# 'Volleyball exists everywhere you go'

**A new volleyball program is coming to Crestview**

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CRESTVIEW — After watching his daughter play volleyball in Crestview for several years, Joe Faulk, founder of the Okaloosa-Walton Volleyball Academy (OWVA), envisioned the potential reach a volleyball program would have in our community.

"We're talking about 10,000 children that could be underserved, and we just thought it was a great opportunity," Faulk said.

Faulk—a financial planner by trade—said the process to start this program was like planning a small business.

The difficulty came when he had to find staff that could mirror his enthusiasm.

Not wanting to coach himself, Faulk said he put together a team of coaches by reaching out to roughly 80 candidates and telling them about his vision.

"I was in a very simple position to recognize a need and know how to find smart people to make things happen for me because I can't make that part happen," Faulk said.

The club currently has five coaches in charge of five teams and is looking to have nine players per team.

Mini Maestas, the coach for the 17-year-old age group, enjoys coaching travel teams and wants every girl on her team to receive a college scholarship.

"It's a lot of time, but to me, I love the sense of

camaraderie," she said. "You become a family with these other girls on your team."

The coach for the 15-year-old team, Jessika Jackson, was born in Crestview but moved to Freeport as a youth. She said she was the first girl from Freeport High School to receive a college volleyball scholarship to what is now Pensacola State College.

Born and raised in a small community, Jackson believes travel volleyball is important for girls wanting to play in college.

"It's these small-town girls that need an opportunity to see that there's a whole world out there," Jackson said. "Volleyball exists everywhere you go, different atmospheres, different coaches, and different styles. But, at the end of the day, we all play the same way."

Part of Faulk's vision is to have a program that reaches more children in the community like special needs children.

"Once we have established the volleyball program as a reliable entity here, we could expand into basketball, softball, indoor soccer, field hockey...and that should not be limited to the most gifted athletes that we have in this city," Faulk said.

Before beginning a special needs program, Faulk wants to find the right coach for this particular group of kids and said he has reached out to a few candidates that could be a good fit for this position.

"The timing of that program will really depend on getting the right person to lead that group," Faulk said.

OWVA plans to host open gyms in August and have try-outs in October.

## Crestview celebrates first 'Bark Park' at groundbreaking ceremony

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CRESTVIEW — Locals of Crestview gathered with their canine companions Monday at Twin Hills Park where the city's first dog park will be located.

The groundbreaking ceremony for the new Bark Park began with a quick word from Mayor David Cadle and then, from the woman behind it all, April Meier.

Meier said she got

involved with the process a few years ago after she found out the city couldn't pay for the dog park.

"I asked if we could raise funds for it, and we started getting funds coming in," Meier said. "So, here we are today getting ready to break ground."

Along with raising money, Meier also works with the Crestview's Community Redevelopment Agency in designing the layout of the dog park, researching about other dog parks in Florida and other states, and finding

companies that will donate work time.

The dog park will feature a fenced-in area with sections for small and large dog breeds as well as lighting for people who want to bring their dogs to the park

in the evening, Meier said. The fence will remain locked with swipe-card access only, which will be available for purchase on the city's website or at Meier's store,

## Alcohol applications approved for nonprofits

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CRESTVIEW — Nonprofit organizations can now apply to serve alcohol at events on Main Street after the city council unanimously approved the application documents during Monday's special meeting.

The applications include the event form, Main Street alcohol permit, requests for police services and an insurance agreement.

"This has actually been in place for two years, but now we have the applications," City Clerk Elizabeth Roy said.

Nonprofit organizations can begin the application process as soon as they are up on the city website, but applications must be complete three weeks before the next council meeting to give the council members enough time to review the documents, according to city officials.

The council unanimously approved the documents with two members absent from the meeting.


City council meetings are held at city hall, 198 Wilson St. every month on the second and fourth Monday.



## Colonel Cornelius Francis McGillicuddy Jr

Colonel Cornelius Francis McGillicuddy Jr., U.S. Army, Retired died Saturday, July 14, 2018 at Fort Walton Hospital in Fort Walton Beach, Florida. He was 86 years old.

Cornelius, or best known as Neil to family and friends, was born January 16, 1932 in Boston, Massachusetts to Cornelius Francis McGillicuddy Sr. and Margaret McGillicuddy (nee O'Connor). Neil was their second son and number two of six children. He grew up in a loving home, worked as a paperboy, was an altar boy in the Catholic Church, graduated from Mission High School in 1949 and enlisted in the United States Army on February 25, 1952. Colonel McGillicuddy was singled out for exceptional performance during basic military training and was selected for Officer Candidate School where he earned his commission in March 1953. His first assignment was to Korea where he served for two years. Ultimately, Neil was a master parachutist,



a senior aviator and completed two tours of duty in Vietnam from 1966-1967 and 1971-1972, where he served as an Aviation Company Commander and Aviation Battalion Commander respectively. He was a graduate of the Infantry Officer Advanced Course, Command and General Staff College, Fixed Wing Aviator Course, Rotary Wing Qualification Course and the Naval War College and he was inducted into the Officer Candidate School Hall of Fame. He was a highly decorated combat veteran and earned the Distinguished Flying Cross with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters and 38 Air Medals with multiple citations for gallantry in action.

