New terminal construction to start Jan. 1

president Jonathan Dunn promptly started dreaming of erecting a bigger, better and better-equipped passenger terminal. In a year or so, he expects his dream will become a reality. "We're going to break ground on the first of January and we're still

continuing the research on putting a small restaurant out here," Dunn said. "We haven't made a final decision. We'd really like to put it out here, but we need to do more market research." Dunn said the airport's location, a 17-minute drive from downtown Crestview,

could be an impediment to drawing patrons to an airport restaurant, despite the romance of watching planes come and go while enjoying a burger. However, no definite decision has been made yet whether to include a restaurant or not, he said. "I would always appreciate local input," Dunn said.

Residents' ideas for menu selections and operating hours are encouraged, Dunn said. In addition to a large public lounge, preliminary plans include a larger pilots' lounge, a new parking lot and a courtyard.

Emerald Coast Aviation offices will also move from the small current terminal to the new building, Dunn said. No decision has been made about what to do with the existing terminal, which is attached to the See TERMINAL A3

Laurel Hill Student to speak

Many students take it easy the summer before their final year of high school.

Laurel Hill senior Ashley McLeod has done the exact opposite.

When she isn't taking college classes, the 18-year-old is preparing for her speech at the 85th National FFA (Future Farmers of America) Convention and Expo.

"I wouldn't have it any other way," Ashley said. "Opportunities are what you make of them."

Representing the state of Florida, she will compete in the Prepared Public Speaking Event at the convention on Oct. 24-27 in Indianapolis. The event is expected to draw more than 50,000 FFA students and guests.

Ashley will compete against students from up to 47 states, presenting a 6- to 8-minute speech on an agricultural topic. Following the speech, each contestant will be questioned for five minutes by judges, who award points for delivery, manuscript and responses. She will have to advance preliminary and semifinal rounds before entering the top four in the final round. The first-place winner walks away with a See SPEAK A3

The free-form open-mic jams will provide a forum for poets and musicians seeking to share their works and receive audience feedback, Hurwitz said.

"I've participated in things like this before, and Rick Sanders has as well," she said. "We really like his music when he comes and plays here. He sounded like someone who would enjoy doing something like this. I'm a poet and I do other performance stuff too. We got together and said we need to do something like this."

Hurwitz said there has already been a lot of interest in the event, and she hopes that once established, the monthly program will continue to grow as more people learn about it.

"I have heard from poets and musicians who want to come to it," Hurwitz said. "It turns out Natural Awakening even has us listed too. It's one of those free magazines (geared) toward healthy living and green living."

Just to make sure things go smoothly at the first Open-Mic Poetry Jam, Hurwitz said she and Sanders recently got together and ran through their respective works.

"We had a practice session to see how it would go and we're both pretty excited about it," she said.

Health Department reports increase of shigella

The Okaloosa County Health Department is reporting an increase in shigella cases across the county and is urging residents to carefully wash their hands after using the restroom.

The Health Department is reporting 49 confirmed cases since the beginning of this year. Typically, there are zero to seven cases reported, according to a release. Shigella is a group of bacteria that causes shigellosis, which is usually a mild, self-resolving diarrheal illness.

The infection is acquired by swallowing something contaminated with the feces of an infected person, which is typical among young children not yet toilet trained or those who have not washed their hands after using the restroom. Shigellosis is very contagious and can be spread

easily from person to person. Symptoms of the infection usually begin one to three days after receiving the bacteria. Symptoms include nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain and fever. Most people infected with shigella develop diarrhea, fever and stomach cramps starting a

day or two after they are exposed to it, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The diarrhea usually resolves itself in five to seven days.

The Health Department recommends washing hands after bathroom visits, diaper changes, play time,

handling pets or soil, and before and after food preparation and eating.

If anyone is sick with a diarrheal illness they should see their physician immediately.

ceed, said Jerry Gregory, who has advised the FFA program and taught agriculture and welding at Laurel Hill School for the past 26 years.

A day of folklife in Baker

Music and demos at free public heritage forum

Local heritage and traditions will be in the lime-light next week when the Baker Block Museum and North Okaloosa Historical Association host a free Florida Folklife forum. The day long event will feature demonstrations of local traditions and music, and will offer advice for local historians who want to document

area heritage.

