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City may sue to keep alley open

Dispute over alley ownership heats up

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CRESTVIEW — An ongoing dispute over ownership of an alleyway east of the historic Alalex building, now the Florida A&M University Rural Diversity Healthcare Center, grew more heated Tuesday evening. During a special meeting, the City Council unanimously approved city attorney Jerry Miller's request to pursue legal action against heirs of the alley's original owner.

After expressing hope for "an amiable settlement" with attorney

Jill Crew, who represents Barbara Adams, at the Sept. 10 council meeting, Miller presented city leaders with an Oct. 11 letter he received from Adams. In it, she threatens to "close off the alley to all FAMU use" within seven days unless the city offers a "complete and acceptable proposal to resolve FAMU's trespass of my alley."

Miller couched his request as a public safety issue because, in its refurbishment of the former sewing factory and city hall, FAMU created several doors exiting into the alley from the building. Two doors exit from

interior stairs while another serves the center's hazardous materials vault and a downstairs hallway. If Adams closed the alley, Miller said, it potentially could impede an evacuation of the Alalex Building in the event of an emergency.

"The letter of Oct. 11 presents a serious threat that we have to take very seriously," Miller said. "It is a threat to life, safety and fire standards and very simply cannot be permitted to occur."

The new doors pose a legal liability, Adams letter states.

Looking for answers

Crestview resident with mysterious paralysis lacks insurance, information

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CRESTVIEW — Britainy Pate wears a smile despite ongoing challenges this past year.

The 27-year-old mother of three has been wheelchair bound since June following mysterious paralysis. Now, she seeks financial aid to find the problem's root.

She started a nonprofit organization, Britainy Will Walk Again Foundation Inc., and said all proceeds will cover her medical expenses. However, after her problems are resolved, she hopes the nonprofit can help others with similar situations.

The goal is \$7,000; so far, \$500 has been collected.

Britainy — let go from her job after losing feeling in her legs — lost feeling in her right arm on Sept. 9.

"I was in church, when it happened I felt a tingling sensation going up my arm, before it went numb," she said.

She also received a couple of days' treatment at North Okaloosa Medical Center after respiratory

failure. She has sought doctors willing to take her case, but it's been difficult without health insurance.

Still, through it all, she stays positive.

"I'm sad, but I still try to keep a smile on my face," Britainy said. "No matter what you go through in life, you can still put a smile on your face."

Some things have improved since the News Bulletin first reported on her situation. Several residents lent a helping hand — among them, Ruth Jenkins, owner and physical therapist at Manual Therapy LLC in Crestview.

NOFD tables chief's removal, discusses policy

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CRESTVIEW — The North Okaloosa Fire Department board of commissioners on Thursday again tabled a decision to remove Fire Chief Ed Cutler. The decision came after the board discussed making changes to the department's disciplinary policy.

"We did have a disciplinary policy in place, but it did not address anyone other than staff that was under the chief," board Chairperson Franklin Sauls said.

Sauls, who presented commissioners with a "tweaked" version of the policy, said his revision would give the board administrative authority. Under Saul's revision, the chairperson would decide disciplinary action for a fire chief. The board treasurer would handle disciplinary action for those under the treasurer in the administrative level.

"(Discipline) of any other personnel would be handled by the chief," Sauls said.

Commissioners Dan Bowers Jr., Craig Shaw and Sam Anderson discussed making other revisions to the policy. Commissioner Bill Terrell suggested contacting the attorney general's office for their input.

Organizations invited to Florida's birthday bash

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CRESTVIEW — Local organizations are invited to Florida's 500th birthday bash next year. Viva Florida 500 commemorates the settling of America's first European communities five centuries ago.

"Viva Florida 500 is a statewide celebration," Okaloosa Library Cooperative coordinator Vicky Stever said. "This is an event nobody else in the United States can claim," she added, noting both Pensacola and St. Augustine claim to be the country's oldest

cities.

How each county chooses to participate in Viva Florida 500 is up to local organizers, Stever said. Opportunities include sharing local history and cultural events at www.vivafloida.org, putting locally significant artifacts in the Okaloosa County time capsule and starting a local "500 Garden" to honor a state historic figure.

