

\$10.9 million project slated for Feb. 13 completion

Work has begun to build an overpass above State Road 85 that will link Duke Field and the cantonment for the 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne).

The work is expected to wrap up in February of next year.

That's good news for motorists heading up and down Okaloosa County's only major north-south artery.

When the 7th Special Forces moved to their new cantonment on Eglin Air Force Base property south of Crestview last year, traffic at what was formerly S.R. 85's intersection with McWhorter Avenue serving Duke Field increased dramatically after 77th Special Forces Way to the U.S. Army's cantonment opened at the same intersection.

Airmen, soldiers, staff, vendors and visitors for Duke Field and the 7th Special Forces come and go through the intersection daily. Additionally, 7th Special Forces soldiers use the Duke Field runway and utilize training ranges on the east side of S.R. 85, requiring frequent crossings of the highway.

That increase in traffic trying to cross S.R. 85, which is also a hurricane evacuation route, led a coalition of local, county, regional, state and federal agencies to put the overpass project on an accelerated construction schedule.

What has resulted is a \$10.9 million Federal Highway Administration project being built by Connecticut-based contractor Lane Construction. The

company is under contract with the Florida Department of Transportation, and the U.S. Air Force is overseeing the work.

"They're (the feds) the ones building it, but there's an easement on Eglin granted to the Florida Department

of Transportation," Eglin project manager David Wolfson of the 96th Civil Engineer Group said. "Once the work is done they'll hand it over to the state for maintenance."

Family literacy program closes

NWFSC Adult Ed program guides students to GED

Last year Walton County's federally funded Even Start family literacy program shut down. Now a cut in funding has resulted in the closure of Northwest Florida State College's version of the program at the Crestview Bob Sikes Center.

"It was a direct federal program," the college's Adult Education Director Barbara Jones said. "All programs in the United States will no longer be funded through that source. It's not just ours."

Jones said some of the material previously taught through Even Start will continue at Northwest Florida State through the college's Adult Education department. Parents seeking an equivalent of the children's component, however, are referred to partner agencies.

"We still have family literacy funding; we just don't have funding for that particular program," Jones said. "Children can go into Head Start and Early Head Start, so we work hand in hand and partnership with other programs. We can certainly serve the parents and there are other good programs in the Crestview area to serve the children."

The only thing missing, Jones assured worried parents, is the "one-stop shopping" offered by a program that addressed the needs of entire families.

"It was a very comprehensive program where all the services were offered at one location, which was nice, but there are the children's programs in the area," Jones said. "Adult literacy is well and strong. We

Laurel Hill seeks grant for roadwork

The Laurel Hill City Council took steps towards the future repairing of roads both within the city limits and on adjacent county roads.

At a meeting last week, council members agreed

to apply for a Community Development Block Grant (or CDBG) of up to \$600,000 that, if awarded, could be used to repave roads within the city limits.

The council also appointed a citizen task force to get citizen input and overlook the application process.

The Citizens Advisory Task Force was selected by council Chairman Larry Hendren and approved by the council. Task force members are Harold Jones, Joel Weekly, Vizell Robbins, Johnny James and Nita Miller.

The meeting last week was the first of several public hearings to be

conducted to inform residents of the block grant, which is administered through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The city is also providing input into future resurfacing projects on roadways in Okaloosa County located outside the city limits.

Christy R. Johnson, a regional planner from the West Florida Regional Planning Council, showed the council several maps of Okaloosa County roads the Florida Department of Transportation plans to work on in the next five years.

Through FDOT's Rural Work Program, the

city can ask that county roads adjacent to the city be placed on the list.

"This program gives you the opportunity to give input on what needs to be done," Johnson told council members. "Or if there are any projects that you would like to see

“There are multiple agencies involved with this,” Eglin spokesperson Mike Spaits said. “The Air Force is kind of the overseers, but the project is being run by a construction rep who is involved with the DOT.”

Also collaborating are the U.S. Army, Okaloosa County Water and Sewer, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection and Century Link, Spaits said.