Colonel McGillicuddy retired from the U.S. Army in March 1983 while assigned to Fort Rucker AL as the Program Manager for the Army's newest helicopter the Black Hawk. Colonel McGillicuddy earned a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Nebraska at Omaha and a Masters Degree in International Affairs from Georgetown University.

After his successful 31 years serving our nation, Neil went to work for Vinnell Corporation in Saudi Arabia from 1984 to 1987. Neil married Betty Jean Wheeler in 1987 and retired to Niceville, Florida. Neil was a scratch golfer with seven holes-in-one, he volunteered for the Florida State Golf Association and worked at Jackson-Hewitt during tax season. Neil was eternally optimistic and was always full of life and energy. He was consistently upbeat and always had a story to tell.

Pawsitively Scrumptious, on James Lee Boulevard. Currently, the fee for the card will be \$25 for city residents and \$35 for anyone outside the city limits.



The families have owned homes here since the 1950s, and vacationed here as far back as the 1920s. One of her daughters was born in Panama City, while she and her husband were stationed in the Air Force, and all of their children and



grandchildren have spent every summer of their lives here.

Whether with friends she made on the beach, those she came to know through cooking classes or at the dog park, or other dual homeowners she befriended over the years, Nancy valued those relationships and kept them fresh.

Nancy is survived by her husband Philip Zeidman, a Washington

lawyer; by their daughter Betsy and Betsy's daughter, Ruby of Washington; and by their daughter and son-in-law, Jennifer and Gene Bloch and their children Anna and John of New York City.

Their only son, John, fell ill while in China and tragically died in 1982. In his memory, Nancy and Philip established the John Fisher Zeidman Chinese Studies program at Sidwell Friends School. 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
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**AmeriCorps NWF Environmental Stewards  
A Hidden GEM in our Local Community**

On a sunny afternoon in Northwest Florida, a group of young AmeriCorps members works with Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (CBA) staff to unload a pile of recycled oyster shells gathered together in marine-grade mesh bags. Finishing a living shoreline at a homeowner site along the Choctawhatchee Bay, the team wades out into the warm shallows to build the long reef breakwaters along the shore. Working steadily, they laugh and chat while passing oyster shell bags from hand to hand, placing each one carefully along the muddy bay bottom to protect the edge of the property and create new homes for baby oysters. With every day of their service, the AmeriCorps Northwest Florida (NWF) Environmental Stewards are improving water quality, restoring habitat, and inspiring the next generation of water stewards.

The same day that part of the AmeriCorps team worked on the reef breakwater at the site, another group taught students about the unique marsh species that improves water quality while naturally stabilizing the shoreline: Smooth Cordgrass. Working from a CBA curriculum, the members deliver science lessons on core STEM concepts, teach each child to raise his or her own smooth cordgrass plant, and eventually meet the schools at a real restoration site along the bay to showcase first-hand habitat improvement and help the students install the grasses they have raised themselves. In the 2017-2018 year, over 1800 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders took a pre- and post-test to measure what they had learned. 90% made critical gains in their understanding of our watershed, a direct impact made by the AmeriCorps members and CBA.

In the same year, the team built 3.5 acres of oyster reef breakwaters and restored an additional 15.5 acres within our community through the removal of an invasive species called tiki trees before local state parks conduct prescribed burns. Since 2014, AmeriCorps NWF Environmental Stewards have built or restored over 100 acres of coastal habitat.

In addition to their restoration and education goals, AmeriCorps inspires volunteers from around Okaloosa and Walton Counties, as well as alternative spring breakers to make a difference. In 2017-2018 alone, they worked with over 550 volunteers who served 1420 hours on reef building, coastal clean-ups, and outreach events.

The AmeriCorps NWF Environmental Stewards are funded through the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) and overseen by Volunteer Florida, the lead agency

for volunteerism and national service in Florida. Volunteer Florida is Florida's lead agency for volunteerism and national service, administering more than \$32 million in federal, state, and local funding to deliver high-impact national service and volunteer programs in Florida. Volunteer Florida promotes and encourages volunteerism to meet critical needs across the state. Volunteer Florida also serves as Florida's lead agency for volunteers and donations before, during, and after disasters. Though most AmeriCorps programs across the United States have one central focus, this chapter is unique because each year members strive to both educate young students about their local ecosystems as well as improve that habitat through living shorelines and invasive species removal.

