

Cost of doing business

A short stretch of sidewalk in front of a new car and truck rental agency opening on South Ferdon Boulevard is costing developers and the owner of the new business \$25,000, nearly \$1,000 per foot.

North county entrepreneurs James Chessher of Crestview and Fred Kaucher of Holt bought the former Bayside Cleaners site, which had burned down several years ago, for a small used car dealership. Niceville businessman Joe Fagundes will rent most of the property, including its freshly renovated office, for his newest Thrifty car and Penske truck rental agency.

The new stretch of sidewalk replaced an entrance to the former cleaner's parking lot. While Chessher said the actual cost of construction was about \$6,000, the balance of the cost came from an abundance of regulatory fees, permit costs and traffic studies necessitated by the site's location on a busy state road.

"Between the city and county permits and the engineering and the state permits, it got expensive," Chessher said. "They make it hard, I tell you. I thought it would probably run a lot of people off who wanted to start a business."

Chessher said because they renovated an existing building on the site, one fee he and Kaucher didn't have to pay was the city's impact fee.

"We barely dodged the impact fee, which would've been another \$15,000," Chessher said.

None of the businessmen disputed that some fees and permits are necessary, but suggested a way should be found to streamline the process to make it less time consuming and cumbersome, especially for small businesses.

Derek Lott, president of the Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce and city president of CCB Bank, which provided financing for the project, said the developers' experience was not unusual, and is glad that the city is looking at reducing its impact fees.

"There were a lot of challenges James and Fred had to face in the way of fees and studies that made the project take a lot longer and made it more expensive," Lott said. "The city would've been receiving tax revenue from this property six months earlier if the process had been smoother."

Despite the challenges the owners had in preparing the site, their tenant, Fagundes, was pleased with the outcome.

North Okaloosa schools graduate Class of 2012

High school is over for seniors at north Okaloosa schools

Some 472 seniors at Baker, Crestview and Laurel Hill schools donned caps and gowns last week in the annual rite of passage known as graduation. The following is a breakdown of the graduating ceremonies for the Class of 2012:

Baker School

Laughter and tears were plentiful Thursday night as the 94 members of the Baker School Class of 2012 came together one last time on graduation night at Doug Griffith Memorial Stadium.

The graduates spoke of long nights studying and the pride they felt while attending many Gator athletic events.

Valedictorian Rebecca Davis delivered the graduate's address and reminded her classmates that they share a special bond that many high school students don't experience, as more than half of the class had attended Baker since elementary school.

"This is not the last chapter of our lives," she said. "We have many chapters to come that will surpass this one."

Turning to the parents, Davis then drew from the late humorist Erma Bombeck when she told them, "After 18 years you are out of a job."

Davis then assured the parents that

the students will always need them and look to them for support.

Thursday's graduation was the 11th at Baker for Principal Tom Shipp, who arrived at the school when the graduates were in the second grade.

"The unique thing about working at a K-12 school is that you get to know the kids and the families real well," he said. "It is a real bittersweet moment. You are happy for them, but you hate to see some of them go. This bunch was in the second grade when I got here, so there is a lot of nostalgia and a lot of good memories."

Shipp said it is especially rewarding to watch the students who learned from some early mistakes grow into responsible young men and women.

"That's the neat thing is to see kids learn," he said. "There were several kids in this class that were kind of turnaround kids. They made a mistake here or there and they learned from it and got to walk the stage tonight. So I'm especially proud of those kids."

Honors graduate Morgan Jones summed up the marching orders for her classmates.

"Our lives will become what we make them," she said. "I challenge the Baker Class of 2012 to live well."

friends and school officials applauded, the 25 members of the Class of 2012 marched confidently around the Laurel Hill School gymnasium Friday evening, took their seats and began the next chapter of their lives.

