## 8,114 voted on charter referendum

### 90 percent of voters weigh in on nonbinding item

**CRESTVIEW** — Their votes didn't officially count, but that didn't stop 8,114 of 9,076 voters from opining about a proposed city charter that would alter the city's governance. Of those, 4,319, or 53 percent, voted against implementing the proposed charter. Almost nine of 10 voters in the last election voted on the charter ballot question, an analysis of official election results shows.

Speaking before the city council at its Monday meeting, several residents advised city leaders to take the results seriously — even if they're nonbinding due to an administrative error. City leaders expect to revisit the issue with another referendum in March 2013, which drew criticism from some opponents.

"Are you going to bring it up every time there's an election? It appears we're flogging a dead horse now," resident Dan Taggett said.

"This is like changing horses


in the middle of the stream," resident Landrum Edwards said. "We're doing a do-over. This is like kickball when we were kids; you get to do do-overs. That's what this council is doing right now."

Holding the election again was a matter of fairness because some voters, she and her husband among them, didn't vote on the charter referendum when they learned it was no longer a valid ballot issue, Councilwoman Robyn Helt said.

#### CRESTVIEW CITY CHARTER VOTE

Of 12,625 registered Crestview voters, 9,076 voted in the Nov. 6 election, and 8,114 voted on the city charter referendum, according to the Okaloosa County Elections Supervisor's official results. Of those, 4,319 — 34 percent of all registered voters, 53 percent of those voting on the issue — voted against the proposal.

The banquet is a tradition at Baker School.

"They have been doing at Baker for a very long time," said Jeannette Hender-

son, 81, a 1949 graduate who was a secretary there 1956 to 1988. "It's just wonderful to see the work the students put in to show that they care for the seniors in the community."

"The senior citizens enjoy it so much and we look forward to them coming every year," Hansford, who's helped with the event for the past 25 years, said.

Senior citizens in the area should make reservations ahead of time, event organizers said, by calling the Baker School front office, 689-7279, during school hours, 7:40 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Denise Gronberg — who has sponsored the event, on behalf of the Baker School Student Government Association, which she oversees, for the past three years — said the event has grown in attendance each year.

"Every year it seems to get bigger and better," she said. "The luncheon is our way of showing our appreciation to the senior citizens in the area."

"From my second to third year (sponsoring the event), the number of people (attending) doubled from 25 to 50," Gronberg, a high school civics teacher, said.

"The students really put in a lot of passion into this event, every year," she said.

## Investigator voted Officer of the Year

### Fellow officers recognize veteran David Henry

**CRESTVIEW** — Investigator David Henry's peers named him Crestview Police Department's Officer of the Year. Mayor David Cadle and Police Chief Tony Taylor recognized Henry and his accomplishments during Monday's city council meeting.

"This young man here, he gets it," Taylor said in presenting Henry to the council. "This young man stood out" from other nominees.

Henry facilitated in numerous arrests that included suspects who respectively stole 15 air conditioners, \$1,000 in cash and a \$15,000 ATV; and those accused of six armed robberies, two armed home invasions and 21 vehicle burglaries, Taylor said.

Henry arrested two Eglin Federal Credit Union employees on racketeering charges; arrested a suspect wanted in a "high-profile sexual battery case," and seized more than \$110,000 in "spice," or illegal synthetic narcotics, Taylor said.

Henry joined the police department in June 2009 and served as a patrol officer before moving to the Street Crimes Unit for a brief stint, spokesperson Lt. Andrew Schneider said.

"He's a hard worker. He's moved up to his current position," Schneider said. "If we have major cases, he's the type who's diligent at resolving them. He's had a good arrest record."

"He epitomizes what we have here at the Crestview Police Department," Taylor said.

# City council mulls allowing pet pot-bellied pigs

**CRESTVIEW** — Pot-bellied pigs might soon live lawfully with their human companions in the Hub City after a concerned resident petitioned to the city council. A 1980s ordinance prohibits the Vietnamese-originated pigs.

Following discussion, the council voted unanimously to direct city staff to research revising Crestview's pet ordinance to include pot-bellied pigs.

"I didn't realize pot-bellied

pigs aren't allowed in city limits until I wanted to adopt one from PAWS (Panhandle Animal Welfare Society), but I can't adopt her because I live in Crestview," Brenda Montgomery said, and added what she believed were pigs' benefits. "They are loving. They are hypoallergenic. They are smart."

Fort Walton Beach once had similar restrictions, but as pot-bellied pigs gained popularity as pets, the neighboring city revised its animal control ordinance to permit them, Montgomery said.

"They're not destructive.

They're not feral pigs," she said. "Health-wise, they're pretty hardy animals if they get their vaccinations. They don't stink."