This chapter of AmeriCorps has been a part of the national network of service programs since 1996. As a whole, AmeriCorps commits time to address critical community needs like increasing academic achievement, mentoring youth, fighting poverty, sustaining national parks, preparing for disasters, and more. More than 75,000 Americans participate in the program each year. Over the course of their service, the full-time members complete 1720 hours and receive a living stipend as well as an education award of over \$5000, which can be used towards paying existing student loans or enrolling in future studies.

Jamie Hajduk, who served in AmeriCorps for two years, says, "While all of this work is going on, something else is happening. I've gained memories and experience that will last a lifetime. I made great friendships and we grew together as individuals. Not just coworkers, but as a team trying to accomplish an important goal. It may be a year of a person's life, but the experiences and memories made will last a lifetime."

The Triumph board voted unanimously to support \$56





In a private ceremony, Marie will be interred with her husband, parents and grandmother at Arlington Cemetery in Upper Darby, PA.



upon obtaining more than \$75 million now being sought from city, county, state and federal sources and \$59 million in commitments from private companies. Triumph's funds will be paid over a period of years with each payment dependent upon jobs created and sustained.

The next step for the Pensacola and Whiting projects is agreement on a term sheet that will stipulate the obligations of all funding partners and include performance requirements and a "claw back" that would allow Triumph to reclaim its funds if jobs aren't created and sustained, as committed by the private and public sponsors of the proposals.

The board also acted to

approve term sheets and contracts for projects in Okaloosa, Wakulla and Bay counties.

The \$1.5 million grant with Okaloosa County, approved at the Board meeting, will extend water and sewer to the Shoal River Ranch area. Economic Development officials believe the region will be able to attract major employers the premier Shoal River mega-site east of Crestview along Interstate 10. The site improvements are expected to attract more

than 500 high-wage net new jobs within five years of site work completion.

Triumph Gulf Coast's board of directors is appointed by the Governor, Chief Financial Officer, Attorney General and presiding officers of the Legislature. The appointee are Allan Bense, Stan Connally Jr., Dr. Pam Dana, Chair Don Gaetz, Ben Lee, and Stephen Riggs IV and Jason Shoaf. All board meetings are public.

### Heat waves, dust storms and summer of '34

**'0**ld man depression, you are through, you done us wrong ..." — from "We're in the Money" as performed in the film

#### "Gold Diggers"

In the summer of 1934, the entire country was sweltering with record heat and suffering on multiple weather fronts. Three years of dust storms had culminated on an April Sunday when the country was hit by the worst dust storm in history. Dust bowl conditions prevailed from Minnesota to Texas, and food production declined significantly.

That summer saw 29 consecutive days with temperatures hovering in triple digits. By year's end, 75 percent of the country was suffering from drought conditions. In north Texas, the cicadas were too thirsty to chirp.

Americans were dying from both heat and hunger. In an attempt to bring relief to working class farmers, Congress passed the Smoot-Hawley Tariff Act, which raised taxes on 900 imports. But the import tariffs caused an international trade war and the global economy hit a wall. The Great Depression then picked up speed and spread beyond our borders.

What many may not remember is that before Smoot-Hawley, there was a tentative economic recovery afoot and unemployment numbers had temporarily leveled. The Tariff Act helped negate the fledgling recovery and thrust the U.S. and the world further into depression.

Tariff costs are almost always passed on to consumers. Makers of cars, appliances, and other products, when hit with tariffs, will often simply tack on that cost to consumers. The U.S. recently imposed 20% tariffs on the first 1.2 million washing machines imported this year. After that, there's a 50 percent tariff on machines, which is expected to take effect sometime in the fall; the United States imports over 3 million washing machines a year. The result? Between February and May of this year prices rose 16.4 percent, the largest three month increase in prices ever.

Washing machine sales are a small part of the overall economy. If the tariff talk stops here, consumers would hardly notice. But investors rightfully fear what could be next.

For example, if automobiles, which are a much larger chunk of U.S. GDP, are tariffed at that same 20 percent rate, it would likely raise the price of a new car by at least \$5,000. This would hit a major domestic industry hard at a time when sales are flagging.


These price increases will likely show up full force in the CPI data later this year and early next year, just as the corporate sugar high from the recent tax cuts is starting to wear off. Beyond the headlines, what worries me most as an investor is that this will almost certainly speed up inflation data at a time when the Federal Reserve has a hair trigger and is primed to raise interest rates. Raising rates into an already slowing economy tends to equal downturns. Rinse and repeat if you dare.

### 'We will bury you'

**S**ome old-timers will remember the quotation, "We will bury you," spoken by Nikita Khrushchev in a speech delivered in Poland in November 1956. He went on to say, "We can say with assurance that your grandchildren will live under Socialism." As American writer, Mark Twain, said to a reporter in response to a report Twain had died, "The reports of my death have been greatly exaggerated." The United States of America can say the same.

