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City, county to discuss Villacrest light

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After an Okaloosa County recommendation to activate the flashing emergency light at Villacrest Drive (west) and P.J. Adams Parkway as a traffic signal failed to placate the neighborhood's residents, Crestview city officials pushed the issue.

As a result, the county agreed to consider their request to erect a light at the Villacrest eastern intersection.

Prompted by resident Greg Smith's comment on behalf of a large contingent from Countryview Estates who attended the June 25 Crestview City Council meeting, Public Works Director Wayne Steele described recent communications with county

Public Works Director John Hofstad.

"At the previous meeting, the council voted to pursue providing a light at the western intersection of P.J. Adams and Villacrest," Steele said.

Steele said he and his staff reviewed the information provided by the county after it performed traffic studies at both of horse-shoe-shaped Villacrest Drive's

intersections with P.J. Adams Parkway at the city's request.

Though the county found traffic at Villacrest East supported a signal, the traffic study discovered an even greater traffic flow at Ashley Drive, which becomes Villacrest West when it crosses P.J. Adams. Based on that data and the existence of the emergency flashing signal, the county recommended converting the sig-

nal to a functioning traffic light.

Crestview Public Works staff, however, also consulted plans by county contractor HDR Engineering for widening P.J. Adams to four lanes, Steele said.

"They supported a traffic light at the eastern intersection," Steele said. "With that being said, I thought that would better serve

CHS lip dub aims for 'Ellen DeGeneres Show'

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The 6-minute, 41-second Crestview High School lip-synch video, or "lip dub," that captured the spirit of the school and the enthusiasm of the community is still racking up views on YouTube — more than 103,500 as of press time. Now it has a chance of reaching an even wider audience: the viewership of "The Ellen DeGeneres Show."

"I got an email from the producer who said Ellen's people have watched the video and they're interested in it," said the lip dub's student director, Ben White III. "A producer said if the lip dub continued to grow in views and people continued to watch it, they would consider

putting it on the show."

The all-student production has been the highlight of Ben's budding film and television career thus far. The final production involved the cooperation of virtually the entire school.

"It was a month and a half of planning, and we only had four or five practices with the singers," Ben said. "The majority of the people in it were spontaneous."

Industry experts who have viewed the production had praise for Ben's preparation and groundwork.

"It is easy to imagine the large amount of pre-shoot organization and planning required by that project," three-

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Amirah Hall has a lot on her plate these days.

When she isn't helping her mother do the bookkeeping for Total Business Solutions in Crestview and raising her son Daylin, the 26-year-old is taking up her father's cause — running the Foster Families of America Inc. thrift store.

Hall's father, Dalton Jones, started Foster Families of America Inc. five years ago. Now, the 53-year-old Jones' health is failing, and he is under hospice care.

Hall is determined to keep her father's dream of helping those less fortunate alive.

"I want to keep it going as best as I can," Hall said.

On Main Street next to Coney Island, Foster Families of America Inc., has been serving the less fortunate through donations from the community. The thrift store offers very low prices on everything from clothing to food.

Foster families that are financially struggling are provided for at the thrift store, with free food and clothing.

Rita Rice has been shopping at or donating to the thrift store since it opened in 2007. The Baker resident visits the store at least once a week. Rice said she has nothing but the highest regard for Jones and his selfless acts of generosity and charity.

"I think he is such a wonderful man," Rice said. "He goes out of his way to help anyone, even if it's on his own dime."

Jones was a foster child himself, raised in a household along with 11 other children in Kentucky. Jones and his wife of 13 years, Wanda, later would take in foster children of their own. It was then that he would learn of the financial burden being a foster parent



time Emmy Award winning retired NBC News producer/director Paul Yacich said from his home near New Orleans. "If that were his only talent, he would still be qualified to set up complicated productions. A lot of effort went into that."

Derek Toten, a Tulane University instructor of video production, director and Yacich's former production manager, concurred.

"It's a remarkable video, well conceived and executed," Toten said. "The achievement here is the planning, coordination and execution. Getting that many people to cooperate and choreograph them to the degree that he did is amazing."