Saying she was "not opposed" to revising Crestview's ordinance, Councilwoman Robyn Helt recommended city staff consult local veterinarians to determine if health issues are connected with such pigs. She also advised checking with counterparts in Fort Walton Beach to learn what procedures they used to revise their city's pet ordinance.

Councilman Tim Grandberry agreed that prohibiting the pets

seemed foolish and said many people in the city, unaware of the ordinance, already have pet pot-bellied pigs.

Councilman Charles Baugh Jr. advised consulting with PAWS (which handles Okaloosa County animal control services) when revising the city's ordinance. Baugh also cautioned that pot-bellied pigs, turned loose when they grew too big for their owners' comfort, have bred with wild pigs and gone feral.

"There are many wild pot-bellied pigs running around north Okaloosa County because irre-

sponsible pet owners, who don't realize they're going to grow into 150-pound pets, brought them up here and turned them loose," Baugh said.

"I can concur with what Mr. Baugh stated, but I could apply the same standards to cats or dogs," Helt said. "I believe we should have limited regulation in matters that affect people's day-to-day life. I don't want to be Big Brother. We have a specific ordinance that prohibits it (having pet pot-bellied pigs). The less amount of prohibitive ordinances that we have in our city, the better."

# Crestview now a Purple Heart City

**CRESTVIEW** — After an Oct. 8 resolution by the city council proclaiming Crestview a Purple Heart City, the title became official during the council's Monday meeting when Mayor David Cadle presented a plaque from the Military Order of the Purple Heart to Council President Ben Iannucci III.

"It's a recognition the city has taken upon itself to honor all the fallen veterans of all the wars and all the military personnel who are on active duty and are Purple Heart recipients," said Military Order of the Purple Heart Region 4 Cmdr. Bill Everett of Baker. "It's quite an honor; quite an honor indeed."

The Military Order of the Purple Heart now lists the city and Okaloosa County on its map of nationwide Purple Heart Cities and Counties. Okaloosa County was the state's Purple Heart County, and Crestview is the county's

first Purple Heart City.

Florida has only a handful of Purple Heart Cities, "and less than 25 throughout the United States," said Everett, whose region encompasses eight southern states. The closest communities to share the honor are Leon County and Tallahassee, and Pike County and Troy, Ala., according to the order's website.

"How fitting it was for Crestview to come on board, because there's an awful lot of retired military and active duty personnel in the Crestview area," Everett said. "Crestview has given up a

lot of personnel in World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam and the Middle East."

The plaque, bearing graphics of an American bald eagle, the U.S. Constitution and the Purple Heart medal, will hang in City Hall.

"It's an honorary designation for a city that recognizes the commitment and sacrifice of our men and women in uniform for the defense of our liberties in our country," Mayor David Cadle said. "It's a way of honoring the Purple Heart recipients not just in Crestview, but throughout the nation."

# Find happiness in Jesus, not things

One of my favorite stories is about a Navy officer who always dreamed of commanding a battleship. He finally achieved that dream and received commission of the fleet's newest, proudest ship. One stormy night, as

the ship plowed through the seas, the captain was on bridge duty when, off to the port, he saw a strange light rapidly approaching his own vessel.

Immediately, he ordered the signalman to flash a message that said, "Alter your course 10 degrees to the south." Only a moment passed before the reply came: "Alter your course 10 degrees north."

Determined that his ship would take a backseat to no other, the captain snapped out the order: "Alter course 10 degrees — I'm the captain."

The response beamed back was, "Alter your course 10 degrees — I'm Seaman 3rd Class Jones."

Infuriated, the captain grabbed the signal light and fired off, "Alter your course — I am a battleship."

The reply came back, "Alter your course. I am a lighthouse."

Sometimes, being headstrong and belligerent can cause a person some trouble. One such example appears in the Old Testament, where we read about Jacob. He had been successful throughout his life — at least, according to society's definition. All his life, however, he had been a scoundrel, a conniver. He was a schemer, a manipulator and was quite greedy. He didn't care what it took to get what he wanted. By one method or another, he had acquired great wealth and status.

You may remember how, in the Old Testament, Jacob had manipulated his twin brother, Esau, to make him give up his right to the family inheritance for a bowl of soup.

You may remember how Jacob outwitted his blind father, Isaac, by putting on sheepskin to trick him into thinking Jacob was Esau, who had come to receive the family inheritance.

Then, in fear of revenge, he fled home and got as far away from Esau as he could because Esau had vowed to kill his brother.

Later on, Jacob turned the tables on his father-in-law, Laban, who had tricked Jacob into working for him for free for 14 years. Jacob later turned the tables on

him with his own trickery, and became quite wealthy at Laban's expense.