Considering the recent meeting of President Vladimir Putin of Russia and President Donald Trump of the U.S., it is good to point out there was a time when we had a really good reason to fear the Soviet Union. Alas, for them, that time has passed. Their threat to us on the world stage is largely in our minds. The Soviet Union that we feared has been gone since the Reagan years, more than 30 years ago. The old Soviet Union broke apart and left Russia standing alone. Yes, they have atomic capacity. However, the threat that was so real in the 1980s just isn't the same today.

Can I justify the statement of Russia not being a threat to the U.S.? I can.

Consider the following.

I was reminded of the reality of war with a speech by Rhet Butler, famous blockade runner of the South, in the academy award winning film, "Gone with the Wind." He said, "Wars are won not with bravery or words. Wars are won with cannons and ships, cannons that can deliver explosives great distances and ships that can blockade ports. There isn't a ship building or cannon factory in the entire south. The north is full of them."

Using that borrowed quotation as a base, let's take a look at the GDP (Gross Domestic Product) comparison between the U.S. and Russia. In short, let's compare the capacity for making war between the two countries.

Today, the U.S. still ranks first in the world in GDP, followed by the European Common Market and China. No, Russia doesn't rank fourth. Russia, is no. 12, not even in the top 10. Even Italy has a greater GDP than Russia. Lest you think the numbers are close, the U.S. has more than 14 times the GDP capacity of Russia. If we add the capacity of NATO to that of the U.S. we have 27 times the economic capacity of Russia.

Despite all the rhetoric and the current state of our national psyche, Russia doesn't want a war with us. So, what do they want? President Putin is intent on recouping the economic power of the old Soviet Union. That is what the incursion into Crimea four years ago was all about. He needed

to insure that Russia had a port on the Black Sea that would give him easy access to the Mediterranean and the many potential trading partners in Southern Europe, Africa, and the mid-east. Russia's involvement in the four-year war in Syria is about access to cheap oil to fuel his ships and factories.

What else does Russia want? They want the same thing that North Korea wants. They want status in the court of world opinion.

One could say with assurance that North Korea's venture into developing an atomic capacity and the intercontinental capability to deliver it to the U.S. was not about wanting a war with the U.S. Instead, it was about that same international spotlight Putin seeks. Proof? North Korea's GDP ranks in the second hundred, less than \$28 billion, of all the countries of the world. They don't want war with the U.S. They want the world to acknowledge their existence.

So, what did the recent meetings do for North Korea and Russia? It accomplished exactly what their leaders wanted it to. What did it do for the U.S.? I'll leave that judgement to history.

My opinion? Not much.

## Restaurants and diners look for ways to reduce the use of straws

It's time to talk about straws, specifically plastic straws and if and how we should try to use less of them. Seattle has gone single-use plastic straw and utensil free and now the city's 5,000 restaurants will use reusable or compostable straws, forks, knives and the like. The entire country of Belize (pop. 300,000) will do the same by 2019 as will Scotland and more countries to come.

Many other U.S. cities have pending legislation and on the Seacoast in New Hampshire and Maine, many local spots have taken on the "Hold the Straw" cause to try to chip away at the plastic pollution problem a little at a time. On my recent trip to Portsmouth, New Hampshire, I nerdishly brought my own stainless steel straw and used it at BRGR Bar and Ore Nell's Barbecue. Both of those restaurants will

provide them upon request as will many more. Starbucks announced they'll eliminate them by 2020.

According to Jambeck, J.R., R. Geyer, C. Wilcox, et. al 2015 Plastic waste inputs from land into the ocean. Science 13 Feb 2015:768-771 (cited on the Blue Ocean Society website), eight million tons of plastic enters the ocean every year. Conventional plastic is made from stuff that stays around a long, long time and is toxic to marine life and we use quite a bit of single-use plastic items in our day-to-day dining pursuits. Plastic straws are difficult to recycle because they drop through the sorting screens and are too small to separate. We also just toss them on the beach after finishing our Slurpees.

OK, so here's this thing, a plastic straw, something that harms the environment is something that we as relatively insignificant, individual human beings can do something about, but the Skip the Straw or Hold the Straw movement is not without controversy. I pause here for a heavy, internal "sigh" and it's not because there aren't great points to be made here, but because when I'm on social media going through them all, it's exhausting.

That said, there are some things to keep in mind on the Hold the Straw topic:

Straws are not the major culprit when it comes to plastics in our oceans — plastic fishing gear, utensils and balloons are said to be far worse — so it's important to recognize that the problem is much bigger than a straw. Still, the straw is manageable for us, it's a good, grassroots place for individuals to start and to help keep conservation in mind.

## Multiple partners collaborate to return endangered snake to Northwest Florida

TALLAHASSEE — Twenty federally threatened eastern indigo snakes have just been released in northern Florida at The Nature Conservancy's Apalachicola Bluffs and Ravines Preserve (ABRP) as part of a collaborative endeavor to return the native, nonvenomous apex predator to the region. The release of the snakes marks the second year in a row of the reintroduction effort, and furthers the long-term joint plan of multiple nonprofit, agency, and academia partners to restore this important species to the region.

