NEW TECHNOLOGY KEEPS FIRE DEPARTMENT UP TO DATE

Technology aids fire department response, communication

New technology is allowing the Crestview Fire Department to respond to emergency situations more

efficiently and enhance communications among the city's three fire stations, responding units, dispatch center and on-scene command staff.

Every morning, chiefs from the city's three public safety stations gather for a situational briefing. But now, should an alarm come in, none of the stations is short a firefighter, let alone a commander. Instead of meeting at the main Woodruff Avenue station as they used to do, firefighters attend via video conferencing without leaving their respective firehouses.

"We can do training this way as well

as staff meetings," Senior Capt. Ronnie Irlbeck of Station 3 on Brookmeade Drive said during a recent morning conference. "We remain in quarters, and our zones stay covered. When they pass on information, all three stations hear it at the same time."

Crestview taxpayers also derive financial benefits, he said. When senior staff members remain in their fire stations, their SUV command vehicles remain at the station. "We're not utilizing fuel," Irlbeck said.

Stretch of Old Antioch Road to be replaced

Work has begun on pothole-prone segment of road

Work is under way to repair a flood-prone section of Old Antioch Road requiring constant patching because of a high water table that drives asphalt out of potholes.

"This is not a Band-Aid; it's a cure," Okaloosa County Engineer Jason Autrey said. "We are fixing the road, not patching it."

Plans include ripping up a roughly mile-long section of Old Antioch Road from the Juniper Creek subdivision at Brodie Lane west to the Wilks Street entrance to the Sandy Ridge subdivision.

"We are not doing an overlay," Autrey said. "We are literally going to go in there and tear out the entire roadway, including the base, and build a new road."

The county has acquired 15 feet of right of way needed to move water and Okaloosa Gas lines and to construct a storm water ditch to funnel rainwater off the new road.

"The ditch is going to make all the difference in the world," Autrey said. "There will be no flooding out of the road when you have a heavy rain."

Plans for the roadwork are welcome news to Stephen Cowan, who lives

Voters face crowded ballot in primaries

Redistricting, revised precincts, multiple races on tap for '12

With presidential-year elections coming up, beginning with the primary election on Aug. 14,

north Okaloosa County voters are seeing the seasonal crop of campaign signs sprouting up among the roadside weeds and already are getting more and more pieces of campaign literature in their mailboxes.

Redistricting and new names on the ballot, amendments to the state constitution and a proposed new city charter for Crestview will give voters more to ponder than usual.

"We're juggling a lot of dif-

ferent things right now," said Okaloosa County Supervisor of Elections Paul Lux. "Everyone is about to get a new voter information card in the next week or two. The new card will contain any new polling place changes. Their precinct numbers haven't changed that drastically, but we did consolidate some polling places."

Some incumbent county officials, including Tax Collector Ben Anderson, Sheriff Larry

Ashley, District 1 County Commissioner Wayne Harris, school superintendent Dr. Alexis Tibbetts and school board representative Cathy Thigpen, face challengers for their seats.

Other incumbents automatically retained their offices when no challengers filed by the qualifying date. They include County Court Judge (Group 3) Patricia Grinstead, Clerk of Circuit Court


Don Howard, Lux and Property Appraiser Pete Smith.

Voters throughout the county will choose from a fresh slate of candidates for county commissioners for Districts 3 and 5.

North county voters will select fire commissioners for Baker District 2 and North Okaloosa Districts 1 and 5. Fire district commissioners for Almarante District 2; Baker Districts 1, 3 and 5; Blackman 1, 3 and 5; Dorcas 1, 2, 4 and 5; and Holt Districts 1 and 5 ran unopposed and retained their seats.

Some north county residents will have to adjust to having new state senators and representatives. The redrawing of state districts has resulted in state Sen. Don Gaetz now representing Crestview in the new District 1. State Sen. Greg Evers now represents the new Senate District 2, comprising the north county except for Crestview.

Former House District 5, once represented by Brad Drake, covered the north county east of

State Road 85, while District 1, represented by Doug Broxson, stretched west. Redistricted, all of north Okaloosa County except for Crestview is now in Broxson's District 3. Crestview and the south

end of the county are in Rep. Matt Gaetz's District 4.

Drake's former District 5 merged into the former District 7 of Marti Coley. Drake chose not to contest Coley's seat, allowing her to complete the last two years of her term, Lux said.

"Brad Drake is not our representative anymore," he said.

