put together a proposal whereby department heads would offer the names of exemplary employees on a regular basis.

- Discussed inspections of city water service back flow valves. Council

member Tim Grandberry suggested the service, required by ordinance, could be performed cheaper if a city inspector did the job instead of an outside contractor, lessening the cost water service customers are obligated to pay for the annual inspection.

- Discussed several options for providing building inspections as the city building inspector retired

and nobody responded to an ad searching for a replacement because of the low salary offered. Council member Robyn Helt moved to up the salary to \$60,000 and fit the position into the city's personnel structure. The motion passed unanimously.

- Unanimously accepted an \$8,500 proposal by Ashley Pyrotechnics to provide the city's Fourth of July fireworks display.

- Learned that council member Charles Baugh Jr. has been appointed president of the Northwest Florida League of Cities, giving Crestview more clout in the organization.

- Was congratulated by interim city attorney Jerome Miller for holding an "almost a perfect meeting. A perfect meeting is when I don't have to say anything."

## Skin cancer topic of 'Healthy Woman'

"It's May in Florida — where's your sunscreen?" asked Dr. Richard Freier II as he gave an informal talk about skin cancer awareness for May's Healthy Woman event at North Okaloosa Medical Center.

The lunch-and-learn session gave area women a lesson in the potential hazards of exposure to ultraviolet radiation, from the sun or through tanning beds.

"There are three wavelengths with ultraviolet radiation — UVA, UVB and UVC," Freier said. "UVC isn't a concern for skin cancer; however, ultraviolet radiation exposure is the main factor responsible for skin cancers. Basal cell carcinoma, squamous cell carcinoma, and melanoma are all on the rise."

Freier said that a good sun protection factor or sunscreen is essential to avoiding skin cancer.

"Because you can't see the sun's rays with the human eye you don't automatically associate it with harming your body,"

Freier said. "Sun damage to your skin cells can be avoided. More and more studies show a direct link to skin cancers from skin damage in indoor tanning beds or booths. Let's face it, overexposure of any kind to UV rays is harmful."

Freier said that skin care awareness starts with ABCD.

"Remember ABCD. Watch any unusual spots and check them for: Asymmetry — does the spot match the other half? Border — do the edges appear ragged or irregular? Color — is it the same color all over or deeper or unusual shades? Diameter — is it larger than a pencil eraser, and I caution you that sometimes a skin cancer can be smaller than that. You have to be aware," he cautioned.

Dr. David Herf took the lecture from a surgeon's focus.

"The highest age rising age bracket for skin cancer is in 16 to 29 year olds," Herf said. "I have patients of all ages with skin cancers. Some see an abnormal rise on their skin and pick it off. They come to me when it is has

grown back with time. The rise in the number of skin cancers comes from the sun bathers and the indoor tanning use."

Herf told the group that he recommends daily use of SPF products at a level 30 or 40 for skin protection. He also cautioned about children and skin care.

"You have to use a waterproof SPF product with children who are playing in the sun and you have to be diligent about reapplying it," Herf said.

Herf also suggested that women who have never had a complete skin check-up from a physician have one on an annual basis.

"Skin cancers can form and grow without any pain or discomfort and people tend to ignore what they don't know," Herf said.

New Healthy Woman's Advisory Council members were also introduced at the lunch-and-learn. Jackie Colmon, Angela Evans, Sara Fordyce, Cecilia Fuller, Robyn Helt, April Linton, Edina Mann, Susan Petrey, Ashley Rogers, Shavone Scott, Katie Sharon, Colette Waite, and Carolyn Williams will serve for 2012.

# Unlicensed driver sends child to hospital

## Wreck snarls lunchtime traffic in downtown Crestview

The circumstances of a May 11 traffic wreck in front of the McDonald's restaurant on West James Lee Boulevard had investigators from the Crestview Police Department befuddled, said police spokesman Lt. Andrew Schneider at the scene. The incident snarled lunchtime traffic for more than an hour after it occurred around 12:15 p.m.

What investigators do know is a red Chevrolet pickup driven by a 52-year-old man struck the driver's side of a late model Honda Civic, shattering the side windows and stripping off the car's steel skin and revealing internal structural parts of the door. The impact of the 33-year-old female driver's head against her windshield shattered the front window.

The driver of the Honda was cited for failure to yield the right of way. Schneider said. Her car was resting at a northeasterly angle across both eastbound lanes of the road. The pickup traveled westbound for about 50 yards, crossing the eastbound lanes, smashing through a brick fencepost and into trees by the side of the road after jumping the sidewalk.