The Nature Conservancy, Central Florida Zoo's Orianne Center for Indigo Conservation, Auburn University, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, The Orianne Society, Joseph W. Jones Ecological Research Center, Gulf Power, Southern Company through the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, and the Fish & Wildlife Foundation of Florida are dedicated to supporting the recovery of this species. The eastern indigo snake is the longest snake native to North America and an iconic and essential component of the now rare southern longleaf pine forest. The partners have worked together for decades to restore and manage the habitat required by the snake, and many other species, to make the release possible.

The eastern indigo serves a critical function to balance the wildlife community — it consumes a variety of small animals including both venomous and nonvenomous snakes. At over 8 feet long, this impressive snake often relies upon gopher tortoise burrows for shelter. The snakes were historically found throughout southern Georgia, Alabama, eastern Mississippi, and throughout Florida, though their range is now far more restricted.

Largely eliminated from northern Florida due to habitat loss and fragmentation, the indigo was last observed at ABRP in 1982, until 2017 when 12 snakes were released to the preserve. This year's annual release is part of a 10-year commitment to the species' recovery and continues a focus on establishment of healthy ecosystems through collaborative land, water and wildlife conservation efforts.

"We continue our dedication to creating a healthy, balanced, and restored longleaf pine ecosystem at the Conservancy's Apalachicola Bluffs and Ravines Preserve

and throughout the region, to encourage the recovery of the eastern indigo snake and support many other important plants and wildlife," said Temperance Morgan, Executive Director of The Nature Conservancy in Florida. "This second annual release results from the teamwork of an incredible group of partners."

ABRP is the only site in Florida currently designated for indigo reintroduction. The 6,295-acre nature preserve in northern Florida's Liberty County protects a large longleaf pine landscape carved by numerous seepage streams. Located in the Apalachicola Bay region along the Apalachicola River, the preserve lies in the center of one of five biological hotspots in North America. This treasure trove of species diversity is unique to Florida and home to a disproportionate number of imperiled species. The preserve is a living laboratory for the development of novel restoration techniques and

land management excellence, dedicated to natural community restoration, preservation of biodiversity, and education and training.

The longleaf pine ecosystem is one of the most diverse ecosystems globally, yet only 5 percent of this precious landscape remains. Over the past 30 years, The Nature Conservancy has employed science and technical expertise to develop the state-of-the-art groundcover restoration process that is now used by state, federal and private partners across the southeast to restore longleaf pine habitat. This restoration, combined with the Conservancy's robust prescribed fire program, has resulted in improved longleaf habitat on over 100,000 public and private north Florida acres in recent years.

Longleaf pine restoration is also a top priority at places like the Apalachicola National Forest and Torreya State Park — both neighbors

to ABRP and supported by the U.S. Forest Service and Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

Bred and raised by the Orianne Center for Indigo Conservation, the world's foremost comprehensive-based conservation organization dedicated to reptiles and amphibians, the 20 young snakes — 12 males and eight females — have most recently been living in outdoor enclosures that allowed them to be exposed to a more natural environment in preparation for their release. The snakes have been implanted with radio transmitters by the Central Florida Zoo's vet staff to allow for tracking and monitoring. Data is still being transmitted and collected from the snakes that were released last year to help inform recovery efforts.

"The Central Florida Zoo's Orianne Center for Indigo Conservation is proud to aid in the recovery of the eastern indigo snake in Florida," said Michelle Hoffman, Deputy Director of the Orianne Center for Indigo Conservation. "This second annual release of 20 animals puts us one step closer to achieving our goal of reestablishing this species in the Florida Panhandle."

The Orianne Society was integral in the creation of the indigo snake reintroduction team and continues to play a role in reintroducing eastern indigo snakes into places they no longer occur. The Society works to conserve critical ecosystems for imperiled reptiles and amphibians, using science, applied conservation, and education.

Auburn University's Alabama Natural Heritage Program continues to bring knowledge to planning reintroduction efforts and expertise in onsite monitoring of the reintroduced snakes. Using radio telemetry, researchers can track the animals' movements, habitat selection and behavior. One of the eastern indigo snakes that was released in 2017 traveled over a mile from where it was initially released. The monitoring program is supported in part by The Joseph W. Jones Ecological Research Center, whose mission is to understand, demonstrate and promote excellence in natural resource management and landscape conservation in the southeastern coastal plains.

The indigo reintroduction efforts are supported by grants and other funding, including a Conserve Wildlife Tag Grant from the Fish & Wildlife Foundation of Florida, funded through purchase of Conserve Wildlife Florida license plates and designated for conservation of non-game species and the habitats that support them.

"The release of 20 eastern indigo snakes is another step forward toward our goal of reestablishing this iconic imperiled species back into the habitats of northwest Florida," said Kipp Frohlich, the FWC's Director of Habitat and Species Conservation. "It's a testament to what can be accomplished working together with many committed conservation partners."