Lux said his office had to tweak some area precincts to accommodate the 2010 census results. In addition, the north county gained new voters from resident unmarried soldiers at the Seventh Special Forces Group (Airborne) cantonment, who will vote at the Foxwood Country Club polling station on Antioch Road.

"We tried to move some of the precinct boundaries to reduce the splits (in census blocks), but we weren't able to do it entirely just because the (state House and Senate) district boundaries don't match so horrendously," Lux said. "We adjusted borders in 31 precincts, but only nine of those

changes actually affect voters, and the number of voters affected is less than 400."

Crestview's proposed new charter will appear on the back of a large ballot, Lux said, "which is going to be a little tough for some folks, because the November ballot is already two pages long, because we have some amendments put there by the Legislature."

"Some of them (amendment descriptions) are better than 500 words, and one of them is better than 600 words, so any local referendums will be buried on the back of page 2 of a two-page ballot. Someone's going to have to do some serious voter education."

in the Sandy Ridge subdivision.

Cowan said the road segment has been patched so many times and is so rough, he won't drive the newer of his two cars on it.

"It seems like every week they are adding new patches to it," Cowan said. "I'm glad they are doing something about it."

On June 18, county road crews began clearing the right of way, requiring closure of Old Antioch Road between Brodie Lane and Wilks Street from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays.

It is expected to take three to four weeks to clear the right of ways and a couple of weeks to move the utility lines and cut in the ditch.

Meanwhile, the county is expected to seek bids for construction of the new section of road.

"In about eight weeks we hope to have a contractor on site," Autrey said.

Autrey said the final cost would not be determined until a contract bid has been accepted. He did say, however, that \$1.4 million has been earmarked for the project and that, "So far, we are significantly under budget."

The portion of Old Antioch Road west of Wilks Street is in the Crestview city limits and is not pitted with potholes like the section to be replaced.

"We are only going to do the part of the road the county is responsible for," Okaloosa County Commissioner Wayne Harris said. "We are doing the bad part."

Autrey agreed. "By far and away, this is the problem segment we are fixing," Autrey said. "This will be a significant improvement. It will be almost unrecognizable once it is done."

Crestview's firefighters also will use touch-screen computer tablets in each fire truck and rescue unit that will direct them to an emergency scene and allow them to send live video and photos to other responders and station headquarters.

"Our tablet technology will enhance our abilities to respond," Fire Chief Joe Traylor said. "We're testing it to make sure where we invested our money is going to do what we expect it to do."

When a call comes in, the fire department dispatcher enters the details into the system, and responding firefighters access it on their truck's tablet.

"Not only will it show what the nature of the call is, but it will use Google Earth to show the map of Crestview and will give the GPS location and will plot the most direct route to the location," Traylor said. "It's really going to help us to make sure we get to the calls in the most efficient manner."

Traylor and his firefighters said the technology especially helps them find their ways around new developments.

"We can get there directly," Traylor said. "With all the construction and new

subdivisions, there's just no other way you can keep track of it."

"The tablet maps are up to date," said firefighter Matt Baker of Rescue Unit 3. "Our paper maps don't show some of the new streets and developments."

Combining an enhanced map that includes Crestview's fire hydrant locations with each fire truck and rescue unit's GPS tag, mobile WiFi and tablet camera will allow dispatchers, senior command staff and fellow responders to monitor a developing emergency situation, Traylor said. Scene commanders can more accurately direct responders.

"When we get on scene, the fire trucks could engage their cameras and feed that video back to our dispatch center or the command post. The people running the scene could get different views from the fire trucks," Traylor said. "Instead of everybody approaching a burning building down the same street, they can see what the exposure is and where the hydrants are and may want to approach from another direction."

With vehicles "tagged" on the tablet map, "our

incident commander will be able to see each unit as they come on scene," Capt. Jeff Sory of Station 3 said. "He'll be able to send them right to a hydrant."

Having the tablets on scene also will expedite completion and enhance accuracy of incident reports, Baker added.

"It's very helpful," Baker said. "Right now we have to do the reports on paper, then come back to the station and put it in the computer. With the tablet we'll be able to write the report on-scene."

Baker said the tablets

also come with an application, or app, that pulls up schematics of nearly every make and model of vehicle so rescuers can determine how best to approach a passenger extrication from a wrecked car.

"The tablet will be able to give us a lot of information," Sory said.

Traylor said the technology allows Crestview firefighters to share information with other agencies, including law enforcement and the county Emergency Operations Center in Niceville. In a storm or other disaster, county emer-

gency operations staff can see live feeds from Crestview, he said.