The driver of the Honda and a boy estimated to be around 9 years old were transported by Okaloosa County EMS to an area hospital. A Crestview po-

lice officer described the boy as in "bad shape" with apparent head trauma. Schneider said the boy was too big for a child safety seat and was riding in the back seat on the driver's side.

"He was in the back seat right where the impact occurred," Schneider said.

Occupants of both vehicles were wearing seat belts.

The driver of the pickup was arrested for driving with a suspended license. The truck was being followed at the time of the accident by the driver's elderly father who was driving a late model red Ford Mustang that was not involved in the accident. The father was cited for allowing an unlicensed motorist to drive his truck.

Crestview police Lt. Eddie Lehneis identified the driver of the Mustang as a resident of the Crestview Manor nursing home who and is under hospice care.

"I've worked a lot of accidents but I've never seen one like this," Lehneis said. "How his (the truck driver's) daddy avoided hitting him in that Mustang I don't know. He's not even supposed to be driving. It's a big tangled story."

As the traffic scene was investigated, police shut down both eastbound lanes, routing traffic north on Coleman Street. Only one westbound lane was open during the investigation.

## Spring break statistics

Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office deputies on beach patrol issued at least 543 citations to underage drinkers during spring break 2012. That compares to 342 notices to appear for underage possession of alcohol handed out during spring break last year.

Deputies reported that the first two weeks of the spring break season were by far the busiest, when many Southeastern Conference schools had simultaneous break dates. They also said one of the trends this year involved

students getting rental houses in Destin's Crystal Beach area and holding street parties.

Here is a breakdown of some of the states with the highest number of offenders cited for underage possession of alcohol during spring break: Alabama, 83 students; Georgia, 74 students; Louisiana, 65 students; Mississippi, 46 students; locals, 36 students.

Notices to appear for underage alcohol possession were also issued to students from 26 other states.

In addition to 543 citations for underage drinking, deputies also made at

# State college named in top 120 colleges

 The Aspen Institute College Excellence Program named Northwest Florida State College as one of the nation's 120 top community colleges, challenging it to compete for the \$1 million fund for the 2013 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence.  
 Northwest Florida State College and 119 other community colleges will now compete for the honor following a yearlong research process into how well their students learn, complete degrees and get jobs with competitive wages after graduating.  
 Northwest Florida State College is now eligible to submit an application containing detailed data on these criteria. It must demonstrate that it delivers exceptional student results, uses data to drive decisions and continually improves over time.  
 They will then be winnowed to eight to 10 finalists in September. A

full list of the 120 community colleges is available at [www.AspenCCPrize.org](http://www.AspenCCPrize.org). Prizewinners will be announced in March 2013.  
 The Aspen Institute will conduct site visits to each of the finalists in the fall. A prize jury co-chaired by John Engler, president of Business Roundtable, former Michigan governor, and former president of the National Association of Manufacturers, and Richard Riley, former South Carolina governor and U.S. Secretary of Education, will select a grand prize winner and four runners-up, to be announced in March.  
 The Aspen Institute identified the 120 community colleges – 10 percent of all institutions – using a quantitative formula that assesses performance and improvement in four areas: graduation rates, degrees awarded, student retention rates, and equity in student outcomes.  
 “The success of our nation's com-

munity colleges is more important than ever before,” said Aspen Institute College Excellence Program Executive Director Josh Wyner, who announced the names of the 120 top community colleges at the annual convention of the American Association of Community Colleges in Orlando.  
 “At a time when a college degree is essential to entering the middle class, community colleges like Northwest Florida State College offer the most promising path to education and employment for literally millions of Americans. This competition spotlights excellence and we encourage Northwest Florida State College to apply for the nation's top community college prize to help raise the bar for all community colleges to improve student achievement and better prepare the next generation for the job market after college.”



# 'I'm extremely proud of this class'

## Introducing the 2012 Crestview Athletic Hall of Fame

Former National Basketball Association star Tom Hammonds and Major League baseball standout John Bale top the list of honorees in the inaugural class of the Crestview Athletic Hall of Fame that was announced at Friday's Red and White game at Jack Foster Stadium.

The rest of those honored in the class are former Bulldog baseball standouts Dale Rice Sr., Terry Taylor, Dexter Day, Tim Gillis and Ricky Despaux. Hammonds' coach Ken Rogers, who led the boys basketball team to the 1985 state championship, will be inducted as well. Bob Lynn, the longtime football public address announcer at Jack Foster Stadium will be a part of the class because of his lifetime of service to the Bulldog program.