Additional funding to support the reintroduction has been provided by Gulf Power, and Southern Company through the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation.

"All of the pieces have come together — the protection and management of the landscape, the advancement of the animal husbandry expertise to raise young snakes for release, and the development of the science necessary to make good decisions and monitor project success. This project is an exceptional example of a strong partnership dedicated to success," said David Printiss, North Florida Program Manager of The Nature Conservancy in Florida. "The restoration is complete, the snakes are flourishing, and the monitoring program is well equipped and ready — all systems are go!"

Throughout the state, the Conservancy continues to pursue conservation projects and support policy that protects natural systems for people and wildlife. Next year's snake release will be scheduled for summer 2019 — stay tuned.



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# Single ingredient brews making a SMASH in beer world

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You may have noticed something called a "SMASH" beer on the shelf at your local beer store. While the name sounds aggressive, this type of beer tends to be more subdued than your average brew. The term is actually an acronym—S.M.A.S.H.—referring to beers containing a "single malt and single hop." Unlike most beers, which feature carefully-balanced and closely-guarded mixtures of various malted grain and hop types, SMASH beers highlight the unique qualities of an individual grain and hop paired, ideally, in simple harmony.

Achieving this balance is more difficult than one might suspect. Much like a plain omelet reveals the skill of a chef, since it contains only a few ingredients prepared simply, SMASH beers offer little cover for off-flavors or poor technique. For a

SMASH beer to achieve its aim, the choice of grain and hop variety must be made carefully and executed adeptly to showcase the qualities of each ingredient, both

individually and in combination. Alongside the growing trend toward clean and unadorned craft lagers, the SMASH beer seems to be a vehicle for some brewers to demonstrate mastery through simplicity.

Even the most basic pale ales and lagers

typically employ a few different grain and hop types to produce an array of style-appropriate flavors and aromas. Stouts and brown ales will use blends of malted and toasted grains to achieve complex colors and aromas, while others employ

wheat and oats to boost flavor and body. And until the relatively recent development of potent, multi-purpose hop strains, examples of commercial beers employing a single hop were incredibly rare. The use of different hops for bittering and aroma has been standard practice for years. The SMASH

beer pushes against these foundational assumptions of brewing, trading an entire chorus of ingredients for an unaccompanied duet between barley and hops.

There have been some recent local versions of this style, both relying on a simple pale barley malt as a base. Southern Tier makes its 2XSMASH beer with Mosaic hops while Genesee Brewing Company released a SMASH beer featuring Simcoe hops under its Genesee Brew House Pilot Batch label. But perhaps the most celebrated SMASH beer doesn't even bear this acronym on the label. Founders' Mosaic Promise combines Mosaic hops and Golden Promise malt from Scotland, producing a beer of considerable depth considering its simple recipe.

This week's recommendation: Mosaic Promise, a seasonal SMASH beer appearing on shelves by late July. Founders Brewing Company. 5.5 percent ABV. Grand Rapids, Michigan.

## Where You Live As Retiree Can Affect Financial Strategies

Upon retiring, many people relocate to enjoy a more favorable climate, or to be closer to grown children, or to live in an area they've visited and enjoyed. ### Florida Tick Surveillance for Livestock

Let's talk about a different sort of border patrol. This border patrol is critical to the health and well-being of our livestock.

In 1906, mounted patrol inspectors started riding the border between Mexico and the US as part of the Cattle Fever Tick Eradication

Program. These "tick riders" still patrol the 500-mile permanent quarantine zone along the Rio Grande today.

Why is this border patrol so important to the health of our livestock?

These inspectors are looking for ticks that cause cattle fever (babesiosis), along with other diseases such as anaplasmosis and equine piroplasmiasis.

Cattle fever caused significant economic losses for cattle producers in the United States before it was eradicated from all states except Florida in

1943. Florida presented some unique challenges to eradication of these ticks due to white-tailed deer serving as reservoirs.

Finally, in 1960, Florida was free of these ticks.

The two ticks responsible for transmission of cattle fever are Rhipicephalus annulatus and Rhipicephalus microplus. These ticks are still in Mexico and are routinely found in the quarantine zone along the Rio Grande.

When these ticks are found in the quarantine zone, steps are taken to ensure they do not survive and move off of

the premises. First, cattle are treated to kill the ticks on them. Second, pastures can be rested for up to nine months in order to starve ticks that are there. Third, wildlife can be fed ivermectin-treated corn in feeders, or they can be fed in special feeders that coat their ears and necks with insecticide.

Surveillance is still in place to maintain our cattle fever tick-free status here in Florida. The Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is collecting and identifying ticks found on livestock and

farmed deer.

Tick testing is done at no cost to the producer. Those who would like to submit a tick for identification may either contact their local extension agent or their local FDACS animal health inspector.