Ben said the lip dub's joyous finale evolved on its own.

"What is so amazing was the end shot," he said. "We planned the entire lip dub and what people were going to do, but we never thought about the end shot. It just turned into this amazing pep rally, and it was so spontaneous. The vastness of it and the amount of people there shows that high school can be the most amazing time of your life if you just get involved with it. I think that was one of the messages that came out of the video."

But Ben won't stop with the lip dub. To him, its success is a doorway to a lifetime career, beginning with entering the University of West

Florida's film program this fall.

"I love what lip dub has done for me, but I don't want to be known as the guy who has that video with a 100,000 views," Ben said. "I want this to be a career, but I can't knock what this lip dub's done for me. It shows people what I'm capable of."

Ben followed the success of the student lip dub with a faculty lip dub involving several dozen Crestview

High teachers and administrators, led by Principal Bob Jones. That production was a surprise at the senior breakfast.

"It was more challenging than the student lip dub because there were more cuts and stuff," Ben said. "It was a present to the Class of 2012 because they did so much for me, especially with this student lip dub."

Ben said he is equally comfortable in front of the camera or behind it. Some of his YouTube videos feature him as both star and director. During the summer, he's preparing for stunts in front of the camera, including assisting an upper-classman at UWF with a short film and doing a modeling gig at Destin Commons.

"My life pretty much consists of going to the gym," Ben said. "In August I'm doing a shirtless thing for two weeks. The lip dub had given me some opportunities in front of the camera, too. I really love being in front of the camera, like you can see in the 'What is Love' video."

Meanwhile, Ben begs, cajoles and encourages everyone he encounters to watch — and re-watch — the Crestview High student lip dub to keep ratcheting up its views.

"This lip dub's really given me opportunities, but if it goes on Ellen DeGeneres, it is like the greatest thing that's ever happened to me," he said.

the public in that area." Though Hofstad initially had stood by his department's original recommendation to convert the Villacrest West light, Steele said he later "called back and said he wasn't aware of HDR's consideration. The county now wants to meet with city staff to work together to come back with a better resolution to put a signal at the eastern end of Villacrest," Steele said.

"I think we can do some of the things in-house, but I would not go to the meeting with the intent of obligating us to any money, but I would go there to make sure we are represented fairly," he said. Council member Robyn Helt moved to allow Steele to attend the meeting with

the county and come back with a report. Her motion passed unanimously.

"This is a prime example of why the county having their own staff and we having our own staff is a valuable component," Helt said, further supporting her call for the city to have its own building official rather than relying on a county official. "Our staff was able to contradict some of the information provided by the county staff."

Council member Charles Baugh Jr. praised Steele for "representing the citizens and being proactive," leading to a round of applause from the audience.

"There's no promises yet," Steele said to laughter.

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Crestview gets a permanent lawyer

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Crestview has a new city attorney following unanimous action by the city council to appoint interim attorney J. Jerome "Jerry" Miller to the permanent position. Miller was the only candidate who responded to the city's request for qualifications (RFQ) to fill the seat vacated by longtime city attorney Ben Holley, who resigned March 26.

"Last Monday (June 18) was the closing date for our request for qualifications," City Clerk Betsy Roy reported. "We received one proposal, from Jerry Miller, our interim attorney."

Roy recommended the council approve hiring Miller "based on his application and considering his invoices."

Following procedure, it

took two votes to engage Miller as the city's attorney. First, the council had to accept Miller's bid for the position, and then it accepted Miller as attorney. Both motions passed unanimously.

"With those terms, which are consistent with the RFQ, I will be pleased to serve," Miller said.

Miller, an attorney with the Destin firm of Pleat & Perry, is also the attorney for the city of Destin and had previously served as Crestview city attorney from 1989 to 1996. He is past president of the Florida Municipal Attorneys Association and was named the Florida Municipal Attorney of the Year in 2005.