A birthday for the books

Crestview library opened current location 10 years ago today

Ten years ago today, Crestview booklovers streamed through the doors of the city's new Robert L.F. Sikes Public Library. It was the seventh location for Crestview's library, which had its humble beginnings in the mid-1940s in a house on Pine Street next to the site of today's Davis-Watkins Funeral Home.

While the library has changed locations and names, its mission of enhancing the public's intellectual and cultural life remains un-

changed. Similarly, the institution's staff members remain as dedicated as its founder, Bertha Henry, who started the library in her own home by lending family books.

The library moved from place to place before opening in 1976 in a new home in Twin Hills Park, presently the Crestview campus of Northwest Florida State College. The city sold the stately building to the college for \$1 million in 1993 and leased back the library space. With the lease rapidly running out, a new library building was needed.

On March 30, 2001, ground was broken for the present library on

a 15-acre parcel of land behind the post office donated by Andrew Giesen Jr., George Giesen, LaDon Dewrell, Doodle Harris, William Barnhill, Roselle Barnhill and Charles Clary.

Mayor George Whitehurst made the welcoming remarks, the Crestview High School Big Red Machine performed, and longtime library supporter and one of the founders of the Friends of the Library support group, Flo Lembeck, shared a history of Crestview's libraries.

The library's construction and

"Instead of building our own facility, which would've taken six to nine months, we can open in three because the building was already here," he said.

Fagundes owns other Thrifty and Penske franchises in the Panhandle, including Niceville, and was eager to enter Crestview's rapidly growing business community. One of his major Penske contract clients, the FedEx sorting facility on Brookmeade Drive, is located nearby.

"We jumped at the chance," he said. "FedEx was after us. Because Penske closed their Crestview office last month, they (FedEx) had to go to Niceville

to pick up a rental truck if one of theirs broke down. That delayed deliveries. We saw the need to be right here in Crestview."

If the car and truck rental business is as successful as Fagundes hopes, he might buy the now-closed Jet Muffler shop next door and expand, he said.

"We (CCB Bank) were looking for businesses that had good ideas we could support," Lott said. "Nobody else was lending money."

Fagundes, who said his sometimes frustrating experience with the permitting process and its accompanying fees has motivated him to declare his candidacy for the Board of

County Commissioners on a pro-business platform, praised the city's supportive business community.

"Derek was instrumental in putting all of us together: Jim, Fred, the city and county and me," he said. "It's a matter of local business people stepping up. It's nice to have a local chamber of commerce and a bank that's actually doing something for the small business owner. We need a lot more of that."

"I am proud that we have taken an eyesore on Highway 85 and with the vision of some local businessmen, renovated it to a very nice looking, tax-generating and job-generating parcel," Lott said.

They adjusted each other's caps, making sure tassels hung properly, fixed the guys' ties, tweaked the girls' makeup, and snapped numerous photos with cell phones and cameras to remember the big day. Some reminisced about school, while others looked to the future.

"I gotta get a job somewhere before I go to UWF (the University of West Florida in Pensacola) in the fall," Andrew Smith said, saying he plans to study electronic engineering.

Two seniors, Austyn Evans and sports standout Tyler Zessin, each thought about lifelong supporters who were not in the gym. Both lost grandparents within the two weeks leading up to graduation.

"I have my granny's ring on even though she couldn't be here," Austyn said, showing her pastor from the First Baptist Church of Laurel Hill, the Rev. Mike McVey, the family heirloom.

Travon Calloway joked as Walter Kelly made sure his cap was straight. Travon will start at Northwest Florida State College in the fall, then plans to transfer to Florida State University "and hopefully study sports medicine."

"Some of them won't go to college at all," lamented Michelle McLemore as she surveyed the room full of her fellow seniors. Michelle will study culinary arts at the University of West Florida. She had taken culinary arts training at Laurel Hill School, "so I have two years under my belt. It was fun!"

Tyler, welcoming guests to the graduation, observed, "This is the first time I've seen the gym this full and a basketball game wasn't being played."

