#### Families hold memorial, balloon release for children killed by heroin overdose

CRESTVIEW - A memorial ceremony was held on Saturday at Floral Designs recognizing one year since the death of Keith Crum, the son of the business' owners.

Crum died Oct. 21, 2016 from a heroin overdose. His lifetime friend, Rhiannon Reiss, died from a heroin overdose on Sept. 29 of this year. The parents of both Crestview residents joined

The celebration was the first of three parties in her honor, according to her son, John Richardson of Baker. Her fellow church members at Pilgrim Rest Baptist Church in Baker held a party for her the weekend of Oct. 22, followed by a family gettogether at a relative's home.

"I never thought it would happen -104 years old. She didn't either," John Richardson said.

That doesn't stop him giving her a challenge every now and then though.

"I tell her we should race up and down the halls, but she won't give me a head start," he said.

Born in Iowa, Mary and her family moved to Colorado when she was 15.

She met her husband, John Richardson, there, after his family moved up from Mississippi.

The two ranched and raised their four sons in their 65 years together.

Her husband died at age 90 in 2004.

When the center began planning Richardson's birthday celebration, they requested people turn in 104 birthday cards to surprise her

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



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# Crestview police helps get woman new wheels

CRESTVIEW - Among many local personalities, one of Crestview's most familiar is "Miss Sara" Reese, a resident with mobility challenges that do little to stop her from near daily treks around town with the aid of a wheeled walker that doubles as a vehicle to carry her belongings.

From her home off Stillwell Boulevard, Miss Sara's trips take her downtown and many times even farther.

"She doesn't use her walker like most everyone else," said Community Services Officer Wanda Hulion, who, like other Crestview Police Department's patrol officers, keeps an eye on Miss Sara when she's out and about. "She uses it to carry her stuff. She's got bags for her things, and she's got her flashlight strapped to it because I fussed at her once for being out in the dark."

Sometimes Miss Sara heads off to do her laundry, which hangs from her walker in plastic bags. Ever since her washer flooded her house, she prefers public laundry services, even after an officer offered to give her a stacking washer/dryer set.

Other times she's on the Lord's work, taking orders for and then delivering peanut brittle freshly made by members of her church.

Many residents have seen rushhour traffic come to a polite – and surprisingly patient — halt as Miss Sara crosses Ferdon Boulevard North in the afternoon. Miss Sara just has a way of making folks feel kinder and gentler, and a little less

But all that traveling around town can take its toll on her walker wheels, and recently, it did, Hulion said. She started looking into a new walker for Miss Sara, but Miss Sara would hear none of it.

"She said, 'Wanda, I don't need a whole walker. I just need new wheels," Hulion said.

So the officer called Drive DeVilbiss Healthcare to see about buying her friend some new wheels for her walker.

"I originally called to see if they'd offer a discount," Hulion said. "The sales rep said, 'Yes ma'am, how many do you need?' I was hoping for a discount, not for him to just give them to her."

But "just give them to her" they did, and now Miss Sara is tooling around town on a set of fine new, heavy-duty wheels valued at \$120 courtesy of the nationwide health care mobility company.

That's important to Miss Sara's independence, Hulion said, not to mention her spirit.

"That mobility is what's kept her going all these years," she said. "It's that fierce determination.

"Miss Sara's independent and determined to keep it that way."

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

Also, the IRS will never ask for payment to be made with gift cards of any type. Call the IRS at 800-829-1040 if you suspect you may owe back taxes.

The IRS mails letters if taxes are owed they do not call and demand payment. Please don't fall for this scam. Stay safe!

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

We had all watched her abuse herself with bad eating and beverage habits most of her life. Dialysis and spending most of her last two years in a nursing home was painful.

You can take good care of yourself 100 percent of the time and still end up with health problems. We see it happen to the best of people. You can take the best care of your

car and still wreck it. A lot of healthy people wreck their lives so there is never a silver bullet.

However, we should try. We should eat less sugar, drink more water, and eat less red meat and exercise a little more during the week. Visiting the doctor and getting routine checkups are crucial as well. Senior adult friends have said to me in the past, "When you get old it seems about all you do is go to the doctor." As cars get old they require a lot of care and, if we are blessed with old age, there is going to be more routine care to keep us going. It's just part of it.

