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Crestview man found guilty of attempted murder

CRESTVIEW — A Crestview man has been found guilty on charges of attempted second-degree murder with a firearm, improper display of a firearm and shooting into an occupied vehicle, the state attorney's office has announced.

Bill Eddins, state attorney for the First Judicial Circuit, said Monday that Terry

Boldridge was found guilty after a jury trial.

The charges arose from an incident that occurred Oct. 25, 2017 at the Quinta Villa Apartments in Crestview. A dispute between Boldridge and the victim took place while they were in Boldridge's

apartment. The victim left the apartment and sat in his car.

After several minutes, Boldridge obtained a firearm and went outside, walked up to the victim's vehicle and shot the victim multiple times. Boldridge returned to his apartment where he reloaded the firearm. Boldridge then went back outside and fired five more shots at the victim as he drove away. The victim

survived the shooting.

Sentencing has been scheduled for Sept. 6 before Circuit Judge Michael A. Flowers.

Boldridge faces a possible maximum sentence of life in prison. The case was investigated by the Crestview Police Department. Assistant State Attorney Jonathan Schlechter was responsible for the prosecution.

Okaloosa eyes same tax rate, higher pay

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CRESTVIEW — Okaloosa County officials do not anticipate increasing the millage rate for residential property owners in the unincorporated area for fiscal year 2019.

Still, because of a projected, almost 6.3 percent increase in property values, the county could see a little more than \$3.8 million boost in property tax revenue with the existing millage rate staying at 3.83 mills in the new budget year.

That rate equates to \$383 per \$100,000 of taxable property value. Last year, a majority of the County Commission approved the county's first millage rate increase since fiscal 2014.

The new budget year begins Oct. 1. The commission is in the midst of examining next year's proposed spending plan and has already had two budget workshops, with the latter one held on Monday.

Commissioners Trey Goodwin and Kelly Windes did not attend Monday's workshop.

The county's overall proposed fiscal 2019 budget totals more than \$383 million, which is more than \$4.6 million, or about 1.2 percent, higher than the existing budget.

For the new budget year, the commission could consider whether to approve a 3 percent pay raise for all of the county's employees, including its 579 general fund employees, as well as Sheriff's Office employees in the ranks of sergeant and below.

The total cost of all of the possible pay increases would be a little more than \$1 million, according to County Administrator John Hofstad.

"The foundation of our county is our employees," Commissioner Carolyn Ketchel said at the board's first workshop.

Commission Chairman Graham Fountain said some county employees have told him that their annual pay puts them "in the poverty range."

A family/household of four people with a combined income of \$25,100 is considered living in poverty, according to 2018 federal poverty guidelines for the 48 contiguous states and the District of Columbia.

During his budget presentation at the first workshop, Ashley noted that the Sheriff's Office entry-level annual salary was raised last year to \$37,500, which is below the county's median income of \$55,880.

The commission's next budget workshop is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. next Monday at the County Administration Building in Shalimar.

Local soldier moves on in Best Warrior

7th Group sergeant now heading to the Army-wide competition

EGLIN AFB — A 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne) sergeant has once again advanced in the Army's Best Warrior competition, taking first place among participating troops in the U.S. Army Special Operations Command.

The sergeant, whose name cannot be released because of security concerns connected with his duties, previously had won Best Warrior in the Army's 1st Special Operations Command, which includes the 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne).

The soldier's latest victory has earned him a spot in the upcoming Army-wide Best Warrior competition. That contest, set for Sept. 30 through Oct. 5, will feature 22 soldiers from 11 Army commands competing at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia and at the Pentagon.

The local soldier was chosen by his team sergeant to compete in this year's Best Warrior, which began with a contest among his 7th Group peers.

Best Warrior includes physical fitness tests, military skills tests such as marksmanship and hand-to-hand combat, and even an academic component in which soldiers are tested on their knowledge of Army history and current events, among other subjects. Competitors also face an oral examination board.

This year marks the 7th Group sergeant's first experience with Best Warrior. In an interview following his

victory within 1st Special Operations Command, he admitted that the academic aspects of the competition tripped him up more than a little bit.

"Flat out, I was terrible," he said.

The demanding operational tempo at 7th Group, while it has created some problems with his training schedule, has played an important part in his winning performances in the Best Warrior competition,

the soldier said after his 1st Special Operations Command.

"It's been a very crazy year," he said in the June interview. But "being best at the basics is what keeps us alive in combat."