Miller had previously assured the council that because Destin holds its council meetings on a different day than Crestview, he will not be impeded from serving the Hub City. When an occasional conflict has arisen during a council workshop, for example, Miller's colleague, Patrick King, attends the Crestview meeting.

In one of his first actions as the city's permanent attorney, Miller advised Mayor David Cadle and the council to refrain from comment on a citizen's request for an update on the termination of former police chief Brian Mitchell because of the confidentiality of personnel issues.

During the meeting, interim Police Chief Kenneth Bundrick briefed the council on a new cyber security system the department has subscribed to. Email, Twitter and Facebook re-

leases from the police will be filtered through Nixle.com, which certifies its municipal and public safety clients' communications as authentic to prevent "spoofing" attacks.

"Anybody can make a profile that says Crestview Police Department on Twitter or Facebook. We can't stop that," Bundrick said. "This company works to make sure we are who we say we are. When we post something electronically through this company, it certifies that we are posting it."

In other matters, the council:

- Unanimously approved March 30, 2013, as the date for the ninth annual Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce Triple B Festival.

- Unanimously approved a revised ordinance providing for city inspectors to test residential

water system back-flow prevention connectors to reduce the cost to water customers.

- Unanimously approved a quarterly employee recognition program that would grant the honoree a paid day off.

- Unanimously approved a city returned check policy drafted by Roy's office after she reported, "We have discovered we do not really have a policy in place when a check is returned."

- Set a meeting of the Community Redevelopment Agency for July 30 at 5 p.m. to consider a variety of matters including a proposed dog park in Twin Hills Park and funding a law enforcement officer to patrol the downtown district.

- Appointed Mack Brooks and Mae R. Coleman to the Historic Preservation Board and Bill Cox to the Board of Adjustment.

- Received a request from Mayor David Cadle for volunteers to serve on the Crimestoppers board to increase representation from the Crestview area.

- Received a request from Cadle to establish a city policy on using the banner pylons at the head and foot of Main Street.

- Heard Bundrick assure a resident that police foot patrols have begun in public housing neighborhoods to address an increase in crime in the areas. Funding restricts the patrols to weekends at the present.

- Received a recommendation from Finance Director Patti Beebe that instead of a series of evening workshops during which each department head presents his or her proposed 2012-13 budget, one or two half-day workshops be held.

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Crestview police investigator fired

Tim White, an investigator for the Crestview Police Department's Street Crimes Unit under then Maj. Joseph Floyd, has been fired for tampering with evidence and perjury.

White admitted to stealing marijuana out of a SWAT team locker and using it to bolster an application for a search warrant.

In a confidential letter to Crestview Mayor David Caddle that eventually touched off an internal investigation, White wrote that the incident was one of three "in which I was placed in a situation which were unethical, immoral and lacked integrity."

He said the three incidents took place while he was "working for a supervisor within this department."

The supervisor was identified in other investigation documents as Sgt. Matthew Purvines.

Purvines, who is still on the police force, also was investigated and questioned as part of the internal inquiry.

He denied the allegations against him.

Purvines told investigators White's accusations might have been in retaliation for testimony he provided against Floyd and former Police Chief Brian Mitchell.

Floyd has been charged with racketeering and Mitchell has been fired.

Police spokesman Andrew Schneider said White's termination June 14 was "based on his actions that violated department and city policies."

In the letter that led to him being investigated, White reported that he was instructed by "my supervisor" to drive to the supervisor's home.

While there, he said he was ordered to dig a hole and then told to turn his department-issued weapon over to the supervisor, who used it to kill a sick dog that belonged to a family member.

White also reported that he conducted a "trash pull" as part of an investigation and "located a small amount of marijuana."

"I advised my supervisor of my findings and my supervisor advised me, 'If I was in your shoes I'd get marijuana from the SWAT closet and add it to what you found,'" he said in the letter. "I again was in fear of

losing my job and felt obligated to do as instructed by my supervisor," he added.

The third incident White reported in his letter involved him accompanying his supervisor on a surveillance mission.

"I... observed my supervisor jump a chain link fence leading to the back yard of the residence and walk towards the front door," the letter said.

