## Gov. Scott unveils three-pronged school safety plan

DEFUNIAK SPRINGS — Gov. Rick Scott stopped in Northwest Florida Feb. 28 to promote his \$500 million school safety plan.

The governor met with sheriffs from five area counties at the Walton County Sheriff's Office in Defuniak Springs on Feb. 28, the first day Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School students returned to school following the Feb. 14 mass shooting at the school.

What happened at Stoneman Douglas in Parkland has reinvigorated the national conversation on school safety. Gun control, mental health and increasing security within schools are among a range of issues being discussed. Scott

called on experts in these fields for input.

The visit was part of the governor's statewide tour to talk about his plan to increase school safety. Scott stood alongside law enforcement officers to do so.

"The money will be spent really primarily in three areas: more law enforcement, significant law enforcement presence at all of our schools; mental health counselors at our schools; hardening of all of our schools; and on top of that, some money for Department of Children and Families to have more teams to go out and work with our youth," Scott said.

Walton County Sheriff Michael Adkinson introduced Governor Scott.

"What you have here is a united,

dedicated front saying we believe the proposal made by Governor Rick Scott is the most significant improvement to the safety and well-being of our children proposed in my 25-year career," Adkinson said.

The governor said that the state has the money to fund the \$500 million dollar proposal and that it was important to pass the legislation during the current session.

Okaloosa County Sheriff Larry Ashley was one of the area sheriffs invited to appear with the governor. Ashley was enthusiastic about the plan and appreciated that the governor took the input of local sheriffs into account in developing the plan. Ashley said addressing

## Friendliest post in Florida? We'll see about that

In a part of the world dotted with posts and service organizations catering to active duty military and veterans, it may seem difficult to find a way to stand out. But a small Veterans of Foreign War post just outside of Crestview defined its own niche.

In a move that predates most of the current members, VFW Post 5450 apparently proclaimed itself the "Friendliest Post in Florida."

That was, until very recently, posted on its Facebook page. A sign on the building, which is on U.S. Highway 90, labels it the "Friendliest Little Post in Northwest Florida."

Current commander Warren Wiedemann is new to the area and to the post. He good-naturedly identifies himself as the commander of the friendliest post, while admitting that he's not sure how the post earned that designation.

"We've been asking some of the gentlemen who have been around for a while," he said. "We haven't come up with what the origin was."

"The ones who actually know the answer may not be around anymore."

Wiedemann, who is one of the youngest members at age 43, says his post has been reaching out to young families and even built a playground behind the post. They are friendly, he said, but stopped short of comparing his post to others in the Panhandle and the state.

"We try to live by it," he said of the motto on the building. "We're a very family friendly place."

Folks at other area posts say that while they don't want to be selfish, they're pretty sure their posts are just as friendly as 5450.

"We are friendly here," said a bartender at one in the south end of the county. "Everybody is just like a family over here. Everybody knows each other and tells their stories."

And out in Mary Esther, the Spectre Post commander, Mike Dorris, got on the phone personally to share his thoughts.

"I think I can speak for most VFW commanders in the state of Florida, everybody thinks they're the friendliest post in Florida," he said.

### Crestview remembers librarian Sandra Dreaden

CRESTVIEW — Sandra Dreaden, Crestview Public Library's first and only reference librarian, died on Tuesday in Crestview. She was 62.

The cause was an incurable form of cancer that had metastasized to her liver.

Dreaden held her position at the library since 2001 and was a GED instructor prior to that. She was also active in the community and was the chair of the Crestview Chamber of Commerce's Government Issues Committee from 2016-2017.

"She was a passionate advocate for the library and for this community," Library Director Marie Heath said. "The quality I most loved about Sandra was that she so freely shared her knowledge with all. I learned a lot from her and I'm sad that I won't be able to turn to her for advice...During one of our last conversations I remember her saying that she was sad, but 'had no regrets' about life. She was proud that she raised four successful boys and loved her husband, Art Dreaden."

Crestview has all of the staple thrift


### HAL DERRINGTON HOLLAND 1925 - 2018

Beloved husband, father, and veteran, Hal Derrington Holland, Major USAF ret, passed away February 21, 2018. Hal was born in March 1925 to Gertrude Witte and Hal Derrington Jetton in Long Beach, CA. At age 19, Hal legally changed his last name to Holland after his stepfather Charles P. Holland, a USN dentist.

An enlisted airman in the Army Air Corps, Hal was a B-17 tail gunner in WWII, earning an Air Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, and other campaign medals. Honorably discharged after WWII, Hal was recalled to serve during the Korean War in 1950, and commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the USAF in 1951. While stationed in New York, Hal met and married his lovely Italian wife of 63 years, Theresa M. Frigo. They explored Asia during accompanied military tours that included Japan, Okinawa, and Taiwan. In Japan, Hal and Theresa had two sons, Mark C. and John D. Hal's sons were ecstatic when he was later

assigned as the base comptroller for Eglin AFB, due to the Gulf fishing and white beaches of FWB, FL. While Theresa held their family together in FWB, Hal served as a Base Comptroller in Thailand. Mid-tour 1968 Hal was hand picked to be the Director of Accounting and Finance for the HQ 7th Air Force, Vietnam, where he was responsible for disbursement of all service member payments in South Vietnam and earned a Bronze Star Medal for Meritorious Achievement. Hal took great pride in his military service through three major conflicts (WWII, Korea, and Vietnam) as reflected by his "Three War" hat that garnered him many thanks for his service.

