## Speed limit raised on portion of U.S. Highway 90

CRESTVIEW — The speed limit now is higher on U.S. Highway 90 in Crestview between Lee Farm Boulevard and State Road 4.

The limit rose from 45 to 55 mph after an area resident contacted the The Florida Department of Transportation with concerns, according to FDOT Public Information Specialist Tanya Branton. Larry Woolley, owner of

Woolley Consignments and Surplus on West James Lee Boulevard, has watched the changes made on U.S. 90 since 1985.

"It was 55 out here for years and years...it's really hard to drive 45 out there," Woolley said.

FDOT changed the speed limit after completing a speed study in the area and made recommendations. Branton said the study looked at different factors like crashes and road features. Another factor observed

during this study was the 85th percentile speed. This part of the study looked at the speed that 85 percent of vehicles traveled at or under, which gave the department an idea of what the speed limit should be.

"All of these factors were considered in the decision to raise the speed to 55 mph making it more consistent and predictable throughout SR10/US90," Branton said in an email.

The new speed limits signs already have been placed alongside the highway.

## Veteran's expo attracts over 100 area job seekers

CRESTVIEW — Veterans, active duty military members, and the public were all welcome at the North Okaloosa Career Fair and Veteran's Expo Thursday, July 19 in the Crestview Community Center.

CareerSource Okaloosa Walton hosted the expo, which featured more than just employers. Veteran service programs like the Florida Department of Veteran's Affairs and various colleges and school programs occupied some of the 60 tables set up at the event.

Liz Westby headed up the event and enjoys putting together the expo in Crestview.

"The community just really gets behind this," Westby said.

As of May 2018, the unemployment rate for the Crestview, Fort Walton Beach and Destin area was over 2 percent, according to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics. Although unemployment is lower than the nation's rate of 4 percent, Westby said the expos succeed because people try to find jobs better suited for their qualifications.

"Most people we are finding that are coming through...are highly qualified but were underemployed," Westby said.

Chris Martin, a soldier nearing his transition next month, walked around the room in his light blue, button-down and black slacks. He spent time introducing himself to the various employers and getting information.

Martin was among a few

## 'Convenience is key'

**Courthouse construction on schedule to conclude in less than two weeks**

CRESTVIEW — In downtown Crestview, the construction phase for the new courthouse is expected to be finished by the end of July after weather delays.

The Okaloosa County Courthouse on Main Street is set to be completed by July 31, according to Christopher Saul, the Okaloosa County Public Information Officer.

Ajax Building Corporation has been heading up the construction of the courthouse. Saul said landscaping and irrigation are the current focal point.

Rain caused delays during construction, which pushed back the completion date

from the beginning of July to the end.

Although construction may be finished by the end of July, Saul said that it will be October before the courthouse is fully operational.

Between now and then, public works will address a list of damages that took place during construction and finalize items like plumbing and electrical work. Administration is expected to be moved into the building by October, according to Saul.

The courthouse, 50 percent larger than the original, is not alone on Main Street. Businesses line the road around the building.

Kareca Wright, who owns Standard Hair Salon, can watch the construction happening right across the street as she works.

"It looks a whole lot better than what was there before," Wright said. "I feel good about it. It's going to look

good down on this end."

One door down, Lorine Johnson, owner of Granny's Attic, sits down in front of her sewing machine and layers of polka dotted fabric. She isn't bothered by the construction happening directly in front of her business.

"It makes no difference whatever to me....I keep my

back to it most of the time anyhow because I'm sitting at a machine," Johnson said.

Along with the retail and food businesses on Main Street, the area houses several law firms, whose staff has been driving to the Courthouse Annex Extension in Fort Walton Beach during the construction.

Brian Corlew, an attorney

at Chesser and Barr, looks forward to a short walk down the road and the possibility of more clientele seeing his office.

"Really, convenience is the key word for me," Corlew said. "After that, it comes down to the travel and everything else. It'll help the clients as well with some cost."

eight years of his life was serving in the U.S. Air Force. A graduate of Cal-Berkeley Engineering School, Myers first worked at Flight Test Station, Edwards AFB, for the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA), a predecessor of NASA. He was an engineering aide on the early X-1 and X-15 test programs.