Planning for the overpass started in September 2009, Wolfson said, and went out for bid a year later. In August 2011 the design/build contract was awarded to Lane Construction, which started work this past March.

are working to get the parents of these children into the existing programs that we have, including ESL in the Crestview Center, day and evening.”

The adult literacy component is the first step in an overall program designed to ultimately assist a student into a college degree or vocational training track, Jones said. It includes GED preparation and adult basic education — “that’s basic skills, individuals who are not quite at the secondary level in reading, writing and math.”

“We work very hard to transition our GED graduates into college credit or technical post secondary education. We want all of our students to go beyond the GED. Once they get a GED, it’s a state of Florida high school diploma. Many

go for a degree and many go for a certification.”

Sometimes a student begins with English-as-a-second-language (ESL) instruction before entering the GED program, Jones said.

“It’s for individuals for whom English is not their primary language,” Jones said. “They can come in not speaking any English. We have six levels of English proficiency that we work with them through. We work with them on oral communication and written communications in the English language.”

“We have students coming from all over the world in those classes. We serve a lot of people who are military dependents.”

Adult education doesn’t stop when a student receives their GED, Jones

said, saying it’s a goal of the local college to help students all the way through to college or vocational programs. “You get assessment; you get guidance and transitional assistance.”

“In transition, once they get their GED we help them get their federal financial aid,” Jones said. “We do career planning and assessment, financial aid assistance, everything to make them a successful student beyond GED. Now it’s so difficult for anyone to get a job without a high school diploma.”


get done.”

Panels focus on PTSD awareness, treatment

NAVARRE — Highlighted by two multi-service, multi-disciplinary panel discussions, the focus was squarely on Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) at a special awareness event June 27 in Fort Walton Beach.

Hosted by Twelve Oaks Recovery Center, the Military Appreciation and National PTSD Awareness Day event culminated a month-long campaign of awareness and education in conjunction with the national observance. Congress named June 27 National PTSD Awareness

Day in 2009.

“Since 1993, Twelve Oaks Recovery has made a commitment to serving U.S. service members, retirees, veterans and their families,” said Paul Reed, interim executive director for Twelve Oaks. “We were especially honored to host this event and partner with various military installations, veteran organizations and community partners to highlight the importance of continuing the dialogue and raise awareness about PTSD.”

Two panel discussions and an information resource fair were the high-

lights of the day, and drew attendees from across the region, including Pensacola and Fort Walton Beach, and from as far away as New Orleans and Biloxi, Miss. The panels featured family therapists, psychologists, clergy, and medical professionals. Subjects ranged from recognizing signs and symptoms of PTSD and accessing care, to understanding how PTSD affects family members, and ways to build resiliency in service members and families alike.

“One of the biggest challenges we face is removing the stigma associated

with PTSD, helping people understand that it is OK to admit they are struggling, and to get them to reach out for care,” said Jim Gwyn, a counselor with the Air Force Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment Program at Eglin AFB. “There are great, evidence-based treatments out there to help people with PTSD, excellent teams ready to provide effective care, and generally good support from chains of command across the military to getting care.”

One panel addressed questions such as how PTSD affects family mem-

bers, differences between a mom or a dad having PTSD in a family, and common reactions in family members dealing with someone with PTSD. Panelists also helped attendees understand available resource options in their communities.

A resource information fair also ran concurrent with the event, and featured several agencies which provide help to PTSD sufferers and their families, including Vet Centers, Navy-Marine Fleet and Family Support Centers, the USO, installation mental health departments, Semper Fi Fund, USAA, and Project Healing

Waters.

“I thought the entire event was expertly put together,” said Nellie Getz, a civilian social worker from Fort Walton Beach who came out to get information about available resources. “The panel discussions were informative and enlightening, and I got a lot of great information at the resource fair.”

Another panel focused more on PTSD signs and symptoms, links between PTSD and traumatic brain injuries, and the effect multiple and extended deployments have had on service members and their families.

“We clearly feel this event was a win-win for everyone involved,” Reed said. “And we plan to continue doing these types of events in the future. We owe this to our military and family members — to keep educating and informing them about how to recognize PTSD signs and symptoms — but more importantly, to let them know that effective care and treatment is available to them, and that there is no stigma to them asking for help.”

