Parade organizers mull ways to curb disapproval

CRESTVIEW — Designating Christmas parade participants' positions and providing a roster of entrants to the public are two ways the Main Street Crestview Association may curb patrons' disapproval with controversial entrants, members said Wednesday.

The committee plans to speak with city attorney Jerry Miller and city council members before making formal decisions on the matter.

Members evaluated last weekend's parade, which drew criticism from a

number of News Bulletin readers offended by Save Me from the Fire ministry's truck. Student minister James Forrester shouted disparaging remarks about homosexuals, said Santa Claus isn't real and damned parade attendees to hell.

Following the parade, the News Bulletin's website, crestviewbulletin.com, and its Facebook page received hundreds of comments expressing outrage from the incident. The Main Street Crestview Association's City Hall-based office also has received comments from concerned residents.

"We don't get to see these people that often," Betty Brunson said.

The event's attractions were

another benefit, the couple said.

The meal, sponsored by the Student Government Association and Leadership Program, followed the middle school band's Christmas concert.

Band Director Tony Chiarito led the musicians in performing winter tunes including "Once Upon a December," which was featured in the 1997 film "Anastasia." Additionally, the band performed a medley of 20 Christmas classics including "O Little Town of Bethlehem" and "Away in a Manger."

City leaders chose the

church because they expect a large crowd, Council Chairperson Larry Hendren said.

"We want to get the community's input and hear what they have to say," he said.

Each resident who wants to speak on the matter will have three minutes to do so, City Clerk Nita Miller said.

The council must take several steps for a possible

dissolution to appear on the ballot, Hendren said.

"We want to make sure that we do it right the first time and not have any regrets afterwards," he said.

That means getting expert advice along the way.

Council balks at debating charter

CRESTVIEW — The City Council appears to have given up on placing the proposed city charter on the March 12 election ballot.

By taking no action at a workshop Tuesday night, the council now has only its regular meeting Monday to vote to meet the January deadline to get the question on the ballot.

That seems unlikely, considering the council adjourned the workshop in less than 10 minutes after taking no action in light of the charter proposal being defeated 4,319 to 3,795 Nov. 6. That vote essentially was a straw poll after a clerical error made the result nonbinding.

Councilman Charles Baugh Jr. opened Tuesday's meeting by reciting the 23rd Psalm. He then said he had "spent the entire day fasting and praying to find the right words to say."

"We've had this pretty much bantered around for three years' time," Baugh said. "I'd like to say during the general election, although it was a non-binding referendum, some see it as a straw poll for the will of the people."

Baugh said the 8,114 votes cast was the largest turnout ever for one of the city's initiatives.

While he said he believes the proposed charter — which would have changed the city's governing structure by providing a city administrator position — would have greatly benefited the city, "at the same time, I cannot ignore the voices that were cast ... If the citizens say no, I think we need to listen to the citizens."

The council had agreed Nov. 26 to discuss putting the charter on the March ballot in three measures to allow residents a "menu" of options.

Health department urges flu precautions

CRESTVIEW — After an uptick in flu activity, the Okaloosa County Health Department urges residents and visitors to help limit risk of exposure to seasonal flu and get vaccinated.

The United States has seen significant increases in flu activity over the past two weeks, which indicates an early flu season, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The flu is an infection of the respiratory tract caused by the influenza virus. Compared with most other viral respiratory infections, like the common cold, influenza infection often causes a more severe illness.

"The most effective precautions we can use

to fight illness are getting vaccinated as soon as possible and by practicing good hygiene habits," said Dr. Karen Chapman, director of the Okaloosa County Health Department.

"There is still time to get the influenza vaccine. With the holidays approaching and many people traveling or gathering with family and friends, these simple precautions may lessen your risk of getting influenza."

Those at highest risk during flu season include children younger than 5 years old, adults 65 and older, pregnant women and those with chronic health conditions like heart and lung diseases and diabetes. All health care personnel are strongly urged to get the influenza vaccine.



PREVENT THE FLU

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. Lack a tissue? Cough or sneeze into your sleeve.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Practice an effective hand washing technique. See www.cdc.gov/handwashing for details. If soap and water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- Avoid close contact with sick people.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone, without using fever-reducing medicine, except to get medical care or for other necessities.
- Get revaccinated every year because flu viruses change annually.

Meanwhile, watch for flu symptoms including headache, high fever, a severe cough, runny nose or body aches.

The Okaloosa County Health Department provides the flu vaccine free

of charge for children ages 6 months through 18 years. No appointment is necessary.

"We like to give back to the community," nursery manager Jennifer Oliver said.



Hendren said he spoke with an attorney from Cedar Grove in Bay County, which experienced a similar situation.

"Cedar Grove was the first Florida municipality to be dissolved by a vote from citizens (in 2008)," Hendren said.