It states White had reason to believe the supervisor "did in fact enter the residence."

The internal investigation conducted by Police Department Lt. Jamie Grant determined White may have committed five criminal offenses and four violations of Crestview's city policy manual.

The criminal violations included: perjury, tampering with/or fabricating evidence, official misconduct, false report of the commission of a crime and trespassing.

His use of the planted pot to obtain a search warrant, signed by Okaloosa County Judge Jim Ward on May 17, 2010, "is sufficient evidence to support a criminal violation" according to a letter to White from interim Police Chief Kenneth Bundrick.

Planting, tampering with and/or fabricating evidence to secure a search warrant "sworn to and before a judge" constitutes perjury, Bundrick wrote.

The letter, dated June 11, notifies White that a "pre-termination hearing" had been scheduled. In that letter, Bundrick also notified White he was being suspended without pay.

A grievance hearing requested by White was held June 21, Schneider said.

Schneider said if criminal charges are brought against White, they would be filed by another agency.

Bill Bishop, the county's chief assistant state attorney, said his office had been advised of the internal investigation findings and of White's termination.

"Our office will be investigating possible further charges in this matter," he said.

In the meantime, the state attorney's office has notified defense attorneys in all cases in which White might have been a witness of his inability to testify and is weighing "each pending case on a case-by-case basis" to see how White's involvement could affect the outcome, Bishop said.

Head-on collision sends 6 to hospital

A head-on collision Friday afternoon on an Arena Road curve drew emergency responders from multiple public safety agencies and resulted in six people, two adults and four children, being transported to the hospital.

The crash between a white Dodge Neon and a white Ford Escort occurred around 2:30 p.m. The four children were riding in the Dodge. The male driver of the Ford refused treatment at the scene or transportation to the hospital.

"They were both probably just coming around here too fast," Crestview Police Department officer Brian McCallum said on the scene. "It's exactly what happens on this corner."

McCallum said tire tracks in the dirt road indicated either one or both of the vehicles probably skidded when they tried to brake, however the investigation was not yet complete. Both cars ended up on the eastbound side of the road.

Emergency responders initially brought nearly a dozen vehicles to the scene, including three Okaloosa County EMS ambulances, a North Okaloosa Fire District fire truck, and patrol vehicles from the Crestview Police Department, Crestview Fire Department and the Okaloosa County Sheriff's Office.

A crying toddler was observed being removed on a backboard from the rear of the Dodge, while one of the adults complained of an arm injury. Neck braces were placed on at least two

of the adults, including a woman believed to be driving the Dodge.

With the wreck occurring on one of the hottest days of the year so far, responders shaded the injured from the sun with towels or their hands as they were treated and removed from the Dodge and placed in the air conditioned ambulances.

McCallum was unable to say if the occupants of the vehicles were wearing seatbelts, however he overheard another responder say at least one of the children was not restrained in the Dodge.

The wreck still is under investigation.





Disabled parking permit requirements change

New legislation calls for documentation when renewing disabled parking permits. If you have a blue permanent disabled parking permit, you need to be aware of the new requirements put in place by Florida lawmakers. The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles will implement the new law.

Effective Oct. 1, any person issued a blue permanent disabled parking permit must renew the permit every four years and, when doing so, provide a certificate of disability completed and signed by a certifying authority within the last 12 months. That means every blue disabled parking permit holder will, at least every four years and within 12 months of the date of their renewal, fill out Form HSMV 83039. Permit holders will not have to pay a renewal fee.

In addition, effective July 1, if your blue permanent disabled parking permit is lost or stolen, a replacement will only be issued if you submit the same documentation required for renewals. The new law does not affect red temporary disabled parking permits, nor people who have disabled (wheelchair) license plates.

Under current Florida law, disabled parking permit holders must



renew their parking permits every four years, but they do not have to submit a certificate of disability when renewing. They can renew online, by mail or by visiting the Okaloosa County Tax Collector's office.

The legislation also directs the department to collect calls reporting abuse of the permits. Calls should be placed to the DHSMV Customer Service Center at 617-3803.