Yes, Jacob had done some nasty things, and had gotten some important people very angry with him. For him to enjoy his wealth, he had to flee for his life and live in another country.

Do you know people like that — people who don't care who gets in the way, or who gets hurt as long as they get what they want? They leave a wake of emotional destruction behind them. They enjoy that they are getting what they want, no matter the cost to others. My heart goes out to people struggling to fill some void in their life, a void created by some hurt or neglect forced upon them.

The unspoken question that drives many of us is, "Am I happy?" If the answer is "no," you seek ways to change things to become happy.

Unfortunately, most people seek change in the wrong way. What usually gets changed is their job, spouse, clothes or where they live. They keep bouncing around from one thing to another, hoping the next discovery will make them happy. Unfortunately, this kind of searching continues to turn up short-term happiness or purely empty results, and never addresses the deeper need within them.

My question for you is, "Are you happy?"

If you are, I celebrate with you.

If not, I ask you to ponder why you are not.

Material possessions do not make one happy, although they can sometimes help. Rather, relationships bring the most happiness and joy into life.

But the ultimate relationship — one with Jesus Christ — brings the ultimate joy.

Give thanks to God.

"The council's not getting a do-over on this item," Helt said. "We have an obligation to put it on the agenda so the citizens get a chance to say. The citizens deserve to have the opportunity to vote in a valid format."

Elections Supervisor Paul Lux's official results show 960 of the 9,076 Crestview voters who cast ballots on Nov. 6 skipped the charter question.

More than 8,000 who did vote on it should have been enough to convey citizens' opinion, Taggett and Edwards said.

"You've got an opportunity (now) that the people have spoke," Edwards said. "Everybody had an opinion on it. If you didn't vote, that is your own fault."

"It was voted on and 500 people said no," Taggett said, referring to the 524 more voters who voted against the charter than for it. "Yes, some people elected not to vote on it. If you don't vote on it, don't complain about it."

Cal Zethmayr, of WAAZ/WJSB radio, referencing data from previous Crestview charter referenda, contended that based on his research, the 8,114 people who voted on the issue were likely the highest turnout they could expect.

"I think they sent you a message," Zethmayr said. "In Crestview, 90 percent who got a ballot went all the way to the back of the ballot and they chose to send you their opinion. 524 more said no than said yes. Do you think you're going to get 8,000 voters to turn out in March? I'll buy a steak dinner for any of you who thinks they will."

Zethmayr said his research showed 72 percent of registered voters voted on the charter referendum — the highest percentage of any of the previous five Crestview charter referenda from the past 20 years.

"We had 8,100 people vote," Edwards said. "You add that up and the majority did not want the city charter to change. I don't care if it was irreg-

ular or not counted or whatever."

"This council doesn't do the citizens of Crestview any service if we don't move forward and put it to a legitimate vote," Helt said. "The citizens have the say. I respect their say. If the citizens don't wish to have a charter revision, that is fine."

The proposed charter would replace the current city charter with a city administrator form of government.

Weeks before the Nov. 6 election, City Clerk Betsy Roy discovered a clerical error. A city council meeting to consider placing the charter on the ballot had been advertised for March 26, 2012, but was actually held April 9, she found. Rather than subject the charter to a potential legal challenge if it had passed, the council reluctantly agreed to rescind the ordinance that placed the issue on the ballot.

However, the action was too late to remove the referendum from ballots, which had been printed.

### Coach likes what he sees in Gator basketball team

**BAKER** — Mike Martello has been through good and bad times as the Baker boys basketball coach.

Now in the ninth year at his alma mater, Martello likes what he sees from this year's version of the Gators, a team that is young at certain positions.

"I think we've got the potential and I'm optimistic about that," he said. "We've just got to put it all together because we've got some kids that haven't played a lot together on the varsity court. Putting on that game uniform is a whole different mentality."

While the Gators will be young in spots, Baker also has veteran varsity players at several key positions to offset some players lost to graduation.

"We've got three returners from last year and one of those is our point guard, Josh Hartzog, and that's always good to have some experience there," Martello said. "Garrett (Sanders) is our post player and he was our post player last year. Justin Morgan saw some starts last year as well and he's a returner."

"We lost probably our two biggest scorers in Danny Spicer and Dylan Dunford, so we've got some holes to fill on offense this year. We've got a couple of sophomores (Brooks Taylor and Austin Hicks) coming off our JV team who give us a little bit of outside shooting ability, I believe. Hopefully, they are going to come along faster than normal and fill in those two holes for us because that's really

where the two scorers did most of their damage from outside."

In addition to Spicer and Dunford, the Gators lost Steven Grant to graduation. Grant, who also played football, could drive the lane and battle for rebounds as well as hit the occasional outside shot.