The final individual honor goes to wrestler Eric Flinchum, who won the school's only individual state championship in the sport, claiming the Class 1A title in the 189-pound weight class in 2002.

Several of the great Bulldog teams of the past also are a part of the inaugural class.

The boys basketball teams from 1983-84, 1884-85 and 1986-87 will go into the hall of fame, as will the girls basketball teams from 1985 and 1991. The 2002 Class 3A

state runner-up football team is in the class, as are the 1999 state champion boys weightlifting team and the 2002 varsity cheerleading squad that captured a national championship.

The Hall of Fame Class of 2012 will be inducted at a luncheon Sept. 14 and introduced to the fans that night at halftime of the Crestview-Bolles football game at Jack Foster Stadium.

"We are putting in 10 individuals and several teams, and it is a big class," Crestview head football coach and athletic director Kevin Pettis said. "I'm extremely proud of this class. Out of the 10 individuals, there are a couple of Cincinnati Reds on there, a Los Angeles Dodger and a New York Yankee. Tom Hammonds played for the Denver Nuggets and the (Minnesota) Timberwolves.

"And then there are all the teams with Ken Rogers winning the first state championship here (in any sport). Who I feel is a shoe-in for next year's class is Matt Brunson, who took them to the state runner-up in football in 2002."

Pettis said he received more than 200 nominations, and more than 80 Bulldogs were nominated.

"I was shocked at the number of people that emailed me," he said. "A lot of them were nominating the same people. The guys that got in were guys that were

nominated four or five different times by different people."


Pettis said he understands some people might be upset because their nominee isn't in this year's class, and he reminded fans that a name stays in the nomination pool five years.

"You can never do anything like this without hurting people's feelings, and that's not what it is intended to be," he said. "It's intended for us to kind of embrace what we have done here at Crestview High School and celebrate the past and build on that tradition."

"I hope everybody that feels a little bit slighted or that their nominee wasn't heard will know that every nominee was heard, and they will be on the ballot again next year."

But now is a time to celebrate the members of the 2012 class, and Pettis is anxiously looking forward to September when the Bulldog greats will be honored.

"I can't wait for the Bolles game to bring them home and have the fans cheer them one last time," Pettis said.

# Gators wrap up spring practice

**BAKER** — Before spring football practice 2012 wrapped up Friday night with a game against Chipley, the Gators still were adding the finishing touches to what has been a rebuilding spring as head coach Matt Brunson looks to fill 18 starting positions this fall.

By all indications it has been a successful effort, with several players still fighting for a spot in the lineup this fall.

"We've had a good spring," Brunson said Tuesday as he looked ahead to the game Friday. "We are finishing up, and we have a very stiff test against the Chipley Tigers, the defending 1A runner-up, and it will be a very good measuring stick for us."

"The kids have done great and

have worked hard. They've done everything we've asked them to do, and we will see where we are Friday.

The players said practices have gone smoothly in Brunson's second spring at his alma mater.

"Things have been going pretty good," offensive lineman Taylor Brown said. "It is easier because you know what he expects and how to do it and how he works."

"We've been working hard and we know what to do so, I think we will have a pretty good shot of beating Chipley."

D.J. Thomas has enjoyed the physical nature of the spring practices.

"I think the spring drills are going real good," he said. "The coaches have the old school stuff going on where you hit them right in the mouth — that type of ball and everybody is loving it."

"We are going to let people know that no matter how big you are and whoever you've got, we are going to come hit you in the mouth every play no matter what the score is."

Brunson continued to be pleasantly surprised by the play off the offensive line throughout the spring.

"I felt like our offensive line was going to be our strong point, and I still feel like that," he said. "Those guys have done a great job responding to the challenge."

As the spring ended, Brunson said he doesn't think the offensive unit or defensive unit has separated itself from the other, which is by design.

"They are about the same because we've got several kids going both ways and learning a new system right now," he said. "Right now we are very basic. We

lay a foundation every year running basic I-formation plays and playing basic defense, and that's where we are right now."

The Gators will continue to work on getting their full package on both sides of the ball throughout the summer and will have everything in place when the season opens in the fall.

As to which Crowson brother, Adam or Ben, will be the starting quarterback, that competition could be ongoing throughout the fall and into the season. And Brunson isn't worried about which brother will be on the field.

"Adam and Ben Crowson are going to be just fine at quarterback," Brunson said. "We are going to play both of them. They both bring skill sets to the table that we need, and we feel like we can use both of them."