The church's fellowship hall will be ready for the meeting, the Rev. Mike McVay said.

"I hope a lot of people will be here," he said.

McVay, who owns property in the city, said he personally favors this north county community rejoining Okaloosa County, but he is open to hearing the benefits of remaining a city.

"If there is one advantage to remaining the city, I hope to know by Tuesday night," he said. "I've never seen the advantage of it."

McVay — who said he doesn't want to continue paying both city and county property taxes — said he wants repairs for Laurel Hill's main roads, including Steel Mill Creek Road and State Road 85.

"The dirt road I live on is a lot smoother than (the paved) roads in Laurel

The Rev. Mike McVay said he favors this north county community rejoining Okaloosa County, but he is open to hearing the benefits of remaining a city.

Hill," McVay said. "I think the county would eventually do something about it."

Okaloosa County Commissioner Wayne Harris said neither he nor the other commissioners plan to attend the town hall meeting.

"I don't want my or any other commissioner's presence at the meeting to be misconstrued (as) being for or against," Harris said in an email. "I know that (Okaloosa County) will stand by whatever decision is made and will equally help, if legal to help."

The council set Tuesday's town hall at its Nov. 15 meeting. Long-time resident Harold Jones raised the issue when discussing the main roads' poor condition.



Some council members said Tuesday they believed that would be difficult.

"I personally think to break it up, you have a fractious charter," Councilman Tim Grandberry said. "If they vote different things, some win, some don't."

Councilman Tom Gordon didn't think the proposal was worth any more effort.

"I made no secret of my support for the charter," he said before adding, "I suggest we let this die and we move forward."

The council then adjourned.

Former Mayor Jerry Milligan, who had chaired the charter review committee,

attended the session.

He said later that he had been perturbed because some of the committee's recommendations were omitted from the proposed charter, even though some council members said it followed the committee's suggestions.

"The charter that was proposed was not at all what the charter committee sent to the council," Milligan said. "That's where I differ with it."

He praised the council for letting the matter drop.

"Maybe, we can only hope, they did indeed listen to the voice of the people in the general election," Milligan said.

"We didn't want people to think that we are just going to turn a blind eye to this," Main Street member Rae Schwartz said. "I came with some concerns and I want to help fix it."

Other members at Wednesday's meeting included Main Street President

Ellis Conner, Patti Gonzo, Viola Owens, Cal Zethmayr and Pat Hollarn.

The group discussed possible steps to prevent a similar situation from happening at future Christmas parades.

Zethmayr suggested the possibility of changing

the application's wording.

"We should put in the application for next year that (Main Street Association) has the right to designate where any unit goes, period," Zethmayr said. "Accept it or don't be in the parade."

Zethmayr suggested making the roster of entrants, by order of procession, available to the public, so people could leave early if they disagreed with an organization's message.

"You can't legally restrict anybody (from being in the parade), because you are going to put the city in a lawsuit," he said, referencing conclusions he arrived at from discussions with city council members. "It's the city's parade that

we organize."

Whether such perceived legal implications actually exist remains to be seen.

"I haven't looked into this matter; therefore, I cannot comment on it," city attorney Jerry Miller said.

Save Me from the Fire applied for Christmas parade entry in Bay Minette, Ala., but North Baldwin Chamber of Commerce organizers denied the request based on an unpaid \$10 float fee, according to Mobile-based TV station Fox 10. The South Alabama chamber reserves the right to deny any application based on unpaid fees or indications that an applicant wouldn't align with the parade's theme,

Fox10tv.com reported.

Nevertheless, all Main Street Crestview members on Wednesday wanted to avoid potentially violating anyone's First Amendment rights.

"I think that we can reasonably ... determine the placement of those units at the end of the parade," Conner said.

However, Hollarn expressed caution.

"This situation had to be handled carefully; that's why we need to work with the city council," she said.

Hollarn said she was horrified when she had heard about the shouting incident.

"This is part of Crestview becoming bigger," she said.

"This is probably only the beginning of certain things like this happening."

Still, each organization should receive the same courtesy, she said, adding, "Not one moment of hostility can be shown towards any group."

Wednesday, Save Me from the Fire, a Washington-based ministry, responded to Crestview residents' furor with a statement on its website, savemefromthefire.org.

"Your controversy is with the Lord God, not with us," Brian Gaines, a Pensacola student minister, said. "We faithfully spoke the truth according to His word in your fair town, knowing that it pleased God."

DeFUNIAK SPRINGS — The Crestview boys basketball team has on-the-job training under first-year Coach Ken Meisner.
 Meisner was hired just before preseason drills last month — and the Bulldogs have been playing catch-up ever since as the new coach and players are learning what to expect from each other.