One of the test pilots was astronaut and first man on the moon, Neil Armstrong. Myers was a skilled Air Force pilot, flying interceptor aircraft such as the F-102 in Thule, Greenland. Stateside, he flew the Air Force's fastest interceptor, the F-104. He patrolled the waters between Key West and Cuba during the Cuban Missile Crisis in President John F. Kennedy's years in office. Myers pulled a tour in Vietnam flying the O-1 forward air control aircraft. He served in Spain and at one time trained

Jordanian pilots. He flew functional check flights in the T-38, investigated aircraft accidents, and managed field testing of tactical intelligence gathering and distribution systems with the 4442nd Tactical Control Group and the USAF Tactical Air Warfare Center. Not only did he serve his country with distinction, Myers was a man who believed strongly in the word of God. He taught Bible study classes to fellow airmen in Vietnam and also while stationed in Greenland, in between flying interceptor runs against long-range Soviet bomber aircraft that tested our defenses. He taught Bible classes in the original Hebrew and Greek versions, a rarity, and was well respected by fellow parishioners for his biblical knowledge. He taught Sunday School at Crestview First Presbyterian Church for 35 years. "It's been a good experience. It's been very nerve-wracking," Martin said. "I have a lot of nervous days just thinking about the next job because I've been so used to the

Army, so used to having a job and guaranteed salary for 7 years, and now, I have to start a new career."

The expo brought in over 113 people searching for jobs and a total of 42 employers.

The Crestview Police Department was one of many government agencies that had a table at the expo featuring a sign-up sheet and application packets.

Brian Hughes, Public

Information Officer, said the department enjoys this particular expo because veterans and active duty military are previewed to the same structure of command as the police department.

"Military veterans already have that instilled in them," Hughes said. "They are just naturally used to going to the next person up the chain rather than getting all huffy and going to the boss if they have an issue."





## The summit - Finland, Russia and the US

Geography counts in diplomacy, as well as military and other more tangible occupations. The Helsinki summit between Presidents Vladimir Putin of Russia and Donald Trump of the United States has sparked controversy. As usual, context helps.

Reflecting location - bordering Russia, Finland traditionally encounters relations among larger nations, including war and Cold War along with diplomacy. President Ronald Reagan in 1988 spent three restful days in Helsinki before going to a summit meeting with President Mikhail Gorbachev of the Soviet Union.

In September 1990, President George H.W. Bush met with Gorbachev in Helsinki, following up an earlier meeting in Malta. Iraq had just invaded Kuwait, and Bush wanted to use Moscow's considerable influence to reverse that armed aggression. At the time, there were several thousand Soviet military advisers in the Mideast.

Nations invading other sovereign nations is unusual since World War II. Ultimately, a broad international coalition led by the U.S., and fully authorized by the United Nations, liberated Kuwait. The Soviet Union supported the effort. Washington and Moscow also

were allies in 1956, in the UN and elsewhere, in the assertive - and successful - leadership of President Dwight D. Eisenhower to thwart the joint British-French-Israeli military attack on Egypt.

Egypt's nationalist President Gamal Nasser's seizure of the Suez Canal prompted that invasion. This is another example of nations violating national boundaries. Britain spearheaded the effort to return to the methods of 19th century imperialism. Ike demonstrated forcefully that the world had gone beyond tolerating that behavior.

In 1997, President Bill Clinton met with President Boris Yeltsin in Helsinki. The encounter further underscored Finland's role as useful meeting ground for principal leaders of the Cold War superpowers.

Beyond these two nuclear weapons powers, in 1992 the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe (CSCE) convened in Helsinki. This inclusive diplomatic body had grown to 52 nations, focused on promoting stability and transparency among the European nations.

In 1975, the 35 nations comprising the CSCE signed the important Helsinki Accords to confirm the legitimacy of Europe's national borders. This was a major diplomatic victory for the Soviet Union, as well as worthwhile generally for stability.