Principal Susan Lowery-Sexton beamed as her seniors marched into the room Friday evening.

"When I saw them at the baccalaureate service last night, it was like a Norman Rockwell picture," she said. "They're so pure and so full of hope."

furnishing costs were covered by a low-interest \$2.45 million loan from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development program and a \$400,000 state matching grant. As construction neared completion in spring 2002, a frenzy of activity was taking place in the Twin Hills Park location.

The library's eight staff members, three of whom still work at the library today, and a battalion of Friends of the Library volunteers, using recycling tubs loaned by Waste Management and produce boxes from Winn-Dixie, packed up everything from books and magazines to computers, office supplies and a globe.

"I went by Winn-Dixie every morning and we picked up banana and apple boxes and other produce boxes before they crushed them," reference librarian Sandra Dreaden said. "It smelled like apples and bananas in here."

The old library closed

May 13, 2002, and staff and Friends, supplemented by a squad of inmates from the county jail, had about three weeks to move the contents of the library 2.5 miles up Industrial Drive. It took them 25 trips in two U-Haul trucks.

"It was horrid!" Dreaden said. "We had our teenage boys in here helping. Patricia Zimmerman was the youth librarian at the time and she had a big, strong teenage son, and I did, too. It was 'recruit the teenage sons to help' time. I have German in my background and it was, 'You will come help your mom zis week!'"

Since then the Crestview Public Library continues to evolve, expanding its programs to offer children's craft classes and story times, adult First Tuesday lectures and demonstrations, adult and youth book clubs, and fun, family oriented programs. While many patrons take advantage of these programs, others just come

for traditional services.

"I like to come here and spend time on the computer, read the books and catch up on the classics," longtime patron Mark Jernigan said. "I'll go find a corner with a chair and browse the magazines. It's a great hangout place. The high school kids, when they get out of school, they all come in here."

The Friends of the Crestview Library remains a strong support organization, funding events and equipment to enhance the library's mission, and hosting popular twice-annual book sales.

As the community's de facto arts center, library patrons enjoy Music in the Library evenings, exhibits by community artists, an annual Poetry Night, and events such as the winter CALA: Crestview Area Loves the Arts show. The library is also the home of two local arts organizations, which meet the first Tuesday of each month.

# The sound of Tiffani

## Senior leaves Crestview High on a high note

When Crestview High School graduate Tiffani Souders landed the plum role of Maria von Trapp in the drama program's spring production of "The Sound of Music," no one was more surprised than she was. It was a moment that typifies the cheerful young woman's modesty and motivation, because music has always been a part of her life, she said.

"It was a wonderful experience for my senior year," she said.

Singing in the school's award-winning chorus during her Crestview High years helped Tiffani pre-

pare for her role as Maria. She credited Choral Music Director Kevin Lusk for motivating her when she felt herself faltering.

"I don't know what I'd be doing now if it wasn't for him," she said. "My tenth grade year I wasn't planning on being in chorus because it didn't fit in my schedule, but Mr. Lusk convinced me to get back into it. I don't know anyone who motivates kids better than he does. He pulls the performances out of them. You just feel bad if you don't do your best for him."

Tiffani said she felt it all come together her senior year.

"I work hard at it and I feel like I've gotten a lot better in the past year than I have in all the years leading up to it," she said. "I don't know if it's just my voice maturing or what, but I feel better now."

Tiffani cantors for the Saturday evening Mass at Our Lady of Victory Catholic Church, where she has sung for the past three years. Singing is a talent she plans to pursue at college.

"I'm going to the University in Central Florida in Orlando to major in biomedical science, then plan to double major with music and biomedical," Tiffani said. "If I don't get to do the double major, I'll at

least minor in music, and I'll definitely be singing in the university choirs."

After singing with the Crestview High chorus in Toronto in April, Tiffani, topped off her high school singing career by winning the Senior Choral Award.