# Consider adding vines and climbers to your garden

Looking for a new twist to your garden? How about adding a plant or two that climbs, rambles or descends? Vines will add a new twist and using them in different ways could be fun. A climber can cover a wall, will soften or hide a chain-link fence, or decorate a tree. It can provide shade when over a pergola or privacy to a screen porch. Ramblers add a wonderful vertical element to any garden.

You can choose an annual, a perennial or an evergreen vine. Growing vertically will give you more growing space since they take up very little ground area, something that is precious in many yards. They can give you a spectacular show of flowers that will delight any visitor to your garden with the clever ways to get these plants to grow.

Annual vines grow quickly and cover an area rapidly if planted properly and given some fertilizer. You can have a climber scurry up any vertical object you want as long as you provide some support. Some climbers have tendrils the plant uses to self attach and some vines you will have to attach to the support. You can also have an annual vine scamper over top of shrubs in a perennial border.

Black-eyed Susan (Thunbergia) is a fast growing vine that will twine around the support that is provided. It has charming, dainty daisy-like flowers that are about an inch and a half in size and they come in shades of white, yellow and orange. The dark centers make them resemble the garden

perennial black-eyed Susan, hence the name. They can be grown in the ground or in a container. They are touted as doing better in a container because they like to be pot-bound, which encourages more flowers.

Morning glories are an easy vine to grow and an old favorite of mine. The clear blue color of the ones that decorated a mailbox down the street where I grew up, reminds me of my childhood. Morning glories need little care and come in various colors. I would recommend growing them on a structure where the dead vines can be easily removed in the fall. I grew them on a chain-linked fence for several years and they were great.

Passion flowers (Passiflora incarnata), another vine from my childhood have the more delicate, tantalizing bloom. I used to go on walks to find them growing wild in the open areas around our pond. Moonflower, which is usually grown from seed, is another great climber that has a lovely fragrance at night. Mandevilla, a popular vine that most garden centers sell, come in a lovely

shade of pink or white. I grow mine in a pot, which I keep in the garage over the winter, but it is an annual in most areas.

Then there are perennial vines like clematis, which are long lived and have beautiful flowers. There are many different kinds of clematis that will fit about any situation. Some clematis bloom in spring, while others flower at different times during the summer months. Sweet Autumn clematis is the last clematis to bloom in our garden and grows up a tree by our patio. Most clematis are deciduous, but there is one evergreen variety. Clematis take a year or two to get established and are worth the wait.

I have seen some wonderful rambling roses growing up in trees and making the tree look like they had flowers. The English are an old hand at putting climbing roses near a fruit tree and letting the rose climb up through the limbs, making the tree look like it is a big rose bush.

If you are looking for an evergreen vine, there are several that will work if

you live in a warmer area. Clematis armandii, Carolina jasmine, Confederate jasmine and smilax are choices to consider. These evergreen vines do well in zones 7, but I'm not sure they will go farther north without a very protected place to grow. I do not recommend ivy because it is invasive where I live.

These are things you need to know before you go shopping for the right vine for your location. What is the purpose? You also must decide if you want an annual, perennial or evergreen vine. Is the vine going to get full sun or a good bit of shade. Do you want something that will grow fast or are you willing to plant for the long term. Do you want the plant to support itself? Some climbers like passion flowers, use tendrils to wrap themselves around a nearby support, some are self-clingers like a climbing hydrangea that adhere unaided to walls or trees and there are ramblers like roses, that need some support to continue climbing.

One more thing to keep in mind is that the annual vine has a possible drawback depending on where it is growing.

An annual vine will weave itself in and out. If you let an annual vine like morning glories attach to a chain-linked fence, when they die, it will take some time to get the dead vine out of the fence. Removing them from a pole or letting them climb in a bush would make less work after they have faded away.

You can see that there are lots of options. Figure out where you want a vine to grow and have fun at your local garden shop choosing just the right one. Vines will be a great addition to any spot and add a wonderful vertical element to any garden.





## Hub City Lakers for the win

PANAMA CITY — The Hub City Lakers traveling basketball team won the 2018 Porter Sports Championship during the weekend of July 14 in Panama City.

With four minutes left in the fourth quarter, the Lakers were up 54-52 against the Marianna Recruits.

“Our veteran travel ball players stepped it up to pull out a 67-56 win,” a Lakers spokesperson said in a media release.

“Cecil Perdue, Elliott Davis, Kenya McRae and TeKee Tolbert also played very well on both sides of the ball,” the spokesperson said.



## Speed limit raised on U.S. 90

CRESTVIEW — The speed limit now is higher on U.S. Highway 90 in Crestview between Lee Farm Boulevard and State Road 4.

The limit rose from 45 to 55 mph after an area resident contacted the The Florida Department of Transportation with concerns, according to FDOT Public Information Specialist Tanya Branton.

Larry Woolley, owner of

Woolley Consignments and Surplus on West James Lee Boulevard, has watched the changes made on U.S. 90 since 1985.