"The end result should be to bring a greater awareness of the history and culture of Okaloosa County," Stever said while ad-

dressing the Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce community calendar workshop on Oct. 15.

"We need to brand the events we're already going to do in 2013 as Viva Florida events," she said, suggesting adding a cultural or historical component to activities to qualify them for the calendar.

"That's pretty easy to do because just about anything you do could fit under that banner — except maybe a church bake sale."

Stever said the north county region could be a prime area for

participating in the "Next Exit History" program, which puts points of historic interest on a mobile phone app for motorists. The site already includes Florida state parks and historic marker locations.

Though the north county isn't as big a tourist draw as the south end, families wanting historic tourism on a road trip have a lot to discover in the area, workshop organizer Rae Schwartz said.

"Somebody driving their family down I-10 might use the app to make their road trip more interesting," Schwartz said. "As they

Hosted by the North Okaloosa Medical Center's Healthy Woman program, the monthly social event of the Crestview Area Chamber of Commerce recognized Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and pink was the color du jour. Even chocolate chip cookies on the refreshments table sported pink M&Ms.

Held at Physicians Medical Plaza, the event included a presentation by Dr. Loretta Brestan, tours of the facility's Imaging and Mammo Department, and recognition of cancer survivors and those battling the disease.

Crestview City Councilwoman Robyn Helt and council President Ben Iannucci III read a proclama-



Wine and cheese for critters

Afternoon benefit for wildlife refuge will also aid local zoo

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CRESTVIEW — Sasquatch Zoo's animals are among beneficiaries of a wine and cheese reception tomorrow afternoon on Main Street. The reception, complete with wildlife refuge "animal ambassadors," is 2-4 p.m. Tickets cost \$15 per person or \$25 per couple.

The event benefiting the Emerald Coast Wildlife

Refuge, to be held at Yellow River Winery and Wine Bar, was the brainchild of Jerry Melvin, a former state senator and former Destin city council member, said Yellow River Winery vintner Nathan Boyles, who will host the event with his wife Crystal.

"He is a great supporter of the wildlife refuge," Nathan Boyles, a county commissioner-elect, said.

The refuge acquired the local Sasquatch Zoo earlier this year. The zoo, situated east of Crestview near Dorcas, is a top field trip destination for schoolchildren and church groups. Its rare white Bengal tigers, Keela and Kota, are favorite attractions.

Tickets include Yellow River's fruit table wines and other selections, and an assortment of fine cheeses. Finger foods will feature Chef Chris Odom's tender Peach Albóndigas meatballs in a sauce made of a reduction of Just Peachy, one of Yellow River Winery's wines, Boyles said. Local guitarist and vocalist Aaron Overton volunteered to perform.

Boyles said he and his wife were glad to host the event.

"We like being involved in the community and this (the refuge) is certainly a good organization and they do a lot of good in the community," he said. "Their acquisition of the local zoo is going to be good for the refuge and good for Okaloosa County."

Emerald Coast Wildlife Refuge acquired the zoo from owner Debbie Mattox in September. Mattox will continue to run the zoo until the end of the year. It will close for a month of renovations, which will include building animal habitats and a botanical garden and will reopen as part of the refuge. Mattox, who founded the zoo in 1987, will remain with the zoo for several more years as a partner.

Blue Jean Ball nets \$28k : Sea-themed fundraiser benefits Covenant Hospice

CRESTVIEW — Covenant Hospice has \$28,000 extra that can cover various end-of-life care services after its Blue Jean Ball surpassed fundraising expectations, Lill Jennings, development specialist, said.

"I think it's gonna be more than that. We don't have all the expenses in and we have more checks (to account for)," she said.

The Oct. 13 event — which brought fire juggling, mermaid waving, wench dueling and dancer-ogling fun to the Crestview Community Center — netted \$2,000 more than expectations, she said.

Proceeds for the "Magic on the High Seas" themed event will cover non-funded or under-funded services, Odin Berg, Covenant's chief financial officer, said. These include coverage for uninsured patients — those who

"fall between the cracks" and lack Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance, Jennings said — along with bereavement, children's support and chaplain services.

