Okaloosa retains tax rate

CRESTVIEW — The Okaloosa County Commission recently gave its unanimous approval to setting the county's tentative fiscal 2019 property tax rate at 3.83 mills.

It's the same as the existing rate and equals \$383 per \$100,000 of taxable property value.

In the new budget year, the rate is projected to generate about \$64.5 million in

property tax revenue. Because of higher property values, that is about \$4 million more than what was collected for the current budget.

The new fiscal year begins Oct. 1.

The county's overall proposed fiscal 2019 budget totals about \$387 million. That's more than \$8.2 million, or about 2.2 percent, higher than the existing budget, County Administrator John Hofstad said at the commission's final budget workshop Monday morning.

In the new fiscal year, the county plans to give a roughly 3 percent pay raise to all county employees, including the 579 general fund employees, as well as Sheriff's Office employees with the ranks of sergeant and below.

Hofstad told commissioners that the staff also has budgeted slight funding increases for various non-profit groups, including Elder Services of Okaloosa County.

The commission set the tentative fiscal 2019 millage rate at a special meeting on

Monday afternoon.

At that meeting, Commissioner Carolyn Ketchel wondered what good is it for the county to have the lowest or one of the lowest millage rates in Florida if it cannot maintain its roads.

She then voiced support for the county's 10-year local option half-cent sales tax referendum, and indicated that the millage rate might be increased if the referendum fails.

If approved by a simple majority of voters in the

Nov. 6 general election, the tax would take effect Jan. 1, 2019. It is expected to generate an estimated \$17 million annually.

Much of the potential sales tax revenue would help pay for infrastructure projects such as road and stormwater work in the unincorporated area and local municipalities.

The commission's two public budget hearings, which are needed in order to formally adopt next year's millage rate and budget, are set for Sept. 4 and 18.

Popeye's waiting on approval from FDOT

CRESTVIEW — The lights are on, and the building is nearly completed. But, the Popeye's in Crestview isn't ready to open quite yet.

Florida Department of Transportation required that the The Popeye's in Crestview have an access to State Road 85.

According to FDOT Public Information Specialist Tanya Branton, a permit has been issued to Popeye's for access to State Road 85.

"It's kind of a difficult site there," Crestview Growth Management Director Teresa Gaillard said. "But, they have been working back and forth with the FDOT trying to get something that the FDOT would work with."

The Popeye's site has a gravel entry-way leading to 85, but the entry-way will need approval from the FDOT. Joe Mann Sr., the construction manager from Vertical Construction Management, said they will be meeting with the FDOT on Monday to go over their current plan.

K9 Officer Kody next in line to receive a ballistic vest

CRESTVIEW — A nationally known nonprofit organization is rallying people across the country to donate money for Crestview Police Department's K9 Officer Kody to receive a ballistic vest.

James Hatch, a retired Navy Seal, founded Spikes K9 Fund. Hatch was critically wounded during his last deployment but credits his survival to K9 Spike, who was killed in Iraq in 2006. The organization raises money for K9s specific needs like protective equipment,

GPS trackers, and medical coverage for K9's who have retired.

K9 Kody, who often answers to Freddy, received a place on the fundraiser list after Jenn Parks, the Florida representative for Spikes K9 fund, reached out to the Crestview Police Department.

Hatch said that before the

K9 makes the list, the handler must go through a verification process and prove the K9's need for the vest.

Before Kody was placed on the list, Nate Marlar, Kody's handler, had to take his measurements and choose the color for the vest.



The family held a private service in his name and he was laid to rest alongside his lifelong partner, Pat. A full military service was held at Barrancas National Cemetery.



Election controversy in Pakistan overshadows progress

Former cricket sports star Imran Khan is now the recognized Pakistan election victor to be Prime Minister. Khan himself never doubted success — he made a flamboyant victory speech before the announcement of official results.

Former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, his chief election rival, has some marked disadvantages, including being in prison. Losers in the election charge the military and court system railroaded Sharif and helped elect Khan's party.

