Cub Scout camp in Crestview

Junior Jedis battle droids and each other in Old Spanish Trail Park

For only the second time in 20 years, Cub Scouts from the Gulf Coast Boy Scouts Council's north Okaloosa County region converged in Crestview for their annual summer day camp. With the weeklong camp's "Star Wars" theme, more than four-dozen junior Jedi warriors attacked battle droids, studied astronomy and engaged in other popular camp activities.

Adult organizers said the new Old Spanish Trail Park venue was popular with both the boys and their parents, who in years past have had to drive their sons to either Fort Walton Beach or the Boy Scout camp near Mossy Head for the day camp.

"We're just excited as we can be to have it here," Pack 732 Cub Master Rhonda Cawthon said. "This is great for the moms and dads. It's centrally located."

Mayor accused of cutting pay without notice

Council to consider assuming responsibility for employees' pay

LAUREL HILL — An accusation that Laurel Hill Mayor Joan Smith arbitrarily cut two employees' pay without notice and failed to provide workers with a personnel manual could lead to policy changes by the city council.

At Tuesday night's council meeting, Water Clerk Cindy O'loughlin said Smith reduced both her and City Clerk Nita Miller's pay by 55 cents an hour with no advance warning.

"I think that was wrong that I was not looked in the face and told my paycheck was going to be cut by \$80 a month," O'loughlin said in the public meeting.

The council sets city policy and the mayor administers those policies.

O'loughlin asked members of the council to intervene on employees' behalf.

"I believe it is time for the council to take some responsibility for the employees," O'loughlin said.

Council chairman Larry Hendren said in other cities "the council makes it part of the budget process to incorporate pay increases for the next year."

Hendren said he will explore a possible resolution or ordinance to turn responsibility for employee pay rates over to the council and bring a proposal back for discussion.

O'loughlin also said she "has yet to see a personnel policy."

"Nobody knows what we are supposed to do on a day-to-day basis," O'loughlin said.

Hendren said he will also look into implementation of a personnel manual.

"We are looking at procedural changes," Hendren said after the meeting.

At issue is Smith's reduction of Miller's and O'loughlin's pay from \$13.89 an hour to \$13.34 an hour. The pay for the city's other three employees was not cut.

"I'm confused," council member Willie Mae Toles said. "Why did you just cut those two?"

Smith said raises given to Miller and O'loughlin last year were larger than intended.

In September three of the city's five employees were returned to a 40-hour workweek after being reduced to 36 hours earlier in the year because of a budget shortfall.

O'loughlin and Miller were allowed to remain on a 36-hour workweek, but their hourly pay was increased to compensate for the lost hours. Miller's pay went from \$12 to \$13.34, but because of the shorter workweek her gross take home pay remained the same.

Sparse turnout for charter forum in Crestview

Role of proposed city administrator sparks discussion

Though Crestview City Council member Tim Grandberry was absent, the four remaining council members still outnumbered citizens at Monday evening's public workshop called to discuss the city's proposed new charter. The forum was held in Warriors Hall to accommodate a large turnout that failed

to materialize.

Two of the three citizens who attended spoke at the open forum. One of them, Landrum Edwards, expressed his opposition to several provisions in the proposed charter.

Edwards began by questioning why all voters can elect all council members, including those representing other precincts.

"It should be if you're in that district, you should vote in that district only," Edwards said. "Otherwise it's called stacking the vote."

Council member Charles Baugh Jr. explained the council fol-

lowed most of the recommendations made by the seven-member charter review committee, and revising the current method of electing council members was not one of the committee's recommendations.

Edwards also felt the mayor, whose role is weakened by the new charter, should be granted a vote on the council. Mayor

Dorcas fire chief fired 'without prejudice'

The Dorcas Fire District Board of Commissioners fired Chief Josh Lingenfelter in a 3-1 vote at a Thursday night meeting that went late into the night.

Lingenfelter was placed on administrative leave last month following the arrest of his wife, Courtney Lingenfelter, on charges of theft of department funds.

Courtney Lingenfelter, the fire department's former bookkeeper, admitted in an interview with State Attorney's Office investigators to writing more than \$6,600 in checks to herself and her husband off the fire department's bank accounts and to using the district's Walmart credit card and fuel card for her personal use, according to an affidavit.