96th Air Base Wing members earn bronze stars

EGLIN AFB — Col. Sal Nodjoman, 96th Air Base Wing commander, will present two bronze stars for meritorious service at his commander's call today (July 11) at 9 a.m. The medals will be presented to Maj. Richard Barnett and Maj. Patrick Brannan. Both men are assigned to the 96th Surgical Operations Squadron, 96th Medical Group.

Barnett performed more than 300 surgeries as an ear, nose, and throat surgeon while deployed, including three emergency lifesaving pediatric airway interventions. He performed complex craniofacial reconstructive procedures on 92 patients.

Brannan performed almost 700 limb-saving operations on U.S., coalition and local national patients as an orthopedic surgeon. He directed the surgical care of critically injured patients after an attack at a market, with 31 of the victims requiring emergency surgery.

The Bronze Star Medal is a U.S. Armed Forces individual military decoration that may be awarded for bravery, acts of merit, or meritorious service. It is the fourth-highest combat award of the U.S. Armed Forces and the ninth highest military award (including both combat and non-combat awards) in the order of precedence of U.S. military decorations.

Main Street manager resigns

Ryan Arvey returns to full-time position at UWF

Main Street Crestview Association program manager Ryan Arvey has resigned after his job was reduced to a part-time position at the beginning of the year. Arvey has returned to the University of West Florida where he was a specialist at Historic Pensacola Village, Main Street member Cal Zethmayr said.

Arvey was hired in January 2011 by Main Street Crestview to meet the requirements of Main Street Florida, which mandates that member organizations must have a full-time program manager in order to be accredited. Crestview's is one of only seven accredited Main Street programs in the state.

Accreditation enhances a community's opportunity to attract Community Development Block Grants, supporters said, adding that since its creation in the 1990s, Main Street Crestview has attracted more than \$10 million in grant-funded improvements for the historic downtown district.

In November 2011, the Crestview Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) agreed to fund Arvey's salary, reduced \$4,000 to \$34,000, for 2012 in exchange for the organization developing within a year a plan to become self-sufficient. However, at a Jan. 23, 2012, meeting, with two of its five board members absent, the CRA voted 2-1 to rescind the agreement.

Arvey agreed to remain in Crestview in a part-time capacity. His salary was funded by Main Street income normally channeled to programs and public events, Zethmayr said.

"We had him on part time," Zethmayr said. "We've been operating totally on our own revenue. For the first time in 20 years, we're not getting any city support. He's been working for us three days a week but now he has another baby coming, so he had to resign."

"It was definitely a necessity but it is bitter-sweet," Arvey said of his resignation. "I like full-time employment, but I'm sorry to have to leave Crestview. I had a lot of ideas of how it could grow. But with the current board, Main Street is in good hands."

Arvey said he hopes the once flourishing partnership between the city and the Main Street association


returns to its former level.

"I hope the organization will regain the help of the city because they can do so much together," Arvey said. "The most successful Main Streets are a partnership between the city and the organization. You'll always be able to accomplish tenfold more together than any one group could do on their own. It really can transform communities."

Upon Arvey's resignation, Main Street engaged Crestview real estate agent Patti Gonzo on a part-time basis as the association's manager.

"Whether she becomes permanent is something we'll have to see," Zethmayr said. "Right now we need someone to work two or three days a week."

Zethmayr said Main Street Crestview's 2012 events will continue as planned, including the August First Friday Fest. The Okaloosa Arts Alliance-

North, which started the summer festival series two years ago in partnership with Main Street, has offered to again help organize the festival.

"It takes all the resources we have to put on a really good event," OAA-N chairperson Rae Schwartz said. "We are looking forward to doing all we can to support these and future Main Street events."

Main Street Crestview will also hold the city's annual Halloween Fall Festival and Christmas Parade as planned, Zethmayr promised, and looks forward to continuing to strengthen Crestview's historic heart.

"They have good reason to be optimistic because they have a strong network of good businesses and they have a group of hardworking volunteers who give because they want to see their town succeed," Arvey said. "They don't get paid for it;

they don't get a lot of recognition. They do it because they believe downtown is a special place."