Funds came from ticket sales, a silent auction and event sponsors, namely supporters of four "Crestview stars" who worked with Fred Astaire Dance Studio of Crestview instructors to perfect their moves before appearing on stage. Dancer sponsorships were as follows: Michael Hamby, \$3,151; Maryann McBride, \$3,058; Sarah Fordyce, \$1,637; and

Bob Jones, \$677.

Crestview's "stars" — Hamby, of Chesser & Barr, PA.; McBryde, of Okaloosa Title and Abstract; Fordyce of North Florida Financial; and Jones, Crestview High School principal — paired with instructors Aaron Stowell and Erika Moreno.

"They spend a lot of time and effort to train these people for weeks," Jennings said of the dance studio.

Audience members howled to a dancing exhibition of The Village People's "In the Navy" and "YMCA" and cheered for fast footwork during spicy Latin beats. The event featured lighthearted theatrical performances by a pirate and the wenches fighting for his affections, and was punctuated by décor and atmosphere that included aquarium centerpieces, a pirate juggling sticks of fire and a friendly mermaid greeting guests at the door.

Silent auction items included various vacation packages, jewelry and artwork, along with items like an autographed Lady Antebellum CD and an autographed Tim Allen photograph.

The Northwest Florida State College Soundstans performed a Broadway medley and later a crowd-pleasing rendition of Queen's "Bohemian Rhapsody."

The event's financial success guarantees it will return next year, organiz-



"I'm going to suggest that we refer this draft from the chairman to the lawyer (Jonathan Holloway) and have him come back with a draft next month that encompasses all of the concerns," Anderson said.

Bowers, Shaw and Anderson discussed the policy thoroughly; however, after much discussion, the board tabled the matter until the next meeting. In

addition, commissioners voted unanimously to table the chief's removal until the disciplinary policy was finalized.

During the Sept. 20 meeting, several commissioners and Cutler agreed that communication between them needed to improve.

Gene Wright, a former commissioner, suggested seeking outside advice.

"In the history of North Okaloosa, we try to recreate the wheel all by ourselves," Wright said. He suggested asking other fire stations how they handle disciplinary actions.

Commissioners decided to move next month's meeting to Nov. 13, when Holloway will submit a revised version of the disciplinary policy to the board for approval. Holloway also said he

plans to contact the attorney general input.

Next meeting's agenda will include welcoming new commissioners. Sauls' and Anderson's terms are up after next month's meeting, according to the NOFD website, nofdfire.com. Anderson will retire; Paul Skarzynski and Rollin E. Rathbun III are running for his post on the Nov. 6 election ballot. Sauls will run

against Todd L. McGirr.

Discussion of removing Cutler as fire chief came after talk of a firefighter's gun accidentally being discharged in the firehouse last year with nobody reporting the incident. Cutler's supporters defended his record during last month's meeting.

After the meeting adjourned, Cutler said he had no comment toward the meeting's outcome.

"I've been following up with Britainy and encouraging her, making sure she gets the help that she needs," Jenkins said.

In addition, Bryant Pate no longer carries his wife up and down stairs from their previous second-floor apartment. Property managers found a ground-level apartment for the Pate family, which includes Alexandria, 2; Anastasia, 4; and Xavier, 14. Xavier is Bryant's son from a previous relationship. The family also cares for Bryant's 87-year-old father, James.

"We have been in the new apartment for about a month now," Britainy said. "Life is now 10 times easier."

Newlin Carter, her father, built a wooden ramp outside the apartment, making it easier for her get outside.

Diara Scott, a former Crestview resident, reached out to help her friend after learning about her situation on Facebook.

"It just broke my heart," said Scott, a nutritional coordinator for St. Vincent's Medical Center in Jacksonville. Scott spoke to several officials at the medical center, namely Dr. David Chabolla, a neurological specialist.

The Pates traveled to Jacksonville on Oct. 4 to run several tests, trying to determine what keeps Britainy from walking or using her right arm. A News Bulletin reporter couldn't reach Chabolla for comment by deadline.

Britainy, who anticipates learning the test results and uncovering her ailment, said her family will return to the Jacksonville center on Oct. 24.