GEORGE ROBERT BOOTH 1948 - 2018

George Robert Booth, a career officer with the USAF, slipped the surly bonds of earth on June 23rd, 2018 in Jackson, Mississippi after a lengthy illness. He was born January 1, 1948 in Vicksburg, Mississippi to William Edward Booth and Elizabeth Polk Booth.

He was a 1966 graduate of St. Aloysius High School in Vicksburg, Mississippi. He received a B.S. degree from the University of Mississippi in 1970. Following his graduation from Ole Miss, he was commissioned as an officer in the United States Air Force. He served his country for 22 years, eventually earning the rank of Colonel. Early in his career, Colonel Booth was selected to attend the USAF pilot training program in Enid, Oklahoma where he graduated first in his flight school class. He then served as a fighter pilot during the Vietnam War, flying with the 8th Tactical Fighter Wing based in Ubon, Thailand. He flew the F-4 and F-15. During his years of service, Col. Booth also served at Air Force bases in Bitburg, Germany; Soesterberg, Netherlands and Nellis AFB, Nevada. He spent one year in Toronto, Canada at the Air Command and Staff College, an institution designed to provide high quality professional military education for selected Canadian and international officers. He then provided services to the Canadian government for 2 years at the Canadian Forces Base Rockcliffe headquarters in Ottawa, Canada. Col. Booth subsequently returned to the United States with an assignment to Langley AFB in Virginia where he served as Commander of the 48th Fighter Interceptor Squadron. He later trained at the Air War College in Montgomery, Alabama, the senior professional military education school of the USAF.

Col. Booth was preceded in death by his parents, Lorie Marie Booth, 2 brothers, Joseph Malcolm Booth and John Christopher Booth (infant death) and one sister, Alice Elizabeth Booth. 

This program focuses on broad, transferable skills and stresses understanding and demonstration of elements of the culinary industry. Careers include culinary manager, food and

beverage manager, pantry cook, executive chef and many more.

The natural gas operations and distribution program will primarily be offered at the Chautauqua Center in DeFuniak Springs, with selected courses offered at NWF's Niceville and Fort Walton Beach campuses and the South Walton Center.

This program prepares students to become gas plant operators, where their job will consist of distributing or processing gas for utility companies and others by controlling compressors to maintain specified pressures on main pipelines.

The unmanned vehicle systems operations program consists of courses that will allow students to develop an operational knowledge of UAV design, limitations, operations and maintenance. The program will offer four specializations: business development, fire/rescue, law enforcement and payload specialist.

This program prepares students to become unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) pilots. UAV pilots must be able to remotely control a flying vehicle with a thorough understanding of weather, aerodynamics, national

airspace structure, vehicle design and control, and human factors. The demand for UAVs is growing, and they are increasingly being used in a variety of industries — from the military and police, to commercial operations.

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

More ways to safeguard personal information

Yesterday we received a letter from one of my husband's previous employers letting us know thieves swindled

money from numerous employees' retirement accounts. The letter discussed the measures the company was taking to protect these funds as well as measures we should take to protect ourselves.

There was no data breach. The thieves had simply sent "phishing" emails and gotten personal information.

Phishing is sending

legitimate-looking emails alleged to be from one's bank, credit card company, IRS and so forth. These fake emails specifically request log in information, passwords, credit card and Social Security numbers.

Deter online fraud

Just as one should never give financial or personal information over the phone, don't assume an email is legitimate, especially one that asks you to click a link to log in or to confirm your password.

People who receive such an email should call the institution, and apprise them of the email.

To contact the company by email, look up its website and type in the

address yourself. A secure website will have "https" in the website's address line.

Emergency responses

Installing a lock box outside your home with a house key is a smart alternative for emergency personnel to gain access to your home without breaking down the door or a window, especially for those living alone. Lock boxes are available at Lowe's for about \$30 to \$45 each.

Once the key is placed in the lock box, memorize the code, and have it written next to the phone.

If you have a medical alert system, make sure they have the code so

that it can be given to the 911 operator. This code should also be given to a trusted neighbor in case of your incapacitation.

Vacation tips

When planning your vacation, don't mention it on social media as that tips off burglars that the house is empty.

- Put lights on a timer throughout your house and vary the times they turn on.

- Stop the newspaper and mail or have a trusted friend/neighbor pick them up.

- Make sure that the grass gets mowed.

- Set your house alarm.

- Take an inventory of valuables before you leave, and lock up what

you can.




What Should You Do With an Inherited IRA?

Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs) are quite popular. (To make sure you fully understand all the guidelines on distributions and taxation of inherited IRAs, consult with your tax advisor.)

It's also important to understand how your inherited IRA will fit in to your overall financial strategy. Consequently, you'll need to address these questions:

- *How much should I take out each year?* As mentioned above, you must take a distribution of at least a minimum amount from your inherited IRA each year – if you don't, you may be subject to a 50% penalty on the amount you should have taken. But you can take out more than the minimum. In deciding how much to take, you'll need to evaluate a few factors. First, of course, is whether you need the extra money to help support your regular cash flow. It's possible you have other pools of income from which to draw, and, in some cases, it may be advantageous for you to tap these sources first. Another consideration is taxes – if you've inherited a traditional IRA, the more you take out each year, the bigger your tax bill may be.

- *Should I keep the same investments?* Inheriting an IRA doesn't mean you're stuck with the original account owner's investment choices. You can change the investments to align with your goals and risk tolerance, both of which may change over time.

- *How does the inherited IRA fit in with my overall financial strategy?* You'll need to consider how your newly inherited IRA fits in to the "big picture" of your financial strategy. Are you adding redundancies? If you keep the inherited IRA largely intact, how will it affect your current investment mix? Could the added income from required distributions change your retirement calculations or even enable you to retire earlier? You may want to consult with a financial professional about these and other questions related to your inherited IRA.

The person who left you an IRA worked hard for that money and thought enough of you to pass it on. Consequently, you'll want to respect this inheritance – and get the most out of it for as long as you can.



A meeting to set Okaloosa millage rate is scheduled



Cobots, robots and recreating the Fab Four

‘W’ith every mistake we must surely be learning ...’ — “While My Guitar Gently Weeps,” as performed by The Beatles

Recently, I read about a fast food restaurant chain that is investing millions into computerized food service. The customer programs his food selection, then robots make each hamburger to order, adding desired condiments and even slicing whole pickles with millimeter precision.

Artificial intelligence has also been utilized recently in an attempt to recreate a Beatles song. Critics called the final product somewhat “emotionless,” and noted that it sounded more like the Beach Boys than the Beatles, but the very fact that we’ve got the technology to attempt such an endeavor is disconcerting to human artists.

Our ability to control, regulate and direct AI represents a significant signpost toward a healthy economy in the 21st century. So the viability of using cobots, or collaborative robots, in the manufacturing sector is especially encouraging. A 2016 study by the International Federation of Robotics reveals that fewer than 10 percent of jobs can be completely automated. Of course, that statistic suggests that 90 percent of tasks can be at least partially automated. Most of those jobs are currently filled by low wage, low skilled workers.

Traditional robots require extensive programming. They are often cumbersome, relatively immobile and dangerous for nearby workers, and many perform their functions locked away from employees. Perhaps most importantly, their presence was a threat to employees because they replaced human hands.

Specialized machines called cobots work in tandem with human workers and can help boost productivity, which then increases overall employment. Designed to shut down if a person crosses their path, cobots minimize worksite injury. Most require no sophisticated coding and are generally lighter and more mobile than traditional robots. Just under a quarter million global industrial robots were sold last year, and only 5 percent of these were cobots. But cobots, sometimes called flexible robots, could soon become an important component of the profitability of small manufacturing plants.

As economist Gary Schilling wrote, “Collaborative robots that work alongside humans ... are getting cheaper and easier to program. And they’re safer and more user-friendly than earlier models that had to be caged to protect humans ... Cobots are being used in warehouses and are much cheaper in moving goods than miles of conveyor belts.”

Integrating technology like cobots into industrial manufacturing makes imminent sense to me, from a human standpoint. We simply cannot afford to invent and program ourselves into a state of high unemployment. But using technology as a complimentary feature on the factory floor is an evolved solution that can simultaneously assist us in achieving maximum efficiency and high employment.

NACDL Report: Defendants ‘are being coerced to plead guilty’

This week the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers (NACDL) issued a report on the “trial penalty.” According to the report, defendants “are being coerced to plead guilty” because the penalty for exercising their constitutional right to be proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt at trial is “simply too high to risk.”

According to the NACDL’s website, the report identifies and exposes the underlying causes of the decline of the federal criminal trial and puts forth meaningful, achievable recommendations to address this crisis.