Everyone wants good health, but many of us don't know how to be as healthy as possible. Health experts describe lifestyle as one of the most important factors affecting our health. In fact, it is estimated that seven of the 10 leading causes of death could be reduced through common-sense changes in lifestyle.

The first step in a healthier lifestyle is thinking about what we are doing now. There are six health behaviors that each one of us should review and determine if we need to improve them. Some

behaviors may not apply to people with certain chronic diseases or physical challenges, or to pregnant women. Such people may need special advice from their doctor or other health care provider. The six health style behaviors are:

- Cigarette smoking: Do you avoid smoking or do you smoke and how often?
- Alcohol and drugs: Do you avoid alcohol or drink moderately? Do you drink alcohol in combination with taking medications? Do you read the prescription labels on your medications and understand the medication you are taking, its side effects, etc.?
- Eating habits: Do

you eat a variety of fruits and vegetables? Do you minimize saturated fats in your diet? Do you use salt moderately? Do you drink or eat foods that are highly processed and contain a lot of sugar? Do you understand your meal proportions and implement portion control?

- Exercise/fitness: Do you exercise 30 minutes a day, or several times a week or is exercise done leisurely?
- Stress control: Do you enjoy your work or daily activities? Do you prepare and plan in advance for those events that you

know will cause you stress? Do you participate in community or social activities?

- Safety: Do you get at least seven hours of sleep a night? Do you take the necessary precautions when drinking, driving, taking medications or handling any chemicals, operating equipment or participating in an event?

Your awareness of the importance of health and lifestyle behaviors will determine your good health. More importantly, by practicing good health habits you will feel good as long as you continue to

do so.

In addition, by living healthy you are setting an example for family and friends to follow. If your health practices need improvement, think about what you need to change. No matter how small the change maybe it will help to achieve better health.

If your health risks are showing and you would like more information about the risks you are facing, you can start by contacting your health care provider or a registered dietitian.

STAFF PICK

"With the Old Breed at Peleliu and Okinawa" by E.B. Sledge (940.542 Sle) – I recently watched the HBO miniseries "The Pacific" based on Sledge's book and Robert Leckie's "Helmet for My Pillow." I highly recommend this honest and visceral read, if only to remind us of the pain and sacrifice soldiers and their families endure for us.

In his own book, "Wartime," Paul Fussell called "With the Old Breed" "one of the finest memoirs to emerge from any war." John Keegan referred to it in "The Second World

War" as "one of the most arresting documents in war literature." And Studs Terkel was so fascinated with the story he interviewed its author for his book, "The Good War." What has made E.B. Sledge's memoir of his experience fighting in the South Pacific during World War II so devastatingly powerful is its sheer honest simplicity and compassion.

Now including a new introduction by Paul Fussell, the book presents a stirring, personal account of the vitality and bravery of the Marines in the battles at Peleliu and Okinawa.

Born in Mobile, Ala., in 1923 and raised on riding, hunting, fishing, and a respect for history and legendary heroes such as George Washington and Daniel Boone, Eugene Bondurant Sledge (later called "Sledgehammer" by his Marine Corps buddies) joined the Marines the year after the bombing of Pearl Harbor and from 1943 to 1946 endured the events recorded in this book. In those years, he passed, often painfully, from innocence to experience.

Sledge enlisted out of patriotism, idealism and youthful courage, but once he landed on the beach at Peleliu, it was purely a struggle for survival. Based on the notes he kept on slips of paper tucked secretly away in his New Testament, he simply and directly recalls those long months, mincing no words and sparing no pain. The reality of battle meant unbearable heat, deafening gunfire, unimaginable brutality and cruelty, the stench of death, and, above all, constant fear. Until his death in 2001, Sledge had nightmares about "the bloody, muddy month of May on Okinawa."

But, as he also tellingly reveals, the bonds of friendship formed then will never be severed.

Sledge's honesty and compassion for the other Marines, even complete strangers, sets him apart as a memoirist of war. Read as sobering history or as high adventure, "With the Old Breed" is a moving chronicle of action and courage.



The public hearing in conjunction with the second reading of this ordinance will be held on Monday, July 23, 2012 at 6:00 p.m., in the Council Chambers, 198 North Wilson Street, Crestview, Florida.