Courtney Lingenfelter told investigators she handled all of her and her husband's personal finances and that Josh Lingenfelter was not aware that she had written the unauthorized checks and deposited some of them in his name. At the Thursday night meeting, Josh Lingenfelter said he had no knowledge of his wife's actions, that he had done nothing wrong and that his termination was not justified.

"My wife, she messed up," Josh Lingenfelter said. "She's facing up to what she's done. That has nothing to do with me."

Commissioners told Josh Lingenfelter that he was fired "without prejudice" and that he was not accused of being party to theft allegations against his wife.

"We are not trying to imply in any way that John is guilty of anything," fire board member Johna Esterberg said. "We want to

close the door on this bad publicity."

Esterberg voted to fire Josh Lingenfelter, as did board members Eddie Alford and Tom Cannon.

Board member Tamara Hagan cast the single nay vote. Board Chairman Ron Cliff was not present.

Cannon was criticized by supporters of the former fire chief for comments he made last month when Josh Lingenfelter was placed on administrative leave.

Among other things, Cannon told Josh Lingenfelter at the May meeting, "It is best for us to err on the side of precaution with the trouble you are having with your wife."

"Being married, if it is construed as conspiracy,

that's serious charges," Cannon said at the time.

"You are punishing him for what his wife has done," one member of the audience told Cannon at the Thursday meeting.

Cannon said he was not accusing Josh Lingenfelter of any wrongdoing, but felt that his termination was best for the department and the volunteer firefighters.

"The department needs to go back to work," Cannon said. "Everybody needs to get happy."

In a unanimous vote, the board appointed firefighter John Polinsky to serve as interim fire chief.

Friday morning, Polinsky said the fire department will operate as normal.

"Firefighters are in good spirits and the department is going to continue to move forward," Polinsky said.

"We're very grateful to the city of Crestview for allowing us to be here," Boy Scout Unit Commissioner Rae Schwartz said. "It's really the perfect location, and as a result we have more scouts here than they do on the south end."

For the campers, however, there were more pressing matters, including battling a battle droid, made of foam rubber limbs and PVC pipe by adult organizer John Bush. Other Cubs duelled between themselves with their foam "light sabers."

Across the camp's location on the shaded gentle slope behind the Crestview Senior Activity Center, Boy Scout Nathan Behr of Troop 773 was among the older boys serving as camp leaders for the Cub Scouts.

"Nothing but fun, fun, fun all day," Nathan said. "We're shooting archery and BB guns over here."

Under the watchful eyes of Nathan's dad and Troop 773's scoutmaster, Dan Behr, and National Rifle Association Boy Scout shooting sports instructor Mike Banks, a den of six or seven younger boys learned the parts of a bow and an arrow before loosening the arrows at targets. Then they made paper plate targets

and pinged away at them with BB guns.

Recently promoted Eagle Scout Derick Masters conducted first aid lessons, assisted by Scout Braeden Sevy, who, when the young boys were done binding his hands together with bandages, was proclaimed "a prisoner of first aid." The Cub Scouts also learned how to tie splints to stabilize a broken or sprained limb, and how to bandage a wound.

At the astrology table, the boys learned about the recent transit of Venus

across the face of the sun and wrote reports on famous astronomers. Then they got a practical feel for how distant our solar system's planets are from each other by portraying the planets and taking their position along a long measuring tape.

"Tomorrow we're doing constellations," Schwartz said. "Friday we'll be playing some space games and making rockets."

The Cub Scouts rotated from station to station, each having a chance at the various activities dur-

ing the daylong camps. Other activities included crafts, during which they made paper models of the famous "Star Wars" droid R2D2, and colored pictures by gluing to them various naturally colored dried peas and beans.

Physical activity was also emphasized, including a spirited game of kickball,

where referees included not just adults and Boy Scouts, but Crestview High student Michael Valdez, who was performing community service hours toward earning a Bright Futures scholarship to college.

The boys also played water sports, including a wet sponge relay, which were designed to cool them

down after a fierce game of kickball in the hot weather.

"It's a great turnout of Scouts," Troop 30 Scoutmaster Richard Masters said. "I think they're all having fun, the big boys and the younger ones."