The New York Times in 2014, “Prosecutors routinely threaten ultraharsh, enhanced mandatory sentences that no one — not even the prosecutors themselves — thinks are appropriate.” Judge Gleeson said the way prosecutors use trial penalty, “coerces guilty pleas and produces sentences so excessively severe they take your breath away.”

The report contends that trial by jury has been replaced by a “system of pleas” which diminishes, to the point of obscurity, the role that the framers envisioned for jury trials as the primary protection for individual liberties

and the principal mechanism for public participation in the criminal justice system.

Guilty pleas have replaced trials for a very simple reason: Individuals who choose to exercise their Sixth Amendment right to trial face exponentially higher sentences if they go to trial and lose.

Faced with this choice, individuals almost uniformly surrender the right to trial rather than insist on proof beyond a reasonable doubt. The report contends that defense lawyers spend most of their time negotiating guilty pleas rather than ensuring that police and the government respect the boundaries of the law.

Beyond a reasonable doubt — the bedrock of the criminal justice system — plays no role in an alarming number of cases. What this means is that an insignificant number of offenders heading off to state or federal prison were proven guilty of anything.

Sure, those defendants acknowledged their guilt by choosing to enter a guilty plea; but shouldn’t the most revered legal system in the world provide something more in terms of protection for those accused of a crime?

On the other hand, can the criminal justice system function without plea bargains?

The plea bargain, however unpopular or unseemly, is a much needed tool in the administration of justice. If the plea bargain were to disappear the criminal courts would grind to a halt. Several years ago, U.S. Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy said plea bargaining determines “who goes to jail and for how long. It is not some adjunct to the criminal justice system. It is the criminal justice system.”

Why shouldn’t there be a trial penalty? What reasonably prudent defendant, represented by a reasonably competent attorney, would plead guilty if she knew a conviction at trial would bring the same penalty as pleading guilty.

A defendant would have nothing to lose by going to trial. The number of trials would increase as would the direct appeals and collateral challenges. A system that is already overburdened would be pushed to the limit.

The question is how to balance the fundamental principles of the U.S. Constitution with the mechanics of the criminal justice system? The NACDL report may well be a first step in finding that balance.

they have a pool, they should become familiar and get trained in mouth-to-mouth rescue breathing," said Dr. Michael Sayre, a professor of emergency medicine at the University of Washington in Seattle. "Whereas hands-only CPR is typically focused on someone who is not in the water and collapses suddenly for other reasons, people underwater die because of lack of oxygen."

After Clay's recovery, Metro founded a nonprofit called CPR Party, using the model of at-home shopping parties to encourage people to teach and learn CPR. The lessons aren't equal to official CPR certification, Metro said, but "they will know what to do and hopefully, we create a bridge to certification. We just give them that basic knowledge to empower them."

About one in five people who die from drowning are 14 years old or younger, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. And for every child who dies from drowning, another five receive emergency department care for nonfatal injuries, often including brain damage. The numbers are particularly discouraging, experts say, because in many cases, drowning is preventable.

Drowning is the third-leading cause of unintentional injury death worldwide, accounting for 7 percent of all injury-related deaths, according to the World Health Organization. The agency estimates there are 360,000 annual drowning deaths worldwide.

"The biggest thing we try to get through to people is you need to maintain constant, active supervision when people are in the water," said Adam Katchmarchi, executive director of the National Drowning Prevention Alliance. "Regardless of age and swimming ability, you should never swim alone. You should always swim around someone who's keeping that vigilant watch over the water, whether that be a parent in a backyard pool or whether you're swimming in a lifeguarded area."

On its website, the NDPA stresses what it calls "layers of protection," including swimmer training, facility safety and parental responsibilities designed to prevent drowning. Drowning can happen quickly and silently, without warning, Katchmarchi said.

"We're used to the 'Baywatch' drowning, where people see on TV that someone's going to be waving their arms and screaming for help," he said.

"An actual drowning victim, when they're in that 20- to 60-second fight for survival, they're unable to call for help because all of their energy is being used to keep their head above water. A lot of times they're bobbing up and down, going under and re-emerging and trying to get air, so it's really difficult for them to call out for help," Katchmarchi said.

"It's really easy to say, 'Oh, I'm watching my kids,' but you're scrolling through Facebook or your Twitter feed. ... Even if you're distracted for just a short period of time, it can happen really quickly and really silently."

Just back from a run with her husband, Laura Metro heard her 6-year-old daughter, Maison, screaming, "I think Clay died! I think Clay died!"

Metro's 3-year-old son, who was swimming with family friends, was found at the bottom of the pool with his towel.