We have to be concerned about overall prevention in this country. We can't wait until we are ready to file bankruptcy to worry about the national debt.

We can't wait to improve medical insurance for Americans. I am in favor of every American having health insurance but we have to improve what we are doing. I don't think the government simply issuing medical insurance to every American is going to work since we are already on the verge of bankruptcy ourselves.

Making insurance available across state lines is huge. Competition is important between insurance carriers, drug companies and hospitals. Medicare should be available for Americans to buy into if their insurance company ever disqualifies them because of a preexisting condition.

If we are going to spend trillions on Iraq and Afghanistan we can at least make health care available to everyone.

#### Sick? Try a humidifier

Humidifiers, which blow water vapor or steam into the air, increase the moisture levels in a room and help combat stuffy noses, sore throats and dry skin, according to the Mayo Clinic.

There are several types, and all serve different purposes:



- Warm mist humidifier: This heats water until it boils and then emits steam. Some of these include mineral filters that trap water, and these need to be changed occasionally, adding an additional cost to consider. Many pediatricians caution against warm mist humidifiers for children, as they can be a burn risk, according to Consumer Reports.
- · There are three kinds of humidifiers in the cool mist category: evaporative, ultrasonic and impeller. Evaporative humidifiers use a fan and blow air over a wet wick, and you'll have to occasionally replace the wick for about \$10. Ultrasonic humidifiers use a vibrating nebulizer to emit the water, and impeller humidifiers use a rotating disk.

#### Tips to fall asleep faster

If your head hits the pillow but your mind is racing or filled with ideas, deep-breathing exercises can help quiet it, said Susan Ginsberg, founder/owner, Stop and Breathe Corporate Wellness Services, Scottsdale, Arizona.

"Breathe deeply so the air flows into your belly, not your upper chest," she said. It can be helpful to place your hands on your belly and imagine you're inflating a balloon.

Next, focus on exhaling for twice as long as you inhaled.

Another tip, based on an ancient yoga technique, is eight-16-32 breathing: Lay on your back and take eight deep breaths. Turn on your right side and take 16 breaths, then switch to your left side and take 32 breaths.

#### Kids' social media use

Some general recommendations from the American Academy of Pediatrics:

- Children 18-24 months should only use media that are appropriate for their age group and supervised by parents and caregivers. Some good places to start include Common Sense Media, PBS Kids and Sesame Workshop.
- Children 2-5 years should have an hour or less of high-quality screen time a day that is educational and promotes good social skills.
- For children 6 and older, place consistent limits on the time spent using media and on the types of media, and make sure media use does not take the place of adequate sleep, physical activity and other behaviors essential to health.



# How to adjust to the end of **Daylight Saving Time**

ome countries observe it, others do not. Daylight Saving Time's intention, when established in Canada in 1908 and enacted by U.S. Congress 10 years later, is to save energy and make better use of daylight. The simple reminder of which way to turn clocks is to "spring forward" - set clocks one hour ahead in March - and "fall back" - set clocks one hour back in November.

This year the end of DST is Nov. 5 at 2 a.m. While this means that we all gain an hour of sleep Sunday, our bodies must adjust to light earlier in the morning and darkness earlier at night.

According to studies, Americans are divided on the mandate. Half still think DST is a good idea, while the other half disagrees. Regardless of opinion, make a smoother transition to DST's 2017 end by planning ahead.

"The Sleep Lady," as Kim West, author of "Good Night, Sleep Tight," is often referred to, offers specifics that

can help adults adjust:

- Go to bed 15 minutes earlier than usual on the Thursday before DST ends.
- On Friday go to bed 30 minutes earlier than usual.
- On Saturday try to go to bed 45 minutes earlier than your usual
- Eliminate all caffeine after 1:30 p.m. the week of DST ending in order to make it easier to go to bed earlier.
- If possible, also avoid alcohol, which negatively affects sleep, the weekend of DST ending.

A similar planning method applies to children. Over the course of the week prior to the time change, move bedtime back by 10 to 20 minutes each evening. For example, a 7 p.m. bedtime might begin at 6:40 one evening, 6:30 the next, etc., until children are going to bed at 6 p.m. by the time Nov. 5 rolls around. Consider gradually adjusting naptimes and mealtimes, too, if they occur daily at the same times.