Khan himself presents an unclear, evolving image. He was an international sports star and jet setter. He is today a successful politician who has expressed sympathy with both China, a communist state struggling to modernize, and the Taliban, a fundamentalist terrorist group that rejects modernity in total.

Perhaps that simply indicates pragmatism, which Khan surely needs now. His Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) Party fell short of a majority in parliament. Khan and associates must broker a governing majority with other legislative factions. PTI supports a centrist approach, which may help both in forming a government and in effective administration.

Another famous Pakistan leader is Malala Yousafzai,

shot by the Taliban at age 16 in revenge for her advocacy of education for females. The vicious attack created an influential international leader against violence.

Vital Voices Global Partnership, a nonprofit organization to empower girls and women, has established the Malala Fund. Yousafzai has become a vital global symbol of courage.

Global media emphasis on violence in Pakistan reflects the country's strategic importance, but also overshadows progress in democratic politics and orderly alternation of governments. In September 2013, beleaguered President Asif Ali Zardari, who did not seek reelection, was succeeded by Mamnoon Hussain, who is still in office.

Also in 2013, Pakistan's National Assembly elections provided a victory to Nawaz Sharif and his opposition Pakistan Muslim League-N. President Hussain is a Sharif ally.

Despite violence, turnout in these elections was approximately 60 percent. The orderly office handover to the opposition represented a distinctive departure from the nation's history of military coups. This was the first peaceful democratic transition in the 66 years of national independence.

In recent years, Pakistan-U.S. relations have been vexed. Pakistan since 9/11 has been a front line in the struggle against terrorism.

Osama bin Laden's ability to hide in Abbottabad raised suspicion that Pakistan officials may have been complicit in concealing him. The U.S. government

did not inform Pakistan of the SEAL Team 6 raid that killed him. Islamic radicalism is influential, but scope of actual public support is unclear.

Pakistan possesses nuclear weapons. This vastly raises the stakes of a possible radical takeover of power. Pakistan and U.S. militaries cooperate closely on securing these weapons, in a long-established durable partnership.

Historically, the nation has been a U.S. ally, a point often overlooked in media commentary. The British-trained military is extremely capable. During the Cold War, Pakistan was generally a conservative counter-weight to neutralist India and communist China.

In the 1950s, Secretary of State John Foster Dulles ensured that this important ally joined both the Central Treaty Organization (CENTO) and Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO), designed to replicate NATO in the Middle East and South Asia, respectively. The nation was unique in having membership in both alliances. Both are long gone, but the geostrategic importance of Pakistan continues.

Mass media emphasize Islamabad-Washington strains, threats of Islamic radicalism, and incidents of brutal violence. The reality is more complex, and more promising.

Yousafzai's influence is especially inspiring.

The current industrial park is not full

Dear editor,
[The] recent article, "Money OK'd for Shoal River Ranch," in the Friday, July 20, 2018 edition of the Northwest Florida Daily News was most enlightening.

Only (almost) \$1.3 million of Okaloosa County money for labor and equipment is proposed for getting water and sewer lines extended to the Shoal River Ranch's project. (My wife and I have been at the same residence since January 1993, when I retired from the U.S. Air Force.)

A few years ago, the county water and sewer outfit suggested we "pay now" for the sewer we "pay now" for — something like \$4,200 — or be charged close to \$6,000

at a later date — when the Kings Crossing Subdivision would be added to the county sewer system.

The Shoal River Ranch is (maybe....) going to create jobs in Okaloosa County, much like the Okaloosa County Industrial Air Park (at the Bob Sikes Airport) had been planned to do when it was created.

The 'current' Industrial Park is in need of businesses or companies to be a valid use of county money spent in the past, where the paved road is good, but the lack of users is not so good.

[As of] Sunday, July 23, 2018, there [were] five structures (some are looking for 'renters'...) and three for-sale properties.

Does Okaloosa County need a second industrial

park when the current one is not filled to capacity?

Might Chairman Fountain Graham know the answers to the following statements?

- The county has had our \$4,200 for several years. Our subdivision has county water service, but no county sewer service. Is a planned project upcoming?