One friend started CPR – or the closest thing he knew based on what he'd seen on TV – on Clay's blue, lifeless body.

Paramedics arrived and got Clay's heart beating again. He was taken by helicopter to the hospital and spent two days in a coma before making what Metro calls "nothing short of a miraculous recovery."

"The doctors said, 'We don't know why he's alive. The only thing – the

only thing – we can attribute it to is the bystander CPR," Metro said. He didn't see the inside of a hospital for an hour and a half after almost drowning. The bystander CPR "was really what did it."

Drowning is the third-leading cause of unintentional injury death worldwide, accounting for 7 percent of all injury-related deaths, according to the World Health Organization. The agency estimates there are 360,000 annual drowning deaths worldwide.

The Metros' good fortune is anecdotal evidence of the findings from a study published in the June 2017 edition of the journal *Resuscitation*, which found that chances for neurological recovery from a near-drowning increase when the victim receives CPR from a bystander.

"We would advocate for parents knowing CPR, and particularly if

Use this combo move for a quick workout

On the days you don't feel like working on your fitness, aim for moves that target multiple zones, and you will be done in no time.

Our move today is a wide squat with a side crunch. You will be working your lower body, quads, glutes, hamstrings, inner thighs and also your core.

Begin this combo move by placing your feet out in a wide stance, angling the toes outward. Lower your torso by bending in the knees. Push your hips slightly forward to

engage the abdomen and hold your chest tall. Place

each hand gently behind the ears or neck and you are ready to move.

Keeping the lower body engaged in a squatting position, begin to bend to one side. Keeping the elbows out from the body, guide the chest with the bent elbow. Once you reach your deepest contraction on one side, return to the start. And continue to the opposite side.

Keep this side-to-side crunch going for at least five to 10 times on each side. Stand from the squat, and give your legs a short break, then return for the next set. Give yourself at least

three to five sets of this combo movement.

For variation, you can add light hand weights, or stand from the squat if it becomes too much to hold while you are crunching.

This move can be done on its own, as it is targeting multiple areas, but also great to add into a lower body/core routine.

Whatever you choose, just do it. You'll be glad you did when you are done.



Station transportation

While the International Space Station orbits the Earth, NASA is working on new ways to send crews back and forth. NASA's Space Shuttle program was retired in 2011; since then, Russia's Soyuz spacecraft has been delivering astronauts to the station.

This year, Boeing plans to launch its CST-100 Starliner, and SpaceX will test its Crew Dragon. Soon these spacecraft will

carry crews of four people to and from the space station, which means astronauts will be able to do more research.

Science experiments, food and supplies are sent to the space station on four cargo spacecraft: the U.S.'s Orbital ATK Cygnus and SpaceX

Sixty years ago this month, President Dwight D. Eisenhower signed legislation establishing the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, or NASA. Since then, NASA has sent astronauts to the moon, to float outside spacecraft in outer space, and to live on the International Space Station (ISS). Its explorations of distant planets such as Mars and Saturn have given scientists worlds of new information to analyze.



The Mini Page celebrates this anniversary with an issue about what NASA has in store in the coming months.

InSight

At 4:05 a.m. Pacific time on May 5, NASA's InSight (Interior Exploration using Seismic Investigations, Geodesy and Heat Transport) spacecraft launched from Vandenberg Air Force Base in California.

When InSight's lander arrives on Mars in November, it will explore the "red planet" to find out more about its interior, or inside.

Scientists have detected volcanoes on Mars, but they don't


know if the planet experiences Marsquakes. InSight will look for seismic, or shaking, activity. A heat probe will move off the InSight lander and record temperatures. Other instruments will record wind and pressure and the properties, or qualities, of Mars' crust, mantle and core.

Radio science instruments will be able to measure Mars' core by determining how the sun affects the planet's orbit.

The data from InSight's mission will help scientists better understand how the other rocky planets in our solar system were first formed.

Parker Solar Probe

Later this month, NASA will launch the Parker Solar Probe, which will fly closer to the sun than any spacecraft ever has. Over the next seven years, Parker will complete seven "flybys" of Venus, using that planet's gravity to pull it closer to the sun.

Parker will enter the sun's corona, or atmosphere, and get within 3.8 million miles of the star. The spacecraft will have to withstand intense radiation and temperatures up to 2,500 degrees Fahrenheit.

As Parker orbits the sun, its instruments will gather data about how energy and heat move through the corona and why solar winds and solar energy particles change speed.