The Fort Walton Beach resident portraved countless zombies on the show.

"I was really big into horror and sci-fi movies, so anything to do with that I was pretty interested in. The first season I was pretty much all over the place in every episode, sometimes in front of the camera, sometimes in the

back," Charpentier said.

He explained that the closer he got to the front, the more zombie makeup effects were called for.

"Sometimes they just need (background) filler, so we have some of the zombies that are in less extensive makeup, and then we have those in the front that are more gory and have more decaying detail to them."

While the show has been his only acting experience so far, Charpentier says

he learned a lot about TV show production, theater and acting.

"I also learned a lot of real-life skills such as talking to people and how to handle certain situations that some people can find a little off-putting, like being around celebrities and crew. I learned from the crew how to gauge such situations."

The RV Walker – which Charpentier is best known for, and his favorite to portray – died permanently in

season two when a character stabbed him in the eye with a screwdriver.

"That one was just so involved and so tedious I loved working on it," he said. It took three and a half hours in a makeup chair, and all the starts and stops of filming required for the scene. That particular zombie has lurched into show merchandise doll heaven, sometimes with an embedded screwdriver in its eve. sometimes without.

When asked about his

favorite character on the show, though, Charpentier said, "Maggie. She is Herschel's daughter and she is one of the ones that they stumble upon at the farmhouse."

He said she starts out as a shy, protected person and gradually comes into her own as the show progresses.

One of the things that surprised him the most about acting on "The Walking Dead" was how easy it was.

"It really didn't seem like I was working. It was more like I was goofing around with my friends on my off time just having a blast, so that was probably the most surprising."

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
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

# Northwest Florida State to present Celtic tour

NICEVILLE - Strolling the Cliffs of Moher while enjoying its views. Walking, shopping and sightseeing on the Royal Mile. Ogling the soaring viaduct over which Harry Potter's "Hogwarts Express" chugged. And planting a wet one on the famed stone at Blarney Castle.


These are just some of the experiences awaiting participants on Northwest Florida State College's "On the Celtic Fringe: Legends and Landscapes of Ireland and Scotland" adventure in May 2018.

It's the third educational and cultural tour of Europe led by David Simmons, professor of humanities and film at the college, and is the group's first to venture to the northern United Kingdom.

"Explore with us the history, people and culture including medieval castles, landscapes, art and architecture, music and contemporary visual culture of Scotland, Ireland and Northern Ireland," Simmons said, inviting students, faculty and friends of the college on the excursion.

Sights and landmarks on the May 14-26, 11-night experience include:

- Edinburgh: Edinburgh Castle; St. Mary's Close; Rossyln Chapel, made famous in "The Da Vinci Code"; and Mary Queen of Scots' birthplace, Linlithgow Palace, among other castles and sites
- Loch Lomond, the Kelpies, Stirling Castle and Sir Walter Scott's Trossachs National Park, which inspired his celebrated poem, "The Lady of the Lake," which he set in what became Scotland's first national park.
- The Glenfinnan Viaduct, the landmark arched bridge featured in four Harry

Potter films as the route of the "Hogwarts Express" steam train; Fort William; Glencoe and Glen Etive, filming locations for the James Bond film "Skyfall," "Braveheart,"
"Rob Roy," Harry Potter
films, and "Monty Python and the Holy Grail"

- Belfast: Kelvingrove Park, Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum; the Necropolis; Glasgow Cathedral; and the Peace Wall with its political murals, commemorating the end of "the difficulties" that plagued Catholics and Protestants for more than a century
- Dublin: The Giant's Causeway natural rock formation; dramatic Carrick-a-Rede Bridge; Castle Ward, which was "Winterfell Castle" in the HBO series "Game of Thrones"; and Newgrange, a prehistoric site predating Stonehenge and the Pyramids of Egypt
- Cork: Trinity College Library, where participants will behold the ninth-century illuminated manuscript, "The Book of Kells"; Blarney

Castle, where stone-kissing is optional but assures the smoocher of good fortune, legend says; English Market, one of the UK's best covered markets; and the Cliffs of Moher, which Condé Nast Traveler calls "the best cliff view in the world."