Martello hopes that football/basketball players Austin Martin and Richard Stroheker will do some of the things Grant did.

"Both of those guys are kind of an inside player and more defen-

sive than anything else and they should do a good job for us," Martello, who played basketball and football in high school, said. "One of the benefits of having played football is there's a toughness about them that is always a plus."

The team's youth is evident on the roster, where Sanders and Adrian Smith are the team's only seniors. Last year, Smith was the Gator player rotation's eighth man; Martello expects him to move up in the rotation and be a key contributor coming

off the bench.

Martello understands small school athletics' cyclical nature, having been through seasons when he was forced to place eighth-graders and freshman on the varsity.

The veteran coach believes Baker is nearing the end of a down/younger cycle.

"I think we are on the bottom of the down slope of the cycle or maybe on the rise again," he said. "We had the three or four years where those eighth- and ninth-graders came through and they were very successful years for us. In three years, I graduated 22 seniors."

"Last year, it was four more seniors and we are kind of at the bottom of that little trough there. Now, I think we've got some really good middle school kids coming up and I'm really excited about that group. And I think this group of mostly juniors that we have this year is going to be pretty good."

Baker seems ready to climb back toward the upper half of a tough District 2-1A. But that district includes defending state champion Chipley and a Holmes County team that features senior post player Chris Walker, the No. 9 ranked recruit in the nation.

Early in the season, there is time to think big about what can happen as the year progresses.

"I really like the enthusiasm this year," Martello said. "This year, we are only going to have two seniors and I see how enthusiastic they (the players) are about this season. They've put a lot of hard work into the off season so I think they have a lot of potential."

I fully expected to be back at work Monday after spending last week relaxing on vacation time.

Most of the teams I wanted to win took care of business so I had many reasons to smile. However, whether I just hang

out around the house as I did last week, or visit family, as I will at Christmas, I usually can't wait to get back to the job.

My plans for Monday were to be in Paxton for the girls basketball game between Baker and Paxton. Tuesday, I would be at the Milton at Crestview boys basketball game. I wanted to see the Bulldogs take down the Panthers (which they did).

But my plans quickly changed when I experienced severe pain in my right forearm much of the day Sunday. Then my blood pressure sharply increased.

Monday morning, rather than heading to work, I headed to the doctor, was promptly sent to the Fort Walton Beach Medical Center emergency room and was admitted for cardiac symptoms.

After a two-and-a-half hour stay in the ER, I went to a room immediately adjacent to the coronary unit. I guess they wanted me close enough to the unit so they wouldn't have far to take me in case something major went wrong.

The doctors ran countless tests, trying to determine if I indeed had a cardiac event, and treated me with multiple drugs just in case I had something going on with my heart they might have missed.

Thankfully, I passed all the tests — this time.

When they said I needed to take a stress test, I wanted to know if it would be anything like sitting in the back seat of my car on a football Friday night trying to file a 400-word story on deadline.

My joke got the desired laugh, but I know my health isn't a laughing matter.

The list of my health issues seems to grow longer with each passing year.

I'm 54 years old and more than 100 pounds overweight. The extra weight is likely a direct

cause of my high blood pressure, high cholesterol, Type II Diabetes and sleep apnea. I'm almost afraid to find out what else might be wrong with me that I don't know about.

I'm the only one to blame for allowing myself to get in this condition.

Thirty-seven years ago, I was a 160-pound high school athlete. A few years later, after my adult body finished filling out, I was a rock-solid 190 pounds. By the time I was in my late 20s, I was still an athletic looking 210 pounds.

As I added the weight a pound here and a pound there, I never even thought about it. Weight gain has an uncanny way of sneaking up on me — right up until I tipped the scales at 315 pounds about two years ago.

Even before Monday's incident, I had started trying to make choices for a healthier me. I've been meeting with a diabetes educator once or twice a month since mid-summer and recently starting using a CPAP machine to help with the sleep apnea.

My weight, which was 310 pounds a few months ago, is down to about 302 pounds.

I'm making progress, but have a long way to go.

I've always functioned better when I had teammates. Something about being a part of a team encourages accountability.

I consider the coaches and athletes I cover — and this section's regular readers — a part of my team because your help makes my job possible.

Now is the time to form a new team dedicated to getting healthier. This challenge, open to anyone, is mainly directed at all the Baby Boomers who once were high school athletes and are experiencing some of the same health-related issues I face.

If you are interested in joining Team Good Health, contact me at my email address listed below. If there is enough response, I'll see if I can get some local health care professionals to guide us down the sometimes confusing path to better health.

We could start the program in conjunction with the new year.


I'm determined to get healthy. Won't you join me?