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July is Ice Cream Month

I've made ice cream lots of times. And every time, I've learned the same lesson: Start the day before you want it to be done.

I think I've lectured you poor innocent readers about this issue almost annually for a decade. And my road to this most recent personal hell was paved with good intentions: I got the ingredients the day before. I came home and made a plan. I read through my recipes, scoffing at their suggested times "three hours," "five hours," "two hours and 50 minutes." Pffft. Lies. All lies.

No-Churn Watermelon Ice Cream Slices

Total time: 3 hours, 50 minutes; active time: 30 minutes; serves 6-10

- One 4- to 5-pound mini seedless watermelon
- One 14-ounce can sweetened condensed milk
- Pinch fine salt
- 2 cups heavy cream, chilled

Cut a thin slice off the top of the watermelon, just enough to show the pink of the inside flesh. Stand the watermelon upright vertically in a large bowl. Place an immersion blender into the cut part at the top of the watermelon and puree the flesh, moving the blender in and around, following the shape of the inside of the watermelon. Be careful not to cut through the sides or bottom of the watermelon rind. Pour out the juice and reserve 1 cup for the ice cream; save the rest for another use. Using a spoon, scoop out any remaining red watermelon flesh so you have a smooth white interior (this is important so the melon freezes properly). Make sure there is no juice remaining inside and pat dry with a paper towel. Freeze the watermelon while you make the ice cream. Whisk together the condensed milk, salt and reserved watermelon juice in a large bowl and set aside. Whip the heavy cream in a

large bowl with an electric mixer on medium-high speed until firm peaks form, about 2 minutes. Fold about one-half of the whipped cream into the condensed milk mixture with a rubber spatula until combined, then fold the lightened mixture into the remaining whipped cream until well blended. Pour the mixture into the frozen watermelon, filling it all the way to the top. Cover with plastic wrap and freeze until solid, 3 hours and up to overnight. If frozen overnight, let the watermelon thaw for about 2 hours in the refrigerator before serving. Place the watermelon cut-side down on a cutting board and halve lengthwise with a long chef's knife. Cut each half lengthwise into 3 wedges.

Ice Cream Bombe

Total time: 1 hour, 15 minutes; prep time: 15 min; inactive time: 1 hour; serves 8

- 2 pints mango sorbet, softened
- 1½ pints good raspberry sorbet, softened
- 1 pint no-churn strawberry ice cream, recipe follows

Freeze an 8-inch bowl. When it's cold, place the mango sorbet in the bowl and press it against the sides of the bowl. If you have a 6½-inch bowl the same shape as the 8-inch bowl (such as from a set of nesting bowls), cover it with plastic wrap and press it into the sorbet to make the layer even. Freeze the sorbet for 30 minutes or until firm. Remove the 6½-inch bowl. Spread an even layer of softened raspberry sorbet

on top of the mango sorbet (a 4½-inch nesting bowl wrapped in plastic wrap helps with this) and freeze for another 30 minutes or until firm. Remove the 4½ inch bowl. Finally, spoon in enough softened strawberry ice cream to fill the bowl. Freeze until hard. To unmold, dip the bowl up to the rim in warm water. Run a knife around the edge to loosen the bombe and unmold upside down onto a flat plate. You may need to run a flexible metal spatula along the edge of the bombe to release it. Freeze until ready to serve. Serve in wedges.

No-Churn Strawberry Ice Cream

Total time: 5 hours, 25 minutes; prep time: 15 minutes; makes 16 1-cup servings

- 1 pound frozen strawberries, thawed at room temperature for 10 minutes
- One (14-ounce) can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- Pinch fine salt
- 2 cups heavy cream, cold


Freeze a 9-by-5-by-3-inch metal loaf pan. Pulse strawberries in a food processor until you achieve pea-size chunks. Add the condensed milk, vanilla and salt. Pulse to combine; remove to a medium bowl and set aside. Whip the cream with a mixer on medium-high speed until firm peaks form, about 2 minutes. Fold about 1 cup of the whipped cream into the strawberry mixture with a rubber spatula until combined, then fold the lightened

mixture into the whipped cream until well blended. Pour into prepared loaf pan and freeze, covered, until thick and creamy, like

soft-serve, about 2 hours. Swirl in any desired mix-ins with a spoon. Continue to freeze, covered, until solid and scoopable, about 3 hours

more.

Local farmers markets open for business

Farmers markets are open for business all across Florida as the summer months offer opportunities to sell produce that is fresh and grown locally.