"Right now we're the only agency that I'm aware of in the state of Florida that is using the technology to this level," Traylor said. "It works out really well for us. The technology winds up saving money in the long run and makes our job easier."

Wine bar opens with a bang

Yellow River Wine Bar is downtown's newest business

Main Street
Crestview's newest business officially opened to the public with a literal bang. The combined grand opening of the

Yellow River Wine Bar and a Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce "Business After Hours" social was suddenly cut short by a crash of thunder and a burst of lightning, followed by torrential rain.

Vintners and owners Crystal and Nathan Boyles started Okaloosa County's only licensed winery last year, producing fruit table wines from mostly locally grown produce. For them,

the June 14 deluge was an unforgettable evening in the history of their little family—and friends—operated winery in the Wilkerson Bluff area on the Yellow River.

"I try to look at the positive side of things," Nathan Boyles said. "For me, it was an excuse to have another party."

He said everyone simply gathered up the food, guitarist Aaron Overton grabbed his amps and the party moved into Boyles' law and land title offices.

"We had quite the after-party," Nathan Boyles said. "We just kept on going. We had friends and visitors who stayed with us for several hours."

Despite its name, the new business isn't a "bar," per se, its proprietors said.

"We use the term 'wine bar' but what we really have is a winery tasting room," Nathan Boyles said. "For us, it's the opportunity for people to come in and sample our wines and buy them by the bottle or buy them by the case. We can't sell you a glass of wine right now, but we hope to add that in the future."

The Boyles have bottled a variety of wines over the past year from different seasonal local fruit. Their strawberry wine, called "Summer Crush," was their first vintage. It was followed by a peach wine, "Feelin' Peachy," and a blueberry wine, "Little Beau Blue," named by their Facebook fans for the couples' infant son Beau.

An opportunity to purchase a semi-trailer full of California plums after it wrecked on Interstate 10 was too good to pass up, so a special vintage, "A Plum Shame," was born. Recently, the Boyles teamed up with local Crestview firefighter Rodney Lancaster, a fellow wine enthusiast, to produce "Fire Proof," a blackberry apple wine.

"We're not wine snobs," the Boyles assure

customers via a note on the back label of each bottle. "That's why we call our product 'wine for the rest of us.'"

In addition to buying fruit from area growers whenever possible, the Boyles proudly employ locals, including commissioning Crestview High School art student Daniel Reid to draw the fruit art on the wine labels, which are then printed at a downtown print shop.

Nathan Boyles is an active member of the Main Street Crestview Association and proponent of the historic downtown district.

"What Main Street needs are businesses that will draw people downtown, and we hope that our wine bar will be one of those businesses," he said. "When people travel, they seek unique experiences, and they'll go out of their way to find those. Winery tasting rooms are something people go out of the way to find."

"We'll be doing regional advertising to attract people to Crestview. We hope we'll be a catalyst to draw people downtown, and they'll visit our neighbors, stay for dinner and enjoy downtown Crestview."

Once the Yellow River Wine Bar is going, the Boyles want to expand the experience to create a place where visitors will be enticed to linger.


"We'd love to eventually partner with a local nearby restaurant to serve food in the afternoons in the courtyard," Nathan Boyles said. "We'd like to add live music in the courtyard, maybe monthly or every two or three weeks."

The Yellow River Wine Bar is open Wednesdays to Fridays, 11 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., "and as we grow, we hope we'll be able to expand on those hours," Nathan Boyles said.



Airport wins Project of the Year

Crestview Bob Sikes Airport has been awarded the American Association of Airport Executives, Southeast Chapter’s General Aviation-Project of the Year at the organization’s annual awards ceremony, reports Okaloosa County Airports Deputy Director Tracy Stage.

“Yes! The BAE North Apron Rehabilitation Project won!” Stage said. “Out of all general aviation airfield projects in the south-east United States, Okaloosa

County took home the hardware, and it could not have been possible without the combined efforts and support of many, especially the Department of Economic Opportunity and the FDOT (Florida Department of Transportation).”

To revamp the apron in front of BAE System’s hangar at Crestview’s airport, county officials, working with their contractor, developed a brand new asphalt mix that is impervious to aircraft fuel, because the previous mix would eat away at the apron surface.

The new mixture is

called the “Crestview Mix.”

Stage believes the new formulation of asphalt will become an industry standard, especially now that it has been accepted by the U.S. Air Force for use on America’s military bases. The Federal Aviation Administration, which is quick to adopt Air Force standards, will most likely follow suit, Stage said.