"To me, its closure," she said. "Even if there is no cure, I just want to know what it is."

Scott stays optimistic. "I have faith that Britainy will walk again," she said. "God can heal all things."

come to Crestview's exit, the app could direct them to the Carver-Hill Museum or the Baker Block Museum."

Area schools, museums and libraries can apply to host a 500 Garden of native wildflowers as part of the Viva Florida project, Stever said. The garden must be dedicated to a historic Florida figure — "Such as (former Congressman) Bob Sikes," reference librarian Sandra Dreaden said — and applications must be received by Dec. 1 at www.xaviercortada.com/?page=FLOR500_gardens.

Another available resource is Florida Memory, a State Library and Archives of Florida photographic collection of more than 160,000 historic images. The Crest-

view library already participates in Florida Memory, Dreaden said. Visit www.floridamemory.com to access the collection.

Email archives@dos.state.fl.us to learn how to donate photos to the collection.

Stever said the possibilities for local participation in Viva Florida 500 are almost unlimited.

"It's wide open and we'd like to do as many things as we can," she said, encouraging interested residents to attend a planning meeting at the Fort Walton Beach Library at 10 a.m. Oct. 25.

To get creative juices flowing, Stevers said, "Rewrite the lyrics to 'Viva Las Vegas,' because that's what I think of every time I hear Viva Florida."

"Every day FAMU uses my alley I am exposed to enormous liability," the letter stated. "I bear the risk of all accidents or injuries that happen on my alley."

Miller said he has asked Mayor David Cadle, who oversees Crestview's public safety agencies, to have the Crestview Police Department monitor the alley to prevent Adams or her representatives from blocking off the alley or resuming truck deliveries to Main Street businesses that the alley serves.

Also distributed during the meeting were copies of documentation substantiating the city's claim to the alley. A 1942 deed indicates Barbara Adams' in-laws conveyed "the west 18 feet of Lot 43 (the rear of a Main Street business) ... To have and to hold unto the Town of Crestview." If the city owned the property, it would've been turned over to FAMU when it received the Alatex Building from the city in 2010.

However, Okaloosa County property appraiser Pete Smith, after evaluating documents presented by Adams and her attorney, declared the family the rightful owners of the disputed property.

"No one from the city has contacted me or my attorney to offer a resolution to this problem," Adams states in her letter. "In the meantime,

FAMU uses my alley without regard to the effect it is having on me and my tenants, without regard to the fact that they are trespassing on my alley, and certainly without regard to the public safety and building code violations they created."

Adams' letter states that neither she nor her attorney have heard from Miller since the Sept. 10 council meeting, asserting, "I have to assume the city or the city attorney never intended to amicably resolve this matter with me."

"It sounds to me that they expect you to contact them," Councilman Tim Grandberry said.

Miller said he has researched the matter since he received council approval Sept. 10 to negotiate with Adams and Crew, but "I simply haven't had anything to report yet."

"Florida A&M University is substantially involved and

I've been working with their general counsel office," Miller said. "They're a large organization and it has required some time."

Councilman Charles Baugh Jr. agreed with Miller that the matter is a safety concern.

"In case there is an emergency or a fire, I don't want to be in the position to be sued because the students can't get out of the building," Baugh said, moving to authorize Miller to take the matter before the Ninth Circuit Court.

After the unanimous vote, Miller said the legal action wouldn't stop efforts to mediate a resolution to the alley ownership issue.

"Having asked for that authority from you does not interrupt our efforts as previously approved by the council to mediate these claims," he said. "We're still on that course and we'll continue to maintain these efforts."

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

BAKER — There was plenty to celebrate for Baker volleyball players Haley Wagner, Katie Wickery, Kaitlyn Rickmon and Falin Lawson on Senior Night Tuesday as the Gators hosted Rocky Bayou Christian.

Surrounded by their family, friends and teammates, the seniors were honored prior to taking the floor for their final regular season match. As has been the case more often than not in their careers, the Gators beat the Knights 3-0 by scores of 25-17, 25-19 and 25-13.

Baker Coach James Kerrell was relieved to see the seniors' curtain call go off without a hitch.