NWFSC announces 2012-13 touring show lineup







A Hall of Fame dad

One of the things I love the most about my job as a sports writer is watching parents coach their sons or daughters.

I’ve lost track of all the fathers/sons, mothers/daughters and fathers/daughters that I’ve covered

through the years, but I know I’ve covered at least a couple of dozen athletes who were coached by a parent.

My football coach at Gulf Breeze, Jim Smith, also coached his son, Ricky. Long after Ricky played his final game of football, their relationship continues to inspire those of us from the Gulf Breeze community.

Some of you might remember Ricky Smith as a big, raw-boned fullback that played in the Dolphin backfield with Ken Hardy in the fall of 1975. If you remember numbers better than names, Ricky was number 34 and was a junior in the fall of 1975.

Gulf Breeze went 4-6 in 1975 and Robert Hines, the Gulf Breeze principal, decided to find another head coach despite the fact that in 1974 the Dolphins had posted the first winning season in school history and, still just in the sixth year, was a new school.

Although he was relieved of his duties as head football coach and athletic director, coach Smith decided to stay on at Gulf Breeze and continue to teach math and coach golf.

With his dad out as the head coach, Ricky decided to go live with his grandmother in Winchester, Tenn., to play his senior season of football. Then he would return to Gulf Breeze to graduate with his friends. Ricky quickly earned a starting spot in the lineup and several Southeastern Conference schools, including Ricky’s favorite, Tennessee, were on the verge of offering him a scholarship when a knee injury ended his football dream.

Six or eight years later Ricky was in Los Angeles chasing another dream to be an actor when tragedy struck again. One day he was run off the road and left for dead by a hit-and-run driver as he rode his bicycle through the Hollywood Hills. For two or three days he laid in a ravine before he was seen by a passing motorist and finally rescued. In reality Ricky should have died in that accident, but the conditioning and willpower of an athlete sustained him.

Coach Smith and his wife flew to California to be with Ricky as he began his slow road to what has never been, and never will

Crestview football team gearing up

It was a busy month of June for the Crestview football team as the Bulldogs started to zero in on the 2012 season that opens with the Kickoff Classic against Pace on Aug. 21.

About 150 aspiring players participated in brutal workouts that included everything from a truck push and monster tire flip to the more traditional running of stadium steps.

“Our kids have been working hard,” Crestview coach Kevin Pettis said. “The kids have busted butt and gotten stronger.”

“We’ve had a great summer so far. It’s just a grind. You go to seven-on-sevens all the time.”

The Bulldogs have played seven-on-seven games against Freeport, Gulf Breeze and Rocky Bayou Christian on Mondays. They’ve also played in several seven-on-seven camps. Crestview won the University of South Alabama passing camp, beating Sydney Lanier of Montgomery, Ala., in the championship game.

Pettis also praised the individual ef-

forts of running back Micah Reed and safety Dakota Dean for leading the way in the workouts and the seven-on-seven competitions.

“Micah Reed’s bench max went up to 360 pounds this month,” Pettis said. “He’s a 360 bench press kid, a 315 power clean kid, a 515 squat kid and a 500 dead lift guy and his 40 (yard dash) is 4.46 (seconds). With how strong he has gotten, he’s going to carry those pads a heck of a lot faster than he ever carried them last year.”

“Dakota Dean did a 275 clean. He’s a 330 bench press kid and a 4.5, 40 kid. He’s the total package.”

Pettis gave the team the week off for the July 4 holiday before heading into the home stretch leading up to the Aug. 6 start of fall practice.

The Bulldogs will continue to play seven-on-seven games each Monday night and will compete in seven-on-seven camps at South Alabama on July 19 and Fort Walton Beach on July 20.

“We just go out there and play and have fun,” Pettis said. “And it’s better the kids being here than somewhere else.”

“It’s going pretty good,” he said. “I like it. We’ve already done this before and it’s just getting into the routine that is going to make it easy.”


“We are way further along this year than we were last year. We just have to get a good season going.”

Pettis also will use the seven-on-seven to work on the defensive side of the ball.



be, a complete recovery.