“All indications are this is clearly destined to change the way the FAA and DOD (Department of Defense) specify future airfield asphalt pavement projects,” Stage said.

The springtime events are held in Long Beach and Palm Springs in the U.S. TED's global focus includes presentations in Europe and Asia, and it offers live streaming of the talks, addressing an increasingly wide range of topics within the research and practice of science and culture.

The speakers are given a maximum of 18 minutes to present their ideas in the most innovative and engaging ways they can. Past presenters include Bill Clinton, Jane Goodall, Malcolm Gladwell ("Tipping Point," and "Blink"), Bill Gates, Google founders Larry Page and Sergey Brin, and many Nobel Prize winners. TED's current curator is the British former computer journalist and magazine publisher Chris Anderson ("The Long Tail").

talks have been offered for free viewing online, with about 1,000 now available, a good thing since I would never be able to afford the \$6,000 annual conference membership fee. One of the first talks that piqued my interest was "The Surprising Science of Motivation" by Daniel Pink, since I'd really enjoyed his books "Drive" and "A Whole New Mind." Recently, "Designing Books is No Laughing Matter" by Chip Kidd made me look at book jackets in a way I'd never done before.

Recently introduced too is TED Books, an imprint of short nonfiction works designed for digital distribution (ebooks only). Shorter than traditional books, they run fewer than 20,000 words each — long enough to explain a powerful idea, but short enough possibly to be read in a single sitting.

STAFF BOOK PICK

"The Rise and Decline of the Redneck Riviera" by Harvey H. Jackson III (975.99 Jac) — Jackson traces the development of the Florida-Alabama coast as a tourist destination from the late 1920s and early 1930s, when it was sparsely populated with small fishing villages, to the devastating BP oil spill of 2010. He explores the rise of this area as a vacation destination for the lower South's middle- and working-class families following World War II, the building boom of the 1950s and 1960s, and the emergence of the student spring break season.

From the late 1960s through 1979, severe hurricanes hit the region, destroying many small motels, cafes, bars, and early cottages that gave the small beach towns their essential character. In the wake of these storms, a second building boom en-

sued in the 1980s, dominated by high-rise condos and large resort hotels. Tensions arose surrounding the gentrification of the late 1980s and 1990s and, of course, the collapse of the housing market in 2008 is still affecting the area.

Drawing from local newspapers, interviews, documentaries, community histories and several scholarly studies, Jackson witnessed the changes personally since the days of his 1950s-built family vacation cottage in Seagrove Beach. Whether you were born here or just arrived, you will find this book very helpful in understanding how the Panhandle developed.

Title IX changed the world of sports

Most young women today don't even think about Title IX. I'd dare say many of those young women don't even know what Title IX is or how it has shaped their lives.

On June 23, 1972, Title IX became the law of the land and opened doors for countless

young women to pursue their dreams of competing in sports.

The wording of the law is simple: "No person in the United States shall, on basis of sex, be excluded from participation

in, be denied the benefits of, or subjected to discriminations under any education program or activity."

Simply stated, the law mandated that women be given the same opportunity to compete in athletics, as well as academics, as their male counterparts.

I attended high school from the fall of 1972 through May 1976, and if I were to thumb through the pages of my old high school yearbooks I would see a girls basketball team, volleyball team, track team, tennis team and maybe a golf team. If there was a softball team, it played slow-pitch softball. Yes, we had cheerleaders, but cheerleading wasn't considered a sport back then.

When it was time to vote on our class superlatives, we did recognize the most athletic girl, as well as the most athletic guy. And though the most athletic guy in my class went on to play football at Auburn, the most athletic girl, to my knowledge, didn't have any opportunities to play sports at the college level. But today young women are only limited in their opportunities by their dreams and their athletic talent.

Crestview graduates Shelby Gainer and Hannah Day have signed softball scholarships in recent months, and former Bulldog sprinter Asten Lopez signed a track scholarship. Baker volleyball star Laurie Steele will continue her career at the college level this fall, and her classmate Morgan Jones will attend South Alabama on a track and field scholarship.

As the opportunities to compete have expanded for young women, so too have the chances to coach.

Crestview girls basketball and volleyball coach Kathy Combest was a pioneer, playing college basketball at William and Carey in Hattiesburg, Miss., during the early years of Title IX. Combest can tell you stories about the evolution in sports brought on by Title IX.

I was in college during the early years of Title IX, and I can attest to the fact that women's sports often were pushed to the old gym on campus, while the men were playing at the best facilities available. Today the women play their games on courts and fields that are every bit as good as those used by the men.