More than 1.3 million Floridians currently have permanent blue disabled parking permits. The permanent permit is blue; the temporary

permit is red. The blue disabled parking permit with a current sticker must be visible from the front and rear of a motor vehicle. One side of the permit must display the applicant's driver license number or state identification card number, along with a warning the applicant must have such identification at all times while using the parking permit.

Illegally obtaining or using a permit can result in the loss of the parking permit and carries the potential for criminal penalties as outlined in Florida Statute 320-0848.


activities. "We will be handing out free water bottles and at least 1,000 free hot dogs," said the church's pastor, the

Children at risk for fireworks eye injuries

JACKSONVILLE — The Florida Society of Ophthalmology and the American Academy of Ophthalmology are working together to urge Floridians to protect themselves and their children from fireworks eye injuries over the July 4 holiday. Of the 9,000 fireworks-related injuries each year, 21 percent affect the eyes, and more than half of the victims are young children or teenagers.

Fireworks of all types, including sparklers, are dangerous. Sparklers typically burn at 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit

and cause 27 percent of all fireworks injuries, including third-degree burns. Bottle rockets cause some of the most serious eye injuries. Errant bottle rockets can injure bystanders and cause many eye injuries. One in every six fireworks-related eye injuries results in permanent vision loss or blindness.

To prevent an eye injury from ruining Fourth of July celebrations, the American Academy of Ophthalmology urges Americans to follow these tips:

- Never let children play with fireworks of any type.
- View fireworks from at least 500 feet away.
- Leave the lighting of fireworks to trained professionals.

• If you find unexploded fireworks, do not touch them. Immediately contact your local fire or police departments.


Using illegal fireworks is a first-degree misdemeanor and is a crime punishable by a \$1,000 fine and up to one year in jail. If you spot a brush or wildfire or if someone is injured, immediately call 911.

PROHIBITED: Under Florida law, only sparklers approved by the Division of State Fire Marshal are legal for consumer usage anytime of the year. Sparklers should bear the wording "emits a fountain or shower of sparks." Aerial devices are prohibited. A good rule of thumb is if it flies or explodes, it is not legal in Florida.

ALLOWED: Over 2,000 state approved sparklers, trick noise makers and fountains, and permitted public fireworks displays.

If you decide to celebrate the Fourth of July at home with sparklers, remember these helpful tips to minimize your chance of accident or injury:

- Cotton clothing is recommended when igniting the products. If your clothes catch fire, it is easier to extinguish. Synthetic fabrics tend to melt to the skin, which puts you at a greater risk for extreme burns.
- Only purchase state-approved sparklers from licensed vendors.
- Before use, be sure to read and follow all warnings and instructions.
- Only light sparklers on a flat, smooth surface away from combustible materials. Do not light them on grass.
- Keep a fire extinguisher or water hose on hand for emergencies.
- Be sure people and pets are out of range before igniting the sparkler.
- Never have any portion of your body directly over the sparkler when lighting the fuse.
- Never allow children to play or use any sparkler or novelty device without supervision.
- Do not use any unwrapped item that might have been tampered with.
- Light only one item at a time, and never attempt to re-light a "dud."
- Discard of all products safely. Submerge used and "dud" sparklers in water before placing in trash receptacles.



A family picnic treat from the old country

My great-grandparents' rich Rhenisch heritage has transcended the generations in the form of Great-grandmother Snyder's famous hot German potato salad. Backyard picnics weren't complete until Mom came out the kitchen door bearing a big bowl of the wonderful treat made from her in-laws' recipe.

Because it was served hot off the stove, it was always the last dish to be prepared. While Dad was grilling the burgers or wieners, Mom would be finalizing the "Kartoffelsalat," as Great-grandmother would have called it. In fact, until I moved to the South, I never imagined that potato salad could be served cold.

As we celebrate Independence Day, I think of the freedoms and liberties my ancestors earned as new, hardworking Americans. When I make this potato salad, I remember, too, my roots in the German Rheinland. I hope you like it.

Dankeschön, Grossmütter!