Ricky’s injuries included trauma to the brain and he still suffers short term memory loss. Although Ricky can tell you about plays we ran at Gulf Breeze when he was hitting the hole as a bruising fullback, he might not remember a conversation you had a few minutes before.

When Ricky walks it’s now with a cane and he’s often seen in a wheelchair, as his once powerful legs and keen sense of balance often fail him. For more than 25 years Jim Smith has been more than a father to Ricky. He’s been a coach, workout partner, fishing

buddy, protector and friend. At times, Jim Smith has even been Ricky’s hands and feet.

The Gulf Breeze Class of 1977 had its 35-year reunion last month and one of their class activities was a beautification project at the Gulf Breeze High campus. They pulled weeds, put down fresh sod and planted flowers around the school. Ricky was there too, watching from his wheelchair as his now 70-something year old dad helped out in his place.

I will let history debate how good of a football coach Jim Smith was. I can tell you he was the second head coach in Gulf Breeze

history and led the Dolphins to their first football win in the fall of 1971. He also led my team to our first winning-season in 1974 and we probably would have turned the trick again in 1975 if not for some injuries to key players.

We will never know if Jim Smith would have turned Gulf Breeze into a winner and contender, but that is not at all important in the grand scheme of things.

More than 36 years after Jim Smith coached his last football game he is still impacting his former players as we watch the love and care he shows Ricky each and every day. Jim Smith might

not be a Hall of Fame coach, but there can be no denying he is a Hall of Fame dad.

One teammate, who has sons of his own now, recently told me how much he admires coach Smith and he only hopes he would be able to do everything for one of his sons that coach Smith has done for Ricky.

I am proud to call Ricky Smith my teammate and friend and I am equally proud to call Jim Smith my coach.

In his own way both Jim and Ricky Smith continue to inspire all of us with lessons in life that go far beyond the football field.

Are some recreational boaters reducing our fish stock and ruining the fish we catch?

I know who screwed up your favorite fishing hole and why the fish you catch might taste a little funny.

Everyone has seen them, the recreational boats that have three smokers aboard going out for a day of beer and fishing. Upon return, there are no empty beverage containers, cigarette butts, or single use plastic bags. They consumed the goods and disposed of the waste. Unfortunately, they disposed of it while on-site at your favorite fishing spot, not that littering is acceptable anywhere.

Most boaters feel that the ocean is a massive body of water, and it is, but the problem is most boaters travel the same routes, hang out at the same popular fishing holes, and litter the same area. This causes bottom carpeting. The food chain in any area starts with the bugs and seaweed living on the bottom.

What happens is the bottom becomes covered with the cans and bottles and the exposed sea or lake floor of mud and seaweed is reduced. If you have 20 littering boats at your favorite fishing hole, drinking and littering two 12 packs for 100 days during the year, they would have littered 24,000 beverage containers. This means each year they carpet 28,000 square feet of the bottom terrain in your favorite fishing hole. Think about the cumulative 10-year affect on the bottom structure and what fishing in this area would be like if that litter was not there.

Aside from littering the bottom with beer and beverage bottles, cigarette butts are one of the worst items to flick overboard. Feeder and surface fish will have eaten them before the end of the day. Their digestive juices extract the chemicals from the plastic in the filter and deposit these cancer-causing agents into the muscle and fat tissue of the fish you are catching and grilling up at home.

The bulk of the carcinogens in every cigarette is collected in the filter. Each filter contains 69 known carcinogens. Some of these filter-trapped carcinogens never enter a smoker's bloodstream when they smoke a cigarette, but when you start eating these cancer-causing agents, they enter your system and will have an accumulated effect on you.

There are several other items that inadvertently end up in the water whenever they are brought aboard a boat. The single use plastic bags containing all the items you picked up on your way to the marina always seems to catch air and set sail as soon as you use the last item in the bag. The other item that ends up in the water is Styrofoam lids from coolers. Everyone at one time or another has bought one of these cheap coolers because they needed more cooler space or forgot to bring one of the coolers from home. The lids on these coolers seem to fly better than a kite on a windy day.