In Okaloosa County, we have two farmers markets that are supported by the local Okaloosa County Extension Office. One is the Crestview Farmers Market at Spanish Trail Park, 205 Stillwell Ave. It operates from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday. The second location is the Okaloosa County Farmers Market at 1954 Lewis Turner Boulevard, Fort Walton Beach. Operation hours are 7 a.m. to 1 p.m. Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

Our Agriculture Agent, Jennifer Bearden, can give growers certificates that will allow them to sell their locally grown produce at both markets.

Produce that is available now includes bell peppers, blueberries, cantaloupe, cucumber, eggplant, okra, southern peas, summer squash, sweet corn, tomato and watermelon. Visit <https://wfrec.ifas.ufl.edu/panhandle-produce-pointers/harvest-calendar> to view a complete listing of local produce availability. For best selection, shop early in the day and have a conversation with your grower. In many cases, if you want

larger quantities they can accommodate.

Many people prefer to preserve or can their produce to extend the season and have locally grown produce all year long. If you decide to preserve, use the latest United State Department of Agriculture recommendations that can be found here: <https://nchfp.uga.edu/>. This site is the National Center for Home Food Preservation and is supported by the University of Georgia. All current recommendations for preserving food may be found on this site.

Try some these recipes that feature using fresh produce:

Tomatoes

Select tomatoes that are

firm to the touch. Tomatoes will continue to ripen once picked. Store unwashed out of direct sunlight. It is best to not refrigerate tomatoes for best flavor.

Tomato and Cucumber Salad

- 2 large tomatoes, diced
- 2 large cucumbers, diced
- 1 cup diced green pepper
- ¼ cup chopped green onion
- Italian salad dressing to taste
- Fresh basil leaves

Directions: Mix all vegetables in bowl. Drizzle salad over salad to taste. Chill for one hour before serving.

Zucchini Quiche


- One can of refrigerator crescent rolls
- 2 tbsp. of brown spicy mustard
- 4 cups of thinly sliced Zucchini
- 1 tbsp. of olive oil or other oil for sautéing
- ½ onion minced
- ½ tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. pepper
- ¼ tsp. garlic powder
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 1 cup of shredded cheese (cheddar or mozzarella)
- Fresh herbs: 2 or 3 leaves of basil, parsley or chives (may use dried if not available)

Directions: Heat oven to 375 degrees. In a skillet, cook zucchini and onion in

olive oil until tender (about 10 minutes). Stir in herbs and spices. Blend in eggs and cheese.

Separate dough into triangles. Place in ungreased 11-inch quiche pan or 10 inch pie pan. Press over the bottoms and up the sides to form crust. Spread crust with mustard. Pour vegetable mixture evenly into crust. Bake for 18 – 20 minutes or until knife inserted in the center comes out clean. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.



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


Police investigation continues

CRESTVIEW — Mayor David Cadle said May 31 that he hoped to wrap up an internal investigation of former Police Chief Tony Taylor within a week, but the report is still not complete.

“I am still finalizing it,” Cadle said Tuesday. “There were some things we wanted to add, but there’s another part of the investigation that is still

continuing and that’s held me up a little bit.”

Cadle said he might be able to release more information soon, but it may not be everything. He said he will continue to release information as it becomes available.

The mayor’s office has been looking into a series of issues since early May on how Taylor

applied city and/or department regulations and protocols.

Taylor, who had been chief since 2012, was placed on paid administrative leave May 9 and officially dismissed June 8. Before his dismissal, the mayor’s office had shared little information on the reasoning behind the investigation.

After Taylor was fired, Cadle cited allegations of “favoritism, rule inconsistency and unfavorable shift scheduling” by more than half of the Police

Department’s staff, which caused a “decrease in morale.”

A day after Taylor was placed on leave, three officers — Cristina Dawson, Investigator Shawn Temple and K-9 officer Jay Seals — also were placed on leave. According to Crestview Police Department spokesman Brian Hughes, the investigations are not related.

“It is an internal investigation and it’s still ongoing,” Hughes said of the officers who remain on leave. “It’s not

connected with the mayor’s investigation. There are no decisions made yet.”

Taylor and the three officers share the same attorney, Tiffany Cruz. Cruz told the Daily News in June that the city’s actions were taken in retaliation for Taylor, Temple and Seals backing Dawson, who reported “discriminatory harassment” in the department.

Cruz was out of the office Tuesday and unavailable for comment.