David Cadle explained that having a vote would preclude the mayor from meeting with individual council members.

"Under the Sunshine Laws, I would not be able to have conversations with the council members," Cadle said. "Mike Anderson, mayor of Fort Walton Beach, does have that power (to vote) and he has said that restricts him in many ways."

Edwards also questioned the need for a city administrator.

"The one central leadership role — the one supervisory position — is desperately needed," said council member Robyn Helt, who served on the charter review committee. "There should be a city administrator to provide day-to-day leadership for the city."

The Rev. Sanford Hayes, who was also a member of

the charter review committee, suggested the council provide a more detailed description of the city administrator's duties to help citizens make their decisions.

"Do you plan on putting anything out so the people can look at the duties and responsibilities and the salary of the administrator?" Hayes asked.

"It's in the proposed charter, Section 5.02," Helt responded. "There might be minute details in the city administrator function that would not be listed in the charter. You want to see the major scope (of the position) but allow enough leeway so there can be administrative changes."

Edwards also asked why the charter was phrased to say the administrator would "serve at the pleasure of the city council, not at the pleasure of the citizens."

Council President Ben

Iannucci III, explained that "the council is elected by the people; the council's the boss of the city administrator," so by extension, the administrator would report to the citizens' representatives.

Former city council member Ellis Conner, who also served on the charter review committee, said convincing the public to support the new charter in the November elections might be difficult.

"Not all people like to see change," Conner said. "This (the new charter) is going to transfer city government from a three-body government...to essentially a one-body government."

Under the proposed charter, the city clerk would, like the city administrator, be appointed by the council. The charter review committee had

recommended leaving the clerk as an elected position, as it is in the current charter, to provide a check to the strengthened position of the council and weakened position of the mayor.

After Edwards complained the council should have advertised the forum more widely, Helt said despite notification having been given of the event in the News Bulletin, on WAAZ/WJSB radio, on public bulletin boards at City Hall and on the city website, it is ultimately the citizens' duty to keep themselves informed of civic affairs and meetings.

"We've brought the horse to water, but we can't make him drink," Helt said.

The council intends to host further public charter discussions in the near future.

"They were getting the same pay they would be at 40 hours, so that was an increase," Smith said.

In October all city employees were given a raise. Miller and Oloughlin's pay increased to \$13.89, an increase of 4 percent in Miller's case. Oloughlin received a larger raise, but the amount was not disclosed.

"I found out (the pay

raise) was more than we even discussed," Smith said of the clerks' pay raises.

It was Smith who came up with the figure of \$13.89 an hour; Oloughlin and Miller said, and questioned why the mayor would take the raise away eight months later.

"You did not give a reason why you cut our pay," Miller said.

Robber guilty in holdup

A Mobile, Ala., man arrested following a holdup attempt at a Crestview Fill-Ups convenience store has been convicted by a jury of robbery with a deadly weapon.

Darryl Wayne Ridgeway, 35, was booked into the Okaloosa County Jail Dec. 14, 2011, after being captured and arrested in Mobile following the Nov. 26, 2011, robbery. He was held on a \$100,000 bail pending his trial.

According to a press release from State Attorney William Eddins of the First Judicial Circuit, "During the robbery, the clerk was able to stab the defendant in self defense during a struggle for the money."

Ridgeway is scheduled to appear before Circuit Judge Michael Flowers for sentencing on July 16. He faces life in prison following his conviction.



An end to the BBQ war

Ms. B's and Possum Ridge join forces

Barbecue connoisseurs torn between across-the-street rivals Ms. B's Bar-B-Que and Possum Ridge Barbecue gained the best of both establishments with the merger of the two restaurants earlier this week.

Possum Ridge owners Rick and Viola Plante bought Ms. B's from its founder and namesake Belinda Gibbons and have closed down their familiar big black trailer where barbecue was smoked and served. Towed across the street, the trailer is serving as a back-up kitchen behind Ms. B's restaurant.

The Plantes opened their drive-up service in November 2007 on the west side of State Road 85 north of Stillwell Boulevard. Two years later, Ms. B's opened in a former wedding dress shop on Industrial Drive within sight of Possum Ridge. Both establishments have been

Triple B barbecue festival winners and have loyal fan bases.