Though seemingly packed with activities, sights, lectures and insight from local landowners, historians and farmers, "On the Celtic Fringe" also offers a surprising amount of free time for hiking, exploring, walking and shopping, a rarity on most package tours but expected on NWFSC's Humanities explorations in which participants are encouraged to set out and explore further at their own pace.

# Oyster biology, ecology and myth busting

he eastern oyster is native, commercially and environmentally important to our area. Oysters are a popular food item and are important in maintaining the water quality in our bay and beaches.

While there is not much commercial harvest still in our area, total annual landings for the state of Florida once topped \$8 million. Many oysters are now raised using aquaculture and the industry is growing yearly.

Once the East Pass in Destin opened after the 1929 floods, oyster reefs naturally established themselves on oyster mounds discarded by earlier inhabitants. They were regularly harvested for food, but in subsequent years, this has been in steady decline.

Oysters still play a crucial role in the Choctawhatchee Bay, our area's largest estuary. They filter up to 50 gallons of water per day, which reduces the amount of silt and suspended solids and diligently improves the clarity of the water. They can tolerate a wide

range of salinity (saltiness of the water) and provide food and shelter for various other organisms like fish, worms and shrimp. They also reduce shoreline erosion by providing a barrier against waves.

However, oyster habitat, and therefore population numbers, have all declined in recent years. To address this habitat loss, the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance started a local oyster shellrecycling program. They collect shells from restaurants and, instead of them ending up in the landfill, they are used to construct oyster reef habitat. These "living shorelines" provide habitat for important fish and shrimp species and the structure for live ovsters to attach. This program, using a network of volunteers, continues to expand today.

Eating fresh oysters is a delight best savored on the coast. Buying fresh oysters locally, at a seafood shop or restaurant, and keeping them cold is key.

One cup of oysters has 170 calories, 2 grams of fat, 10 grams of carbohydrates and 17 grams of protein. They're also a great source of zinc and omega-3s.

A few myths surround these delectable bivalves, but they have not been proven to be an aphrodisiac or cure a hangover.

One of the most popular myths concerns when to eat oysters. Historically, it was said to eat oysters only in months that contained the letter "R," meaning September through April. This most likely had to do with the importance of keeping them cold. However, with the advent of ice and the ability to chill, it is safe to eat oysters year-round. Enjoy some oysters today.

# Checklist to help you choose a financial professional

or reasons likely to remain obscure, Oct. 30 is Checklist Day. While the origins of this observance may be a mystery, the value of checklists is clear: They help us organize our time and break large jobs into manageable steps. You can use a checklist for just about

Many financial professionals meet with their clients at least once a year to discuss the clients' portfolios and recommend changes, as needed, and also make themselves available, through phone calls and email, for any questions or concerns their clients may have.

• Find someone who will honor your preferences. Some financial professionals follow certain philosophies. For example, you might find one advisor who tends to

favor aggressive investing, while another one might be more conservative. There's nothing wrong with either approach, but you'll want to be sure that your preferences take precedence in all recommendations and guidance you receive from a financial professional. And many professionals won't express any of their own preferences at all, but will instead follow a course of action based on your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon.



#### How to pick the perfect pumpkin for carving

- Try to buy a pumpkin grown locally or directly from a pumpkin patch, as the longer a pumpkin has been off the vine the more likely it is to get bruised in transport, which can lead to soft spots and rotting.
- Choose a pumpkin with blemish-free skin and no soft spots or gouging.
- Set the pumpkin on a flat surface to see which side is the most stable; note that it's not always opposite of the stem end.
- After carving your pumpkin, soak it in or spray it with a bleach solution of 1 tablespoon to a gallon of water. Let air dry.
- Mist daily with the bleach solution.


You can take a pumpkin, spray gold paint on it, wipe off some of the paint to make an antique look that is elegant, or paint it solid silver to go with silver candelabras.

# 10 types of real estate agents

Monty's answer: There are more real estate agents with a specialized practice today than there

were 20 or 30 years ago. Here are the common specialties in residential real estate

- there may be more. **Generalist:** The anti-specialist, they turn away no business. They do not limit themselves in any way. The majority of real estate

agents are generalists. **Listing agent:** Limit their practice to listing property. They do not work with buyers but focus their time and energy on helping sellers.