Museum executive director Ann Spann said the program represents a renewed focus on community education, and encouraged area teachers, students, parents and families to attend.

The program also will include tips on identifying and documenting community traditions and cultural resources.

ments will be available throughout the day and a modestly priced barbecue plate lunch will be available. The forum is free and open to the public. No pre-registration is required.

"We are excited to be a cosponsor of the Florida Folklife Program," Spann said. "It's a great beginning for our educational outreach of the museum. We're looking forward to future forums and relationships with our schools, students and community."

Police hunt suspect in multiple robberies

The Crestview Police Department has taken to social media to find a suspect in multiple armed robberies at businesses across the city.

Using both their Twitter and Facebook accounts, the police have shown several frame captures from surveillance footage of a robbery that occurred Aug. 4 at the 87 Depot gas station.

Crestview police are hoping that someone will come forward and be able to identify the person in the video.

Lt. Andrew Schneider of the Crestview Police Department said John's Computers and Electronics was robbed on July 21. Good Things Donuts, on South Ferdon Boulevard, was robbed on Friday, July 27. The Jin Jin China restaurant, also on South Ferdon Boulevard,

was robbed on July 28.

The suspect, a black man with a thin build and about 5 feet 7 inches tall, used a semi-automatic pistol in each robbery and fled from each location either on foot or on a bicycle, according to a Crestview Police Department news release.

On July 21, the suspect entered John's Computer and Electronics on Martin Luther King Jr. Avenue and robbed the owner John Stilwell at gunpoint. Stilwell said he noticed the suspect in the store prior to the robbery.

"(The suspect) came in about a week before the robbery, probably to scope the place out," Stilwell said. On the day of the robbery, the same man came in and asked several questions about the store, then pulled a gun and demanded money, he added.

The armed man escaped with almost \$250 from Stil-

well's register and his wallet.

Since the incident, the 51-year-old retired military veteran has seen a different side of Crestview. The traumatic event caused Stilwell to cut back on hours and even close on Saturdays. He said he has had to go to the hospital because of several panic attacks resulting from the robbery.

In five and a half years of business, he had never had a problem of any kind in the store, Stilwell said.

"Ninety-nine percent of the people that came are the nicest people," Stilwell said. "It just takes that one person to ruin it."

The man also is suspected of the July 27 robbery at Good Things Donuts. Lynn Stacil was working behind the counter at the bakery during the robbery, which happened about 4:30 a.m.

Stacil said it was the second time this year the doughnut


shop has been robbed. The most recent robbery has caused the store to change its hours.

"We keep the doors locked until the sun comes up," Stacil said. Like Stilwell, she said the robber also took her peace of mind.

"The only damage (the suspect) did during the robbery were to my nerves," she said. The armed suspect most recently attempted to rob Pizza Hut at Northview Plaza on North Ferdon Boulevard on Tuesday night.

Police said no money was taken during the robbery, and the suspect was last seen fleeing on foot.

Crestview police arrest 2 in carjacking, attempted kidnapping

Crestview police arrested two teenagers in connection with a carjacking and attempted

kidnapping that occurred Tuesday night at a shopping plaza on North Ferdon Boulevard.

Marcus Dominique Ashley, 19, and Justin Daniel Cline, 18, were charged with grand theft

auto by carjacking, attempted kidnapping and battery, according to a Crestview Police Department news release.

Ashley and Cline are accused of attacking a man in the shopping

center parking lot as he walked to his car. The man told police he was "attacked from behind by a group of males," the news release said.

He told police that the men tried to force

him into the trunk of the vehicle, but he escaped and ran to a nearby business and called police.

A short time later, police officers saw the suspects drive the man's car into a grassy lot a few hundred feet south of the shopping center. The suspects fled on foot and got into another vehicle. Police officers conducted a traffic stop of that vehicle and took the men into custody. Ashley and Cline were released Wednesday from the Okaloosa County Jail on professional cash bonds of \$11,000 each, according to jail records.

said, "I'm sorry. The patient didn't survive."