Hot German Potato Salad

Makes 6-8 servings.

- 6 medium potatoes
- 10-12 slices bacon
- ½ cup chopped onion
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 1½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon celery seed
- few dashes pepper
- ½ cup vinegar
- ½ cup water

Peel, dice into ¾-inch cubes and cook the potatoes in salted boiling water and drain.

Meanwhile, in a large frying pan or skillet, fry the bacon until crisp, then drain on a paper towel.

Cook the onions in the bacon grease until lightly browned.

Blend in the flour, sugar, salt, celery seed and pepper; cook over low heat until smooth and bubbly, stirring constantly.

Remove from heat and stir in vinegar and water (slowly so you don't get spattered). Heat to a boil, stirring constantly. Boil one minute. Sauce will suddenly thicken.

Put cooked potatoes in a serving bowl, pour the sauce over them, crumble the bacon into the potatoes and stir to mix. Serve immediately. Guten appetit!

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
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

"It's a fantastic group of kids. We had no real issues. Everyone just worked hard and had a lot of fun."

Campers ranged from 4 years old up to middle school age, and the instruction was geared to meet the skill levels of the participants.

"We always have the different groups work together," Rose said. "The youngest ones work for about an hour, and then we either work the older ones with a big group or break them down to two groups. It all depends on what we are working on that particular day."

The common theme among all of the players was getting the basics down correctly.

"We worked on everything right across the board, ball control, dribbling, touches on the ball, basic turns and basic moves are a foundation of the curriculum," Rose said.

Aside from the obvious soccer skills learned, the camp serves another purpose.

"I don't think kids are active enough, so I think four or five weeks over the summer being involved in camps and all of that is good for the kids," Rose said. "The reason we just do two hours a day is to try not to get them too fatigued. We try hard to give

Plant the right plant in the right place

The mature size of plants is an important consideration when choosing plants for your landscape. It's best to select plants that fit the size area you wish to fill.

Before selecting a plant, be sure to find out how large it will eventually get. In many cases it's important to know the mature size in both height and width. And don't rely on the word "dwarf" in the plant name. This term is relative and can be very misleading.

For example, a dwarf Burford holly can grow 10 feet or more in height with time and somewhat based on its location. This might not be what the homeowner had in mind when buying a "dwarf" shrub to place beneath a low window.

Many people can't look at a plant in a gallon-size pot and imagine that in just a few years it will take over the side of the house. A common landscape mistake is to not place the plants properly when planting to allow for their mature size.

Planting a tree that will eventually reach 80 feet in height under a power line that's 20 feet off the ground eventually creates problems for both the tree and the power lines. People often complain when such trees have to be pruned

because of limbs growing into the lines. But in many cases, the power lines were there first. It's almost as if the lines were used as a reference to place the trees in a straight row.

Another common example is placing plants such as shore junipers in narrow plant beds. Shore juniper is a poor choice for narrow beds. One shore juniper can have a mature spread of 6 to 9 feet. Pruning to force the plants to "fit" within a narrow bed results in plant decline. Eventually the entire planting becomes an eyesore as the plants begin to die.

Most of these kinds of problems happen simply because someone did not realize the plant's mature size and space requirements. It's certainly worth your time to find out how large a plant will be at maturity. Our office has this information for most plants appropriate for North Florida. A reputable nursery should be able to quickly provide this information for the plants they sell. The point is to find out before you plant so you can plant the right-sized plant in the right-sized place.

FWC snook researcher wins conservation award

The Wildlife Foundation of Florida honored longtime Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission biologist Ron Taylor with the 2011 Louise Ireland Humphrey Achievement Award at a commission meeting May 3 in Crystal River.

Taylor has studied marine fisheries for the state for 35 years. He is the lead scientist for snook research in Florida and is noted worldwide as an authority on the sport fish. His research has led to many discoveries about snook. Among them, and one he considers his greatest professional achievement, is finding that all snook are born as males, and some later become females. This information is important to the management of the fishery.