Here are some easy solutions for boaters to prevent your favorite

fishing hole from continuing to become trashed:

• Share this article with as many fishing contacts as possible. It is important to educate other fishermen and make them aware of the real impact of their actions. Their litter sinks to the bottom and is therefore unseen and perceived as not having any effect on the vast ocean.

• Take some binoculars along on your trip. If the fish are not biting, start watching the other boats, especially if they are catching fish and you are not. You may be able to figure out what they are doing right, in addition to spotting a litterer in your favorite fishing hole. If you witness another boat littering, call them out over the radio.

• Spread the word. Tell everyone which boat is out in your favorite fishing spot trashing the place.

• Fishing tournaments should do a declared beverage count when leaving the dock. Any boat returning without their empties should be disqualified.

• Do not take the single use plastic bags on board. Dump the stuff on the boat and find a place to stash all of your goodies.

• Use an empty beverage container as your ashtray. It will trap and keep the butts until you reach the docks.

• For the Styrofoam containers, use the duct tape fix. Tape a beverage or similar weight object to the top of the lid and you will not have the lid blowing off your boat allowing you to reuse the cooler.

Increased regulation is



not the answer. I believe education and peer pressure by fishermen who care about their sport can significantly reduce this problem.

If all of this accumulated trash stayed on top of the water in favorite fishing holes instead of carpeting the bottom, this problem would have been corrected a long time ago since it would be such an eyesore to the community

surrounding it.

Fishermen love the environment and can appreciate fishing in a pristine area filled with fish.

Invasion of the caterpillars



Spring has sprung and 'tis the season of the caterpillar. They are everywhere, crawling on outdoor walls, railings, cars, trees and picnic tables. You name it, caterpillars are on it.

In the last few weeks of June I saw at least five different species of this squirmy critter around our office in Gainesville: the white-marked tussock moth, oak beauty, forest tent caterpillar, live oak metria and dubious tiger moth. The oak trees that shade our office are one of their host plants (a home providing food and shelter).

Caterpillars are the larvae of moths and butterflies. Once they hatch, they eat continuously. They love to eat leaves, stems, grasses, whatever tastes yummy. It is during this stage of their life that many gardeners and farmers consider them pests. Only after their transformation into beautiful winged beauties are they often adored.

Generally caterpillars look soft and squishy or like furry worms. However, looks are deceiving. Many times the "fur" or "hair" on caterpillars is like a sharp needle that causes skin irritations if rubbed or picked up. Most caterpillars will not make you sick. However, there are

four common species in Florida that can make you sick: the puss caterpillar, io caterpillar, saddleback caterpillar and hag caterpillar. These are called stinging caterpillars. It is a good practice to never touch a caterpillar unless you know what it is and that it will not hurt you.

The beauty of caterpillars is how different each one is and how they use their markings, hairs and colors to survive. The tussock moth caterpillar is quite hairy, with four tan tufts of hair on its back, orange dots, a bright red head and tufts of long black hairs that look like antennae and a tail. It appears to be an alien. Others, like the oak beauty, are camouflaged and blend into the branches of oak trees — you can't see them, and neither can a bird, unless you are looking for them.

Another fascinating thing about caterpillars is how they defend themselves against predators. Not only does their camouflage or sharp "fur" help, but there are many other ways caterpillars defend themselves. A puss caterpillar will puff itself up and use its tail to whip and strike a predator and cause a serious sting. The red head of a white-marked tussock moth is a signal for danger.

There is also a nasty thing called regurgitation. If threatened, some caterpillars regurgitate and squirt a brown liquid. It's not dangerous, just gross. To a bird, that liquid from the belly of the caterpillar is quite bitter and unpleasant tasting, so the bird will spit out the caterpillar in most instances.

Forest tent caterpillars don't actually build tents but spin silken mats on the trunks and large branches where they congregate to molt or rest from feeding. The caterpillars are relatively harmless to people — they do not bite or sting although a few people have an allergic reaction to handling them.

Caterpillars are fascinating, and there are so many things to learn about them and their adult forms. Right now, caterpillars

are easy to find, because it is just before they will start the pupation process — called metamorphosis — when they become the