In other words, the hard drive, containing five-plus years of documents, photos of church activities, emails, contact lists, and a whole host of programs, gave up the ghost, quit working, left me high and dry. Everything was gone. Nothing, not one scrap of data, could be pulled from that hard drive.

As you might imagine, I was devastated. I didn't declare a national day of mourning but was tempted.

Fortunately, I had backed up much of my data two weeks prior to this unforeseen crash. This meant, that except for my programs and email necessities, I still had the vast majority of my five-

plus years of documents, which were restored after the new hard drive was installed.

I learned several lessons from this debacle: Back up frequently (including email and contact information); don't put all your eggs in one basket; be prepared.

Our lives are filled with unexpected events. Occasions that try our patience, cause us mental anguish, or lead us to cave in to temptation come around with regular frequency. When we give in, we crash — spiritually. Thank God that He came to restore us, to put us back together again, to provide a way to find healing and wholeness.

He did this through Jesus Christ. If we believe we are going to go through life without any hiccups or emotional or spiritual

crashes, we are, as the apostle Paul said, "self-deceived and strangers to the truth." It will happen. The question is, will we be prepared? Will we have the ability to recognize and admit we have erred, and that we need healing and restoration?

Jesus told many parables about being prepared for the inevitable. The parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaids comes to mind. Five were ready for the arrival of the Bridegroom, five were not. 

Now, the Board of County Commissioners are in the final Study called "The Small Area Studies". Final approval and making it law will be decided in the September/October 2012 time frame.

WHAT IT DOES:

- A) It severely impacts over 145,000 acres in Okaloosa County.
- B) It takes away the property rights from over 20,000 residents without paying them a dime! "The value of any property is based on property rights. When someone takes those rights away from you, all you have left is worthless DIRT."

- Tell them that you are blessed in the north end of the county where Eglin has natural barriers to protect it from any encroachment. These are the Shoal River and the Yellow River systems. Both have swamp/wetlands that in some places are over 3 miles wide, plus, the NWF Water Management District (State) owns almost all the frontage on these two river systems.
- Since they unfairly targeted Holt with "Dead" Zones which would have done the most damage of all the communities, they should be ashamed and they need to apologize to all of the residents in Holt.
- Tell the County Commissioners to take their boots off the necks of hardworking north county residents. We don't need people from other areas and other states telling us what to do!

As a life long resident of Okaloosa County and a former U.S. Army Reservist, I fully support Eglin's Mission and all of our brave men and women serving in the Armed Forces. Eglin PLEASE help us defend our rights as U.S. citizens as Okaloosa County prepares to rob us of our property rights and future generations' ability to use and enjoy their property without heavy handed restrictions that is clearly not needed by Eglin.



Anderson named Crestview boys basketball coach


Crestview principal Bob Jones has announced the hiring of Matt Anderson as the Bulldog boys basketball coach. Anderson comes to Crestview from Graceville, and is replacing Keith White, who resigned in July to take the job as the defensive coordinator for the Walton High School football team.

Anderson, a 1980 graduate of Ponce de Leon, brings a wealth of experience to the job, having picked up more than 350 wins in his career. He led Malone to four consecutive state championships from 1985 to 1998. He also has served as an assistant coach at Chipola College.

Jones had to conduct a quick search because teachers return to the classroom Monday, but he said he was able to find the quality he was seeking.

"He (Anderson) has won state championships and he knows how to get to that level," Jones said. "A lot of guys can coach basketball or any sport really well, but it takes a special coach to get a team ready to play in that — what we call — second season, and to still be fresh when March rolls around and the playoffs start."

"I've seen coaches that are great coaches and can win 20 games a year, but by the end of the year (regular season), they

are done. They don't have the ability to pace the team through the season and have the players ready and fresh going into the district tournament."

Anderson, who used to watch the great Bulldog teams of the

1980s, always has been impressed by what Crestview has to offer.

"I've always thought Crestview was one of the best jobs in this part of the state," he said. "I would come and watch those teams coach (Ken) Rogers had in 1980s and remember what a great job he did."