Taylor continues to study snook today. His most recent work in rivers and on offshore reefs has provided valuable insight into the life history of snook species other than the popular common snook. Taylor's research also has helped identify a new species of the fish in Florida: large-scale fat snook.

"Ron has dedicated his life to the study of marine fisheries in Florida, and snook in particular," said

Gil McRae, director of the commission's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute. "His knowledge, passion and commitment to a team-based approach make him a major asset to the agency and well deserving of this recognition."

Taylor is noted by his colleagues as a great mentor and a popular presenter at scientific conferences and meetings. His love for his work has rubbed off on his son as well. Ron Taylor takes great pride in the fact that Josh Taylor has followed in his footsteps as a marine fisheries researcher with the commission.

The Wildlife Foundation of Florida created the Louise Ireland Humphrey

Achievement Award in 1999 as an annual honor for a fish and wildlife employee whose dedication and service have made outstanding contributions to conservation of Florida's fish and wildlife. The award is named for the first female commissioner of the Florida Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission, who served from 1984 to 1999, including two terms as chairman.

Humphrey was an avid outdoorswoman and a dedicated participant in conservation efforts throughout the southeastern United States. She died in March at her home in Leon County, but her legacy lives on through this prestigious award.

BAT BLITZ

North Florida nightfall brings out diversity of bats, biologists

As night falls over north Florida, a band of 66 men and women split into small groups to find bats in damp, mosquito-rich places in the Panhandle, like Apalachicola National Forest, Joe Budd Wildlife Management Area and St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge.

The "Bat Blitz" was conducted for three nights in late May as commission biologists and the University of Florida joined forces with Apalachicola National Forest staff, as well as students and volunteers from throughout the southeast United States and as far away as Oklahoma, Kentucky and Ohio. The blitz, sponsored by the Florida Bat Working Group in conjunction with the Southeastern Bat Diversity Network, was held for the first

time in Florida.

To ensnare the bats, biologists hoist nearly invisible "mist nets" as tall as trees. They wait for hours in the dark with equipment out on portable tables so they can quickly log in any bats they capture. The bats will be identified, measured and weighed, and a sample of guano will be collected before they are let go.

"It's best to think like a bat" when scouting for bats, said Melissa Tucker, wildlife biologist for the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. "Bats are not evenly distributed across the landscape. Some areas are more important for foraging and roosting, and we're still figuring those things out," she said. Sites over water or with features such as fire lines or forest trails that funnel flying bats into

the nets are usually good choices.

The grand total of bats captured over three recent nights: 246.

Eight of Florida's 13 native bat species were identified in this survey: the Southeastern myotis, Seminole bat, red bat, Brazilian free-tailed bat, evening bat, big brown bat, Rafinesque's big-eared bat and tricolored bat. Natives like the threatened Florida bonneted bat live only in the southern end of the state.

"It was a lot of bats,"

Tucker said. "We were really pleased about the number and the diversity. Finding eight species was exciting to us. It was an amount of information about bat species in north Florida that our staff couldn't have gathered on our own or

in such a short amount of time."

How are bats doing in Florida?

"In general, we have a sense in Florida that our common species of bats are probably doing OK," Tucker said, adding, "We

do not have a lot of baseline information to draw from."

The deadly white-nose syndrome that has decimated many cave-roosting bat species throughout the eastern United States has not been detected in Florida. The disease is caused by a fungus found in cold caves and affects bats as they hibernate. With Florida's relatively warm winters, few bats hibernate here, so there is hope bats in the state won't experience its devastating effects.

Still, to prevent a potential spread of the fungus, "Bat Blitz" biologists were extremely careful about decontaminating equipment between every bat examination and at the end of every night, as well as forbidding anyone from bringing in equipment from out of state.

Florida bats play a major role in insect control, consuming moths that destroy crops and dining upon mosquitoes. Some bats also pollinate flowers, although all bats in Florida are insectivores.

How to help bats? "Use insecticide sparingly and with caution. It's always nice to put out bat houses," Tucker said. "And if you come across bats in tree cavities, palm fronds or Spanish moss, step back and give them their space."

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