"You always kind of worry with Senior Night and all the distractions about how they are going to come out and play," he said. "But the girls came out and played solid and did what they had to do and it was a good solid win."

Wagner and Wickery led the Baker attack against a stubborn Rocky Bayou squad.

Wickery had a team-best seven kills and nine digs to go along with seven

assists and a pair of aces. Wagner had three kills, five digs, three aces and a block.

The seniors weren't the only ones turning in a big night for Baker as the Gators closed out the regular season with a 20-2 record.

Jordan Linzy had six kills, three digs and an assist, Savannah Risen had three kills, three digs, six assists and an ace. Hana Wadsworth had two kills, two digs and four aces. Alex Roy pitched in five digs and two aces.

The first set was close until the midway point. Rachel Mosley helped keep the Knights close with several kills from different points of the court.

The set was tied at 13-13 when a Knight service error put Baker in front and sparked a 12-4 Gator run to close out the set.

Baker jumped to a quick 6-1 lead in the second set and led 14-7 before the Knights mounted a rally and pulled even at 19-19.

A kill by Wagner put Baker in front 20-19 and gave the Gators the serve. With Linzy in serve, Baker scored five straight points to close out the set.

The third set was all Baker as the Gators roared to a 9-2 lead and never trailed.

Rocky Bayou tried to mount a rally behind Mosley and cut the Gator lead to 9-6 but that was as close as the Knights got as Baker steadily pulled away for the win.

Kerrell — who praised Mosley for a top effort in keeping the Knights in the match — said seeing a player of her caliber should help the Gators as they prepare for what they hope will be another run through the state tournament.

"Rachel could play for any school easily, all the way up to 8A because she's a top notch player," he said. "It's good when we see players like that because it gives us a challenge and she is one of those players that can hit the ball from anywhere on the floor and she's solid. She's fundamentally sound and we had to try our best to get her out of her routine and try to keep her off balance."

The Gators return to play Tuesday in the semifinals of the District 1-1A tournament at Central at 6 p.m. as they go for their 10th consecutive district title.

Baker will face the winner of Monday's match between Laurel Hill and Central.

District volleyball tourneys start Monday

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CRESTVIEW — The Baker volleyball team will go for a 10th consecutive district championship.

The Gators open the defense of their District 1-1A title at 6 p.m. Tuesday at Central against the winner of Monday's 4 p.m. match between the host Central Jaguars and Laurel Hill.

The championship match is at 6 p.m. Thursday at Central.

Crestview opens play in the District 2-6A tournament at Choctawhatchee on Monday at 6 p.m. against Mosley in the tournament semifinals.

The tournament finals are at 7 p.m. Thursday. The Bulldogs enter the tournament as the No. 3 seed behind top seed Niceville and No. 2 seed Mosley.

Tournament host Choctaw is the fourth seed and Fort Walton Beach is the fifth seed.

Baker Coach Tomikko Parks said there hasn't been any talk about the string of championships the Gators have put together.

"We haven't mentioned a number (of consecutive championships)," she said. "The girls just want to win. We just want to win that district championship and the number hasn't come up in our conversations or anything."

"It's important that we were the No. 1 seed because that means we've done our job in the regular season and that's the most important thing. The girls understand how important it is to win the district championship because without the district championship, we can't reach our other goals (of making it to the state tournament)."

Winning might be a way of life for the Gators, but for a Crestview program that has been down for several years, earning the No. 3 seed is a step in the right direction.

Bulldog Coach Kathy Combest led Baker to the first five championships in the Gator streak. Now, she's just happy that Crestview has escaped the district cellar for the first time in close to a decade and hopes her team can find some tournament magic.

Crestview lost both of its regular season matches against Mosley, but the Bulldogs beat the Dolphins in a set — and Combest thinks Crestview might be primed to pull the upset.

"Mosley is a great team, but the game we beat them in wasn't close," she said. "There are teams people look at in the tournament and say, 'We don't want to play that team.'"

"I hope we are that team that sneaks up on people as we reach our potential in the tournament. Once those girls get a taste of that success, they will want to go back. I want to see that for those girls."