"I was surprised that I actually got it, because it is a student vote, and sometimes it tends to be a little bit of a popularity contest," Tiffani said.

"I worked so hard and I've done so much with the chorus and it's been such a huge part of my life, so it was really nice to receive this recognition. I would've been happy for whoever

won, of course, but I was so happy because I have worked so hard."

Her senior year capped by the lead in the school spring musical, winning the Senior Choral Award and leading the Pledge of Allegiance at her graduation, Tiffani headed off to UCF freshman orientation this week, then will attend summer music camp at Florida State. She's ready and eager to face whatever life throws her way next.

"I am really excited, honestly," Tiffani said. "I'm ready to move on to bigger and better things, you know?"



Preparedness and you

# Graduation viewed in Afghanistan

While most Crestview High School graduates' parents proudly watched their sons and daughters accept their diplomas from the bleachers at Jack Foster Stadium Friday night, a small contingent watched the ceremony live more than 7,500 miles away.

School administrators worked

with the 7th Special Forces (Airborne) Group to set up a live video feed so graduates' parents stationed with the Army in Afghanistan could also share their children's big day.

Principal Bob Jones said he and Assistant Principal Dexter Day were approached by Corp. George East, an information technology specialist with the 7th Special Forces, about setting up the video feed.

Jones said he and his staff

were glad to do whatever they could to make the project work.

"We have a very, very long standing in the school system of supporting the families of military families," Jones said. "It's a feeling we have in the school system that we're proud of the military in our area and we want to support the families of those who are going out there and putting their lives on the line."

Jones said several alternative means of broadcasting the

event were discussed, including using Crestview High's Internet network. However, the idea of bouncing a feed from the stadium off a military satellite got rejected early in the discussion.

"They did not get permission to do that since this is not a military event," Jones said.

The event was ultimately streamed live over the Internet, Jones said, with a cameraman placed in the stadium's press box.

"It's a first for the school district and something we can look at doing more of in the future, not just for 7th Special Forces but also for Air Force family members who might be deployed somewhere," Jones said.

The system also has other potential applications, Jones added.

"We might do live streaming of football games next season so parents who are deployed can view them," he said.

#### WHAT DOES THE MEDICAL BENEFITS SETTLEMENT PROVIDE?

both are good fits in Brunson's power offense that features a heavy dose of running the football.

Crestview finished a strong spring practice in impressive fashion, beating District 2-6A rival Niceville 12-7 in the spring game.

Heading into the summer conditioning program all systems seem to be go for the Bulldogs as they enter the second year under coach Kevin Pettis.

A half dozen seniors from last year's 4-6 team signed college scholarships and several other key contributors graduated as well. But the Bulldogs should be in better position heading into the summer workouts than they were a year ago.

satisfaction of Pettis, he can look to last year's starting quarterback, senior Dakota Dean, who is expected to start at a linebacker or safety spot in the fall.

Foster, a junior, also played quarterback last year, and could play there again if needed. But he was moved to receiver so Crestview can utilize his athleticism on the field.

Tate Sweatt and Brandon Davis join Foster as the top receiver prospects. Matt Gillis also should see plenty of playing time at receiver. Dean and fellow senior Tyler Henderson worked almost exclusively with the defense this spring, but Pettis said he could use both players as receivers when fall camp opens in August.

The only guys who carried the football for the Bulldog varsity in the spring game were Reed brothers Micah and Emmanuel. Micah, a senior, is coming off a strong second half of his junior year and is currently committed to Central Florida. Emmanuel, a sophomore, was one of the most talked about freshmen at Crestview in recent years and he turned in a solid rookie campaign in sharing carries with his older brother.

The offensive line remains a work in progress with the loss of super size starters Earl Reed and Will Boler. But the Bulldogs did show they are capable of running the ball in the spring game behind a new combination of

linemen that included Alex Tillman, Jonathan Longman and Justin Abdo.