After his military retirement, Hal went on to obtain Bachelor Degrees in Management and Accounting from the UWF in 1971-75. Hal was the corporate accountant for Kelly Enterprises Trust, Destin, FL and later the Accounting Controller for Tolbert Enterprises at the Ramada Inn, FWB for nearly ten years.



Hal founded his own family business "American Tax and Budget" tax service in FWB and provided that service for over 23 years. Hal was an active member in Kiwanis and served as Treasurer and President in the OSIA Lodge 2422 in FWB. Hal was a listed personality in Who's Who in Finance and Industry, The American Registry, Community Leaders of America, and Personalities of the South.

Hal (and Theresa) were Roman Catholic, longtime supporters of St Mary's parish and many other charities. Hal loved playing the drums;

early on he played in the Greater San Diego Bonham Bros Band, and later taught drumming to eager students. Hal was the drummer for the local Original County Line Gang country band and played percussion for the Okaloosa Community Chorus for many years, enlisting help from his own roadies, Mark and John. Hal was a total cut up, and always tried to bring a laugh to everyone he met. Hal (and Theresa) loved raising four Boxer dogs, and adopted many rescue dogs and two cats during their many years together.

Hal's proud parents, beloved wife Theresa, two siblings, John M. Holland and Phyllis (Holland) Taylor, and son Mark C. Holland all preceded his passing. He is survived by his son John D. Holland, niece Madeline J. Monaco both of FWB, FL; granddaughter Heather Holland and great granddaughter Riley Marie Holland of Dothan, AL; granddaughter Lauren Holland-Hernandez and husband Jesse Hernandez,

For nearly six years, Exodos has been serving the city of Crestview.

Much of the inventory is clothing in the front of the store — just \$3 a pop — but like any thrift store, there's always something unique tucked away on a shelf.

There's often times the store receives a donation so unique that the staff doesn't even know what to label it.

"People are so good to us and donate regularly... but sometimes we get stuff and we don't even know what it is," Crowson said with a laugh. "I'll hold it up and ask customers, 'Alright everybody, what is this?' Sometimes there's illegal paraphernalia we have to call

in. We've seen it all." The best part about working at a thrift store is snagging some bargains for yourself.

"We all leave a little bit poorer than we were," Crowson said. "But it enriches the community."

### 'Business within a business'

Vendor markets have become a growing trend in the retail world, including Crestview.

Old Time Antiques has been a downtown staple for more than a decade. More than two years ago, it became Old Time Antiques & MORE when new owner, Kari Howard took over the store. Since then, she has added quite a lot more.

Howard's appreciation of antiques comes from her parents who were coin collectors, "I love the thrill of the hunt," she said. But stores like Old

Time Antiques, along with other local vendor markets don't just specialize in the old. There's also repurposed furniture, DIY crafts and all sorts of handmade goods.

"It's nice to bring some of the furniture pieces back to life," Howard said, "Somebody else gets to love it."

At Old Time, there's more than 30 vendors with all kinds of thins for sale. In the back of the store, you'll even find a hair salon run by Cat Mathis who stays so busy she doesn't even advertise. The vendor market is the perfect spot since her aesthetic is "vintage retro," she said. Her salon is decorated with vintage Barbie dolls and Elvis Presley memorabilia.

"We have a husband and wife vendors — he makes the furniture and she paints," Howard said. "We have one vendor who is a 90-year-old World War II veteran. It's like having a business within a business."

## FROM THE PULPIT

### The author who 'got' our worth

One of my favorite authors is the late Henri Nouwen. He was a Jesuit priest in the Roman Catholic tradition. He is a favorite author because he "got it."

He got that God is not a God of wrath or vengeance. God is not one to punish willy-nilly, nor toy with us. He got that the world

hurts people. Lies are told to us and about us. We are told in so many ways that we have to prove we are worthy of love, of acceptance, of being in any relationship.

We are often told by people who matter the most that we will never amount to much of anything, or we are doomed to failure. We are told in various ways that we are stupid, or unattractive, or a loser.

Because people hear these kinds of comments often enough and strongly enough, they are taken to heart. We believe them, if not consciously, then subconsciously. They then become self-fulfilling prophecies.

What Nouwen "got" is we are worthy of God's love, grace, and forgiveness. Period. We don't have to earn it. We don't have to prove we are perfect enough to get it. Simply by the fact that we have been born we are loved.

As Nouwen so eloquently put it: "You were the beloved before your father, mother, brother, sister or church loved you or hurt you. You are the beloved because you belong to God from all eternity. God loved you before you were born, and God will love you after you die."

The prophet Jeremiah delivered God's word in verse Jeremiah 31:3: "I have loved

you with an everlasting love."

God called Jesus, "my Beloved." And because Christians are called sisters and brothers of Jesus Christ, we too are God's beloved. We are loved beyond anything we can ever imagine.

I wonder what would happen if more people could hear this and accept it? Did not God prove how much he loves us by leaving the throne of heaven to live on this world as Jesus Christ? Did God not teach us his ways through the tremendous lessons of Jesus? Did not God allow himself to be put to death on a cross so our sins could be forgiven

and we return to him?

How much more must God do to get us to understand that we are loved so much by God that he did everything to prove it?

Actually, the ball is now in your court. God has declared you are worthy of his love, grace, and forgiveness – in spite of what the "world" says about you. Will you allow yourself to hear God's declaration, accept it, and live it?





### OBITUARY: BRITTANY NICOLE TORRES