“It was 55 out here for years and years...it’s really hard to drive 45 out there,” Woolley said.

FDOT changed the speed limit after completing a speed study in the area and made recommendations. Branton said the study looked at different factors like crashes and road features.

Another factor observed

during this study was the 85th percentile speed. This part of the study looked at the speed that 85 percent of vehicles traveled at or under, which gave the department an idea of what the speed limit should be.

“All of these factors were considered in the decision to raise the speed to 55 mph making it more consistent and predictable throughout SR10/US90,” Branton said in an email.

The new speed limits signs already have been placed alongside the highway.

CRESTVIEW — In downtown Crestview, the construction phase for the new courthouse is expected to be finished by the end of July after weather delays.

The Okaloosa County Courthouse on Main Street is set to be completed by July 31, according to Christopher Saul, the Okaloosa County Public Information Officer.

Ajax Building Corporation has been heading up the construction of the courthouse. Saul said landscaping and irrigation are the current focal point.

Rain caused delays during construction, which pushed back the completion date from the beginning of July to the end.

Although construction may be finished by the end of July, Saul said that it will be October before the courthouse is fully operational.

Between now and then, public works will address a list of damages that took place during construction and finalize items like plumbing and electrical work. Administration is expected to be moved into the building by October, according to Saul.

The courthouse, 50 percent larger than the original, is not alone on Main Street. Businesses line the road around the building. Kareca Wright, who owns Standard Hair Salon, can watch the construction happening right across the street as she works.

“It looks a whole lot better than what was there before,” Wright said. “I feel good about it. It’s going to look good down on this end.”

# Local soldier advances in Best Warrior

EGLIN AFB — A 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne) sergeant has once again advanced in the Army's Best Warrior competition, taking first place among participating troops in the U.S. Army Special Operations Command.

The sergeant, whose name cannot be released because of security concerns connected with his duties, previously had won Best Warrior in the Army's 1st Special Operations Command, which includes the 7th Special Forces Group (Airborne).

The soldier's latest victory has earned him a spot in the upcoming Army-wide Best Warrior competition. That contest, set for Sept. 30 through Oct. 5, will feature 22 soldiers from 11 Army commands competing at Fort A.P. Hill in Virginia and at the Pentagon.

## Northwest Florida State College offers 3 new programs

NICEVILLE — Northwest Florida State College is launching three new programs in the fall 2018 semester — an associate of science in culinary arts, a career and technical certificate in natural gas operations and distribution and an associate of science in unmanned aerial vehicle systems.

"The three programs we are introducing this semester are a direct result of listening to our community partners. We are committed to giving our region trained workforce with skills relevant for the available jobs in Northwest Florida," Dr. Devin Stephenson, NWFSC president, said.

The culinary program is designed to promote the Emerald Coast's tourism industry by preparing students for employment

in the culinary and restaurant industry.

In this program, students will gain employable skills and knowledge through classroom instruction and culinary lab experience in the following courses: Sanitation and Safety; Maintenance and Operation of Equipment; Methods of Preparation and Cooking; Perform Different Types of Food Services; Nutrition; Baking; and Dining Room and Beverage Management. Students will also receive training in communications, leadership and human relations skills.

This program focuses on broad, transferable skills and stresses understanding and demonstration of elements of the culinary industry. Careers include culinary manager, food and beverage manager, pantry cook, executive chef and many more.

The natural gas operations and distribution program will primarily be offered at the Chautauqua Center in DeFuniak Springs, with selected courses offered at NWF's Niceville and Fort Walton Beach campuses and the South Walton Center.

This program prepares students to become gas plant operators, where their job will consist of distributing or processing gas for utility companies and others by controlling compressors to maintain specified pressures on main pipelines.

The unmanned vehicle systems operations program consists of courses that will allow students to develop an operational knowledge of UAV design, limitations, operations and maintenance. The program will offer four specializations: business development, fire/rescue,

law enforcement and payload specialist.

This program prepares students to become unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) pilots. UAV pilots must be able to remotely control a flying vehicle with a thorough understanding of weather, aerodynamics, national airspace structure, vehicle design and control, and human factors. The demand for UAVs is growing, and they are increasingly being used in a variety of industries — from the military and police, to commercial operations.

Team Florida compete, but the best part was being there in person with my family to see him compete. He set his personal record for time in all of his events. Watching how happy he was with his team and making new friends, even his competitors, was just a joy. He told us that although the medals are great, it is better to respect others than to medal. He is a true inspiration!

Also, my husband and I coach Special Olympics track here in Crestview, so both as a mother and a coach, I am elated! We told him that the experience of attending the games is the great part.

If he medaled, that would be the icing on the cake (or the butter on the bread — my mother-in-law's words, since he doesn't eat sweets). He came home with three medals, two gold and a bronze, which far exceed any expectations. His fourth place ribbon was probably the most exciting out of all of them because of the finish of the race. Our whole family couldn't be more proud!