- The Shoal River Ranch is getting \$1.3 million of Okaloosa County money for water and sewer service. Taxpayers need to vote on this — perhaps?

- Who is "...tickled to death" now?

For each activity that is proposed, at least 70% of the funds must benefit low and moderate-income persons.

In developing an application for submission to DEO, the City of Crestview must plan to minimize displacement of persons because of planned CDBG activities. In addition, the City of Crestview is required to develop a plan to assist displaced persons.

The site is expected to be ready within 30 days, but it could take up to 60 days for the restaurant to open depending on when Popeye's receives approval.

"With DOT, it's always a wild card. They work at their

pace. I think it's a minimum of 30 to 60 days," Mann Sr. said.

The opening of Popeye's was delayed past the original date of July 24. Mann said there were multiple factors in play. One of them was the previous general contractor, who was fired over issues like poor performance, quality of work, and occasionally, not paying the subcontractors, Mann said.

Marlar said he chose a "coyote brown" ballistic vest for his canine partner. He has been with the police department for three years and Kody for eight months.

"With him, every time we're out there and there's a time whenever somebody might be armed or something, and we're going into the unknown, that's definitely something that's on your mind because dogs are pretty awesome, but they're not bulletproof," Marlar said.

Marlar said Kody is next in line to receive his vest, and his fellow Crestview K9 officer, Sonic, is also on the list.

"(Kody) would give his life for me in a heartbeat, and it's my job to protect him,"

Marlar said. "I'm glad to know he's going to be able to be covered just like I am."

The ballistic vests, made by Tidewater Tactical, are \$2,500. The money donated to the Spike's K9 Fund goes to the K9 at the top of the list.

"Once we get those

donations in, even if we get enough in to put vests on two or three, we'll do that as quickly as we can," Hatch said.

Currently, Hatch said about eight or nine K9s are on the list.







Crestview Police Department hosts youth academy for third year

CRESTVIEW — It was a rainy, dreary Wednesday outside the Crestview Police Department, but it was anything but inside Warriors Hall because it was time for K9 and SWAT day at the youth academy.

Officer Wanda Hulion took role call as kids from the community waited for Officer Josh Ellrick and K9 Officer Hero.

This marks the third year for the Crestview Police Department's Youth Academy, a program for youth 7 to 15 years old to learn from officers about law enforcement.

"We want the kids to know we're people just like they are," Hulion said. "This is our job. You have a lot of kids saying they want to know what a police officer does because they want to be a police officer when they grow up, so, that's our main goal."

Ellrick began his lesson by describing Hero's intense smelling abilities. He said Hero can smell up to four individual toppings on a pizza at one time. Hero was there to demonstrate that instinctive smelling ability by sniffing out the marijuana and methamphetamine Ellrick had Officer Javonnia Peak hide near the front door.

After Ellrick brought Hero out, the kids watched as the K9 sniffed around the room until he sat with his tail pointed upward signaling he had found the drugs.

Cheering and laughter rang through the hall after Hero received payment for doing his job in the form of a plastic stick.

Many of the kids raised their hand throughout Ellrick's lesson with questions. One of the children mentioned he saw on a television show someone use oils to disguise drugs from a K9.

"I'm glad you bring that up... You guys can't smell it. I can't smell it," Ellrick said. "However, because Hero's sense of smell is so strong, no matter what you do to disguise the odor of a narcotic,

Hero will be able to find it because that's his designed purpose."

The demonstration complete, it was the moment the kids had been waiting for: the chance to pet K9 Hero.

One by one, they walked to the middle of the room, where Hero lay on his back waiting for his belly rubs.

Ellrick ended his lesson, and the kids took a break before the SWAT sergeant began his lesson — gun safety. Officer Sam Kimmons said the kids received gun safety lessons more than once during the week.

"Sneaking in some educational points without them knowing... because in our area with it being high military, most of the time kids have guns at home," Kimmons said. "Plus, it's still southern territory. There's a lot of people (whose) parents hunt."

The youth academy ended Aug. 3 with graduation and celebration at Old Spanish Trail Park.