Various economic factors affected both popular establishments. Rick Plante said he saw a substantial dip in their income when the BP oil spill drove away the summer beach rental crowd in 2010. Then the May 2011 opening of a Crestview branch of Johnny O'Quigley's Ale House next door to Ms. B's proved stiff competition for Gibbons' restaurant.

Customers of the new restaurant, which reopened for lunch on Tuesday, will enjoy many of both eateries' menu selections, Gibbons and Viola Plante said. Gibbons has been hired by the Plantes to manage the restaurant and oversee the transition, as the Possum Ridge proprietors have never operated a sit-down restaurant.

And, they assured patrons, Gibbons and her team will continue to operate the bakery portion, locally popular for

its treats such as sheet cakes, creative cupcakes, cream horns and cinnamon biscuits. The Plantes will add some baked goods of their own creation, including Viola's cobblers and Rick's king-sized cinnamon buns.

"That's the only question people keep asking," baker Becky Johnson said. "Is the bakery still going to be here?"

While the new establishment will bear the Possum Ridge name, longtime customers will see the same friendly Ms. B's staff bustling around the dining room. Rick Plante has assumed the pit master's duties, overseeing the barbecue and smoking facility custom-built behind the restaurant by Gibbons' husband Tim.

"It's a whole new, different adventure for us," Rick Plante said. "We had been looking for a years for a restaurant. We even thought of building new. Then Belinda approached me. She was wanting to retire. I said we have to jump on this chance. It's too good to be true."

"It's definitely a new hat to wear," Viola Plante added. "I couldn't ask for a better place with a better staff."

"It's very exciting," Belinda Gibbons said. "It's

As Viola Plante walked up, the women put their arms over each other's shoulders and grinned broadly.

"Today I made the pear crisp and she made the peach cobbler," Gibbons said. "It's going to be lots of fun!"

"This was a marriage," Plante said. "A happy marriage."

The "marriage" was good news to patrons worried when Ms. B's shut down last week.

"I'm a fan of both places now," Crestview resident Dwayne Hooper said happily as he paid his lunch tab Tuesday afternoon.

Possum Ridge BBQ and Bakery is at 1001 Industrial Dr., near the corner of Richbourg Lane. Opening hours will be announced soon.



Crestview hosts Florida State volleyball camp

Local volleyball players won't have to travel far to get all the advantages of a college camp at a reduced cost.

Crestview High School will host a Florida State volleyball camp Monday and Wednesday. The cost of the two-day event is \$160.

Bulldog volleyball coach Kathy Combest is happy to bring a college camp to the Crestview community.

"When you go to an individual camp (on a college campus) you have to drive there, plus you have to stay overnight," she said. "And it could run anywhere from \$200-300 just for one child, and that's all some children can do."

"So FSU, if a high school wants to do it, has what they call a satellite camp where they will move the camp to your site. They are going to be doing that at Crestview."

Several members of the Florida State coaching staff and Seminole players will lead the camp that is open to girls from all local schools grades six through 12.

"This camp is open to Laurel Hill, Baker, Jay, DeFuniak," she said. "It is open to anybody that wants their child to come to an individual camp that is only \$160. They will be doing the same thing here they do at their in-

"What they are doing is they are just exposing it to more people. When they do a satellite camp, they expose more kids to what Florida State is about and what volleyball can do for them."

By all indications the Crestview High School soccer camp was an overwhelming success.

"A lot of the young kids are really good, and I see them being really good when they grow up. I was about three when I started playing, and it brings back a lot of good memories."

"The best part was working with the little kids and trying to help them get better because it helps me get better too."

Born's teammate, Cameron White, was impressed with how quickly the young players were picking up certain skill sets.

"The best part of camp is definitely seeing kids improving from when they first got out here," he said. "After two days they are already better at dribbling and passing."

"Some of the younger kids are having a hard time with knowing where to be on the field, but most of the middle schoolers know what they are doing."

White, who will be a junior this fall, knows he'll have graduated before any of the players at the camp joins the Crestview varsity, but he did see enough to have hopes for the future of the program.

"I don't see anyone that I think will play with me," he said, "but I see a lot of kids from the middle school down to the youngest that I think definitely will be able to lead Crestview to victory."