One basketball court at my alma mater of the University of Tennessee even bears the name of a woman, Pat Summitt, who is the winningest coach in the history of basketball. Both the men and women basketball teams take to the floor at The Summitt.

"I like small numbers because I can devote more individual attention to them than I can in a big class," he said. "They can come and have fun and catch fish. Parents come out, and they learn a few lessons too."


"The biggest thing is learning how to catch them."

Martin said Monday's fishing wasn't very good, but they changed locations to the new bridge, and it improved.

Often Martin would interrupt his own conversation to point out a fish to the campers as it leaped from the water. Martin said there were some pretty big catfish in the lake, and by today or Thursday he hopes to put a young angler in a position to land a 6- or 8-pound catfish.

The young anglers will be fishing by themselves soon enough, and Martin loves to run into his old pupils on the water.

"You see kids that were out here when they were little, and they have kind of developed their fishing techniques," Martin said. "I ran into some of the kids when I was out here this morning that are outdoor education kids that are trying out some of the bass techniques we have learned already."

The last 40 years have been good for women's athletics, but there are still growing pains. And in some corners there remains resentment that with the expansion of women's athletics, some men programs had to be cut to achieve the balance of an equal number of scholarships for both men and women.

I understand football is the big program that requires the most scholarships, and the balance must be achieved in other programs, but in the 40 years since Title IX became law, women's athletic programs have expanded often at the expense of a men's program. It seems to me if a school cuts a men's wrestling program while fielding a rowing team for women, then it's the men who are being discriminated against.

There is no perfect law or policy, and someone will always feel as if the other party is getting a bigger slice of the pie, but 40 years ago there was no pie for the ladies. Today when women athletes sit at the table with their male peers, they can be confident they are getting their fair share, and it all started June 23, 1972, thanks to a thing called Title IX.

nationals at the University of West Florida on July 10-14 and will go back to Orlando later next month.

Watching the teams run through their drills, it is obvious Livingston and the rest of the coaches have spent plenty of time stressing the fundamentals of basketball. Every player works on dribbling and passing the ball like a seasoned professional, and drills are conducted with the precision expected of players several years older.

The accelerated skill development is all part of Livingston's plan.

"I don't coach to the level they are at, I try to coach them above that," said Livingston, who helps Crestview boys basketball coach Keith White. "If they are in the fifth grade, I try to coach them to be better than this to the next (level)."

"I do talk to coach White and try to do some of the drills he does, so when the kids get up to that level they are going to know what to do."

Livingston said he sees a bright future for members of the Force if the players stay together through high school.

"I think if the fifth-grade


Tickets are \$25 for adults and \$20 for youth ages 18 and younger. There is a \$2 per ticket box office processing fee. Tickets may be

Duane Paxson sculptures, Dalí prints on display

The Mattie Kelly Arts Center Galleries at Northwest Florida State College concludes its 2011-12 season with two exciting shows on display through July 20.

The McIlroy Gallery will host Duane Paxson's new body of work, the Ivory Tower series. And back by popular demand, the Holzhauser Gallery will feature Salvador Dalí's series of woodblock prints illustrating Dante Alighieri's "Divine Comedy."

In his Ivory Tower series, Paxson incorporates wood, metal cage-like forms and synthetic materials to

create sculptures that investigate structures of power. His works call on the viewer to think about how power and influence are wielded in a variety of forums: government, professional life, family and gender relations, among others.

As a special treat for families, in addition to his Ivory Tower series, the college will also exhibit Paxson's large-scale installation, "Jelly Bean Angels." The piece is accompanied by an illustrated narrative and is very popular with children.

Paxson will give an Artist Talk at 1 p.m. Thursday in the McIlroy Gallery. The public is invited to meet the artist and learn about his work.

In the Holzhauser Gallery, Salvador Dalí's suite of 100 prints — commissioned by the Italian government in the early 1950s to commemorate the septuagennial of the poet's birth — presents a surrealist vision of Dante Alighieri's

"Divine Comedy."

Each of the 100 cantos describing Dante's travels to Inferno, Purgatory and Paradise is illustrated by a woodblock based on (now lost) original watercolors by Dalí. Though shown in part and in other venues, the series has not been exhibited in total at the Mattie Kelly Arts Center in more than a decade.

Don't miss this rare opportunity to see an important part of NWFSC's permanent collection alongside new work from an Alabama artist with an international reputation. The galleries are open Monday through Friday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., and 90 minutes before Mainstage and Sprint Theater productions, including the summer musical "The Wiz" (July 18-21).