The Bulldogs continued their crash course in Meisner's basketball style Tuesday night when they traveled to Walton to face the Braves.
 Crestview's gritty effort wasn't enough as Walton took a 59-50 win.
 Lack of execution led to the Bulldog loss, Meisner said, adding he continues to see improvement from his team each game.
 "We ran what we've worked on, but we beat ourselves," he said. "Obviously, Walton gets the win, and I give Walton all the credit. They did what they had to do to win, but when we don't execute, we are going to beat ourselves."

"The improvement has been 100 percent. And that's all you ask for as a coach. As long as you can make improvement throughout the season, good things are going to happen — and not just during the season, but in life."

The Bulldogs (2-4) played from behind most of the night as the Braves jumped to an early 10-2 lead.

Crestview's only score in the first 3:30 of play came on a basket by Jonathon Buckelew.

Back-to-back 3-point plays by Bulldog post player Denzel Ware cut the Walton (6-0) lead to 10-8 with four minutes left in the opening quarter.


As fast as the Bulldogs pulled to within a basket of Walton, the Braves scored six quick points on DeShawn Tucker's pair of long 3-pointers.

and the Bulldogs responded, staying within four or five points of the lead.

Walton led 19-13 at the first quarter's end and 33-29 at the half.

Ronnie Baylark came up big for Crestview in the second quarter, scoring seven of his team-high 18 points in the period.

The teams matched each other, basket-for-basket, in the third quarter as Walton led 44-40 after three.

Baylark opened the fourth quarter with five quick points. His second basket, a 3-pointer,

gave the Bulldogs their first lead of the night at 45-44 with 7:03 left in the game.

Crestview held the lead for 75 seconds until Ken Rudolph hit a pair of free throws, putting Walton back in front with 5:49 left in the fourth. Eleven seconds later, Buckelew answered with two free throws of his own, putting the Bulldogs back in the lead.

A Rudolph 3-pointer started an 11-0 Walton run that put the game out of reach.

Crestview's Baylark and Walton's Tucker tied for high-point honors with 18 points each.

Bucklew and Ware each had 12 points for Crestview.

Rudolph added 17 for the Braves, and Shaq Huffman had 13.

Meisner knows there's still plenty of work to do.

"We are learning from each other," he said. "We are still not where we want to be. They are slowly learning that we want to play an up-tempo game a little bit and we can do that if we can get some easy baskets."

"When we were able to get the ball up the floor, we were able to get some easy baskets — or at least some easy looks."

Bobcat pressure too much for Gators

PAXTON — Paxton's pressure defense didn't hurt the Gators as they faced the Bobcats on Monday, Baker boys basketball coach Mike Martello said.

Although Paxton did use an unrelenting press that seemed to expose some of the Gator weaknesses, Martello believed the Gators were their own worst enemies.

"We are a better basketball team than that," he said. "We missed some easy shots and made some mental errors early on and got down early. And that made everything worse after that."

"I don't think their pressure did that much to us, but it was

just our mental mistakes."

Whether it was the Bobcat pressure or the Gators playing poorly, the result was the same: Paxton beat Baker 68-40.

This is a different playing style for the Bobcats who, in the past, relied on big men in the middle to lead the way, Paxton Coach Jeff Bradley said.

"This is a new style for us," he said. "We haven't played this way since I've been here, but we are so guard-oriented, and we've got some of the best shooters I've had as a group."

"We want to see if we can get the tempo in our favor and hit some shots."

Early, Paxton pressure didn't seem to rattle the Gators. Six minutes into the first quarter, the Bobcats (3-1) held an 11-10 lead.

The next three minutes of play saw Paxton go on an 8-0 run. A Forrest Wibbing basket with 5:57 left in the second quarter capped the run and extended the Bobcat lead to 19-11.

Baker (1-3) got a 3-point play from Josh Hartzog, closing the Paxton lead to 19-14 — that's as close as the Gators got the rest of the way.

Asa Fayne's free throw started a 10-0 Bobcat run that extended the Paxton lead to 29-14 as the Bobcats led by double digits the rest of the way.

After the first period, the Bobcats stretched a 15-11 lead to 37-19 at the half.

Pressure continued throughout the game.

Beating the Gators is al-

ways special for Bradley, a Baker graduate and Martello's high school teammate.

"Me and Mike go way back, and we played high school ball together," Bradley said. "Of course, he played and I watched a lot. But it's always good to be able to win that game."

When the final horn sounded, Grant Stewart's 14 points led a quartet of Bobcats in double figures. Desmond Moore added 13 points, and Dustin Geoghagan and Austin Carnley each had 10 points.

Anderson was one basket away from double figures, scoring eight for the Bobcats.

Hartzog led the Gators with 14 points. Brooks Taylor added 12 points and Garrett Sanders had seven points for Baker.