Buyer agent: Advertise as a buyer agent, but will take listings as well. May or may not utilize a buyer agency contract.

#### **Exclusive buyer agent:**

Limit their practice to buyer agency. They require a buyer agency agreement and will not accept listings.

**Territorial agent:** Limit their activity by boundaries. In large high-density cities, sometimes by streets or individual blocks.

**Property value agent:** Limit clients by price range. Can work in many markets, but most often found in larger cities with populations more than 300,000 people.

**Property type agent:** Many markets develop specialists based on location and type of property. Farm brokerage, vacation property, and apartment specialists abound.

**Team agent:** Some agents form teams and pool their energies and expertise. From two people to groups of six people or more collectively can list and sell more real estate than an individual.

Captive agent: Developers and home builders often will engage real estate agents who work exclusively for the developer, and no one else.

**Unlicensed agent: Prac**ticing real estate without a license is illegal, but that does not mean imposters do not exist.

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Fertility preservation and breast cancer treatment

Hearing the words "You have breast cancer" can trigger a whirlwind of emotions, especially among women of childbearing age who still want to grow their family. Cancer treatments risk leaving women infertile; however, ongoing research into fertility preservation methods is increasingly offering cancer survivors the possibility of having biological children post-treatment.

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Sponsored by the National Breast Cancer Foundation and the American Cancer Society, this annual health campaign aims to raise awareness of the causes and consequences of the disease and provide women across America with the information and support they need to have the life they've always

How does treatment affect fertility?

A woman needs an adequate number of healthy eggs in her ovaries to get pregnant naturally. These eggs are all made before she's born and spontaneously die with age; however, invasive drugs and forms of treatment can damage and kill eggs prematurely (e.g. chemotherapy) or delay pregnancy, giving eggs time to age naturally (e.g. hormone therapy).

Fertility preservation options

If you're a young woman recently diagnosed with breast cancer, your doctor may recommend the following courses of action to ensure a bright reproductive future:

• In vitro fertilization (IVF). Colloquially referred to as the "test tube baby" technique, IVF stimulates the growth of eggs, collects them and fertilizes them in a test tube to create embryos, which are later implanted in the woman's

• Frozen embryo transfer (FET). FET is a cyclical treatment that involves thawing frozen embryos from previous IVF cycles (or a donor) and transferring them back into the woman's uterus. FET is considered the most effective fertility preservation strategy to date; however, women who are single or not yet married may feel more comfortable freezing eggs that haven't yet been fertilized with their partner or an anonymous donor's sperm

The American Society of Reproductive Medicine (ASRM) has found that for women less than 35 years old, frozen eggs have just as good a chance at creating life than frozen

# Visiting someone with breast cancer? Keep this in mind

When visiting someone with a serious medical condition — like breast cancer, for example — we sometimes do or say the wrong thing, despite our good intentions. If you're looking to bring someone comfort in their time of need, follow these pieces of advice:

• Always call before your visit, even if the rendezvous was planned. It's possible that the person may not be well enough or in the mood for visitors. Should this be the case, don't take offense and suggest another day for your visit instead.

• Always be willing to lend an attentive ear. Mute your cellphone and don't interrupt. Let them talk freely and respect their moments of silence. Avoid giving medical advice or comparing their situation to someone else's. And no matter what you do, don't pretend to understand how they're feeling (unless you've been diagnosed with cancer yourself) or say that everything will be alright. Instead, ask them how they're feeling and let them know you're there to help, however

• Remember that it's your presence that counts; you're not obligated to uphold a conversation. If neither of you feels like talking, consider doing an activity together instead like watching a movie curled up on the couch. Furthermore, acts of compassion like a warm embrace often speak louder than words.

· Lastly, don't exhaust your host by overstaying your welcome.

You could also take advantage of your visit to offer more concrete support like accompanying your ailing friend to their doctor's appointment, preparing their meals, taking them shopping, etc. Better yet, why not organize an outing to the movie theater or spa to help them clear their mind, if only temporarily? However you choose to offer your support, try not to exhaust yourself in the process - your own health and well-being are just as important.



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
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