The Trump administration overall has been consistent in giving emphasis to secure borders for Finland and the Baltic States, traditional targets of

Russian aggression. "We are with you, we stand with you on behalf of freedom." Vice President Mike Pence made that statement in July 2017 in Estonia, the first stop on a trip that included Georgia and Montenegro, also pressured by Russia.

President Sauli Niinistö of Finland visited the White House in 2017. On April 3 2018, the United States hosted a Baltic Summit, underscoring commitment to Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.

In 1940, the Soviet Union annexed the Baltic States, which had achieved independence in 1918. The U.S. government continued to fly the Baltic States' flags throughout that occupation. Exile groups from the Baltics become influential in the United States, and elsewhere. All three nations became NATO members in March 2004.

During the Cold War, the Finns accommodated Moscow but were never under direct Soviet control. The Russo-Finnish War of 1939-1940 ended through negotiation, not conquest. This greatly embarrassed Soviet leader Joseph Stalin and the Red Army, which had anticipated easy victory. Lethal highly trained Finnish ski troops inflicted enormous Soviet military casualties.

The two prima donnas who just met in Helsinki proved unworthy of this important history.

Credit the Finns for being helpful - and tough.

Below is a question-and-answer session with Mauldin and his mother, Karen Mauldin. An interview with Luttrell will be published in a later News Bulletin issue.

**How did you prepare for this year's Olympics?**

**HARRISON:** I trained well. I worked out at the high school track after school and on Saturdays at Special Olympics track practice, at the Twin Hills track, and the treadmill in my bedroom.

**What's your favorite part of the games?**

**H:** I don't know what I would label as my favorite. I just enjoyed my whole trip. It was my first ever plane ride. I liked the weather in Washington. I really liked the color of the track (purple) and the surface. I liked hanging out with all the good people there. These are only a few examples of why the trip was a blast.

**Do you intend to compete next year?**

**H:** Of course. Hopefully I'm able to run a half-marathon at the state games. I also hope to go to the next USA Games in four years and run the half-marathon.

**What do you like to do in your spare time?**

**H:** Listen to music, look up videos of people conducting classical music and car videos. I like to run in my leisure time as well. I like to tell jokes. I am also interested in researching genealogy and ancestry.

**What did you do to celebrate your wins?**

**H:** I shook my competitors' hands and held their hands up on the podium. I also went out for a steak dinner with my mom and granny when I got home.

**How long has your son been a runner?**

been running since the fifth grade, when he was almost 12 years old. He is now 19 years old.

**What is the best part of the games for you?**

**K:** Watching my son compete on a national level was amazing. I enjoyed watching the track members of Team Florida compete, but the best part was being there in person with my family to see him compete. He set his personal record for time in all of his events. Watching how happy he was with his team and making new friends, even his competitors, was just a joy. He told us that although the medals are great, it is better to respect others than to medal. He is a true inspiration!

Also, my husband and I coach Special Olympics track here in Crestview, so both as a mother and a coach, I am elated! We told him that the experience of attending the games is the great part. If he medaled, that would be the icing on the cake (or the butter on the bread — my mother-in-law's

words, since he doesn't eat sweets). He came home with three medals, two gold and a bronze, which far exceed any expectations. His fourth place ribbon was probably the most exciting out of all of them because of the finish of the race. Our whole family couldn't be more proud!

**How many family members were able to attend the games?**

**K:** Aside from myself, my family members that attended were my husband, Rodney, my mother-in-law, Doris Mauldin, our other children, Danielle Mauldin, Travis Polk, and Taylor Scott, and our grandchildren, Amoree Mauldin and Titus Scott, all of whom are just as proud of Harrison and what he accomplished.

**How has his training changed him?**

**K:** His training hasn't really changed him. He just likes to run and has a wonderful attitude, not just towards any personal goals, but towards his fellow athletes as well. He's very into

The state decides who will attend USA Games and they see the same things in him that we do.

**Is he going to compete again at the next Special Olympics?**