Jones pointed to Anderson's local ties in Walton County as another factor in his favor.

"We want someone that wants to come in and make this his home and wants to stay at Crestview High School until he retires," Jones said. "We don't believe we are a steppingstone. We are a 6A school."

"We most likely will be the biggest school in the county this year, looking at our enrollment right now. We feel like with the history, and we've had a state championship in basketball here, we should be a end school for someone. I feel like coach Anderson is looking at us as being that school for him."

Crestview won't be Anderson's first dance with the big boys. He coached four years at Bay High School in Panama City where he went 73-35 and took the Tornados to a pair of playoff appearances.

"I think the difference between a small school and a big school is you don't have to share as many of your athletes at a big school," Anderson said. "At a small school you have to share so

many of your players. At Graceville, seven or eight of our 12 varsity basketball players also play football, so I wouldn't get them until mid-November."

"I know there will be some football players on the basketball team, but not as many as a small school. I think football can be a very positive influence on a basketball team. You really want to be successful and build school spirit through football, basketball, the other sports and academics."

Anderson's coaching philosophy is similar to what White had done the past few years. Anderson said he prefers a pressure, man-to-man defense that will create baskets off turnovers if he has the players that will fit that style.

"If we can't get the points off the fast break we will run a motion offense with a dribble-drive to the basket," he said. "At the end of the year we will add more plays to keep the other teams off balance as the playoffs approach."

Anderson admitted he doesn't know much about his new team, but he hopes to change that fairly soon with team meetings and possibly some workouts. He knows he has some ground to make up on the other teams in the district, but he's not worried.

"I don't really know the talent there," he said. "But I know the mindset it takes to win. I've had the experience where I've won four state championships."

BAKER — The Baker football team wrapped up the preliminaries of the preseason Wednesday afternoon before ending things with photo day.

As is the case of teams throughout the state, the Gators worked in shorts and helmets the first three days of the preseason and were scheduled to put on the pads for the first time Thursday afternoon.

Baker coach Matt Brunson was pleased with the work the Gators put in getting ready for the start of the season.

"Our guys have had a great summer, and our days in shorts were kind of a carryover from what we did this summer," he said. "They came in and we've worked in the weight room and we got some stuff done together on the field, and we are excited about

getting in gear.

"We had nearly perfect attendance in the summer, and with everything we were able to do in the summer up until this time, I don't feel like we need two-a-days. We are far along with our conditioning, and as far as execution and what we are going to do (plays) we have to get them in here in gear and get things polished up."

Brunson said the new Florida High School Athletic Association rule that limits teams to 18 hours of practice a week doesn't concern him or hamper what the Gators are trying to accomplish.

"I think 18 hours in a week is plenty," he said. "We are far enough along by what we do in the summertime that the 18-hour rule is not going to affect us."

The Gators spent the first three days of the preseason mainly working on special teams and conditioning, but that was set to change Thursday when they put

on the pads.

"We take pride in being physical and trying to win the line of scrimmage," Brunson said. "We do a lot of one-on-one and board drills. We've got to get that collision aspect (of football) going."

"That's the only thing you can't do in shorts, but our guys have bought into the fact that we are trying to get stronger and be more physical and we are going to get after each other tomorrow."

Devin Robbins, a senior, was happy with the progress of the team as well.

"I think we are going to do pretty good this year," he said. "Everybody is doing like 110 percent so far in practices. We just have to keep it going because things have been great."

"Last year coach Brunson came in and was the new coach, and we had to get used to him, but now we are used to him pretty good."

Senior quarterback Adam Crowson has returned to the team after taking last season off, and he is quickly getting the feel of doing things again.

"It has been interesting trying to get back in the groove, but I think I'm fine and I'm getting the hang of it," he said. "I'm just excited about the season, and I think we are going to do well."

Brunson said the Gators were right on schedule as they got ready for the second week of practice and were starting to look ahead to the start of the season.

"Next week we are going to just work against ourselves and get our hitting shape back in line and get ready to be physical up front and do the things we do," he said. "And then on the 17th we will scrimmage against each other."

"After that we will change gears and get ready for Jay for the classic, and then it will be on to regular season."