Artist earns Romania stay, museum exhibit

The experience taught her the value of perseverance, she said.

“This was my first juried artist’s residency to be accepted to. I’ve entered several, and been denied by some. But I kept entering. This experience showed me to keep pushing forward and never giving up.

“Learning is such an opportunity and I am hoping to find a new residency every year. Whether it is a one-day class, a weekend class or a month-long class, I enrich my life’s journey. This particular experience had a few bumps along the way that was totally overshadowed by learning new artistic techniques and making new lifelong friendships. I am very blessed and will continue the pursuit of creating art for my supporters and collectors,” Lala said.

While she loves to travel and it informs her work, Lala said it was only the second time she’d been to Romania.

“I had only been to Bucharest for one day as a part of a river cruise in 2010. This trip opened my eyes to so much more of the Romanian culture,” she said.

The mostly rural settings lent a full immersion-type of experience to her, from day one. She said there were sights such as horses and buggies, laundry, sheep herders, “even little old ladies selling fresh bread out of their homes, a total different culture than I was accustomed to.”

The residency’s structure had the artists sketch two days a week in the studio and paint live models.

Man on probation for child pornography

Ben Kimbrough’s 10-year probationary period includes numerous restrictions

BAKER — A 75-year-old man charged last year with producing and possessing child pornography after sexual images of a young family member were found on his computer has been sentenced to 10 years of tightly regulated probation after entering a no contest plea, according to Okaloosa County Circuit Court records.

Ben Wilkerson Kimbrough of Baker entered the plea June 21, and sentencing documents signed by Judge Michael Flowers were filed on July 3, court records show.

Specifically, Kimbrough pleaded no contest to four counts of possession of obscene material and possession of a photo of a sexual performance by a child.

Kimbrough had been fired from his position as an engineer at Eglin Air Force Base in August 2016 after authorities discovered he was using his government computer to search for “exploitative” images, according to an Okaloosa County Sheriff’s Office arrest report filed at the time. Search terms included “prepubescent,” which he searched for 930 times, “pedophile” and “disk clean up,” the report said.

In the course of an Air Force investigation, Kimbrough admitted to taking nude photos of a young female family member. He agreed to allow federal agents to search his computer, and the images found there led to the issuance of a federal search warrant of his home in Baker.

around this area.”

If an Eden resident says one morning he or she is headed out to work—after having retired 20 years ago—or visiting a family member long since passed, Eden staff will gently redirect him or her, Woods said.

“Okay, but let’s go get some breakfast, first,” Woods said.

While assisted living residents are free to come and go as they please, the memory care unit has limited access. However, Eden staff still strives to provide those residents with ample communication, nutrition, indoor and outdoor exercise, and leisure.

Finally, when it comes to

end-of-life care, Eden offers hospice, again requiring no move to a new facility.

Woods will be conducting another community update July 26 at Samuel’s Roadhouse, 114 John King Road in Crestview. Contact Woods at 417-0103 or alan@livingateden.com for time and to RSVP.

“At the last one, we hoped to have six to eight people there,” Woods said. “We had 25. It was a packed house. We had a pharmacist there, so this next update I’m going to focus on aging in place. I’m going to have home health there, physical and occupational therapy and someone from hospice.”

Investigators found four photos of the child, which all appeared to be taken on the same day, the report said.

Kimbrough told a sheriff's investigator he had entered the bathroom when the child was taking a bath and took photos of her, including close-ups of her genitals.

Kimbrough also admitted going back and looking at the photos "once or twice," the report said.

Kimbrough was charged with four counts of producing photographs of a sexual

performance by a child and four counts of possession of those photos.

In addition to routine terms of probation — such as remaining in a specified place, not associating with criminals, and not possessing a firearm — Kimbrough's probation includes a number of special provisions related to his crimes.

Kimbrough's whereabouts will be electronically monitored and he cannot have any contact, direct or indirect, with victims of his crimes or other minors.

He also is subject to a 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. curfew, with those hours subject to adjustment if future situations warrant the change. He also is prohibited from

living within 1,000 feet of schools, child care facilities or other places where children congregate.

Also according to court documents, Kimbrough can't volunteer or work for pay at any place where children congregate. He is also subject to an annual polygraph examination, and he cannot have a post office box.

Under the terms of the judge's order, Kimbrough was notified that his probation could be modified or rescinded. Also under the order, Kimbrough was notified that if he violates any of the terms of his probation, he is subject to arrest and the possibility of having his probation revoked.

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
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
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
